My Grandfather John William Chadwick played for Oldham in the 1890s and my family have been involved with Oldham for many years and I was Chairman of Oldham when we won 2 Division 2 finals at Old Trafford, won the Lancashire Cup and reached 2 Challenge Cup semi-finals.

I sincerely hope that Oldham return to their former glories, nothing would give me greater pleasure than Oldham winning every game in a season (except of course those against Blackpool). My great ambition is to watch Oldham play in a long awaited Wembley Final this being the only major event they have never been involved in. This dream I know I share with thousands of others.

You really had to be at Rochdale two weeks ago to appreciate the efforts of both sides in blistering heat in a match that ended in a 38-38 draw to earn both sides 2 valuable league points. It was much later that I realised that the players by drawing away had earned themselves winning pay. I know a win would have earned us an extra point, but it would be churlish to devalue one of our greatest results by dwelling on such matters. I left Spotland proud of Blackpool Panthers.

The story at Workington was rather different after a promising first half where we were very competitive and hardly deserved to be trailing 8-12 at the interval. We were demolished in the second half to lose by 50 points to 12. This was by far our worst 40 minutes of the season.

We return home after three successive away matches and I stressed to the players before commencing our travels that it was very important that we gained points on our travels to continue our improvement and not least maintain distance between ourselves and the bottom two. I thought we were the better side at Rochdale and

could quite easily have won. I was not to disappointed with the final outcome of a 38-38 draw which gained us two valuable league points. I was particularly pleased that after conceding a converted try in the 79th minute, we showed great character and skill by going straight up field to score the equalizing try on the final hooter.

The Rochdale game was of course the final game of the 15 year career of our Captain Paul Anderson who retired after the game to take up a coaching role with Rochdale Hornets. It was fitting that both teams formed a guard of honour to applaud him from the field and the end of the game. Paul was my first signing at Blackpool and has been an inspirational leader and has played a vital part in our improved fortunes this season. Paul leaves with all our best wishes for the future.

I realised that the visit to Workington would be particularly difficult.

They have been traditionally difficult to beat on their own patch and would certainly want revenge after becoming the first team to lose to Blackpool for almost two years. PROGRAMME REVIEW

4 Try Llewellyn Gains valuable share of spoils for Panthers Rochdale Hornets 38pts Blackpool Panthers 38 pts.

Centre Dave Llewellyn rewrote Blackpool Panthers record books in this thrilling draw at Rochdale to earn the Panthers two valuable league points. Llewellyn who a month ago was playing for amateur side Black brook has now scored seven tries in five games for the Fylde based Panthers to become the hottest try scoring sensation in National League Two,

Llewellyn scored all his four tries wide out on the left, all four finishing off slick handling moves from the impressive Panthers, who look a class act with the ball in their hands. Llewellyn scored in the 2nd, 34th,57th and 80th minute to become the first ever Blackpool Panthers player to score four tries in a match.

Matt Ashe converted both the early tries and struck the upright with the third and saw his potential match winning kick drift narrowly wide with the final kick of the game, however few of the admiring crowd begrudged both sides a draw in this pulsating game. Ashe also converted his own try to give the Panthers a 12 point lead after 5 minutes.

The early Panthers lead stung the Hornets into action and quick fire tries by Craig Farrimond and Ainscough both converted by Carl Sneyd levelled the scores after 13 minutes. Further tries by Andrews and O' Brien one converted saw the Hornets race into a 22-12 lead, but Llewellyn scored his second try converted by Ashe to leave the interval score 22-18.

The Panthers started the second half as the had the first with two early tries, Darryl Kaye burrowed over on the far left and Semisi Cocka forced his way over with brute force, both tries were converted by Ashe to leave the Panthers leading 30-22.

A sustained period of Rochdale pressure saw Alex Brown score an unconverted try far out on the right before Llewellyn completed his hat trick to leave the Panthers leading 34-26. Severe Hornets pressure then saw converted tries by O' Brien and Andrews to leave the hosts leading 38-34 with only a minute remaining.

Justice was done however as the ever impressive Panthers back line combined yet again to send Llewellyn over in the corner for his fourth try to set a new scoring record to level the scores.

As the final hooter sounded the crowd stood to its feet to applaud both sides from the field. There was a lovely final touch when both sides formed a guard of honour to applaud Panther's Captain Paul Anderson from the field after completing his final game of a 15 year professional career. He will now take up a coaching post at Rochdale on a two year contract. He leaves knowing the Panthers this side is now a force to be reckoned with in the division.

New signing Lee Birdseye was impressive at scrum half and the Panthers now head north to Workington having only lost one of their last four games.

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

We extend a warm Fylde Coast welcome to our visitors Oldham Roughyeds RLFC.

Roughyed is a nickname for a person from Oldham.

They were founded in 1876 as **Oldham RLFC**. They moved to their ground Watersheddings in 1889. Oldham were one of the twenty-one clubs that left the Rugby Football Union to form the Northern Union in 1895.

