




"I was disappointed with the result; after the first 20 were lined-up in the tunnel before we entered the field minutes we should have been more than six points up so there's that disappointment.

"But I'm also very pleased with the character that they showed towards the end of the second half when they came back from the dead and made a real contest of it." he added.


Another person with plenty of Challenge Cup experience is Wildcats scrum-half Danny Brough.

Brough was part of Kear's Hull FC team that won in 2005 and is in excellent form so far this season:

"He comes up with big plays doesn't he? Like that kick for the 20.1 thought Danny and also Brad Drew showed signs against Wigan of why we brought them in so that's another pleasing aspect to see."

Another plus point for Kear was that his Wildcats came through the game unscathed; a welcome relief after the growing number of injuries sustained so far, which left Kear with no choice of team for the Wigan game.

Kear said: "We were down to our last 17 and that was Wigan's strongest team so that's something else we can take from it. There was only Sean O'Loughlin to come into the Wigan team and we've got an army of blokes who have been sat in the stands watching the game so that's heartening for us as well; to show we're competitive when we're so depleted is very heartening."





Since his move from Hull FC last year. Wildcats prop forward Kyle Bibb has had to wait patiently for his chance to pull on a Wakefield shirt.

That patience paid off when he made his debut in the Round 11 clash away at the Huddersfield Giants, coming off the bench to help the Wildcats seal an 18-16 victory in front of the SKY cameras.

That began a run in the team for the 21-year-old which culminated in his first start in Wakefield colours in last weekends defeat to Wigan.

He said:"It was frustrating to wait so long before making my debut and it was brilliant to finally start a game for the Wildcats. It was just disappointing we didn't pick up the win. The boys tried hard but we just couldn't quite

"Learning from a player like Danny has been a great. He's a top bloke and I really look up to him. He helps you and talks to you and shows you how to do something

"Of course the other props like Ricky Bibey and Adam Watene are excellent to be around too and they help you to improve your game as well.

"Getting to play with players like them was a factor in my decision to come to Belle Vue."

The spotlight swings back to the Challenge Cup with the arrival of Oldham this afternoon and despite a limited number of appearances this season, Bibb has already made his mark on the competition with two tries against Barrow in the last round.

He said: "That was one of my best games. It was a great match to be in and great to be involved in a Challenge Cup game.

"The atmosphere was different and there was a lot more buzz about it and it was a big occasion for the players playing in it."

With the winners of today's match just 80 minutes away from a place in the Challenge Cup final, Bibb is wary of looking too far ahead and insists the Wildcats will take it one game at a time.

He said: "We've got to give it everything we've got against Oldham because it will be a tough match and they're going to raise their game against us.

"And next weekend it's back to the Super League so our focus will shift back to our goal of a top six finish so we've got to keep our minds right and concentrate on the next game."

His run in the team meant that Bibb got to play against the Castleford Tigers at the Millennium Magic weekend in Cardiff, an experience he will not forget in a hurry.

He said: "It was amazing. I'd never experienced an atmosphere like it as a player and it really was a magic weekend. It was great to be involved in the match and





meaningful matches between Wakefield and Oldham. Wakefield of course missed the initial cut for Super-League whilst Oldham were included but struggled, on the skills. and off the pitch, to live with the new era of Rugby League. This weeks guest therefore is one selected on shared experiences with both of today's competing clubs, rather than from one particular game - Paul Round, in his own words 'a mans man - a players player', a real contributor to the sport - on and off the pitch, even if some of his experiences are best described as 'team bonding' exercises

We started off with the swap deal that brought Paul, and Paul Lord, to Wakefield in exchange for Ged Byrne, and I suggested that Wakefield perhaps got the better of the deal. "He didn't play much at Oldham either and me and Paul, well I went on to play another 100 and odd games probably - after I left Wakefield."

So was it a surprise to come to Wakefield? "Well yeah that was out of the blue; especially after that season; we'd a new coach, Peter Tunks, and he'd made me Club Captain; then 6 weeks into the season he said 'I've done a deal - I want Ged Byrne'; whether it was the Chairman

or the Coach I don't know, but between them I thought 'well, obviously they don't want me here, so I'll be as well away, than be not where I'm wanted!' Once they try and get rid of you you've got to go to pastures new. I'd no hesitation in going, but I'd made my home in Oldham then and Toppo and Tiger wanted me to move over there but I couldn't, 'cause when I'd moved to Oldham from St Helens I'd started living in Oldham and I just wasn't prepared to up and move again."

