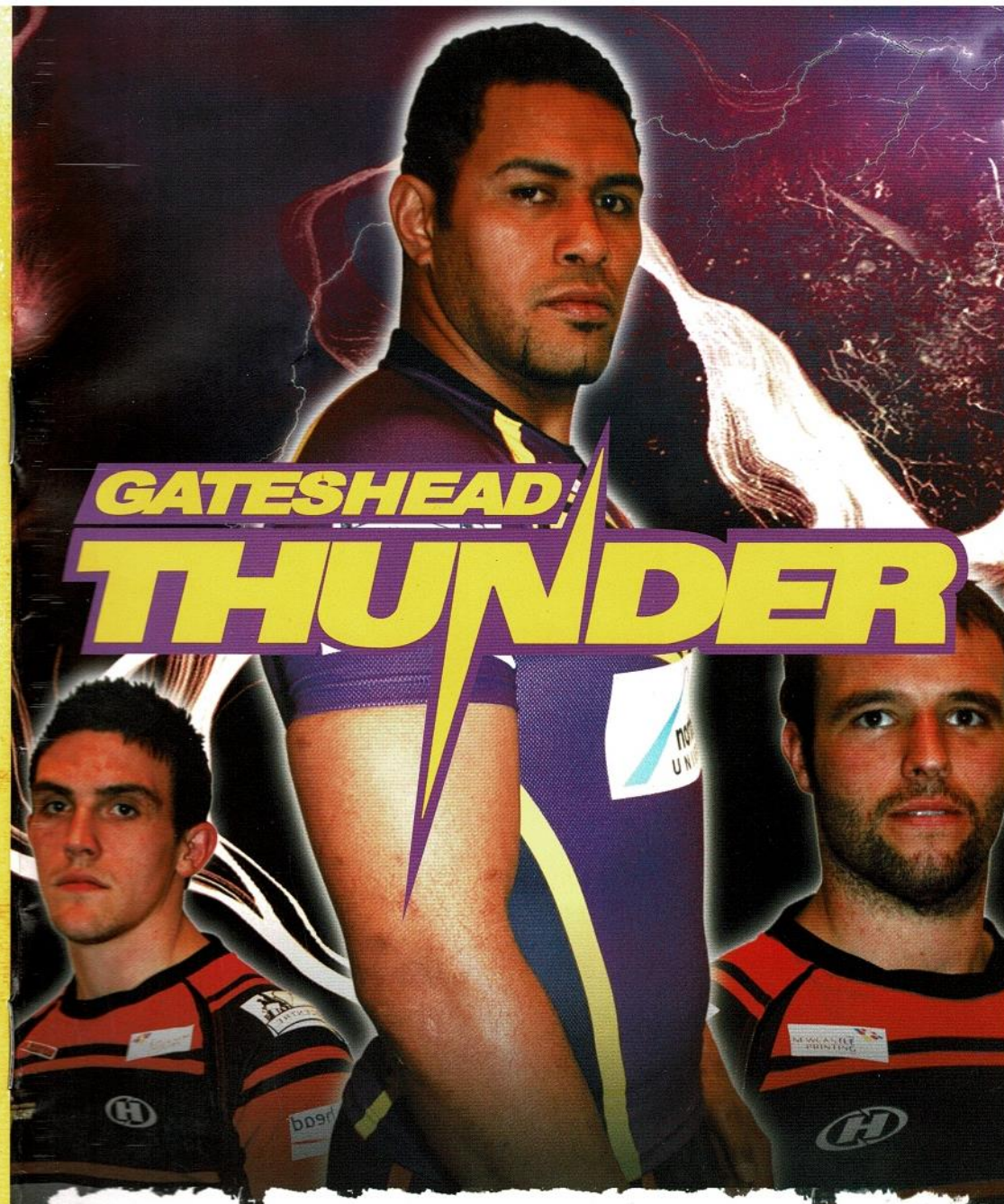

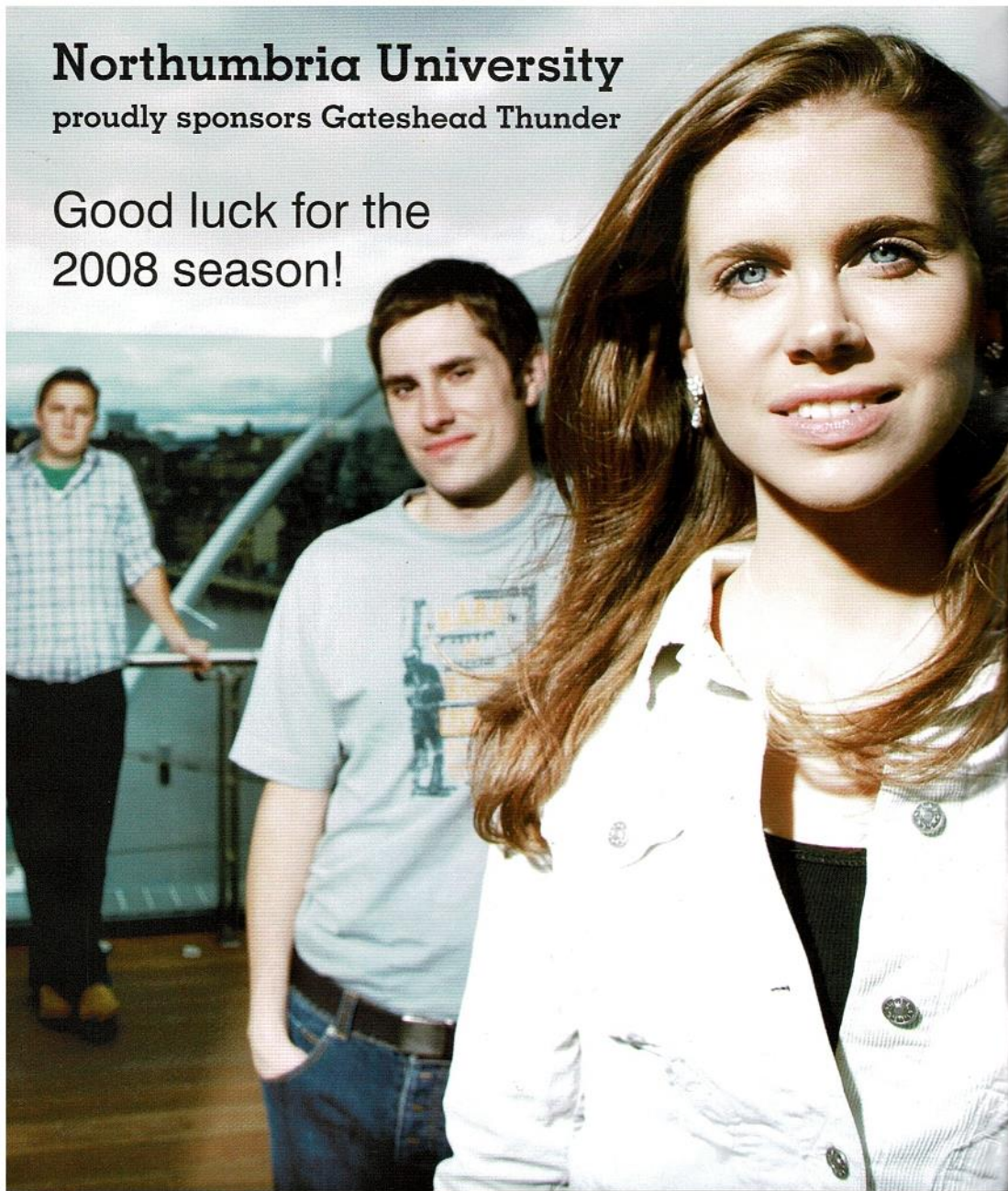

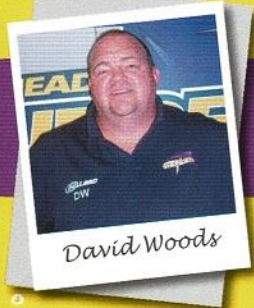

I must again stress, due to us achieving higher than everyones expectations, we really need the support of everyone in the North East, so bring some friends along to the greatest game that is played.

