Lessons in latent support

I HAVE never been to Barrow, but I am sure I am not alone in that fact.

Its location gives new meaning to the phrase 'tucked away' and its link to the rest of the UK comes via the A590.

But the fact it is so cut off from the rest of the UK has its advantages, not least when you are trying to get the local community behind something that makes them proud of their little part of England.

Step forward the Barrow Raiders, the success story of the season. Second in the Championship and in the final of the Northern Rail Cup, they have been like a breath of fresh air for the sport. The town is buzzing and there is now even talk of a shot at a Super League licence.

On page 35 columnist Paul Bennett examines the achievements of the Raiders and the efforts of chairman Des Johnston to achieve success. He talks in detail about Barrow and what they might bring to Super League.

Mr Johnston is also featured on page 6 talking about the amount of Barrow fans he expects will go to the final of the Northern Rail Cup against Widnes.

The Raiders supremo claims upwards of 7,000 will take the 'short' trip to Blackpool and on recent evidence you can't really doubt him.

When the Championship One title hopefuls entertained Wigan in the Challenge Cup this year more than 6,000 packed into Craven Park.

In the Northern Rail Cup semi-final against Featherstone there were nearly 3,000 in attendance.

When you are talking about that kind of support it is no wonder the Barrow chairman is prepared to dig into his pockets to bolster the squad.

In terms of risk and reward it means he knows the club is no bottomless pit because the people of Barrow and the wider Furness area will respond to success.

And ultimately it is a part of the country that has rugby league in its heart and soul. Unfortunately the same can not be said of Doncaster, and their humiliating defeat at the hands of Batley on Sunday was the latest in a long line of body blows.

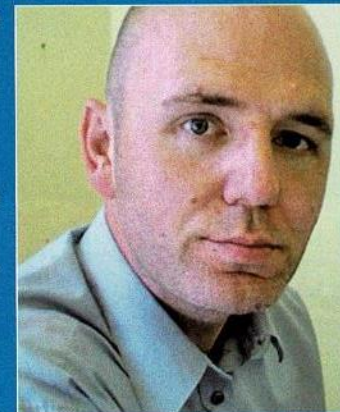
If only the people of Doncaster had come out and supported the club when they had momentum last year and in the early part of this.

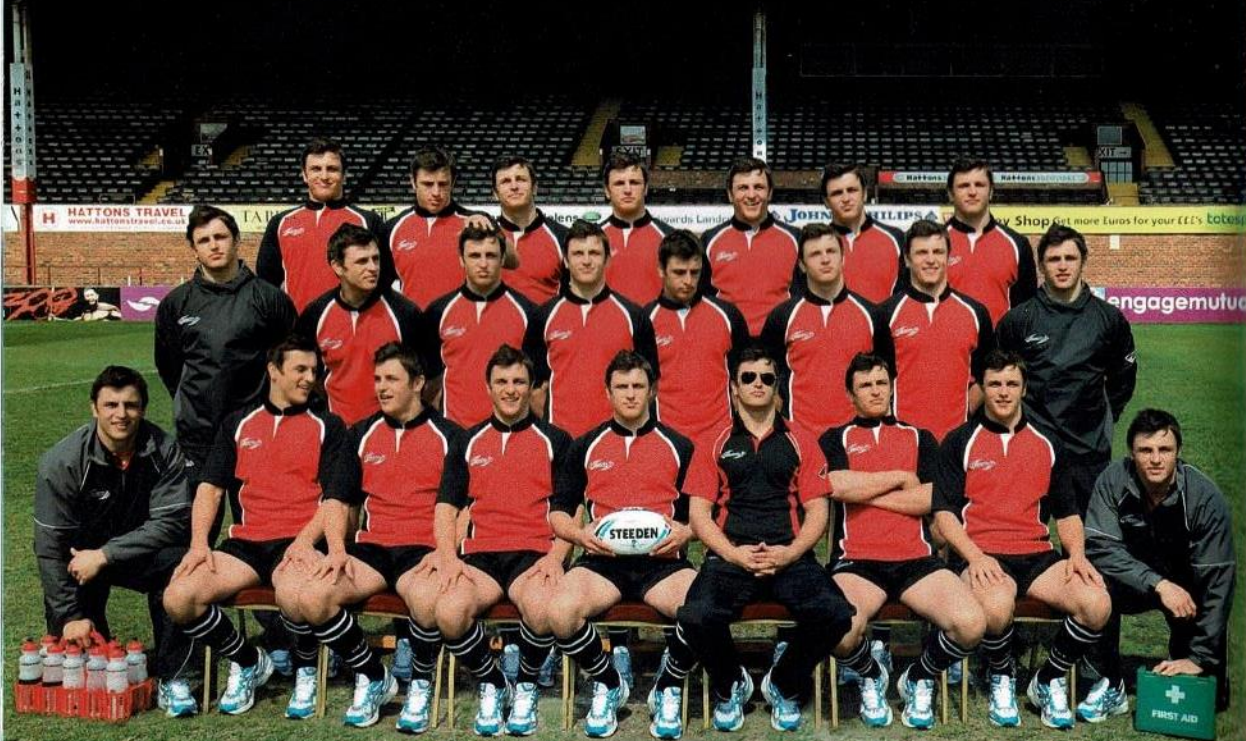

Raiders expected to invade Blackpool

BARROW chairman Des Johnston reckons the Raiders will take up to 7,000 fans with them to Blackpool for their Northern Rail Cup Final with Widnes.

