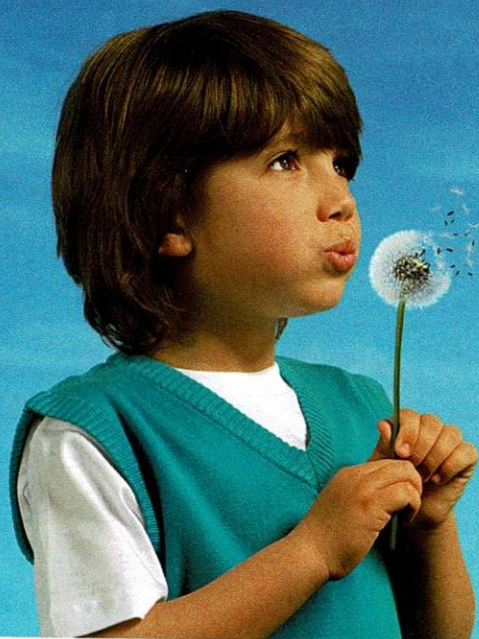

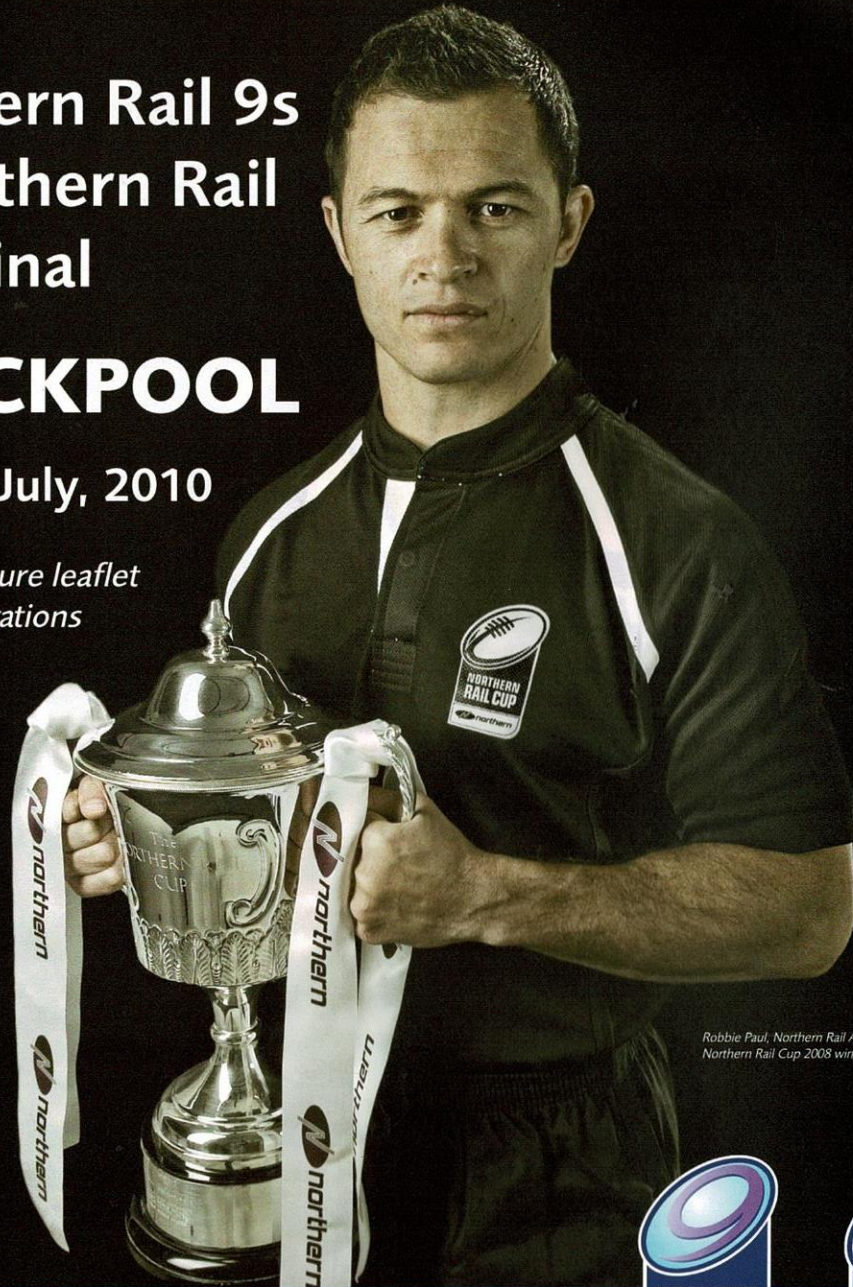

The Co-operative Championships kick-off with a bang this weekend with ten matches scheduled across the two divisions which provided such great entertainment last year.

The official launch for the competitions took place in Manchester last week with the help of Coronation Street stars past and present Lucy-Jo Hudson, Michelle Keegan and Helen Flanagan and the pictures from the event generated some great national coverage for the sport.

The theme of the launch revolved around the news that a higher percentage of female viewers are tuning into rugby league than football or cricket on Sky Sports but this wasn't the only positive statistic regarding last season's TV coverage.

By the end of the 2009 season more than a million people had watched The Co-operative Championships live on Sky Sports and overall viewing figures were up by 31 per cent on the previous year.

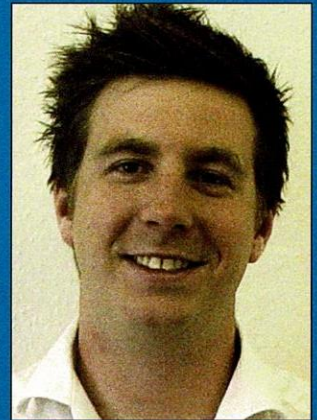
The regular Thursday night TV exposure has certainly been a great platform for the competitions and the Leigh Sporting Village Stadium is a fitting venue to kick off coverage of the 2010 season with champions Barrow Raiders taking on the Centurions live on Sky Sports.

Finally, I'm sure all rugby league fans will wish Neath-based South Wales Scorpions well as they launch their Championship One campaign at The Gnoll against Workington Town, on Sunday.

# BASIL'S HOME SWEET HOME

**He's experienced a lot of the highs and a few lows too, but the irrepressible Ian Millward is never short of a word or too, as TOM COATES found out!**

**"**It's like being at a new club!" said new Centurions' coach Ian Millward on his return to Leigh. "The stadium's fantastic and the training facilities are ten times better than they were before.

"There were always doubts

about whether the old ground was able to take us to the next stage if we were good enough.

"Obviously that's not an issue anymore!"

Ian Millward's first spell as Leigh coach began in 1998. The short time he spent with the Leythers saw them evolve from being a struggling first division side into candidates for a Super League spot.

"They'd only won something like four games over the whole year," said Millward on his arrival in the town.

"They were a young team eager to learn and I was keen to make a good impression myself, so it was a good fit. I really enjoyed it.

"Seeing the team start to win, the crowds building up and the players enjoying their rugby league was great. They were averaging crowds of 700 a game when I arrived and it was up to 3,000 when I left which shows you far we came."

Millward then replaced Ellery Hanley at St Helens and led the men from Knowsley Road to two Super League titles, two Challenge Cup final victories and success in the World Club Challenge.

"They're all special," he said of his silverware haul during his spell with the Saints.

"When you win one, you want to experience it again and I was lucky that I was able to be a part of such a successful era. To win five trophies over five and a half years is a great achievement to me."

Ian's spell with St Helens was brought to an abrupt end in 2005 following allegations of misconduct. He didn't have to wait long for his next appointment however, local rivals Wigan made their intentions clear and Millward was appointed head coach of the Warriors within a fortnight.

