



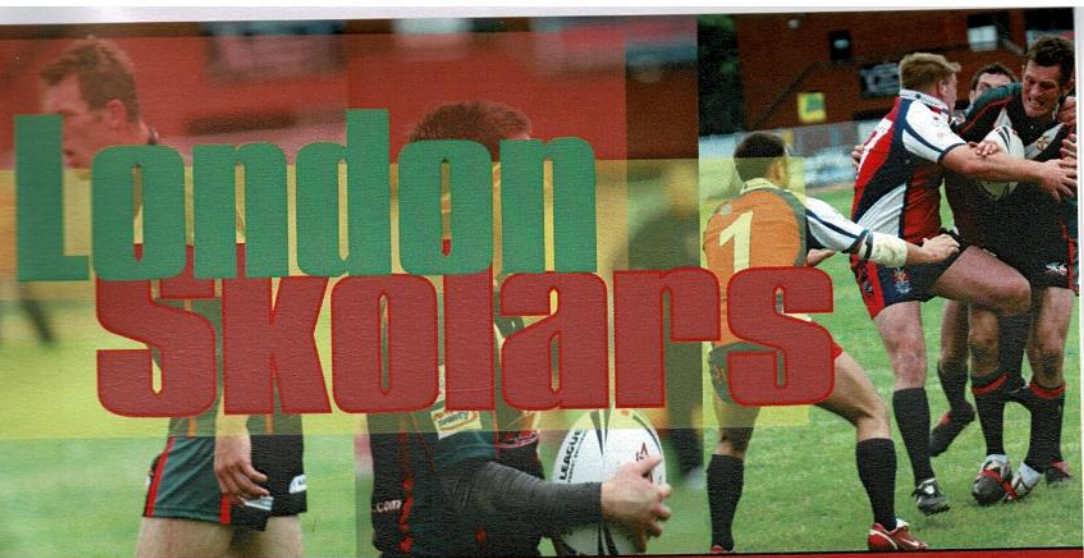

A 26 year old Samoan he was part of the Penrith Panthers NRL squad in 2007. Before that played for Easts Tigers in Brisbane, where he played in the second row alongside Mark Cantoni, a Skolars' favourite from a few seasons ago.

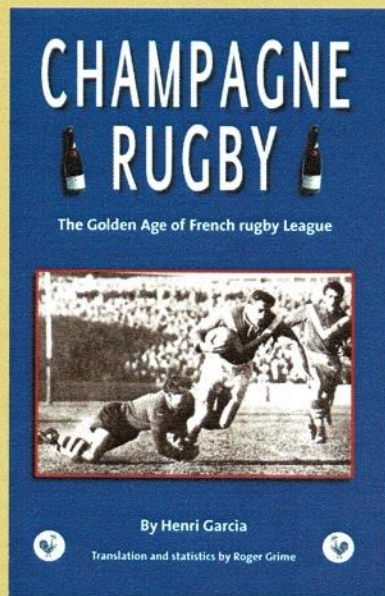
It's also been good to have Stevie Gibbons back after he completed his studies back in Ireland. That's given us a lot more options at half-back and hooker. Another player joining us in the last few weeks is Joe Brown, a Londoner who comes to the club on loan from Doncaster, after spells at London Broncos and Salford City Reds. He caused Oldham a lot of problems up at Sedgley Park and I'm looking for the same again tonight.

What we do need to change is our consistency. We've had some periods of dominance in both our last two games, but lost the initiative too often through our own errors. This week is a tough one, playing Barrow on Saturday, followed by Oldham tonight, but I know Oldham have had a very busy last few weeks because of their involvement in the Carnegie Challenge Cup. Great that a side from NL2 could make it to the quarter finals and with two sides from NL2 in the semi-finals of the Northern Rail Cup (one of which we beat in the group stages), it just shows the quality of this league.

Rules of the game - the basics

Starting the Game

The team that wins the coin toss has the option to kick or which end of the pitch to defend. In the event of choosing to kick, the opposing captain will have choice of which way to play. At the kick off the ball must travel at least 10 metres forward and bounce in the field of play. If it doesn't do this the team kicking off will be penalised. Also when a team concedes a score it has to restart with same type of kick from the half-way line.

Play-the-Ball

Every time a player is tackled, all defenders, apart from a maximum of two markers, have to retreat 10 metres from the play-the-ball area. This will be marked by the referee (in other words the defending side retire back to the referee). The defending side may advance when the ball is rolled back by the foot. If they move forward early, or don't, retire far enough back, a penalty will be awarded.

Six Tackles

A tackle is completed when the ball or the ball-carrying arm of the player has touched the ground and a tackler is touching him. After six tackles the ball must be handed over.

Offside

If a player is in front of a teammate who kicks the ball forward, he is offside. He is back onside if the receiver who gets the ball runs 10 metres, or fumbles the ball, or the kicker overtakes him.