The Cumbrians booked their trip to the resort next month for what will be their first final in more than a quarter of a century with a 16-10 win over Featherstone on Thursday night.

And with more than 1,500 enquiries for tickets being fielded by club staff on Friday morning alone, Johnston is confident of having a massive following at Bloomfield Road on July 12.

"The club hasn't been in a final for 26 years so this is a huge occasion for us," he said.

"Blackpool is only a relatively short drive away so I'm sure we'll take between 6 and 7,000 fans with us.

"You can feel the excitement in the town already."

Securing their place in the final also took the Raiders a step closer to their Super League dream, as the winner of the competition gets the right to lodge an application in the next round of Super League licences.

"We could be the first club to qualify on that criteria and that is very exciting," said Johnston.

"It would be good to get that boxed ticked at the earliest opportunity but it would only be the first step in a long journey."

Johnston would like broadcasters Sky to consider playing the semi-finals on Saturday evenings in future, believing the game deserves a better billing and more

convenient scheduling for fans.

"We got more than 2,700 for the semi-final which wasn't bad considering it was a Thursday night, which made it very difficult for any Featherstone fans to get here," he said.

"If the game had been on a weekend I think we would have put another 1,000 on the gate. It is something Sky should look at.

"If it was given a 6.30pm kick-off on a Saturday I think the crowds would be a lot bigger. When teams are spread so far apart geographically as they are in our division, that would make it a lot easier on travelling fans."

Meanwhile, the club has received con-

firmation that Liam Campbell's season is over because of his collarbone injury.

And while he is out of contract at the end of the year, Johnston has assured him that he remains in their plans.

"He is absolutely gutted but I've told him he still has a big part to play for us," he said. "He is a very talented player with a big future.

"He is contracted to the end of the year and, assuming his injury heals ok, I can't see any reason why he wouldn't be here next year."

Johnston has also revealed he's in talks about bringing in two players on loan from Super League clubs as he looks to bolster the squad for the season run in.

Nanyn joins Centurions on permanent deal

LEIGH have clinched the signing of Mick Nanyn for 2010.

The former Whitehaven, Widnes and Oldham centre tried his hand in Super League earlier this year by signing for Harlequins RL.

But having failed to make an impression on coach Brian McDermott, Nanyn joined the Centurions on loan in May and

has now penned a deal to stay at the Leigh Sports Village until the end of next season.

"He's got the remainder of this year and next year as well," said coach Paul Rowley. "I'm looking forward to continuing working with him."

Leigh have also snapped up Leigh Miners Rangers teenager Jonathan Pownall.

The full back or centre has

had a fine season in the Gillette National Youth League and has now signed professional terms with the Championship outfit.

"He's a down-to-earth lad, a quietly confident person who is just going to go about his business, sneak up on the rails and make his way up into the first team eventually," said Rowley.

Meanwhile, Leigh will be without Adam Higson for

around another six weeks after it was revealed his broken hand has failed to heal properly.

Higson had been expected to return to full training last week after having the plaster cast on his hand removed.

However, scans revealed the bones have not totally mended and Higson has now been told to rest the injury for another month and a half.



Panthers' double swoop

BLACKPOOL have signed young Widnes duo Dean Thompson and Josh Simm on a month's loan.

Thompson has been loaned out to the Panthers to gain more first team experience whilst Simm (pictured left) has been sent out to prove himself again following recent disciplinary problems.

The second row forward, who has established himself as first teamer this year, was investigated by police following an incident in a local bar with teammate Michael Ostick.

Panthers boss Crompton is delighted to have landed the duo, even if they're on the Fylde Coast for different reasons.

"Obviously one is here for disciplinary reasons and the other to get more first team rugby, and in the meantime we get the use of two very good players," he told League Weekly.

"Dean is a very exciting centre

from Widnes's under-21s, who has won a couple of player of the month awards this season and has scored tries for fun. He'll give us some good strike power.

"Josh has been a very strong second rower in the first team and has probably one of their most consistent back rowers.

"He has had some disciplinary problems with the club but he's a very good young player and hopefully he will set a good example for the rest of my squad."

Crompton admits there is little chance he will get to keep either player beyond the initial month-long spell, but says he is comfortable with that situation.

"They will just freshen us up and give us a boost as we look to stay in a play-off position and maybe even climb up a little."

The pair are set to debut against Workington Town on Sunday.

Ex-Mayor set to save crisis-hit Doncaster

DONCASTER look set to be saved by the town's former mayor.

Martin Winter, also a former hooker with the Dons, is leading a business consortium that have registered an interest in taking over the crisis-hit Championship club.

Winter has reportedly put together a group of at least 10 business people willing to put money into the struggling South Yorkshire side to save them from liquidation.