You were part of a back row that included GB internationals Gary Price and Michael Jackson, "Yeah, there was potential, but the first full season I was there I had a bad knee injury in a pre-season friendly; I did the ligaments in my knee. I was out ooh, well before Christmas, 'cause that was the year we played in the Yorkshire Cup against Sheffield, I was injured then, so that was a big disappointment for me, but I was in plaster a good while.

So your place was taken by Darren Fritz? "He was another player's player." Rumour has it that Darren won't come back to Wakefield as a result of his encounters with the local women? "Well no. I'm definitely not commenting!"

You played alongside some great players in your time Unfortunately, you have to east your memories back here, "We had Wrighty; unfortunately he was dogged some considerable time to come up with memories of with injury and he never really got chance to play to his potential and he had to finish early which was a shame, but he was a fabulous player, he had all the talent, all

> You also appeared in the same side as a young Henry Paul. "He's another one; he's gone on to bigger and better things and done everything he ever dreamed of."

> Toppo did always seem to have a good eye for talent "Toppo and Tiger - they were a good partnership them two - good cop / bad cop! He'd never do it unfairly - he always had reason to do it, although you never thought so at the time - you don't do you but, yeah - it was good. they were a good partnership - they worked well

"You know, I think as a team we probably let them down a bit. You know, we never fulfilled our potential as a team: we may have just lacked in one or two places, the key players, to really spark the team. We were a bit 'hit and miss' which is frustrating for a coach - and players. alike. There were no superstars at Wakefield - apart from Jacko!"

But you had some high points - such as beating Leeds broke into the team and played a handful of games in 17-0 at Headingley. "That was certainly one of the highs of being at Wakefield, it rivalled - I've played in some good derbies you know. Saints-Wigan and when I went to Halifax, Halifax-Bradford – and they were all good he had a good time with the lads now and then but, derbies you know, and you had a lot of them, as you know, you had Cas', you had Featherstone, you had Leeds; them 3, Cas. Featherstone and Leeds, you had to get your game up every one, you know, every one of them games; you had to be on your mettle or you'd get a good drubbing."

Do you have strong memories of the old Watersheddings ground? "Oh yes - it was a place and a half that - it was worth 5 points every game that. Just the surroundings and the wet and the cold, and the crowd, you know, it was very similar to Bradford really - where you have to go through the crowd, it was like walking the gauntlet. It was even for when you played at home, if you had a bad game they used to give it you. you know, the speccies. But yeah, I've some good memories there; I was a record buy for them when they brought me there. It went to tribunal and they had to pay 65 grand for me; Saints wanted 100 grand and they said 'no. we'll take it to tribunal' and it got set at 65 grand which was a record; that was '87 - eech, 20 years

And before that you played for your hometown club St Helens? "Yeah, I never played any amateur Rugby of sorts - I went straight from school as a 16 year old. I



82/83 and then I played quite regular in 83/84, then in 84/85 I was in the side when Meninga was over here. He was very quiet, he kept himself to himself, you know, more family man than anything, but he was an awesome bloke. He played in 2 finals that year; and he won them, virtually both, single handedly. He played in the Lancashire Cup Final and beat Leigh at Wigan and then we beat Hull KR in the play-offs at Elland Road. He was just phenomenal! I managed to play in the Lancashire Cup Final, but missed the Premiership one - I didn't get

Today's game is in the cup - did you ever get to play at Wembley? "Yeah I scored a try at Wembley - when we lost to Halifax. I remember it to this day; a little runround on the 5-yard line and a crash just to the left of the sticks. I got a bit giddy; that night it was 30 yards, but it was just a 5-yarder, a run-round round Graham Liptrott, it gives me some pride.

So is it fair to say that you played hard and drank hard? "Well yeah - those were the times when you could. Now they don't, but they get paid a lot more - it's a lot more high profile and it's a lot harder game. I don't think the bodies could take the punishment!"