Foul Play

High tackles (contact above the shoulders) are not allowed, and incur a penalty (a kick for goal, a kick to touch followed by a fresh set of six, tackles, or - if the team wishes, just a set of six, tackles. Stealing the ball from a player when there is more than one player involved in the tackle, or impeding a man when he hasn't got the ball is also illegal.

40/20 Rule

If a player standing no more than 40 metres away from his own try line manages to kick a ball in general play which bounces in the field of play then goes into touch inside his opponents, 20-metre area, his side gets the head and feed at the scrum, almost certainly giving them possession again and six more tackles in an attacking position.

Indeed he is no doubt on the shopping lists of Hull, Huddersfield and Warrington, I hope he stays in London as he has brought new young talent through as well as turning round the careers of a few players discounted by other clubs.

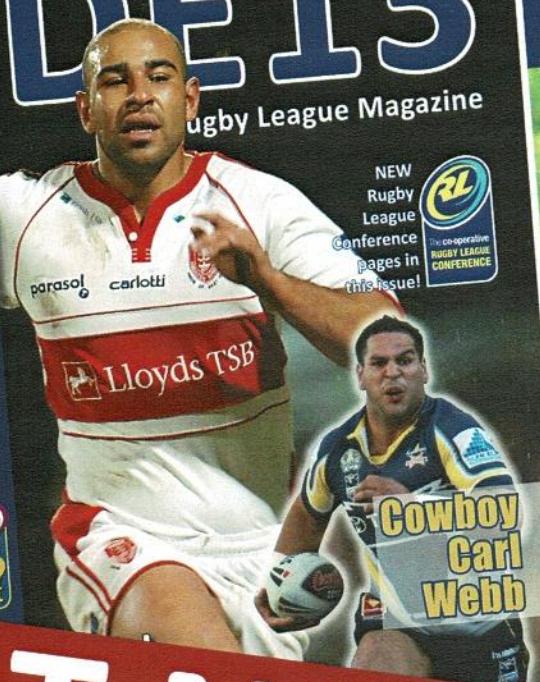

Roughyeds To Watch

It's only 11 days since Skolars took on Oldham and the top points scorer that day was Mick Nanyin, who joined the club this season, having previously played for Swinton, Rochdale, Whitehaven and Widnes, where last season he scored 28 tries and kicking 161 goals for a points haul of 434. He also has the distinction of having played in each of the last four NL1 Grand Finals, two for Whitehaven and two for Widnes.

With last season's leading try scorer Adam Hughes no longer with the club, the second highest try scorer in 2007 was Lucas Onyango who racked up 18 touchdowns. He is one of two of tonight's players to have represented their country in the Commonwealth Games, being part of the Kenyan squad in the RU sevens for the 2002 Commonwealth Games in Manchester. A move to Sale Sharks RU followed, before starting his RL career with Widnes Vikings in 2005.

Half back Neil Roden is fast approaching his 200th game for the Roughyeds. He is in his second spell at the club, having also played for Batley Bulldogs and Leigh Centurions. He also has the distinction of having played in each of his club's two Grand Finals - the defeat by Widnes in the Northern Ford Premiership Grand Final of 2001 and the loss to Featherstone Rovers in the NL2 Grand Final of 2007.

Joining Roden in the half-backs is James Coyle. The 22 year old Wiganer joined the club last season and quickly made a big impression. He comes from a family with a strong tradition in the game with both his father and grandfather having played for their hometown club, also as halfbacks. His quality was recognised at an early age when he was picked for the North-West Counties under-16s tour of Fiji, New Zealand and Australia in 2001 alongside James Roby and Harrison Hansen.

Challenging these two for a half-back place, but also being able to play at hooker is Matty Brooks, who played against Skolars for Bradford in Dublin in 2005. A period at Hull KR followed, with loan spells at York and Oldham, with the loan becoming permanent after impressing last season.

Another member of the Oldham squad to have played against Skolars at Dublin is Gareth Langley, who made his Super League debut for St Helens soon afterwards in 2006. Despite hailing from St Helens, it wasn't until he was 15 that he took up the oval ball, previously having been on the books at Wigan Athletic.

Making a strong contribution in their victory against Skolars was Oldham's Welsh international and club captain Rob Roberts. 'Two Bobs' has added some vital experience to the pack since joining midway through the 2007 season. Leeds-born Roberts has played at Super League level for Hull, Huddersfield and Halifax and has also played for Keighley and Leigh as well as having a stint in Australia.

Another international is French winger Said Tamghart, who played for UTC (now Catalans Dragons) under current Roughyeds coach Steve Deakin. Apart from his impressive pace, Tamghart is also recognisable by his distinctive footwear (or rather lack of one part of it).

