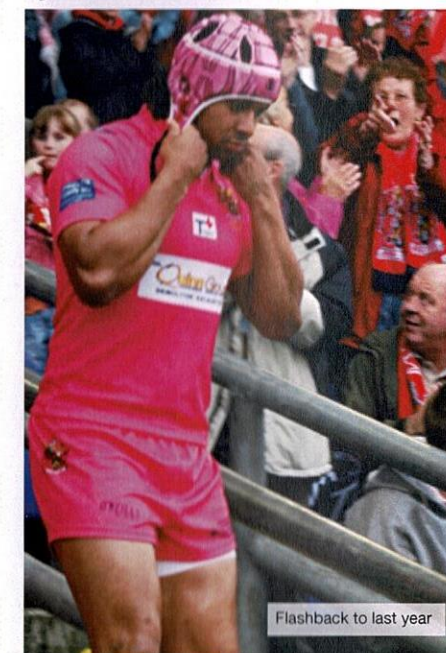

Flashback to last year

ROUGHYEDS have released details of a unique fund-raiser for local charities, built around the televised Co-operative Championship 1 game against London Skolars at Boundary Park on Thursday night (August 6), kick-off 7.30pm.

The two beneficiaries will be the Link4Pink Appeal, raising money to upgrade patient facilities at the Royal Oldham Hospital's breast-care unit, and Dr

Kershaw's Hospice.

"We hope we don't get a stampede by half-time!" said a tongue-in-cheek Roughyeds chief executive Christopher Hamilton.

The nominal charge for "release" will be a minimum £1, but there will be lots of collecting buckets for additional contributions which will be split equally, as will all the "release" takings, between Dr Kershaw's and Link4Pink, the Appeal which has set itself a target of £250,000 to upgrade patient facilities at the Royal Oldham Hospital's Victoria Unit.

Fans attending the game, to be televised live by Sky and screened across the nation, will be asked to wear something pink to raise awareness of the charities which will benefit directly from their attendance.

Said Mr Hamilton: "It is no secret that the club is passing through difficult times, both financially and otherwise, but even in the current economic climate Roughyeds are fully committed to supporting these two very worthy local charities.

"This will be the third year in a row that the club has demonstrated its support for worthy causes by linking a televised game to a one-off fund-raiser. Each time, we have tried to come up with something different to highlight the work we are doing and to put the spotlight on the charities we are supporting."

He added, again with tongue in cheek: "This year, given recent results and happenings at the club, we felt it would be appropriate to let people in for free... but charge them to get out! That way, we should raise a lot of money if we can get numbers into the ground in the first place!

"Seriously, the game has a very important meaning to all the people in Oldham and Rochdale who are affected by breast cancer and to all those patients who come under the care of the dedicated team at Dr Kershaw's Hospice.

"We hope the people of Oldham, regardless of

whether they are Roughyeds fans or not, will back this event by coming to the game and, if possible, by wearing something pink."

Brian Hurst, Appeals Manager at Dr Kershaw's, said: "The last 12 months have been very hard for us because of the recession, and we are not over the hill yet.

"All charities have been hit hard by the credit crunch, as have sports clubs like Oldham Roughyeds, but the club has never wavered in its support for us --- this is the third year in a row they have come up with something like this --- and their backing is much appreciated.

"From Dr Kershaw's comes a big thank-you to Chris and the club and the hope that the people of Oldham will rally round the club and the team and support what they are trying to achieve on our behalf."

Rita Bottomley, chair person of Link4Pink's volunteer fund-raising committee, said: "The club has adopted Link4Pink as one of its charities for the year, and we are extremely grateful to them for that.

"There are eight ladies on our committee, all volunteers, and we have recently been joined by Mr Hamilton.

"The people of Oldham have been fantastic in all they are doing to raise money for the Appeal, but it should be pointed out that the facility is also for the use of breast-care patients from Rochdale and other areas as well.

"The dedicated team at the Victoria Unit do fantastic work and they are keen to improve the facilities for patients. That's where we come in as volunteer fund-raisers. Every penny raised goes directly to the Appeal and we trust the public will support the club, Link4Pink and Dr Kershaw's on an important night for all three next Thursday."

Club officials, as well as officials of Link4Pink and Dr Kershaw's, hope all Roughyeds supporters will make a special effort to back this event in front of a nationwide television audience and also to encourage friends, family, neighbours and workmates to put in an appearance too.

