



Harder and harder to earn a genuine payday

VER the past year or so I am pretty sure you'll have heard that things are not going well with our economy.

In fact, you probably know someone who has been directly impacted by the credit crunch.

These are tough times and rugby league is not immune to the economic slowdown. Clubs at our level of the game in particular are fighting hard to attract sponsorship. My heart goes out to them.

On pages four and five we look at Doncaster, a club who have become synonymous with financial difficulties. For them it has been a long, hard battle to stay afloat but at last it seems there is something sustainable in the offing.

Good luck to them and I hope it works out. The club has struggled to attract the crowds it needs. It is not heart-and-soul rugby league territory so all those in South Yorkshire deserve credit for fighting the fight.

For semi-professional clubs buying the equivalent of a potentially life-changing lottery ticket comes in the form of the Challenge Cup.

Can you imagine the difference getting drawn at Leeds Rhinos in, say, round four would make to the Dons? All in all, pretty enormous.

But that potentially-lucrative stroke of good fortune has been dissipated by the decision to let season ticket holders at Super League clubs watch the Challenge Cup for free.

For the likes of Barrow, who had Wigan in round four, that move will have hardly affected the revenue they brought in for a full-house 6,275 gate. Because the Raiders have such a massive latent support base the overwhelming majority will have paid to see that match. There were 'only' 1,500 Wigan fans there and even if most of them were season ticket holders it still meant a massive payday for the Cumbrian club.

On the flipside of the coin are cash-strapped Hornets RL. Having scraped through round four with a six-point victory over Swinton they appear to have earned a financially-lucrative draw at in-form Super League side Huddersfield Giants.

The Giants are a club whose attendances have steadily risen, but this season their average gates have been boosted by a mega-cheap season ticket offer.

And how many 'floating' fans are going to be tempted down to the Galpharm when 'it is only' the Hornets?

I am sure it will be decent payday for the Rochdale club, but without that golden ticket factor the competition has lost that edge for the minnows.



IT'S FAIR to say that Doncaster RLFC have seen more changes than most rugby league clubs in recent times.

The past 14 years have seen three name changes and no less than 10 coaching changes while the club has called four different venues home.

Their trademark colours were even switched from blue and gold to red, white and black for a brief spell during the 18 months Doncaster were known as the

Yet that is just the start, for events off the field have been equally turbulent.

The club went into liquidation after their one and only season in the top flight in 1995, and John Wright had to stave off the threat of liquidation again in 2001 before succumbing in 2007.

Wright had overseen the club's move to the Lakeside Community Stadium (now the Keepmoat Stadium), while the team was making steady progress under the late St John Ellis, who was the English game's longest serving coach when he suddenly passed away on New Year's Eve 2005.

Doncaster-born businessmen Craig Harrison and Shane Miller struck a deal to After Doncaster's two main backers pulled out of the club it has been a perilous existence but nearly two years of uncertainty could be about to end after various bodies have come together to form an advisory board. GAME ON reports

revive the club in 2007, and although the Dons were unable to avoid relegation that year, they pulled off a major coup by luring rugby league legend Ellery Hanley back into the game.

His appointment as coach helped inspire the Dons to an immediate return last season, beating Oldham in the Grand Final to seal promotion.

Harrison and Miller have both now left the club, though, and chief executive Dave Marshall and accounts director Karen Bailey have taken on the arduous task of trying to keep things ticking over.

"We went from a club that had two backers pumping six-figure sums in over 18 months to me and Karen, who haven't got any money to put in and are just trying to keep the club going, which is what the fans have asked for," said Marshall.

"We've taken this on on behalf of the fans and the club just to keep rugby league going in Doncaster.

'There's no-one putting money in behind the scenes and anything we bring in is going straight back into the club.

"It's just a case of if fans want a club in Doncaster, this is what we're trying to provide at the moment."

But that task was boosted at the end of last month by a consortium of local businesses forming an advisory board for the

UK Coal, Green Energy Solutions and Sewell Moorhouse have agreed to contribute an equal financial sum every season for the next three years, which could spark another rugby league revival in South Yorkshire as Doncaster have set their sights on a top-flight return in 2012.

The advisory board is helping put together Pro Doncaster 2012, a plan aimed at submitting a successful Super League application in 2011 for the 2012

"The advisory board will try to generate income for the club and look at putting a three-year business plan in place," said Marshall.

"It's early stages so there's not much detail so far but we'll be trying to develop the business both on and off the field and it's a boost to help us stay solvent.

"In the current climate, the more support we can get, the better, so it will be massively important if we are to move this club forward positively."

In the meantime, head coach Tony Miller must soldier on with a depleted squad and he can only bring players in on match payments in his bid to maintain their Championship status.