But the man with the nickname 'Basil' paid the price for Wigan's poor form and he was sacked in 2006 following a run of results that had left the club languishing near the bottom of the table.

His departure from Wigan prompted a return to Australia where he was appointed assistant to Graham Murray at North Queensland Cowboys before replacing Murray as head coach for the closing stages of the 2008 season.

He moved on to Canberra Raiders at the end of the season to assist David Furner before Leigh came calling again. Eventually Millward negotiated a release from his contract with the NRL club to secure a second spell with the Centurions.

**"**I wanted to get back to the NRL to continue my education as a coach and to challenge myself," he added. "That competition is the 'coal face' of rugby league and you've got a cross-section of fantastic players.

"I wanted to experience it and, I think doing that helped me develop knowledge-wise and also re-ignited my enthusiasm for the sport."

"My three children still live in the UK," he explained on his reasons for returning to Leigh.

**Coming back to his spiritual home of Leigh was about far more than just Rugby League for Ian Millward**

"I wanted to spend more time with them, plus my wife's parents live in the area so it wasn't an entirely rugby league based decision."

"Arthur Thomas, who took me to St Helens, is with Leigh now. He's become a close friend of the family and played a big part in the success I had at St Helens.

"He's keen to move the club forward and his involvement at the club was another of the reasons I chose to come back.

"The infrastructure that's in place now, with the new stadium and everything, is not only positive for Leigh, but positive for Rugby League as a whole."

The Centurions endured a tough time in 2009 and it was only a last minute reprieve, brought about by the off-field problems at Gateshead, that preserved Leigh's status as a Championship club.

The let-off has given Leigh a second bite at the cherry, as relegation to Championship 1 would have almost certainly spelt the end of the Centurions' Super League ambitions.

"Demotion would have put our Super League ambitions in severe jeopardy," admitted Millward.

"The form last year reflected where we finished in the table," he continued.

"Having said that though, we've kept a majority of last season's players on and I've been impressed by their attitude, their enthusiasm and also their desire to become better players."

"They did deserve to go down and we were lucky to avoid that but I've been pleasantly surprised with the way the players have gone about their business so far."

He and his side are chomping at the bit to get started with the league season and the Centurions coach is optimistic of the side's prospects, despite last season's

struggle.

"For us, it's all about performance at the moment. If we can be more consistent than we were last year then we can give ourselves a great chance.

"If each individual improves as a player and if the team can perform consistently, who knows where that'll drive us to. It's not about the end-product yet.

"It's just about getting the right processes in place for now – we can look at taking rewards from that in the future."





## Girls allowed in our family friendly game

A higher percentage of female viewers are tuning into Rugby League than football or cricket according to newly released viewing figures from Sky Sports, which show that the sport has a female audience share of 35% compared to Premiership Football at 29% and Ashes cricket at 25%.

To celebrate the findings Coronation Street stars past and present, Michelle Keegan, Helen Flanagan and Lucy-Jo Hudson, shared their love of Rugby League last week as they brought some glamour to the official launch of the 2010 Co-operative Championships.

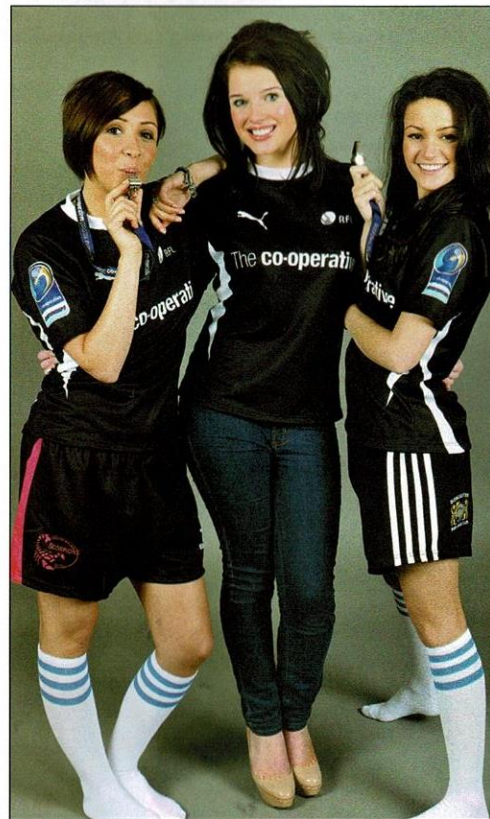

## 2013 World Cup to be 14 teams

TEAMS from more than 20 nations will be given the opportunity to play in the 2013 Rugby League World Cup, the RLIF announced today.

The World Cup will be staged in the UK and will feature 14 nations, two of whom will come from qualifying tournaments in the northern and southern hemispheres. The identity of the 12 teams which will have automatic eligibility for 2013 and those who will be involved in the qualifying process will be revealed later this year.

The proposal for a 14-nation Rugby League World Cup was ratified in Singapore this week at a meeting of the RLIF and welcomed by Chairman Colin Love, who expressed his belief that the tournament would

elevate international Rugby League to new levels.

"We are delighted to have ratified this proposal for a 14-nation Rugby League World Cup which was unanimously supported by RLIF delegates," said Love.

"This year will see the Four Nations in Australia and New Zealand build on the success of the 2008 Rugby World Cup and 2009 Four Nations and going forward I am confident that in 2013 we will see a tournament that will successfully showcase international Rugby League to a worldwide audience.

"The format reflects Rugby League's increased participation around the world and provides a wonderful opportunity for the finest athletes in any sport to prove themselves on the greatest stage of all."

# who will be the 2010 IRONMAN

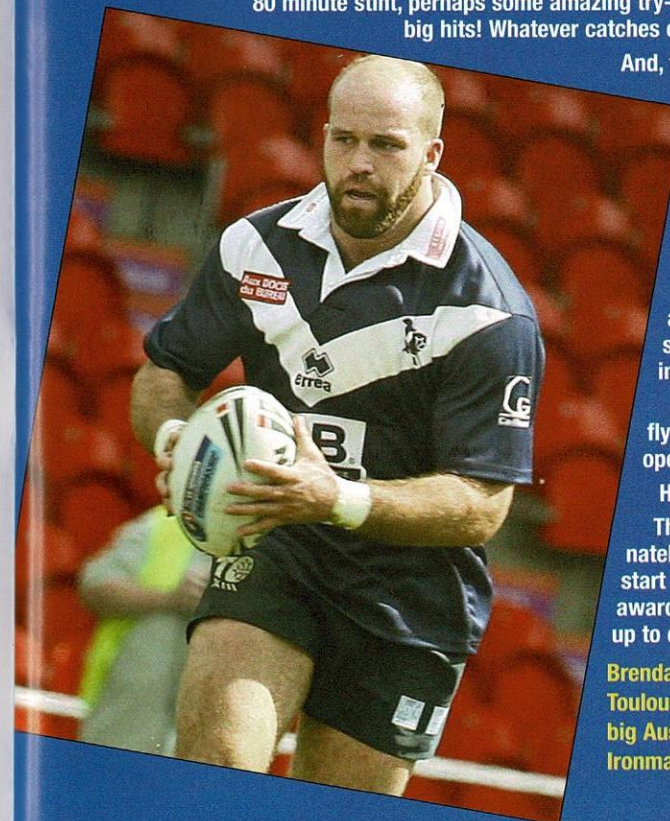

# STAN IS THE MAN

Rugby League doesn't have many living legends, players who are adored and admired across the game by fans, whoever they support. But STANLEY GENE is one iconic member of the RL family who certainly fits into that category. Despite being at the back end of a stellar career, Stan still has lots to offer his latest club Halifax. He spoke to Game On's TOM COATES

Having arrived on these shores in 1995, Stanley Gene has gone on to carve out a career in British Rugby League that has seen him feature for six different clubs – becoming a firm fan's favourite at every one. Stan will see out his playing days with Halifax, bringing the curtain down on a career that has seen him win a World Club Challenge, represent his country and develop a reputation as one of the toughest players to ever play the sport.

