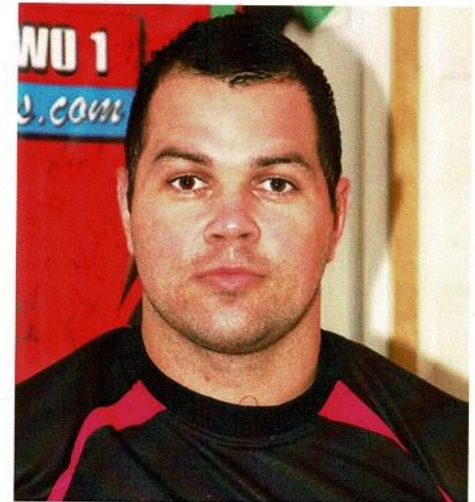
ANTHONY SEIBOLD'S FAMOUS BLOG

WHO ARE OLDHAM ROUGHYEDS?

With three League Championships, one First Division title, three Challenge Cup wins, seven Lancashire League triumphs and nine Lancashire Cups to their name, Oldham are one of rugby league's most famous names.

As one of the original 22 clubs to start the Northern Rugby Union in 1895, success arrived quickly for the Lancashire outfit.

They won their first League title by heading the First Division in 1905 and further League success followed in 1910 and 1911, when they twice beat Wigan in the Championship final. Indeed, in 1910 they won three trophies, adding the Lancashire League and Lancashire Cup to their sideboard.

As for the Challenge Cup, though, it was not until 1925 that they followed their 1899 success, finishing runners up three times (in 1907, 1912 and 1924) before laying the ghost to rest when they beat Hull KR 16-3 in the final at Headingley.

They lost in the Challenge Cup final again the following year to Swinton but gained revenge in

1927 when their fourth final appearance in a row ended in a 26-7 romp at Wigan.

It was another 30 years before they enjoyed more glory, the signing of players like Alan Davies, John Etty Sid Little and Derek 'Rocky' Turner leading to their last Championship title in 1957, along with numerous county honours.

However, that was their last major success, although they have won the Second Division three times in 1964, 1982 and 1988 and the Divisional Premiership twice, in 1988 and 1990.

They added Bears to their name as one of the founding members of the Super League in 1996, but they were relegated in 1997 and, to add insult to injury, they went bankrupt as well.

However, they re-formed as Oldham Roughyeds in 1997 and reached the Northern Ford Premiership Grand Final in 2001, only to lose to Widnes. They were relegated in 2006, though, after only one win and have been there since, despite reaching the Grand Final twice.

him feel welcome. He does however need a haircut, so please if anyone can help see me after the game!

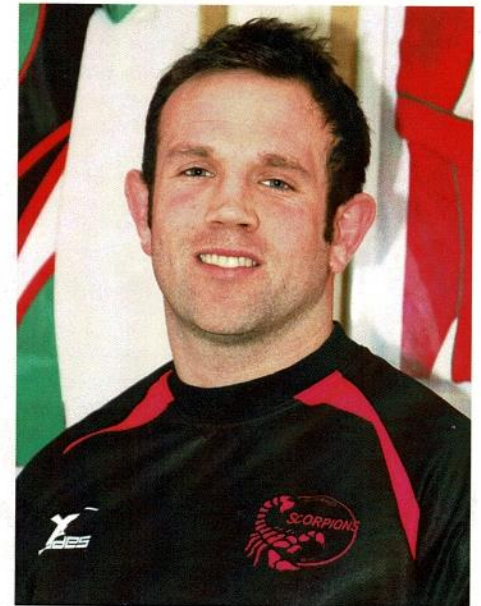
Finally this week I thought I would leave you with the results of my monthly training award:

Oldham were the first ever rugby league team to visit Wales back on September 7th 1907 as they beat the brand new Merthyr Tydfil side 25-6.

Welsh rugby was full of undercover professionalism at the time. In 1901 Treherbert were accused of offering players £1 a week to play while in 1907 allegations were made that players from a number of clubs were being paid up to six shillings a match.

However Welsh players were still constantly going up north to legitimately turn professional. Within a few months of the 1895 split where "Northern Union" was formed to allow players to be paid for playing rugby, Huddersfield had seven Welshmen in their team and six Llanelli players all joined Rochdale at the same time. Eventually the WFU (the original name for the WRU) banned Northern Union scouts from their grounds, but that was after a Wigan man was reportedly thrown into the River Taff to discourage his activities.

But by 1907, things were starting to hot up in the valleys with Merthyr Alexandra and Ebbw Vale rugby clubs becoming restless at the constant amateurism.

This was discussed at the Alexandra AGM and while professionalism was both proposed and seconded, an amendment that favoured the club remaining as amateurs was passed and the club didn't defect. But this just led to players defecting to a newly formed Merthyr club with

backers found and fixtures arranged.

The edition of the Merthyr Express dated September 7th 1907 was an historic one advertising not only Merthyr's first ever match against Oldham but also previewed Ebbw Vale's trip to Keighley. There was an even a paragraph talking about the "All Black professional movement" that was "being formed in Sydney by Mr Albert Baskiville, hon secretary of the New Zealand Football Club". These events would also have great significance to professional rugby in Wales and the international game as a whole.

Neither Welsh club was given much of a chance of winning their first match. Ebbw Vale's Keighley adventure wasn't entirely glamorous as they had to make a 12-hour overnight journey on the 10pm Friday night train to Yorkshire in order to play on Saturday afternoon. They lost 26-3.

Back in South Wales, Merthyr didn't fare much better in their home tie against Oldham losing 6-25 with the visitors running in seven tries.

However the moral venture of professionalism was a complete success. The Merthyr Express ran a match advertisement in their September 7th edition and a week later reported on the gate receipts saying that "the takings amounted to over £150, and after the match the Merthyr men were paid over the table."

Oldham finished top of the league that year but lost 12-2 to Hunslet in the Championship Final. Merthyr finished 23rd out of 27.

Like most clubs they have had lots of up and down years, being one of the 22 clubs that left the Rugby Football Union to form the Northern Union in 1895. They have a long history and have always thought of a club that could make the big time but never did.

To be honest it is a blessing that there is still a team called Oldham playing rugby league for when Rupert Murdoch funded the Super League competition it was proposed that part of the deal was that some traditional clubs would merge. Oldham were supposed to merge with Salford to form a club to be known as Manchester which would compete in Super League. This was resisted and instead they adopted the name Oldham Bears and were founder members of the new league (1996). In 1997 the club went bankrupt with debts of over £2m a new team Oldham Roughyeds was then formed.

For people that used to watch the Crusaders in 2007 and 2008, you may notice a name on the team sheet for the Roughyeds, Jamie l'Anson, an ex-Leeds Rhinos youth player. He played two memorable seasons in Bridgend before moving to Oldham for the 2009 season. A warm welcome to an old friend.

