

Lethal Lucas looks to third-time lucky in Oldham promotion push

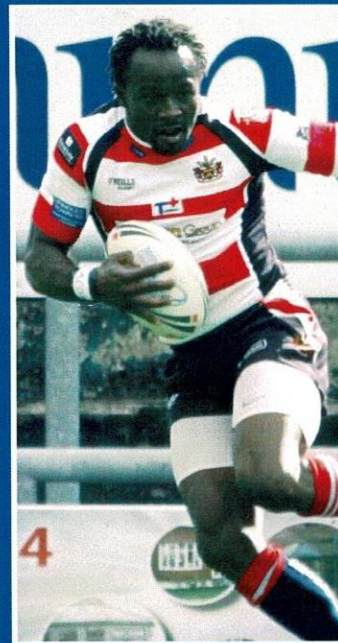

Happy-go-lucky Lucas Onyango, a

real favourite of the Oldham crowd, is enjoying his rugby again on the Roughyeds' right wing after making the spot his own over the last nine matches.

He played in only six of the club's first 18 games of the season while Andy Ballard and Lee Greenwood were holding down the wing positions, but the crowd-pleasing Kenyan is back to his best now and gaining in confidence every time he drags the Roughyeds shirt over his head.

He is scoring tries too --- six in the last nine games



and one in each of his last four outings against Blackpool, York, Hunslet and Swinton. He has had five centres during that nine-match sequence in Danny Halliwell, Ballard, Chris Baines, Craig Littler and Jamie Russo. But so long as the tries keep on coming he is just happy to be out there and happy to play alongside anybody as his centre.

And, having been involved in each of Oldham's promotion-chasing attempts in 2007 and 2008, when they were beaten in the grand final each time, this 28-year-old flier is hoping to make it third-time lucky.

If Roughyeds are to make the final this time they will have to do it the hard way by winning three games as they did in 2007 when they defeated Swinton and Workington at Boundary Park and then went up to Barrow and won there to qualify for the showdown with Featherstone in the final at Headingley.

Onyango is ready for the challenge and, despite recent results prior to the victory against Swinton, he is optimistic about the Roughyeds' prospects of going all the way.

He said: "I believe in the squad we have here. If all the players are fit and everything is right we can beat any team in the league. At the moment we are having no luck but in a game like rugby things will change at some point and then the luck will shine on us.

"We now have players like Marcus St Hilaire and Paul Reilly back, everyone is fighting for a place and everyone wants to win.

"This will be my third time pushing for promotion with Oldham and I really hope it will be third-time lucky.

"We just need that little bit of luck that has been missing. Every game from now on is a grand final and every team will do everything they can to play their 'A' game. There are no easy matches and we will have to be at our best."

Talking about his appetite for tries, he went on: "When you play on the wing you normally find that you have a centre partner alongside you for some time but lately there have been a lot of changes.

"For me it is no different though because everyone who has played on my inside has been a good player.

"I try to make sure that in every game I play I score. If I don't, I beat myself down about it afterwards.

"Scoring helps to build confidence which in turn helps you to play well in the next game so I hope the scoring carries on."

His most recent touchdown, against Swinton, was a fabulous try which put some of our most senior supporters in mind of the legendary Brian Bevan. Much credit has to go to Craig Littler, now back at his best after a lean spell in which he was hampered by injury and went out on loan to Swinton.

It needed a delightful piece of centre play to push Lucas up the touchline and he hugged it with speed and aplomb to get clear of the cover before stepping inside the full-back to go over.

Coach Tony Benson later described it as one of the finest winger's tries he has seen all season across the entire division.

Lucas is but one of several Oldham players who seem to be hitting the straps at just the right time and of the players currently at the club he is second only to Thomas Coyle in the list of try scorers. Lucas has 13, Lee Greenwood 12 and Coyle 14.

