
IT'S 200 NOT OUT FOR OUR LOYAL CLUB MAN

Player Profile: **NEIL RODEN**

STAND-OFF NEIL HAS HIS SIGHTS ON MORE TRIES

THE player-profile feature takes on a rather different slant in this issue given that Neil Roden, a player whose profile we have covered previously, today reaches the huge milestone of 200 appearances with the Roughyeds.



Only John Hough, now retired from playing and concentrating on his new role as head coach of the Reserves, has recorded more games than that since Oldham RLFC (1997) Ltd was launched for the start of the 1998 season - and in these days of one and two-year contracts it is indeed exceptional for a player to drag the jersey of one club over his head on 200 occasions.

Unlike Houghie, who is now in the middle of a well-

deserved ten-year testimonial, Neil had two seasons away from the club in 2005 and 2006, but he jumped at the chance to come back and the evidence suggests that, given the opportunity, he would like to end his playing career at the club he first joined from Wigan's academy set-up more than eight years ago. As the Oldham Evening Chronicle's rugby league reporter in those days I vividly recall turning up at Castleton Gabriels for an academy match to find two fresh-faced new recruits watching the game from the sidelines. One was Phil Farrell, the other was Neil Roden, not yet 20. "They are good lads -- you'll see," said coach Mike Ford. He wasn't wrong, was he? Not many days later Roden and Farrell were to make their Roughyeds debuts on the bench at Featherstone. It wasn't a baptism they will particularly want to remember. It was on March 26, 2000 and Featherstone blew the visitors apart to win 61-26. For the record, Oldham lined up like this: Sibson:

Neil stayed on the bench for the next two games against Sheffield and Hunslet before Ford removed his own No 7 shirt and handed it to the young pretender at Batley. Roden marked his promotion with a try—his first for the club——in a 28-16 win, the third of seven wins in a row following that horrific day at Post Office Road.

Hayes, A Gibbons, Rich, Barrow; D Gibbons, Ford;

Subs: Guest, Doran, Roden, Farrell.

Casey, Hough, Clegg, Holland, McMenemy, Campbell.

It was to be the first of 89 tries Roden has scored in the service of the Roughyeds and no other player, not even a stalwart like Houghie, comes anywhere near that record of consistency in getting over the line in an Oldham jersey. Even now, at the ripe old age of 28, nifty Neil can still find his way to the line when he's in the mood, as he showed once more at Blackpool last Sunday when he recorded what I reckon was the third hat-trick of his Roughyeds career.

He was to have a chuckle later that evening when he switched on his television, clicked on to Teletext and read that 'Oldham's Neil Roden chipped in with FIVE tries in a 44-10 win at Blackpool'.

"I thought I must have forgotten a couple," was his tongue-in-cheek comment later: "They can put me down for five if they wish, I'm not complaining. Seriously though, I was real chuffed to get three because it took my total for the club to 89 and now I have my sights set on 100 Oldham tries.

"Four would have been nice because that would have

equalled the feats of Mark Sibson (twice), David Gibbons and James Bunyan, but it's always good to get a hat-trick.

"I suppose it isn't beyond the realms of possibility that I could score another 11 this season to hit the ton, but in any case I hope to still be with Oldham next season (his current two-year contract ends in November) and if that is the case it goes without saying that we hope to be playing in NL1."

Neil's season-by-season record with Oldham looks like this:

2000: 20 appearances out of 21 possible, 6 tries, two drop goals, 26 points.

2001: 34 appearances out of 34 possible, 16 tries, six drop goals, 70 points.

2002: 36 appearances out of 39 possible, 20 tries, seven drop goals, 87 points.

2003: 28 appearances out of 32 possible, 8 tries, three drop goals, 35 points.

2004: 24 apparances out of 33 possible, 18 tries, 72 points.

2005:

2007: 34 appearances out of 36 possible, 10 tries, two drop goals, 42 points.

2008 (to date): 23 appearances out of 24 possible, 11 tries, 44 points.

OVERALL: 199 appearances out of 219 possible, 89 tries, 20 drop goals, 376 points.

He was the club's leading try scorer in the 2002 season with 20 and his seven drop goals that season also constitutes a club record for drop goals in a season.

No other player in the new club's 10-year history has scored more tries than Roden or, indeed, more drop goals ... and it would be superbly fitting for such an honest, reliable and durable performer to achieve his ambition of scoring 11 more tries for a club career best of 100.

Added Neil: "That's just a personal thing - a side issue, if you like. The main thing is that the club and team does well and 'doing well' this season means winning promotion. We have had a lot of rugby in recent weeks and while getting to the quarter-finals of two cup competitions was good in many ways it has definitely made life tougher for us in terms of our challenge for the NL2 championship.

"All we can do is to go out in each match and give it our best shot, but if we still have ambitions of going

up automatically we can't afford to drop many more points, if any.

