

# SOLDIER BEN LINED UP FOR HIS ROUGHYEDS RETURN

**WINGER** Ben Seru, out for nearly a year with a serious injury to his left knee, will be back in full training at Oldham within the next few weeks.



Since his knee was smashed on his senior Roughyeds debut in last year's Carnegie Challenge Cup quarter-final defeat at Wakefield, the soldier has had a major reconstruction and has spent the last few months working hard on an Army rehabilitation programme. He contacted the club last week to say the time was fast approaching for his return to rugby and he had further talks with club officials when, proudly sporting a Roughyeds replica jersey, he turned up to watch last Saturday's Carnegie Challenge Cup clash with Gateshead Thunder at Darlington.

Said Ben: "I'm running again now, but I am still working hard on building up the strength in my leg. The Army physios have told me I could be back in full training at Oldham in three to four weeks, but then I would probably need a couple more weeks to get up to speed." The British Army's dual-code Fijian winger did enough in his first-ever game for Oldham, a reserve team match at Widnes, to earn an immediate first-team call-up at Wakefield a few days later, but the tie was only 17 minutes old when he was forced to limp out of the action. His signing by Oldham in May, 2008 on a contract that would run to November, 2009 successfully concluded two months of talks with Army and player.

Aged 31, and a sapper with 15 Field Support Squadron, 38 Engineer Regiment, Ben is a serving soldier with the Royal Engineers, stationed at Ripon in North Yorkshire. He came to Oldham's attention with a stunning performance for the Army when Roughyeds beat them 56-10 at Aldershot in a third-round Carnegie Challenge Cup tie on March 9, 2008. Club officials made their interest known when the tie was over and he signed ten weeks later to become the club's first-ever signing from the Armed Forces.

He was a prominent player for the Army in both codes of rugby, having twice played for the union side against the Royal Navy in front of massive Twickenham crowds ---40,000 in 2007 and 50,000 in the early part of 2008. Shortly before signing for Oldham he spent two weeks in South Africa with the Army's rugby union squad on a special training exercise. Married with two small daughters, Ben was devastated when he was so seriously injured on his Oldham debut, but a year on he is delighted with his recovery and is determined to be back in a Roughyeds jersey as soon as he gets the all-clear.

Chris Hamilton, the Roughyeds chief executive, said this week: "Ben is back running again, still in straight lines but he will start stepping again in the next few days. "He is a very determined character and we know he has a lot of ability. "It was a huge blow to us as well as to him when he suffered an injury like that on his Oldham debut, but he is keen to get back now and we are looking at him being up to full fitness in about five to six weeks."

# BALLARD THE BOOT IN RECORD POINTS HAUL

**Club history rewritten as Benson's boys put on a capital show to win 78-10 in London.**

**RAMPANT Roughyeds smashed THREE all-time club records when beating the struggling Skolars 78-10 in London in their most recent league game. Congratulations to all concerned in the rewriting of more than 100 years of club history.**

Individually, the toast was Andy Ballard, whose 13 goals and two tries gave him the distinction of having scored more points in one game - 34 - than any other Oldham player going back to 1895 and beyond.

But that wasn't the only Roughyeds record to tumble on a day when coach Tony Benson's boys rattled up Oldham Rugby's highest-ever match score and also recorded the club's biggest-ever winning margin - achievements that bettered anything produced by the great Oldham sides of the Roaring Twenties and the Fabulous Fifties.

Later, a delighted Benson revealed how Ballard kicked his way into Oldham Rugby folklore despite having to use a couple of marker cones of different sizes as a make-do-and-mend kicking tee.

"Andy rarely uses a proper kicking tee," he said.

"Instead, he will make do with two marker cones, but they went missing at London and he was forced to improvise by using cones of different sizes.

"Being the laid-back character that he is, it didn't bother him one little bit. Amazing really."

The former Wigan and Salford winger had equalled Abe Johnson's 81-year-old record haul of 30 points in a match with nine goals and three tries in a 66-14 win against Workington Town at Boundary Park five weeks earlier.

This time, on a sunny May day in the unlikely setting of a North London athletics stadium, he claimed the record for himself by scoring two tries in the first half and producing a faultless display of goalkicking to land 13 conversions from 13 attempts.

Only the legendary Bernard Ganley ever kicked more goals than that in one game for Oldham and that was 50 years ago when he kicked 14 against Liverpool City on April 4, 1959.

A small crowd - most of those from Oldham - witnessed the moment seven minutes from the end when Ballard converted Neil Roden's try from under the posts to take his total for the match to 32 and thus cause 81 years of Roughyeds history to be rewritten.

Seemingly unaware of the significance of his achievement, Ballard said later: "Sure, it's nice to know I've broken the record, but really I should have scored a few more points than I did.

"Looking back, I think I should have had two more tries in the first half - once when I put the ball back inside to Thomas Coyle and on another occasion when I kicked inside. Thomas scored himself thankfully, but looking back I think I should have backed myself in both instances and gone for the line.