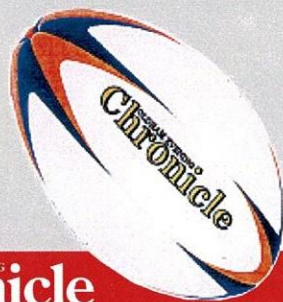

Benson's boys aim to build on Swinton win

ROUGHYEDS players and coach Tony Benson have promised fans they will unite as one in a huge effort to turn the tables on Hunslet Hawks at Boundary Park this afternoon.

The buzz words within the squad and around the training camp this week were '**CHARACTER**' and '**COMMITMENT**'. And players are urging fans to play their part by turning Boundary Park into a fortress for the day on what will be the team's last appearance of the year on home soil.

Club officials expect a significantly better turn-out than last week, given the

excitement generated by the Swinton Lions tie and the right result: 31-26 to the Roughyeds and a chance to put the record straight with the Hawks.

Hunslet triumphed 36-18 at the South Leeds Stadium in the Roughyeds' final league game, but now it's sudden-death cup-tie rugby and for Benson and his squad it's an opportunity to put that defeat well and truly behind them.

Players have assured fans they will give their all for the cause. Said one: "All we ask in return is that fans get behind us from the moment we leave the tunnel, and stick with us to the end. There's got to be strength in numbers - and we've got to make home advantage count."

Despite concerns about the club's structure in an uncertain future, players and staff have risen about adversity to strengthen bonds within the camp.

Said chief executive Chris Hamilton: "In the

past few weeks we've seen how much character they've got and that was a big factor in last week's win."

Added coach Tony B: "We're a smaller group now, but I'm so proud to be part of it. Everyone has pulled together - Chris (Hamilton), players, backroom staff, office staff, sponsors, the lot.

"As a group and as a team we have dug deep collectively - and we don't want to think that next week it will all be over."

Roughyeds have set their sights on their third Grand Final in three seasons and even though they would have to do it the hard way, players are not shy in expressing the view that they believe they have as much chance of getting there as Keighley, York and Hunslet.

They will have the whole of Lancashire behind them as well - and that's got to count for something.

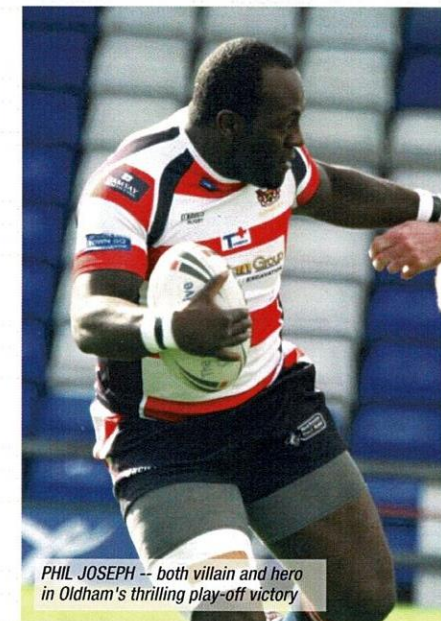
PRESS GANG HAD A BALL!

THE Roughyeds' thrilling 31-26 play-off win against Swinton Lions here at Boundary Park last Sunday went down well with the gentlemen of the Press.

RODEN DROPS IN TO GO BACK IN TIME!

NEIL Roden, who has now scored 99 tries for Oldham, turned back the clock to yesteryear when he dropped that all-important long-range goal in last Sunday's win against Swinton.

Fans with good memories, or those who keep statistics, will know that Neil holds two Roughyeds records for drop goals --- most in a season and most overall for Oldham RLFC (1997) Ltd.