It all began when his performances for Papua New Guinea during the 1995 World Cup attracted the attention of Hull KR. The East Hull club offered the young Kumul a contract and Gene's decision to leave his native country to play for the Robins proved to be the start of something special for both parties.

"It was really scary coming here," admitted Gene talking about his arrival in Hull. "I lived up in the mountains where you never saw traffic lights or roundabouts or more than two cars.

"It was a big step to take but I'm glad I made the decision."

Stan went on to make 108 appearances for Hull KR, picking up a Silk Cut Challenge Plate winners medal along the way, before signing for Gateshead at the end of 1999.

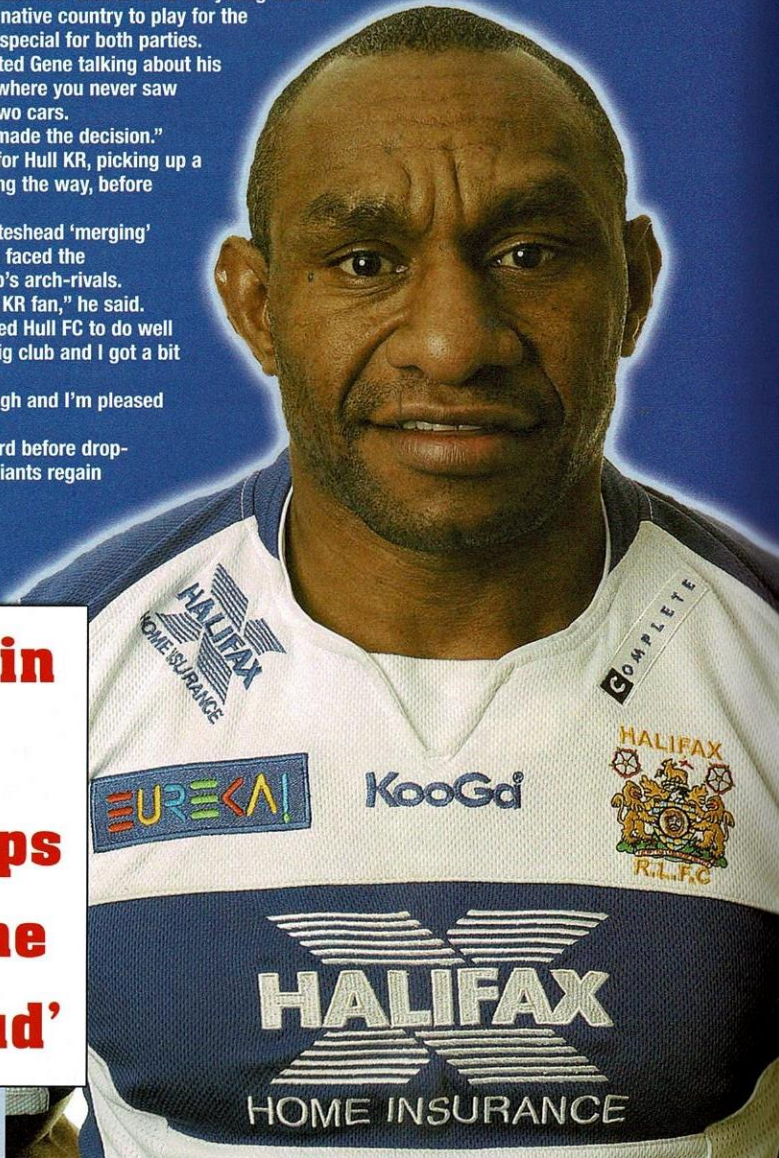
Fate's a funny thing though and, with Gateshead 'merging' with Hull FC in time for the 2000 season, he faced the prospect of turning out for his previous club's arch-rivals.

"I always have and always will be a Hull KR fan," he said.

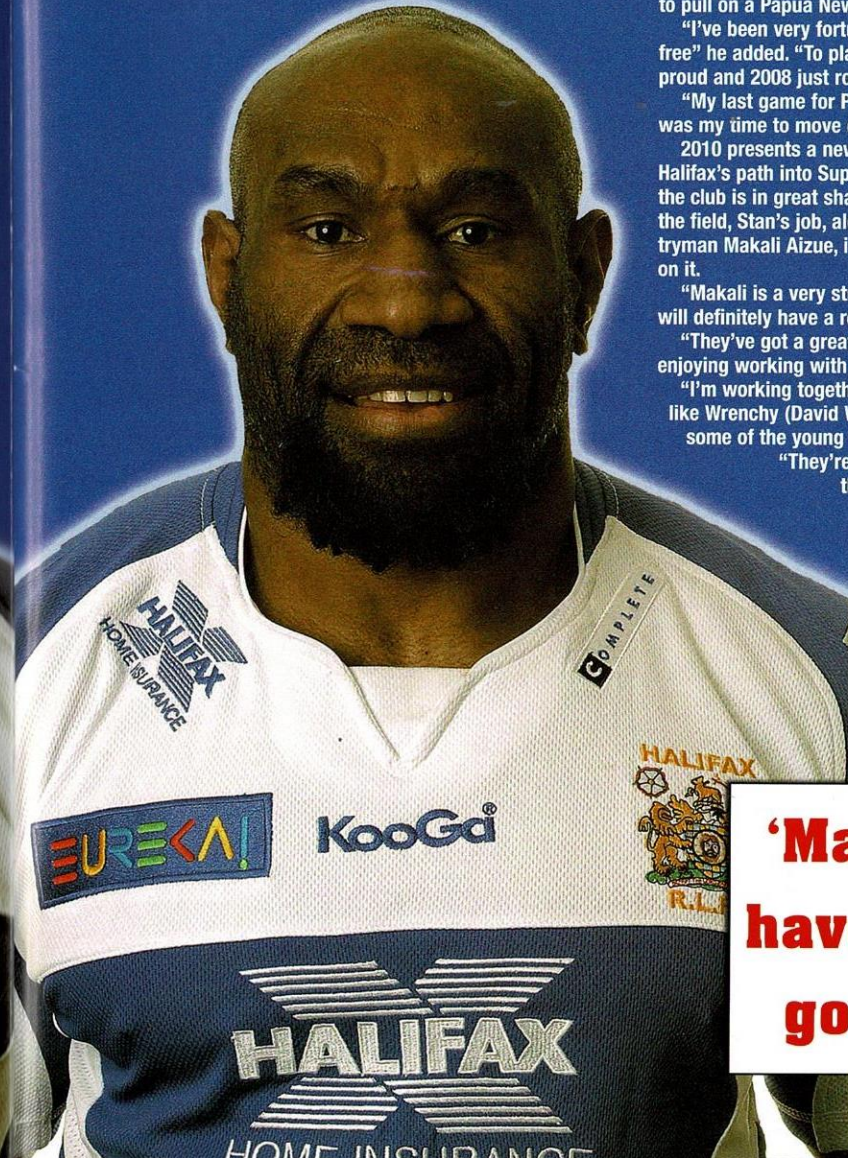
"But, at the same time, I've always wanted Hull FC to do well and Hull City (soccer) to do well. FC are a big club and I got a bit of stick when I first went there."

"I really enjoyed my time with them though and I'm pleased with the contributions I made."

Gene spent three seasons at the Boulevard before dropping down a division to help Huddersfield Giants regain promotion from the NFP.

He scored 28 tries in 27 appearances that season before going on to play 68 more times for the Giants in Super League.

The diminutive Kumul's next career move took him to Bradford for one season before being reunited with his beloved Hull KR who had just won promotion to the Super League.