The Dons' director of rugby Carl Hall has revealed that he had been working to put together his own consortium to keep the club going on a semi-professional basis. But Winter's group promises to bring in more cash for the club and Hall has decided to step aside.

"I've informed the administrator of my interest but will now be withdrawing to leave the way open for Martin," said Hall.

"I've been working hard behind the scenes trying to put a consortium together and I've had the support of several local businessmen.

"I came up with a package which would see the club go back to basics

and players paid match payments only for the next three to five years.

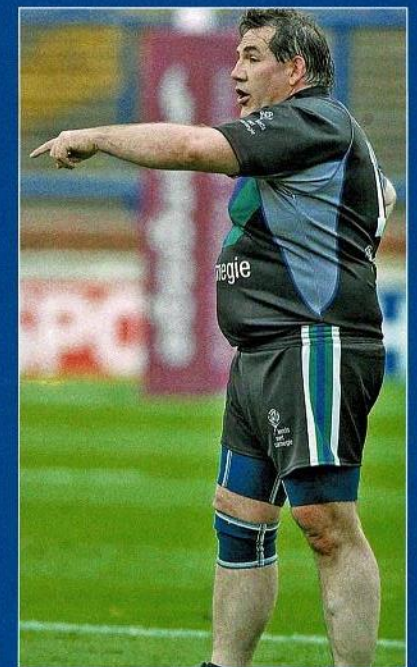
"We would have targeted a mid-table spot in Championship One next season with the aim of getting back, and being competitive, into the Championship in that period – possibly working in conjunction with a supporters' trust.

"Martin is the man to save the club and take it forward. He has the necessary leadership experience and knows all about budgets and things like that."

Meanwhile, the Dons have snapped up three student players to bolster their squad following the departure of several key stars to Championship rivals.

Leeds Met captain Mark McKinley, a 23-year-old loose forward, is joined at the Dons by two players from Loughborough University – second row Stephen Hall, 22, and winger Chris McNamara, 20.

McKinley and Hall were set for their debut against Batley on Sunday whilst McNamara, who had other commitments, should make his bow against Sheffield Eagles this weekend. Sunday's South Yorkshire derby will be held at Featherstone's Chris Moyles Stadium.

Stunning Widnes flourish

WIDNES will face Barrow Raiders in the Northern Rail Cup final after a sensational 27-22 victory against HALIFAX at The Shay.

In a game packed with drama the Vikings booked their place in an unbelievable last 10 minutes.

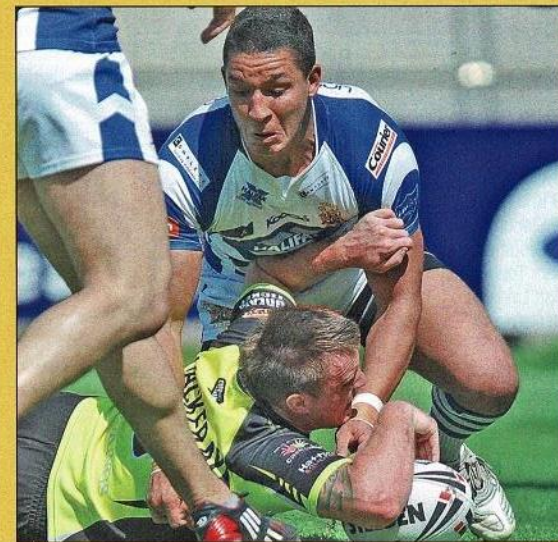
Trailing 20-6 after 51 minutes Fax looked dead and buried. However, a sensational 12-minute spell in the third quarter heralded 16 points and Matt Calland's side looked set for victory at 22-20 up.

But the key moment came on 70 minutes when Ben Black picked up a stray James Webster pass and broke clear, with an open run to the line the Australian scrum-half saw the chance of glory slip away as the ball agonisingly slipped from his grasp with the line at his mercy. A try would have put the hosts eight points clear and surely wrapped up the game.

When Craig Hall rubbed salt in the wounds with a penalty to level matters two minutes later the game was well and truly in the balance.

Hall had a great day with the boot and his towering drop goal under intense pressure four minutes from time gave his side the edge.

It was fitting that the win

came courtesy of the magnificent Thackeray, the stand-off bursting clear from Black's error and he sent the visiting fans into raptures with his 78th-minute try.

Hall missed his only conversion but it hardly mattered as the hooter sounded soon after amid scenes of wild jubilation from the massed Widnes ranks.

Paul Cullen was rightly proud of his team and said: "Halifax have been the best

team in the Northern Rail Cup and the Championship all season, we knew that to come to their ground and win a semi final we'd have to be at our best and the players were. It was a fantastic effort from one to 17."

A dejected Matt Calland was gutted to miss out on a final spot, adding: "We were dropping the ball left, right and centre in the first half. In the second half we got a bit of momentum and got back into

the game but we just didn't finish off our chances."

Meanwhile for the second consecutive cup tie BARROW got out of jail with a try two minutes from time when all seemed lost.

In the previous round a Liam Harrison try in those dying minutes saw off the challenge of Dewsbury, and it was a Andy Ellis touchdown under the posts in the 78th minute that sealed a hard fought 16-10 victory against FEATHERSTONE.