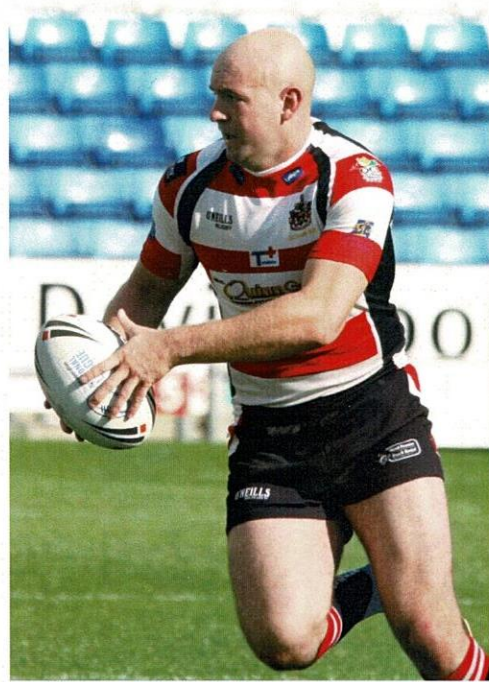
His seven in 2001-2002 has yet to be beaten, and his total for the club now stands at 21, which again puts him out in front.

Last Sunday's one-pointer, though, was his first since he dropped a couple in the 2007 campaign.

"I don't seem to be scoring tries these days, so I thought it was time I at least popped one over," he said later, tongue in cheek of course.

Tries do seem to be scarce these days for the man who has crossed the line more times than any other player in the history of the new Oldham club, but he is not alone among the players in believing that a combined effort across the whole team can enable Roughyeds to make an impact on the play-

offs.



Speaking after the Swinton tie, he said: "We trained well in the build-up to the game and we put the difficulties of the past few weeks behind us.

"We have a lot of character in the camp and it surfaced when we had to keep the Lions out near the end.

"There is little to separate the play-off teams and I see no reason why we can't go all the way."

Keen fan George Cowburn, of Thornham, keeps meticulous records of the Roughyeds and he has done since the new club was formed in 1997.

My records on Roden, and those of club historian Mike Turner, differ slightly but George's stats look to be spot-on, such is the amount of information he can supply in support of his figures.

Only league and cup matches count towards official figures and according to George, Neil has currently made 225 Oldham appearances, scoring 92 tries and 21 drop goals.

In addition, he has played in another ten games that don't count --- seven friendlies against South Sydney, Manly, Whitehaven, Warrington, Leeds, Huddersfield and Leigh; two Law Cup ties against Rochdale; and one match against York which was expunged from the records when York folded in the 2001-2002 season.

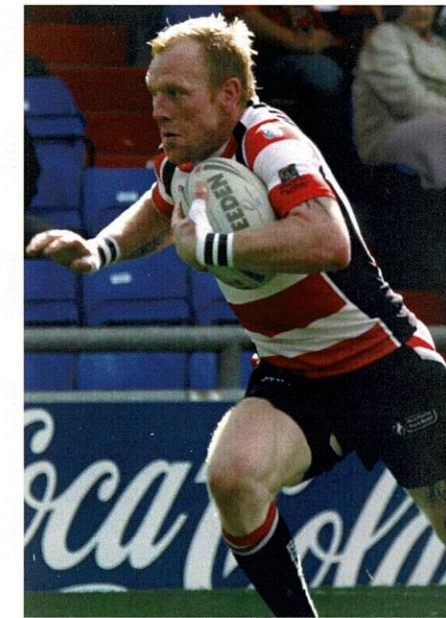
In those games he scored another seven tries to take his grand total for Oldham to 99. So its one more for the ton Neil, which would be a massive milestone to achieve, notwithstanding that seven of those touchdowns are classed as "unofficial".

Thanks for the statistics, George. Now just go for it Neil . . . one needed for the century!

ALL-ACTION Paul Reilly (pictured) is one of several Roughyeds players who are running into form at just the right time.



