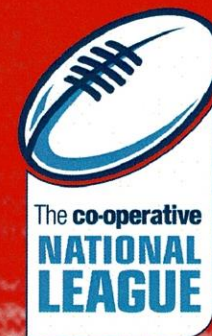

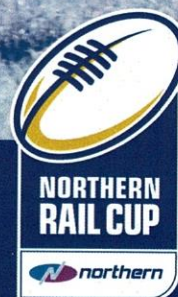

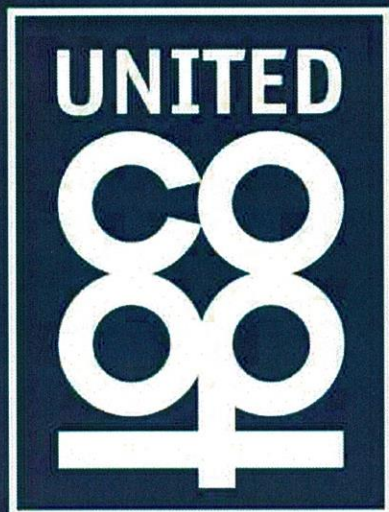

# ROCHDALE HORNETS PLAYING SQUAD

## Craig Robinson (Prop);

During the tough times of the 2007 season Craig always led from the front, never allowing his head to drop. His battling qualities and loyalty to the cause have been rightly rewarded with Craig named Vice Captain for the 2008 season, a fitting tribute to the former Wakefield man. All Craig's 15 appearances came from the bench scoring 4 tries.

## Wayne Corcoran (Half Back/ Loose Forward);

Wayne was another player that showed loyalty beyond the cause during the 2007 season. Despite requiring a shoulder operation for the majority of the season Wayne bravely played on showing immense courage which was all too lacking during 2007 but Wayne chose to fight on unselfishly delaying his operation. Wayne should be back in fitness for the start of February and will be hoping to back up 2007 with another big season. Wayne made a total of 23 appearances 12 from the bench scoring 3 tries.

## Eric Andrews (Wing);

The highlight of 2007 for Eric was the magnificent solo matching winning try he scored in the Challenge Cup verses Celtic Crusaders. That try gave everyone a glimpse of just what Eric is capable of given the space and a chance to run at the opposition which in 2007 was limited. Eric has enjoyed his stay at Hornets and was only too willing to pen a deal for 2008. No-one made more appearances than Eric's 28 in 2007. He scored 10 tries in all competitions.

## Danny Samuels (Loose Forward)

Danny successfully made the transition from U21 to First Team Grade during 2007 and will now be hoping to push on and make a real impact in 2008. Danny was one of the mainstays of last year's successful U21's team making a significant contribution at that level despite suffering a number of injuries.

## Todd O'Brien (Hooker)

A consummate Professional Todd found First Team opportunities limited in 2007 but got his reward for some brilliant U21 performances by featuring regularly in the First Team towards the end of last season. Todd's leadership qualities earned him the Captain's role in the U21's last term but Todd's goal this season will be to cement a place in the First Team. Todd

played the final 3 games of 2007 2 of the appearances being from the bench.

## Sam Butterworth (Stand Off)

Had three great seasons with Hornets from 2004-06 before linking up with former Coach Darren Shaw at Leigh where Sam had an exceptional season and was instrumental in Hornets downfall on both occasions the sides met last term. Sam will have benefited from his time away from the Club but is really pleased to have re-signed for his home town team. Sam played 21 times for Leigh last term scoring 3 tries.

## Paul Alcock (Second Row)

Paul (25) started his career at Warrington Wolves a product of their youth system and spent four seasons there before moving to neighbours Widnes Vikings. Widnes gave Paul his Super League debut v Wakefield in 2001 and he went onto make 15 Super League appearances for the Cheshire Club. His next move took him to Swinton in 2006 having previously had a spell on loan with the Club in 2005. Moved to Hornets in Autumn 2007 citing Bobbie Goulding as the main reason for his decision to switch clubs. In 2007 Paul made 15 full appearances and a further 2 from the bench scoring 4 tries.

## Andrew Marsh (Prop)

Andrew is a product of the highly successful Widnes Vikings youth set up and has also been involved with both the England and Great Britain students' Rugby League teams. Although only 19 Andrew has figured in a number of high profile matches including two Senior Academy Grand Finals and taking part in the Carnegie Students Ashes Series v Australia. His performances in these matches have now earned him a chance in the Professional ranks.