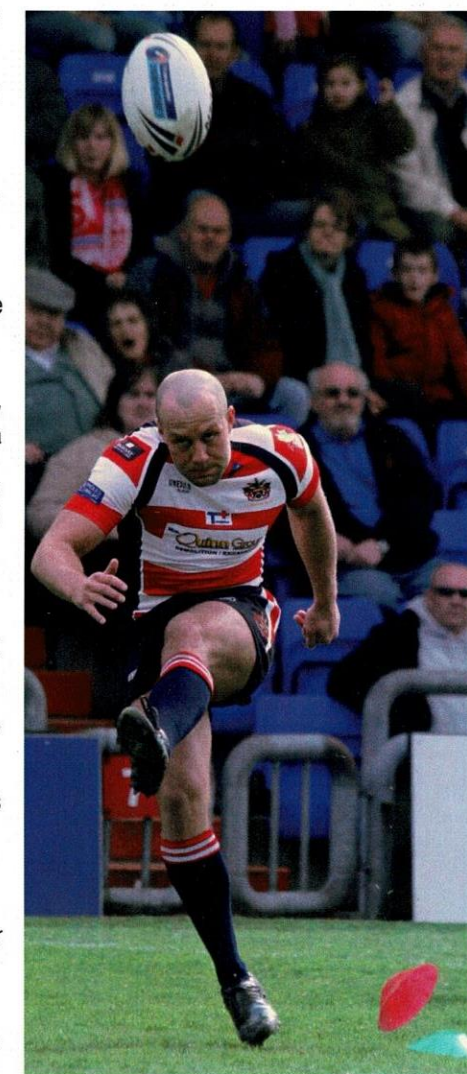
"But that's the way I play. I'm not greedy, I just do what I can for the team. Still, it's good to keep the points pot bubbling."

Ballard has now kicked 75 goals and scored 13 tries so far this season to amass 202 points in his attempt to smash Pat Rich's record for the new Oldham club of 146 goals in 2001 and Mick Nanyin's best of 362 points in 2008.

If he achieves either of those he will then be striving to beat Ganley's all-time club record hauls of 200 goals and 412 points in a season, both set in 1957-58.

Surprisingly, Andy doesn't practise his goalkicking other than in the warm-up before matches.

"There are no rugby posts where we train," he explained, "but I've been kicking goals since I was about seven years old and it just comes naturally. To be honest I don't think about it all that much. I just go out and do it."

## Teenage new boys in tough baptism for the Reserves

A YOUNG Roughyeds reserve side, which included three 17-year-old debutants, was beaten 56-0 by a strong Leigh Centurions side at Sedgley Park, following their 50-30 defeat by Hunslet Hawks in their opening game of the league season at the same venue.

First-team squad members Jason Boults, Craig Littler and Luke Sutton were in the Oldham side, as well as the three 17-year-old new boys - Ross Coates, who has been playing rugby union at Littleborough; Luke Clegg from Oldham St Anne's; and Austin Barraclough from the Newsome amateur club in Huddersfield, recommended by Phil Joseph.

Coach John Hough said that, despite the defeat, Oldham showed more commitment and enthusiasm than they had in the first game and kept going against heavy odds until the end of the match.

He said Leigh fielded an exceptionally strong side and would be expected to be one of the leading sides in the competition.

Oldham had an opportunity to get a second crack at Hunslet Hawks on Friday evening and their next home game, at Sedgley Park, will be against Barrow on Saturday, May 30, with a 2.30pm kick off.

# JAMIE HOPES TO BLAZE THE PROMOTION TRAIL NOW EARLY-SEASON KNOCKS ARE BEHIND HIM

## PLAYER PROFILE

### No 9 JAMIE I'ANSON

Roger Halstead talks to a Top Gun who shoots from the hip.

At the age of 21 Jamie I'Anson is one of the youngest players in Oldham's first-team squad, yet he has already experienced many of the ups and downs associated with life as a professional rugby league player.

In recent weeks he has been doing battle in the Roughyeds' front-row despite a wide variety of bumps, bruises, twists, sprains and knocks which would have sidelined many a player who did not have a disposition that was as hard as granite.

"I've been carrying lots of little injuries," he revealed. "They weren't bad enough to keep me out for any length of time, but they were enough to hinder my performances, and I'm the first to know that."

"Hopefully, and with a bit of luck, they are all behind me now and I can kick-on and start to show the sort of form I produced early in the year."

The young Yorkshireman, raised in the

Leeds Rhinos Academy set-up and developed further in two seasons with Celtic Crusaders down in Wales, hopes to be blazing the promotion trail with the Roughyeds over the course of the next few months.

He is enjoying his rugby here at Oldham - "more than at any other club I've been at" - and his goal for the remainder of this season is to help Roughyeds to achieve their aim of climbing out of the sport's third tier at the third time of asking, following Grand Final defeats in 2007 and 2008.

"Promotion is the goal, no matter how we do it," said Jamie. "We've suffered a couple of setbacks in the league and the automatic spot might now be out of our

hands, although its early days yet and anything can happen over the course of the season."

"We've just got to concentrate on each game as it comes up, and see where it takes us. But promotion is the goal, and there are more ways than one of achieving it."

Jamie was born and bred in the same area of Leeds as his Roughyeds captain and mentor, Robert Roberts. Jamie is from Whinmoor, 'Two Bobs' from Seacroft, but both are in the south-east of the city where they breed 'em tough, and they breed 'em for rugby league.

Jamie's grandad and uncle played league and by the age of 11 he was following in the family tradition and turning out for Whinmoor Warriors under-12s.

He didn't always play in the front-row, but he was always somewhere in the pack -- a big, strong lad who liked to play his weight.

Honours came quickly, and easily . . . Leeds service area, Leeds and District, Yorkshire Boys, and the biggest of them all, the offer of a Rhinos scholarship at the age of 11. By the time he was 15 he was signing pro forms for one of the most famous clubs in world rugby league. "I signed for Rhinos on a four-year contract," he recalled, "and it was great to be at a club like that while I was so young."

"They had great coaches, fantastic facilities and everything about the place was professionalism at its best."

In his early days at Leeds,



Jamie couldn't go wrong. Playing for the Rhinos junior sides as well as for Hunslet Parkside under-15s and under-16s, he represented England under-16s and England Academy as well as being named Top Gun at a national development squad.

During his apprenticeship with Rhinos he had a brief spell on loan with Featherstone Rovers and it was while he was at Post Office Road that he came up against a team that was just starting to make a name for itself in South Wales, Celtic Crusaders.

He must have made a big impression on Celtic because coach John Dixon was soon keen to inquire about the future plans of the young, energetic and robust front-rower who didn't know how to take a backward step.