Barrow were hanging onto a 8-4 lead until Rovers struck in the 65th minute with a try from Tom Haughey, converted from the touchline by Kyle Briggs, and at 10-8 there looked no way back for the Raiders.

But one last throw of the dice saw Ned Catic produce a nifty piece of footwork inside the Rovers' 22, and in support was Ellis. The lively hooker headed for the line and, despite defenders hanging on desperately, managed to put the ball over the whitewash.

But delighted home fans had to wait anxiously as referee James Leahy went to video referee James Child for confirmation. He gave the nod and Darren Holt converted and rounded off the scoring with a penalty goal after the final hooter.

Campbell leads demolition job on Dons

BATLEY Bulldogs grabbed 12 tries as they demolished crisis club 70-6 Doncaster, who now find themselves playing home games at Featherstone as their pitch at the Keepmoat Stadium undergoes major work.

Bulldogs winger Johnny Campbell grabbed four of the tries as the in-form Championship club was just far too good in every department.

Dons coach Tony Miller says he has always been realistic through this crisis.

"I knew it was going to be very difficult to stay in this division, but I have to be realistic about things," he said. "We've been beaten in all aspects today, we looked like

a team who have just been thrown together, which is what we are.

"We had players coming back from long-term injury and a few new faces which doesn't help. I thought we defended very well for the first 20 minutes but the fact Batley had 80 per cent of the play definitely took its toll on our lads in the second half.

"I have told the players that they now need to draw a line in the sand. This is the lowest we have hit and we now need to keep improving on a weekly basis."

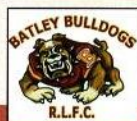
A sympathetic Bulldogs coach Karl Harrison said: "You have to feel sorry for

Doncaster with what they are going through, but it's a dog-eat-dog game, and we have to be professional.

"Tony Miller and Carl Hall have a really tough task ahead, but the Dons played for the full 80 minutes and kept on going despite getting well beat on the scoreboard.

"Handforth and Mennell are getting a lot of rave reviews at the moment but I have four big mobile front rowers which helps the half backs.

"Craig Potter was also outstanding at right back, but overall a very good team effort."

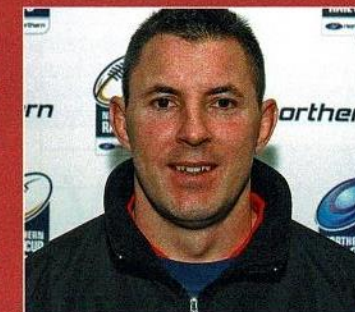
We have improved hugely since last Barrow clash

It just shows what a bit of hard work and belief can do for you. Batley have turned things around of late and it all makes good for the comp.

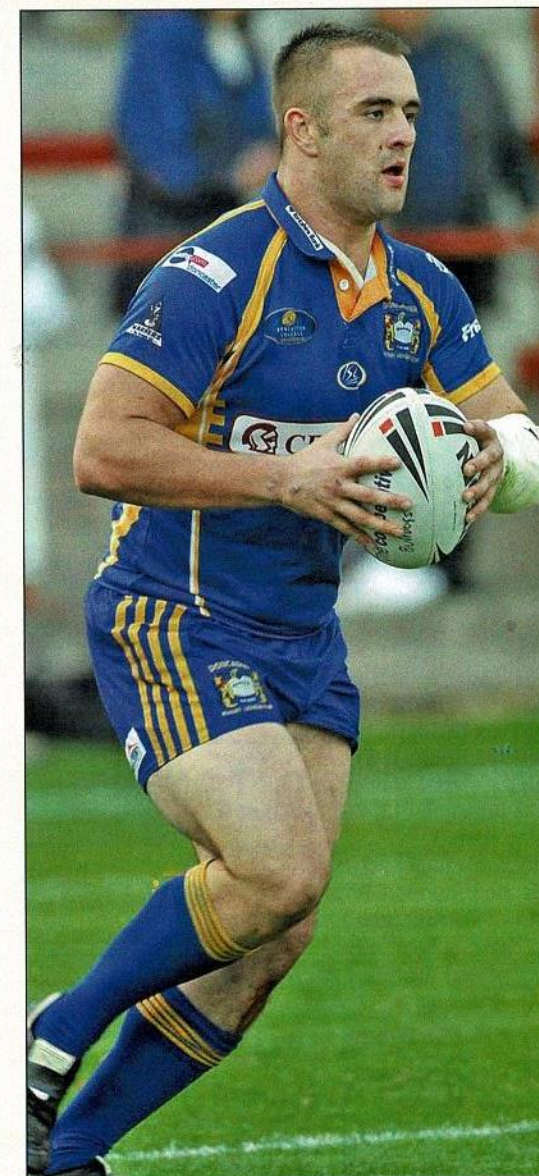
Last of all I would like to thank all the supporters who have come across today and last week it is always the same loyal fans faces I see getting behind this club. You all deserve a big rap for that.