## Chris Spurr (Centre)

Chris (27) has spent his entire career playing in Yorkshire before deciding to take up Bobbie Goulding's offer to refresh his career across the Pennines at Hornets. Another product of the Great Britain Students set up Chris signed professionally for Featherstone in 1997 before moving onto Batley and then York where Hornets secured his signature. Has always featured prominently in the try-scoring column for all the clubs he has played for. Chris featured 28 times for York last term scoring a healthy 12 tries in the

process.

## Martin Ainscough (Standoff)

Product of the Widnes Academy Martin (22) played for both the Junior and Senior academy at Widnes and was awarded junior academy Player of the year in 2002. Another player who has played against Australia for Great Britain Students and also toured Australia in 2003. Martin also played for England Students in the World Cup that was held in Australia. With chances limited at Widnes Martin signed for Leigh for the 2007 season playing 18 times scoring 10 tries.

## Mike Grady (Wing)

Mike is the type of Club man coach Bobbie Goulding enjoys having in the squad. At 26 he has already played at 7 different clubs including French outfit Albi. English clubs he has features for include Warrington Wolves, Whitehaven, York, Oldham and Warrington Wizards. Mike will feature predominantly in the under 21's were the young heads will benefit from his vast experience.

## Jimmy Elston (Hooker)

Jimmy will be the Captain for the 2008 season as his leadership qualities were quickly spotted by the coaching staff. Jimmy is relishing the new challenge presented to him across the Pennines having spent the early part of his career in Yorkshire playing for Wakefield, Dewsbury and latterly with York City Knights. Jimmy's career has been a rewarding one so far having played Super League for Wakefield, made a Grand Final appearance for Dewsbury and gained promotion with York. He will be hoping to continue his successful career in Lancashire. Jimmy operated predominantly from the bench last term. His 12 full appearances were backed up with a further 17 from the bench, ending with a total of 6 tries.

## Chris Foster (Half Back)

A product of Ryland Sharks Chris was taken to Doncaster by John Stankevich during the 2007 season where he impressed, turning in a Man of the Match performance against Hornets at the Keepmoat. Chris won the BARLA player of the year in 2006/07 having picked up the Man of the Match award playing against Australia u18's during the 2007 season. Chris is eager to continue his progress under Bobbie Goulding during 2008. Chris featured 6 times for

Doncaster last year notching 4 tries.

## David Newton (Prop)

Dave re joins Hornets after having a spell away from the club at Swinton and there is no doubt that that he returns to the Club a better player for it indeed he was very highly regarded at Swinton and they were bitterly disappointed to lose him. Dave made a Grand Final appearance for Swinton in 2006. 10 full appearances with a further 10 from the bench was Dave's record last year scoring 2 tries.

## David Best (Prop)

Another player that is in his second spell at the Club having spells at Oldham and more recently Batley in between. David has really matured as a player and his power and toughness upfront will be a major asset to Hornets this season. Dave is a player who feels that he has got unfinished business at Hornets. David's appearances last term were limited to 9.

## Chris Campbell (Wing)

Ian left the Club in 2003 to join Keighley where he made the first of his two Grand Final appearances. Ian then had two highly successful seasons at Keighley before moving onto Swinton and then to his hometown team for a second time Oldham, where he was a Grand Finalist in 2007. His leadership qualities will be invaluable and his knowledge of National League two a great asset for Hornets in 2008. Ian played 24 times for Oldham last season scoring 2 tries.

## Chris Hough (Half Back)

Although only in his mid twenties Chris can be best described as a much travelled seasoned pro. Along with a previous spell at Hornets Chris has played for Oldham, Swinton, Doncaster, Batley and also had a loan spell at Leigh last season. Chris has been a constant thorn in Hornets side over the years and his organisational qualities and kicking game will give Hornets a new dimension this season. Chris was mainly used off the bench last term for Swinton he made a total of 17 appearances scoring 2 tries and 3 goals. At Leigh he made 7 full

appearances scoring 1 try.

## Phil Farrell (Back Row)

Returns to the Club as Assistant Player Coach to Bobbie Goulding having had spells away at Oldham and Batley. Phil is extremely eager to get onto the coaching ladder and sees the position at Hornets as an excellent opportunity to do this. When called upon Phil's on field experience will be an added bonus and his input with the younger players will be typically positive. A mid season departure from Batley only allowed Phil to make 11 full appearances 1 more as substitute scoring 1 try.

