




departments and also from you the fans, and players. Have a look, we think you'll like them.



Player Spotlight

BARROW-BORN Mat played for the England Academy side against the Aussie Schools side in 2002. He began his professional career at Leeds Rhinos but in July 2004 went on loan to Castleford Tigers, making a try-scoring debut for them in a 48-16 Super League defeat at Wigan.

He joined Huddersfield
Giants in September 2005
but had to wait until the 2006
season to make his debut for
them. However, in the interim
period, whilst still on Leeds'
books, he was selected on
the wing for Cumbria in a
friendly match against
Ireland up at
Whitehaven in front
of 1216
spectators.

Mat notched a brace of tries in his side's 64-4 victory, whilst current team-mate at The Willows, Stuart Littler, scored the only try for the Irish.

In 2006, he made a total of 15 appearances for

Huddersfield and scored six tries, including three in the 42-34 home Super League victory over the Catalans Dragons.

Last season he made 11 appearances for the Giants, scoring a couple of tries, including one against Salford in the Reds' 18-16 success at the Galpharm Stadium. That was Huddersfield's seventh successive Super League defeat from the start of the 2007 campaign.

In October 2007 Salford stepped in to secure his services on a 12-month deal and it is expected that he will figure prominently in the Reds' squad this term.

Elder brother Ade Gardner is a prolific try-scorer at St Helens, with whom he has played since 2002.





Club Connection



IN our visitors ranks this evening will be front row forward Simon Baldwin who made 88 appearances for the Reds after joining us from Leigh prior to the 2003 campaign.

Simon originally played for Leigh East ARL club before turning professional with hometown club Leigh on his 17th birthday in March 1992.

The following season he made his first team debut as substitute and scored a try in the 12-12 home draw against Leeds.

He was a member of the 1994 GB Academy squad on their Tour of Australia and within three months of his return to these shores he had linked up again with coach Steve Simms ay Halifax.

It was in 1995 that he made his debut for England, playing against Wales and France in the European Championship. A month later he gained his only cap for the GB Under 21s in their 17-16 defeat against France at Albi.

He continued to play for Halifax until the end of the 1998 season, and then he joined Sheffield Eagles for the opening of the 1999 campaign. However, it did not work out for him at the Don Valley Stadium and the 2000 season opened with him back at Leigh.

Whilst at Hilton Park he appeared for Leigh in a couple of Division One Grand Finals (2000 and 2002), both of which ended in defeat.

Salford
snapped him up
for the 2003
campaign and he
played a big part in
helping Salford
regain Super
League

status. He missed just one match all season, scored a total of 13 tries and gained Winners' Medals for the Arriva Trains Cup and the Division One Grand Final, ironically on both occasions the opposition was his hometown club of Leigh.

Simon continued to play for the reds on their return to the top flight and he went on to make 88 appearances for the club, scoring 17 tries, prior to joining Rochdale Hornets in National League 1 for the 2007 campaign.

A disastrous season for the Hornets saw them lose their last nine matches, culminating in a massive 106-0 home defeat at the hands of Grand Final winners Castleford Tigers and that saw them relegated to Division Two, along with Doncaster.

By that time Simon had moved up to Whitehaven where he played eight matches.

Now he has been snapped up by ambitious neighbours Oldham to hopefully bolster their pack in an all out bid to regain their Division One status, after just missing out to Featherstone Rovers in the 2007 Grand Final.






Just before the interval Alker forced his way over but Wilshere failed to convert from another easy position. Half time. 6-24.

A Brief History...

Oldham RLFC

A FOUNDER member of the breakaway Northern Union in 1895 but Oldham's history goes back to September 1876 when the club was formed at a meeting in the Prince Albert Hotel.

Their first ground was at Glodwick and their inaugural opponents
Stalybridge on 21
October of that year.

A move to the sloping ground at Clarksfield preceded the switch to the site at Watersheddings where the opening game against Swinton on 28 September 1889 ended in defeat in front of a 7000 gate. When the "split"

pioneer members. In 1899 the club won the NU Challenge Cup beating Hunslet

occurred some six years later.

Oldham were one of the

by 19 points to 9 and in doing so became the first Lancashire side to lift the trophy.

Although Oldham have subsequently won the Challenge Cup in 1925 and 1927 and been runners-up on

four occasions, they have still never appeared at Wembley. Oldham's glory days

came in the 1950s when they were the kingpins of the League. They were consistently high up in

the table and in 1956-57 they ended the season with a six points lead over Hull,

a side they defeated in the Championship Final 15-14 at Odsal in front of 62,000 spectators.

Oldham also headed the league the following season and went on to land a hat-trick

of successive Lancashire Cup Final wins.

During 1957-58, Bernard Ganley set up a new goalkicking record with a total of 200 for Oldham and 19 for GB.

Other well known stars of the period were internationals Frank Pitchford, Sid Little, Charlie Winslade, Alan Davies, Derek Turner, Ken Jackson and Ike Southward, who was a then record signing of £10,650 from Workington Town.

The first floodlit match at Watersheddings took place on 26 October 1965 when GB Under 24s beat France by 12 points to 5.