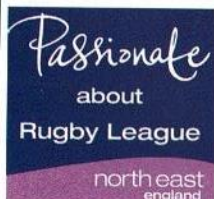

Over the last few weeks we have had a few injuries and players missing.

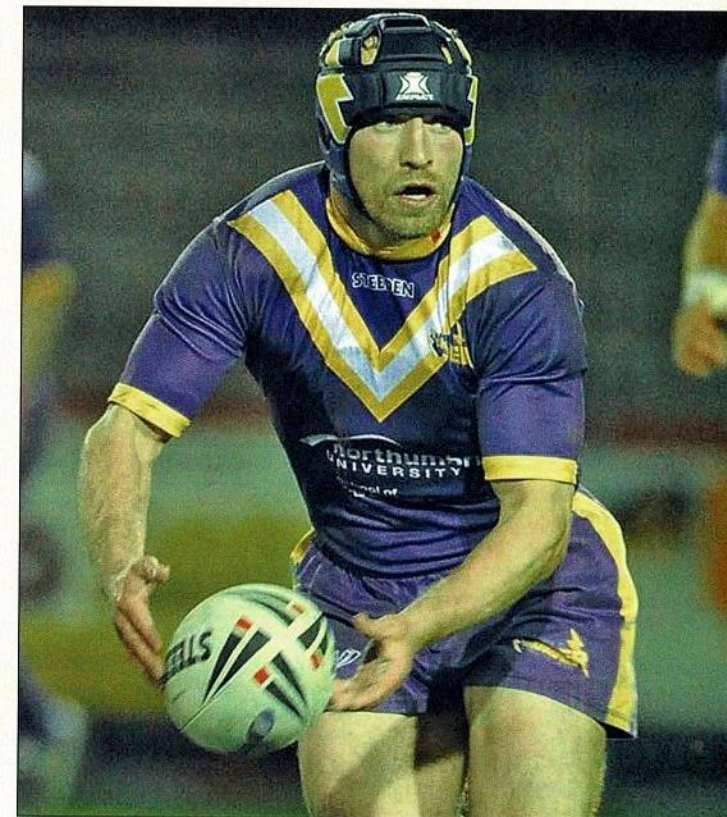

JULIEN LEHUBY, TOULOUSE OLYMPIQUE CONDITIONER, ANSWERS TO OUR QUESTIONS...

Quand tu as pris en charge la préparation physique de l'équipe au mois de décembre, quels étaient tes principaux axes de travail et objectifs ?

At the start of the season, last December, what were your aims and goals?

Julien LEHUBY: Tout d'abord, faire passer l'équipe du niveau d'Elite française au niveau plus exigeant du Championship. Il fallait ainsi préparer les joueurs de manière à ce qu'ils puissent tenir un rythme de match élevé, et qui plus est pendant 80 minutes.

Julien LEHUBY: My first goal was to upgrade the team level from the French Elite League to the Championship which is much more demanding. We also had to prepare the players so that they could sustain the full length of a game with a high rhythm.

Pour cela, comment as-tu organisé tes charges de travail ?

To achieve that, how did you organize the work?

J.H.: J'ai eu la chance d'avoir les joueurs trois mois avant le lancement de la compétition ce qui m'a permis de pouvoir insister sur un gros travail foncier avant d'attaquer sur de la résistance à l'effort.

J.H.: As the players were available three months before the beginning of the competition, I have been able to make them work hard during the first month and a half before focusing on their endurance.

Aujourd'hui, es-tu satisfait du niveau de forme des joueurs ?

Today, are you happy with the level of your players?

J.H.: Oui car les objectifs que je m'étais fixés ont été atteints bien que l'on puisse toujours faire mieux. On a également peu de blessures à déplorer hors mis celle de Jérôme Gout et c'est en parti grâce à ce travail qui a été fourni même si le facteur chance en fait parti. Pour la fin de saison (qui est encore longue) il faut qu'on élève notre intensité et explosivité.

J.H.: Yes, the players have reached the goals I had set them... but we always can do better. We didn't have many bad injuries (except Jérôme Gout) and I believe this is thanks - partly at least - to the work that has been done, even if we also had some luck. For the end of the season, we have to improve our intensity.

Comment gères-tu le fait que certains joueurs soient professionnels alors que d'autres travaillent ?

How do you cope with the fact that some players are semi professionals?

J.H.: C'est une des principales difficultés de la saison avec des joueurs qui enchainent journée de travail - muscu - terrain. Ces derniers se sont beaucoup impliqués et je tiens à les féliciter car ce n'est pas forcément facile tous les jours.

J.H.: This is one of the main difficulties for this season, with some players having to work - weights - training all in the same day. Those players have done many efforts and I'd like to congratulate them for that because it must not have been easy every day.

Pour finir, la fin de saison du TO, tu la vois...

How do you feel about the end of the season?

J.H.: Dans le TOP 6 et pourquoi pas TOP 4 ce qui nous permettrait de recevoir à domicile le premier match de play-off. Après, une fois qualifié, tout peut arriver ! On en sera plus quant à notre capacité à enchaîner les gros matchs à la fin du mois de juillet qui s'annonce très difficile car on rencontre les quatre premiers coup sur coup (ndlr: Featherstone, Barrow, Halifax et Widnes).