## Mark Brocklehurst (Centre)

An "Oldhamer" Mark played his junior rugby at Waterhead where he was picked up by Wigan. Mark played a couple of seasons in the junior ranks at Wigan before he joined Swinton at the start of the 2007 season. He scored four tries in 14 appearances last term for the Lions.

## Alex Brown (Wing)

A powerful winger who joined Keighley at the start of the 2006 season from the amateur game he was playing for the Huddersfield Sharks club. He became soon became a crowd favourite at Keighley scoring a number of long range tries which earned him the 'most improved player' award at the end of the 2007 season. Alex scored six tries in 14 starts last season. Alex was looking for a new challenge in 2008 and was delighted to become one of Bobbie Goulding's first signings.

## Craig Farrimond (Back Row)

Craig played his junior rugby at Warrington Wolves where he captained their Senior Academy and gained a promising reputation earning himself a place in the Super League U21s select squad. He has since played for Oldham and Swinton where he has been extremely unlucky with injuries over the past couple of seasons. Now fit and raring to go Bobbie will be hoping for big things from him in 2008. Craig was restricted to 4 full appearances last term with 7 more from the bench.

## Andy Gorey (Wing)

An extremely quick outside back Andy spent the early years of his career at Oldham where he became a first team regular after coming through the Academy where he was coached by current Hornets U21's coach Shaun Gartland. Andy started 7 games last season for Oldham scoring two tries. He has been playing for Oldham Rugby

Union Club during the closed season.

## Wesley Lawton (Hooker)

One of the four players signed in the close season from NL3 team Warrington Wizards, after a string of impressive performances when being watched by Bobbie. He comes with a reputation as a tough tackling number nine and will be looking to take his chance when it is presented to him.

## Danny Shaw (Wing)

Speedy winger who was in the National League Conference team of the year last season scoring 25 tries for Warrington Wizards. Danny has age on his side being able to play in the U21's but he will be hoping to take his first team opportunity when it comes along. He will be one of the quickest players in Hornets 2008 squad.

## Tom Wild (Prop)

A Scotland B international Tom was also a member of the NLC team of year last season and is now looking to make the step up to NL2 after a big pre season.

## Mike Callan (Prop)

After coming through the ranks at Warrington Wolves where Mike made four Super League appearances for them off the bench in the 2002 season, he moved onto Leigh where he played in the promotion year of 2005. Mike's career then took him to Blackpool then on to Oldham. After taking a year out of the game Mike is now looking forward to making a big impact in 2008.

## Mike Stout (Centre/Second Row)

Another player renowned for having a quick turn of foot, Mike has played for Swinton, Blackpool and Oldham after coming through the academy at Widnes. Mike started last season at Oldham where he scored one try in 4 appearances, he then moved on to Blackpool where he scored seven tries in 17 appearances in what was a struggling campaign for the Panthers. Mike is relishing the new challenge presented to him at Hornets.

## Mark Roughneen (Full Back)

A goal kicking utility back, Mark is in his second spell with Hornets after playing in the club's academy in his early years. The fourth recruit from the successful Warrington Wizards team of last season whom Bobbie is keen to have a closer look at.

