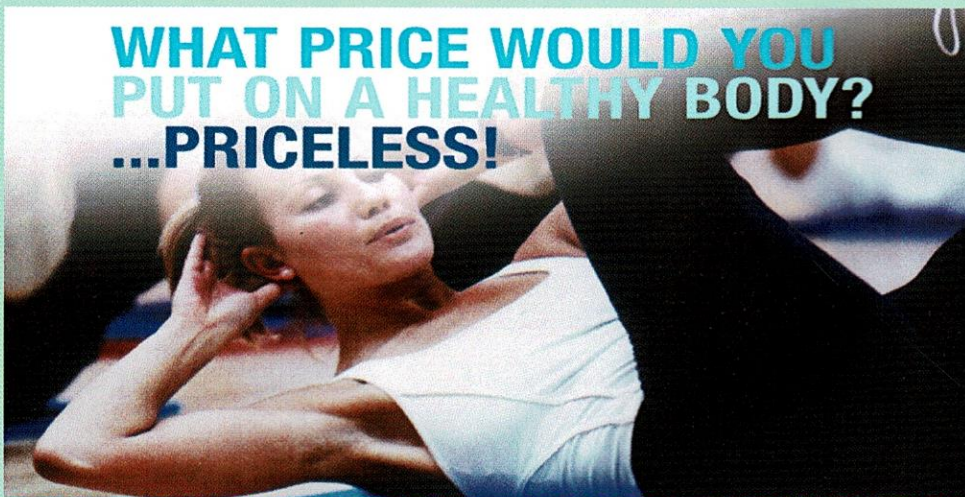

With their semi-final win over Wakefield at Fartown Huddersfield Keighley had reached a Challenge Cup Final at last. Someone after the match congratulated the club chairman Sam Slater, "Congratulations, Sam, but who'd have thought Keighley would be going to Wembley?"

"Aye, indeed, who would have thought it? There isn't anyone here would have thought it six months ago." Sam agreed.

Word soon got around Keighley of the tremendous win and as the team bus heading home approached Cross Roads they were met by an incredible sight. Hundreds of people lined the route right down into town cheering them all the way; most of the route was decorated with flags and streamers.

Filled with many Welsh players you can imagine the team was

in good voice and they waved and sang all the way to the Victoria Hotel in Keighley. Thousands of people in the road outside blocked Cavendish Street and there were many more inside.

As Bevan, the try scorer, got off the bus the crowd went wild going on to recognise and cheer each player in turn

In the club's diamond jubilee year and in the year of the Coronation of King George VI the final promised great things.

When Leeds Met launched the Carnegie Great Student Run 2007, leading the way was former Widnes, Wigan and GB star Joe Lydon.