It isn't every day you can watch a pro rugby league game at this level for as little as £1 and at the same time make valuable contributions towards the fabulous work being done on behalf of the community by Dr Kershaw's Hospice and by the breast-care Victoria Unit at the Royal Oldham Hospital.

Please give generously into the collecting buckets (no matter what name is on any particular bucket ALL proceeds will be divided equally between the two charities) and please do your best to wear pink with pride.

Let's together make Thursday night another memorable Roughyeds occasion here at Boundary Park.

Despite being hit by first-team calls, Oldham Reserves produced a three-tries-to-one second-half fightback to run Dewsbury Rams close at Sedgley Park on Saturday.

"We were off colour in the first half, but we played much better after half time,"

commented Roughyeds coach John Hough. Indeed, the home side came close to snatching victory near the end but with Rams reeling and defending desperately on their own line, Oldham were penalised for a faulty play-the-ball and the chance was gone.

Rams dominated the first half with rangy second-row man Jake Wilson scoring twice down Oldham's right side.

Despite two tries by centre Jamie Knight, Oldham trailed 20-8 at half time but they were the better side in the second half when the forwards rolled up their sleeves and gave halfbacks Chris Hough and Matty Ashe the opportunities to stamp their mark on the game.

The experienced Hough used an intelligent kicking game not only to give Oldham territorial advantage but also to set up three of his side's five tries, while his partner Ashe nipped through a wrong-footed defence to score the try that put Roughyeds only two points down with 20 minutes still left to play. IRISH EYES WERE SMILING WHEN WAYNE RUBBED SHOULDERS WITH THE STARS

PLAYER PROFILE No 12 WAYNE KERR

Roger Halstead talks to a man whose rugby league dream is coming true
WAYNE Kerr, the Roughyeds prop, still has to pinch himself and bring out his scrapbook of memoirs to convince himself that he really did

feature with some of the best players on the planet on a November day in Australia last year.

It was on Wednesday, November 5, 2008, at Parramatta Stadium, that this true-blood Irishman - born in Dublin, raised in County Kildare - turned out off the bench to play his part in Irish RL's finest hour when the men in green beat Samoa 34-16 in arguably the



biggest upset of the last World Cup. The win took Andy Kelly's boys into a semi-final qualifier and shattered the hopes of Samoa, whose squad looked like a who's who of Pacific Islands greats and included George Carmont, Willie Talau, Frances Meli, Nigel Vagana, Ali Lauititi, Harrison Hansen and David Solomona.

Ireland, who led 16-12 at half-time, had a record-breaker in winger Pat Richards whose 22 points from three tries and five goals eclipsed Steve Prescott's 14 points against Samoa eight years earlier.

The Irish lined up like this: Michael Platt; Damien Blanch, Sean Gleeson, Stuart Littler, Pat Richards; Scott Grix, Liam Finn; Eamon O'Carroll, Bob Beswick, Gareth Haggerty, Ben Harrison, Lee Doran, Simon Finnigan. Subs: Michael McLorum, Karl Fitzpatrick, **WAYNE KERR**, Ryan Tandy.

Merely to travel Down Under as part of that squad was a massive achievement for Kerr, his then London Skolars team mate Stevie Gibbons and two more "real" Irishmen who went as unknowns, Ross Barber and Brendan Guilfoyle.

Of the four only Kerr got a game - around ten to 15 minutes as a substitute in Ireland's greatest-ever triumph. Even more remarkable was the fact that he and Gibbons had only been playing rugby league for little more than two years after taking it up as a way of keeping fit in the summer during their annual close-season break from the union code.

Wayne started playing union aged eight and remained with his home-town club of Cilldara (Gaelic for Kildare) until he was 20 when he moved to a senior club, Carlow, and spent two years at senior level as a hooker or back-row forward. Aged 18, he had represented Leinster at youth level as a hooker, but he never played prop in the 15-a-side game and, since turning to league, he has never played anywhere else but in the front-row. The boy who, within two years, was to wear the green of

Ireland in the cauldron of World Cup rugby league, tells a remarkable story of how he became hooked on the brand of rugby that was imported from England. "Stevie Gibbons, myself and another two guys from the Carlow RU squad used to play touch rugby in the summer just for a spot of fun and to keep fit. We had seen League on TV, and we liked what we saw. "We didn't take it seriously at all in those early days but Stevie got a few more lads interested as well and he formed Carlow Crusaders. It was just a fun thing for us, but we entered the Irish comp and reached the Grand Final, in which we played Limerick. "Unknown to us, a Kiwi who had settled in Ireland, Damian Welland, had a lot to do with the growth and development of League over there, and he was at our Grand Final. He asked me if I would like to play for Ireland 'A', and from that moment on I got well and truly involved with league, and I was soon taking it very seriously indeed."

