Deakin leaves Barrow

Barrow Raiders parted company with Steve Deakin on Saturday, just two days before they could have secured first place in Championship against Gateshead.

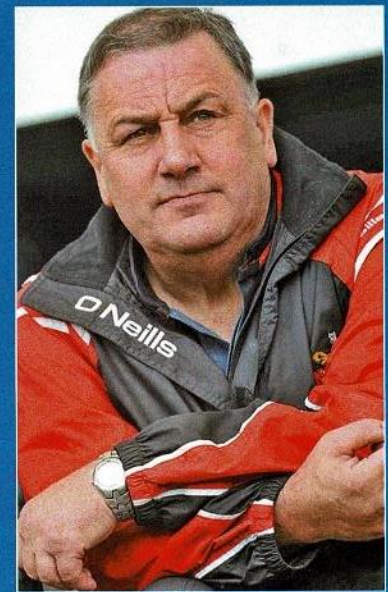
With all relevant parties saying very little about the shock announcement, exactly what has happened is unclear.

But, reportedly, Deakin (pictured right) was informed of the Barrow board's decision on Saturday lunchtime following a meeting of directors on Friday night.

Raiders chairman Des Johnston told the North West Evening Mail that "certain issues at the club had come to light".

Deakin was only appointed coach in July as a short-term replacement for Aussie Dave Clark and was expected to take charge of the club until the end of this season.

It is thought Deakin will now return to France to take up a coaching role with a rugby union club.

MENTION of ambitious Featherstone, reported to be recruiting strongly for next season, and the local council, Wakefield MDC, has backed their plans for a new community stadium. Chief executive Andy Prout says the project would be with a development partner, meaning Rovers would remain debt-free.

Thunder storm in Barrow

GATESHEAD all-but rescued their season with a stunning 16-12 victory over leaders Barrow on Monday.

Thunder jumped out of the bottom two on the back of the win and with Doncaster away being their final game, Steve McCormack's side looked nailed on to stay out of the relegation zone.

The North East outfit are level on points with second-bottom Leigh – and fourth-bottom Batley – but the Centurions' points difference is significantly worse than their two relegation rivals and their remaining fixture is at home to in-form Whitehaven. The Bulldogs finish off at Featherstone.

Gateshead trailed for virtually all of the game but took the lead in the 77th minute when Dylan Nash crossed on the back of a superb 40/20 from Ben McAlpine. Michael Knowles added the extras.

LEIGH were also in action on Monday at home to HALIFAX but for them it was a very different story as they lost 27-18.

Rob Worrincy bagged three tries for Fax, who can still pip Barrow to first place if they beat Toulouse and Barrow lose heavily at Sheffield.



It was nip and tuck for most of the match. With ten minutes left the Centurions only trailed 20-18 after a Stuart Donlan try had cut the gap.

Shad Royston's try all-but sealed the victory for the visitors and Lee Paterson added the extras while Bob Beswick kicked a drop goal in injury time to complete the scoring.

On Thursday night SHEFFIELD provided a first-half lesson in taking try-scoring chances then dug deep to deny a resurgent FEATHERSTONE even the consolation of a bonus point as they claimed a crucial 28-12 victory.

Sheffield were hit by early injuries – including a mystery gash to playmaker Brendon Lindsay's right leg, thought to be a result of something left behind after the U2 concert – that left coach Mark Aston struggling to spell his battered forwards.

The win keeps Sheffield on track for a possible second place finish – not bad for

a team that relied on bonus points to keep them in the hunt.

Eagles' coach Mark Aston said: "All we can do is keep on winning – we've won three on the bounce. We have Barrow coming here next week (Thursday) and nobody looks forward to coming to Don Valley.

"We could still finish second and if we do, after the turmoil we had early season with long term injuries, it would be a reasonably successful season."

Featherstone produced a game of two halves and left coach Daryl Powell frustrated. "We were pretty poor defensively and made some poor decisions in the first half," he said.

"We came out and played as we can in the second half and caused Sheffield a lot of trouble. We just needed one more score to put the pressure on them but they got a bit of a pasty try and the game was gone.

