

N THE basis that it's good to share, the news that another four Engage Super League players have joined the growing list of players to be dual registered with a Co-operative Championship side is to be welcomed.

Leigh Centurions have snapped up Warrington Wolves youngsters Matty Blythe, Lee Mitchell and Tyrone McCarthy along with St Helens front row, Jacob Emmitt, in a deal which can only enhance the quality of the competition in the Northern Rail Cup and Cooperative Championships.

Promising back rower Tyrone McCarthy was a member of the Wolves' Carnegie Challenge Cup-winning side at Wembley and these four signings will prove great additions to the Centurions squad.

Moreover, following their impressive 36-6 victory over Featherstone Rovers, the Centurions have certainly put down a marker of their intent in the Northern Rail Cup competition.

Another club who have enjoyed a flying start to the competition is Halifax who prior to the Sheffield game were yet to concede a point after scoring 92 of their own in two victories over Dewsbury and London Skolars.


Keighley Cougars are also in strong early-season form and are setting the pace in Pool A with their 38-10 win over Workington putting them one point clear at the top.



oint Workington coach and former player Gary Charllton has fond memories of his tussles with 'Haven over the years. "They've always been full-blooded with no holds barred," said Charlton who, with Martin Oglanby, has succeeded Dave Rotherham as head coach at Dewent Park. "Everything's full on and everyone gets stuck into each other."

Today's game is his first taste of derby action as a coach but local lad Gary is well aware of home much this game means to the supporters. "I've played in plenty of derby matches and it's special because you're playing against people who are your mates off the pitch," said the Town boss. "It gives you more of a buzz to go out there and play well. The bragging rights that come with victory mean this game does have special meaning to supporters so we'll be looking to do them proud."

Workington have endured a tough few seasons since the break-up of the Northern Ford Premiership in 2003. But, following a positive close-season recruitment drive, Charlton is optimistic about Town's future.

"We're looking to get Workington up and running and playing well. We've spent a few years in the doldrums but hopefully, if we can string a few results together, the crowds will start coming back."

Liam Finch has been brought in from Barrow and could prove to be a shrewd signing, while Mike Backhouse, Joe McKenna, Lee Dutton and Scott Kaighan have followed him from Craven Park to bolster the Town ranks.

"Because of where the club's been over the last few years, the derbies been a bit one-sided but we think we've got a great chance of putting that right this year."

"If we can prepare our troops right, we'll be in for a good game," said Charlton.

Despite the importance of the match to everybody involved at Workington, he insists he won't be giving the game any special treatment as far as training is

going to go out there and see what we can come up with." One of the great features of the Northern Rail Cup is that it often pits two sides together that otherwise would not meet. A prime example of that is the Cumbrian derby between Workington and Whitehaven this weekend. Less than 10 miles separate the two towns making this a bona fide battle for local bragging rights. ed Stokes' first job on British shores was with Workington. He was offered the vacant coaching position at Derwent Park while on tour with the New Zealand A team and took over in time for the 2004 season.

Stokes brought the likes of Taani Lavulavu, Lusi Sione and John Tuimaualuga to Workington, along with outstanding hooker Jonny Limmer as the club attempted to rebuild following a dramatic fall from grace since being relegated from Super League.

"I really enjoy living in Cumbria, that's a given really," said Stokes. "I've spent time with Workington and Whitehaven and have been made to very welcome at both clubs."

Having spent time with both rivals, Stokes is under no illusion about what this derby means to the fans.

"The derby to me is as important as it is to the supporters, it's an important date in everyone's calendar up here. Obviously there are bragging rights at stake and we'll be looking to do the business on the pitch for the fans, but also for ourselves" said Stokes.

"We won't be preparing for the game any differently. We're confident we can pick up a result so training will be as normal in the build-up."

Whitehaven's start to the campaign has seen them win one out of their first three matches – an emphatic victory over Doncaster last weekend helping put the midweek defeat against Batley behind them.

"Sunday's performance was an improvement, although I didn't think we played too badly against Batley," said Stokes.