"It's a promise I made to the club when I left," said Gene on his 'homecoming'. "Neil Huddell is a good friend of mine and we used to joke that I'd be the first player he'd sign if he ever became chairman. A couple of years later, they got promoted and I ended up back there.

"I was really happy to return, Justin Morgan understood my strengths and fitted me into his side and for that I'm grateful."

Stan spent three seasons with Hull KR, bringing his total appearances for the club to 173 and cementing his status as a legend among the Rovers' faithful.

"They're like family to me," said Gene. "Some of them have been talking about organising a bus full of supporters to come and watch a Halifax game."

"I always check on how they're doing and I hope they can continue to grow as a club and move on to bigger and better things."

An accomplished career at club level only tells half the story of Stan's life as a rugby league player who has represented his country at three separate World Cups. He retired from the international scene following the 2008 tournament in Australia and will go down as one of the greatest ever players to pull on a Papua New Guinea jersey.

"I've been very fortunate in that I've stayed fit and injury free" he added. "To play in three World Cups makes me very proud and 2008 just rounded it off perfectly.

"My last game for PNG was very emotional for me but it was my time to move on."

2010 presents a new challenge for him, namely to secure Halifax's path into Super League come franchise year. Whilst the club is in great shape for a Super League application off the field, Stan's job, along with fellow new signing and countryman Makali Aizue, is to spearhead the club's progression on it.

"Makali is a very strong and powerful guy," said Gene. "He will definitely have a really good year.

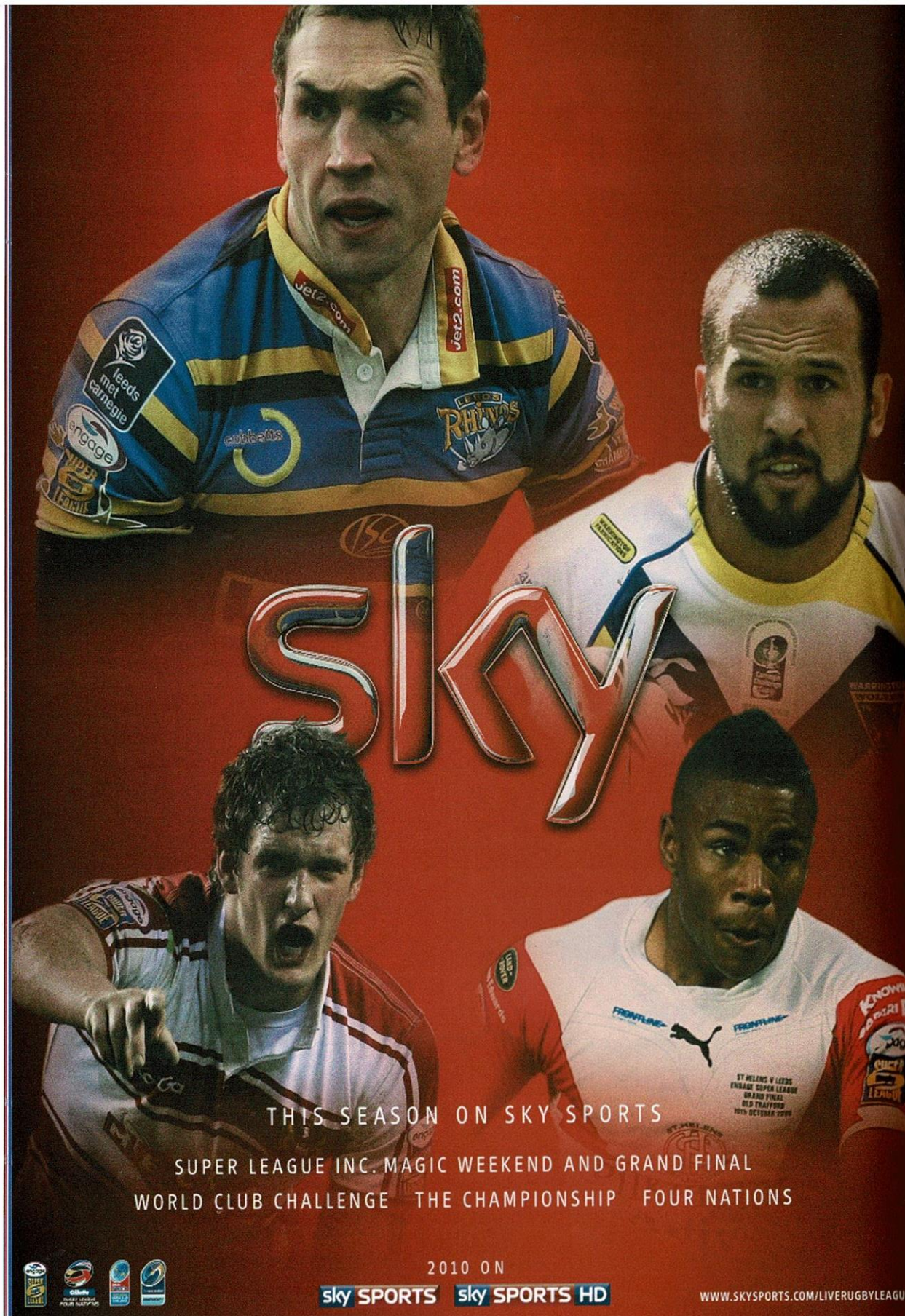
"They've got a great balance over at Halifax and I'm really enjoying working with the younger players.

"I'm working together with a couple of the other older ones like Wrenchy (David Wrench) and Dave (Larder) to bring some of the young lads through."

"They're all great guys and I want to help get them into Super League.

"If we can keep our heads down and dig deep over the next couple of years then you might see Halifax back in the big league."

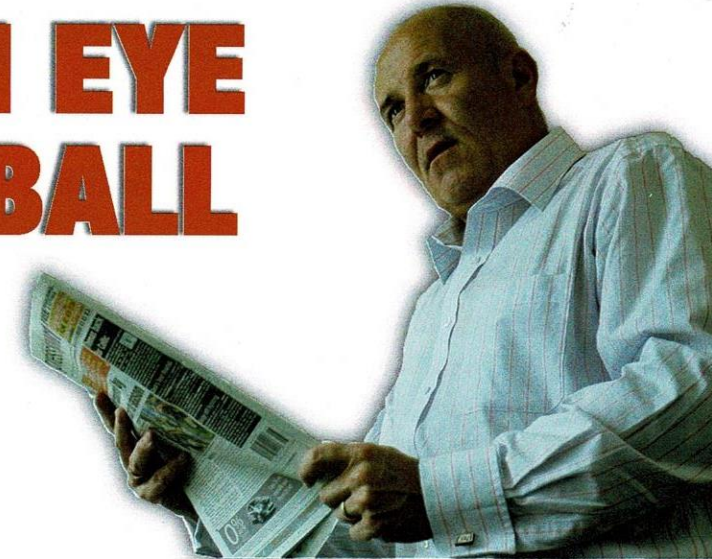

# KEEP AN EYE ON THE BALL

**W**RITING in last week's edition about the season when Workington coach Gary Charlton and I were on opposing clubs in the Winfield Cup in Australia, and looking at today's Player Profile with Halifax hero Dave Larder, got me to thinking about just how small a world we live in.

You may have heard of the theory of 'Six Degrees of Separation' which argues that if all the people you know are one step away from you, and all the people each of them know are two steps away, then by the time you get to step six, you've 'touched' every person on the planet.

Now I like this idea, especially if it brings me into the orbit of, say, Angelina Jolie and Carmen Elektra, although knowing my luck I'd end up stuck with one of the Roly Polys and Ken Livingstone. I suppose in fairness the girls from the Roly Polys might be great company – I might even be able to keep up with them on the dance floor – but 10 minutes in a lift with 'Red' Ken Livingstone? I'd rather have all my teeth out thanks. Without the anaesthetic.