"We lost three big players last year -Zeb Luisi, Corey Lawrie and Luke Gale - Ellery Hanley and his coaching partner Tony Miller brought success to


and with the budget we have we've struggled to replace them," added Marshall.

"We think we've signed enough quality to be competitive but we've got quite a thin squad and had eight players out last

"When you've got no cash and you're trying to bring people in on next to nothing, it's always going to be tough when you get hit with eight injuries, and I don't think people appreciate how tough it is here now both on and off the field.

"But the target this season remains consolidation and staying in the Co-operative

Featherstone back among big boys

IT WILL be just like the good old days down at Post Office Road after Featherstone Rovers pulled star-studded Warrington out of the hat in Tuesday's fifth round Carnegie Challenge Cup draw.

Dary Powell (pictured right) has big ambitions for the club and the tie will provide him with an excellent yardstick as to the strides Rovers are making.

Featherstone, three times winners of the events, have made a strong start to life in the Championship and the club will be hoping to pack The Chris Moyles Stadium for the tie against a side who have made a terrible start to their Super League campaign.

After losing their first five league games, Warrington appointed England coach Tony Smith as their new boss. He is assisted by the previous man in charge, Jimmy Lowes.

Smith has helped turn things around and the Wolves have won their last two matches.

Batley also get to welcome Super League opposition with Salford the visitors to The Mount. The teams know each other well though having played each other home and away in National One last season.

Many of the top flight clubs will have been hoping to avoid the biggest banana skin – aka Halifax – but that honour has gone to Castleford although Terry Matterson's side have home advantage.

Cash-strapped Hornets will be hoping for a big crowd when they travel to the Galpharm to tackle in-form Huddersfield Giants while Sheffield Eagles have a similarly daunting prospect as they must go to Hull KR.

Meanwhile the Co-operative Championships are guaranteed a team in the quarter-finals after Gateshead Thunder were paired with Oldham.



Tickets go on sale for cup finale

Rugby League will rock Blackpool on July 11 and 12 with the seaside resort hosting the inaugural Northern Rail 9s tournament as well as the Northern Rail Cup Final

And supporters can now purchase their tickets for the action packed weekend.

The Northern Rail 9s tournament will feature every domestic based Co-operative Championship and Co-operative Championship 1 club not involved in the Northern Rail Cup final and will be played over two days at Fylde RUFC before culminating at Bloomfield Road on the Sunday.



Agonisingly close for battling Barrow

WIGAN went into the hat for the fifth round of the Challenge Cup but they were given one almighty scare by BARROW before a sell-out 6,275 crowd at a sun-baked Craven Park.

It took two tries in the final minutes to secure the 32-20 victory for the Super League side as Barrow pushed them all they way in a pulsating 80 minutes.

The Cumbrians sprung a surprise when announcing their team as chairman Des Johnson paraded new recruit Ned Catic to the crowd, and the former Castleford and Wakefield star took his place on the bench 24 hours after arriving in the country.

Barrow were given a standing ovation as they left the field – not only by the home supporters, but also by the 1,500 travelling Wigan fans.

The game hung in the balance at 20-24 on the hour with Wigan hanging onto that four-point lead. The ground erupted as Barrow's centre Liam Harrison crashed over in the corner only for referee Jamie Leahy to rule that the pass from Finch was forward.

Barrow could have levelled at 24-24 and gone ahead if the conversion was successful. However, Wigan survived and it was they who were awarded a dubious try in the corner from Karl Pryce, who looked to have lost the ball in touching down.

Barrow stand off Liam Finch was awarded the Carnegie man of the match and was outstanding as he overshadowed Wigan's Sam Tomkins, who only came into the frame in the closing minutes when he weaved his way through for what was to be the match-winning try.

KEIGHLEY put up a very spirited fight against Castleford and, as quite often is the case, the scoreline was not a true reflection of game, the Tigers winning 64-20 at Cougar Park.

A flurry of penalties in the second half, plus the Cougars losing Danny Jones to the sin-bin, allowed the Tigers to rattle in the tries, including a hat-trick from man-of-the-match Rangi Chase.

It was not the only hat-trick of the game, the other coming from Keighley's Lee Mapals, who scored probably the try of the match on 79 minutes when he ran 90 metres to touch down.

Wakefield were far too strong, far too quick and far too skilful for LEIGH at Belle Vue as the hosts won 54-0.

The Centurions surprised the Wildcats in the opening minutes when centre Sam Reahy broke down the right channel but he didn't see support looming on his outside and the move broke down on 30-metre line.


And that was Leigh's best moment of the first half. Too many errors (and a couple of costly penalties) proved their downfall and with home halfback Danny Brough kicking out of hand superbly, Leigh spent most of the opening 40 minutes trapped inside their own 20.

Leigh trailed 26-0 going into the break but could not stem the flow in the second half.