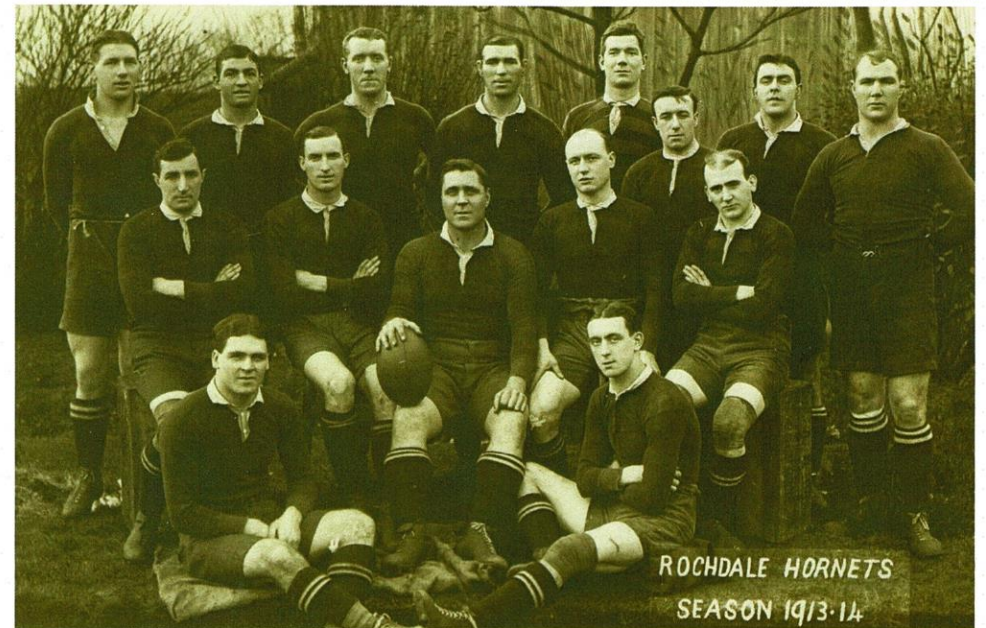
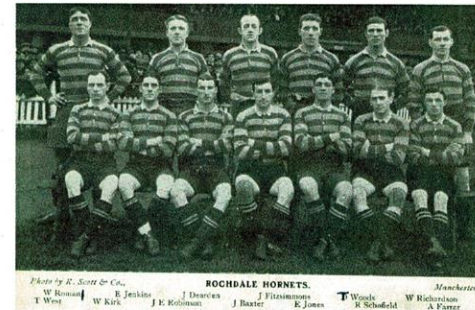

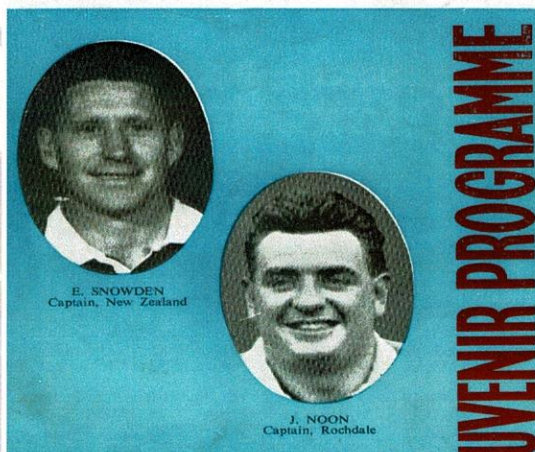

The player who scored the try was A. J. Van Helden, the famous South African, and he was playing wing for Wigan against Oldham in the Rugby League Challenge Cup Final of 1924.

No far anyone seems to agree, but almost everyone with the right often they are supposed and sometimes surprisingly and not as should be supposed if he is told that Van Helden died between the legs of a horse, on which was seated a policeman, he never did by near the Athletic Ground. Some even say, with so many years having passed by, that he jumped over the horse. The police, unaccounted truth is that Van Helden, getting a crumple from his colleague, Parker, and he crash the horse in front of a mounted policeman.

**THRILLING FINAL**  
The explanation for the presence of horns on the playing field is that the mounted police had to be completely on the tour throughout this memorable day.

I would like to take the opportunity to introduce Ray Clark and myself to all you loyal fans who suffered whilst watching the "NETS" slump to 3rd from the bottom of the Second Division last season.

When I accepted the job I had no illusions about the task ahead and moved quickly to appoint my old mate Ray Clark, a fine coach in his own right, as my right hand man. Ray teamed up with me at my former club Mansfield Marksmen and we dragged the NE Midlands outfit from near oblivion to a respectable Top 8 position over a 16 month period.

Quite frankly, when we joined Rochdale Hornets during the summer we inherited an ill-disciplined, disgruntled, disillusioned and depleted squad. I had to move quickly to increase the size of the squad from 14 to 18 players by selling Ruane to Oldham for £13,000 plus Chris Hyler and bringing in Jeff Brown (free), Alan Derbyshire (free), Steve Turner (free) and an amateur Fulback.

I had no alternative but to recommend the sale of Ruane because in addition to the player requesting First Division rugby the Hornets Board made it clear to me that there was no money available for team strengthening. By bringing in 5 players for £1 and netting a £13,000 profit I have gained vital breathing space for the board and myself.