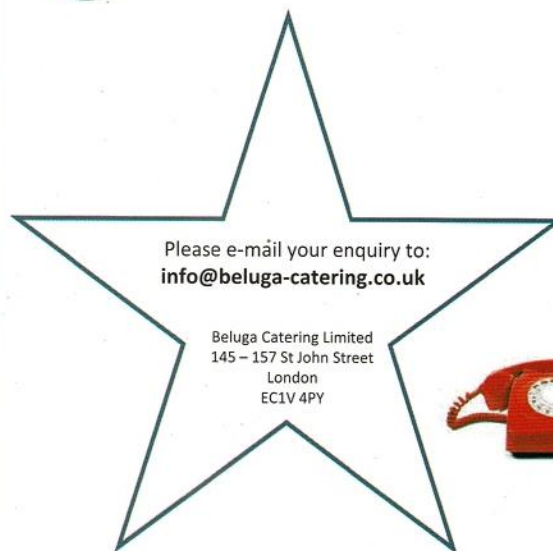

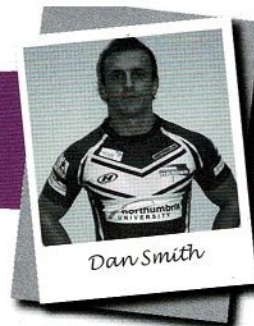

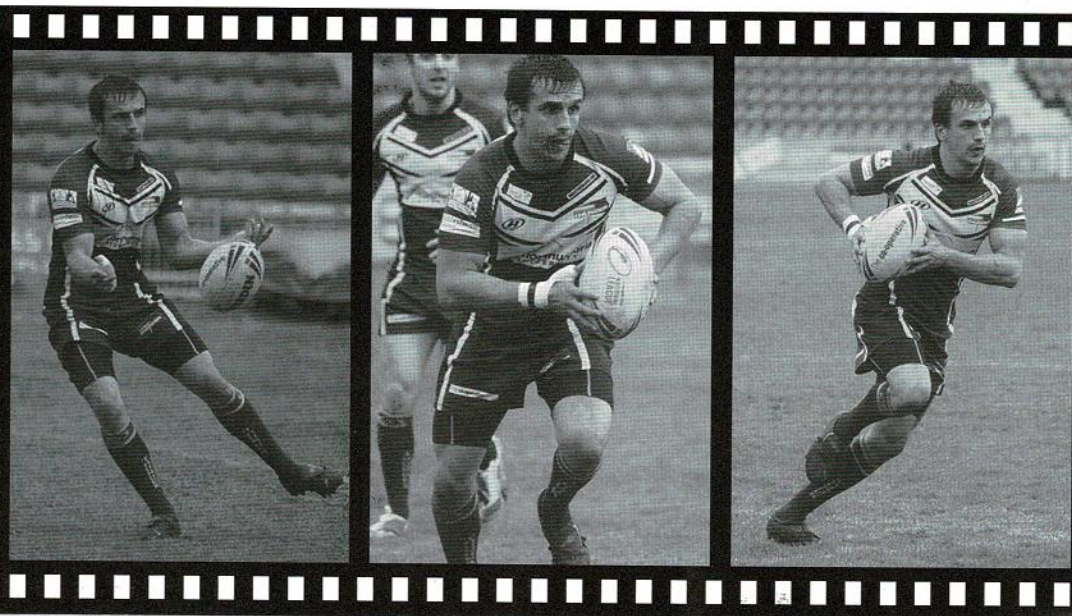
What are your hopes for the rest of the season?