"We're in the top six and we did enough to build a bit of confidence within the group. It's just a matter of us coming up with that type of tempo and urgency for 80 minutes and not 40."

Skolars excel but Keighley secure second

Keighley confirmed their second-place finish in Championship One with a 28-10 victory over wooden-spoonists London Skolars, but the home team, who announced the appointment of James Massara as their coach for 2010, produced one of their best performances of the season.

The 1,156 'Friday Night Lights' crowd



saw the Skolars battle gamely and when Olu Iwenfu scored just after half-time that reduced his side's deficit to 18-10.

Three minutes later Keighley restored

their 12-point advantage. Dan Potter made a break and Sam Gardner finished off in the corner.

And the scoring was completed on 55 minutes when Jon Presley kicked a superb 40-20 to set up a Cougars attack and two tackles after the scrum, Jamaine Wray darted over the line from acting half-back.

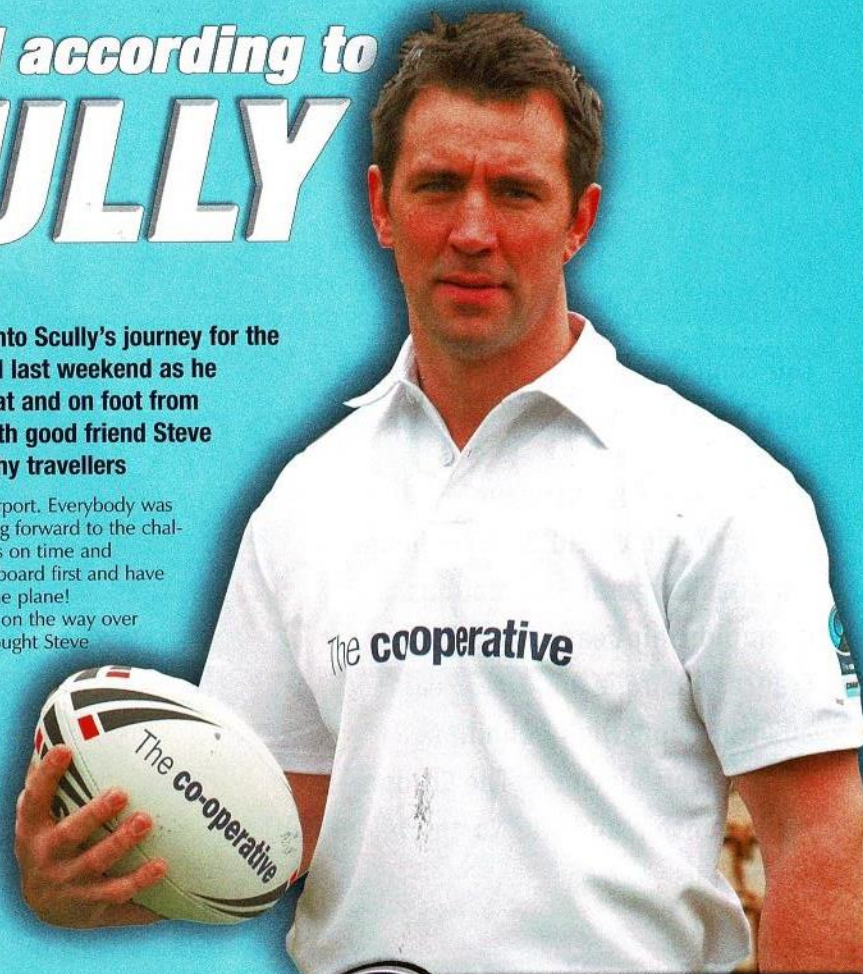

AHEAD OF THE GAME

PAUL BENNETT gives his slant on life in 'the greatest game'

Championship has been division of year

THE CO-OPERATIVE Championship regular season comes to a close this weekend – and what a season it's been.

They say Super League gets better and better each year, but it's the Championship that's proved THE most competitive division in rugby league in 2009, and it's set for an absolutely gripping finale.