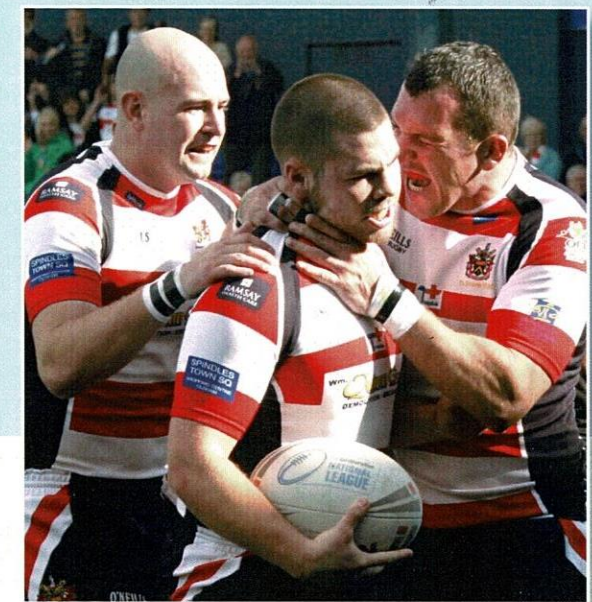
The former Huddersfield Giants legend has made only four of his 18 appearances over the season in his favourite full-back spot, but he has been impressive each time, particularly so in the last two games against Hunslet away and Swinton at Boundary Park in last week's play-

off win.

If experience counts for anything --- and today's visitors Hunslet must think so with Paul March, Neil Lowe, Richard Chapman and Josh Weedon in key midfield roles --- then Reilly's your man.

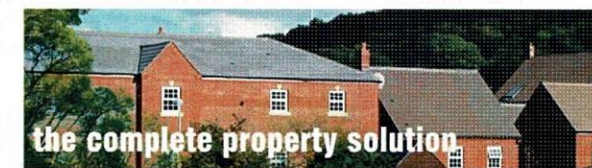
His enthusiasm knows no bounds and there were signs last week that it was rubbing off on every other member of the side.

Like Reilly, Lucas Onyango and Craig Littler are playing their best rugby of the season; Craig Robinson caused the Lions problems as a wide runner; Chris Baines is playing consistently well to merit his selection in the division's all-star line-up; and the return from injury and illness of Marcus St Hilaire and Tommy Goulden couldn't have been better timed. Bainsey is even proving his worth as a goalkicker. He kicked five out of six last week. And of the one he missed, he said: "I think I took too much time over it. I was so keen to get it right, I took longer than usual. I learned a lesson: stick to your usual format for every single kick."

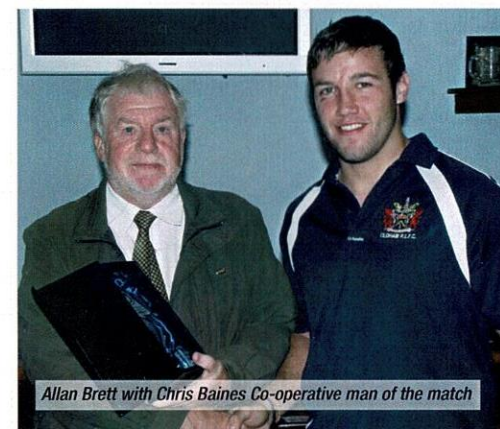

An RFL Tribunal also banned Castleford from serving alcohol in bottles next season following the scenes at