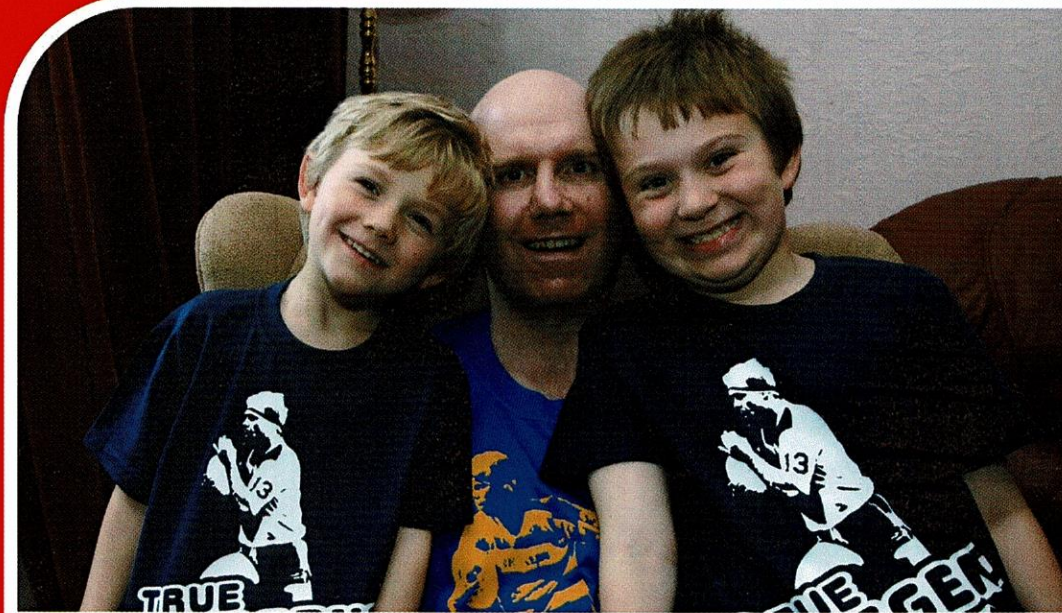

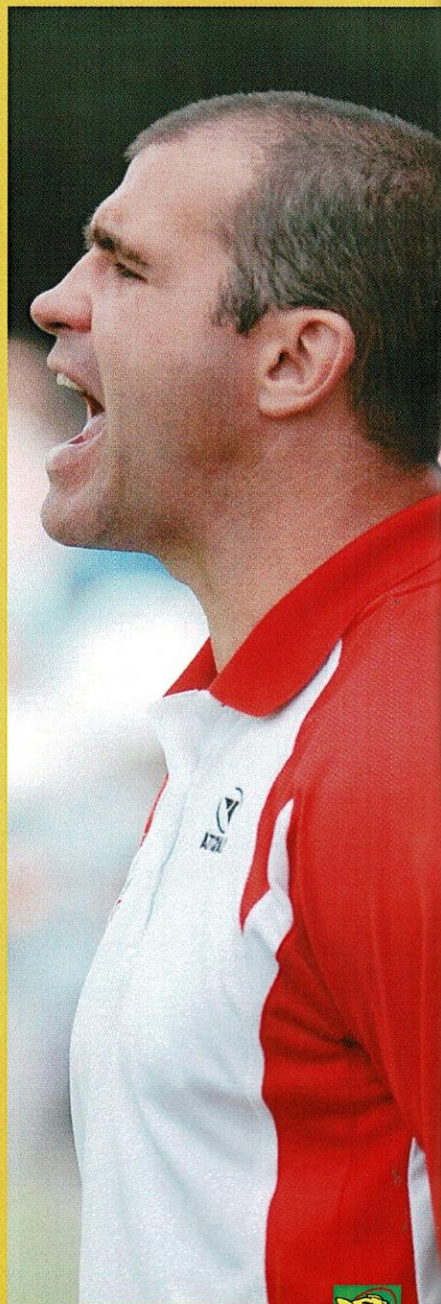

Lucas Onyango - A real flier, aged 25, Lucas grew up in rugby union in his native Kenya. He first came to England in the Kenya RU seven-a-side squad for the

2002 Commonwealth Games in Manchester. He liked it here, returned to stay, and played rugby union with Sale Sharks (briefly) and Manchester before turning codes to sign for Widnes Vikings in 2005. In nine first team games for Vikings he scored six tries and showed that he was one of the fastest men in the sport. Sadly, he picked up a serious knee injury at Batley and he was never to play for Widnes again.

Once fully recovered he played rugby union again in the Manchester area and Roughyeds signed him in March, 2007 from Leigh RU Club. Shortly before turning pro with Widnes he played for Kenya again in the 2005 Rugby World Sevens in Hong Kong. Roughyeds believe Lucas will score a lot of tries in the Co-Operative National League Two where his speed and elusive running will make him a real crowd pleaser.



Geno Costin (Second Row/Prop) A non-quota Aussie, 22-year-old Geno is in England for the first time and hoping to make an impact in NL2. Former

Halifax stand-off Carl Briggs, lined up originally to become Gateshead Thunder's new coach, planned to take Geno to the North-East with him. When that move broke down, Briggs pointed Geno in Oldham's direction, much to the delight of coach Steve Deakin. Geno first established himself in the Queensland Cup competition with Wynnum-Manly, alongside another Roughyeds recruit Mark Ogden, but last year played in the same comp for Logan Souths. Has long had a yearning to embark on an adventure to England and now that opportunity knocks he intend to make the most of it. Arrived in Oldham with his mate Mark Ogden on Boxing Day --- just in time for his first training session on freezing Oldham Edge two days later.



Richard Mervill (Prop Forward)

Formerly with Halifax and then Keighley, Richard comes to the Roughyeds for 2007 from Australia --- a similar route to that taken by his former Cougars team mate, Simeon Hoyle. Mervill played in the 2003 Keighley side that won promotion to NL1, alongside hooker Hoyle and stand-off Paul Ashton, and later jetted off Down Under, where he has been playing for Dapto in the Illawarra competition.

Hoyle, who had also played out there, alerted Roughyeds to the availability of

both Mervill and his Dapto team mate Drew Houston and it was thanks largely to Hoyle that Oldham got their names on contracts. Said to have a high work rate and a good offload, Mervill has experience of the game in both hemispheres and, with Wes Rogers and Jason Boultis, he will provide much of the Roughyeds' go-forward from the front-row.



Drew Houston (Second Row/Centre)

One of the two overseas quota men for 2007, 23-year-old Drew comes highly recommended by another new Roughyeds recruit, Simeon Hoyle. Hoyle played in Australia in 2005 and liked what he saw of the Dapto pair, Houston and a former Keighley colleague Richard Mervill. Houston, once a youngster linked with Melbourne Storm, had two seasons with a Storm feeder club, Norths in the Queensland Cup, before heading south for Dapto, champions of the Illawarra competition. Drew comes to Oldham with a reputation as a good line runner and a big hitter on the edges of the rucks in defence.