Although I've seen Dave Larder play many times over the years we've never met, although as an amateur player at Dudley Hill I came into his dad Phil's orbit once or twice, and as a journalist have interviewed him in his role with the England Rugby Union team, when Leeds Rhinos invited Phil, Joe Lydon and then-England RU coach Andy Robinson along to Headingley for a joint workout. I know, I know, in the cemeteries of small former pit villages and industrial towns across the north, granddads and great-granddads alike were spinning like tops ... how times change.

But how I first met Phil Larder gives the proof to that Six Degrees of Separation theory. Six? At the rate the world's shrinking, it might be down to five or four before too long. I reckon it would have been the autumn of 1983 and for reasons we don't need to go into here, I was living in the beach community of Belmont Shore, just outside Long Beach in California, and working on the door of the local sports bar, Legends. It was owned by a Widnes bloke, John Morris (small world?) and an All-Star offensive lineman for the Los Angeles Rams, Dennis Harrah.

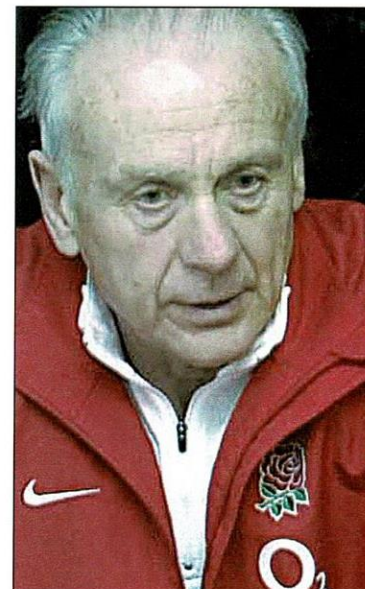
Now I'd got the job simply by phoning the bar and asking if there were any rugby sides in the locality. A thick Yorkshire accent answered the phone and before you knew it I had both the stand-off shirt – and the doorman's job – of ex-Headingley RU star Paul Gray who was heading back to England after a stint out there.

A 'small world' incident again, eh? But having a beer after work one night I got talking to another Englishman who was on a 'working holiday' and staying with another British ex-pat pal of mine by the name of Eddie Robinson. This visitor had been despatched to Los Angeles by the Rugby Football League apparently to study the training and coaching methods of what we call 'gridiron' but the Yanks simply refer to as 'football'.

This was still the early '80s, but after the traumatic maulings we'd received at the hands of both the '78 and '82 touring Australians, the masters of the British game were desperately looking around for answers. Professionalism loomed...

The bloke's name was Phil Larder and the reports he compiled as a result of that process were to kickstart many of the modifications that literally changed the face of not just how Rugby League is played in Britain, but how our players regard themselves as athletes.

His 'little' boy David would have been a primary school laddie back in those days, possibly some years yet off his first black eye or bust lip (and I will politely refrain from suggesting whether such rites of passage were received or administered!) Still, you can bet your bottom dollar he was brought up with no shortage of knowledge about our great game. And it's not surprising to see that he wants to go into coaching after he finishes at Fax. He certainly has the pedigree.

# Going 'co-op' was lifeline

A lot of semi-professional Rugby League clubs have been close to the brink over the past couple of seasons – and times are still tough out there. When the situation struck at Rochdale Hornets, the fans took matters into their own hands. Chairman Mark Wynn tells TOM COATES why going co-operative can be the way forward for others



“You can’t count on a sugar daddy to dip his hand into his pocket every time you need bailing out.” Those are the words of Hornets RL chairman Mark Wynn, who believes that the sport’s only professional co-operative club will be the first of many, with several clubs struggling to stay afloat over the past couple of seasons.

“Also, if their business hits a sticky patch then the club hits a sticky patch,” he adds, in honest appraisal of the financial and economic situation many sporting organisations are finding themselves in – all the way from the Glazer family and their debt-laden Manchester United, through to the under-threat Portsmouth in football’s Premiership, right to the grass roots of rugby league.

“I doubt that we’ll be the only co-operative run club in a few years given the current climate.”

Rochdale Hornets found themselves on the brink of extinction at the end of the 2008 season, with supporters rallying round to ensure the town would continue have a team to support.

“The old club went into administration and the supporters group that was around at the time entered into dialogue with the RFL and a group called Supporters Direct,” said Wynn. “Supporters Direct is an umbrella organisation that helps fans to get involved with the running of the their club.

“The only other interested party was Rochdale AFC but, with the shared stadium, we didn’t feel this was the best way forward,” he added.

Local businessman and long-time supporter Paul Ormerod stumped up the cash to get the Hornets up and running again, on the proviso that things would be very different this time around.

“Every supporter can pay £20 to become a member,” said Wynn. “And a board of directors is elected to run the club on their behalf.

“Membership entitles you to one share and one vote and we have regular meetings where shareholders can have their say on how the club is run.

“It’s much more ‘hands on’ than other clubs run by shareholders,” Wynn continued. “No member has invested a significant amount of money so there’s nobody wanting control.”

The Hornets’ chairman is aware of the restraints the

structure places the club under though. “Because, we don’t have a ‘sugar daddy’ we have to be a lot tighter with our finances,” adds Wynn. “We can’t afford to speculate on big name players in the hope that they’ll draw in the crowds.

“We’re looking at keeping the books balanced rather than taking a punt on something. In a way we’re taking the club back to how it used to be run.

“Every team used to be run by a committee and had direct links with the local community. We’re hoping to re-establish this relationship and engage with the town – I think that’s what every rugby league club needs to do,” he continued. “We had fallen off the radar in Rochdale but the majority of our members now are locally based.

“It’s almost a perfect fit really as Rochdale is the birthplace of the co-operative movement. We have a five year plan to show people that this is a credible way of doing things.

“The new club launched just four days before our first match in 2009 so it was a bit of a mad scramble. We will make mistakes along the way but we learnt lots last season and hope to operate at a profit this year.”

Wynn hopes that if the club can stabilise itself off the park, the results will start to come on it.

“If we perform well behind the scenes then the team will perform well. And any income we generate will be used to develop local players,” he added.

“We spent a few seasons without fielding any local lads, there are five or six now. The local amateur scene has been sadly neglected. We hope to address that over the next couple of years.”

One man who echoes the Chairman’s sentiments is head coach John Stankevitch, who joined the club during the close season.

“The atmosphere here’s fantastic to be honest,” said Stankevitch who succeeds Darren Shaw as head coach at Spotland.

“I didn’t expect anything more than what I’ve been given,” he continued.

“Mike Banks, who I knew from Widnes, is the club’s chief

executive and that’s helped me to find my way around the club. I’ve tried to bring my own approach, my own ethics and just create a professional environment,” said the former Saints prop forward.

“The club as whole, not just on the field, is moving in the right direction,” he continued. “If we build slowly and not try to run before we can walk then we’ll do just fine.”

Stankevitch can reflect on what’s been on a difficult start to the season but he has high hopes for the league campaign.

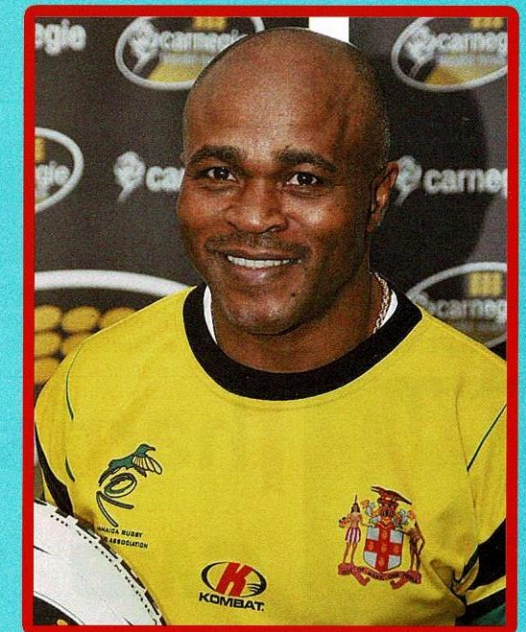
“I’m disappointed that we haven’t qualified for the next stage of the Northern Rail Cup but I feel as though we’ve made progress over the last four weeks. The game against York was winnable and at times we’ve been our worst enemy.

