

Former Leeds Rhinos youngster Kyle Briggs has scooped the co-operative National League Two Player of the Month Award for March after a tremendous start to the season with Doncaster.

Briggs, who has started the year on loan at Hunslet before sealing a permanent move to the Keepmoat Stadium, has been described as "a real gem" by his coach Ellery Hanley.

But he grabbed the headlines by notching 22 points at Blackpool in a 54-12 victory and was League Weekly's man of the match in his side's 36-18 win over the Lions three weeks ago.

"He's only 19, but he's got a real cool head on his shoulders. When you're being pushed hard, like against Swinton, he just knows how to come up with the right play at the right time to keep us on the front foot." Dons director of rugby Carl Hall said.

"There's no doubt that Kyle can go on to play Super League. I remember when Ellery came back from signing him and said we'd just signed a real gem for the future."

Briggs was chosen as the top prize winner after a selection process involving League Weekly's match reporters and The Co-operative National League Two coaches. The thirteen includes the Lions' very own Marlon Billy, who has scored nine tries in seven appearances for the club this season.

Today's game is a one-off in the cup, so I urge our loyal fans to get behind us this afternoon and out-voice what I expect to be a large contingent from Oldham.





Keighley turned over Oldham last weekend. Gareth Walker looks at how the currently undefeated Cougars' side was built

KEIGHLEY Cougars' outstanding start to the NL2 season, which included Sunday's stunning win over today's visitors, Oldham, is just reward for the club's show of faith in coach Barry Eaton.

The former Dewsbury, Batley and Widnes scrum half is now in his third season at Cougar Park, having initially been appointed to work alongside Peter Roe. Now in complete charge on his own, Eaton is making an early play for the NL2 Coach of the Year award.

But at other clubs with more short-sighted views, he might not even have been in a job. When Eaton arrived at Keighley ahead of the 2005 campaign, he found a club who wanted to invest in talented local young players.

That was always going to take some time, and in the last two seasons the Cougars finished 11th and 10th in National League Two. For many coaches, that would have meant the end of their tenure in charge, and a predictable look towards another new boss.

But Keighley showed faith in Eaton, and that is starting to pay real dividends for the Yorkshire club. The two years of rebuilding that Eaton was allowed to undertake has seen the likes of James Feather, Gavin Duffy and Richard Knight become established first team players.

Those three, and a host of other players, have been able to progress to the extent where they are now key members of an undefeated side that is second in NL2.

Alongside those, Eaton was then given the budget to bring in a number of experienced National League players during the close season to add to his squad.

Several shrewd captures - Neil Lowe, George Rayner, Dan Potter, Jon Presley and Jamaine Wray among them - have bedded in superbly so far. Lowe and Rayner both scored try doubles in Sunday's stunning 26-12 win over Oldham, which was played in front of a crowd of 1,276.

That prompted one caller to a local radio station to hail the return of 'Cougarmania' - the boom time that the club experienced in the 1990s. Back then, their average home attendance was well in excess of 3,000, and the club was one of the strongest outside the top flight.

While that radio caller's declaration might be a touch premature, the signs are that Keighley can continue to make significant progress in coming seasons.

In an era when the game's administrators are hailing the benefits of the Super League licence system allowing clubs to plan for the long-term, it just shows what can be achieved with a little foresight in the National League as well.

Ten years ago Steve Deakin played a role in a Challenge Cup fairy tale that came true when he was part of John Kear's Sheffield Eagles coaching team that plotted the downfall of Cup giants Wigan Warriors in one of the all-time shock Final results at Wemblev.

In 1998 Eagles were written off as 'no hopers' when they faced the mighty Wigan but they stepped up to sink the Warriors 17-8 in front of a national television





Eighty years to the week since Swinton last won the Cup, Ian Jackson looks at the 1928 journey that faced the Lions on the road to the final

ELVE CU S

As the Lions continue their Challenge Cup campaign this season, it is exactly 80 years since the club last won the trophy.

On Saturday 14 April 1928 Swinton defeated Warrington by 5 points to 3 at Central Park in Wigan to lift the Challenge Cup for the third time in their history. The victory was part of the historic achievement of winning five cups in one season. Also, the match was Swinton's third successive appearance in the final having lost to Oldham the previous year but beaten the same club in the 1926 final.

With a great parallel this season, in the first round of the Challenge Cup 80 years ago, the Lions made the long trip to Cumberland to play the top amateur side Whitehaven Recreation and won by 44 points to nil. There were ten tries in all, including Dick Cracknell (5) Frank Evans (2) Chris Brockbank, Bert Morris and Miller Strong plus seven goals from Bert Morris.