Jamie takes up the story. "When I was 19 I realised it was time to move on from Leeds. Crusaders were interested in taking me down to South Wales and although it was a massive move for me, which involved uprooting and going to live down there, I saw it as an ambitious club that would be right for me."

In his first year in Bridgend, things couldn't have worked out any better. He got a lot of first-team football; quickly became a fans' favourite; and learned a lot from team mates, several of whom had played NRL football in Australia.

At the end of his first year there, Crusaders won promotion to what was then National League One. They strengthened the squad, and Jamie discovered in his second season that he was getting fewer opportunities at senior level.

"I still played about 17 first-team games," he recalled, "but nothing like as many as the year before and I found myself in the Reserves a lot more than I had been in 2007."

"Things were not working out for me as I had hoped, and I tried to get a move back to the North on loan. A few clubs were interested, including Oldham, but Crusaders were asking for too much money so I had to wait until the end of the season when I had negotiated a settlement for my release."

"Once I was free to move I talked to Oldham again, and signed, and I am glad I did because I am really enjoying my time here."

He has no regrets about moving to Wales, though, and he is firmly of the belief that there is a great

future for the sport in the south of the Principality.

He opined that the RFL should stick with Crusaders and continue to encourage them and added: "To push the game down there is one of the best things the Rugby League has done in recent years. "Now that Crusaders are in Super League, they can only get stronger and I am sure that eventually the game down there will flourish. I hope so anyway. They deserve it."

Jamie, who was only 11 when he used to watch Marcus St Hilaire playing for Leeds at Headingley, looks to 'Junior', 'Two Bobs' and the other senior professionals at Oldham for guidance, just as he sought help from his more experienced colleagues at Leeds and at Crusaders.

"I don't have a hero within the game," he added, "but I respect every single person who plays this game and I am learning all the time from players who have been around for a lot longer than I have."

Jamie has recently joined forces with 'Two Bobs' in representing Roughyeds on community work in primary schools right across the Oldham borough.

Each day of the week they do morning and afternoon sessions in the schools, and Jamie is learning the rudiments of community work from his club captain, just as he takes guidance from him on the field.



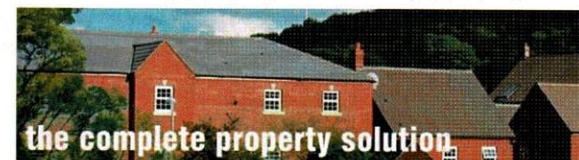

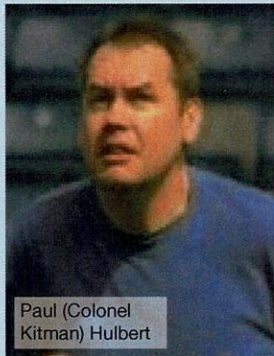


All coaches within the club are fully qualified to a minimum of Level 1, and are fully CRB checked. This all complies with the Clubmark standard the club is accredited to.

Oldham reached the quarter-final last year and they will be hoping to go one better this time when they take on Featherstone - and their Oldham-born star Iestyn Harris - at the new Leigh Sports Village stadium on Thursday, June 4 (7.30pm kick off) in a match to be televised live by Sky Sports.

As part of the club's community work Jamie I'Anson and Chris Baines are now working alongside club skipper Robert Roberts, who has been a regular visitor into Oldham's primary schools for more than a year.

Hardly a day goes by when 'Two Bobs' does not go into local schools and he is now being joined by Jamie, while Chris has been working in secondary schools.

Club coach Tony Benson said in an interview on Oldham Community Radio: "The event with Northern Rail was not a one-off thing as far as the Roughyeds' work in schools is concerned.

"We are only too pleased to help in any way we can, and not just on rugby but on other matters such as healthy eating and healthy life style and on other matters as well.

"Robert, Jamie and Chris are out today, as they are every day. The community is very important to us."

In the player profile on Jamie I'Anson on pages 4 and 5 of this programme you can read how the young prop is now working in tandem with 'Two Bobs' on community work and is enjoying every minute of it.