"They're a good side and I'm satisfied with our performance aside from a few glitches. We were ahead for part of the game and it could have gone either way," he

"It's close matches like that that you need at the start of the season."

The loss of Leroy Joe early in the campaign with a fractured ankle is a blow to the Whitehaven cause, but Stokes hope to have the evergreen Kiwi back on the park before too long.

"We're two weeks down the line now and recovery looks to be on track," said Stokes. "We'll keep an eye on him but hopefully he can be back in action for us in four or five weeks."

As for the derby, Stokes is confident that his players have the desire and hunger to win the match.

"The players are quite capable of building themselves up, they don't need to be told what's at stake in this game."



Barrow Raiders

Steve McCormack has an almighty task on his hands if he hopes to emulate Barrow's success over the last two seasons. The Raiders have won two consecutive league titles and gone from Championship 1 also-rans to genuine contenders for Super League license.

Andrew Henderson has replaced Andy Ellis, who has joined Harlequins, and is joined at Craven Park for 2010 by fellow Thunder team-mate Michael Knowles and experienced second-rower Richard Fletcher.

Jamie Rooney has committed himself to Barrow cause for 2010 and will, once again, play a vital part in the Raiders' onfield push for a franchise spot in two years' time. With clubs around them recruiting strongly during the close-season, last year's grand final winners cannot afford any slip-ups if they hope to retain their crown.

Batley Bulldogs

The Bulldogs' great escape in 2009 saw them embark on an end of season run that included victories over Barrow, Halifax and Featherstone. Karl Harrison's arrival at Mount Pleasant galvanised the squad and, by the end of the season, his side looked capable of turning anybody

The club has recruited well during the close-season. Winger Eddie Kilroy joins after spending several years with Bradford academy, Sean Hesketh has been brought in from Featherstone and Jason Walton, with a string of Super League appearances to his name, has been drafted in from Salford.

They are joined in 2010 by ex-RHinos youngster Gareth Moore, James Martin and Lee Greenwood, along with three dual-registered players from Huddersfield: Kyle Wood spent 2009 with Sheffield, while threequarters Josh Griffin and Alex Brown will be hoping to catch the attention of Giants coach Nathan Brown with a spell at Championship level.

With Harrison at the helm, and some bright young players ready to explode on to the scene, Bulldogs supporters should be able to look forward to a tilt at a playoff place this season.

Dewsbury Rams

Having swept all before them in 2009, Warren Jowitt and his side face an altogether different task this time around. With the Championship stronger than ever, any club promoted from the division below faces a daunting challenge in making the step-up and holding their own.

With this in mind, the club has recruited heavily over the winter. Anthony England, Luke Menzies and Luke Stenchion will add size to the Rams pack and, in Dominic Brambani, Dewsbury have a ready-made replacement for the departed Liam Finn.

Big things are expected of local lads Alex Bretherton, Andy Bostock and Pat Walker while new signing Ayden Faal should be fit for the start of the league campaign. The club were forced to pay a fee to prise the ex-Rhinos academy star away from Hunslet and Jowitt will be keen to get him back on the pitch as soon as possible, following a close-season hernia operation.

The Rams will find the going tough in the Championship but will improve as the season progresses. Dewsbury fans can expect a real scrap for survival this year, but it's one they should win. Prediction: 8th

In Kyle Briggs, Featherstone have one of the sport's hottest prospects and a player expected to make the step up following the retirement of lestyn Harris. Andy Kain and Liam Finn will give the side further attacking spark with the likes of Tommy Saxton and Jon Steel providing that finishing touch.

Larsen Marabe and Jesse Joe Nandye have been flown in from Papua New Guinea and are expected to make a big impact once they settle. Iain Morrison is another player who'll be looking to make his mark after developing a reputation as one of the divisions top young props during his time at Widnes.

Halifax

2009 will live long in the memory of Halifax supporters for a variety of reasons. A blistering start to the league campaign saw them race clear at the top of the Championship, winning their first seven matches, and staking an early claim for a franchise spot in the near-future.