The task ahead is daunting but Ray and myself are confident that by the end of the season the "NETS" should have developed into a respected workmanlike outfit — JUST BEAR WITH US!

# Games to Remember

## Hornets 30 Oldham 24

### 8th August 2004

It was a scorching day at Spotland - but when the heat was on, Hornets rose to the challenge.

And this was a typical blood and thunder derby - no quarter asked or given and bubbling over into the occasional scrappy fracas. With Bobbie Goulding feeling the effects of a pulled quad in the warm up, Liam McGovern started at scrum half and it was his chip that drew a foul from the Oldham defence after five minutes that gave Braddish the first points of the afternoon.

Oldham responded almost immediately; quick hands wide saw Johnson edge in at the corner.

Hornets replied in kind. The next foray into Oldham territory saw Tommy Hodgkinson crashing through tacklers, refusing to be grounded. As defenders swarmed around him he slipped a neat ball out of the back for Darren Robinson to reach in from close range.

Then came the sin-binning of Dave Alstead on 21 minutes. Picking-up an Oldham drop out, the touch judge ruled that his foot was on the line and, hence, out of play. Having checked first where his foot was, Alstead was understandably peeved; the touch judge took offence at being told so and Alstead was dispatched.

Oldham ran the penalty and two tackles later had exploited the extra man for Dodd to score.

But 12-man Hornets took the game to Oldham. First a jinking break from Janan Billings took him through a busy defence, but his pin-point pass to Gorski who scooted in was deemed forward - despite the fact that Billings had visibly turned to make the pass. Then Richard Varkulis fumbled the ball over the line. Oldham exhaled and on 34 minutes Brennan found himself on the end of some good passing to score.

Half time 8-18 and Hornets simmering at chances missed.

Hornets began the second half in determined mood. 48 minutes: quick hands to the right saw Michael Platt squeeze Dave Alstead in at the corner. Braddish added the extras from wide out.

Hornets added Sam Butterworth to the mix and took the kick-off possession deep into Oldham territory. Marsh was sin-binned for holding down Andy Gorski; Hornets took the ball close to the Oldham posts; Butterworth picked up from

acting half and, while the defence shaped to handle the expected pass, a change of pace and angle saw Butterworth cruise through to score.

Hornets were level and Oldham looked decidedly frazzled.

But Oldham struck next; a napping Hornets defence standing off Roden who capitalised to score. 20-24 and with the game coming nicely to the boil, Hornets hit the gas.

On the hour Richard Varkulis blasted through flapping defenders; his run took him 40 metres and, as the cover arrived, he picked his pass perfectly for Hornets top scorer Chris Campbell to dash in at the corner.

Just two minutes later, Hornets were back on the attack. With the Oldham defence in disarray, Michael Platt's looping run from the back of the ruck took him clear; outpacing the scrambling cover for a superb effort. Braddish added the extras; Oldham looking increasingly desperate.

Both teams sucked in for the last quarter. Oldham's pack throwing itself onto the resolute Hornets defence; Hornets looking increasingly likely to make the crucial break through Cunliffe and the non-stop Gorski.

With the clock ticking down, the game boiled over; Robinson and Roden exchanging blows in an all-in scramble. The resulting penalty was Oldham's last chance to salvage the game. Ex-Hornet Jon Roper scuffed the penalty and missed touch; Campbell gathered and Hornets played out the clock.

The hooter brought the main stand to its feet and Hornets celebrated a superb, huge-hearted performance that had seen them claw back a ten point deficit and outscore Oldham 22-6 in the second half.

Bobbie Goulding was full of praise for his players - Particularly Tommy Hodgkinson and Lee Hansen whose refusal to take a backward step pounded the Oldham pack into submission.

Once again, Bobbie Goulding's Rochdale Hornets have proven that playing with spirit, commitment and no little nous is everything you could ask for. The sheer elation on the faces of the players showed how much it means to win in the red, white and blue - and showed that, not only can this side stand the heat; it can serve up superb Rugby League too.