Coincidentally, current Roughyeds team boss Tony Benson was also despatched to Ireland by the RFL about that time to supervise the progress and development of the many young Irishmen, who were starting to make their way in the game.

Damian and Tony picked a party of promising young Irish players to make a three-game visit to New Zealand and it was in the summer of 2007 that Wayne Kerr found himself flying across the world for the first time to play RL for Ireland at three venues in New Zealand's North Island, including Bay of Plenty of Auckland.

Back home, he was making meteoric progress in his new code of rugby. Representing Ireland 'A' in a four-nations tournament, he scored a try in a win against England 'A' at Leigh; missed the drawn game with Wales 'A' because of injury; but scored again in Ireland's win over Scotland.

Ireland finished second to Wales on points difference, but more importantly for the continued progress of Kerr he had done enough to earn selection for the full Irish squad and to earn his first Irish cap in Russia, of all places.

"I'll never forget that one," recalled Wayne. "It was surreal. It happened to be Barrie McDermott's last game for Ireland. There were a lot of Super League players in our squad, and I was rubbing shoulders with players whom I had only ever seen on television. It was crazy." He got his second cap against Russia in Ireland and his third in another World Cup qualifier against Lebanon at Dewsbury. The match ended in a draw, but Ireland went through.

Shortly afterwards, in January, 2008, Tony Benson was appointed coach of London Skolars and the ambitious Kerr jumped at the opportunity to move to London and to break into professional rugby league in England.

For a country boy from Ireland, it was a life-changing move. Swapping the quiet, laid-back culture of the Emerald Isle for the hustle and bustle of North London, Wayne had to adapt to a new lifestyle as well as adapt to life as a part-time pro.

"I shared a house in White Hart Lane, not far from Tottenham's ground, with a couple of Fijian guys and a Kiwi," he said. "It was a culture shock, but my rugby league was developing and that was the main thing."

"It was tough, though, real tough. If we were travelling any distance to play Union in Ireland we would go the day before the game. At Skolars we had to travel north every second week and we always went there and back in the day, even to places like Barrow and Workington when we would leave at 6am and get back around 3am the next day.

"It was crazy really, but it was great experience and I'm glad now that I went through it."

Wayne scored ten tries in that 2008 season in a struggling team, and with three Irish caps already on his CV he dare hardly dream that he might have a chance of a World Cup call-up later in the year.

"Playing for Skolars you are hardly in the spotlight," he said, "but with ten tries to my name, Tony's (Benson) connections with the Irish set-up and the fact that they were talking of taking one or two true-blood Irishmen for the experience I thought I might have had a chance of going for the ride."

"Even when I was picked I never thought I would get a game. To be picked as a

sub against Samoa - my fourth cap - was a dream come true. I was playing for Ireland in the World Cup only two years after first learning of rugby league. It was unbelievable.

"I was on the field for about quarter of an hour. It was different to anything I had ever been used to. Talk about a shock to the system. I was playing with and against some of the best players in the world, and a lot of players go through a full career without experiencing anything like that."

Wayne was still in Australia when he signed for Oldham to follow Tony B to the Roughyeds -- and it was a move he has never regretted. He has a younger sister, Jade, and a girl friend of seven years in Claire, whom he met at school in Ireland and who now lives with him in Leigh. She was the girl-next-door--- not literally, but as Wayne put it "from just down the street."

And the future? "My goal is simple," he said. "I just want to keep on improving and enjoying my rugby. Being realistic, I think I came into league far too late to ever make it to Super League, but I would love to play in one division higher, hopefully with Oldham."

"Beyond that, I would love nothing better than to add to my four Ireland caps and to play the game at the highest level I can ever attain." To that end all Roughyeds fans will wish Wayne the very best of luck... the luck of the Irish, of course!

