Of the many and various 'truisms' that sporting cliches throw up, never has it been more clear that it isn't how you start a season, but how you finish it, that counts.

It's a fair bet that there are more than a few twists in the tail - and the tale - of the 2009 season before we count down to the Grand Final prize.

For now, let's come together to make 'Blackpool rock' next weekend in a real party atmosphere with every club in our competition able to play its own part. And let's just keep our fingers crossed that the summer weather plays its part too!




The other Northern Rail Cup final side, Barrow, take on Toulouse this Thursday after their surprise defeat to

A towering match in prospect when Widnes and Barrow meet - and Blackpool is opening its arms to the RL family!

The RFL have confirmed a kick off time of 5:15pm for the Northern Rail Cup Final between Barrow Raiders and the Widnes Vikings next Sunday, July 12, at Bloomfield Road, Blackpool.

And it looks like being a massive sell-out, with just a few tickets left!

As of Tuesday this week Widnes were fully sold out, most of the clubs had sold their allocation and Barrow just had 90 left, with chairman Des Johnston saying they could have filled much bigger grounds than Blackpool! The RFL have held some tickets back for 9s fans wanting to go see the finalists in action.

Red Hall bosses have teamed up

with the Visit Blackpool tourist organisation to provide rugby league fans heading to the seaside resort for the Northern Rail Cup Final and 9s weekend with an array of amazing offers for leading tourist attractions in the town

Supporters can download the vouchers for attractions including Blackpool Pleasure Beach, the Sealife Centre and Blackpool Zoo as well as deals for a number of bars and restaurants in the town by visiting www.visitblackpool.com/rugby

To help fans source accommodation in the town over the weekend of rugby, Visit Blackpool have set up a website portal specifically for the Northern Rail Cup and Northern Rail 9s which can be accessed via www.conferencebookings.co.uk/ delegate/BCTRUGBY2009

The Northern Rail Cup Final will be televised live on Sky Sports.

Meanwhile weekend tickets for the Northern Rail 9s event which runs on 11 and 12 July at Fylde RUFC are only available from cooperative Championship clubs and are priced at £9 for adults and £5 for concessions. THE draw for the inaugural Northern Rail Nines competition has been made. All English Championship sides – with the exception of the two Northern Rail Cup finalists Barrow and Widnes – were entered into the draw, which was made on BBC Radio Manchester's Rugby League Extra Show. The 18 teams were drawn into five groups – three consisting of four teams and two groups of three teams.

Championship leaders Halifax, still smarting from their semi final defeat to Widnes, are in Pool E along with Oldham and Sheffield Eagles. Elsewhere, Cumbrian rivals Whitehaven and Workington have been drawn in the same group – Pool D – along with Featherstone Rovers.

Pool A will see a local derby clash with Swinton Lions and Hornets RL in the same group.

The tournament – brand new for 2009 – will be played at Fylde

RUFC, the home of Blackpool Panthers, on the weekend of July 11 and 12.

Each side plays three games in the group stages on day one.


The teams in the four team groups will play round robin, while the teams in the three-team groups will get their three games by playing the teams in the other three-team group.

The top two sides from each four-team group will progress to Sunday's Northern Rail Nines Trophy competition whilst the bottom two will enter the Plate competition. For the sides in the three-team groups, just the top side will qualifying for the Trophy competition with the remaining teams contesting the Plate.

The competitions then takes a knock-out format with all games up to the final being played at the Panthers' home. The finals of both will be played as curtain raisers to the Northern Rail Cup Final.

Lighting up again

ondon Skolars will host Keighley Cougars on the eve of the Carnegie Challenge Cup Final (Friday August 28) in a repeat of last year's successful Friday Night Lights fixture which attracted a sell-out attendance of

Skolars have extended the capacity of their ground to 2,000 and are going all out for another sell-out as they hope to attract a club record crowd for a second consecutive year and avenge the narrow 14-18 loss they suffered at the hands of the Cougars in 2008.

Skolars chairman Hector McNeil said: "Friday Night Lights continues to go from strength to strength and with the invention of the Skolars staff they're coming up with some really fun and exciting initiatives for the event itself.

"We're confident it'll be another sell out and are looking forward to opening up both sides of our ground for the first time."



Also included in the day's entertainment will be a steel band and BBQ, Skolars girls, fan games and competitions, the always popular real ale festival as well as the finals of the Skolars 'Urban Rugby' programme - Estate of Origin!

Urban Rugby is in its seventh season and runs through the summer. It is a variation on 13-a-side but can be played anywhere on any surface from grass to basketball courts. It has been a tremendous tool both in getting rugby league out into the more deprived areas of North London but also as a recruitment tool to the Skolars junior ranks.