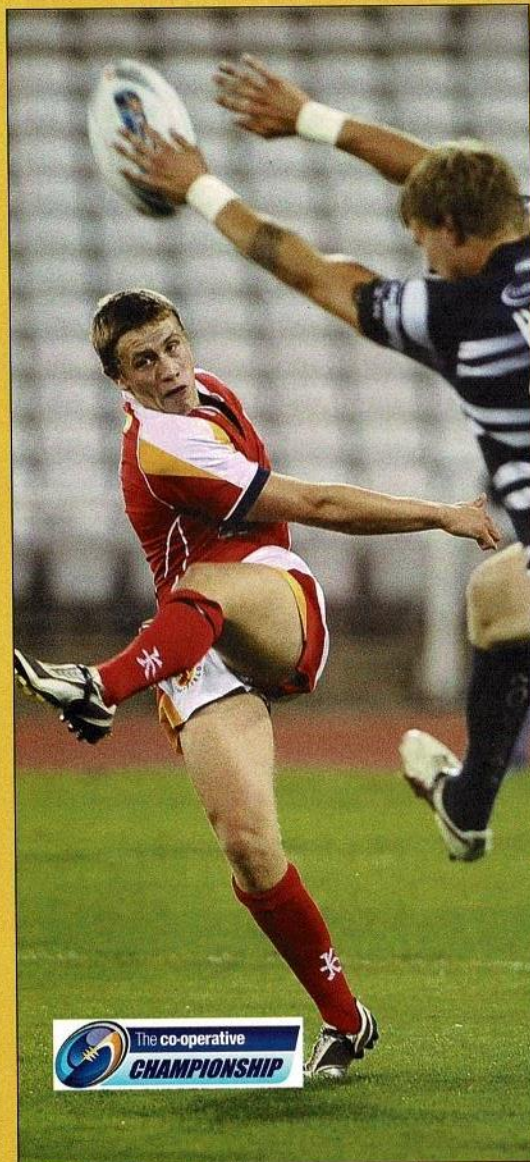
The Jungle after their 22-20 defeat in the match.

THERE was a fiery return to the Don Valley for FEATHERSTONE coach Daryl Powell who saw his side upset the in-form SHEFFIELD EAGLES 32-8.

With a total of four sin-binnings – two in the first minute – and two sendings off, Rovers will be sweating on the disciplinary panel's deliberations before their visit to Widnes.

Powell enjoyed the moment however: "I'm really pleased with the performance, the attitude and commitment and the emotional effort that went in tonight was excellent," he said.

"Our forward pack was absolutely superb and gave Andy Kain, Iestyn Harris and Kyle Briggs the opportunity to pull the strings. As a team the attitude was the best we've been all year. It's the right time to do that and hopefully we can repeat it.

"Across the season we have been looking for an emotional energy – we delivered tonight, and had a verbal energy and a complete performance from a defensive point of view.

"We just weren't prepared to lose the game, to concede points and as a result we were a little better than Sheffield."

Looking forward to the trip to Widnes he added: "We would play tomorrow if we can turn up like we did (at Sheffield) – with the effort, the defensive security, then we'll be difficult to beat.

"We have played really well away from home and it won't bother us where we have to go. You have to get stuck into it and see how it goes. It's about us turning up with the effort and commitment that hopefully can be a trademark of Featherstone Rovers."

Iestyn Harris and Craig Cook were binned after a 1st minute fracas, then in the 38th minute

Ian Hardman and Ryan Hepworth were red-carded and Andy Kain and Sam Barlow binned for their parts in a mass brawl, with the entire incident put on report.

Eagles coach Mark Aston was understandably disappointed, but credited Rovers for upsetting his side. "We lost our composure and focus and they did the job they needed," he said.

WIDNES VIKINGS had to battle back from an 18-4 deficit to see off a determined Whitehaven outfit 26-21.

"There are many ways to win a rugby league game and we have just found another one," said coach Cullen. "Three weeks off was always going to be a test and we passed it. We were a little bit scruffy and rusty and they looked a bit tougher and sharper early on. Our ball control in the first half was a little disappointing and we had to defend our try-line more than we wanted to do.

"They opened us up a few times – in fact more than any team has done in the last month or so. All in all it was a tough game but we expected a tough game from Whitehaven and we got it in buckets full.

"They changed tactics – flying off the line into us and then slowing down the play the balls and it worked in their favour, especially when we turned the ball over, but mentally we were very strong and we were always within touching distance.

"The tries before and after the break were big psychological blows for us while Whitehaven were down to 12 men. Our honesty and patience proved to be the difference."

Haven boss Ged Stokes summed the game up: "If anybody walked away from that game unsatisfied they must be very hard to please."