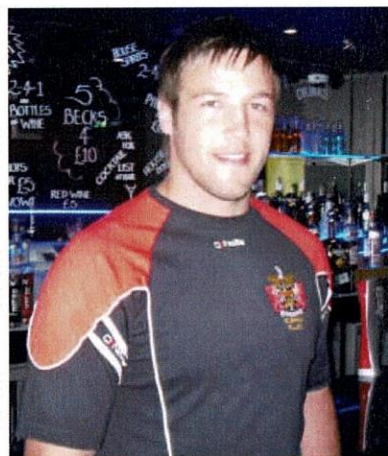

Talking of the Dewsbury game he said "We were down on man-power and

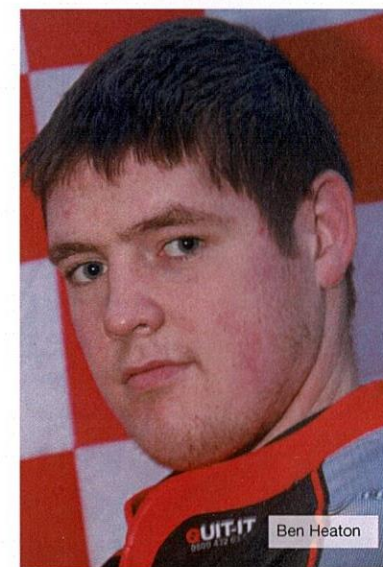

the world according to WILKO

In this instalment read about Jon's thoughts on the current state of rugby league in the UK and how he feels the game is going to progress into the future...

I think the sport needs a plan to make sure it doesn't become a niche sport. If you look at rugby league at the moment within the sporting world, it sits within football, cricket and rugby union. We are in fourth place really, and I think it needs to make sure it doesn't slip and become more of a niche sport and not just restricted to the towns of the North of England.

For the future of the game, it needs a sort of mission statement, or a direction for it to go in. But we need to look at ways that we can improve the sport. We are getting to a stage where a few teams are playing a similar style, slowing the ruck down, and as a result you do get some less attacking games.

I've witnessed some attritional games, and this is probably the first year that I have turned on the TV and watched a rugby game and thought 'this is not as exciting as yesteryear'. We've got to be careful that we don't slow it down too much that people don't want to watch it.

I know that to be successful at international level you need to play like that sometimes, but I like the way we play the game in this country.

We also need to be careful to look after the reputation of the Championship clubs and the leagues below that and make sure they have got a sustainable future as well.

We do need to spread the game but I don't think that should be at the cost of all the teams that have been around for so long. I suppose the lesson to be learned is that if it doesn't always work in the areas it's being played in now, what's to say it's going to work in the areas it's not?

Catalan was a region that already had a rugby league base. It's got clubs down there that already play the game; it's not a place that has no rugby league infrastructure. The south of France has always been a hot bed for rugby league and when you talk about South Wales, it has been a place that has produced rugby league players through a rugby union system.

Just look at Scott Gibbs, John Devereux and Jonathan Davies who are all Welsh, but came to play rugby league. I know there is support for rugby league down in South Wales, I just don't know whether there is an infrastructure there to support a team.

I think we should leave the end of season play-offs as the top six, rather than the top eight. If you finish half way down the table, or even just after, you can still win the whole league which is ridiculous.