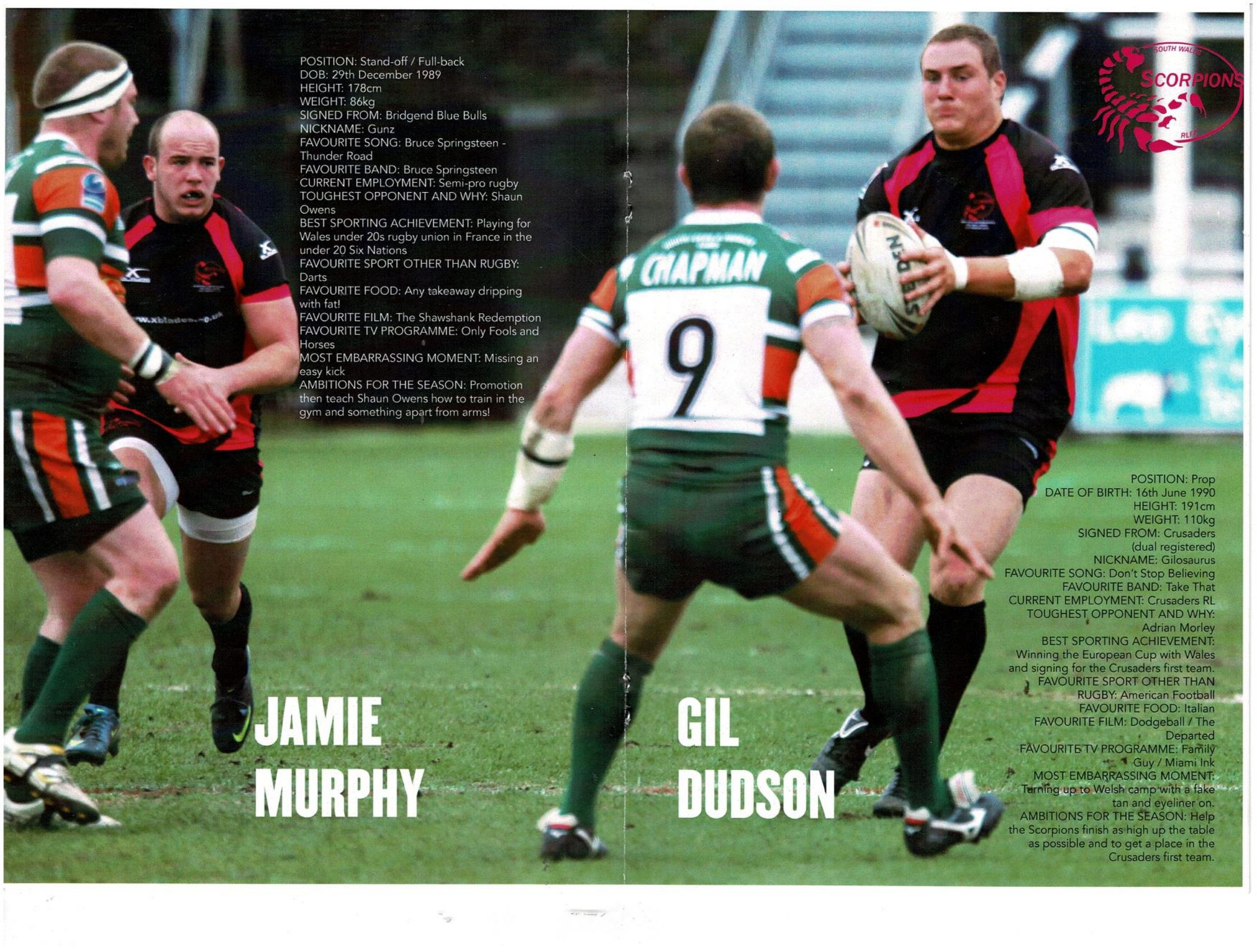

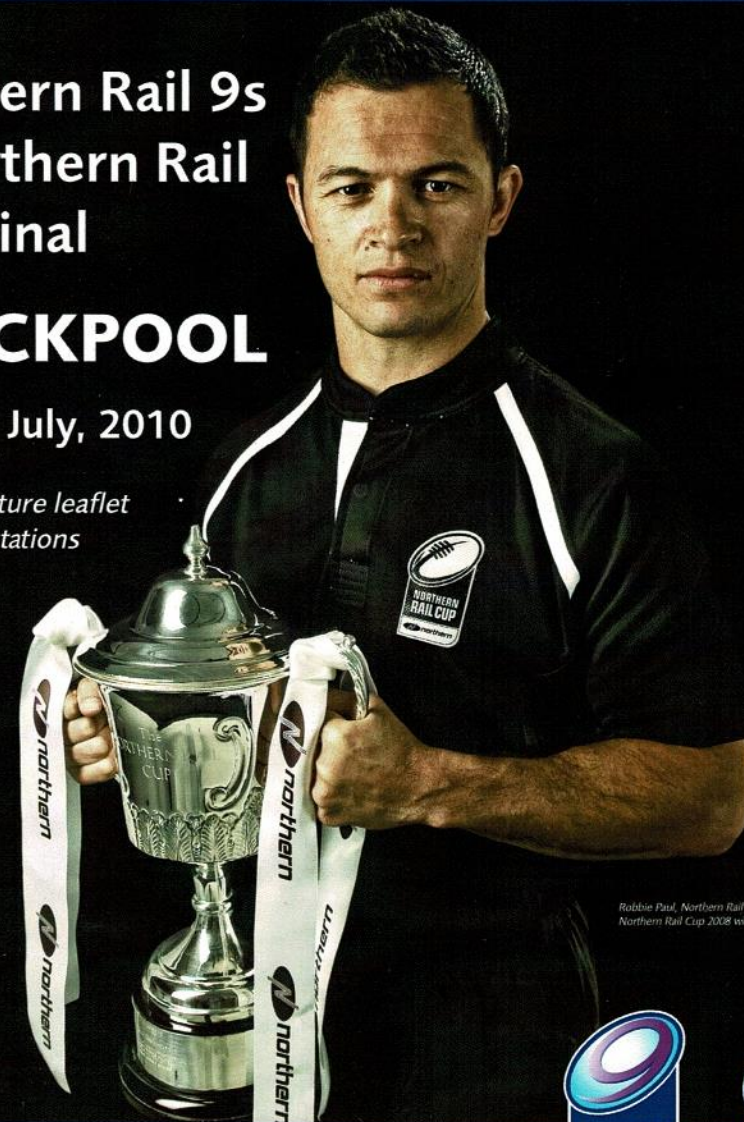

DEVELOPMENT NEWS

GRASS ROOTS RUGBY LEAGUE IN SOUTH WALES

As the summer approaches, it's a warm welcome to the first of our regular updates on what is happening throughout the local clubs and in Welsh Rugby League as a whole.

RUGBY LEAGUE CONFERENCE 2010

The Rugby League Conference in South Wales is also extending as they will be split into two divisions for the first time. The Premier Division will consist of Valley Cougars, Bridgend Blue Bulls, Cardiff Demons, Blackwood Bulldogs, Newport Titans and CPC Bears (West Wales).

The regional division, which will be contested on a Merit Table basis will include Torfaen Tigers, Tydfil Wildcats, Dinefwr Sharks, Neath Port Talbot Steelers, West Wales Wildboars and Ammanford Rhinos with the possibility of more teams also joining. The league will be officially launched on April 22nd at The Senydd in Cardiff Bay where all clubs, including representatives from the Crusaders and the Scorpions, including Iestyn Harris, will be present.

The full set of a Conference fixtures will appear in a double page spread in the Blackpool Panthers programme on Monday 3rd May.

ACADEMY GAMES IN SOUTH WALES

NATIONAL LEAGUE VIEW

WITH GARETH WALKER OF LEAGUE EXPRESS

SOME coaches believe that the Easter weekend can go a long way to shaping your season, and we've certainly learnt a lot more about certain club's prospects over the last week.

Riding high at the top of the Co-operative Championship are Leigh Centurions, who overcame the difficulties of a Good Friday trip to Toulouse to complete a perfect holiday weekend by dispatching Batley three days later.

The Centurions have turned more than a few heads already this season under shrewd Aussie coach Ian Millward, and look set to be among the front runners in the second half of the campaign.

They have undoubtedly been helped by the arrival of four dual registration signings in the excellent Lee Mitchell, Matty Blythe, Jacob Emmett and Tyrone McCarthy, but it is the improvement in several of their own players which has been just as impressive.

Similarly Featherstone Rovers have been outstanding to date, winning each of their opening five matches including wins against Barrow and Halifax.

They had the luxury of just one game over Easter - against Fax - but have to be commended for the way they have started the league campaign, especially after missing out on Northern Rail Cup qualification.

Widnes Vikings have kept pace with the top two after their Easter Monday win over Whitehaven, despite a crippling injury list, and Batley Bulldogs' Good Friday derby victory against Dewsbury sees them in the top six.

The other two current occupants of a play-off place - Halifax and Barrow - have not started the season quite as they would have wished, although both had morale-boosting Monday wins.

Sheffield Eagles have also fallen some way below pre-season expectations and picked up only two points over Easter, in a draw at Keighley.

The Cougars had a terrific holiday weekend by backing that up with a superb win at struggling

Dewsbury, and Barry Eaton's side have already overturned seven of the nine point deficit they have started with.

That puts them within striking distance of the likes of Whitehaven, Toulouse and Dewsbury, all of whom were winless over Easter.

In Championship One, Hunslet Hawks have risen to the top courtesy of two big wins in four days against Doncaster and South Wales - the Scorpions first defeat of the season.

Blackpool Panthers and Oldham remain the only two clubs in the division with 100 percent records as they also recorded back-to-back wins, and they are followed by York, who had a mixed Easter with one win from two.

The less-than-ideal fixture schedule in Championship One meant that Gateshead, Rochdale, Workington and South Wales only played one game, while Swinton Lions didn't play at all.

The Lions are still floundering well below where they would like, while Doncaster have seen their fortunes improve of late with two wins from their last three matches.

The other factor to consider with Easter, however, is how clubs that have played twice in quick succession cope with that in coming weeks - and as such, this weekend should reveal plenty more.