"I don't think we'll know for a week or two yet how many teams will go up automatically, but as I say we have to put that to the back of our minds and concentrate on one match at a time. We definitely have the quality in the side to go all the way. Perhaps we have not been as consistent yet as we were in the second half of last season, but having said that I think our best performances this year have been better than anything we produced in 2007.

"It was about this time last year that we started to string together a run of wins which ultimately led us to the Grand Final, and the fact that we have won the last four in a row perhaps suggests that we might be hitting the straps again at the right time just as we did last year.

"On a personal note I am real pleased to hit the 200game mark for Oldham (I still have a bit to go to catch up to Houghie) and, as I say, I would really love to get to 100 tries. That wouldn't be a bad thing to have on my record, eh?"

Indeed, it wouldn't Neil. And when you look at his phenomenal record of consistency in the Oldham jersey and take into account also that he is rarely spelled and that, in any one game, he probably handles the ball more and makes more tactical decisions than anyone else other than his half-back partner, James Coyle, you begin to appreciate his real value to club and team.

It was a bit of a grueller because the traffic was bad both going and coming back. That's why I'm pushed now. Got to go, or Deaks will be having a word with me!"

Don't let anybody ever suggest again that these lads are less than totally committed.

Well done on the 200 appearances Neil ... and very best wishes for the 100 tries. Nobody deserves such a reward more richly than Neil Roden.

Roughyeds match reporter for League Express and lifelong Oldham fan.

With just 10 fixtures still to play in the NL2 league campaign, it is perhaps a good time to assess progress so far, and to look ahead to what the future might bring.

As we currently stand, our overall record is : P 24 W 18 L 6, Pts. For 770, Pts. Against 464. Just 12 of these games, of course, have been in the league, with 30 points amassed from our 10 wins, defeats at both Keighley and Gateshead being not only disappointing in themselves, but also both being by margins of 14 points, thereby preventing us from gaining any bonus points. Only time will tell how vital this may prove.

Of course, the league campaign has been interrupted - I nearly wrote 'complemented', but maybe this would have been a particularly inappropriate word in the circumstances - by cup games. There were early losses at both Salford and Rochdale in the initial stage of the Northern Rail Cup. though qualification for the first ever time for the competition's knock-out stage brought a superb win over Whitehaven before defeat at Batley, and finally 3 Challenge Cup wins before the honourable quarter-final defeat at Wakefield.

The clear pre-season objective, of course, as last year, was promotion to NLI - preferably in the automatic position, but if not, through the play-offs. Our competitors for automatic promotion are Barrow, Doncaster and, surprisingly, Gateshead, who have, in effect, dropped 0, 8 and 2 league points respectively so far compared with our 6.

Crucially, though, we have some vital games still to play, as do these other three teams. Thus, we have both Barrow and Doncaster still to play home and away, as well as Gateshead today here at Sedgley Park. In

addition, Barrow have to visit Doncaster, Doncaster Gateshead and Gateshead Barrow. The bonus point system slightly complicates interpretation of exactly what this means, but although top spot is not in our own hands entirely, it is also clear that, IF we were to win all ten remaining fixtures, either Barrow or Gateshead would have to win some very tricky games if either of them is to finish above us. In particular Barrow would have to win at Doncaster or Gateshead at Barrow. And that, of course, is assuming none of the four contending sides manages to lose at somewhere like Keighley or York - which is by no means certain, and which demonstrates how genuinely competitive the division is.

What this is saying, then, is that the coming two months promises some nail-biting afternoons. Have we the players and the playing strategies to put together a run of 10 more wins? This is where perhaps the cup experiences become relevant. Our wins at Boundary Park against both Salford and Whitehaven, and the cup performances at Dewsbury and Wakefield, surely all demonstrate what we are capable of doing when we play to our potential - and when the players we have are all fully switched on and motivated. In addition, the performances since our defeat at Gateshead have strongly suggested that Steve Deakin and the players have the target well in sight This is not so much in the points we have been scoring, but more significantly in our much-improved defensive efforts.

We shall see! I for one can't wait.

Roughyeds Fight Night

BILL 'The Mighty' Quinn lived up to his billing at the Legends of League boxing extravaganza in Bolton on Saturday night, June 14, when three ringside judges gave him a points win over former New Zealand rugby league Test ace Brad Hepi.

A huge roar went up from the full-house, £70-a-head 800-strong audience at the Reebok Stadium's indoor boxing arena and banqueting rooms when referee Steve Collins raised Quinn's arm in triumph at the end of three rough-house two-minute rounds which provided the best fight of the night.