Leigh Centurions coach Neil Kelly said: "It was significant that a significant number of Wakefield tries came after we'd defended for 10 tackles not just six because we'd given a penalty away on the third or fourth tackle.

"And that meant we'd another set to do near our own line after a good kicking game from Danny Brough. It's just an unstoppable tide when you do that to yourselves. The discipline was never going to be cured in one week, but it's got to be cured for next week."

As expected, Warrington progressed comfortably through to



the fifth round with a 56-10 success over a gallant YORK outfit at the Halliwell Jones stadium

The Wolves never threatened to hit anything like top gear and the final scoreline had a somewhat flattering look as the home side scored four tries in the final 11 minutes following the dismissal of York prop Danny Ekis.

Ékis was shown his red card by referee James Child in the 63rd minute for a high challenge on Louis Anderson, who was also sin-binned after he reacted to the tackle with a flurry of punches which sparked a mini-fracas.

York director of football James Ratcliffe said: "I don't think the final scoreline does us justice because it was a valiant effort and after the sending off there were gaps galore and it was a matter of damage limitation for the final 15 minutes when we were down to 12 men."

The last time HALIFAX entertained WIDNES just a fortnight earlier, they provided a thrilling spectacle.

And their Friday night encounter actually surpassed it as Halifax once again took the spoils, edging out their great rivals 20-16.

Matt Calland's Halifax had

trailed 8-6 at the interval and when the impressive Anthony Thackeray scored an early second half try for the Vikings it looked like Paul Cullen's side were destined to exact revenge.

However, thanks to another monumental defensive effort led by veteran Dave Larder, Bob Beswick and Paul Smith, Fax managed to thwart a strong Widnes outfit and clinch the game with unanswered tries from Shad Royston and Mark Roberts.

Lucas Onyango celebrated his return to the OLDHAM side after several weeks out with a hat trick of tries that included one from deep inside his own half as Oldham beat Lezignan 60-30.

Andy Ballard, on the other flank, chipped in with 10 goals and two tries to take his points tally in the last two games to 58 and had Oldham fans roaring whenever he turned the Lezignan defence inside-out, which was often.

Centre Marcus St Hilaire also got a brace as Oldham treated their fans to some fantastic football fare, created in the main by the Coyle brothers, James and Thomas.

GATESHEAD produced a solid display in the final 20 minutes of the first half to storm into the last 16, scoring three unanswered tries which effectively left DONCASTER with far too much to do in the second period as they won 32-18.

Doncaster coach Tony Miller was very disappointed with his charges, saying: "We started well and we finished well, but it seems like deja vu again in the 20-60 minute period, for some reason we are not mentally switched-on.

"We are certainly switched on physically as we keep finishing games off strongly."

SHEFFIELD produced a great late show to end DEWSBURY'S seven-match winning run with a 28-18 victory. The Rams gave their all as they took an 18-8 lead but in the final 25 minutes the Eagles at last got meaningful possession and blasted back in style.

Sheffield coach Mark Aston felt his side had earned the win by solid hard work. He said: "You can put it down to perseverance. Credit to Dewsbury, they hadn't lost a game and you can see why. They were very dogged and kept going, with a good attitude, and they are a hard team to beat."

A late George Flanagan try sealed a dramatic 28-24 win for BATLEY in a glorious cup tie at the Mount against HUNSLET. Neither coach could have envisaged what a nail-biter the game would be – it was a magnificent old-fashioned cup match with some iron-hard tackling and one glorious try from a man worth the money to see plus another eight tries for good measure.

HORNETS RL came from nowhere to inflict a surprise, but deserved, 28-22 win against SWINTON, who are unbeaten in the league.

Similarly to last week's narrow win at home to Keighley, the Lions built up a decent lead before allowing their opponents back in the game, a tendency they will need to look to eradicate to obtain much success this season.

FEATHERSTONE overcame a spirited challenge from Cumbrian amateurs Wath Brow to reach the fifth round.

Wath Brow looked set for a drubbing when they were 50-0 down early in the second half but they emerged with great credit after staging a gutsy fightback.

Jon Steel, making his comeback after a foot injury, collected a hat-trick of tries and Andy Kain and Joe McLocklan each grabbed two touchdowns as Rovers bounced back from the heavy home defeat against Whitehaven to win 54-16. 

oday it is back to the bread and butter of the Co-Operative Championship following a tremendous day against Wigan in the Carnegie Challenge Cup last week.



The arrival of Ned Catic was not announced until the day of the Wigan match. He hadn't been in the country long and we did not want to put any pressure on him to turn out in the Cup.






After our defeat at home to Barrow, there were a few home truths that needed to be said and we also took a bit of criticism which, to be fair, was due.







So we welcome the play-


ers, coaches, officials and supporters of Toulouse Olympique to Mount Pleasant for today's game.