Why summer puts a smile on all our faces

THE news that moves for the regional leagues to join their professional counterparts by turning their backs on winter rugby are underway made for heartening reading over Easter. On the weekend that saw the sun finally break through the seemingly permanent blanket of grey that has framed the first two months of the season, the benefits of summer rugby were clear for all to see.

Most pitches may still have been showing the scars of eight weeks of Northern Rail Cup and Co-operative Championships action but the green shoots of new growth were evident at many grounds on Good Friday and Easter Monday.

Growing the grass roots is as important to the sport of Rugby League as it is the beleaguered club groundsmen who have had a real struggle of late to get their pitches playable. The development work being done by the RFL is fundamental to the future success of a sport which can only benefit from increased participation at every level around the country.

Untold numbers of people outside the sport's Northern heartland have long been denied the opportunity to play Rugby League because of a lack of support for anyone wanting to set up a new club or the absence of coaches and match officials with the required expertise.

That is no longer the case, largely due to a significant investment by Sport England who have provided £29.4m of funding to the RFL to increase participation around the country.

The return on that investment is already being seen in the burgeoning Co-operative Conference, which this year will feature 108 teams - a 20 per cent rise on last year - in a competition which gives the sport a truly national profile.

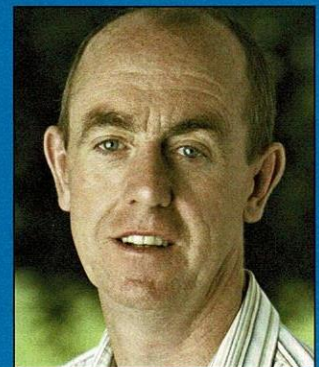
While breaking new ground geographically is crucial to Rugby League's future success, so too is the availability of grounds for players of all ages and sexes on which to train and play the game.

The fixture disruption caused to Co-operative Championships clubs by the recent harsh weather pales compared to the difficulties faces across the community game, especially at junior level where young players - many of whom aspire to go on and represent their town and country - have been inactive for months on end.

It is not always easy to maintain children's interest in any given activity; it is almost impossible to sustain their enthusiasm when frozen pitches, cold weather and dark nights prevent them from training and playing.

The proposed switch to summer - a move which is being driven by the community clubs and regional leagues - could have a dramatically positive impact on the numbers of young people who play Rugby League, the importance of which should not be lost on anyone. Just as more milk equals more cream, more players equals more competition for a place in the squad of a professional club; more competition leads to higher playing standards; increased playing standards invariably equates to more bums on seats.

Here comes summer: bring it on!

THE FAITH



It's been a tough league baptism for last year's unbeaten Rams side, but the boss remains upbeat

BEN COLLINS REPORTS

There can be no doubting the optimism of coach Warren Jowitt at Dewsbury. The Rams romped to the Championship 1 title last year, winning all 18 league games to become only the second-ever team to finish the season with a 100% record after Hull FC's flawless Division Two campaign in 1978-79.

They have suffered a difficult start to life in the Championship, though, losing each of their opening six games and having key players sidelined through injury.

Jowitt has been forced to blood a string of youngsters and admits inexperience has cost Dewsbury so far.

But not only is Jowitt confident the Rams will avoid a repeat of 2008, when they were relegated to Championship 1 after just two wins from 18 games, he insists they can still spring a surprise this season.

Speaking ahead of the Easter programme, when the Rams went down to Batley and Keighley, he was keen to stress the positives.

"The results haven't been going our way but things are going good for us," he said. "I've had a lot of new, inexperienced players in the team because five or six quality, experienced players have been injured."

"But as the games go by, they seem to be gaining experience and confidence. We've come a long way since the opening game."

"I honestly believe that something special's going to happen at Dewsbury and come the end of the season, everyone'll be thinking 'how have they done that?'"

"We've set a team goal but that's between us. It demands a lot of commitment and a lot of effort and that is what we've been getting so I think it's very achievable."

Despite their injury problems, Dewsbury were beating title contenders Widnes last month before succumbing to a late fightback, with the Vikings running out 36-30 winners.

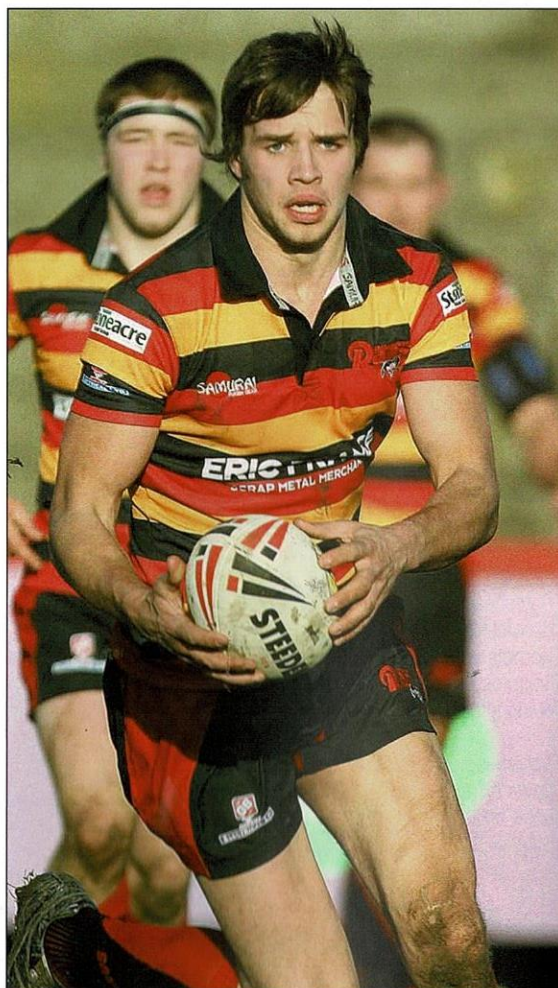
Prolific goal-kicker Patch Walker, who can also play in the forwards, claimed a try and five goals from half-back and although Jowitt felt he made some poor decisions late on, he has still been singled out for praise during Dewsbury's testing start.

"Patch has been given the captaincy and we had two really big games against Sheffield and Widnes," said Jowitt.

"I moved him to number seven as well and it's been the right move, he's made us look a much better side."

"He's inexperienced himself and that showed against Widnes. He had a big game for us but we were eight points up with about six minutes left and an experienced half-back would have kicked us to the win."

"Widnes couldn't contain us. Our forwards were far better than theirs, we dominated the game, and when you're out in front you look to your half-backs to put the game to bed. You need to keep turning them with kicks into their danger zone."



Ex-Shaw Cross player Patrick 'Patch' Walker has impressed his coach during a tough opening to the league season

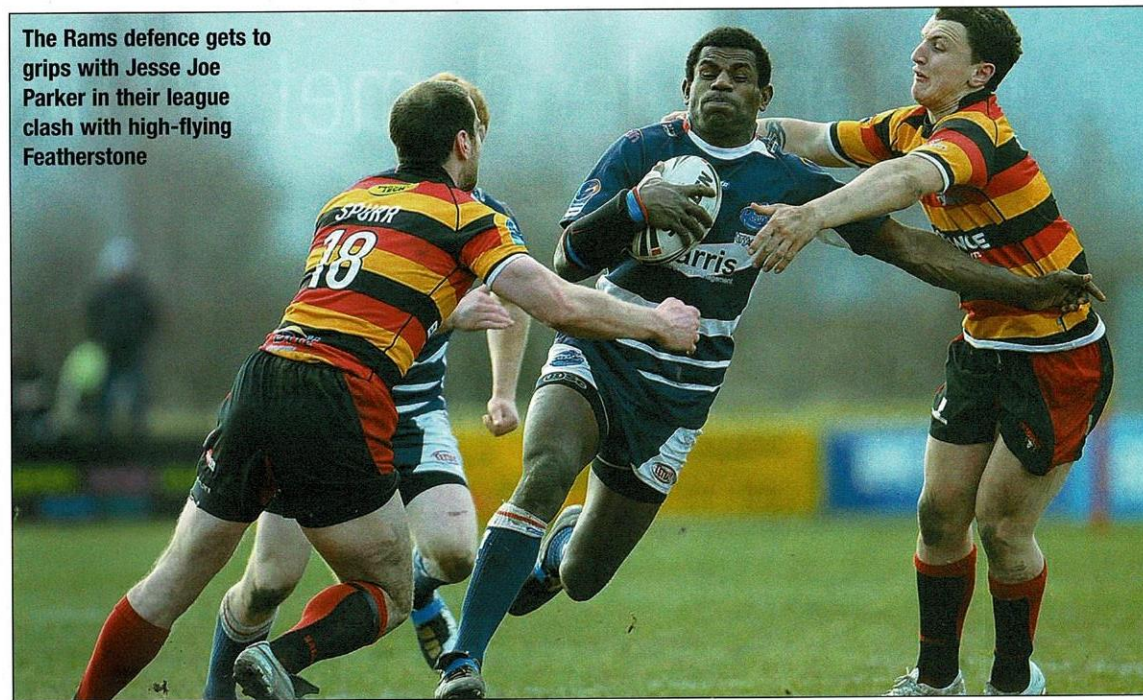
"But there were too many poor, indecisive kicks, giving Widnes field position and letting them off the hook."

