



But what happens Salford kick Harrison out, who comes in Aussie Shaun McRae, who failed miserably at South Sydney, however he did well at Saint Helens, but who wouldn't with the talent on hand.

Tony Smith is to quit Leeds for pastures new at G.B., level who takes over Kiwi Brian McLellan. What encouragement does that give to up and coming Coaches in National One and Two. The one I feel sorry for is Harrison who was given an extended contract at Salford, and we are led to believe knocked back any hopes of him becoming G.B., boss in favour of staying at The Willows.

- 6. No recording, whether for radio or television, and whether for transmission or otherwise is permitted unless permission is specifically granted by the Barrow RLF club for such purpose. Such authorised will be issued in writing to the company/individual.
- 7. Only persons/organisations with the specific authorisation in writing from Barrow RLFC will be permitted to offer/distribute literature inside or outside of Craven Park, Barrow-in-Furness.

Then he is shown the door and what happens McRae is handed a four year plus contract. There is enough talent, out of work, to Coach these top clubs, and money can be saved by the thousands. These over-seas Coaches don't come cheap.

Away from Coaching and welcome to Oldham for what is an important game for both clubs. Oldham have battled on in recent years without a home rugby league ground, and well done to the likes of Chris Hamilton and Sean Whitehead for the hard work and dedication for keeping the club, and a famous Oldham name afloat.

As a youngster growing up in the rugby league world they had many a great player like full back Bernard Ganley, centre Alan Davies and in later years Bob Irving who came to Barrow at the end of his career and not to forget that fine Cumbrian winger Ike Southward who had a spell at Oldham. Local amateurs Walney Central will always remember going to the Watersheddings in 1960 for a second round rugby league challenge cup tie, Oldham won 50-4 and who got a double hat-trick of tries - Ike Southward. Enjoy the game Paddy.

# **Crarey's Comments**

This is our moment of truth. After our defeat at York last weekend we have to show we have the ability and resolve to bounce back.

At York we were very poor technically. We spewed the ball out and there was no support work.

The answer has been a very constructive team meeting this week. There is no doubting, the players all know my thoughts.

It might have been a little easier today had we to faced what might be considered as poor opposition but Oldham will be a tough test. I consider them a top-four team but they have had a couple of blips.

Their response has been to bring in James Coyle who has had a lot of experience with Wigan and Widnes but the good thing for us is that this is only his second week in and as a halfback involved in key moves, you need time to settle in. But they have a strong pack and were very enthusiastic at their place when they gave us our heaviest defeat of the season.

Revenge will be sweet but we cannot afford to play like we did at York. In the second half we had five good ball sets in their 25 and we dropped four on the first or second tackle. The other ended with Martin Ostler stretching over the line but the referee found a reason to deny the try.

The conditions were horrendous but I am not blaming them. However it did mean that three times on the first tackle we were dragged into touch.

Too many people had off days and I hope that is out of our system now. We had trained hard on goal-line defence but after a game where we went without a try, we have been working on our attacking structure.

I hope to be bringing in Ian Rawlinson as an impact player and a good thing now is that there is pressure on the players with Michael Bassan, Nicky Beach, Jamie Marshall and Jamie Butler ready to return to the squad.

We have also been having talks with a front row man who has played first grade rugby in Australia with West Tigers and is keen to come over. But finance is a problem. We have been getting good crowds, and I think that is great, but we need even more through the turnstiles because we need to be self-financing and not have to turn to chief executive Des every time we need cash.

Finally a word of praise for the Academy lads. They are doing brilliantly.

Last week we wanted to bring in some new defensive calls and they had no problems in handling with them. In fact you tell them something and they soak it up like a sponge and then come back for more.

Their coach Steve Rae is very open minded about what we are doing. He realises the need to replicate in the Academy what we are doing with the senior squad. He doesn't challenge things but gets on with the job. His help has been brilliant.



The old rumour mill was working overtime at last week's golf day gathering of the Rugby League Writers Association at Bradford. And, although

I know from experience that you don't want to believe everything you read in the papers, I thought I might pass on some of the titbits that came my way. Only time will tell whether all or any of it is true so it may be a matter of Watch This Space.

For starters there are rumblings in Australia that not everybody is happy with The Greatest Game and calls for change are gaining strength. Cause for concern are the mind-numbing tactics employed by a growing number of NRL coaches.

Folk are getting twitchy at what they see as stereotype play of five drives and a kick and an alarming absence of variety and skill. In other words, it's boring. Fast and athletic but still boring.

Among the suggestions on how to force clubs to bring back some of the old-style fundamental skills are - and you'll never guess! - Scrapping the 10-metre off-side rule and replace it with a seven-metre. Now, there's a novelty. If there was ever a rule designed to promote biff-and-barge rugby it was the ten-metre rule.

The Aussies are also beginning to wonder if 12 substitutions (replacements) are far too many and should be restricted to six. The argument is that this would prevent coaches from making their changes according to the clock.

On the home front it was whispered that the "Super League Franchise Act" of 2009 is anything but done and dusted and that all is not lost for those who believe that promotion and relegation should be written in stone and not decided around a board room table.