Steve Deakin will be a familiar name to many London RL fans, having been assistant coach at the Broncos. Now in charge of his home town club, the capital will also bring back memories of one of his greatest successes, winning the Challenge Cup with Sheffield Eagles in 1998 at Wembley, whilst assistant to John Kear.

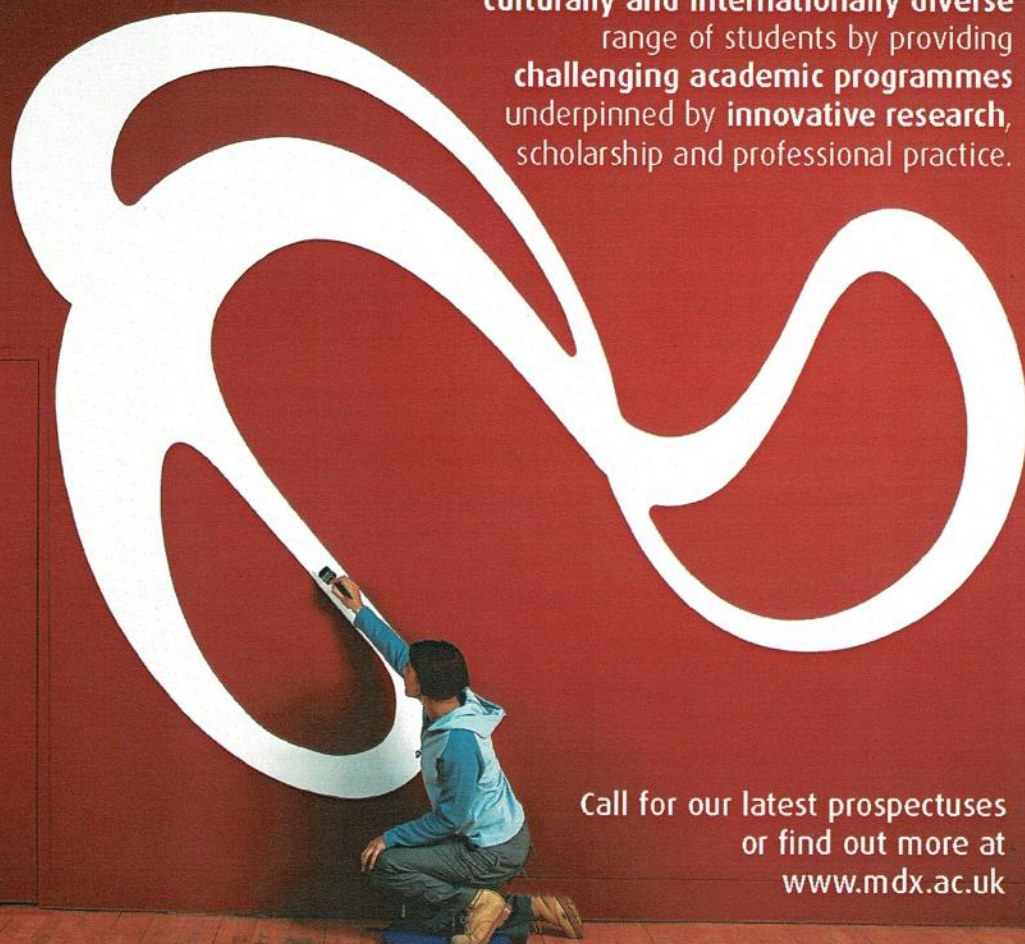

Skolars Tag Rugby will be held at Finsbury Park on Tuesday nights for 8 weeks throughout summer.

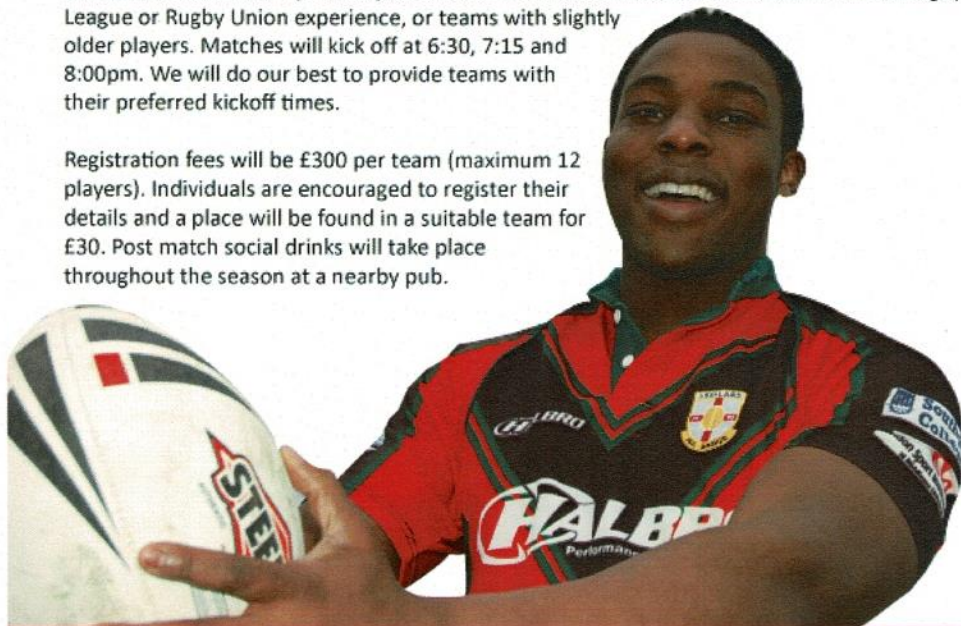
The competition will begin on Tuesday the 24th of June and culminate with finals on Tuesday the 12th of August.