"The Widnes game proved to everybody that we do have it in us, though - we've just got to learn how to hold onto leads because the game should have been won."

"Rob Spicer, Alex Bretherton, Austin Buchanan, Lee Lingard and Luke Menzies have all been on the sidelines. Apart from Lee Lingard, they could be out till the end of April, so there's quality to come back into the side."

"There is quality in the side now, it's just youth and inexperience that's letting us down."

The Rams defence gets to grips with Jesse Joe Parker in their league clash with high-flying Featherstone



While Jowitt is remaining tight-lipped about exactly what he means by "something special", it would be fantastic all-round for the Rams faithful if it could be a Challenge Cup upset having been handed a fourth-round draw at home to Super League neighbours Bradford.

The Rams had over 1,300 for their first two league games at Tetley's Stadium this season and are set for a 3,700 sell-out for the visit of Bradford on April 18.

"We're really looking forward to it," said Jowitt.

"Bradford's my old club and I spent about six years playing alongside (Bulls coach) Steve McNamara."

"We've always done well in the pre-season friendlies against Bradford and it's a big challenge, but if we keep improving like we are, I think we'll ask a few questions of them. We beat Featherstone and Batley in the Northern Rail Cup last year and then went to Barrow and nearly beat them in the quarter-finals. In one-off games, you do seem to find something extra."

And Jowitt's men can count on the continued support of the Dewsbury fans.

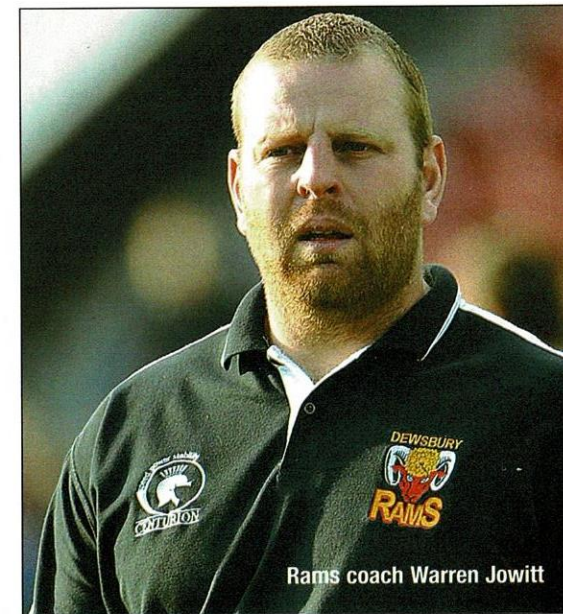
Last year's historic league campaign and those Cup performances against higher division sides have raised expectations. But there have been no murmurings of discontent from the Owl Lane stands during their difficult league start.

"There is a lot of expectation after last year," said Jowitt. "We beat Featherstone and Batley - the challenge now is to do it week-in, week-out in the league."

"The fans have been really good and the feedback I'm getting after games is they've been impressed. They can see the effort's there, and in times gone by, they've known when no effort is being put in."

"Obviously fans want to see their team win every week but when the chips are down, that's when the players need the fans to get behind the team."

"We're working hard to get things right on the field and we're slowly turning the screw."

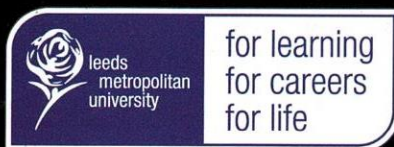


Rams coach Warren Jowitt

IN LAST week's Game On we carried an article about the fantastic work being done by the folk at the Rugby League Benevolent Fund and their Try Assist campaign, which raises much-needed funds for some of those RL diehards who have been less fortunate than most of us.

Tim Adams and Stephen Ball from the RLBF are spear-heading the campaign to encourage RL fans to become patrons, at a cost of just £18 per year, or about 30 pence a week, which if we equate it to something in real terms, is about three slices of bread or half a dozen of the bubbles in the froth on top of your pint of lager. In other words, and as the magician Paul Daniels is wont to exclaim: "Not a lot."

My cheque will be in the post forthwith chaps.

One of the people featured in the RLBF campaign was Dave O'Connor, who broke his neck while on international duty with BARLA back in the mid-80s. I was honoured to play both against Dave, when he was a stalwart of the Yew Tree side in Leeds (this was pre-National Conference League), and with him for BARLA Gt Britain, when we took on the French A side in St Gaudens and stuffed them, 34-7. That was in 1983 when Dave was named BARLA Player of the Year, for the second time if I'm not mistaken.

The fund has stumped up to buy Dave a specially adapted vehicle to get him around, which has incalculable value to a bloke who's otherwise housebound. Also in the article was Matt King, the London Broncos youngster who was similarly stricken and who has subsequently graduated from University, having had his tuition fees met by the fund, and I've been fortunate enough to hear this very articulate young man speak about the positive impact the Rugby League family has made on him. Truly inspirational.

We haven't always been either so lucky as a sport, or so well organised. The season that I played alongside Dave O'Connor, I made my representative debut for the Heavy Woollen district playing against York, up at Heworth's ground. Also on debut that day from my club Dewsbury Celtic was a young man by the name of David Roebuck. Dave played hooker, and when a scrum collapsed it left him paralysed from the neck down. I went on to have a fantastic life in Rugby League, on and off the field, while my pal Dave went on to spend the next 27 years – and counting – in a wheelchair.

But here's the rub – the Heavy Woollen District RL did not have insurance for any such eventuality. David Roebuck was left without a job, his marriage fell apart, and he hadn't two pennies to rub together. That couldn't happen financially now, but luckily Dave had, apart from his family and friends, his Rugby League family around him.

We started our fund-raising before he got out of Pinderfields Hospital, and some 27 years on we're still doing it on a regular basis. If you've met Dave Roebuck you'll never forget him, because for all that misfortune he is without a doubt the most cheerful, positive bloke you have ever met in your life. I'll guarantee it.

These days Dave isn't just reliant on the efforts of his pals, the Benevolent Fund has also weighed in to enhance his limited quality of life – limited in physical means at least. If you can measure spirit, then we should all be so lucky as David Roebuck.

But when you next cheer and applaud the fantastic entertainment you get from this great game, at whatever level, spare a thought for some of the blokes who have paid a frightening price for their love of the sport – because there but for the grace of God go a great many of us.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH - MARCH MARTYN RIDYARD, LEIGH

LEIGH stand-off Martyn Ridyard is the Game On Player of the Month for March after playing a focal part in the Centurions' unbeaten league campaign and second place in the Co-operative Championship.

Ridyard, 23, a product of local amateur club Leigh Miners, saw off a stern challenge from Featherstone playmaker Kyle Briggs and Widnes starlet Anthony Thackeray to grab the most competitive slot in the Dream Thirteen, and the craft of Fev new-boy Liam Finn to seal the overall Player of the Month award.

The team is dominated by the unbeaten Leigh and Featherstone players with four and five selections respectively, while young Widnes centre Shane Grady makes the starting line-up thanks to some mature performances early in the month, and his prolific goalkicking.

And although Dewsbury Rams struggled to get off the mark in the 'W' column through the month, powerhouse second-rower Andrew Bostock was the model of consistency as the Rams picked up three losing bonus points to at least get their account ticking over.

Zeb Luisi is the sole nominee from the reigning champions Barrow Raiders, with his speed and craft at the back of the pack central to the good work being done by the Cumbrians.

Other players from lower down the table to get an honourable mention from the judges were Toulouse hooker Cedric Gay, pushing Mark Smith of Widnes and eventual choice Craig Cook close, while Batley bulldozer Sean Hesketh also caught the eye.