As of Thursday, three clubs are still in the hunt for second spot while Barrow aren't yet assured of top. Although we already know which six clubs will be in the play-offs, starting next week, we've absolutely no idea who's going to win the title.

Genuinely, any of the six teams in the finals series – Barrow, Halifax, Widnes, Sheffield, Whitehaven or Featherstone – could reach the Grand Final and lift the new Championship trophy. Each have shown glimpses of both brilliance and vulnerability throughout the year and it's just going to be a question of who comes good at the vital stages.

Down at the bottom of the table, it's even more intriguing. Three clubs could still be relegated alongside Doncaster, with Batley, Gateshead and Leigh all tied on 29 points.

Had Toulouse not been given exemption from relegation, they too – on 30 points – would have been right in the mix.

Steve McCormack has done a remarkable job with

Thunder, aided greatly by the club's investment in star overseas players such as former NRL Grand Finalist Russ Aitken. Victory at struggling Doncaster will guarantee them safety.

Batley have also enjoyed a Lazarus-like reversal of fortunes under the guidance of Karl Harrison – resurrecting

their survival hopes with some marvellous wins against a number of the division's top clubs.

Meanwhile, ambitious Leigh have slumped to second bottom and, after Monday's defeat at Halifax, know they need at least a bonus point – and most likely a win – to stand a chance of staying up and, therefore, keep their

hopes of playing in Super League from 2012 alive.

It's going to go right down to the wire and, though I'll stick with my earlier prediction that it'll be Leigh that suffer relegation, it really could go any way – and that's the sort of drama that can only increase the interest, from media, fans and sponsors alike, in the Championship as a whole.

So it was with some concern that I heard recent news of a cut in the Championship salary cap from 2010 – from a maximum of £400,000 to £300,000.

With Doncaster having had huge problems this year and a number of other clubs rumoured to have their own financial concerns, it's sensible to make sure clubs don't overstretch themselves in an increasingly competitive division.

But is slashing the cap by a quarter going to dent the quality of the league next year?

I guess only time will tell there, but the competition – on the face of it at least – hasn't looked like needing much fixing.