OPPOSITION HISTORY

It was 1876 when Oldham Football Club was founded as a result of a meeting in the Prince Albert Hotel. A playing field was organised at Sugar Meadow, Gartside Street, adjacent to Glodwick Spinning Mill and changing facilities were provided at the nearby Shakespeare Inn. The first match, on 21st October, was against Stalybridge. After 2 seasons they joined Oldham Cricket Club at the new Clarksfield ground before moving to their permanent home at Watersheddings. They were one of the original 22 clubs that formed the Northern Rugby Football Union in 1895. In 1899, Oldham were the 2nd club to win the Challenge Cup by beating Hunslet 19-9. (Batley won the first 2 finals). It was in the 1st round of the competition that the club had their record victory of 63-0 against Goole. They lost in Challenge Cup finals in 1907, 1912 and 1924 but defeated Hull KR in 1925 and won it for the 3rd and last time in 1927 when in their 4th consecutive final they beat Swinton. In the first title race in 1895/6 they finished 4th. A year later, 2nd and won it in 1904/5. They won the Lancashire League in 1897/8, 1900/1, 1907/8, and the Lancashire Cup 1906/7. Title success followed in 1909/10 when they also won the Lancashire League and Lancashire Cup. In 1910/11 they again won the title and in 1912 the record attendance was set when the visit of Huddersfield drew 28,000 spectators.

POST WAR YEARS

If pre-war results were successful, and they were as this brief synopsis suggests, then the 1950's were the glory years with some record breaking players wearing the club shirt. On Monday, 15th September, 1952, record receipts were taken when Watersheddings hosted the Kangaroo tourists before a crowd of 19,370. Some of the player statistics are as follows, bearing in mind it was 3 points for a try: Alan Davies, 391 appearances, 174 tries, 1 goal, 524 points. John Etty, 150 appearances, 90 tries, 270 points. Frank Pitchford, 305 appearances, 105 tries, 1 goal, 317 points. Bernard Ganley, 341 appearances, 1,358 goals, 2,761 points. While they were Division 2 champions in 1963/4 in the 1970's the club were not fortunate enough to win any honour but in 1979 the club recruited Terry Flanagan, who became the youngest captain at 19. In 1987/8 and 1989/90 the club won the Divisional Premiership but the 80's may be remembered by rugby league followers by former Oldham player and schoolteacher, Phil Larder, effectively introducing whole new coaching criteria to rugby league after watching 'The Invincibles' tour and then going to Australia and USA to learn first-hand what had made the Australians so superior. Both he and former Oldham player and coach, Mike Ford have been successful defence coaches in the other code. The 1990's were a difficult decade for the club. Australian Peter Tunks was appointed captain and coach but with the club close to relegation he resigned and was replaced by the man he brought to the club, fellow Australian Rob Lindner, who was assisted by Andy Goodway, who had left the club for Wigan in July 1985, for £60,000, where he enjoyed a hugely successful playing career. The last game Goodway played for Wigan was here at the GIS, in the Charity Shield in 1992 against St. Helens. With Lindner in charge the club avoided relegation and Goodway succeeded Lindner in May 1994. He remained in charge before going to Paris St. Germain. The club avoided merging with Salford to become Manchester for the purposes of Super League. Instead they became Oldham Bears. They were relegated the following year, 1997, went bankrupt and they sold Watersheddings. In December Oldham Roughyeds were formed and they were to share Boundary Park, home of Oldham Athletic AFC.