Dewsbury will dish out harsh lesson

For most teams it is a case of two games in four days and as MIKE **OXLEY of Totesport** explains, that adds a new dimension to this weekend's fixtures

IN 2004 there was a scandal in the sport of rugby league involving Great Britain international players Sean Long and Martin

Both players were playing for St Helens at the time; the match in question was between Bradford and St Helens on Easter Monday, April 2004.

The game, which Bradford won 54-8, changed the rules and betting on rugby league for ever. In the inquiry that followed both Long and Gleeson were found guilty of breaching an RFL bylaw prohibiting players betting on matches in which their club was involved, regardless of whether or not they were involved in

Thereafter the RFL implemented a 48-hour declaration rule so that teams had to announce a 19-man squad two days before the game. That was then reduced to a 17-man squad on the day.

The rule only applies to Super League fixtures and for me it is still hard to implement, especially for this weekend's games where nearly all the clubs have two games in four days.

Personally, as a bookmaker, I am not in favour of the rule as I think it is part of the game that we all have to play detectives and try and find out what team a club is putting out ahead of the

the four-day Easter period, it will be the punters and supporters who are close to the clubs that will know where the value lies during the weekend.

The cynics among us will look at certain matches to see if a club will put their best team out or whether they will rest a few on the Friday knowing that they have a better chance of picking two points up at home on the Monday.

A team like London Skolars could be the perfect case of the above scenario. They play Dewsbury on the Friday, who in handicap terms will be conceding around 40+ points; whereas on the Monday London will be hosting Blackpool Panthers where they will have a better chance in a more competitive match.





Leigh have been at the forefront of helping raise educational standards with initiatives related to rugby league. GAME ON reports on how the Centurions have made a difference

LEIGH Centurions' community ing tirelessly over the last five years with the local schools of Leigh and most recently in Bolton, to deliver high quality, holistic, vibrant and innovative programmes that enhance the image of the sport and the lives of all the participants

One of our most highly acclaimed education programmes started four years ago and has gone from strength to strength within that

Aimhigher is a national initiative to raise levels of participation in higher education.

It aims to work together with varying partners to set up a range of activities which will encourage more people to consider entering higher education and help them to succeed in gaining a place.

Aimhigher Greater Manchester is funded by the Higher Education Funding Council (HEFCE) and the Learning and Skills Council (LSC) and the Department for Education and Skills (DfES) as part of a national initiative to raise levels of participation in higher education.

Their task is to work together to encourage more people to apply to enter higher education and to help them succeed in gaining a place. It works to increase social inclusion by encouraging learners to take advantage of higher level education.

The concept of a local pro-

fessional rugby league club working with Aimhigher Greater Manchester was founded by Professor Barry Dale a university lecturer and keen Leigh fan.

Professor Dale recognised the potential in a programme linked to the club and after several initial programme writing sessions between business and leisure & tourism teachers from four local high schools and the clubs community department, the outline of the first programme was formed.

Four years on and the programme is still going strong

although changed a little from the first drafts and deliveries but more focused and innovative and with the added bonus of peer mentors from our past cohorts.

The main objectives of the Aimhigher with the Centurions' programme is to increase the participants knowledge of how Leigh Centurions works as a an organisation, to raise the aspirations, motivation and self esteem of those who have traditionally not progressed to higher education and support them to aim higher, to raise levels of attainment at KS4 and

level three and enable progression to higher education and to widen knowledge of different career paths and further education and higher education options.

The programme this year aims to give local young adults (year 10 pupils) from St Mary's Catholic High, Bedford High and Westleigh High an insight into the workings of the professional Rugby League club and its product - a matchday.

Over the past cohorts students have put together matchday entertainment packages that have included

Samba bands, local dancers, tribute acts, sweet and tombola stalls, face painting, kids areas and school sports day half time activities. As part of the initiative students also have to decide on their target

audience and then promote the game through special ticket initiatives, this ends up becoming a healthy competition between the schools and the crowds for the Aimhigher matchdays always increase!

Over the course of the eight weeks pupils will experience various different marketing activities that staff at the club would usually undertake for each matchday.

Such activities will include,

designing a matchday poster, designing a media package for the matchday and design and implementation all matchday entertainment - all within a budget. The organisation of a Leigh Centurions matchday is really what sets the programme out from all other Aimhigher projects.

The success of the programme over the last four years has been immense with around 60% of pupils going onto Further and/or Higher Education, and testament to this was the Community Department winning the Key innovator award at the Aimhigher Awards last year.

The 2009 programme will start after the Easter Holidays at the clubs Playing for Success Leigh Learning Zone study Centre at the Leigh Sports Village stadium and will run for eight weeks for two hours on a Friday after school

The Aimhigher matchday will take place on Sunday June 14 when Leigh Centurions take on Gateshead Thunder at the LSV.