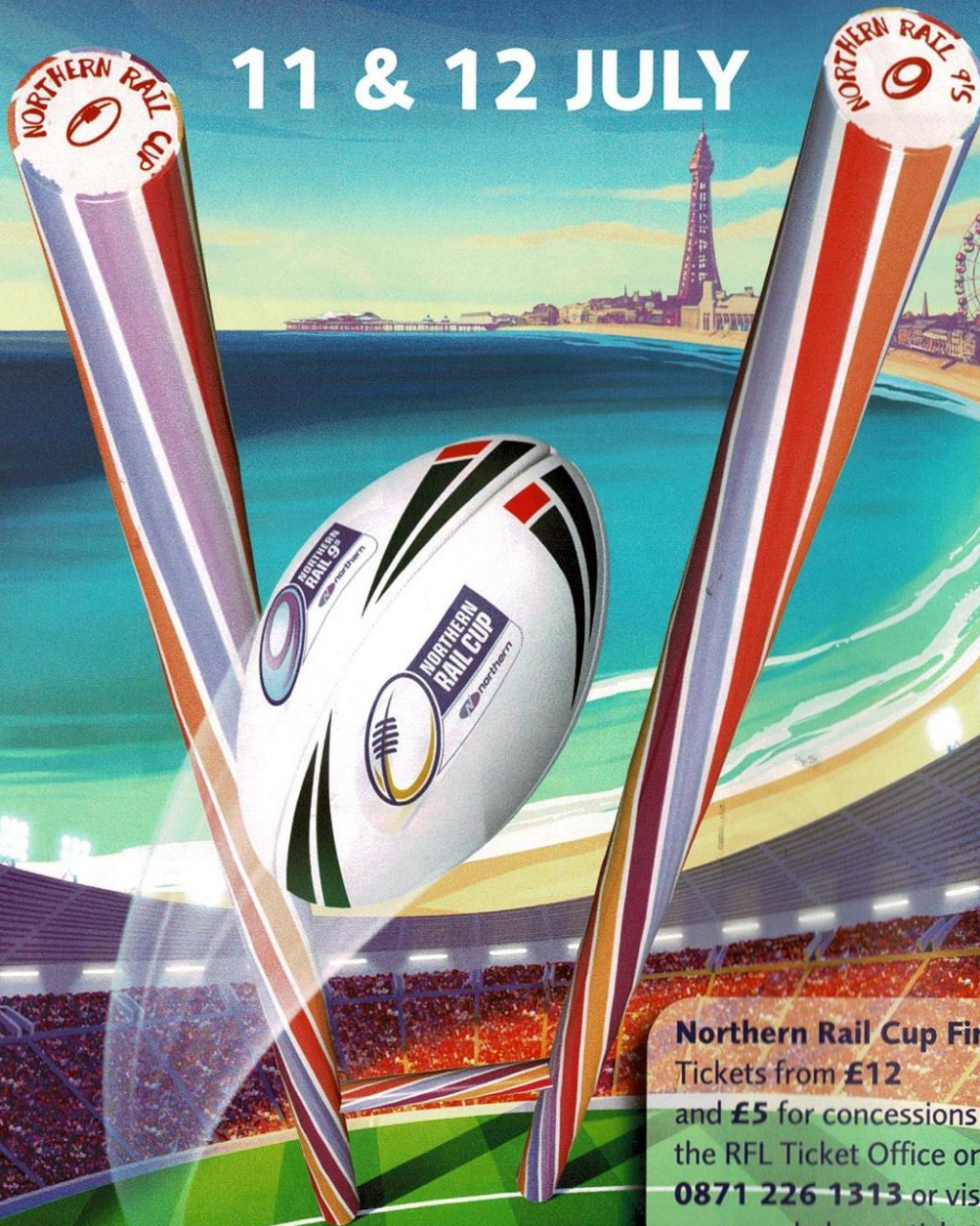

The men from Don Valley deserve as many plaudits as Halifax for pushing the team second in Super League so close. Mark Aston was very proud of his team and so he should be.

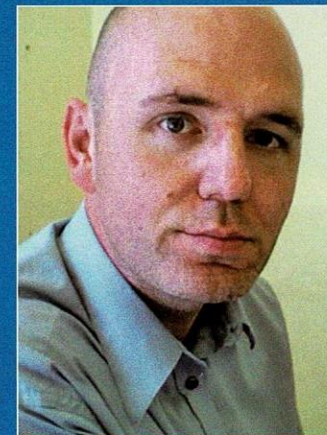
It is arguably their best and most surprising result since winning the Challenge Cup more than 10 years ago.

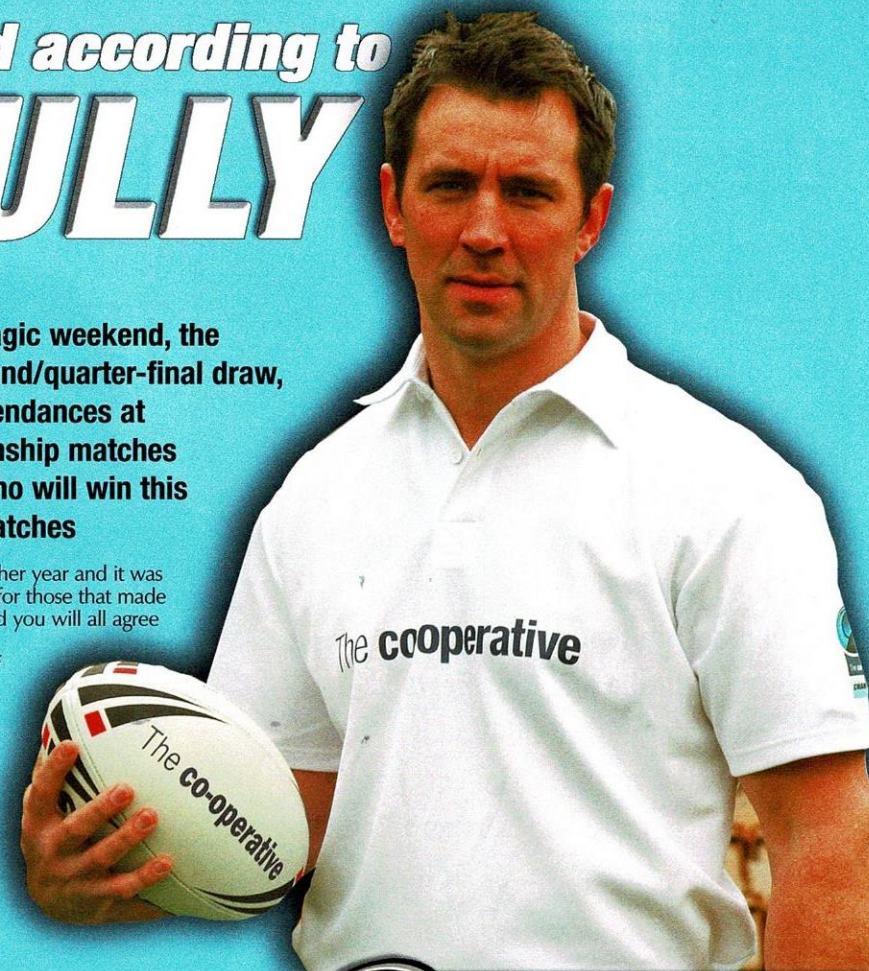

He replaced long-time boss Gary Thornton, who parted company with the Championship strugglers after losing 60-22 at home to Toulouse on April 13.