OLDHAM were also involved in a real nail-biter at Boundary Park in their derby clash with SWINTON LIONS.

Phil Joseph was both the villain and hero in a thrill-a-minute elimination play-off.

The home team looked in pole position and sitting comfortably having scored 14 unanswered points early in the second half, to establish a 26-14 lead.

Then, while in another good position, substitute Joseph threw out a pass only to see it intercepted by Andy Saywell, who galloped home from long range for the try which Graham Holroyd improved to close matters to just a single score.

The experienced head of Neil Roden was crucial as he thumped over a towering drop goal to give Oldham a 27-20 advantage, which would ulti-

mately prove enough – but not before a second try for Saywell in the corner and a cracking touchline conversion from Holroyd set up a proper grandstand finish.

It forced the position from which Joseph made amends with the score to settle matters, driving over directly from the back of the scrum.

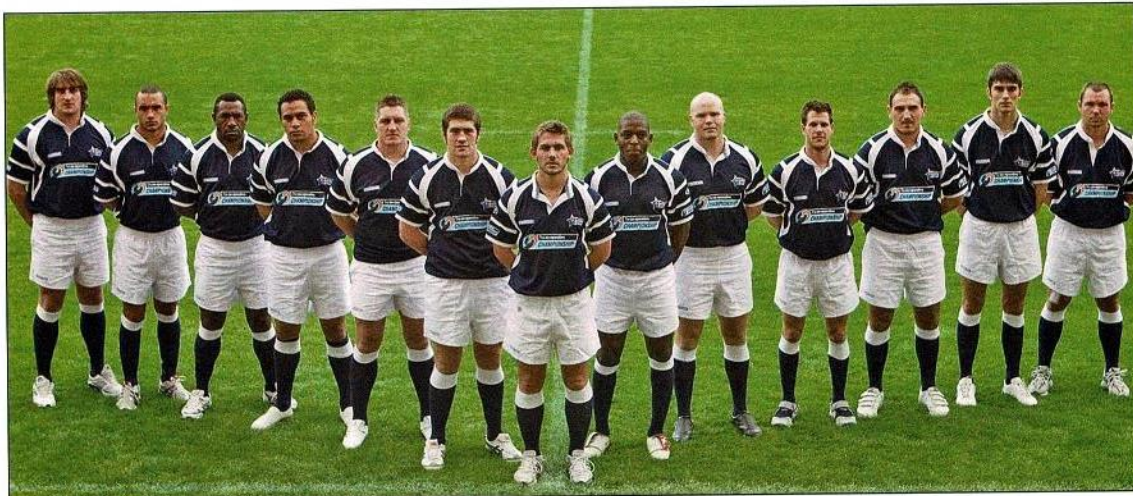
"I was made up for Phil," said Roughyeds coach Tony Benson afterwards.

PAUL BENNETT gives his slant on life in 'the greatest game'

Right call over Ashes keeps dreams alive

GLAD TO SEE the powers that be have seen sense over their idea to bring back the Ashes as a one-off test.

It was an idea with the best of intentions – to ramp up interest in the Gillette Four Nations on the back England cricketers' success this summer. Our sport can use all the publicity it can get and the 'Ashes' name carried weight with the media and the public alike.

The problem for the RFL marketing bods, however, was that it carried just too much weight.

Ashes rugby league means so much to everybody who was ever associated with it – players, coaches, tour officials ... even we common fans.

The decades of history; the memories of thrilling wins, of cruel defeats, of heart-breaking near-misses, of late, late glory – it's all so special.

And many of the great tales in Ashes folklore are of bravely coming back from one-nil down in the series to win it 2-1, or of managing to get one over on the old foe but just not being able to get the job done over the three matches.

As former Great Britain tourist and coach Brian Noble rightly said, the challenge of the Ashes is to beat the Australians over three matches not just one.