Prescott, the former St Helens and Hull full-back, is battling a rare form of stomach cancer and has pledged to help Christie's with major fund raising. Collins, the former WBO champion who. with Chris Eubank and Nigel Benn boxed in a golden age of European super middleweight competition, refereed all seven

Herol 'bomber' Graham, another legend of the ring, gave an exhibition of how to use footwork, agility and supreme fitness to avoid punishment at close quarters. But the bouts featuring big names from rugby league's recent past, like Steve Hampson, Anthony Sullivan, Esene Faimalo, Maea David, Garry Schofield, Alan Hunte, Tim Street and Warren Jowitt, topped the bill and there was none more exciting or compelling than the clash of tough-guy Hepi and the Roughyeds chairman.


Each boxer entered the ring under the spotlight, to motivational music and escorted by a bevy of beauties from the Wakefield Trinity Wildcats dance and cheer leader group.

But there was a surprise in store for Bill Quinn when Hepi was joined in the ring by his fellow Kiwis, Faimalo, Maea David and Simo Faitaua who promptly formed a quartet to give a rendition of the Haka, the Maori war chant designed to frighten and intimidate opponents.

"It didn't bother me, it just made me more even more determined to give it my best shot," said Bill, who stood up well to the initial flurry of punches from his younger opponent before outboxing him and scoring countless points with a left hook and a left jab on the counter attack.

Attired in pink in order to promote the breast-cancer research specialists, Genesis, Quinn's boxing technique and ability to keep the more aggressive Hepi at bay with punches on target edged the Roughyeds chief to victory.

Said Bill: "Hepi was a mighty tough opponent, but he never caught me with one that really hurt me. I'm just glad that neither of us got knocked about too much. It was really satisfying to get the verdict because the one thing I didn't want was to let anyone down, most of all Oldham RL Club." First people to congratulate their hero ringside were Bill's fiancee Suzanne, his two sons Michael and Harrison and his father Michael snr, a former all-Ireland Gaelic football champion. "We're all proud of him," said Michael snr."Mighty proud."

A delighted Reserves coach John Hough said: "At last we've got the monkey off our back and now we can start to climb the table. We were unlucky to lose last week, but we kicked on from that game and I thought Chris Clarke

and Luke Sutton looked especially good in the pack.

"It goes without saying that it was a huge lift to have Phil Joseph and Craig Littler in the side. The rest of the side followed them. The Fisher try followed and then Smith saved a certain Rovers try with a great cover tackle on the Rovers right winger Davi Garahan with the corner flag only feet away.

Scrum-half Lowe's kick into the in-goal on the last tackle set up a second try for Sutton and only a couple of minutes later Smith came up with a 40-20 which led to the Joseph try from dummy half.

A flat pass from Joseph sent Sutton crashing over on the burst for the fourth Oldham try to take the Roughyeds in at half time with a commanding 22-4 lead.



David Topliss - A great rugby league player, and a very nice guy. by ROGER HALSTEAD

Oldham supporters will have been shocked and deeply saddened by the loss of David Topliss, who died on June 16 after collapsing while playing five-aside soccer.

The former Great Britain stand-off, a Wakefield Trinity legend who later captained Hull, came to Watersheddings at the end of his career and played a total of 49 Oldham games spread over the 1985-86 and 1986-87 seasons, writes ROGER HALSTEAD.

Oldham were beaten by Castleford at Wigan in the 1986 Challenge Cup semi-final - just one of many games Toppo was forced to miss in the second half of that season after being injured in a car crash.

At the season's end I wrote as follows in the Oldham Evening Chronicle: "Oldham suffered many blows during a season of stark contrasts on and off the field but none to compare with the loss of David Topliss after a car crash.

"The team's slip after an exciting run of 11 league games without defeat can be traced back to a January morning in Wakefield when Topliss suffered head and neck injuries in a road accident.

"He was never to play (that season) again - and Oldham were never quite the same without his influence, leadership and tactical expertise.

"Topliss had justified the faith of manager Frank Myler, particularly in organising Oldham's threequarters into a useful strike force."

Toppo was back the following season to play in 34 of the team's 38 games in all competitions. He played stand-off to Ray Ashton in that memorable match against the Australian tourists, who struggled to beat Oldham 22-16. And he was Paddy Kirwan's stand-off on the night at Watersheddings, in front of 10,000 fans, when Oldham grabbed sporting headlines with a 10-8 first round Challenge Cup win against all-powerful Wigan.

Sadly, Oldham were to be relegated at the end of that season with four going down from a first division of 16. The Topliss-inspired Oldham won 13 of their 30 games that season to finish with 26 points - exactly the same as Leeds, but with a poorer for-and-against record. They finished above Featherstone (17 pts), Barrow (16) and Wakefield (9) yet still got relegated because 25 per cent of the division was required to take the drop.

They were great years, nevertheless, and many hundreds of Oldham fans past and present will be among the many thousands throughout the North of England who have been mourning the premature passing of a great rugby league player, and a very nice guy.