Do you think that ever got in the way of the Rugby? "Well every Australian coach I've had has got rid of me! They couldn't handle me or, let's put it this way -there's a clash of personalities! Peter Tunks got rid of me at Oldham, then Steve Simms got rid of me at Halifax, then lo and behold. I was at Bradford - I broke my jaw and I'd had one first team and two A' team games; then Peter Fox got the bullet and then they got Brian Smith and he didn't offer me another contract so that was it, I retired then and I started work!"

Paul now works for a demolition company based in Oldham. Of course there have been many defences which have been 'demolished' by Paul down the years and we are privileged that many of those occasions were whilst wearing the Red. White and Blue of Wakefield Trinity - long before the Wildcats were invented. A different era; a different breed of player, but they certainly earned our respect all the same.

If you look hard enough, you'll find 'em! MARTYN SADLER, the editor of Rugby Leaguer & League Express, gives the Wildcats some credit for their recruitment policy.

In last Monday's 'Rugby League Express' I wrote about the reservations that some people have about increasing the number of clubs in Super League to 14 in 2009.

The problem is that if two new clubs are given the nod in July to enter the competition next year, they are likely to struggle to find players, particularly of the quality required to mount a credible challenge to the other Super League clubs.

And there wouldn't be much point in bringing in two new clubs simply to have them propping up the table and diluting the strength of the competition.

My proposal was for the RFL to announce the names of two new clubs for Super League, but to delay their admission until 2010, while giving them the right to negotiate with players who will be coming out of contract by the end of the 2009 season. That is the only way, as far as I can see, that the new clubs will be able to hit the ground running. Otherwise, if they enter Super League in 2009 who will they recruit?

There are players in the National Leagues, but very few Super League clubs recruit players from this source. In fact Wakefield are one of the few clubs that have recruited National League players and turned them into respectable Super League players.

In fact Wakefield coach John Kear seems to have perfected the art of recruiting players that other clubs probably wouldn't touch, and making a silk purse from a sow's ear.

Just look at Danny Brough, for example, who was shown the door at Hull FC by Kear's successor Peter Sharp, I wonder whether Sharp, who was himself sacked recently at Hull, ever regretted that decision. Brough joined Castleford, spent a season

with them in the National League, but now leads the Albert Goldthorpe Medal table, which can be viewed online in its entirety on www.totalrl.com/medal.

I don't need to tell Wakefield supporters about Kear's other recruits from National League clubs, but it shows that if you are determined to look hard enough then you will find the talent. And you don't have to go to Australia in order to do it.

In fact I wonder whether we are near the point at which the attraction of signing overseas stars begins to fade. When you look at Warrington's recent troubles, and you consider how much they have spent this season on overseas players, you have to ask whether it's worth it.

A couple of years ago Wakefield had an almost exclusively Australian squad. Kear has put that right, I'm glad to say. Of the nine Wakefield players who have earned points in the Albert Goldthorpe Medal table this season, six of them are English. And I am delighted about that.

A strong start to the season has seen the Oldham Roughyeds lose just once in seven Co-operative National League 2 games and they will be looking to add a Super League scalp to their promising season this afternoon.

And with a Challenge Cup semi-final spot up for grabs, Oldham and the Wildcats will battle until the end to take one step closer to the final at Wembley Stadium.

The early season Northern Rail Cup clashes provided fans an insight into what to expect from the team this season. They finished second in their league table only to the Salford City Reds, who last season were plying their trade in the Super League, and beat them 18-14 at home with a last minute try from Mick Nanyn.

Confidence at the club was high as the Roughyeds started the league campaign with three victories.

The first one came at the expense of the Rochdale Hornets who were disposed of 46-32, but not before Oldham almost threw away the game after leading 30-4 at half time.

A scare early on in their next game against the Hunslet Hawks meant that Oldham had to come from behind to win. Frustrated early on, Steve Deakin's men fell behind 6-0 but once prop Jason Boults crossed the try line Oldham never looked back en-route to a 40-12 victory.

A six minute blitz against the York City Knights proved to be the turning point as the Roughyeds recorded their third straight National League 2 win of the season 36Mick Nanyn converted tries from Tommy Goulden, Said Tamghart and Paul O'Connor in the early stages of the second half to give the home side a 32-14 lead and they showed grit and determination in holding off a skilful and pacy York side.

Oldham came back down to earth with a bump in their next league outing going down 26-12 at the hands of the Keighley Cougars.