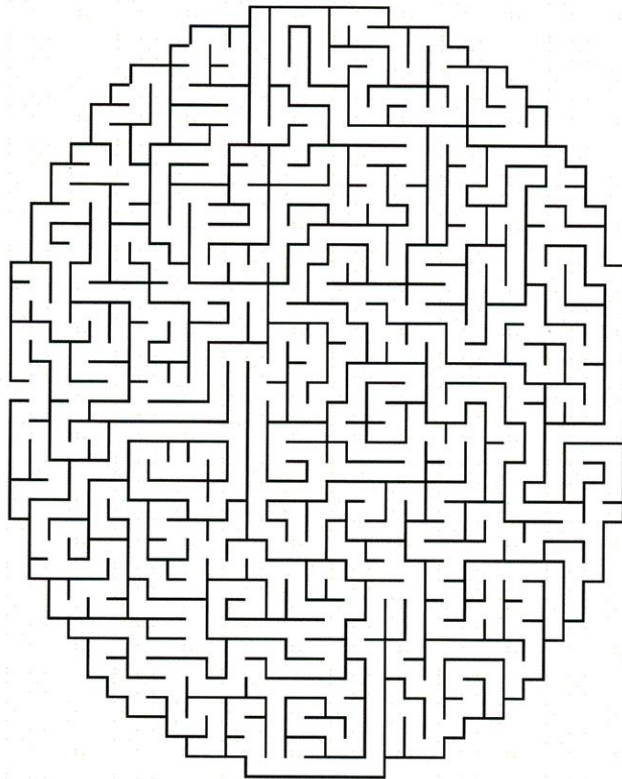

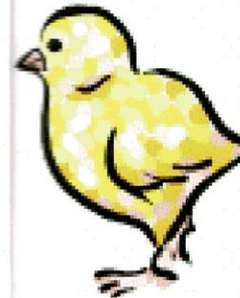

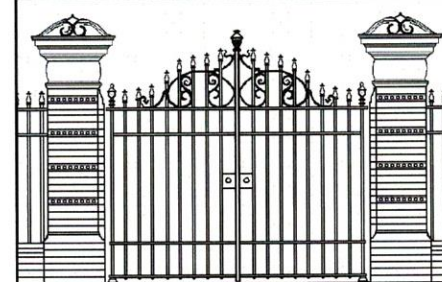

# WORLD CUP

Hello and welcome to the Latest "Build Up to the World Cup".

Last time out we crossed the English Channel to the look at the French Rugby League, this time we look across the Irish sea at our near neighbours Irelands history in the game.

## IRELAND

The seed of modern-day Rugby League in Ireland was sown when in 1989 the Dublin Blues were formed and founded by Brian Corrigan. They consisted mostly of rugby union players who wanted to stay fit over the summer.

The Blues competed against touring teams from Britain and surprised many of the touring sides with the quality of their play, scoring many memorable victories over British amateur teams.

In early 1995 the British Rugby Football League marketing arm financed the position of a Development Officer for Ireland, providing a massive boost to the growth of the game.

In the same year Ireland formed its very first competitive team to play against the USA in Washington on St. Patrick's Day. Ireland won 24-22 with Wigan legend Joe Lydon coming on as a replacement. He had gone out there as a manager but was drafted in to play. Terry Flanagan, Huddersfield Coach and former Great Britain player and Niel Wood, Director of British Student Rugby League, coached the team.

Competitive matches were established between teams in Leinster and Ulster: Schoolboy matches were played between Dublin and Belfast schools, Open Age Clubs competed against each other in the All-Ireland Challenge Cup. Teams included Belfast Wildcats and Bangor Vikings from Ulster. From Leinster, there were Dublin-based Dublin Blues, North Side Saints, Tallaght Tigers, Churchtown Warriors and Bray-based East Coast Panthers. From Munster the Cork Bulls were formed under the guidance of Ex-Dublin Blues stalwart Peter McNamara. Northside Saints and Cork Bulls had their successes but the long-established Dublin Blues were always pre-eminent and there or thereabouts when it came to the trophy presentations.

In August 1995 Ireland beat Scotland at the RDS in Dublin. The game was played as a curtain raiser to the British Charity Shield encounter between Wigan and Leeds. The Irish team that day included former Great Britain player Des Foy.

In 1997 more England-based Super League players made themselves available for Ireland by use of the grandparent rule. The Irish team improved its standards but this development gave less opportunity for Irish-based players to get a chance to play. However, Irish-based players were included in the Irish squad for the triangular tournaments in 1998 against France and Scotland and 1999 against Scotland and Wales.