Meanwhile, on the domestic front Oldham went through a lean spell and apart from a couple of Second Division and Divisional Premiership victories, the club have not won any major trophies since their 1958-59 Lancashire Cup Final triumph.

Despite the setbacks, Oldham took their place in the newly formed 12-club Super League in 1996, playing their matches at Boundary Park.

MATTY BROOKS (half-back/hooker): Joined Roughyeds last season on loan from Hull KR, scoring two tries in 17 appearances and ending the campaign with a terrific show as a substitute in the NL2 Grand Final against Featherstone at Headingley. Now a fullyfledged Oldham player on a one-year deal he will have to make the adjustment from fulltime pro with Rovers to part-time footballer with Roughyeds. Turned pro for Bradford, then on to Hulll KR. A native of East Hull.



DARYL CARDISS (utility back): Aged 30, this hugely experienced utility back has played for Wigan, Halifax, Warrington and Widnes. Joined Wigan from Hunslet Boys Club in

1994. Made a total of 142 Super League appearances and scored 46 tries in the elite competition. Enjoyed a fine stay at Halifax, for whom he scored 39 tries in 99 outings.



JAMES COYLE (scrumhalf): Now contracted to Roughyeds until November, 2009, this talented 22-year-old ioined the club from Wigan midway through last season and made an

immediate impact. His 14 appearances vielded six tries, but it was the vast number of tries he made for others that underlined his real potential. Another product of Wigan St Pat's, he was a shooting star in Wigan's academy system before spending the whole of the 2006 season on loan at Widnes.



TOMMY GOULDEN (backrow): Equally at home in the second-row or at loose, 26-year-old Tommy was a key member of the Rochdale Hornets pack in 2006 and 2007, having been signed from

amateur rugby in Leigh by Bobbie Goulding in 2005. Leigh born, he picked up every possible honour as an amateur, including captaincy of BARLA Great Britain, before turning pro for Rochdale.



TOMMY GRUNDY (backrow): Aged 22, Leigh-lad Tommy is one of the younger members of the Roughveds squad, Can play equally well in any of the back-row spots as well as centre. Turned pro

for Warrington as an 18-year-old, then played for Leigh and Blackpool before returning to his hometown club, Leigh, for 2006 and 2007. Joined Roughyeds on a two-year deal.



DANNY HALLIWELL (centre): One of eight new signings, 26-year-old Leigh-born Danny was on loan at Leigh, from Salford, last season and he has also worn the

colours of Halifax, Warrington and Wakefield. Can play anywhere across the back division and, like many of his Oldham colleagues, has considerable Super League experience. His 43 top-flight outings comprise three for Wakefield, 10 for Wigan, 25 for Halifax and five for Leigh.

SIMEON HOYLE (hooker): Edinburgh-born Simeon is half-way through a two-year contract with Roughyeds. Aged 28, and formerly with Keighley Cougars and Halifax, he is a hooker of the old school, tough in defence but with an ability to make things happen from dummy half. In 2003 he helped Keighley to win promotion to NL1 by beating Sheffield in the NL2 Grand Final.



PHIL JOSEPH (utility): Turned pro with Huddersfield Giants and. as a teenager, played 14 Super League games for the Giants in 2004. Moved to Swinton Lions in 2005, scored 11 tries

in 29 games, and was named NL2 player of the year. Suitably impressed, Hull KR signed him on a two-year deal, but after one season at Craven Park he left the Super Leaguebound Robins to join Halifax, from whom Oldham signed him on a two-year contract.



GARETH LANGLEY (wing): Pacy, and a good finisher, 'Gaz' joined Roughyeds prior to the 2007 season after five seasons at St Helens. He was Saints academy player of the year in

2005 and runner-up in 2006. Played at Salford as a teenager before joining his hometown club at Knowslev Road. In 30 games for Oldham last season, he scored 13 tries and kicked 35 goals for a points haul of

CRAIG LITTLER (centre): Aged 22 and, like Langley, a product of the St Helens Academy system. Both played several seasons at Knowsley Road and developed a fine understanding as a centre-wing partnership. Craig headed off to Australia on an extended holiday at the end of last season, but he signed a new two-year deal on his return after proving to coach Steve Deakin and his staff that he had kept himself in good shape while he was away.

RICHARD MERVILL (prop): Formerly with Halifax and Keighley, Richard had a superb season in his first for the Roughyeds in 2007.

Walked off with two major awards at the end-of-year Awards Night and was rewarded with a two-year contract for 2008 and 2009. Suffered a broken hand in one of his early games in 2007 and was similarly unlucky in the build-up to the 2008 campaign when he dislocated an elbow in training. There will be no complaints from the fans if he bounces back this year like he did last.



MICK NANYN (centre): A points machine - one of the best goalkickers in the English game - Mick has starred for Swinton. Rochdale Hornets, Whitehaven and Widnes and has smashed club

scoring records wherever he has been. He took the Widnes record off Jonathan Davies in 2006. He played 29 games for Widnes last season, scoring 28 tries and kicking 161 goals for a points haul of 434. Also has the distinction of having played in each of the last four NL1 Grand Finals, two for Whitehaven and two for Widnes.