J.H.: In the top six and why not in the top four, which would allow us to have a first round in the play-offs at home. And after we never know what can happen... We will know more about our ability to put in a winning run against big teams at the end of July as we are going to play the top 4 teams (Featherstone, Barrow, Halifax and Widnes).

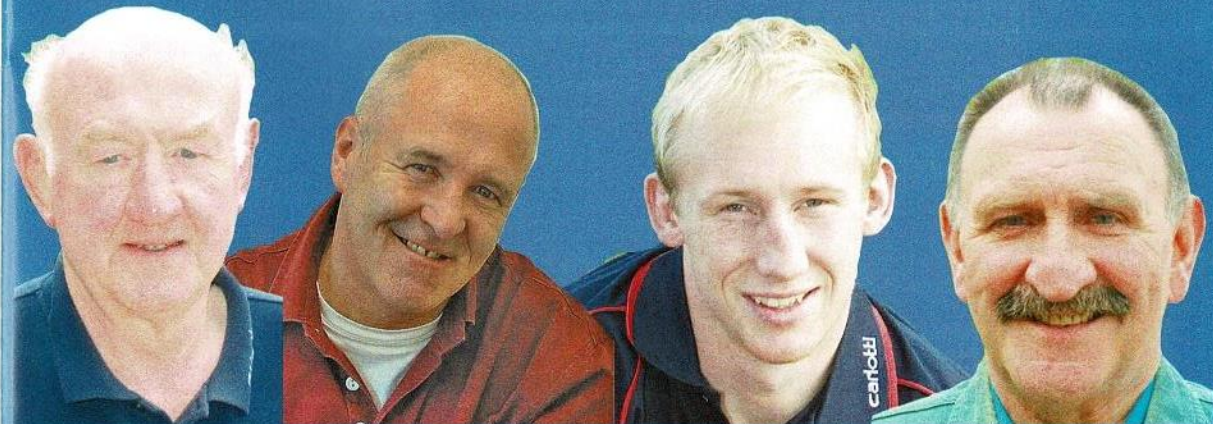

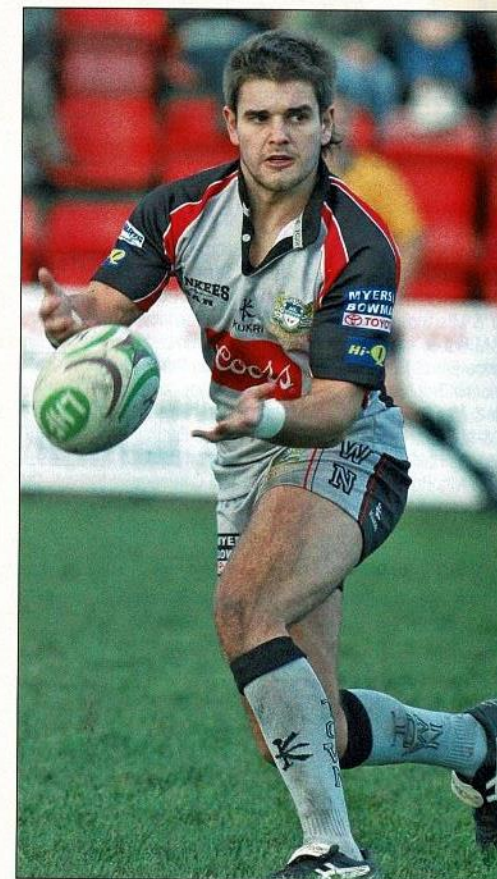
I felt it was the right time to bring fresh blood in, as a few players were taking their positions for granted.

It is the first time Settle have had a girls rugby team with success and again shows the fantastic work this club does in the community. So well done to Settle and I am sure they will have a great time in London with their respective finals and then being invited to the cup final. Enjoy a good, entertaining game today.

The clubs – Arnos Grove Gladiators, East Barnet Bulls, Edmonton Tigers, Hornsey Hawks and Wood Green Warriors – are all based in some of the most challenging areas of the boroughs and offer opportunities to those who are untouched by other sporting opportunities.

The competition will initial-

Skolars also run a number of successful rugby league derivatives.

Urban Rugby, for example, is in its seventh season and

runs through the summer months.

It is a variation on 13-a-side rugby league but can be played anywhere on any surface from grass to basketball courts.

It has been a tremendous tool both in getting rugby league out into the more deprived areas of North London but also as a recruitment tool to the Skolars junior ranks.

It is hugely popular in the housing estates of Haringey and Enfield where an estate leader is appointed from the location to lead on the project with the support of the Skolars' community coaches.

A summer course of estate urban rugby is now in full swing this will culminate in the

annual 'estate of origin' finals which take place at Skolars Friday Night Lights event on the eve of the Carnegie Challenge Cup Final.