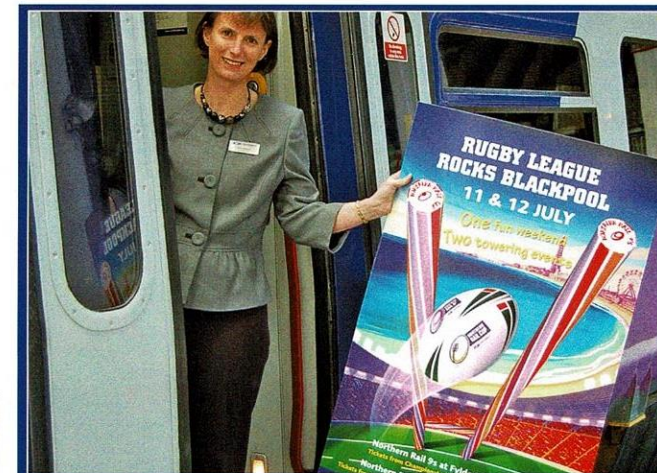
The Bulldogs have only won one league game this season and are facing a desperate fight

The Tigers won through to the quarter-finals but were pushed all the way by the Championship leaders in the first cup tie to be decided on the golden point rule.

A game of high drama and 12 tries in the end boiled down to a superb drop goal from 40 metres out by Brent

Sherwin just 55 seconds into extra-time. Castleford coach Terry Matterson praised his opponents' performance.

He said: "We spoke about the threats and the fact we needed to respect the football, but from the first two sets we didn't complete and that set the tone for the game.

"We worked really hard on our defence in the week, though you wouldn't have thought so looking at the game.

"We are lucky because at 34-30 with five minutes to go it wasn't looking great. But the belief is there and we are in the

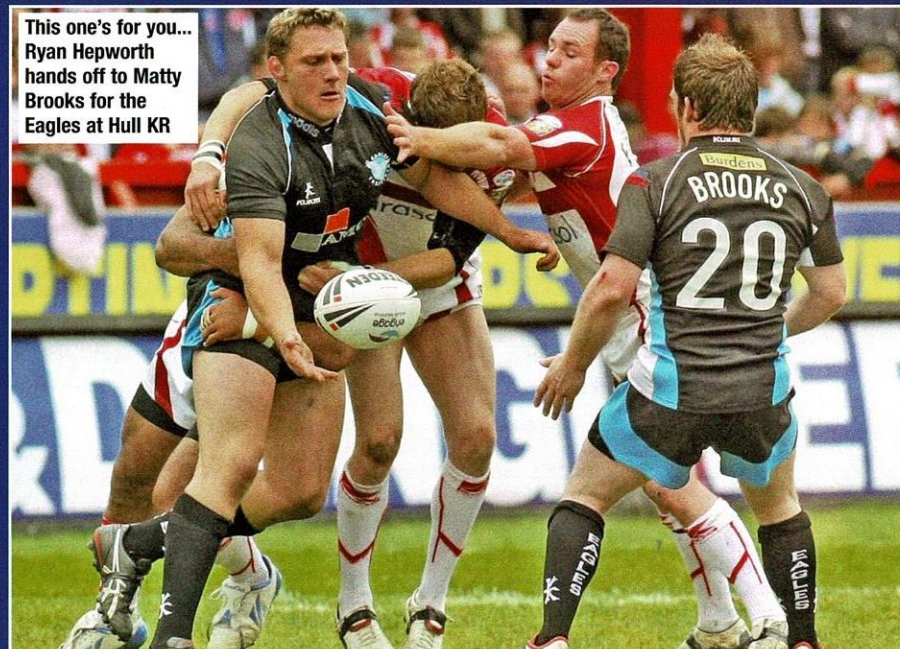
draw, that's the main thing."

HORNETS played out of their skins at the Galpharm where they lost 38-12 to the Huddersfield Giants but it was not a representative scoreline.

The Super League side seemed to be just going through the motions whereas the Hornets, inspired by Martin Ainscough and Mick Fogerty, really tested the Giants' defence.

The duo lifted the side when it appeared they may be in for a drubbing after the first 15 minutes.

As of last Thursday the Hornets only had 15 players available but Widnes came to the rescue and by Friday morning the Rochdale side had taken Brett Robinson, Dave Houghton and Matt Strong on loan. Also making his debut was recent signing from Leigh, Adam Thomas.

A very pleased Darren Shaw said: "They were absolutely fantastic. Their character was immense. In the first half the execution was a little flat and the completion rate was low, but in the second half they were outstanding.

"I think we asked some pretty good questions. We can take a lot of positives from this and we are looking forward to next week already."

GATESHEAD made history twice on Saturday when they staged their first ever game at the Darlington Arena and reached the quarter-finals for the first time thanks to a 34-16 win over OLDHAM.

And with Steve McCormack now on board as the newly-appointed head coach – and the arrival of five new players in the pipeline – the future looks encouraging for the resilient Gateshead club.

"We can box the Challenge Cup off and put it in the drawer for a while now and get into our bread and butter and make sure our league position starts to improve," said McCormack.

"It's a fantastic competition and a great achievement for Gateshead. The fans were brilliant today and while they're not the biggest in number the noise they make is as good as any in the game." FEATHERSTONE made a great start against Warrington but eventually lost out 56-8.

Rovers were 4-0 ahead after 20 minutes but any hopes of an upset faded when Warrington recovered from a slow start to lead 20-4 at the break.

With scrum-half Michael Monaghan in outstanding form, the Wolves made their class tell in the second half to finish with a 10-try victory.

Featherstone coach Daryl Powell admitted he was a "bit disappointed" with their display.

"For the first 20 minutes I didn't think there was anything between the teams," he said. "I thought we started well and put some pressure on Warrington but we were unable to sustain that.

"That is the disappointing element but I suppose

the difference between Super League and the Championship is the consistency of effort.