They were the second club to win the Challenge Cup after beating Hunslet 19-9 in 1899. Batley had won the first two finals.

Oldham were fourth in the first title race of 1895-96 and second a year later, they finally won their first title in 1904-05 just edging out Bradford Northern by three points. Oldham won the Lancashire League in 1897-98, 1900-01 and 1907-08 as well as the Lancashire Cup in 1906-07.

Title success followed in 1909-10 as they beat Wigan in the Championship final. Also in that same season they managed to win the Lancashire League and Lancashire Cup. The following season, 1910-11, they beat Wigan again in the Championship final.

Oldham won the Lancashire League in 1921-22 and the Lancashire Cup in 1912-13, 1918-19 and 1923-24.

Having lost in the 1907, 1912 and 1924 Challenge Cup finals, they finally won the trophy again in 1925 when they beat Hull Kingston Rovers 16-3 at Headingley, Leeds.

The club's last Challenge Cup final was in 1927 when they beat Swinton 26-7 at Central Park, Wigan, their fourth consecutive final and revenge for their 9-3 defeat when the same teams met in the previous year's match.

In 1932-33, Oldham won the Lancashire Cup again.

In the glory days of the 1950s, Oldham won the Championship and a host of other trophies with a side that boasted players such as Alan Davies, John Etty, Frank Pitchford, Derek "Rocky" Turner and Bernard Ganley.

Oldham's success in the 1950s also included two further Championship titles - in 1954-55 and 1956-57; the Lancashire League 1956-57 and 1957-58 and the Lancashire Cup 1955-56, 1956-57 and 1957-58.

Oldham were Division Two champions in 1963-64, 1981-82 and 1987-88 while also winning the Divisional Premiership in 1987-88 and 1989-90.

When a Rupert Murdoch funded Super League competition was proposed, part of the deal was that some traditional clubs would merge. Oldham were supposed to merge with Salford to form a club to be known as Manchester which would compete in Super League. This was resisted and instead they adopted the name Oldham Bears and were founder members of the new league. Relegation came in the second year of the new summer season, when they finished below Paris St Germain.

In 1997 under Chairman Jim Quinn, they went bankrupt with debts of over £2m. A new team Oldham Roughyeds was then formed in December to play at a lower level. The Roughyeds tag had been a long accepted nickname for the old club.

To many loyal fans' dismay, the club left Watersheddings in 1997 and moved to Oldham Athletic AFC's Boundary Park stadium in nearby Chadderton / Royton.

Mike Ford retired as player-coach of Oldham in 2001 and in January the following year took up a post as defensive co-ordinator with the Irish Rugby Football Union. Oldham put Mark Knight in temporary charge of the first team. After a successful 2001 season, they narrowly missed out on promotion to the Super League, losing to Widnes Vikings 12-24 in the Northern Ford Premiership Grand Final.

During the 2002 season they played at Hurst Cross in the nearby town of Ashton-under-Lyne, due to a dispute with Oldham Athletic over the use of Boundary Park.

Steve Molloy took charge of the Roughyeds after former boss John Harbin left to join Oldham Athletic as fitness conditioner and sports psychologist in July 2002. Under Molloy, Oldham won seven and drew two of their last 14 games, clinching promotion to National League One and reaching the last four of the play-offs.

In March 2005, Oldham entered a creditors' voluntary agreement (CVA) with total debts of £325,000. In 2007, the excavation and demolition firm The William Quinn Group acquired a 52% stake in the club. Bill Quinn became the club's new chairman, with previous owners Chris Hamilton and Sean Whitehead remaining as directors.

Oldham narrowly missed promotion in 2007 losing in the play off final to Featherstone and their league progress this season has been hampered by success in both the Northern Rail and Challenge Cups, where they reached the ? finals in both competitions.

NATIONAL LEAGUE TWO REVIEW

As the league season reaches its halfway point, the table has an unexpected look about it. All the pundits expected a two horse race between Oldham and big spending Doncaster. This has yet to materialise with surprise packages Gateshead Thunder leading by four points having only lost one of their twelve games. They are closely followed by Barrow Raiders the only club in rugby league with a 100% record. The other surprise team Keighley are now starting to drift back to the pack after a couple of heavy home defeats.

Both pre-season favourites are suffering through cup successes. Oldham reached the quarter finals of both the Challenge Cup and Northern Rail and are playing catch up rugby. To visit both Gateshead and London in midweek will fully test the resolve. Doncaster have fared even worse, their wonderful Northern Rail campaign that has seen them reach their first final in their history, has left them a mountain to climb regarding their league fixtures. Last weeks game against Gateshead was their first home game in over two months.

York after a poor start are comfortably within the play off zone. Whilst Workington, Rochdale and Swinton are currently grappling for the final play off position. Perennial strugglers Blackpool are neither in the play off zone or the battle for the wooden spoon as they lead both Hunslet and London Skolars by six points to occupy 10th place their highest league position for over two years.