“We do have a young squad, and we’ve only had four months to get things in place.”

Despite the relatively inexperienced nature of the side, the Hornets’ coach remains defiant about his side’s prospects.

“We’d like to win our games and improve as the season progresses,” said Stankevitch. “Success for me would be to qualify for the play-offs and make the final.”

Our defence was excellent, but as I said in the Press, our attack certainly needs some more work.

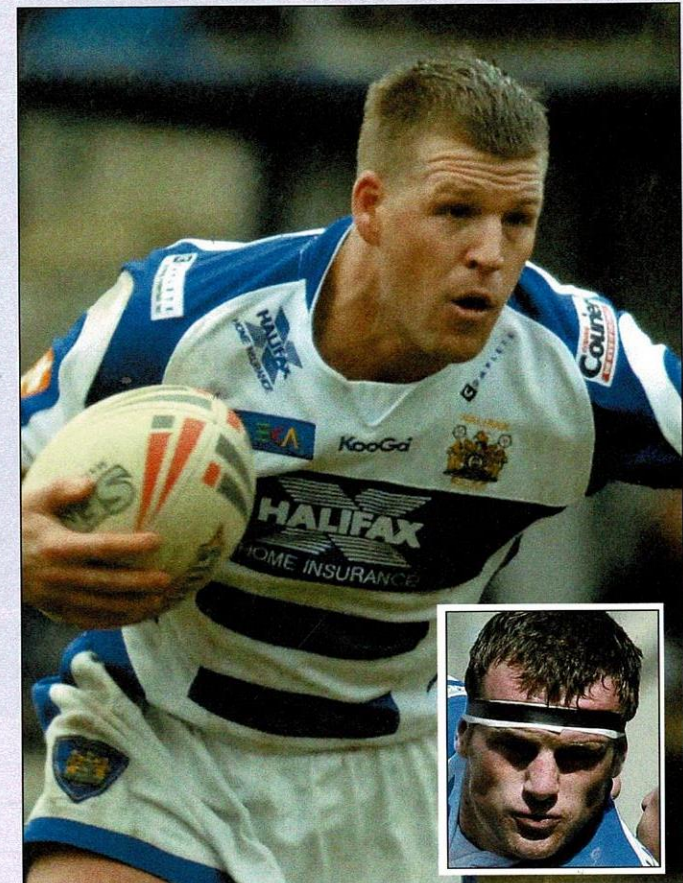
Finding that improvement has not been made any easier by having our final NRC game against Hunslet snowed off last weekend, with the weather continuing to hit our training too.

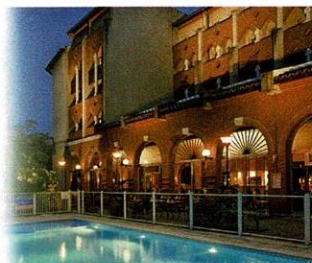

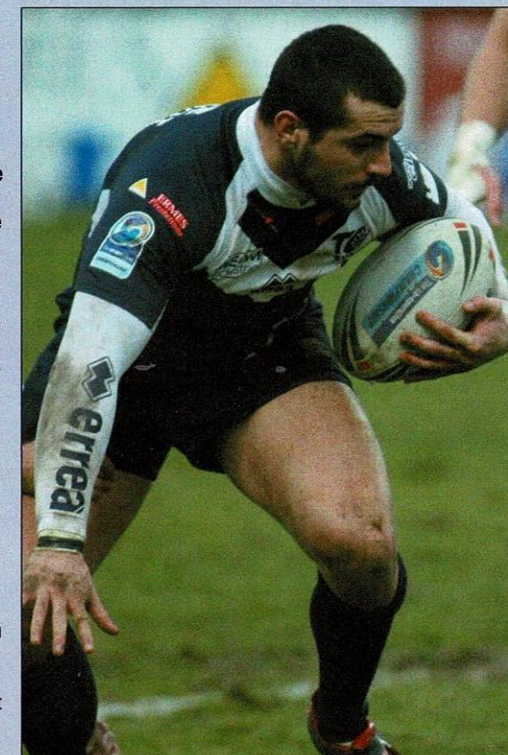

We've certainly made great strides in terms of performance over the past month and we have arguably had the toughest set of fixtures in this year's group stages of the NRC.

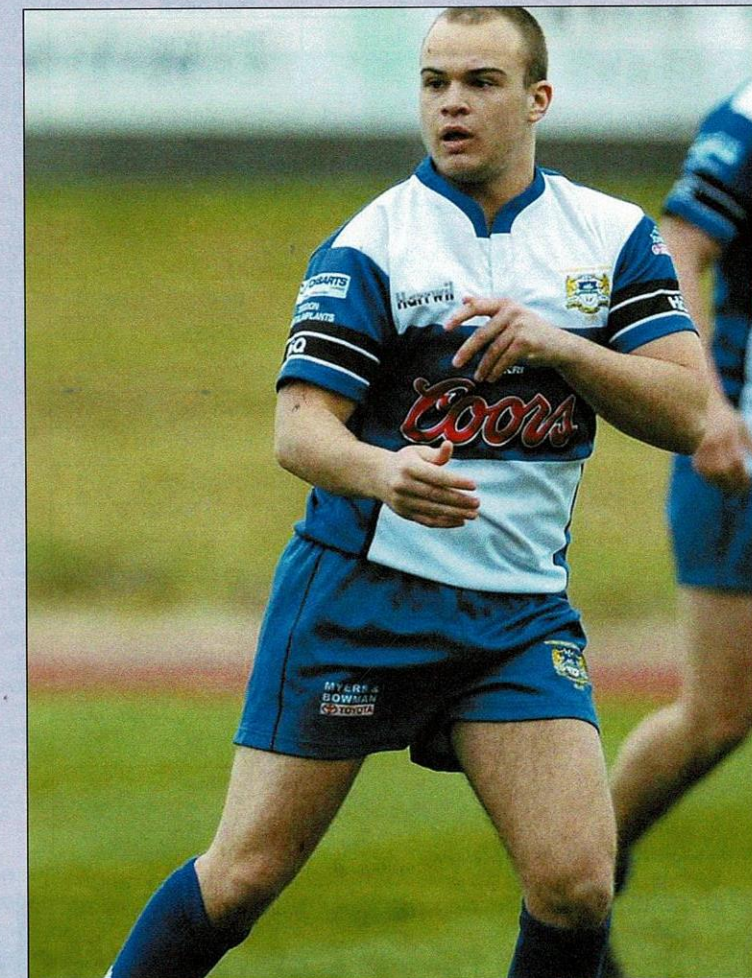
Today, I hope to pick from my first choice 17 and this will no doubt be the starting point for us, looking for performance consistency.

have the ball, they are physically and mentally fatigued from chasing your players around the field, and so offer very little in attack which in turn makes your defensive job easier and more straightforward. This in turn, leaves you more energy in the tank to keep attacking and building pressure, and eventually the dam will burst... or so I hope!

Scorpions players at the anti-doping lecture

SOUTH Wales Scorpions received an anti-doping lecture on Monday evening in preparation for their opening Co-operative Championship 1 fixture against Workington Town.