COACH OF THE MONTH - MARCH DARYL POWELL, FEATHERSTONE

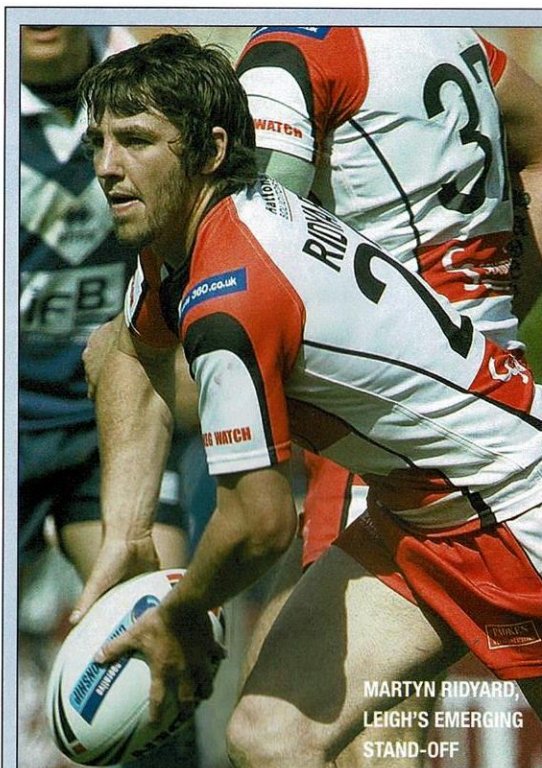


Daryl Powell edges out Aussie prodigal son Ian Millward for the prestigious Coach of the Month award for March.

quality of their performances, shoving pre-season title favourites Barrow and Halifax back into the cheap seats with the authority of their performance.

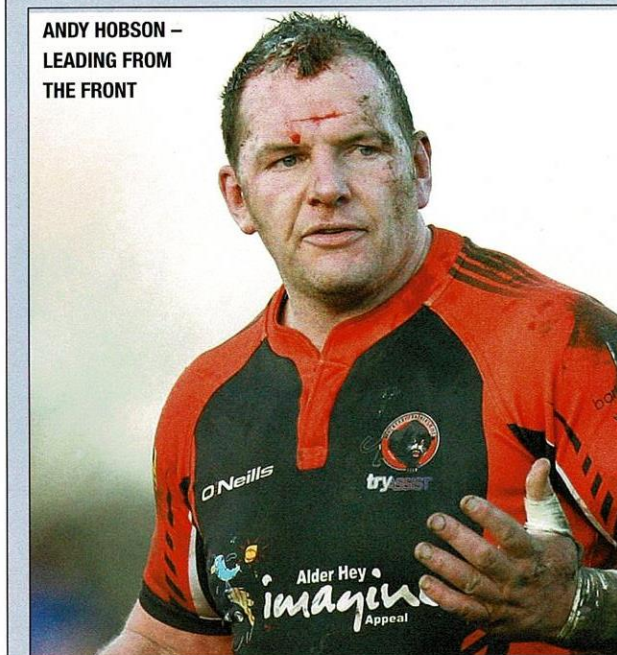

It's a dog's life for Sheffield fans

Eagles go back to the future

SHEFFIELD Eagles are set to 'go back to the dogs' with a greyhound named after the club and racing at their first home.

Former player Daryl Powell and Mark Aston took a trip into the past with a visit to Owlerton Stadium as the Eagles open a new chapter for the club.

It was at the greyhound racing track where professional rugby league kicked-off in Sheffield 26 years ago.

Now Eagles fans will soon be able to have flutter on a greyhound to be named after them.

"We are going to do some special deals and the Eagles players will be coming down to Owlerton. All being well there will be a dog running in the name of the Eagles – we can't guarantee anything but we hope it will be a winner," said John Gilburn, managing director of Owlerton Stadium.

Featherstone coach Powell and Eagles boss Aston are on opposite sides this weekend when their teams meet at the Eagles' new home Bramall Lane. It is the first of seven games the Eagles have planned at Sheffield United's ground.

"It's good to be back out at Owlerton where the club started," said Aston. Now the first game for Sheffield Eagles at Bramall Lane is against Featherstone – coached by Daryl with another old Eagles player Ryan Sheridan as his assistant.

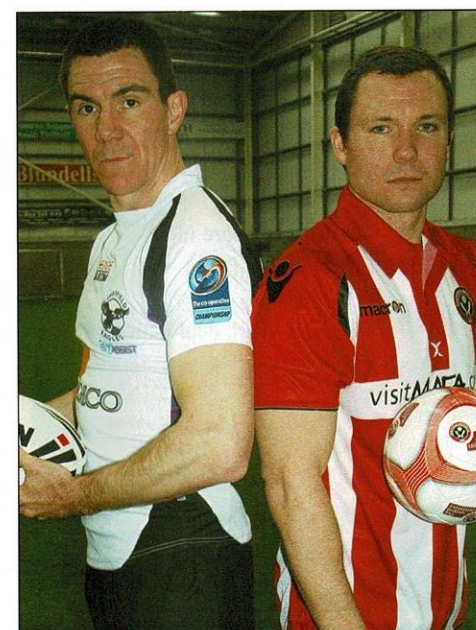
"It's amazing to think we're playing at Bramall Lane and we have to make it work. Daryl and I will always be friends but this Sunday it's about winning."

Former Great Britain star Powell played his first professional game at centre in the Eagles' opening game – a 29-10 win over Rochdale Hornets on Sunday 2 September 1984.

Aston made his professional debut the year later and also has a Featherstone link having played a season at Post Office Road in the mid-1990s.

Powell said: "It was a special start playing at Owlerton against Rochdale, winning the game and obviously it being my first professional game.

"It is going to be good at Bramall Lane. It will be an outstanding occasion for Sheffield and hopefully there will be a big crowd there and Featherstone will be keen to win the game."



MEANWHILE Sheffield have 'signed' soccer star Chris Morgan – but only as a spectator. The Sheffield United captain gave his backing to the Eagles as the countdown started to their first game at Bramall Lane.

Morgan says he has never seen a game of rugby league but is planning to watch the Eagles play Featherstone Rovers.

"Myself and some of our players have been invited down to the first game at Bramall Lane and we hope to be there," he said.

Morgan swapped shirts with Eagles vice-captain and half-back Brendon Lindsay when the pair met at Blades' Shirecliffe training base.

But the tough defender has no plans to switch codes. He said: "I'm not sure it's for me. The tackling in football can get physical but it's not like the rugby lads. It's something different. It makes me wonder how some of the lads like Brendon feel when they wake up the morning after a game."

But Lindsay thinks Morgan will enjoy the 13-a-side code. "Rugby league could be just right for Chris and I'm sure we'll make him a fan of the Eagles."

The Eagles are mounting a big campaign to bring in new fans and hope United supporters will follow Morgan with the Eagles as their 'second team'.

Morgan sees no problems with the Eagles playing at the Lane – a move the club hopes will boost their bid for a Super League place.

"I don't see a problem with rugby league being played at Bramall Lane – we play at other clubs that share with rugby like Watford. I hope some of our supporters will come along and watch the games," he said.

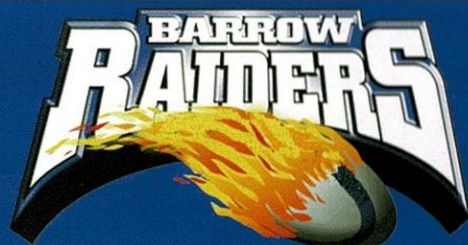

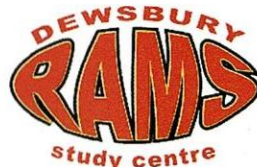

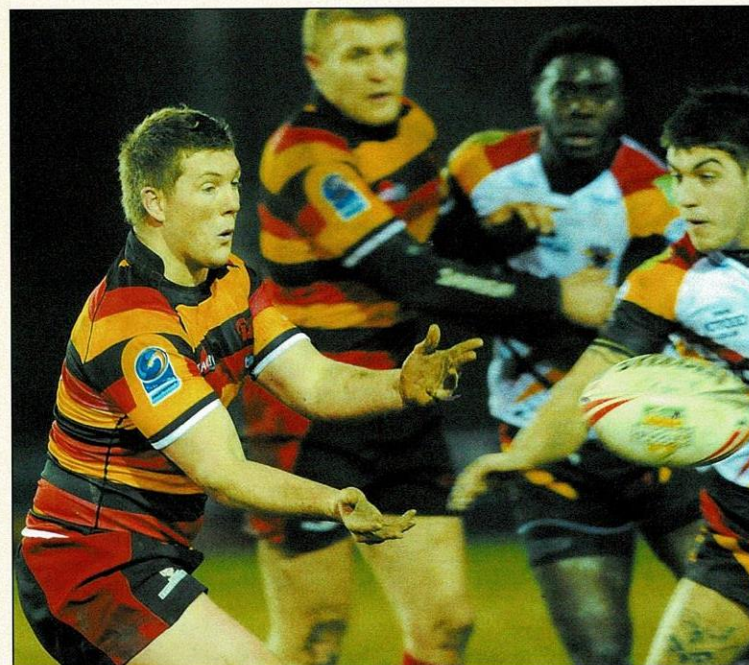

I believe we can and I know Warren feels the same but we need nothing less than 100% from now until mid August.