The second-half of the season brought with it a dip in form, however, and Matt Calland's men were unable to recapture their early season form - despite eventually making the Grand Final and coming up just short.

In Ben Black and Luke Branighan, Calland has one of the division's most lethal half-back combinations at his disposal and, with Stanley Gene and Makali Aizue arriving during the close-season, a visit to the Shay in 2010 will be a tougher prospect than ever.

Halifax have class all over the park and it's difficult to see anyone derailing their quest for silverware this season.

Prediction: 1st, Grand Final winners Key Man: Ben Black

Keighley Cougars

The Cougars are another side that has enjoyed a season-on-season progression on the field. Barry Eaton has overseen Keighley's evolution from a struggling Championship 1 outfit into promotion challengers and then play-off winners.

The form of young half-back pairing Jon Presley and Danny Jones was the catalyst behind the team's success with Scott Law, Andy Shickell and Will Cartledge taking on the fight up front.

The step-up to the Championship is a massive one though and the Cougars will find the going tough at this level. Chris Baines is the club's marquee signing and is joined at the club by a smattering of Super League academy starlets with a point to prove.

Keighley face a massive challenge but, with Eaton at the helm, there'll be no shortage of passion and effort from the players. The club's tumultuous pre-season will see them begin the season with nine points deducted, which may give the Cougars too big a mountain to climb. Prediction: 11th

Leigh Centurions

Having regained their Championship status following Gateshead's dramatic decline, the Centurions will be keen to put last season behind them.

New coach Ian Millward needs no introduction to British Rugby League supporters and will be eager to implement his own way of thinking at the Leigh Sports Village.

Robbie Paul's decision to join the club for 2010 was a massive boost to a club with one eye on a Super League application and, with Ricky Bibey, Tommy Goulden and Tim Hartley signing-on, Leigh look in a much stronger shape ahead of the league campaign than last time around.

John Duffy returns to the club after spells with Whitehaven and Widnes and will be looking to recapture the form that helped the Centurions to victory in the Grand Final and promotion to the Super League in 2004.

The decision taken by the RFL to reinstate Leigh's place in the Championship may well prove to be the shot in the arm the club needed.

The recent bad weather may have put the brakes on the Eagles' planned move to Bramall Lane but, on the field, the team will be eager to pick up from where they left off last season and mount a serious challenge for silverware this term.

Sheffield's ability to take points from every single match in 2009 secured a third place finish that has threatened to turn the South Yorkshire club's distant Super League dream into a realistic ambi-

Aaron Groom and Brendon Lindsay's blossoming partnership is crucial to the side's fortunes - there's certainly no shortage of flair and finishing power elsewhere on the pitch. They registered victories over Barrow, Whitehaven and Featherstone but defeats against Leigh and Gateshead towards the end of the campaign meant Gilles Dumas' side finished up in the 'relegation' spot.

Having found their feet in a new competition, the men from the Stade de Minimés will be looking to find some consistency and mount a challenge for a playoff place.

The Wynn brothers, Tim and Nathan, will again be looking to lead from the front in 2010 along with the exciting Constant Villegas. Brendan Worth and ex-Catalan Dragons man Matthieu Griffi will provide the muscle in the pack, whilst new signing Simon Worrall will be looking to make a big impression after rising through the ranks at Leeds.

Toulouse will be looking to improve on last year's 10th placed finished and are well equipped to upset a few teams.

The Vikings' close season recruitment has seen them secure the services of several young Super League stars, with Paul Cullen taking advantage of the RFL's new dual-registration initiative. Shaun Ainscough, Ben Davies and Liam Farrell have arrived from Wigan along with Chris Dean from St. Helens.

James Ford, having spent 2009 with Cas, will be hoping he can get back into Super League with the Vikings while young half-back Thomas Coyle will have a point to prove having been released by Wigan two years ago.