As Wales' newest professional rugby league side the Scorpions needed to prepare game by knowing exactly what kind of medicines and stimulants are accepted or not in sport and how exactly to combat the use of performance enhancing and recreational drugs.

Dean Hardman, the Operations Manager at the Rugby Football League conducted the lecture, which was filmed by Sky Sports for transmission on their Boots N All programme to highlight how the RFL are conducting their campaign regarding anti-doping in sport.

"The RFL deliver the 100% Me Education Campaign that was developed by the UK Anti-Doping in Sport," he said.

"We deliver this to players across the country at all levels at all the professional clubs so it's important that our players

understand the anti-doping regulations, are informed and educated and can make the right choices."

Ian Gibbons, South Wales Scorpions strength and conditioning coach, said that it was vital for the young Welsh players to have this lecture before they stepped on the field today.

"There are a lot of myths and misinformation out there," said Gibbons.

"So it's important that we had the information directly from the experts. It was good for the players and it was certainly beneficial for the club as a whole. We all got a lot out of it.

"When a player is tested for drugs, he is tested against performance enhancing and recreational drugs.

"The players need to know what they are being tested for and the procedures around drug testing in sport.

"All players and staff need to know exactly what's required of them. It's also all about building a partnership with the anti-doping testers and not working against them."

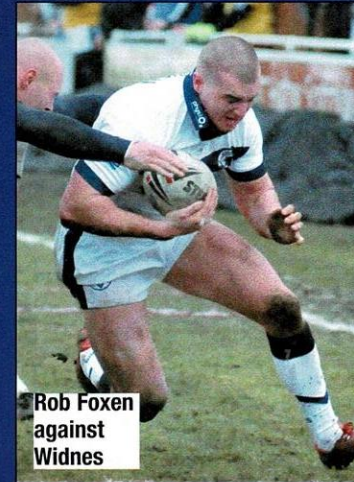

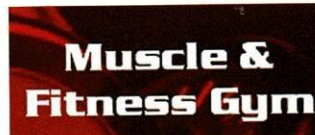

We have tried to give opportunities to as many players as possible in the last couple of weeks to enable us to be as strong as possible for today's league kick-off.

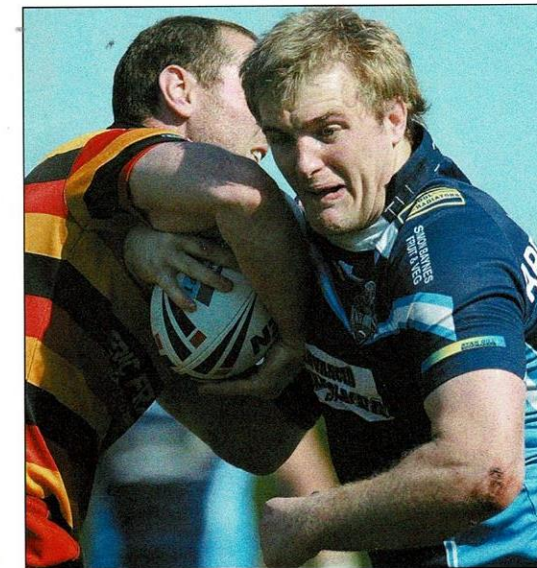
We have definitely prioritised the league over the cup although strong performances in all competitive fixtures are a must and we feel that we are playing ok.

Campbell's second try of the game rounded off what was a magnificent individual display from the 22-year old.

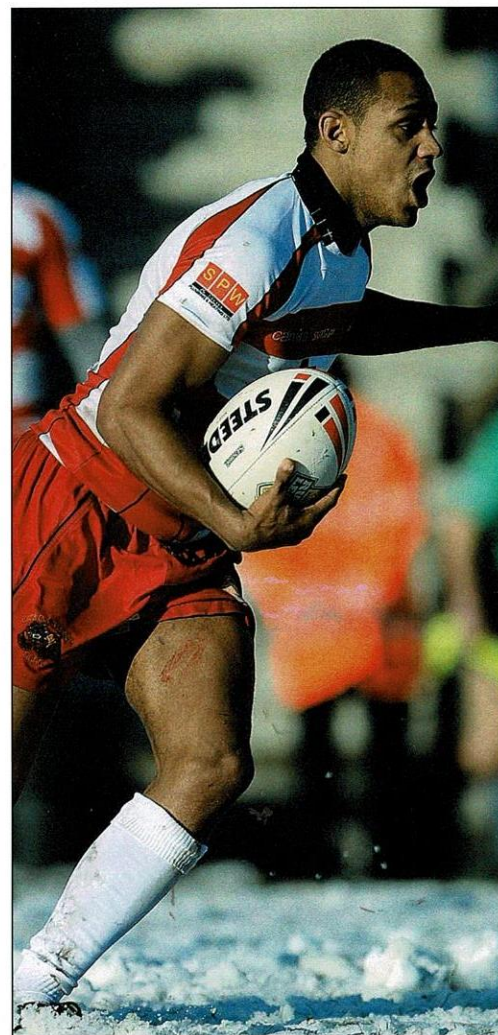
After collecting a kick from Swinton within in his own 10-metre line, Campbell cleverly stepped past four defenders to cross the try line after running the full length of the pitch.

## History looms for students in Cup 3rd round

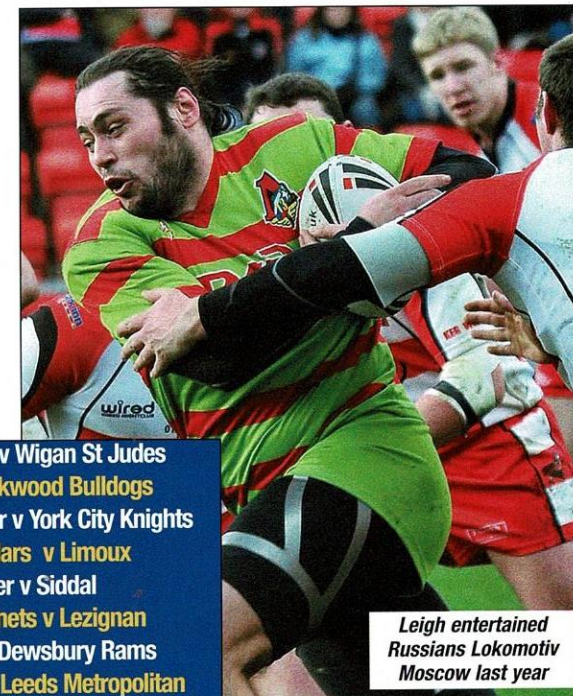

# Rugby League gaming goes to a new level

Rugby League 3  
now on Nintendo wii  
Reviewed by Tom Coates

Due for release in late March, Rugby League 3 represents the sport's first foray into the world of virtual-reality motion-control.

The game, available for the Wii, is the third instalment of the series and the first to be released on Nintendo's ground-breaking system.

The Wii, for those of you unfamiliar with it, is a games console that places emphasis on the usage of hand gestures and physical movement to control the action. With Rugby League 3, the developers have taken the physicality and excitement that makes our sport great and turned it into a video game that is easy to learn but, more importantly, lots and lots of fun.

However, the pick-up-and-playability of this game only tells half the story of a product that is bursting with features. No stone has been left unturned in creating a piece of software that not only accurately portrays our sport on the pitch, but also offers a management mode brimming with options and immersing the player in a world of tactics, injuries, transfers and training regimes.

The previous two offerings perhaps lacked the depth and longevity that makes a good game great. Rugby League 3, on the other hand, has enough in the tank to keep you glued to the screen for years to come. The realism of the game is astounding, players can choose to coach their team and control every game or, in true management style, take care of matters off the pitch and let their squad do the talking on it.