We have the visit of Bradford next Sunday, a trip to Barrow the following Saturday before the televised game against Leigh on 29 April. Anyone with a ticket for the Bradford game who wants to come to the Leigh fixture is advised to hang on to their ticket and then contact the club for details on a special cut-price admission.

There may well be a lot of people at the Bradford game who haven't seen us in action either for many years or it could be their first visit to the stadium. We want

We had a good result of our own on Monday, beating Toulouse, and it was good to get back to winning ways after a difficult couple of weeks.

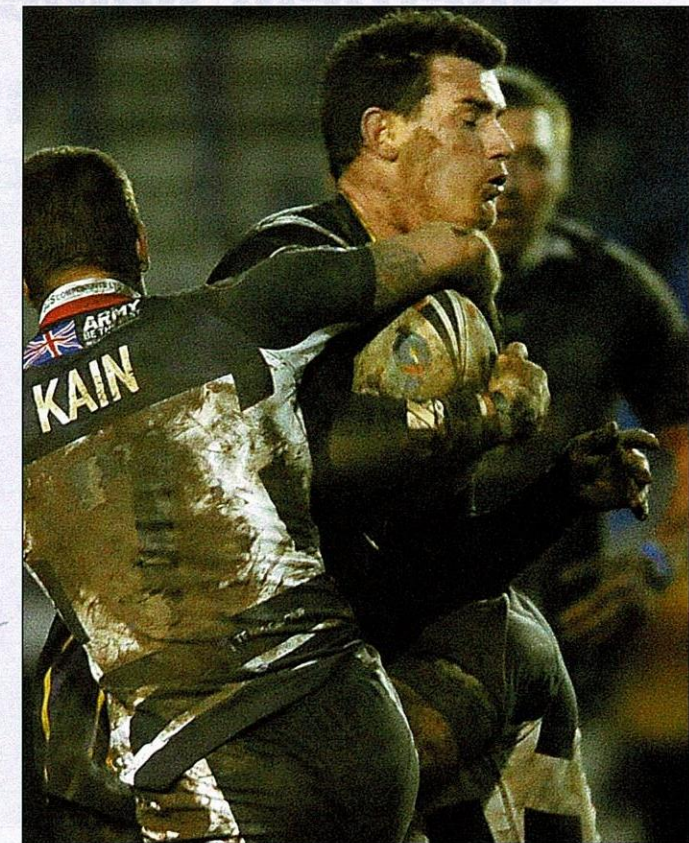
As I said in the press, it was still a long way

In parallel with national events, the first signs of recovery do not guarantee future progress.

Our friends from Keighley arrive on the back of an excellent win at Dewsbury which followed a draw with Sheffield Eagles, and so they

will not be short of confidence here this evening.

Add the spice of any number of Halifax lads playing against their 'home town' club, and you can understand the attraction this fixture has for the Sky cameras.

Almost without exception, matches involving Halifax televised as 'Thursday Night Thrillers' have proved to be just that.

I've no problem with that, but for the sake of the blood pressure, a controlled performance would suit me just fine.

One area of uncertainty, for both teams, is the effect of

At Easter, we persist with two matches in a single weekend, and the television commitment means for two sides, Halifax and Keighley this year, the task is to play three matches within six days.

But a review of the RFL website shows that has not been the case.

I suspect that there is a financial limit for many supporters and two matches on a single weekend is one too many.

And those without that concern have other interests, and choose not to watch matches between tired, patched-up teams.

I hope the game will review the Easter Programme.

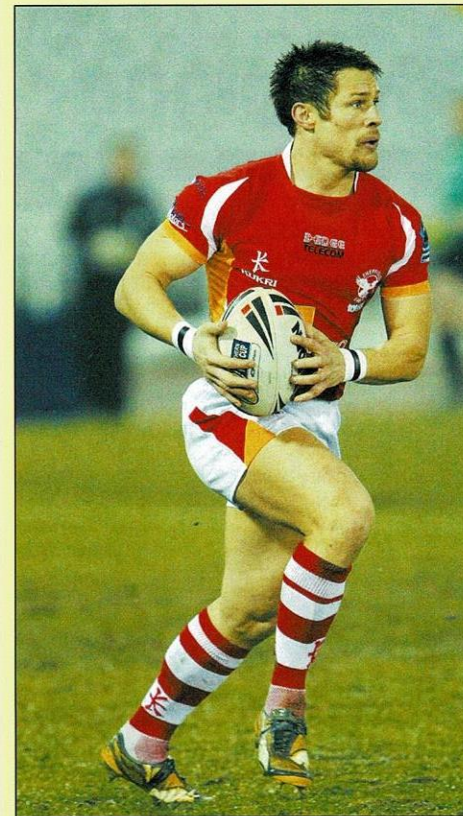

Good evening and welcome to everyone for tonight's clash with Toulouse.

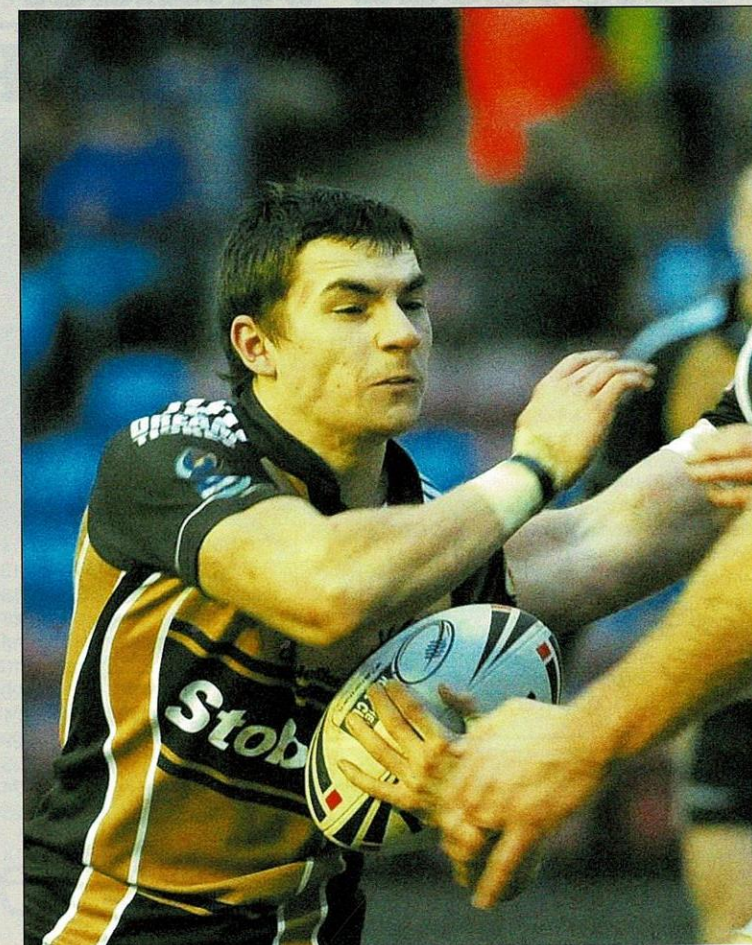
As we've already seen on many occasions from the Widnes side this season, there have been many times where we haven't played at our best or necessarily had our best seventeen players available for whatever particular reason, but the common denominator along the way has been our character, team spirit and work ethic and I don't think we'll ever see a greater example of that than the 'away' win at Dewsbury.

It's okay smiling when everything is going well and you're playing good rugby, but it's what you do and how you deal with matters when things are going wrong which has certainly been the case for us recently, but having come through that tough battle against the Rams, we knew only too well that Whitehaven would provide us with an even bigger and far more experienced proposition and that's exactly how it panned out.

Overall, it was a decent day's work especially when you consider that there were seven or eight of both teams' starting 13 sat in the stand, but in a game littered with more than 20 penalties, the contest never really got started and the faster the game went the better we looked, while by the same token the slower it went the more ordinary we appeared.

We're obviously pleased with the points that we scored although you'd always like a few more, but as a group we're furious about conceding eighteen points in the manner we did, at the back-end of both the first and second half and it's something that collectively, we're not prepared to accept.

Player development is very important to us here at Widnes, but it's also something that you have to give Whitehaven a

great deal of credit for too, and even though we feel that we're doing pretty well at the moment with six or seven players in our ranks who have only ever played for Widnes and have worked their way through our system, Whitehaven have around 30 and that shouldn't be overlooked and I've nothing but admiration for the way they go about their business.