The second round was a much sterner test at Halifax with one try from Jack Pearson ensuring victory by 3 points to 2. To prove it was no fluke, the Lions went back to Thrum Hall the next week in the league and won 5 points to 3.

In the third round, the Lions were at home, then the Chorley Road ground, where they beat a determined Castleford side by 3 points to nil thanks to a Frank Evans try.

The semi-final was yet another close affair at Fartown, Huddersfield. There was a 12,000 attendance (with gate receipts of £792) to

witness the Lions overcome Hull by 5 points to 3. This time a Jack Evans try and a single Bert Morris goal secured victory and the Hull try was one of only two times in the entire competition that the opponents crossed the Swinton line.

This victory set up the Lions for a Challenge Cup final appearance and the last time before the final was moved to the Empire Stadium, Wembley.

In the final, Swinton lined-up as follows:

Full back Billy Young; three-quarters Frank Evans, Hector Halsall (captain), Jack Evans, Chris Brockbank; halfbacks Albert Atkinson, Billo Rees; forwards Miller Strong, Henry Blewer, Bert Morris, Martin Hodgson, Dick Cracknell and Fred Beswick.

Chris Brockbank put the Lions ahead from a perfectly-timed pass from Jack Evans. It was also Jack Evans who scored a vital drop goal to ensure the victory after Warrington had equalised following a try from Seeling.

The attendance was 33,909 and the gate receipts totalled £3,159. The Swinton team continued its fine form a few weeks later beating Featherstone Rovers in the Championship Final and thereby winning five cups in all during the glorious 1927-28 season.

IN PROFILE

THE CHALLENGE CUP

Last night, five historic rugby league trophies were reunited in central Manchester as the club celebrated the eightieth anniversary of winning "All Five Cups"

This week we look at the history of one of those - the Rugby League Challenge Cup

The clubs that formed the Northern Union had long been playing in local knockout cup competitions under the auspices of the Rugby Football Union, the most famous being the Yorkshire Cup. However, during the build-up to the 1895 split, the rugby union authorities refused to sanction a nationwide tournament, fearing that this would inevitably lead to professionalism.

After the schism of 1895, the break-away clubs were free to go-ahead, and they instigated the Northern Rugby Football Union Challenge Cup, a competition that was to become the most famous rugby league tournament in the world.

In 1896 Fattorini's of Bradford were commissioned to manufacture the Challenge Cup at a cost of just £60. Fattorini's also



supplied three-guineas winners' medals then valued at thirty shillings. The first competition was held during the 1896-97 season, which was the first season entered by the Lions, and 56 clubs entered to compete for the trophy.

The first final was held at Headingley in Leeds, on the 24th April 1897, and saw Batley defeat Saints 10-3 in front of a crowd of 13,492. Just three years later, in the 1899-1900 season the Lions won their first Challenge Cup, defeating Salford by 16 points to 8.

The competition was interrupted by the First World War, though it was held in 1915, when the season that had begun before the war was completed. It was then suspended until the end of hostilities.

During the 1920s, when Swinton were a dominant force in the game, the club took the trophy on two occasions - firstly in 1926 when they defeated today's rivals, Oldham, at Rochdale by 9 points to 3, and secondly in the famous 1927-8 season, when the club also won four other trophies, on this occasion defeating Warrington 5-3 at Central Park in Wigan.



Originally the final tie was held at one of the larger club grounds in the north, however, noting the excitement in Huddersfield that the town's soccer team were playing at Wembley in the FA Cup Final, the rugby league authorities voted to relocate to the recently built Wembley Stadium in London. The first final held at Wembley was in 1929 when Wigan beat Dewsbury 13-2 in front of a crowd of 41,500.

In 1946, the Lance Todd Trophy was introduced and awarded to the man of the match. The winner is selected by the members of the Rugby League Writers' Association present at the game and the trophy is presented at a celebratory dinner at The Willows. In 2006 St Helens scrum-half Sean Long became the first player in the history of the Challenge Cup to collect a third Lance Todd trophy following his man-of-the-match performance in the final against Huddersfield Giants. His other Lance Todd trophy wins came in the 2001 and 2004 Challenge Cup Finals.

Until the 1993-1994 season there were very few amateur clubs included in the cup, typically two. For part of the 1980s and the 1992/1993 season the cup was solely for professional clubs. The competition was then opened up to large numbers of amateur clubs, several of whom have defeated professional opposition.