But since then, they have matched their form at the start of the season and have embarked on a three game unbeaten run, kick-started by a second derby win over the Hornets this season. A scrappy affair saw Oldham eventually run out 24-14 winners after a failed Rochdale comeback.

A visit from Blackpool was next up for Oldham and they remained unbeaten at home this season despite a hat-trick for Panthers' former Roughyeds winger Damian Munro.

The 38-26 victory was followed up by another home win, against Swinton, 13 days later by a score of 30-20.

The Boundary Park outfit suffered cup heartache last weekend as they bowed out of the Northern Rail Cup at the quarter-final stage against National League I side Batley Bulldogs and they will be keen to avoid a repeat of that against John Kear's Wildcats.

John Kear will know all about his opposite number today as Deakin was his assistant in the Sheffield Eagles side that pulled off the shock of the century in that famous victory over Wigan in the 1998 Challenge Cup final. Deakin took charge of Oldham two years ago and last season guided the Lancashire side to the National League 2 Grand Final. He joined the Roughyeds from Les Catalans Dragons after the French club sacked him just three months prior to their inclusion in the Super League. Deakin has a wealth of experience with coaching roles at Halifax, Sheffield, Keighley, Rochdale, London Broncos, Huddersfield and with French clubs Cannes and the Dragons to his name.

Key Players

Marcus St Hilaire

The Huddersfield born utility player joined Oldham at the beginning of 2008 on a two-year deal, which chief executive Chris Hamilton described as a 'massive' signing for the club. He can play either wing or full-back and has a wealth of experience having tallied up over 200 Super League appearances. The 30 year old played at Bradford Bulls last year and has an excellent scoring record, having scored over 70 tries. He will be looking for a big game this afternoon, having already experienced the big time in the Challenge Cup after playing in the 1999 Challenge Cup final at Wembley.

Mick Nanyn

A key player for the Roughyeds, Mick Nanyn has built a formidable reputation within the National League ranks and is new at Oldham for the 2008 season. The goal-kicking centre has played for Swinton, Rochdale, Whitehaven and Widnes previously and has broken club points records at all them clubs, taking the Widnes record off Jonathan Davis in 2006. He's a player who has all the experience when it comes to big games, having played in each of the last four National League Grand Finals so definitely a player to watch out for today.

Tommy Goulden

Another new player at Boundary Park this year is Tommy Goulden. The former Rochdale Hornet can play either second-row or loose-forward. It was Hornets coach Bobby Goulding who snapped up Goulden from amateur level, where he earned a number of accolades. He captained the BARLA Great Britain team and last year was named Rochdale's Supporters Player of the Year.

MATCH REPORT WILDCATS 30-38 WIGAN WARRIORS SUNDAY 25TH MAY 2008





A late fight-back from John Kear's men proved in vain as Wakefield Wildcats went down 30-38 to Wigan Warriors at Belle Vue Stadium.

> Wigan raced into a 18-32 lead with little of the game remaining but two tries both converted by scrum-half Danny Brough gave the Wildcats a sniff of victory before a final try to Harrison Hansen sealed victory for Brian Noble's troops.

The lead switched hands several times in the first half with Wakefield taking the lead with the first try of the afternoon on five minutes.

It was Wildcats' winger Damien Blanch who touched down after Brough's kick found Ryan Atkins; only for Wigan's Pat Richards to dislodge the ball from his hands, but Blanch was on hand to take the score. Brough converted.

10 minutes later and the Warriors drew level after Thomas Leuluai stepped through the Wakefield defence to score by the posts; an easy conversion for Richards.

Wakefield had the opportunity to take the lead again with a penalty attempt but Brough's effort hit the posts to deny him.

It was Brough however who orchestrated the next try on 26

minutes. His kick through looked to be going dead only for Scott Grix; who stepped in at stand-off in the absence of Jamie Rooney, to palm the ball backwards for Jay Pitts to touch down for his first Super League try.

Once again Brough converted but almost instantly, Wigan hit back following Wakefield's failure to re-gain possession from the kick-off.

And it didn't take long for Wigan to capitalise on the mistake when Andy Coley barged over and Richards converted to level matters.


Wigan went in two points in the lead at the break after Richards booted over a penalty kick but not long after the re-start Tony Martin put Wakefield ahead by four.