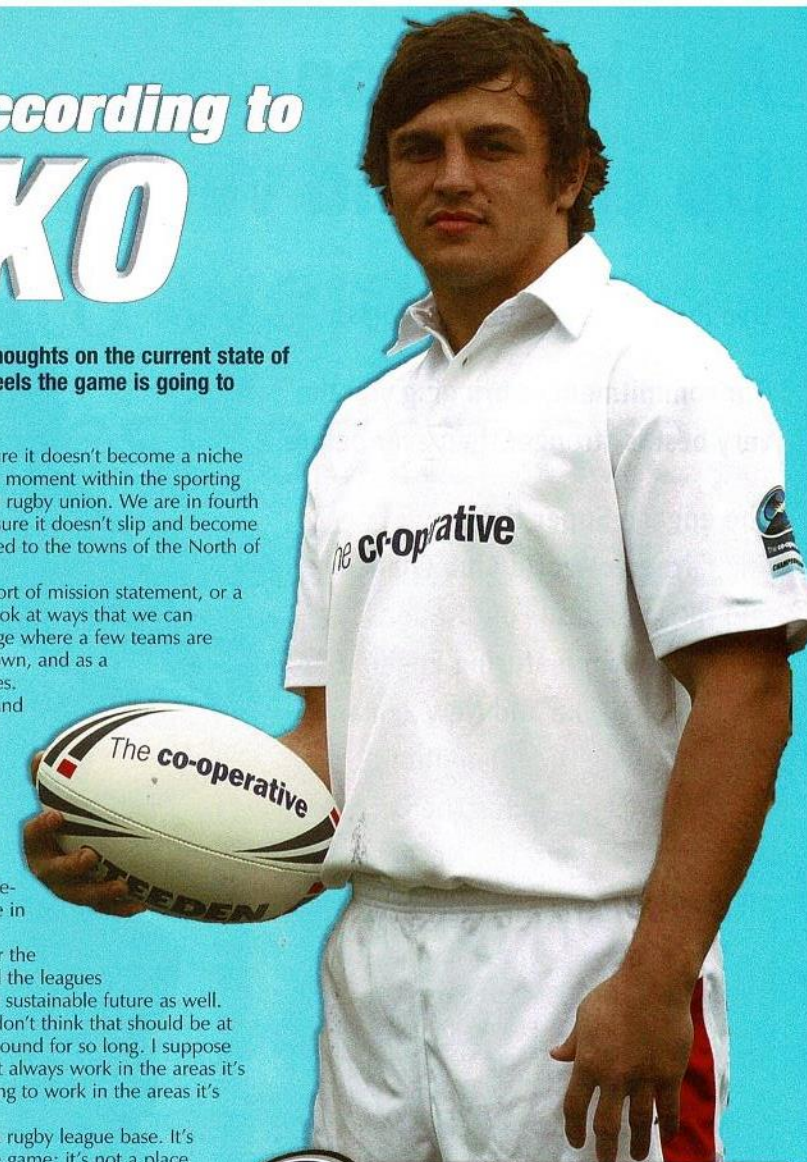
All sports are driven by the elite – in golf people try and catch Tiger Woods, tennis players try to beat Roger Federer and football teams are trying to get to Manchester United's standard.

What that does is inspire people to get to that level whereas sometimes in rugby league there's a push to get everyone on a similar level and make it exciting and competitive. But in all sports you need champion teams.

If you look at Wigan in the 1980s and 1990s, they inspired teams to get better. So with a top eight, it gives teams who have had a pretty unsuccessful season the chance to win the competition and get all the accolades, which is bizarre really.

It's up to the lower teams to make themselves better, rather than bringing the top teams down and meeting in the middle. Let the top teams drive the competition forward and let other teams catch up to them!

ON THE MONEY!

It pays to weigh up where best odds are

This could be the weekend where Widnes prove their value, says MIKE OXLEY



I received an interesting email from a P. Cook from Dewsbury who said that he has been punting my selections since the fifth week of the Game On magazine, and he checks all the bookmakers online to see which is the best handicap rather than using one particular bookmaker and finds that by doing this he always finds the best value.

That is a good point by Mr Cook – always look for value and the best handicaps. A couple of good sites that I would advise people to use on the internet are www.bestbetting.com and www.oddschecker.com, and most handicaps for games come out around two days before the game is due to kick off.

I have also been asked how I decide what handicap is right for each rugby game, especially so early in the week before a team has been announced.

Each week I have a rating for each team that is updated after the round of games are played. I also add four points on to the team that is playing at home, as in most sports you have to take into account the home advantage.