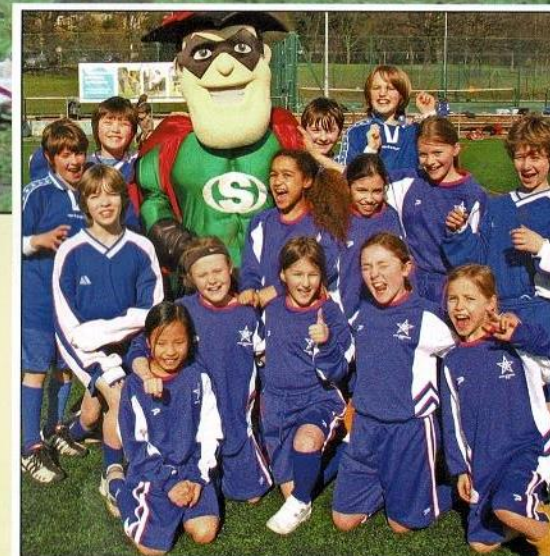
Meanwhile a Tag Rugby competition is now in its second season and is a vital part of Skolars' commitment to offer rugby league to all competitors.

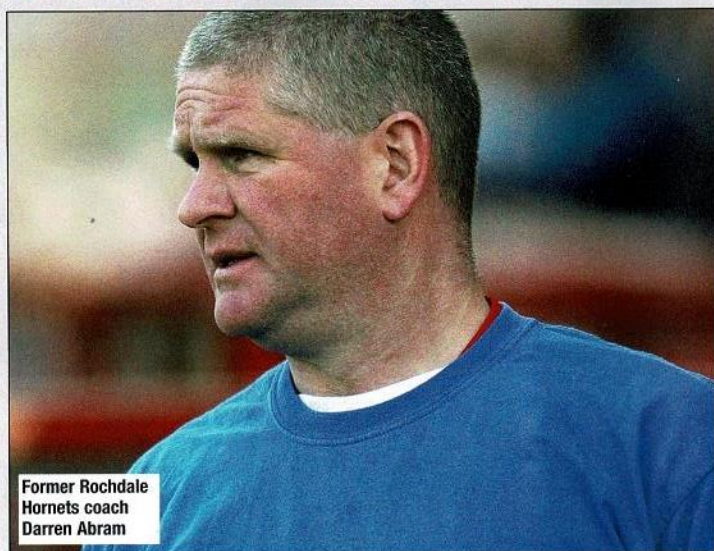

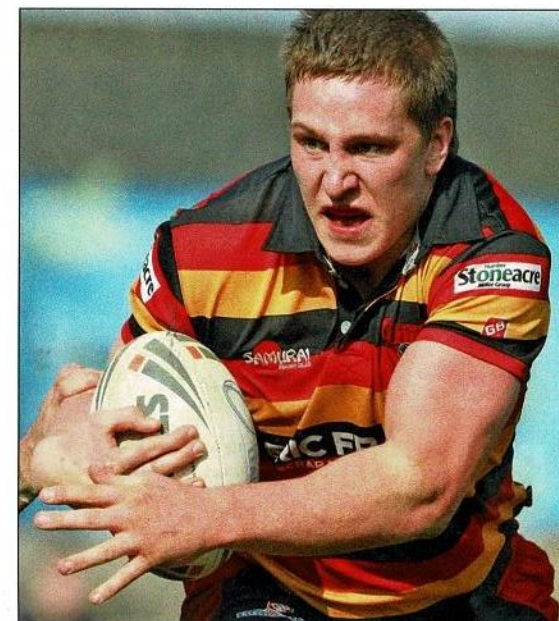

Cumbrians do their talking on the pitch

WELL, Cumbrians have been banging on for years about how they should have a team in Super League.

Now, at long, long, last, it seems like some of them are finally cutting the crap and getting their arses into gear.

It's alright whingeing about how one of the traditional heartlands of the game is being 'ignored' by the RFL in favour of 'new' territories like Wales and the South of France.

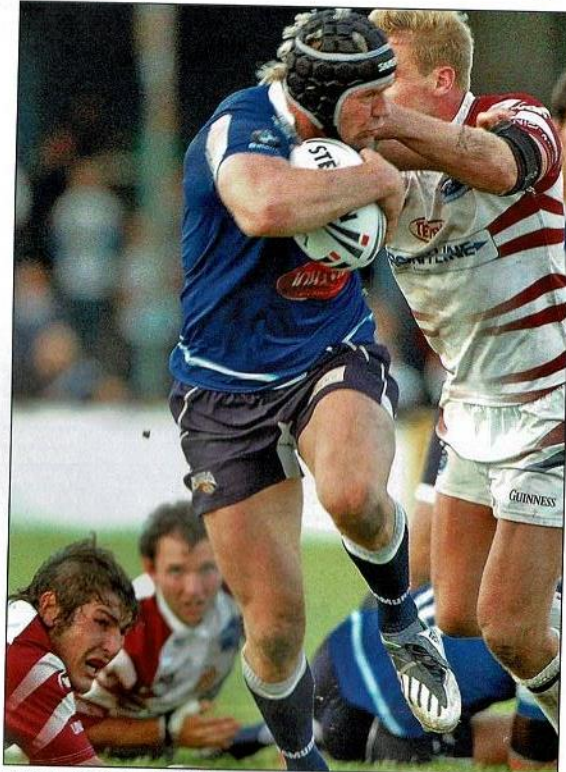
The fact of the matter is that both the Catalans and the Crusaders wanted a Super League licence far, far more than anyone up in the far North West.