Halifax tie up stars long-term

HALIFAX have announced new contracts for four more first team regulars in the past week. Hooker Mark Gleeson, utility star Bob Beswick, goal kicking winger Lee Paterson and back rower Mark Roberts have all followed coach Matt Calland and pivots Sean Penkywicz and Ben Black in pledging their futures.

WIDNES have extended the loan deals for Warrington duo Kevin Penny and Steve Pickersgill. Since their arrival at the Stobart Stadium, the duo have impressed Vikings

coach Paul Cullen – their former boss. The pair will now remain at the Championship club for the rest of the season, although they can be recalled by the Super League outfit "at any time".

GATESHEAD say they've got a great relationship going with Super League club Castleford Tigers after taking yet another player on loan. Forward Anthony England has moved to the North East for a month, joining Tigers teammates Jamie Cording and Nathan Massey at the Thunderdome. Earlier

in the season, Gateshead had taken Joe Arundel and Jonny Walker on loan too. "Gateshead Thunder are very grateful to Castleford Tigers for the loan of another player," said chief executive Rod Findlay.

LEIGH have been boosted by an investment from five local businessmen ahead of naming lan Millward as new coach. The ambitious Championship outfit have their sights set on a place in Super League in 2012. And they have now been boosted by the formation of a new group —

the Leigh Corporate Club – which they hope will attract much-needed capital over the next few years.

FEATHERSTONE fear key forward Jamie Field could miss the rest of the season. The former Super League star has been out of action since dislocating his shoulder in the Northern Rail Cup quarter final win over Oldham, And whilst Rovers initially hoped Field would be back in action within a month. there are growing concerns that he could be out for the remainder of the campaign.

LOOK WHO'S BACK...

Former Wigan and St Helens coach Ian Millward is to return to England next season after agreeing a three-year contract with Leigh Centurions.

Millward, 48, who enjoyed a successful stint at Leigh in 1999, is to quit his role as assistant coach with Canberra Raiders to succeed Paul Rowley at the Sports Village in 2010.

"lan took Leigh from a lowlyplaced club to the top four before being released to take over at St Helens in the 2000 season," said chairman Arthur Thomas.


"He created history at Saints, winning two premierships, two Challenge Cups and a World Club Challenge in a six-year term.

"I would like to thank Paul Rowley for his services during the interim period and he will continue at the club as a coach working alongside lan."

Millward said: "Leigh gave me a start back in 1999 and I will endeavour to repay the club and its supporters with success in the coming seasons.

"I thoroughly enjoyed my time at Leigh and in Super League and the other reason behind my decision was to be closer to my three children, who still live in England and to allow my wife Marion to live closer to her parents.

"I am also appreciative of Canberra Raiders' decision to release me from my current contract at the end of the 2009 season to allow me to take up the Leigh appointment."




As most of you are probably aware, I am stepping down from Club Directorship and this is my last set of notes.



The game will also give the opportunity for one or two of the squad to push their claims for a place in the Northern Rail Cup Final at Blackpool.


A number of our senior players have already cemented their places in the 17 following their performance at Halifax but, there is still an opportunity for players to impress.

The quality of these new signings shows how committed we all are here at Blackpool, with our aim of consolidating a play-off place virtually there.


This week however will be a different ball game altogether.






He was accompanied on his visit to the facility by Keighley MP Ann Cryer, who is also a trustee of the Cougar Community Foundation.



Today we welcome Oldham to Derwent Park. I know that Tony Benson will be looking to avenge last week's defeat at York.



Upsets aplenty as underdogs bite back

T WAS a toss-up who sprung the biggest surprise in the Championship last Sunday afternoon as the two front-runners both fell unexpectedly at the unlikeliest of hurdles.

It seems only a few weeks ago that both Gateshead and especially Batley were struggling to keep pace with the teams in the lower half of the table.

Indeed the only consolation for both Halifax and Barrow coaches Dave Clark and Matt Calland was that their closest contenders also lost.

Gateshead coach Steve McCormack punched the air with relief after his team ran up a 32-point first-half lead, then hung on for dear life as Matt Calland roused his men for a second half charge.

"We knew what Halifax's strengths were and they have three or four hookers in the side so are always quick from dummy half." said McCormack.

"We defended that well in the first half but then allowed them to score a few tries from around that area in the second which was disappointing.

"Every game is important to us now. It was good to get a win at home and to beat the top of the table side was a big turnaround for us after the heavy defeat at their place.

"Everyone is working together and it's shown in the last two weeks. We knew Halifax would come back but the desire and work ethic of the team shone through and we deserved to hold on."

Calland offered no excuses for his team's first-half effort, coming after a Northern Rail Cup semifinal defeat by Widnes.

"I would like to apologise to the Halifax fans for an abysmal first-half display," said Calland. "We were outfought and out enthused by Gateshead.

"It wasn't good enough and the players were given a real dressing down at half-time.