"The physical element is probably the biggest difference. I thought physically they outlasted us significantly in both halves and I think that's the difficulty of being part-time players."

SHEFFIELD outscored Hull KR in the second half at Craven Park as they went down 34-24.

The Red and Whites had built up a 22-6 lead at the break but the Eagles fought back superbly and only a late Ben Fisher try ended the tie as a contest.

Sheffield boss Mark Aston was understandably delighted with his side's display, and expects to see them kick on for the rest of the season.

"We've been outstanding of late, in patches, but we put it together for 80 minutes out there, which is great," Aston said.

"The last 10 minutes we had no subs left, but credit to the boys, they dug in and we asked to walk off the field proud and I think we can. The pleasing thing for us is that we can move on now.

"We scored 24 points against one of the top teams in Super League and we out-scored them in the second half, so all we've got to do is put it together consistently."

BATLEY managed to avoid total humiliation against Salford.

A three-figure score was a possibility as Salford roared out of the blocks but the Bulldogs stuck in there and managed to hold the Reds to a 66-4 defeat at Mount Pleasant.

The 11-try triumph was never in doubt following two touchdowns in the opening nine minutes from John Wylshere and Richie Myler and by half-time it was 48-0.

Batley caretaker coach Karl Harrison said: "We showed Salford too much respect in the first half. We came out of the arm wrestle first and every time we made a mistake Salford scored and put us to the sword.

"We tightened things up at half time and changed a few things technically. We were outstanding in the second half and I'm really pleased. There were a lot of positives to take that we can work on for our next game."



## Haven salute returning heroes

WHITEHAVEN ended a run of four straight defeats as they won a fantastic game against WIDNES at The Recreation Ground 26-22.

There were so many fairytale stories in this game for the Cumbrian side.

John Patrick, who had made himself unavailable after his job as a plumber left him working in Scotland, answered an SOS to dash home and play after Rob Jackson joined a crippling injury list.

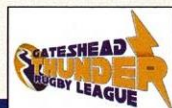

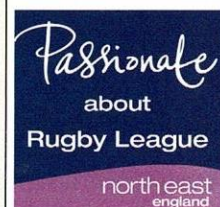

## Blast for the Beeb after TV 'bye' insult

The club blasted the BBC after the Carnegie Challenge Cup draw on Sunday. Thunder were drawn at home to Cup holders and favourites, St Helens on the weekend of May 30/31. The BBC's rugby league reporter, Dave Woods, stated that the draw was "a Bye for St Helens".

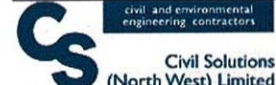
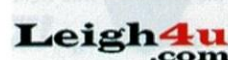

**NEW head coach Paul Rowley reflects on his first game in charge - the cup win at Batley - after taking over from new Director of Rugby Neil Kelly.**

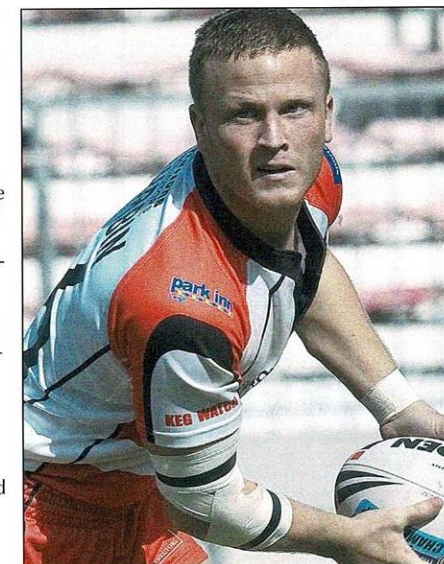

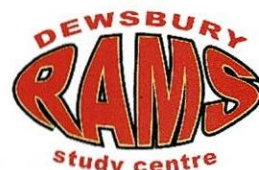

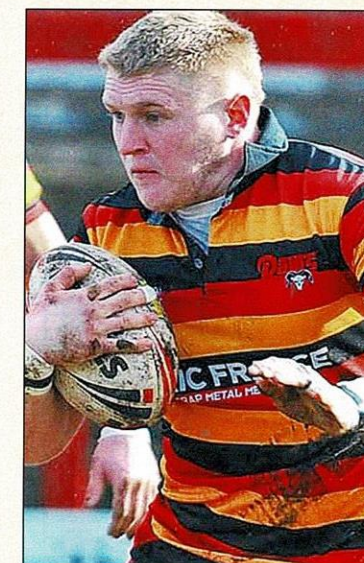

Hornets' participation in the nines has to be funded from the revenue we raise from ticket sales so every ticket we can sell is vital to offset our costs.