Their success was enough to earn a place in the 2000 World Cup. Finishing top of their group, the Irish eventually lost 26-16 to England in the quarter-finals, but the performance set the scene for future developments in Ireland.

In 2006 the Leinster and Munster conferences were abandoned in favour of an all-Ireland league. This had great difficulties while it attempted to compete with the Rugby Union season and unfortunately the end of the season was scrapped in order to get to the play off finals. Hard lessons were learnt as a result of this. At the AGM in 2006 the league structure was again reviewed and this time the shorter season was agreed on but with a tiered system. The tiers would allow newer teams and less experienced teams to play against one another and continue their development while the more established teams would compete against each other and enhance the players skills for games against other representative teams.

And in 2007 a three league approach with the Elite league and two conferences based on geography gave the game a terrific boost. The newly elected executive also set about making the product more recognised and developing new relationships with potential sponsors. The Leeds Rhino's brought their pre season training camp to Dublin. The leagues each had a major sponsor and all results were published in various media outlets. The wolfhound draw was converted to the Wolfhound Supporters Network.

Ireland has played in 22 full internationals, winning 14 and losing seven with one draw. As it is not a full member of the Rugby League International Federation, these matches are not considered to be tests. Ireland has also played friendlies against Australia and Scotland that are not included in these results.

The Ireland A Wolfhounds team is selected from players in the Irish domestic competition. This team is administered by Rugby League Ireland.

# OLDHAM PEN PICS

**CHRIS BAINES** (back-row): Signed on a two-year deal for 2008 and 2009 following the good impression he made on Roughyeds in the previous two seasons. Aged 23, he joined the club originally on loan from Warrington. Toured New Zealand with Great Britain Young Lions in 2003 after representing his country at youth level against Australia and France. A product of Wigan St Pats.

**SIMON BALDWIN** (prop): One of the most experienced forwards in the squad, formerly with Leigh, Halifax, Sheffield, Salford, Rochdale Hornets and Whitehaven. Having ended last season at Whitehaven and having had two spells with hometown Leigh, Simon has made his seventh move in a long career to sign a one-year Roughyeds deal. Made 127 Super League appearances, mainly in the second-row, but now widely regarded as a prop.

**JASON BOULTS** (prop): This 24-year-old former Bradford and Halifax workhorse was a real stalwart of the Oldham pack in 2007. He played in 25 games and for much of the season he was first-choice No 8 after producing an outstanding performance in the win at Celtic Crusaders in May. A wholehearted grafter with a huge engine, Jason never takes a backward step.

**MATTY BROOKS** (half-back/hooker): Joined Roughyeds last season on loan from Hull KR, scoring two tries in 17 appearances and ending the campaign with a terrific show as a substitute in the NL2 Grand Final against Featherstone at Headingley. Now a fully-fledged Oldham player on a one-year deal he will have to make the adjustment from full-time pro with Rovers to part-time footballer with Roughyeds. Turned pro for Bradford, then on to Hull KR. A native of East Hull.

**DARYL CARDISS** (utility back): Aged 30, this hugely experienced utility back has played for Wigan, Halifax, Warrington and Widnes. Joined Wigan from Hunslet Boys Club in 1994. Made a total of 142 Super League appearances and scored 46 tries in the elite competition. Enjoyed a fine stay at Halifax, for whom he scored 39 tries in 99 outings.

**JAMES COYLE** (scrum-half): Now contracted to Roughyeds until November, 2009, this talented 22-year-old joined the club from Wigan midway through last season and made an immediate impact. His 14 appearances yielded six tries, but it was the vast number of tries he made for others that underlined his real potential. Another product of Wigan St Pat's, he was a shooting star in Wigan's academy system before spending the whole of the 2006 season on loan at Widnes.

**TOMMY GOULDEN** (back-row): Equally at home in the second-row or at loose, 26-year-old Tommy was a key member of the Rochdale Hornets pack in 2006 and 2007, having been signed from amateur rugby in Leigh by Bobbie Goulding in 2005. Leigh born, he picked up every possible honour as an amateur, including captaincy of BARLA Great Britain, before turning pro for Rochdale.

**TOMMY GRUNDY** (back-row): Aged 22, Leigh-lad Tommy is one of the younger members of the Roughyeds squad. Can play equally well in any of the back-row spots as well as centre. Turned pro for Warrington as an 18-year-old, then played for Leigh and Blackpool before returning to his hometown club, Leigh, for 2006 and 2007. Joined Roughyeds on a two-year deal.

