





Everybody at Craven Park today will have more important things in mind but excuse me if I finish off this season's columns by getting a few bees out of my bonnet. They are starting to irritate.

First, while Super League's average attendances top 10,000 for the first time, crowds at London's outpost, Twickenham Stoop, have slumped by 30 per cent to a figure of fewer than 4,000.

After 27 years of professional RL in and around London, have we shown that the local public are remotely interested?

A friend of mine in Rugby League has a son who lives less than half an hour from The Stoop, home of Harlequins RL. He's a great fan of the sport, but would never think of becoming a regular.

His reason - there's just no soul, no sense of belonging, nothing remotely permanent or club-like about Quins RL. In fact, it's just another rugby team. Which might go some way to answering Martyn Sadler's query in a recent League Express: Why do Londoners not like Rugby League? They may well like it, but only as a TV show. It is, and always has been - a tribal sport.

Second, has the experiment of three points for a win, two for a draw and one for a narrow defeat made a scrap of difference to the National Leagues? Well it has done just that - made exactly one scrap of difference.

If the National Leagues had been played under the old two points for a win only Batley and Dewsbury (National One) and Hunslet and Skolars (National Two) would have swapped places. And they had no effect on the play-offs whatsoever.

Rugby League has never been slow to change - but this has proved to be a totally pointless exercise especially when there is no bonus point for winning by more than 12 points. A bonus for losing? I said it was barmy at the time and it still is.

Finally, Amateur Rugby League. Having been chairman of three clubs down the years - Corby Pioneers, Tameside Borough and Manchester Knights - this is a particular pet subject. There are already occasions of clubs struggling to raise teams for long journeys (Milnrow didn't come to Ulverston on the third weekend of the season and have already folded) and I'm sure it won't be long before more 18-nils appear.

For what it's worth, I'd like to see Barrow and District League clubs form a well-run high-profile West Coast Premier League. Millom may be too strong at the moment but the others, plus possible additions such as Heysham Atoms, Blackpool, - even perhaps a revived Marsh Hornets - would make far more sense than regular trips to all corners of Lancashire and Cheshire and expensive nine-hour away days. How many times do Barrow clubs make the journey south with a coach and barely 13 players? Surely that can't make sense.

County Cups and National Cups ties would provide any necessary variety. Is there a will? If so there's a way.

PS: To the Raiders: All the best in today's play-off match - even if it is against my "other" team Oldham.

### HOLT EYES ANOTHER BARROW RECORD

DARREN HOLT of Barrow Raiders needs four points to equal his club's record 305 in a season by utility back lan Ball in 1979-80. Ball's tally consisted of 26 three-point tries and 119 goals, including 11 drop goals, in 31 appearances. Holt's total of 301 comes from a club record 140 goals, including three drop goals, plus six tries in 30 matches. Holt equalled the goals record with two in the Co-operative National League Two qualifying semi-final 36-20 defeat at Featherstone Rovers. The scrum half had set the record in 2004 when his 140 goals included eight drop goals, in 29 matches. Holt also passed the 2,000 points milestone for Barrow with four at Featherstone taking him to a record-extending 2,002 from 59 tries and a club record 910 goals, including 54 drop goals.