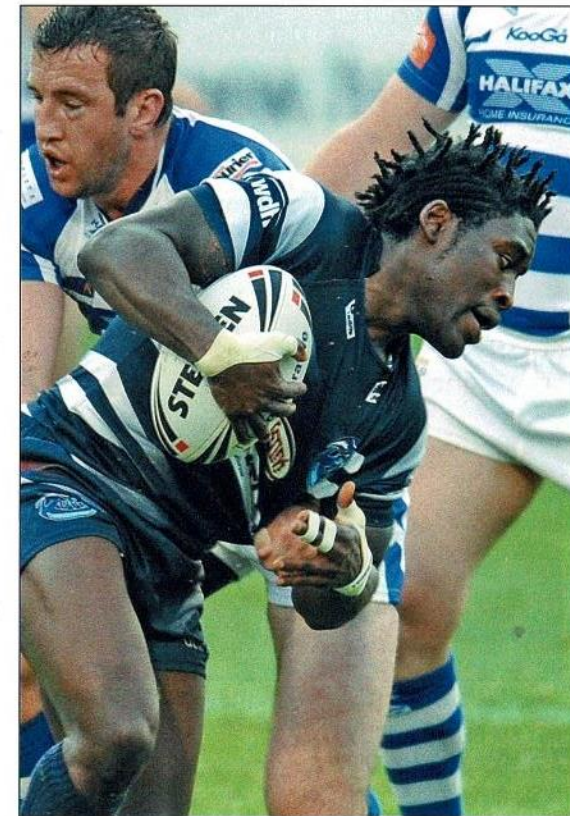
My provisional handicaps are done on a Monday morning, and then throughout the week I look for important team news that might have an effect on the handicap. A team might go into administration or release a load of players like Doncaster did early on in the season and that can have a drastic effect on the handicap, but overall the handicap will only change a couple of points on general team news.

I have mentioned in recent weeks Widnes's price for the Grand Final, and I am amazed that after last weekend's results where Widnes won and Halifax were beaten by Featherstone at home, that Widnes's price for the Grand Final has been pushed out by skybet to 3/1 from 11/4.

The clash of the weekend is Widnes at home to Halifax, and after this game I think it will be all there for people to realise that Widnes are the best team in the division.

I think the bookmakers will make this a scratch game but on recent form and of course with Widnes having home advantage I think Halifax should be receiving a small start. So if they bookmakers come out with scratch then certainly Widnes should be punted.

In Championship 1 this week the game I fancy there being an

upset in is Swinton at home to York. York lie third in the table, four places higher than this week's opponents, but I just feel that York, after their home defeat by out of form Hunslet last week, are hitting a dodgy patch, whereas the majority of Swinton's points have come from their home matches at Sedgley Park.

My view on this game is giving York a start of four, but I can see the bookmakers not doing their homework on this one and just looking at league standings and possibly going scratch – or they might even decide to give Swinton a start.

So good luck this week and remember to take a bit of the 3/1 on offer for Widnes before it is too late.

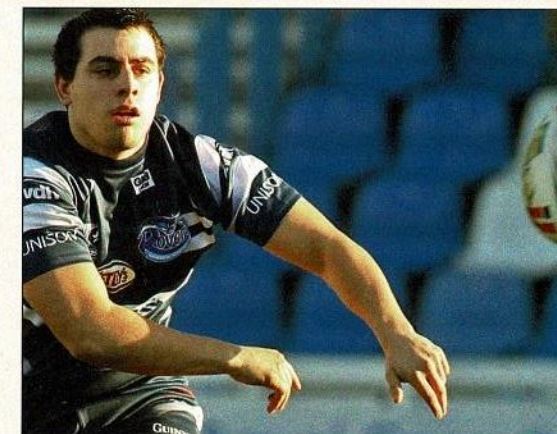
I was really pleased for the support we took to Halifax, their vocal effort and patience with our first half performance got what it deserved in the end.

The game today will be a tough challenge for us,

Toulouse have some real quality in their team and nothing less than our best will be good enough.

There are six games to go in the regular season with four at home and two away. It is important though that we focus on one at a time starting with today's challenge.

In my experience, heading into play-offs toughened up and consistent gives you the best opportunity of success and we have a great chance to do just that - but every game is huge for us at this stage.

A great game in prospect

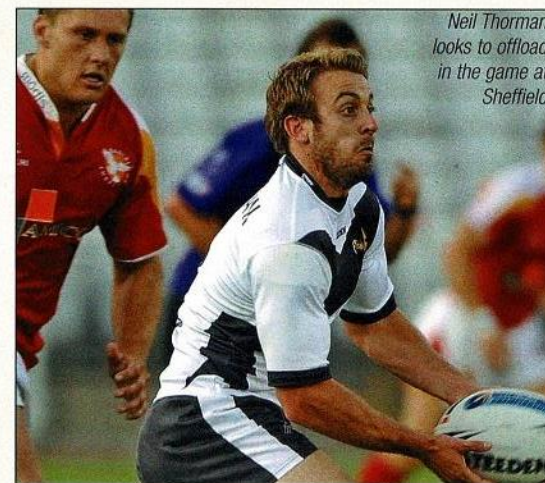
Welcome to what promises to be a cracking game against the Batley Bulldogs.