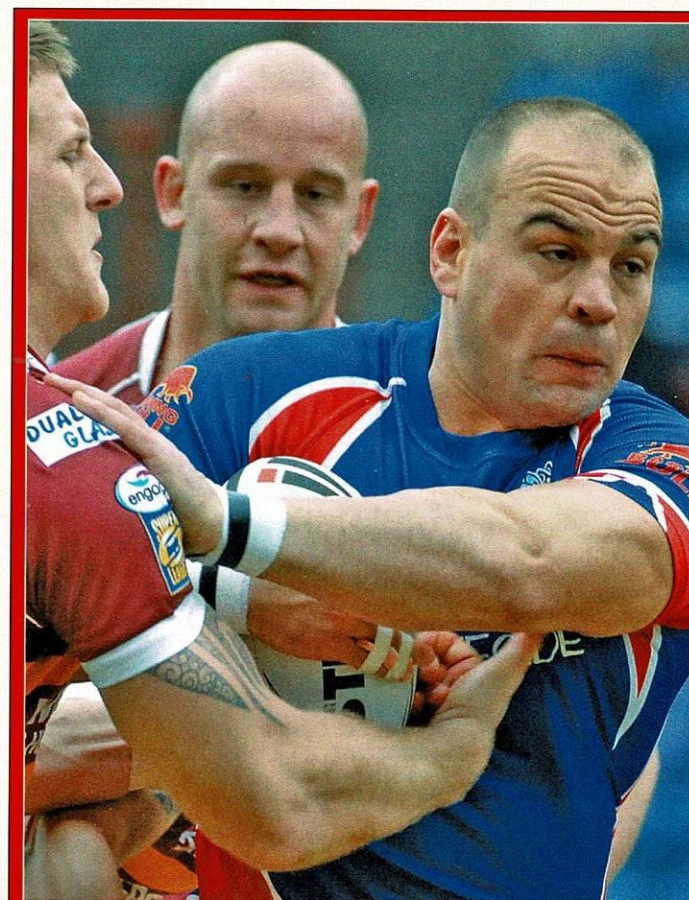

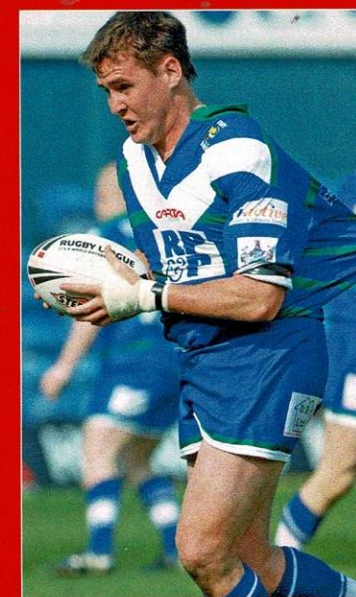

After this week we will be "on the road" for a while as Boundary Park carry out the pitch repairs.

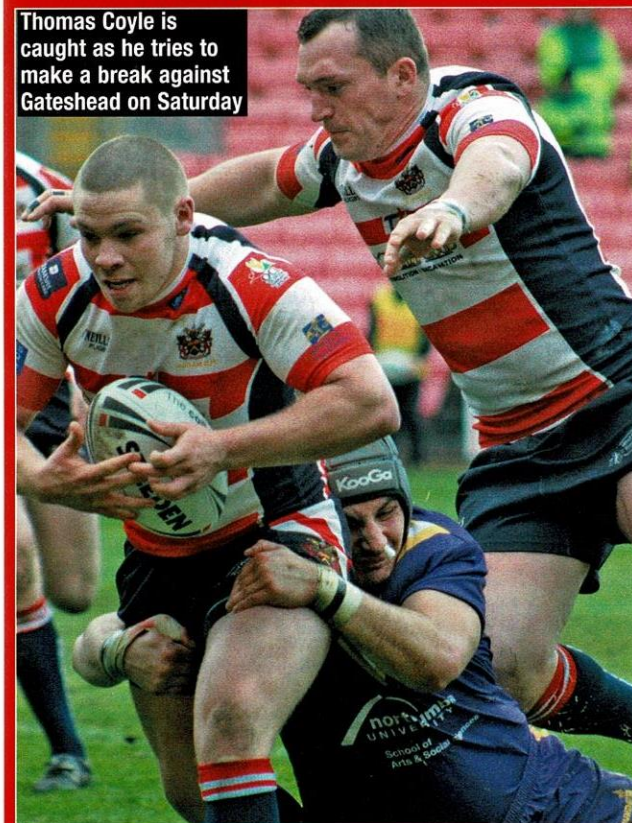

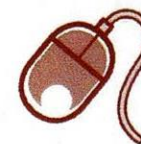
MATT CALLAND is the official League Weekly co-operative Championship coach of the month for April.

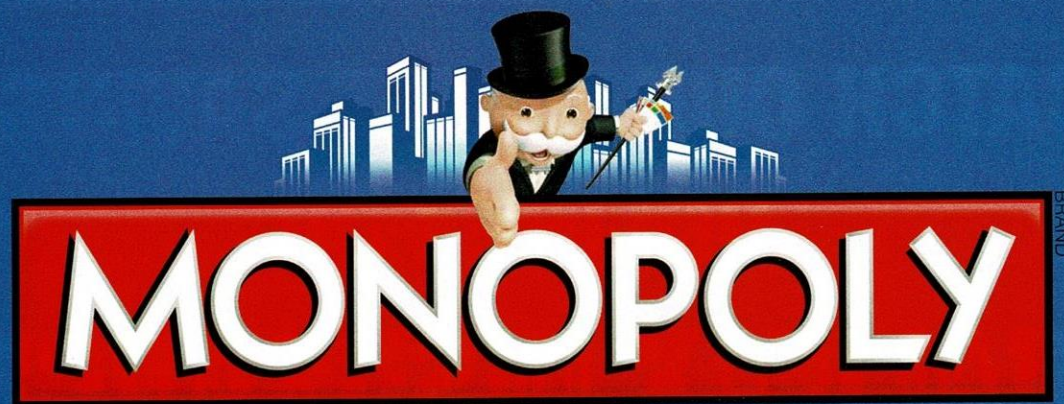

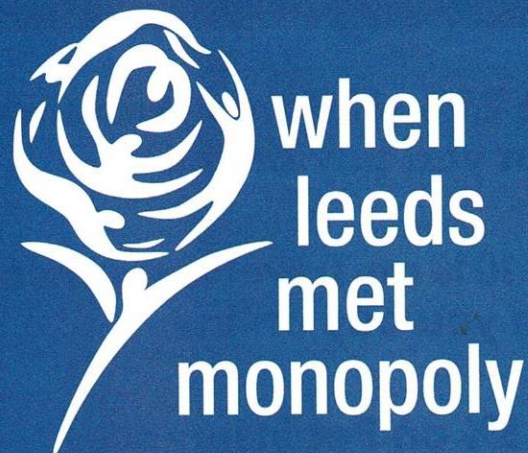

But I can't be the only 'neutral' observer of the game who wants to see Saints trip up in the cup.