THE NEW MILLENNIUM

Mike Ford, was coach when he left the club one month into a new 3 years contract in December 2001 and Alliance coach Mark Knight was put in temporary charge. The club just missed out on promotion to Super League losing to Widnes in the Grand Final. In January 2002 John Harbin took over as coach and that year the club played at Hurst Cross, Ashton Under Lyne, following a dispute with the other club sharing Boundary Park. In July Harbin left to be replaced by Steve Molloy. They won 7 and drew 2 of their remaining 14 games meaning that when the Northern Ford Premiership split they gained entry to National League 1. In 2003 they reached the last 4 play-offs. In 2004 they made the play-offs but Molloy parted company with the club in September that year and in October Gary Mercer was appointed coach. In March 2005 the club entered a Creditors Voluntary Agreement (CVA). In October that year John Pendlebury replaced Mercer but he left in March 2006 after only 3 games and current coach, Steve Deakin took over. The season finished with only 1 win and they were relegated to National League 2 although the club paid its final payment of the CVA and would stay at Boundary Park for 2007 season after reaching agreement on a sliding scale rent. After a few games into the 2007 season, excavation and demolition firm, The William Quinn Group acquired a large stake in the club. Bill Quinn became the new chairman, with previous owners Chris Hamilton and Sean Whitehead remaining as directors. On 4th May and 30th August last year, the games against Celtic Crusaders were both televised by Sky Sports. In the match at Oldham's Boundary Park, 4,327 fans attended to make it National League 2's highest crowd. Oldham lost the Grand Final to Featherstone and this season were recently beaten in the quarter finals of the NRC and come to us tonight having just played Wakefield Wildcats in the quarter finals of the Carnegie Challenge Cup. For those wondering what a 'Roughyed' is the definition I have means a wearer of a rough felt hat worn mainly in Oldham. It is a nickname for a person from Oldham and is derived from the rough felt used in the hatting industry which was once a major employer in the town.

NATIONAL LEAGUES TALK

Flashback Time

As an interesting experiment, this week's column will take a look back to the first summer season, and what each current National League club was doing on the third weekend of May back in 1996.

Three clubs are ineligible of course, with Celtic Crusaders, London Skolars and Gateshead Thunder not having been formed 12 years ago. But for the rest of the clubs, there are some interesting facts to look back on - this week we'll deal with current NL1 clubs, and next week NL2.

Salford, coached by Andy Gregory and on their way to the old Division One title, won 32-10 at home to Featherstone in 1996. A crowd of 3,130 saw six Salford tries, including two to Nathan McAvoy and one for Sam Panapa.

Featherstone finished the year in a credible fourth placed, and on that day scored tries through Neil Summers and Martin Pearson. They were coached by former Great Britain international David Ward.

Halifax were in super league back then, and on the third Sunday of May 12 years ago, were winning 32-18 away at Leeds Rhinos. Craig Dean scored two tries and John Schuster slotted six goals in front of 10,028 supporters.

Also in the top flight then were Sheffield Eagles, and May 19, 1996 saw them beat Oldham Bears 23-10 at home. Current coach Mark Aston kicked three goals, while Keith Senior was among their try scorers as the Eagles moved to fourth in the top flight that day.

In contrast, Leigh Centurions were a mid-table Division Two team then, and on this particular weekend, lost 15-14 at Chorley. Two men who have gone onto coach at the club, Dave Ingram and Alan Hadcroft, crossed for tries at Victory Park.

Batley Bulldogs would finish 1996 at the foot of Division One, and went down to a 34-8 home defeat to Keighley Cougars in front of 2,148 fans. Club legend Glen Tomlinson scored their only try.

Whitehaven, then nicknamed the Warriors, would end the year one place above the relegation positions, and on May 19, 1996 gave Hull FC a run for their money before losing 19-22 at the Recreation Ground. Halfback Steve Kerry, on loan from Huddersfield, scored a try and kicked a drop goal in defeat.

The two remaining current NL1 clubs, Widnes Vikings and Dewsbury Rams, played each other on that same day.

The Vikings, still coached by Doug Laughton, won 36-24 in an exciting contest at the old Naughton Park, with Shane Cooper, Steve McCurrie, Mark Preston, Stuart Spruce and Darren Wright among their try scorers. Among Dewsbury's responses were tries from Kevin Crouthers and the club's young player coach, a certain Neil Kelly, while Barry Eaton kicked four goals.
