

NATIONAL LEAGUES TALK

Leigh Centurions play what could be their last ever game at Hilton Park this afternoon (17th August) when they entertain Whitehaven.

Unless Leigh move at least one position up the table before the end of the league campaign - and that is still very possible - this game will see the club and its supporters say farewell to a ground that has been home for 61 years.

Hilton Park has seen many great games through the years, and has played host to Championship and Challenge Cup winning sides.

Though its top flight exposure has been limited in recent seasons, it remains something of an iconic ground for many, and it will undoubtedly be an emotional day for the Centurions' supporters.

The club will be doing much to mark the occasion, with a succession of events being held over the weekend.

The Centurions have also produced a limited edition programme, of some 92 pages, that is available at the club shop, and includes a copy of the programme for the first ever match at Hilton Park.

But while the people of Leigh will be keen to remember days from the past, now is also a time for the club to look to the future, and the move to the plush Leigh Sports Village.

Anybody who hasn't had chance to see what kind of facility the Centurions will be gracing should check out the website at www.leighsportsvillage.co.uk.

The new ground will be the focal point of Leigh's next Super League licence application in 2011, and will provide the kind of resources that the club was crying out for the last time it was in the top flight in 2005.

Everybody has seen the kind of success that the likes of Warrington and Hull FC have generated when moving to new grounds in recent years, and the Centurions will be hoping that their switch can have a similar impact.

The Hilton Park farewell match is one of a handful of crucial clashes in NL1 this weekend, as six clubs battle it out for the bottom three play-off places.

Two of them meet on Thursday when Sheffield host Widnes, before Featherstone look to re-ignite their top six challenge at Dewsbury on Sunday, and Batley face the daunting task of a trip to Salford.

In NL2, Barrow may have taken a big step towards automatic promotion if they beat Keighley on Friday, while Oldham will be looking to keep up the pressure this afternoon here at Swinton.

It's all building towards a fascinating climax to the National League season.

CARNEGIE CHALLENGE CUP Oldham defeated the Armyaway at Aldershot in the third round, before setting up a fourth round win at Swinton. Today marks our fifth clash this season. THE two young loan signings who made impressive debuts for Oldham against Barrow, Michael Brown and James Martin, are likely to be involved again this afternoon. Brown, a 21-year-old centre, and Martin, a 20-year-old back-row forward, have each signed for one month on loan from Super League club Huddersfield Giants.

Brown, a Leeds boy, came out of the Hunslet Parkside club and signed for Leeds Rhinos at 16 before joining the Giants a year ago after three seasons with Leeds Academy. He has played one Super League game off the bench, helping the Giants to beat Harlequins 26-16 at the Galpharm Stadium in June. Martin, a Huddersfield lad, was reared at Newsome Panthers -- the club that produced Phil Joseph -- before joining the Giants and working his way through that club's academy and reserve-team set-up.

Both surpassed expectations in Oldham's win against Barrow, left-centre Brown with a 71st-minute try and substitute Martin working solidy in the forwards for nearly an hour in his first taste of senior rugby.

Said Martin: "I was a little nervous beforehand, but that is not unusual -- it's how my game preparation works. Once I had my first hit-up it was fine. The moves Oldham use are similar to the ones we use in the Huddersfield reserve team, so it is just a case of getting used to the new calls."

"I felt I got through the game okay and hopefully I will make progress from here."

Founded in 1875 as Barrow FC, Barrow is thought to be amongst one of the oldest clubs in the UK that is still surviving and continuing to play. It is impossible to go into great detail on a Web Site with so rich a Club history, so we have endeavoured to put together a very brief outline of some of the key facts and events below.

The game was played in these early years under the Rugby Union code and it was not until April 1897, along with other Morecambe Bay clubs, that the team switched to the two-years old Northern Union.

August 1931 saw Barrow move to its current home ground, Craven Park. The club have reached the Challenge Cup Final on five occasions, winning only once in 1955 against Workington Town.

1938 - Lost to Salford 4-7 1951 - Lost to Wigan 0-10

1955 - Won against Workington 21-12

1957 - Lost to Leeds 7-9

1967 - Lost to Featherstone 12-17

In the recent 2004 season the club managed to gain promotion to Division 1, under the coaching of Peter Roe, however they were to yo-yo down again to Division 2 and that is where they are today.