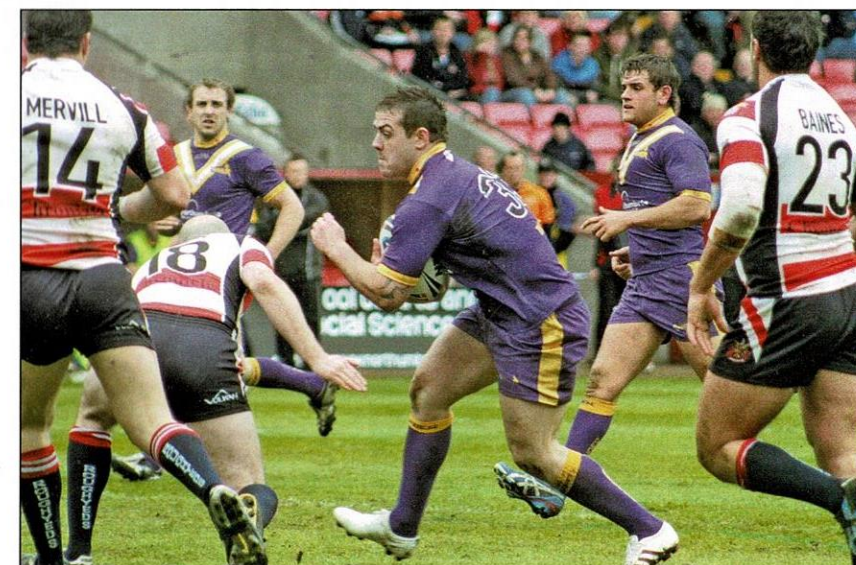

## Challenge is to work out after effects

**MIKE OXLEY** of Totesport reviews the 5th round of the Challenge Cup and how those ties might have a knock-on effect in this weekend's round of matches



WHAT A weekend in the Challenge Cup for the Championship teams even though Gateshead are the only representative left from the lower leagues.

The performances of Sheffield, Hornets RL and Halifax against Super League sides deserve congratulating.

The Eagles did amazingly to only lose by 10 points and actually won the second half 18-12 against Hull KR.

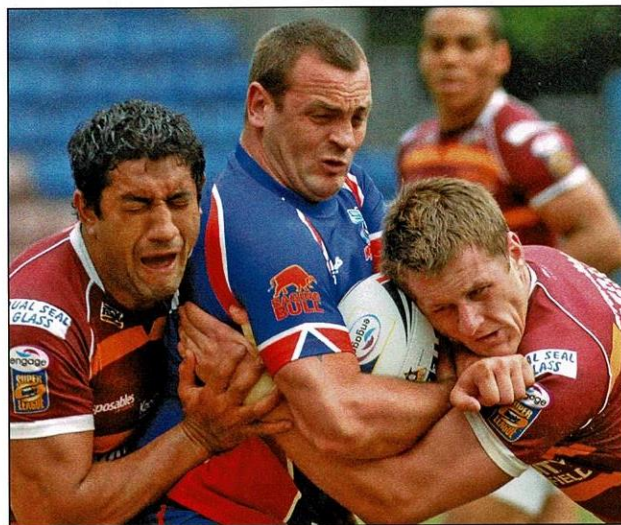
The Rochdale club, who seem to be improving week by week, were beaten by 26 points and actually drew the second half against Huddersfield.

But the best display had to be Halifax's golden point loss (35-34) against Castleford.

Matt Calland's men were winning by four points with four minutes to go until Brent Sherwin gave Castleford a lifeline with a try to the right of the uprights. He failed to kick the goal but got the valuable one pointer in extra time.

People seem to dismiss Halifax's chances of getting into Super League in the next couple of years but if they finish their ground and keep improving their performances why shouldn't they be favourites to get into Super League?

On to this week's games and in view of what I have just said it is worth looking at the matches involving those who have played against the Super League outfits and how they might come out of those punishing clashes.

There might be a few unusual scores this weekend and we will try and work out the value.

The two standout games of the weekend have got to be Leigh v Widnes and Toulouse v Barrow.

Even though on current form Widnes do not look the best betting proposition, what I saw in their second half performance against Whitehaven bodes well for the future and I can see them putting a winning sequence together starting at Leigh.

The Centurions have been in terrible form of late. Apart from scraping past a poor Batley side their home performances this year have been below par. I can see most bookmakers being scratch about this game, whereas on current form I make Widnes a four-point favourite.

Toulouse v Barrow is the game of the round to see how far the French have come in recent weeks and also to weigh up if the Cumbrians are true title challengers.

I make the game a scratch game and I would not punt on this fixture with the wife's money. This is one contest to weigh up for future investments.

Of the remaining games I think that Sheffield will put in a performance against a Halifax side who will still be reeling from the defeat against Castleford in mind as well as body.

I think some bookmakers will give Sheffield a 20-plus start whereas I think it should be nearer to 14.

The Hornets have improved considerably in recent weeks and they could win the handicap against a decent York outfit.

I think the Rochdale outfit warrant only a small start of around six points whereas looking at recent results, which include York beating them 44-14 just over four weeks ago at the Huntington Stadium, most bookmakers may not see it the same as me and may give the Lancashire outfit a double-digit start.

But I am of the opinion that, with a couple of new players, Darren Shaw's side are coming to hand and can put in a much improved display.

Good luck this week and let's hope we can continue with picking the winners and making a nice profit.

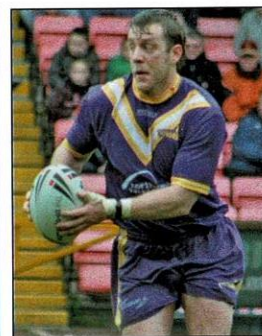