James Webster and Anthony Thackeray will, once again, guide the side around the park and look to the likes of Gareth Haggerty and Steve Pickersgill to make the hard yards down the middle and provide them with a platform.

Widnes' Northern Rail Cup triumph last season has helped build momentum in the club's push for a Super League place. The players' job is to ensure that standards on the field remain high as the club prepares for what it hopes will be the step-up to the promised land. Prediction: 5th


Gateshead are another team who, under head coach Chris Hood, will consolidate in 2010 and aim to be competitive every week.

And we're not taking anything for granted because

Warren Jowitt the men from the Tetley's Stadium are a real threat.

We'll be playing at their place and do you know that kind of thing makes a real difference at this level of Rugby League.

In the Engage Super League all the stadia are becoming

generic so it's not that different wherever the game is played. But it's not like that in the Co-operative Championship and Championship One.

The changing rooms are all different:

some stadiums like the Tetley's are like postage stamps and come in on top of you, while there are there are tracks like Whitehaven's that are wide open to the elements.

It affects the way players prepare for their games and it's not without coincidence that Championship games are harder to predict.

The conditions are so much different and it's much tougher for the players for the away teams than it is in Super League.

The key game this weekend will be Keighley Cougars' trip to Barrow Raiders. Barry

Eaton's Cougars are sitting proudly on top of Pool A with a 100 per cent record. They're assured of their place in the Quarter Finals already.

But Barrow have a win and a narrow defeat against Widnes to show from their Cup outings and that's got to leave an element of doubt in Steve McCormack's team, especially as they were expected to do so well after taking the Championship honours and reaching the Northern Rail Final last year.

At this level the grounds are very different from Super League and that affects the way players prepare

At this season it's all about building success. And Karl Harrison's Batley Bulldogs are barking up the right tree already, whilst early pointers suggest Halifax are going to take some stopping in both the League and Cup.

All clubs work hard with schools both coaching and marketing the game. I recently discovered this week that Northern Rail is taking the Cup to primary schools in partnership with the clubs.

> Not only is rugby league on the agenda on these Momentum Tours, the kids also get to learn about rail safety and the dangers of trespassing on railway tracks.

The special assemblies are for pupils aged 7 -11, which is just the right age for their impressionable minds to learn lessons for life.

Well done Northern Rail on a cool idea.

Barnett back from drug ban with Sheffield

SHEFFIELD Eagles coach Mark Aston believes winger star Richie Barnett can rebuild his career at the Championship club.

The ex-Hull, Warrington and Salford winger has signed a one-year deal at the Eagles after his two year doing ban ended at midnight on Sunday.

Aston says the player – who blamed confusion over a herbal supplement for his ban – has a point to prove.

"What has happened in the past doesn't take you forward and we are looking at what is happening now and going forward," said Aston.

"Richie wants to go back to the Super League and if we can help him do that and he can help us along the way then everybody wins."

Barnett tested positive for a performance-enhancing drug in 2007.

A sample taken when he was playing for Warrington revealed higher than normal testosterone/epitestosterone level - similar to that found in the 2006 Tour de France doping scandal.

The player blamed a herbal supplement he was taking and he was allowed to carry on playing, joining Salford Reds, while further tests were conducted.

An innocent explanation was not found and he was banned following an RFL hearing on 15 February 2008. The

ban ran out at midnight last Sunday.

Aston said: "I don't want to dwell on the rights of the case against Richie – I want to look at what Richie can do for Sheffield Eagles.

"The opportunity has come up to sign a player who has played in the Super League and scored plenty of tries - we're delighted that Richie has agreed to sign."

Barnett, now 28, had a high tries-togames ratio - 40 tries in 69 Super League appearances for Hull, Warrington and Salford.

Barnett has been working as a personal fitness trainer. He was due to train this week and could make his return at Oldham today.

LEIGH have taken full advantage of the new dual registration rules by signing four Super League

starlets on loan.

The Centurions have swooped for three of Warrington Wolves' top young talents, including 2009 Challenge Cup final winner Tyrone McCarthy.