The last game of the season for any club in any sport always has a special flavour and we hope as many fans as possible can make that game.

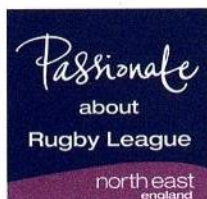

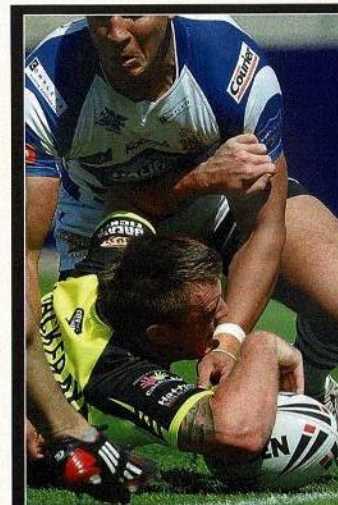

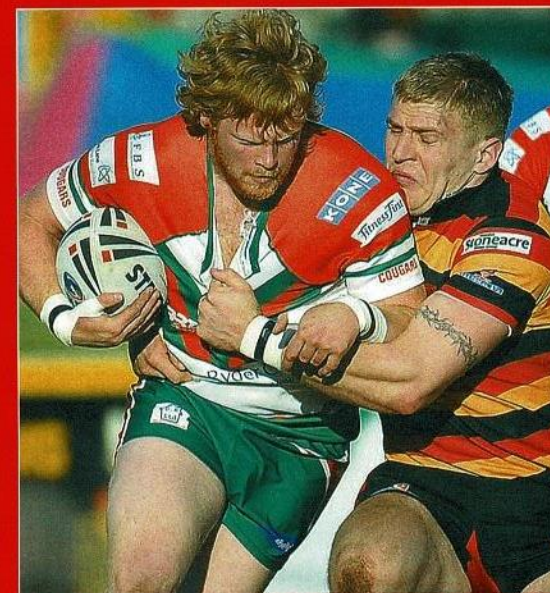
A big night for Keighley!

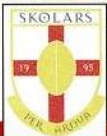
I am extremely excited about Sporting Chance and the opportunities it will give our young people.

The invitational tournament here today may be less intense, but hopefully should be an enjoyable event for spectators and participants. Thank you to everyone taking part today.

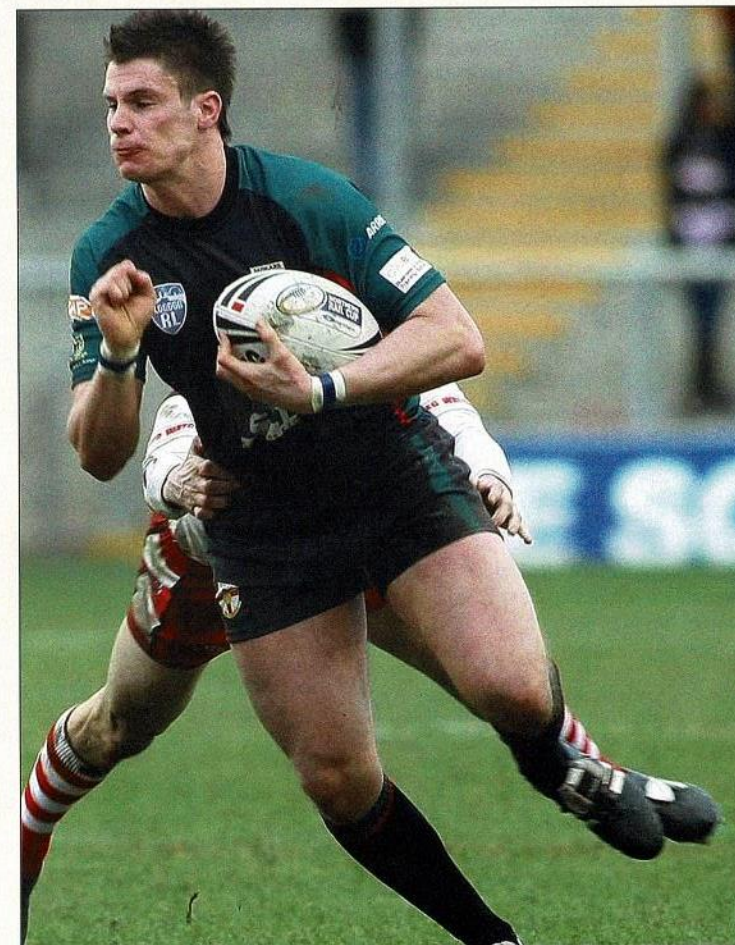

This week we must pick ourselves up and push on with the job of getting the three points from this game that will help secure a good position in the final table for the play-offs.