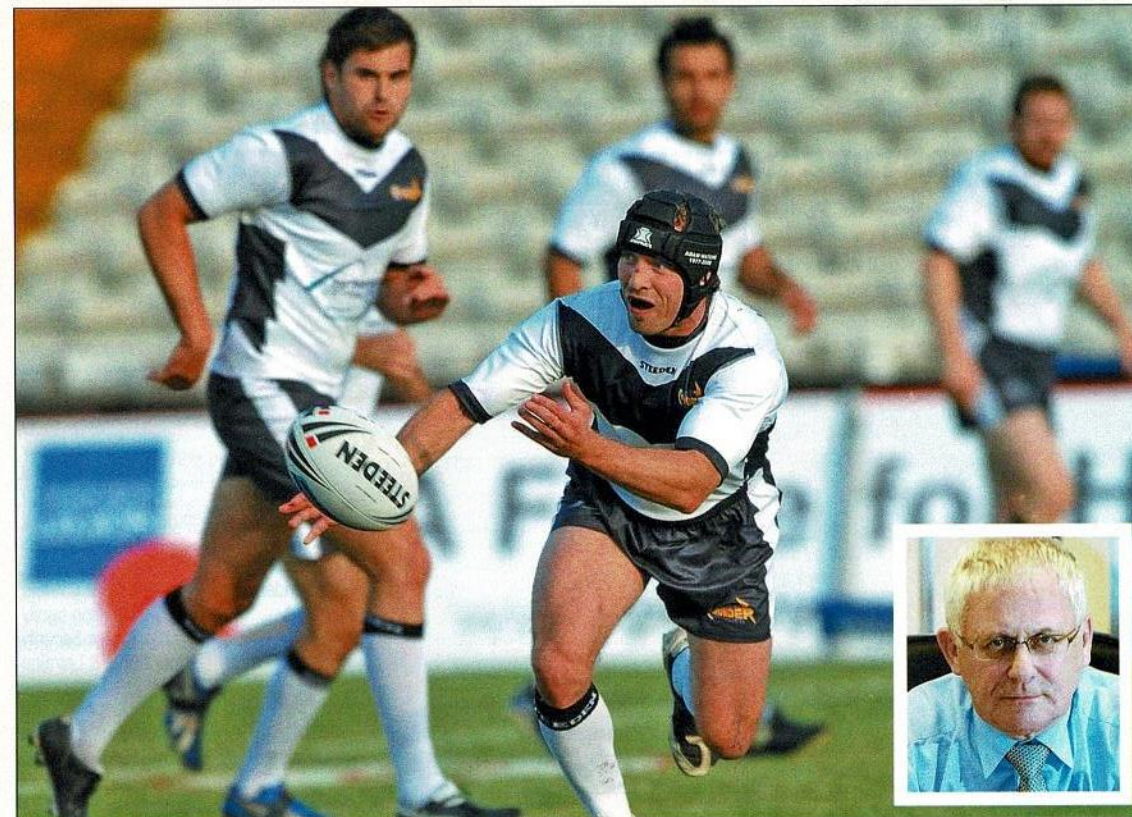

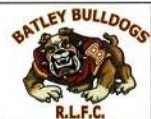

This will provide us with a tough challenge but one I feel we are well capable of achieving if we can be at our best.

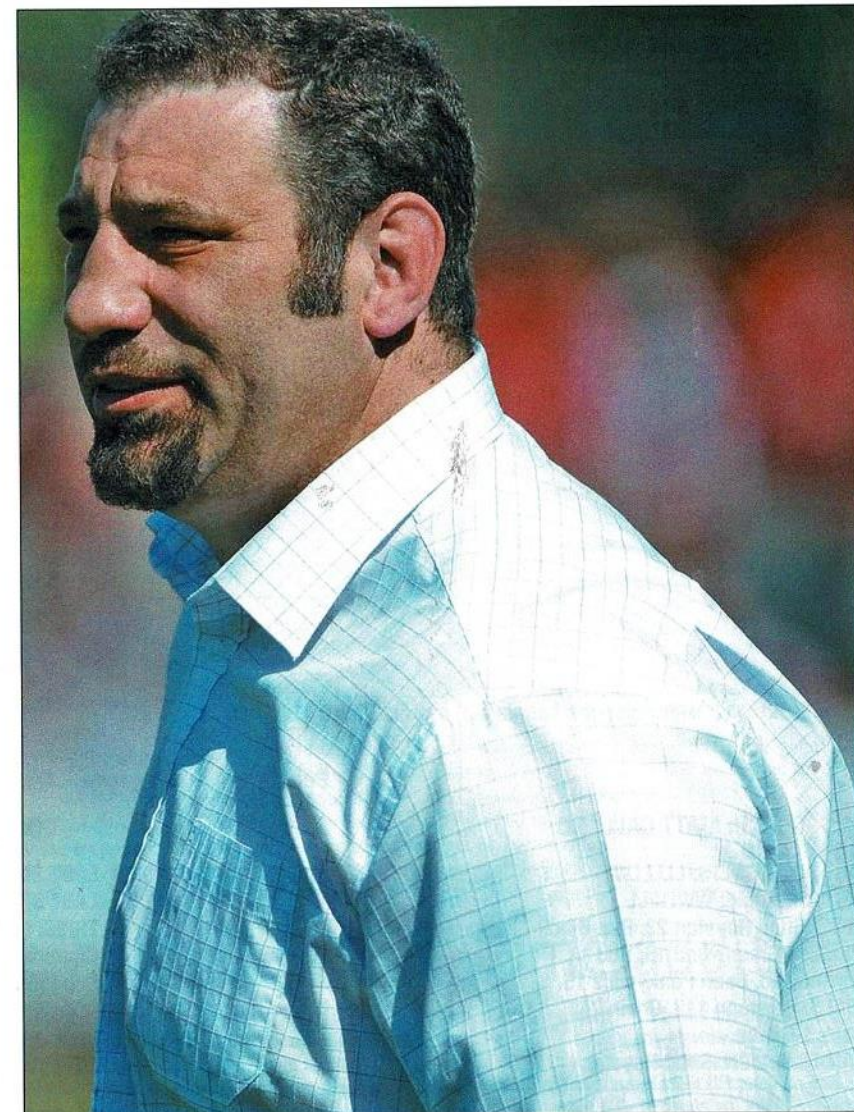
Unfortunately for us and our fans we have not been as good at home as we have on our travels this season, which is a huge reversal on last year.