The young loose forward is joined at the Leigh Sports Village by fellow back rowers Matty Blythe and Lee Mitchell. Coach lan Millward has also raided former club St Helens for prop forward Jacob Emmitt.

The four players, all aged 21, add real strength to the Centurions' pack for the upcoming Championship campaign, although Blythe has also been known to operate in the centres.

Of the quartet, Mitchell is the most experienced having already racked up 30 top flight Super

League appearances for the Wolves.

"I'd like to thank both Warrington and St Helens for their co-operation, in making these players available to us," said Centurions boss Millward.

"The four players are going to be training with us and their clubs. Obviously our depth isn't long so they could be vital to us in having them available."

The dual registration contracts mean the youngsters can still play for either team this season. They will turn out for the Centurions when not included in Mick Potter or Tony Smith's Super League sides.

Wolves boss Smith said: "We are pleased with the arrangement in place with Leigh, and look forward to seeing these young players develop through the dual registration system."

"We have showed our progression from pre-season to the game against Leigh where defensively we were very good.


"Leigh have notable former Super League players in their ranks and a coach in lan Millward who has a big reputation in both NRL and Super League, so it was a positive start for us.







Last Sunday's game at London Skolars was a long day, but a good one as we came away with a 68-0 win and, just as importantly, no fresh injury problems.


As I highlighted in the press after the game, I thought Sean Penkywicz's performance was a real bright spot for us. He looks like he is getting back to the form we all know he is capable







The talented centre has a chequered history in the game, being sacked by Salford in 2008 after being handed a 12-month jail sentence.

Reid – who had previously had spells with Leeds, Hunslet, Gateshead, York, Barrow, St Helens, Halifax, Castleford, Widnes, Keighley and Sheffield – rejoined the Eagles following his early release in May that year and then spent time with Batley Bulldogs last season.

Hornets have also handed a trial to outside back Chris Humphreys, who is a free agent following his release from Bradford Bulls. At 21, he is now too old to play in the new Super League Under 20s academy competition.

TOULOUSE Olympique boss Carlos Zalduendo tips his side for sixth place in this year's Co-operative Championship.

He believes his side will just qualify for a play-off place recognising the strengthening of sides like Widnes, Leigh and Featherstone with dual-license signings.

He appears to have agreed with the Catalans Dragons to take some of their players but their policy presently is only to take up that option when injuries occur. Zalduendo has faith in their present line-up to deliver the goods.

Coach Gilles Dumas said that on last season's showing only seventeen or so of his players were of the required level. He brought on board Yoan Tisseyre a young back rower from Lezignan and the winger Carlos Mendes from Lyon towards the end of the last campaign and in the close season has added another back rower Simon Worrall on loan from Leeds, three

quarter Vincent Duport from the Dragons and another Catalan prop Romain Mencarini from St. Esteve.

Both Worrall and Duport are young players with Super League pedigree. The Leeds loanee played against Catalans in last year's semi final as did Duport who grabbed a hat trick of tries at Headingley.

The powerful former Avignon junior played nearly fifty games for the Dragons since his debut in 2007 but wants to play more regularly as does the Yorkshire lad. Mencarini is a very promising 20-year -old front rower who just couldn't get a look in at the Dragons. He like the other two should benefit hugely playing Championship football on a weekly basis.

Additionally Toulouse believe that the experience acquired in their debut season plus these new faces will make the difference in 2010. They've already had two tough pre-season games under their belt and are some distance ahead of where they were twelve months ago. Dewsbury at home will be a good first test.



'MR RUGBY LEIGH' is the story of Tommy Sale, a rugby league hero, who has devoted more than 80 years of his life to the sport whether as a player, coach, administrator or fan.

Since his initial involvement as a scoreboard operator for his beloved Leigh at the age of ten, Tommy's enthusiasm for the 13-a-side code has rarely wavered. Told with characteristic warmth and remarkable modesty, Mr Rugby Leigh encapsulates the life of a true rugby league legend.