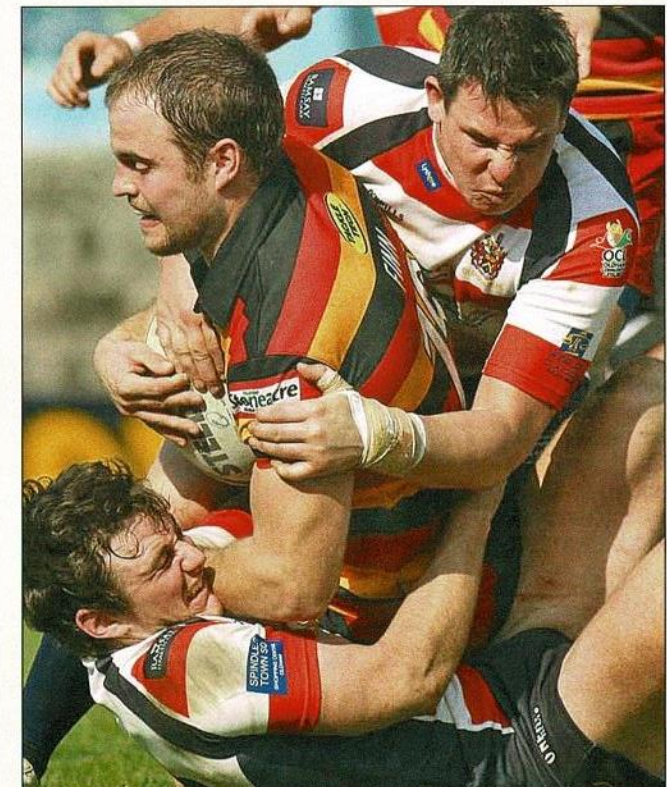
Rochdale are another club who have had their ups and downs this season but from a playing perspective have stuck in there and concentrated on picking up points at a steady rate.

So far this season has produced an extremely competitive Championship and Championship 1.

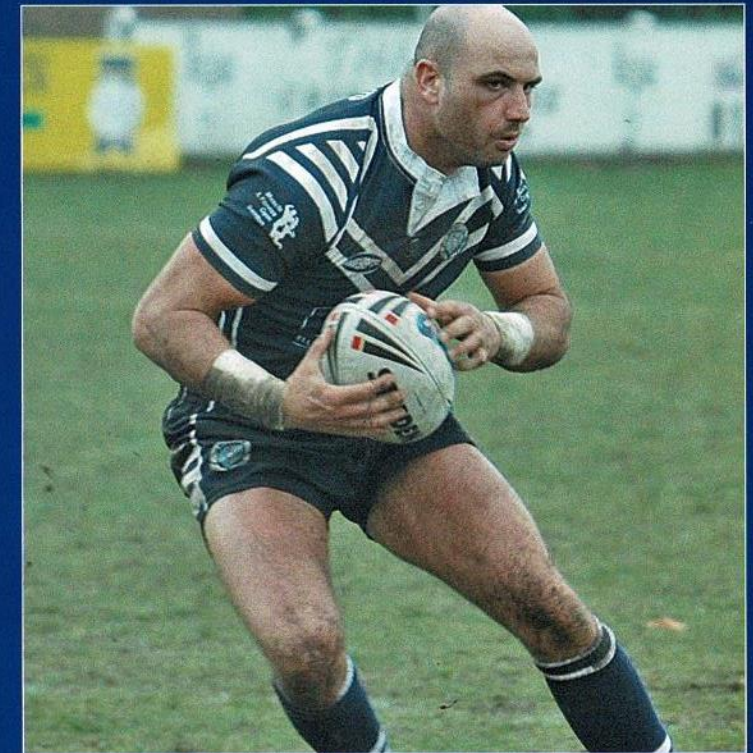
It looks as though it is going to stay that way right up to the final day of the season.