**DANNY HALLIWELL** (centre): One of eight new signings, 26-year-old Leighborn Danny was on loan at Leigh, from Salford, last season and he has also worn the colours of Halifax, Warrington and Wakefield. Can play anywhere across the back division and, like many of his Oldham colleagues, has considerable Super League experience. His 43 top-flight outings comprise three for Wakefield, 10 for Wigan, 25 for Halifax and five for Leigh.

**SIMEON HOYLE** (hooker): Edinburghborn Simeon is half-way through a two-year contract with Roughyeds. Aged 28, and formerly with Keighley Cougars and Halifax, he is a hooker of the old school, tough in defence but with an ability to make things happen from dummy half. In 2003 he helped Keighley to win promotion to NL1 by beating Sheffield in the NL2 Grand Final.

**PHIL JOSEPH** (utility): Turned pro with Huddersfield Giants and, as a teenager, played 14 Super League games for the Giants in 2004. Moved to Swinton Lions in 2005, scored 11 tries in 29 games, and was named NL2 player of the year. Suitably impressed, Hull KR signed him on a two-year deal, but after one season at Craven Park he left the Super Leaguebound Robins to join Halifax, from whom Oldham signed him on a two-year contract.

**GARETH LANGLEY** (wing): Pacy, and a good finisher, 'Gaz' joined Roughyeds prior to the 2007 season after five seasons at St Helens. He was Saints academy player of the year in 2005 and runner-up in 2006. Played at Salford as a teenager before joining his hometown club at Knowsley Road. In 30 games for Oldham last season, he scored 13 tries and kicked 35 goals for a points haul of 122.

**CRAIG LITTLER** (centre): Aged 22 and, like Langley, a product of the St Helens Academy system. Both played several seasons at Knowsley Road and developed a fine understanding as a centre-wing partnership. Craig headed off to Australia on an extended holiday at the end of last season, but he signed a new two-year deal on his return after proving to coach Steve Deakin and his staff that he had kept himself in good shape while he was away.

**RICHARD MERVILL** (prop): Formerly with

Halifax and Keighley, Richard had a superb season in his first for the Roughyeds in 2007. Walked off with two major awards at the end-of-year Awards Night and was rewarded with a two-year contract for 2008 and 2009. Suffered a broken hand in one of his early games in 2007 and was similarly unlucky in the build-up to the 2008 campaign when he dislocated an elbow in training. There will be no complaints from the fans if he bounces back this year like he did last.

**MICK NANYN** (centre): A points machine -- one of the best goalkickers in the English game -- Mick has starred for Swinton, Rochdale Hornets, Whitehaven and Widnes and has smashed club scoring records wherever he has been. He took the Widnes record off Jonathan Davies in 2006. He played 29 games for Widnes last season, scoring 28 tries and kicking 161 goals for a points haul of 434. Also has the distinction of having played in each of the last four NL1 Grand Finals, two for Whitehaven and two for Widnes.

**PAUL O'CONNOR** (full-back): A Great Britain Students International, Widnesborn Paul played briefly on loan for Oldham in 2006, then returned in 2007 on contract having let it be known to the club that, in the May, he would be leaving for a pre-arranged sabbatical in the southern hemisphere. He had a great first half of the season but he didn't play again for the club until he reappeared in the first pre-season friendly of 2008 at Leeds. Having signed a new two-year deal he is set fair for a long association with the Roughyeds.

**LUCAS ONYANGO** (wing): A real flier, aged 26, Lucas grew up in rugby union in his native Kenya. Has played for Sale Sharks, Manchester and Leigh in rugby union, and Widnes Vikings in League. He had a great season for Oldham in 2007 when he scored 18 tries in 23 outings only to damage a shoulder at the end of the year. He entered the 2008 season waiting for an operation on that shoulder and was expected to be sidelined at least until the start of the NL2 campaign at Easter.

**ROB ROBERTS** (back row): Joined Roughyeds in late July, 2007 and landed a match-winning drop goal at York in a 15-14 win on his debut. Played Super League with Hull, Halifax and Huddersfield and also represented several clubs in the National League. Known as 'Two Bobs' - for obvious reasons -- he put his career back on track with Oldham after a difficult time at Leigh and revelled in his new responsibilities as captain.