Another bonus for league fans is the amount of clubs available. For the first time, players can select teams from both Championships and the Toyota Cup as well as the NRL, Super League and international scene. The attention to detail in this respect is excellent. All kits, players, logos and likenesses (up to the 2009 season) have been faithfully reproduced in virtual form, giving punters the chance to lead their favourite team to glory from the comfort of their armchair.

The range of available teams is complimented by the choice of 38 stadia, including Headingley, the Galpharm Stadium and the Willows, as well as accurate representations of facilities from France and Australia.

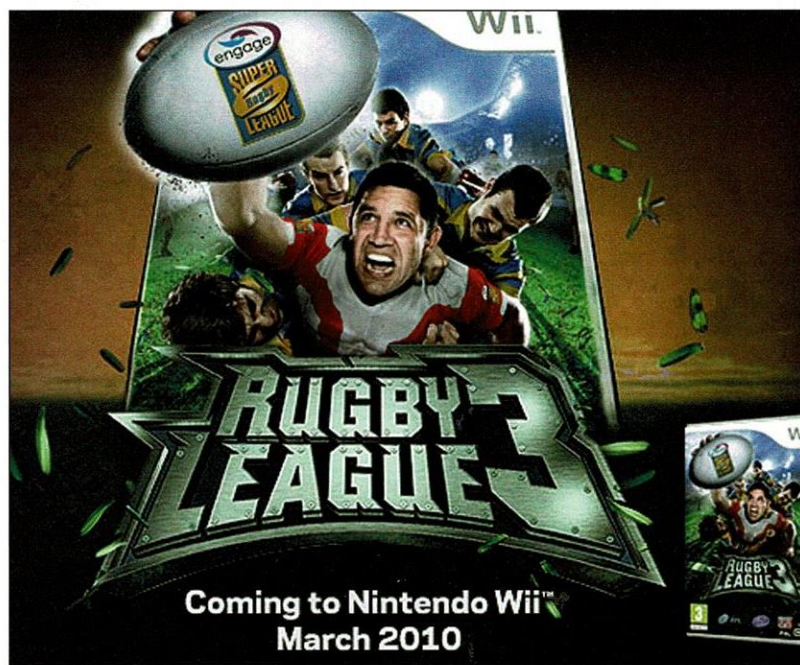
Back on the pitch and on-the-fly tactical changes made at the press of a button mean you can tell your wingers to drop back, tighten up your line defence or throw caution to the wind and look for the interception. Australian voice of rugby league Andrew Voss provides the commentary, a soundtrack complimented by the referee calls coming courtesy of the Wii remote's on-board speaker.

The comprehensive on-board customisation mode allows you to create your own teams, players and competitions. Want to run out at Headingley alongside Kevin Sinfield and Rob Burrow? Now you can! Everything from hair colour and facial features to playing ability and nationality is customisable meaning even the least athletic of us has the chance to pull on a pair of boots and take part in the action.

Up to 8 players can take control at any one time, with the option to use a combination of remotes and standard controllers giving the game that 'arcade feel' and striking the balance between an accurate sport simulator and a game that's fun and easy to play.

With its attention to detail, comprehensive management mode and the sheer enjoyment of running, tackling and passing with the flick of the wrist, Rugby League 3 truly is the game that fans of the sport have been waiting for.

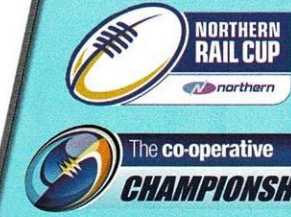

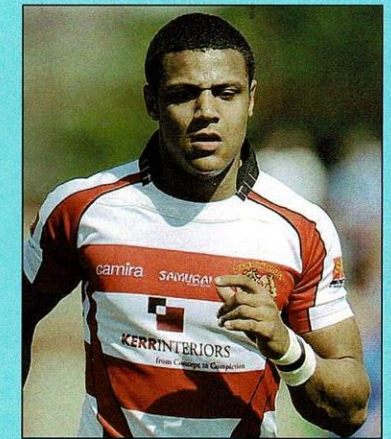

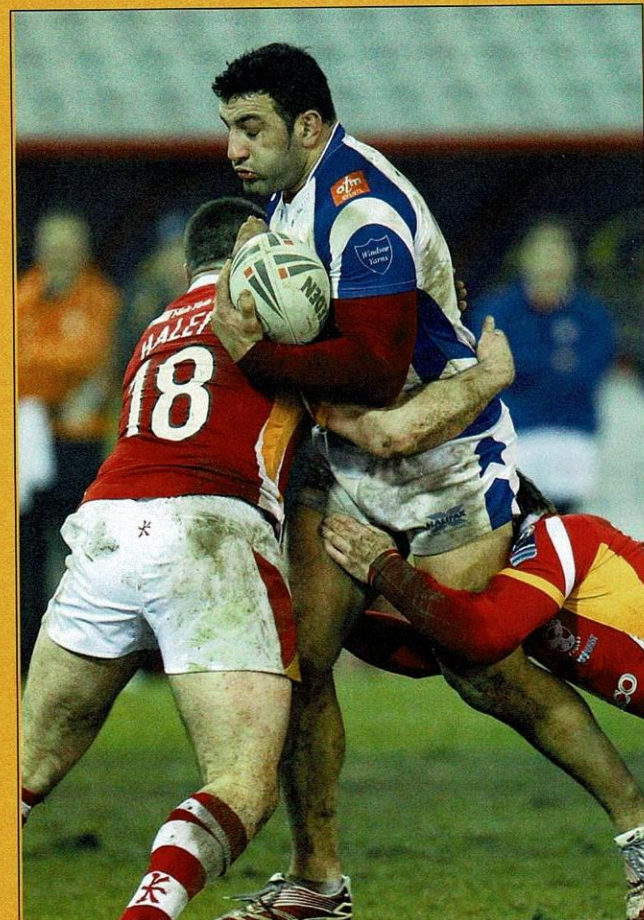


# Frozen out again!

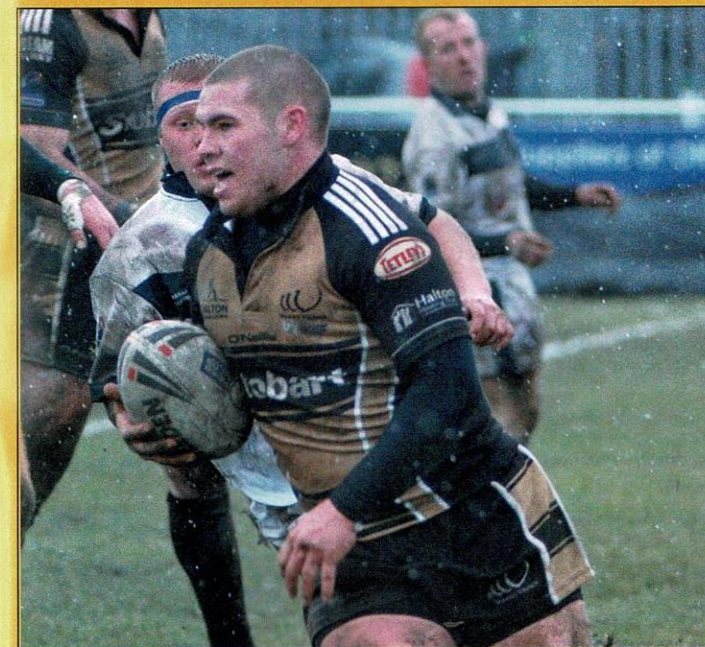

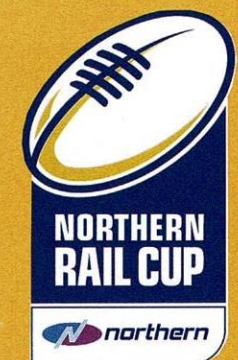