Apparently, one of the worries about a 14-team Super League is the lack of playing strength in depth. To add another couple of teams to the present dozen - presumably it would be any two from Widnes, Castleford, Toulouse and South Wales - is hardly likely to add to the quality of the sport's top competition. What talent there is would simply be spread more thinly.

And, unless I've been missing something, the available talent is already stretched to the limit. Even Sky's uncritical commentary team have stopped telling us that we are watching the greatest thing since old Mr. Warburton discovered the bread slicer.

There is the odd exception of course - Saints v. Leeds was a cracker in any language - but by and large matches are pretty run-of-the-mill. In other words, better than many other sporting events but hardly mind-blowing entertainment.

Which brings us back to those mutterings Down Under. Is the game going stale? Have coaches devised a way to stifle talent by filling up their squads with big raw-boned second row forwards? Where have all the sidesteppers, body-swervers and 40-try wingers gone? And is the ten-metre rule to blame?

Like I said, it may be a matter of Watch This Space. Incidentally, there was no suggestion of a return to contested scrums. Now that would be a novelty...

# Carnesie sreat student run Taking support beyond boundaries


When Leeds Met launched the Carnegie Great Student Run 2007, leading the way was former Widnes, Wigan and GB star Joe Lydon.

# Oldham Pen Pics

BAINES, Chris (back-row): A young forward who also did enough for coach Steve Deakin last year, while on loan from Warrington, to win a contract for 2007. He proved to be a good, hard-working forward in his first season with the Roughyeds and the experience he gained will serve him and the club well in NL2.

BOULTS, Jason (prop): One of many new boys in the Roughyeds squad for 2007, 23-year-old Jason arrived on the recommendation of two of his former Halifax team mates, Jamie Bloem and Alan Hadcroft Alan, already established here as one of coach Steve Deakin's senior men, wasted no time in tipping off the boss when he learned from Bloem that Boults was ready to leave The Shay to take up a new challenge. At 16 stone and 6ft 2in, Jason can play his weight in the front-row.

COSTIN, Geno (prop or back-row): A non-quota Aussie, 22-year-old Geno is in England for the first time and making an impact in NL2. Former Halifax stand-off Carl Briggs, lined up originally to become Gateshead Thunder's new coach, planned to take Geno to the North-East with him. When that move broke down, Briggs pointed Geno in Oldham's direction, much to the delight of coach Steve Deakin. Geno first established himself in the Queensland Cup competition with Wynnum-Manly but last year played in the same comp for Logan Souths. Has long had a yearning to embark on an adventure to England and now that opportunity knocks he intends to make the most of it.

CRABTREE, Andy (hooker): One of half a dozen players signed by Roughyeds from Swinton Lions for 2007, Andy is eager to fulfil the early promise that earned him not only a spot on the books of Wigan Warriors but also a place in a talented Great Britain academy side that boasted several players who have gone on to big things at the highest level.

GOREY, Andy (winger): A scrum-half in his Royton Tigers days, local lad Andy became a good full-back in the former Roughyeds academy side. He was under contract on the break-up of the academy side, but he pledged to fight for a place in the first team rather than go elsewhere. In 2006 he became a fans' favourite with gutsy performances, capped off with a couple of length-of-the-field tries. Diminutive, but pacy, he established himself as a regular on the wing, making more than 20 appearances and taking his try tally into double figures to finish the season as the club's top try scorer.

HOUGH, John (hooker): Cut 'Houghie' in two and you will find 'Roughyeds' running right through

him. He was the first player to sign for the 'new' Roughyeds club when it was formed by Chris Hamilton and his fellow directors in the autumn of 1997, following the demise of Oldham Bears. Currently two seasons into a three-year contract, 29-year-old Oldham-born John will have completed ten years with the club at the end of the 2007 season and will thus qualify for a testimonial.

HOUSTON, Drew (second-row or centre): One of the two overseas quota men for 2007, 23-year-old Drew comes highly recommended by another new Roughyeds recruit, Simeon Hoyle.

HOYLE, Simeon (hooker): Formerly with Keighley Cougars and Halifax, hooker Simeon was one of the first of the new boys to be signed up by Roughyeds for 2007. He is a hooker of the old school - a tough and industrious operator in defence while having enough know-how to make things happen from dummy half.

LANGLEY, Gareth (winger): Pacy, and a good finisher, 'Gaz' Langley comes to the Roughyeds after five years in one of the most professional learning and development schools in rugby league - the youth and academy set-up at St Helens. Born in the well-known rugby league district of Parr, near St Helens, 22-year-old Gareth didn't take up the sport with Blackbrook until he was 15. By the time he was 16 he was playing for Salford under-18s, having been headhunted by the then Salford academy coach Steve McCormack.

LITTLER, Craig (centre): How appropriate that Littler comes next to Langley in alphabetical order. For that's exactly how they have lined up, as centre and wing partners, in the Saints academy teams of the past four years. A year younger than 'Gaz', at 21, Craig was offered the chance to have another year at Knowsley Road, but he opted to sign for Roughyeds instead - and one of the reasons was that he could continue his partnership with Langley.