One thing which concerns me greatly at the moment is the fact that our Under 21s haven't played a single game yet and we're now past Easter!

So, while the first team have played almost a dozen times over a three month period, our reserve grade side haven't played a single match yet and the nonsensical decision to delay getting that competition up and running is something which I simply don't understand.

Young players such as Danny Hulme and Dean Thompson who came in and did such a good job for us last weekend are testimony to this because all that they are doing at the moment is training as there's no games for them to play in and it makes our player development process

all the more difficult because our younger players haven't had a serious hit-out for such a long time and when they are called upon to step-up into the first team, they're doing so from an almost standing start, which isn't fair at all.

The same also applies for the likes of James Ford who has been missing for six weeks with a torn hamstring but not had the facility to get himself match-ready and back up to speed because of the lack of reserve grade games, and why the respective seasons don't run concurrently is another thing I find absolutely ridiculous.

Today sees the visit of Toulouse to The Stobart Stadium, Halton, and while I'm obviously concerned about the possible threat that they may throw at us, I'm equally as worried about our own problems at the club which must be considered too.

The seventeen who played against Whitehaven on Easter Monday were the last seventeen players standing from our senior squad, so all of our energy and effort this week will be spent on finding seventeen fit and healthy bodies able to do a job for us this evening.

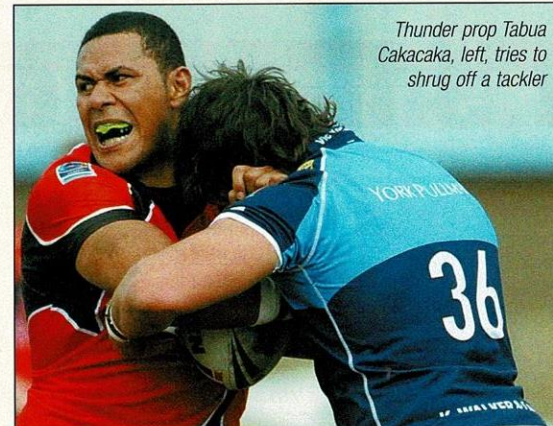

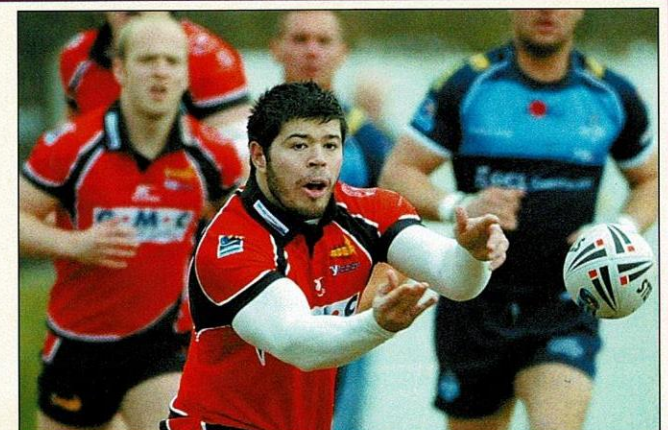
They all strive for success and the glory of winning. However, there can only be one league champion, cup holder or play-off winner.

It's a long while since we were in such a lofty position and everyone involved with the club at whatever level will be enjoying the "bragging rights" which accompany the honour.

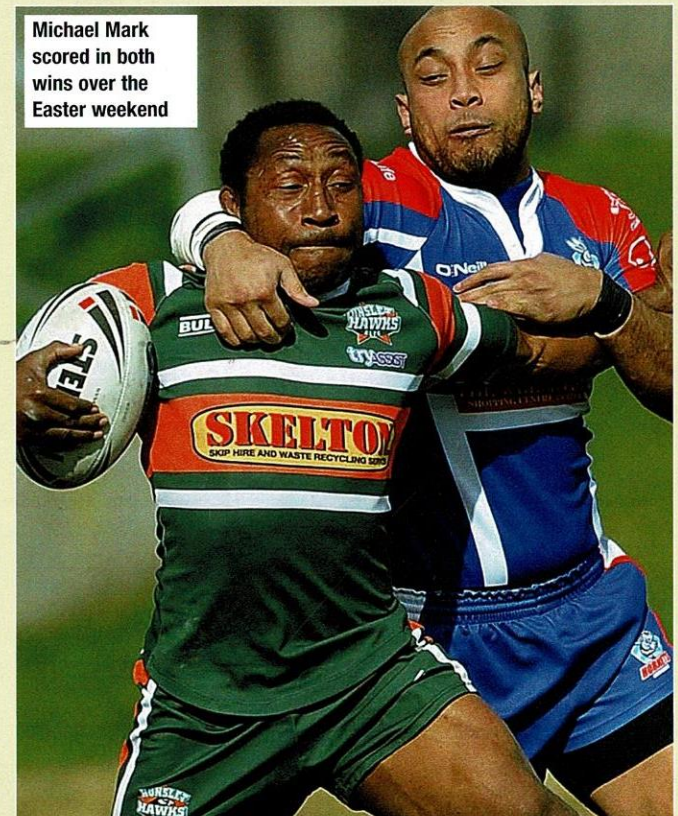
However, let us not forget that the hard work starts from now, as every club will be determined to knock us off the perch as soon as possible.

Eighteen points down during that disruptive spell would have seen the majority of players and teams put their heads down, but at half-time we re-grouped and re-assessed what we are about, and we came out

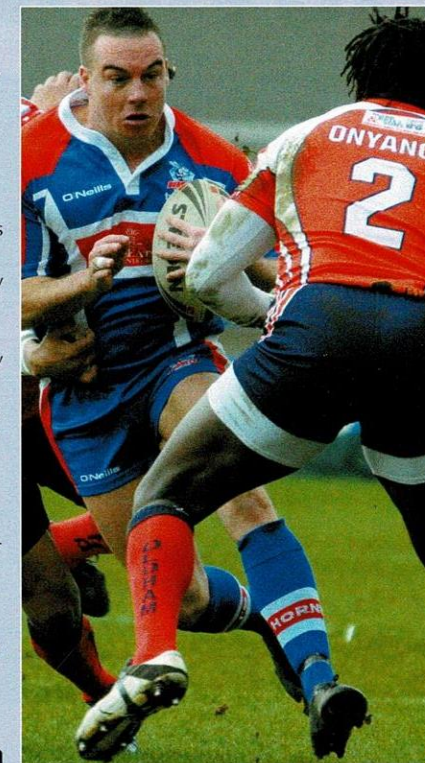
with our backs against the walls but with a point to prove to ourselves.

Coach Steve McCormack had master-minded a 'great escape' as Gateshead earned the results they needed to avoid relegation from the Championship.

But owner Steve Garside then pulled the plug after four years of bank-rolling Thunder, forcing the club into liquidation, not only accepting but seeking a drop into the Championship 1, and handing Leigh a relegation reprieve.

McCormack left, later to be appointed at Barrow, and chief executive Rod Findlay was left to pick up the pieces.

First the former RFL lawyer helped put together a business plan and form a new holding company for the club, but the RFL had to be convinced the new structure could sustain the club before allowing Thunder to take up a place in Championship 1.

Thunder were ultimately given the green light for this season - along with a six-point penalty - and a Pledge Night in November demonstrated there was enough support from fans and sponsors to keep the club going, showing Findlay was right to soldier on.

"We were rocked by the news that the shareholders had fallen out and withdrawn their support, and that Steve Garside was filing for administration," said Findlay, now chairman on a part-time basis.

"We had to take a long, hard look at ourselves and ask 'what are we about?' The RFL said they weren't just giving us the unconditional funding for the sake of it, we had to show we could produce our own income too.

"We also had to see if we could put out a competitive team and I think we showed in a fairly short space of time that we did have that support. We've won a lot of friends over the years and they've stuck with us."

It is safe to say that since being introduced to Super League in 1999, Thunder have lurched from one financial crisis to the next.

Findlay was therefore keen to safeguard the long-term future of the club and ensure it was doing more than just merely surviving, although that has limited on-field expectations for this season.

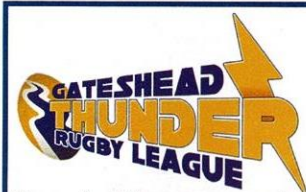
"We had to ask 'what is the point of the club?' If it's simply to exist, to be on that league table, is that a reason to

reform?" he said. "Just because there's been a rugby league club in Gateshead for the last 10 years wasn't a good enough reason to reform.