We've been able beat them now and then (and who could

forget that great win in Sydney in 2006) but a series win has eluded us since 1970. As much as it hurts, the Aussies deserve to be recognised for their domination of our great rivalry and claiming the Ashes back on the back of a one-off contest would have cheapened the feat.

Thankfully, common sense has prevailed and the RFL and ARL have reversed their original decision to out the Ashes Trophy on the line.

But, if the people in charge of shifting tickets for the Four Nations want extra pulling power for the England-Australia game at Wigan on

October 31, then there could be a sensible middle ground.

And, like many a sensible idea in rugby league, it comes right from the wise brain of League Weekly's very own Ray French! Ray, in his column in the paper last Monday, called for England and Australia to play for a different trophy – leaving the Ashes to be contested in future by Great Britain and Australia.

Ray suggests the 'James Lomas Trophy' – named for the first ever captain of a Great Britain Ashes tour squad in 1909-10. Whatever you'd call it, I think it'd be a good idea.

Whatever happens, there's at least one good thing to have come out of this slightly embarrassing episode. The Aussies have obviously taken note and there were encouraging words from ARL chief Geoff Carr as to a possible Great Britain Ashes tour in 2012 after all.

Let's hope so. Then maybe we can get those Ashes back the proper way.

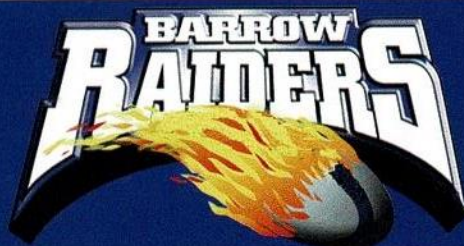

No more thinking about bonus points and points differences. And we certainly won't be thinking that if we lose to Halifax we can still have another bite at the cherry.

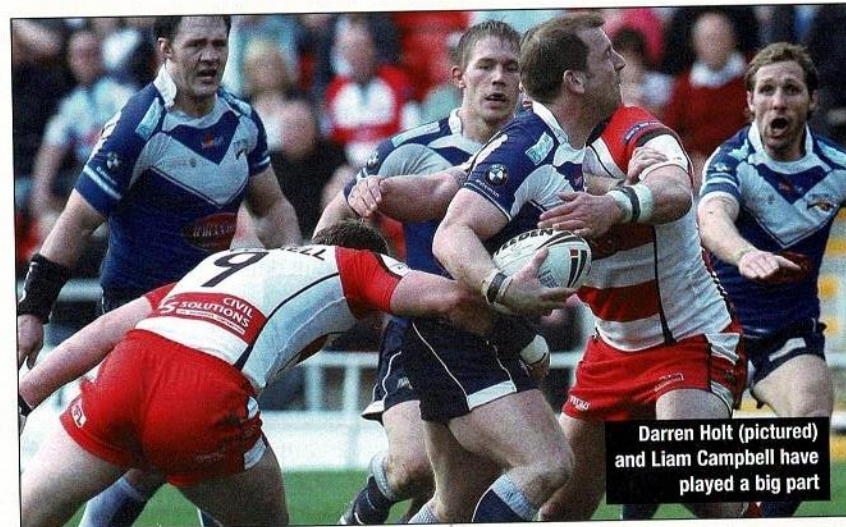
We aim to get it finished tonight so we can then sit back and let the others fight out for the right to play in the final at Warrington.

Hopefully this week we will have a number of them back but the performances of the likes of Shane Grady, Scott Yates and Dave Houghton all bode well for the future of the club.