Prizes will be awarded to the winners of each division. The prize for the winning teams will include tickets to the 2008 Carnegie Challenge Cup final at Wembley

In season 1, the competition will be run for open age Men's teams only. Tag rugby is a non contact version of rugby. It is a fun and social way to keep fit over summer.

Skolars Tag Rugby will feature 2 weeks of grading after which teams will be split into 2 divisions based on ability. 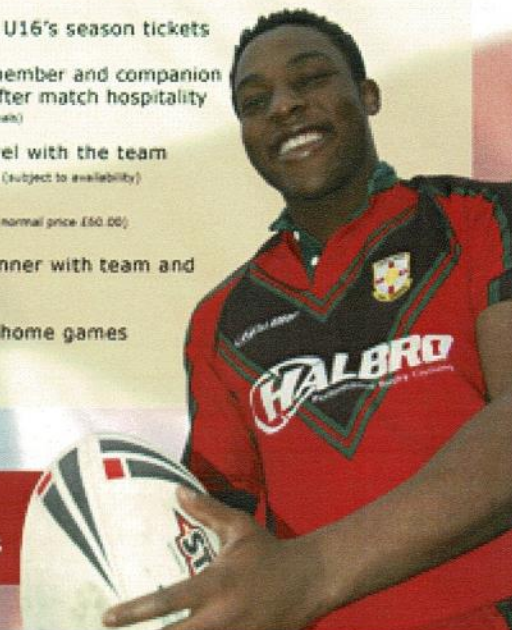

London International MX9s Goes Big As Skolars Launch Friday Night Lights

The London International MX9s will be re-launched as a major event in central London next year. The organisers of the tournament – host club London Skolars and the RLEF - have decided to postpone this August's proposed event and focus activities on finding a new location for the tournament for 2009 which will see it make huge strides towards becoming one of the capital's main sporting carnivals.

"The fact that the event has become the leading international nines tournament globally, we feel it needs to be staged at a high profile, central London, venue in future," said Hector McNeil. "Most European countries with Rugby League national teams have already participated or want to participate in the MX9s. Therefore a long term, high profile stage with top class media support is needed if we are to grow the event in the way it deserves to grow."

Several venues including central London park areas, such as Regents Park, Hyde Park, Old Street and Green Park to name but a few, are being considered and an announcement will be made soon.

It is also expected that the media coverage of the tournament will rise due to the location change, with the aim of getting one of the major broadcasters to cover this unique event.

Event Organiser Ben Araud said: "We are very excited about a central London venue for the MX9s. It's the most prestigious annual 9s tournament and is the largest gathering of international teams annually. The timing for 2008 is too short to move the event so we are looking to plan ambitiously for a superb 2009 tournament. Our overseas friends will be disappointed but I am sure they will be excited by the proposed upgrades in the future."

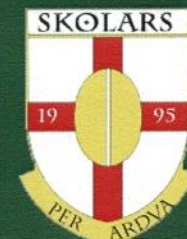
In previous years the MX9s has taken place on the day after the Carnegie Challenge Cup Final and the day before a Bank Holiday: perfect for fans returning home from the capital. But this year's final is not being held on the Bank Holiday weekend, making the event less viable on that date.

Rugby League European Federation Executive Officer Kevin Rudd commented 'The London International MX9s tournament has become a popular event with all European RL Federations and Associations wanting to participate. We also expect more quality applications for 2009 and this may mean we need to consider expanding the number of teams taking part and looking at other format options. The extra time will allow us to plan for this accordingly. This reflects the rising popularity of the game internationally'

The main event at White Hart Lane CSC that weekend will be the now traditional annual FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS match as Skolars take on Keighley Cougars in co-operative National League Two on Friday 29 August at 6.15pm. The previous two years' matches on Cup Final Eve have drawn record crowds to New River.

The game will be organised in conjunction with the North London Mini Olympics and promises to be another sell out crowd and a fantastic promotion for the fastest growing sport in London. We would encourage all fans of Rugby League who will attend the Challenge Cup Final to make their way to North London on the Friday night.