He helped Dapto to the championship of the Illawarra competition last year and he also earned selection in the competition's representative side, centre.



Adam Hughes (Centre). started his Oldham career in blistering form with four tries in his first three outings.

He crossed for two on his debut against Barrow, added another at London Skolars and scored an absolute gem at Workington --- one of the best centre's tries seeHe has made 162 Super League appearances --- nine with Leeds; 46 with Wakefield; 16 with Halifax; and 91 with Widnes. In Super League he totalled 78 tries (four for Leeds, 21 for Wakefield, eight for Halifax and 45 for Widnes) and 85 goals (34 for Wakefield and 51 for Widnes) for a total Super League points haul of 482. n from an Oldham player in many years.



Wes Rogers (Prop Forward)

At the age of 29, Wes brings experience, a cool head and stability to Oldham's front-row in 2007. Oldham-born, he first played for the Roughyeds in the club's early days, but he returns, from Swinton, as a much more experienced and matured front-row forward, who is delighted to be coming back for a second chance with his hometown club. On leaving the Roughyeds last time, he spent three years with Rochdale,

followed by three more seasons with Swinton, and he is one of six ex-Lions who will be wearing Roughyeds colours in 2007, the others being Kris Smith, Stuart Oldham, Michael Stout, Andy Crabtree, and Ian Sinfield.



Kris Smith (Second Row/Centre)

Another vastly-experienced player, this 28-year-old has been on the books of four Super League clubs, namely Leeds, Salford, London and Halifax. He has also played in France with Pia and Carpentras and it was while he was briefly at Carpentras that he was a club mate of the Roughyeds' new French signing, Said Tamghart. He is a big man of 6ft 4in and 15 and a half stones and he has had brief experience of Super League with both London and Halifax. A product of the Eccles amateur club, he was snapped up by Leeds Rhinos while still a teenager.

He then moved to Salford where a knee injury hampered his progress. His French excursion followed before he returned to England to play with London and Halifax before enjoying a four-year stint with Swinton. He showed his versatility with Swinton last season when he played 14 times in the second-row, five at loose-forward and once at stand-off, coming into prominence with outstanding displays in the second-row as the Lions beat Featherstone Rovers and Celtic Crusaders, both away, to earn their Grand Final appearance against Sheffield.



Tony Tonks (prop) Oldham have high hopes of the 22-year-old Yorkshireman, whom they signed from Bradford Bulls just a few days before the

start of the 2007 Co-Operative National League Two campaign. A Normanton lad, and a product of Normanton Knights, Tony had a season with Wakefield academy before turning pro for Bradford when he was 16. He was full-time at Odsal for six years, though for the 2006 season he was loaned out to Doncaster Lakers in NL1. He played in nearly every game for Doncaster, but then returned to Bulls where he was under contract for the remainder of the 2007 campaign.



Said Tamghart (Utility)

The description 'utility' perhaps fails to do justice to this French international, who has represented his country at every level, including fully-fledged Test matches against Australia and New Zealand. He played prop

against the Aussies and second-row against the Kiwis, but both he and coach Steve Deakin have confirmed that he can operate equally well at loose-forward and also in the backs at centre or wing.

Paul Ashton (Half Back) Son of former Watersheddings scrum-half star Ray Ashton, Paul is fulfilling a lifetime's ambition to play for his hometown club. Though born in

Widnes, he was only a few months old when his parents moved to Oldham where his father carved out a career that earned him GB tour honours in 1984 during 212 club appearances which reaped him 72 tries. Aged 27, Paul learned his trade at Saddleworth before playing for Halifax, Rochdale, Keighley and Swinton. He was in the Cougars side, with his new Roughyeds team mates Simeon Hoyle and Richard Mervill, that won promotion to NL1 in 2003.

He got his big chance at Oldham in 2006, initially on a week-to-week basis, and did enough to earn a full contract for 2007. Will be challenging for both half-back spots as he feels equally comfortable with both No 6 or No 7 on his back.

Lee Wingfield (Second Row) This 24-year-old second-row forward, signed last year from amateurs Leigh East, can also operate equally well at centre. He won

many honours in the amateur game and played on numerous occasions for Great Britain. He played against France and Russia in Russia in 2003 and kept his place for international appearances against France at Carcassonne and then for the return game at Whitehaven. Perhaps the pinnacle of his achievements in the amateur game came in 2004 when he toured Australia with GB amateurs and played in every game. He signed a contract to cover 2006 and 2007 and he proved to be one of Oldham's top performers in the early part of the 2006 season until first a ban and then an injury at work kept him out of the side. Although he prefers to play in the pack, he has also operated well in the threequarters.