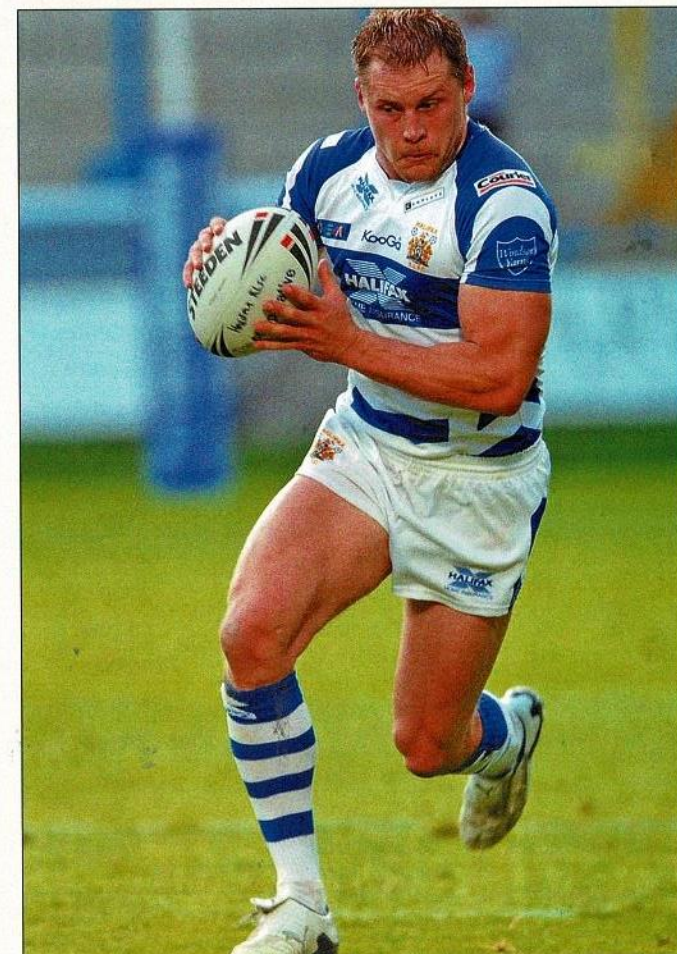

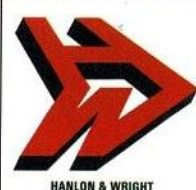

That won't be a bad result from a season that didn't start the way we had planned.

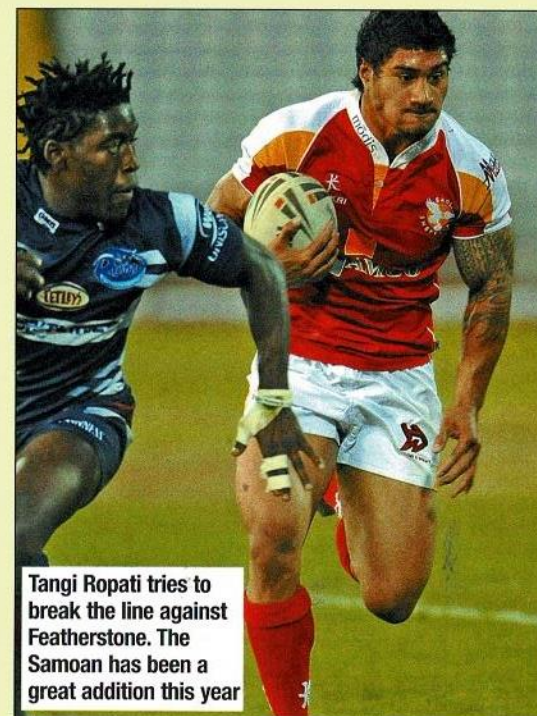
We're ending the league season on a high and that's down to a great attitude at every level in the club.