PAUL O'CONNOR (full-back): A Great Britain Students international, Widnes-born Paul played briefly on loan for Oldham in 2006, then returned in 2007 on contract having let it be known to the club that, in the May, he would be leaving for a pre-arranged sabbatical in the southern hemisphere. He had a great first half of the season but he didn't play again for the club until he reappeared in the first pre-season friendly of 2008 at Leeds. Having signed a new two-year deal he is set fair for a long association with the Roughveds.



LUCAS ONYANGO (wing): A real flier, aged 26, Lucas grew up in rugby union in his native Kenya. Has played for Sale Sharks, Manchester and Leigh in rugby union, and Widnes Vikings in League.

He had a great season for Oldham in 2007 when he scored 18 tries in 23 outings only to damage a shoulder at the end of the year. He entered the 2008 season waiting for an operation on that shoulder and was expected to be sidelined at least until the start of the NL2 campaign at Easter.

ROB ROBERTS (back row): Joined Roughyeds in late July, 2007 and landed a match-winning drop goal at York in a 15-14 win on his debut. Played Super League with Hull, Halifax and Huddersfield and also represented several clubs in the National League. Known as 'Two Bobs' - for obvious reasons - he put his career back on track with Oldham after a difficult time at Leigh and revelled in his new responsibilities as

ADAM ROBINSON (back row): A tough-asteak young Yorkshireman, Adam played much of his early rugby at Wakefield. Aged 21 he turned down Featherstone in order to sign for

the Roughyeds last year from Doncaster. A product of the Stanley Rangers amateur club in Wakefield, Adam thrives on his defensive duties but his first campaign in an Oldham shirt was cut short by a shoulder injury on which he had an operation. He is determined to bounce back, having signed a new two-

NEIL RODEN (stand-off): Neil rejoined Oldham from Leigh in 2007 after leaving the club initially to go to Batley in 2004. In his first stint here he scored 290 points (68 tries and 18 drop goals) in 142 games over four and a half seasons. He has overtaken Mark Sibson as the 'new' club's leading all-time try scorer. Last season, he was an influential midfield organiser, playing in all 34 games and forming a more-than-useful half-back pairing in the second half of the season with his fellow Wiganer James Coyle.

LEE SANDERSON (half-back): One of the unluckiest players in the game, Lee is currently on extensive rehab after a major knee reconstruction - and it wasn't the first time he had been under the knife. Extremely talented, and a gifted footballer and goalkicker, his father, Mark, played for Rochdale Hornets and his uncle, lan, was a hooker at Oldham in Watersheddings days. Lee has previously played for Leigh, London, Rochdale and Barrow.



WARREN STEVENS (prop): Yet another vastly experienced performer with more than a century of Super League outings on his CV. This former Warrington and Leigh stalwart was playing with

Blackpool last season on a match-to-match basis when Roughyeds boss Steve Deakin invited him to accept a more permanent arrangement with the Roughyeds. He played only a handful of games at the back end of last season, but Deaks has a load of faith in him as underlined by his new two-year contract.

SAID TAMGHART (back row): A French international, Said has represented his country at every level, including full Test matches against Australia and New Zealand. Came under the influence of Oldham coach Steve Deakin when both were at UTC, better known now as Perpignan-based Catalans Dragons. Said was popular with fans in his first season at Oldham when he made 29 appearances, most of them coming off the bench as an impact forward.

LEE WINGFIELD (utility): Played for Great Britain at amateur level in Russia, France and Australia, but desperately unlucky with injuries since he turned pro for Oldham on a two-year deal for 2006 and 2007. In top form early last year until he broke a hand and then suffered a serious knee injury against Swinton in his first game back, Currently on rehab after an operation, but hoping to be fit to make his comeback in the next few weeks.



One to Watch

MARCUS ST HILAIRE (wing/full-back): A star with Leeds Rhinos, Huddersfield Giants and Bradford Bulls, 30-year-old Marcus has joined Oldham on a twoyear deal. He played 24 Super League games last season, 2007, representing Bradford 19 times on the wing, once as a substitute and four times as fullback when deputising for Michael Platt. His record speaks for itself - 39 tries in 111 outings for Leeds; 37 tries in 74 games for Huddersfield; and 14 tries in 39 games for Bradford.

Head Coach

STEVE DEAKIN, aged 51, and a coach for 24 years, he has seen service with Chorley, Halifax, Sheffield, Keighley, Rochdale, London Broncos and Huddersfield as well as with French clubs Cannes and Catalans Dragons. He also did a brief spell on the coaching staff at Watersheddings in the Peter Tunks era, but he has come a long way since then.

During that time he has won the Challenge Cup as John Kear's assistant at Sheffield and won the French division championship as head coach with Cannes. Fully aware of the task ahed of him.

Steve hopes to realise his ambition of coaching a Super League team, if that can be achieved with his home town club, al the better. He has signed a contract to the end of the 2007

season.

The other important part of my job is to help the clubs development officers to deliver coaching and education programmes in local schools, a place where a number of you may have already met me.