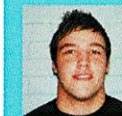
back-row forward ADAM ROBINSON Wakefield-born 20-year-old, a joiner by trade, is blessing the day he chose to sign for Oldham, instead of

opting to stay in his native Yorkshire with one of the other clubs who were interested in signing him, such as Featherstone, Keighley and Hunslet. Adam spent five years at Wakefield, whom he joined on a scholarship when he was 14. He ultimately spent two years as a full-time pro in the Wildcats' Super League squad when Shane McNally was coach. A burning desire for more first-team rugby led him to Doncaster where, in the 2006 season, he played regularly in the same

pack as another recent Roughyeds recruit, prop Tony Tonks.

Andy Crabtree (Hooker) One of half a dozen players signed by Roughyeds from Swinton Lions for 2007, Andy is eager to fulfil the early

promise that earned him not only a spot on the books of Wigan Warriors but also a place in a talented Great Britain academy side that boasted several players who have gone on to big things at the highest level. At Swinton in 2006 he faced immense competition for the specialist No 9 role, but he made nine appearances, three starts and six off the bench. A tidy footballer with good hands and a rugby brain, the youngster has the attributes to play loose-forward as well as hooker, but it is with No 9 on his back that he has accomplished most of his achievements so far. He can also kick goals.



Chris Baines (Back Row)

A young forward who also did enough for coach Steve Deakin last year, while on loan from Warrington, to win a contract for 2007. He proved to be a good, hard-working forward in his first season with the Roughyeds and the experience he gained will serve him and the club well in NL2.

He was in his third season of under-21s rugby at Warrington when he first got the chance to move on loan to Roughyeds. He had three separate and continuous one-month loan spells and when the Wolves said they would release him he had no hesitation in grabbing the chance to commit himself to Oldham for the remainder of 2006 and then 2007. A product of Wigan St Pat's, he toured New Zealand with Great Britain Young Lions in 2003, also representing his country at youth level against Australia and France.



Jason Boultis (Prop Forward)

One of many new boys in the Roughyeds squad for 2007, 23-year-old Jason arrived on the recommendation of two of his former Halifax team

mates, Jamie Bloem and Alan Haddock. Alan, already established here as one of coach Steve Deakin's senior men, wasted no time in tipping off the boss when he learned from Bloem that Boultis was ready to leave The Shay to take up a new challenge. At 16 stone and 6ft 2in, Jason can play his weight in the front-row, as he proved in his two seasons at Fax where he was an ever-present with 30 appearances in 2005 and then added 27 more in 2006 --- statistics which show he is as durable as he is consistent. Started off at Salford under-16s, spent four years as a young pro with Bradford Bulls and signed for Halifax in November, 2004.

Andy Gorey (Winger)

A scrum-half in his Royton Tigers days, local lad Andy became a good full-back in the former Roughyeds academy side. He was under contract on the break-up of the academy side, but he pledged to fight for a place in the first team rather

than go elsewhere. In 2006 he became a fans' favourite with gutsy performances, capped off with a couple of length-of-the-field tries. Diminutive, but pacy, he established

himself as a regular on the wing, making more than 20 appearances and taking his try tally into double figures to finish the season as the club's top try scorer.

Not many of last year's squad were offered new contracts, but Gorey was and he quickly put pen to paper as he looked to further develop his career with his hometown club.



Gareth Langley (Winger)

Pacy, and a good finisher, 'Gaz' Langley comes to the Roughyeds after five years in one of the most professional learning and development schools in rugby league --- the youth and academy set-up at St Helens. Born in the well-known rugby league district of Parr, near St Helens, 22-year-old Gareth didn't take up the sport with Blackburn until he was 15.

By the time he was 16 he was playing for Salford under-18s, having been headhunted by the then Salford academy coach Steve McCormack. He wasn't on contract and it didn't take long for hometown St Helens to take him to Knowsley Road. He was the Saints senior academy player of the year in 2005 and runner up toplayer of the year in 2006, a season in which he made his Super League debut in a young Saints side that took on Catalans Dragons in Perpignan.



John Hough (Hooker)

Out 'Houghie' in two and you will find 'Roughyeds' running right through him. He was the first player to sign for the 'new'

Roughyeds club when it was formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997, following the demise of Oldham Bears. Currently two seasons into a three-year contract, 29-year-old Oldham-born John will have completed ten years with the club at the end of the 2007 season and will thus qualify for a testimonial. A product of the Waterhead club, he signed for Warrington Wolves while still a boy, but he carved himself a niche in the history of the new Oldham club when he signed as a free agent on December 2, 1997.