MERVILL, Richard (prop): Formerly with Halifax and then Keighley, Richard comes to the Roughyeds for 2007 from Australia - a similar route to that taken by his former Cougars team mate, Simeon Hoyle. Mervill played in the 2003 Keighley side that won promotion to NL1, alongside hooker Hoyle and stand-off Paul Ashton, and later jetted off Down Under, where he has been playing for Dapto in the Illawarra competition. Hoyle, who had also played out there, alerted Roughyeds to the availability of both Mervill and his Dapto team mate Drew Houston and it was thanks largely to Hoyle that Oldham got their names on contracts.

RODEN, Neil (half-back): Neil rejoined Roughyeds from Leigh after leaving the club initially to go to Batley in 2004. In his first stint with Oldham, after joining from Wigan Academy, he amassed 290 points (68 tries and 18 drop goals) in 142 appearances over four and a half seasons. No other player in the nine-year history of the 'new' Roughyeds club has totalled more tries than Roden, whose 68 pushed Mark Sibson (61) into second place. Neil also has the distinction of having played for the Roughyeds in the 2001 Grand Final against Widnes at Spotland.

SINFIELD, Ian (back-row): Another vastly experienced forward who has returned to his hometown club. The brother of Leeds Rhinos captain, Kevin Sinfield, Ian played in the first ever Roughyeds game at Rochdale on New Year's Day, 1998. He had come initially on loan from Salford, but soon afterwards he was signed on a permanent basis, with Roughyeds paying out an undisclosed fee for his services. 'Sinny' had four seasons at Oldham, making more than 70 appearances, before moving to Rochdale, then to Keighley, and on to Swinton. While at Keighley he played in the NL2 Grand Final alongside Simeon Hoyle, Paul Ashton and Richard Mervill.

TAMGHART, Said (utility): The description 'utility' perhaps fails to do justice to this French international, who has represented his country at every level, including fully-fledged Test matches against Australia and New Zealand. He played prop against the Aussies and second-row against the Kiwis, but both he and coach Steve Deakin have confirmed that he can operate equally well at loose-forward and also in the backs at centre or wing. On his way up the ladder to full French international honours, he played for Carpentras, Avignon and UTC (better known now as Perpignan-based Catalans Dragons) and it was while he was at UTC that he came under the wing of Deaks, who holds him in the highest regard.

WILKINSON, Alex (centre, wing): Oldham-born Alex played his early rugby with Royton Tigers and toured with GB schoolboys to Australia in 1999 and with England academy to New Zealand and Australia in 2000. Super League giants Bradford Bulls snapped him up and, while at Odsal, he had a loan spell with London Broncos, where he played six times in Super League. He then moved on loan to Huddersfield, where he added another 13 Super League games to his tally. He played a similar number while on loan to Hull FC, who offered him a two-year contract. However, Alex wanted to complete his degree and with part-time rugby the only option he chose his hometown club.

HODSON, lan (back row): Initially rejected new offer for 2007, due to work commitments, but the Roughyeds door remained open and he re-signed in March after playing one or two games for Tydlesley RU. One of the club's better performers in 2006, he always gave maximum input, even when asked to play out of position at stand-off.

ONYANGO, Lucas (winger): A real flier, aged 25, Lucas grew up in rugby union in his native Kenya. Has played for Sale Sharks, Manchester and Leigh in Union, and Widnes Vikings in League. Did well at Vikings before damaging a knee. Over that now and keen to make the most of his chance at Oldham.

SANDERSON, Lee (half-back): Needs no introduction to Barrow fans, having had a spell at Craven Park from where the Roughyeds signed him in March. Previously played for Leigh, London Broncos and Rochdale Hornets. Currently out injured with a knee problem, for which he is booked in for an operation.

TONKS, Tony (prop): Roughyeds have high hopes of the 22-year-old Yorkshireman, signed from Bradford Bulls just before the start of the NL2 campaign. He had one year at Wakefield Academy, then six at Bulls as a full-time pro, including last season when he was out on loan at Doncaster.

HUGHES, Adam (centre): The massively experienced 29-year-old boasts more than 150 Super League appearances during spells with Leeds, Wakefield, Halifax, Widnes and Leigh. A powerful, pacy centre who knows where the line is, he signed for Oldham in preference to several other clubs and scored two tries on his debut in May - against Barrow.

ROBINSON, Alan (second row): A tough and uncompromising player who relishes his defensive duties, the 20 year old Yorkshireman turned down Featherstone in order to sign for the Roughyeds from Doncaster. He started his pro career at Wakefield and has made a big impact in Oldham colours in his two months at Oldham.

BROOKS, Matty (half-back): Signed on loan from Hull KR, initially for one month, but with a view to extending it to the end of the season. Hull-born Matty, who can also play at hooker, was reared in the Bradford Bulls youth set-up before moving to Hull KR, from where he had a spell on loan at York earlier in the season.

COYLE, James (half-back): Signed last week and made his debut off the bench against Swinton last Sunday. On Wigan's books from being a boy, 21-year-old James spent last season on loan at Widnes. He is leaving full-time rugby behind to take a job with BNFL and Roughyeds were delighted to sign him despite competition from other clubs.