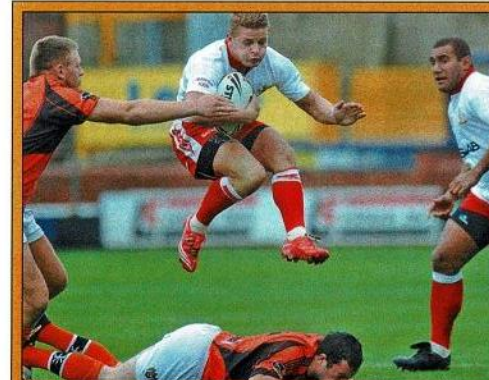

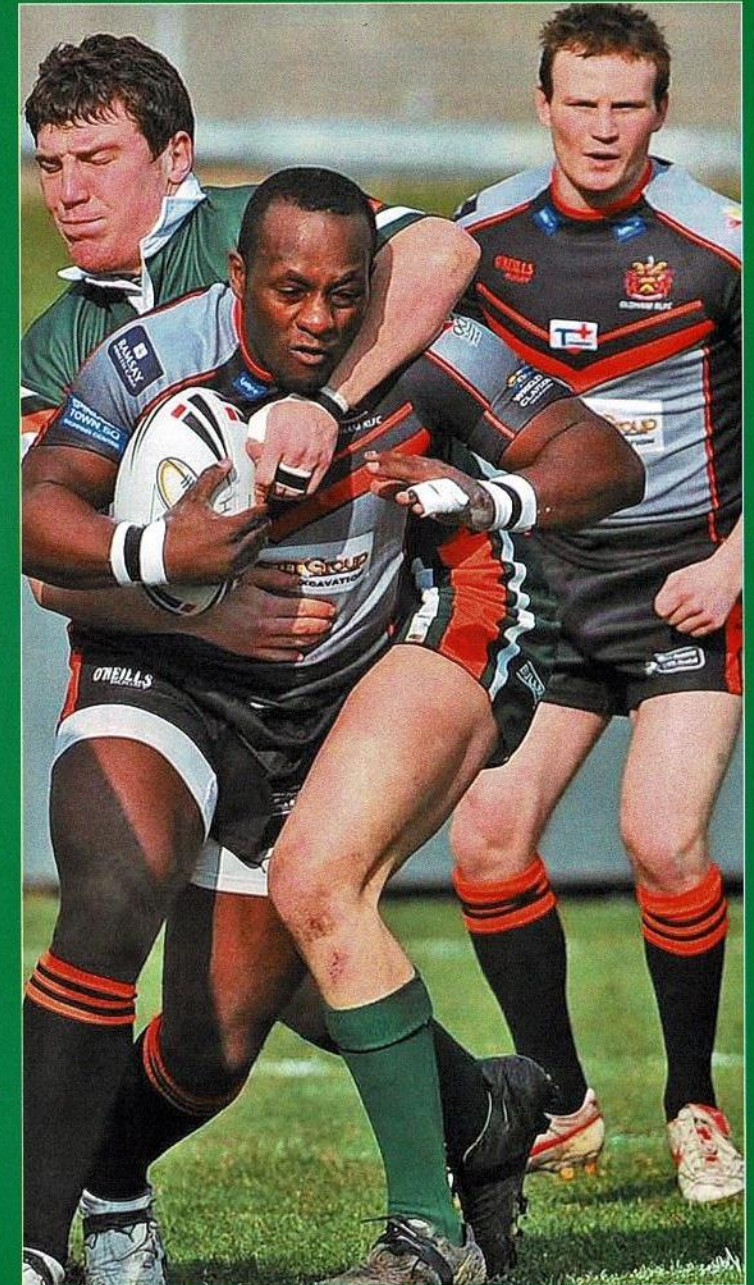