By refusing to pool resources, Whitehaven and Workington have missed their chance of a joint licence bid. Now, a genuine 'new' Cumbrian force has emerged.

Next month, Barrow Raiders will take part in the Northern Rail Cup Final in Blackpool and, if they win that game, they'll then be eligible to apply for a top flight licence in 2012.

It's gratifying to see Barrow owner Des Johnston largely staying away from public complaints about the game 'betraying' its roots and instead investing his hard-earned cash to bankroll success at Craven Park and get the town interested in its rugby league team once again.

It's refreshing to see they've

refused to play the 'victim' card like some of the other Championship clubs have since they were snubbed for a licence last time, or simply found themselves not in a position to apply at all.

Where some clubs' so-called Super League ambitions have been merely pipe

dreams (Doncaster anyone?), Barrow's claims seem credible and realistic.

What this all means is that, on July 12, we'll probably see the most meaningful Northern Rail Cup final to date.

It's interesting that it's Widnes Vikings who stand in Barrow's way.

The Vikings have the air of a Super League licence-holder in-waiting, but if that's going to be the case then they're going to have to get their act together over the next few years.

They have the stadium and they have history, but the prospect of introducing them into Super League isn't as sexy and exciting as a second French team or a Cumbrian franchise.

It's a similar story for Halifax too. Both they and Widnes will have to make their case almost undeniable if they're to persuade the RFL to go with such an uninspiring selection.

Hence why it's vital that they dominate the Championship and Northern Rail Cup finals over the next two years to make sure they don't give anyone else a sniff.

Should make for some interesting viewing at Bloomfield Road in a fortnight's time.

Bring on Blackpool, I say!

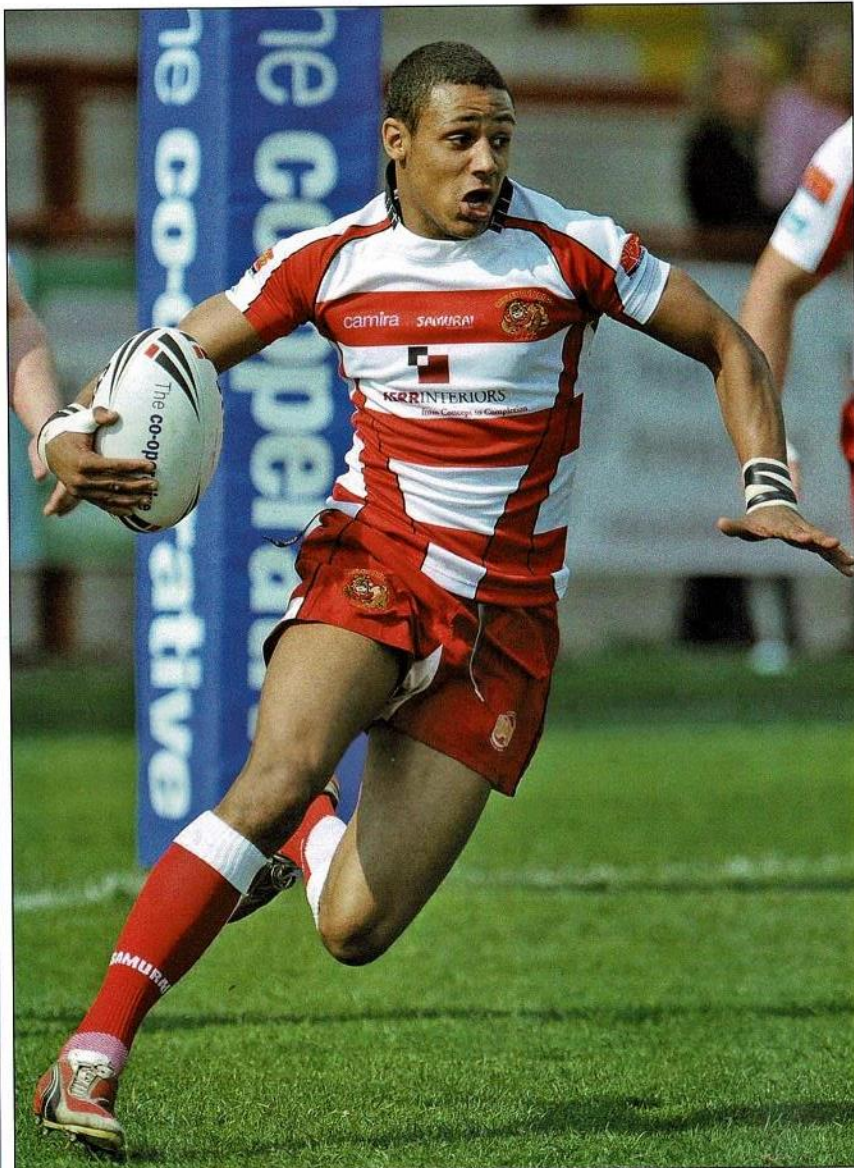