"I was confident we could come back in the second half but we didn't take enough of our chances in the game and pulled up short."

Over at Mount Pleasant, highflying Barrow were brought to earth with a massive bump as Karl Harrison's resurgent Bulldogs won their fourth game out of five – and in some style.

Batley had seven different try scorers contributing to a convincing 46-16 scoreline which left Barrow coach Dave Clark shaking his head and hoping for a return to form before Blackpool next week.

Doomed Doncaster, still trying to survive on a week to week basis, were put to the sword by Sheffield in front of a measly crowd of 275 at the Chris Moyles Stadium and are desperately in need of a guardian angel. The detail of former Doncaster mayor Martin Winter's rescue package continues to be awaited.

Whitehaven's two wing flyers were having fun in the sun at the Rec as Leigh contributed their part to a high-scoring bonanza.

Craig Calvert raced in for four tries and Ade Adebisi bagged two as Whitehaven ran away as 36-22 winners on a hot day in north-west Cumbria,

It wasn't the prettiest of games, but the result meant that Batley leap-frogged ambitious Leigh in the Championship table.

It was hot and steamy too in the south of France, but Toulouse's chances of beating Featherstone were fatally damaged when playmaker Nathan Wynn left the field early on with a shoulder injury, and Rovers ran out 32-16 winners.

Thus was the Knights' 20-18 win preserved in what was another Thursday night classic for fans both at home and at the match.

The result took David March's men second in the table but there's still no catching Warren Jowitt's soaraway Rams. They plundered 64 unanswered points at the London Skolars with Bryn Powell netting a hat-trick. Coach Jowitt said: "I am very satisfied with the win, but all wins are satisfactory. We were very professional and clinical

Keighley took third spot in the Championship 1 equal on points with York after a 44-18 defeat of Hornets RL.

Hornets coach Darren
Shaw said: "We had to have a couple of positional changes and with 20 minutes to go we had used all our subs, but that's no excuse for some of the dumbness in defence at times. We came out the first half with an 80 percent completion rate and didn't do a great deal with it and in the second half we completed 49 per cent and we did not have much possession at all.

"Both Steven Roper and Mick Fogerty are going for X-rays because they heard their ankles crack in a tackle as they went down. Brett Robinson, who was playing nine, has to go for X-rays as well on his ribs and Adam Thomas had to have four stitches in his eye."

Cougars boss Barry Eaton was a hard man to please. "I am pleased with the result but I am not entirely satisfied with the performance," he said.

"I thought we were pretty scratchy at times and basic handling errors let us down far too often. I am happy with the result but there is lots to work on."



A career in Hock all for a stupid mistake


REAT publicity for rugby league last week ... Anyone who watched 'The Boss' Bruce Springsteen and Kasabian on the main stage at Glastonbury would have seen a big Bradford Bulls flag on a massive pole, right in front of the camera. It was the best coverage rugby league has had on the BBC for years.

Less positive (if that isn't an unfortunate term) was all the air time and column inches given to Gareth Hock's failed drugs test – although they do say there's no such thing as bad publicity, don't they?

The Hock issue is a tricky one. Part of you wants to completely rip into the guy for being a Grade A moron; throwing away such a brilliant career for something as stupid as cocaine.

When he was off-form, he could be horrendous and often he showed the kind of brains (or lack of) that made it little surprise to learn of his alleged off-field indiscretions. But when he was on-form he was an absolute world-beater — a player with real power and skill and the kind of player that really could prove a handful for Australia and New Zealand in an England shirt.

Frustratingly, given Hock's impending two-year ban, he looked like he'd begun to have more on-days than off-days of late – he seemed to be entering the prime of his

career, making his drug offence, if confirmed as expected, even more brainless.

It would be all too easy to crucify Hock for his stupid mistake – and many people might choose to do just that.

But, putting the offence into context, Hock is not a drugs 'cheat' in the athletic sense (although I understand cocaine can be used as a masking agent for other, performance-enhancing drugs, though there's no suggestion that's the case here).

I'm not saying cocaine is ok – indeed far from it, it's illegal – but it's unlikely a player takes the white stuff to make him play better. Young men tend not to seek any advantage from taking 'recreational' drugs – instead looking for the kind of kick that young men with cash often do.

Having said that, I don't necessarily agree that recreational drugs should carry a lesser ban than performance-enhancing drugs. As part of the self-styled family game, players ought to know they are role models who have to set a good example for youngsters who look up to them.

But they don't need to be completely hung out to dry. Hock will have a sentence to serve and will do so – but after that there should be nothing stopping him from coming back into the game and making a living again like Ryan Hudson, Sean Penkywicz and Dave Allen have done.

He needs people around him to stick with him, help him deal with his mistake and keep him on track over the next two years so that, once his ban expires, he's in shape to play again – whether it be with Wigan or whoever.