"After a bit of soul-searching we came to the view that we had a part to play in promoting rugby league in the North

East and promoting the North East through rugby league.

"If all we're doing is taking players from other clubs and surviving on the RFL's central distribution, then there's not really much point having us here.

"Producing our own players is as important as our Championship 1 status and being able to play our part in the league, so Chris Hood, our Director of Rugby, has commented often that the Under-18s is the most important squad at the moment because hopefully they'll form the nucleus of Gateshead Thunder going forward.

"We've not been getting the results so far but just being competitive is our main aim this year. We started on minus-six points so the immediate aim is to get to zero and take it from there."

Thunder is just one of several clubs rocked by the withdrawal of their main backer in recent years and the new ownership structure is aimed at protecting the club from suffering the same fate again.

Shares have been offered to individuals such as life members and long-standing directors while, once ratified, local junior clubs and the supporters club will hold a 25% stake in Thunder.

"We're doing it in a very different way," said Findlay. "We've always been owned by an individual or a small group of individuals and we wanted to reinvent ourselves.

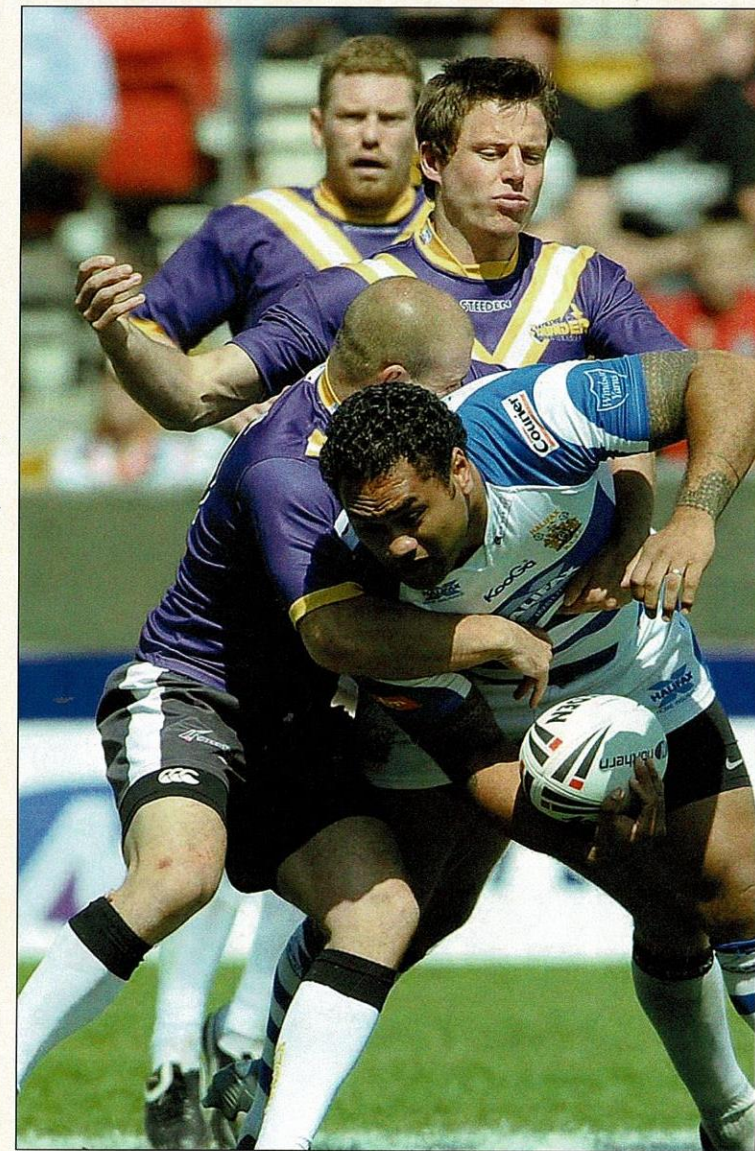
"People have said 'is there a backer to take the club on?' Well, we don't want to be reliant on one individual, because I think that's where we've gone wrong in the past.

"Having been through a backer withdrawing before, we don't want the players, staff, fans and sponsors to go through that uncertainty again.

"We had to get it up and running so Chris Hood, Keith Christie (Commercial Director) and I became the three shareholders," Findlay explained.

"But we've offered shares to our junior clubs, supporters club and certain individuals so that they feel part of the process and to respect the investment, time and emotion people have put into the club.

"We wouldn't exist without them and we now feel we're representative of the region. The term 'community club' has been used which makes us sound like an amateur club but I think we're more a professional club for its community."



In a season where they got through to a Challenge Cup quarter-final against the mighty St Helens, Gateshead also reached the final of the Northern Rail 9s Plate division, where they faced Halifax (above).

Thunder have also formed a partnership with Gateshead FC, with whom they share the council-owned Gateshead International Stadium, which has seen them sharing resources and launching a series of joint initiatives.

Findlay, meanwhile, will continue to combine his role with that as a partner in the Jesmond-based law firm McDaniel & Co, which he's held since January.

"Part of the discussions I had when I joined Daniel & Co. was that they were happy for me to stay involved with Gateshead Thunder because we're developing a sports law practice and it's consistent with that," he said.

"It's an absolute honour to be able to play a part in taking Gateshead Thunder forward and I'll stay involved as long as it benefits the club.

"Once the club's up and running I'd be happy to say 'I'm leaving it to you guys', and now Gateshead have a set-up where if I was hit by a bus tomorrow, the club would still go on."

After 14 long years and eight different bases nomadic Oldham have finally found a home.

The White Bank Stadium in the residential Limehurst area of the town will be the club's new, permanent ground.

The announcement was made on April Fools Day and after Oldham's turbulent past, chairman Chris Hamilton admitted some fans could be excused for thinking the announcement was a fake one. However, the current RFL President is hoping for a much brighter future for the Co-operative Championship One side.

Oldham's new home is definitely not the KC Stadium or the DW Stadium. With a notable sloping pitch, it's more reminiscent of Mount Pleasant. Indeed, the rather grand name hides a multitude of tasks that still need to be completed before Tony Benson's team runs out there for the first time.

New away changing rooms, an upgrade of facilities for match officials and a general tidying up of the site is on the immediate agenda.

Indeed, Hamilton declined to give an official capacity for a ground currently used by Vodkat North West Counties League division two football side Oldham Boro with an average crowd of 40, but he intends it being ready for business for the visit of York City Knights on May 9.

In the meantime, Oldham will continue to play home games at Sedgley Park rugby union club. Sedgley Park is the eighth and final resting place for Oldham RLFC (1997) Ltd that have been homeless since leaving Watersheddings in 1996.

In between, the club has played at: Hurst Cross, Ashton-under-Lyne, Bower Fold, Stalybridge, Victory Park, Chorley, Bloomfield Road, Blackpool, Spotland, Rochdale, Boundary Park and Leigh Sports Village.

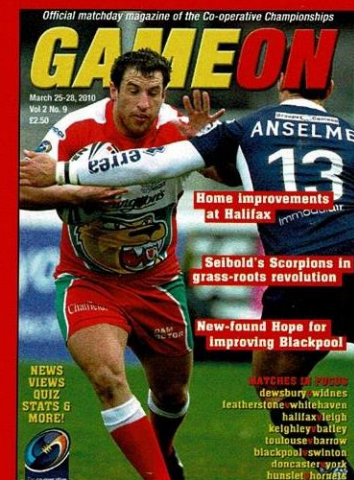

The resurgent Centurions were helped by having played one more game than Rovers but wins at Toulouse Olympique 36-6 and 26-4 over Batley Bulldogs at the Sports Village sent out a message that Ian Millward's team means business.

Featherstone will point out that they had only one game over the holiday weekend – but a big one against Halifax, winning 44-4. Kyle Briggs continued to pile on the points with a try and eight goals for Rovers.

"We are proud of the way we are working as a team but we won't get carried away," said coach Daryl Powell.

For Toulouse their poor spell continues as they suffered a third defeat when they were hit by the backlash from Halifax with a 50-6 defeat at the Shay on Monday.

The Cougars continue to chip away at the points deduction and showed that they are coming to terms with the higher division with a battling 16-16 draw at home to Sheffield Eagles on Good Friday.

Coach Barry Eaton said after the Sheffield game: "We made great strides over the last few weeks and I feel that we have turned a massive corner."

Championship 1 also saw new leaders with form team Hunslet Hawks continuing their charge up the table with a 42-12 win at early pacesetters South Wales Scorpions. Hawks had opened their holiday programme with a 54-12 crushing of Doncaster.

It was the first taste of defeat for the Scorpions who were blown away by five second half tries from their visitors.