At the end of 2007 the Board appointed ex-player and assistant Dave Clark as head coach. Dave has been at Craven Park for almost a decade, and has made a great start to his first senior coaching role. Ex favourites Dean Marwood and Darren Carter have been added to the coaching team and together with ex-Wigan and Widnes legend Mick Cassidy, have had a remarkable season.



lan Jackson looks at a big match between Swinton and Oldham, held at Chorley Road in 1900

Almost 108 years ago a monumental encounter took place between the Lions and Oldham at Swinton's Chorley Road enclosure on 29 September 1900. A grand total of 13,118 people watched Swinton win the game by 11 points to nil.

In the crowd, there were 11,311 paying spectators through the gates, 1,638 season coupons, 100 boy's season tickets, 49 complimentary tickets and 20 press passes. One of the press passes belonged to a journalist from the Manchester Weekly Times who wrote under the pseudonym of "one of the crowd". Here is the account of what he witnessed that afternoon as it appeared in the paper on 5 October 1900.

The newspaper piece began as follows: "To the little village of Swinton I journeyed to exercise my journalistic muscle on those who did pursue with nimble feet the bouncing leather bladder." It appears that the journalist found all of Lancashire to be "mostly football mad."

So much so that: "Week in, week out, during the football season, as soon as "th' one-o'clock buzzer" goes, the British workman in these parts throws down his pick, or hod, or spade, or loom, or steam-derrick, or beetle, or Nasmyth hammer or whatever implement he happens to be wielding and flies him to the arena where the jersey-clad gladiators engage in footy encounter for possession of the leathern spheroid."

At first the journalist found it difficult to gain access into the ground as there



were only "two or three narrow slits" serving as entrances. This was because of ground alterations at the Chorley Road enclosure during the summer of 1900. The journalist finally got into the ground via "a private wicket - the players' entrance." Once inside there was a crowd of "about sixteen thousand leather-throated enthusiasts, of whom an energetic minority had evidently journeyed from Spindledom."

Swinton won the toss and made Oldham play into strong sunlight. The game itself was a triumph for the Lions who were top of the league with Oldham at the time. Swinton scored three tries, one each for Bob Valentine, Jack Lewis and Vernon Hampson plus a goal from the legendary James Valentine who was less than four years away from an untimely death when struck by lightening on holiday at Barmouth on 25 July 1904.

It was a physical game as "the tackling sure and deadly" with the players "trod upon, pinched, squashed, strangled and flung violently to the ground" whilst many of them had a "nose tweaked" or "eye bunged-up" and some even had their "face rubbed in the turf". This was the true features of the genuinely uncompromising game of Northern Union Football in 1900.





IN PROFILE

HECTOR HALSALL was Swinton's "Five Cups" winning captain in the 1927-8 season

Following his retirement as a player he went on to coach both Leigh and Barrow, where he helped lay the foundations for their own golden era

Hector Halsall signed for the Lions almost ninety years ago in 1920, coming to the club from Wigan for £105. The inter-war period was a time of rebuilding at the club, with the board putting in place many of the foundations that were to see the Lions become one of the dominant clubs in the game during the 1920s.

Halsall signed at the same time as Albert Jenkins, who joined the club from Ebbw Vale RUFC, and made his debut on 6th November 1920 away at St Helens Recreation, a fixture that was narrowly won 10 points to 9 by the Lions.

In terms of the number of trophies won, Halsall was the most succesful captain that the Lions have known, being captain throughout the decade and, in particular, during the famous "All Five Cups" season eighty years

During his time with the Lions he earned one Great Britain cap when he took at the Kangaroos in the first test match to take place at the newly built Station Road ground in the 1929-30 series. The match is remembered not only for being the only 0-0 draw in Ashes history, but also for an incident in which Swinton's Fred Butters severely injured his ear.

His final game for the Lions was just seven weeks later when Swinton took on Widnes at Station Road, a game that eneded in a 7-all draw.

Following his retirement, Halsall continued to run the Buckley Arms on Partington Lane in Swinton, where he had been landlord for a year previous, and staved until 1933.

By this point he had become coach at Barrow, where he was to remain until 1950, leading the

In his book "Twin Towers" Barrow historian, Keith Nutter, notes that Halsall was the "brains" behind the team, bringing great players such as Willie Horne and Jim Lewthwaite to the fore at Craven Park

In 1950 Halsall retired as coach at Barrow, but continued to take an active interest in the club as groundsman.