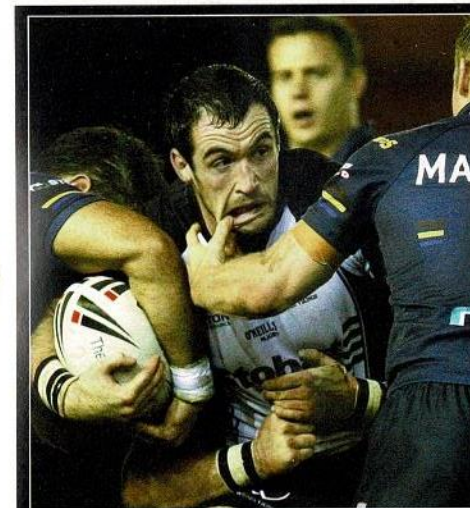

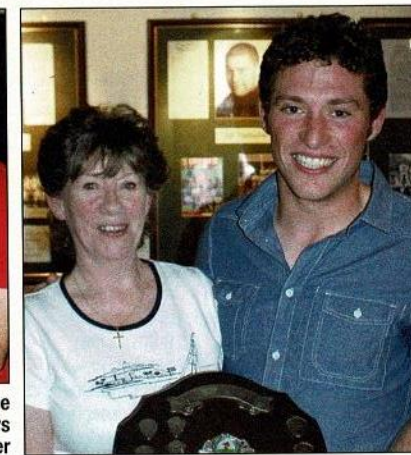

Team-wise once again we may be put in the situation whereby Tony will not have too much of a headache when it comes to selection because of injuries etc, but again we will know more later in the week.

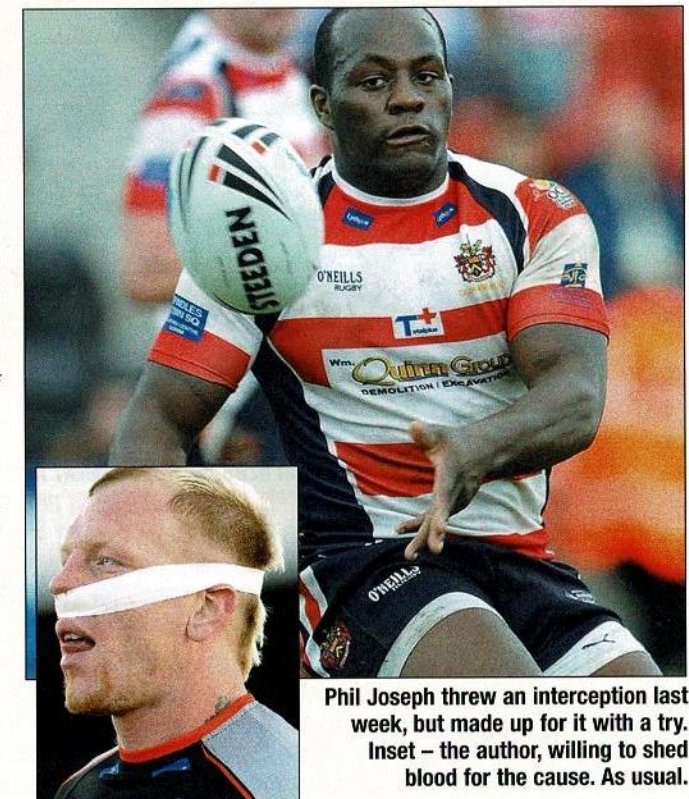

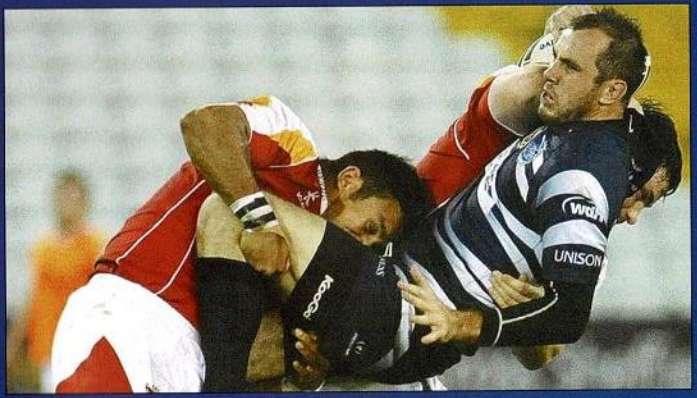
