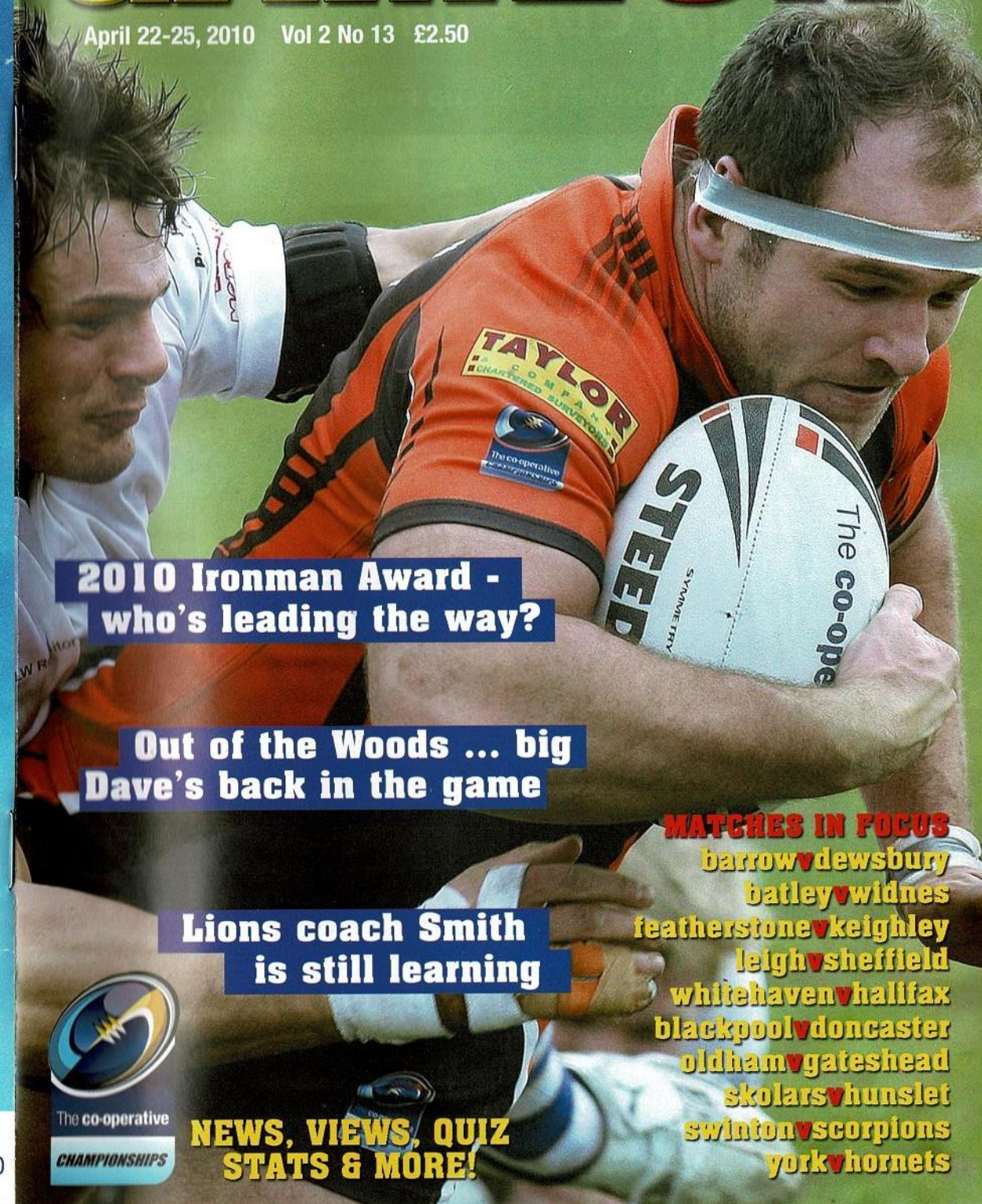

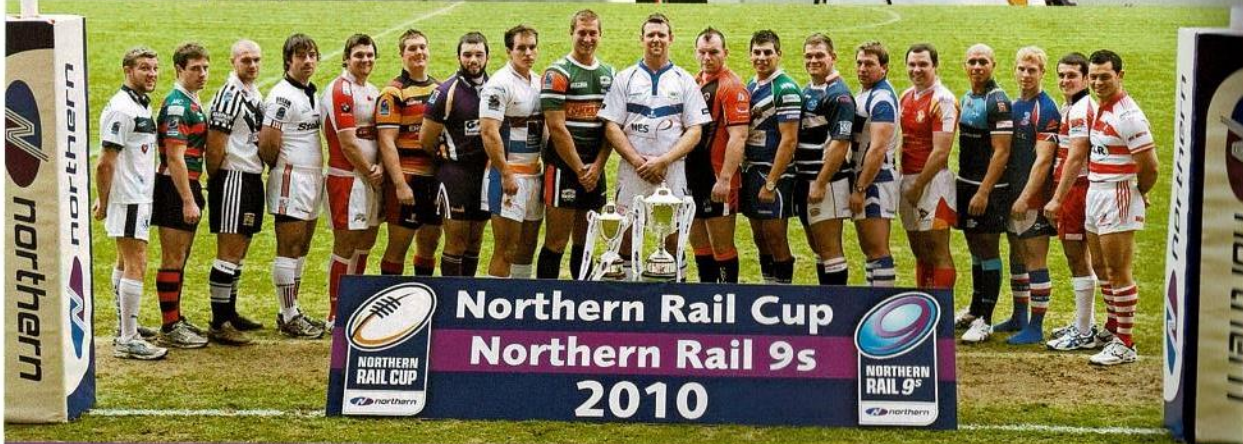

# This was Cup magic the old-fashioned-way

Engage Super League have their version next week; for the Co-operative Championships clubs, last Saturday and Sunday proved to be the real Magic Weekend, in more ways than one. The fourth round of the Carnegie Challenge Cup has always been a special time, a weekend when the supposed superiority of the sport's elite is put into the spotlight, a time when clubs outside the top flight get to see how the 'other half' live.

Or see a Challenge Cup dream die, as happened to Castleford Tigers last Sunday when Barrow Raiders, the reigning Co-operative Championship champions, pulled off a famous victory to take a stunning step nearer Wembley. It is difficult to overstate the significance of Barrow's 34-28 success, a win which saw the Cumbrians fight their way back from being 28-12 down to defeat opponents who just a couple of months ago toppled Engage Super League champions, Leeds Rhinos.

While playground logic would suggest that that makes Barrow a better team than Leeds, the reality is, of course, more prosaic. Not that anything should detract from the magnificence of the Raiders' achievement.

As well as proving that Halifax's effort in taking Castleford to extra time in the Challenge Cup 12 months ago was no fluke, the result at The Jungle put into context the quality of the Rugby League seen in the Co-operative Championship on a weekly basis and offered incontrovertible proof of the calibre and integrity of the competition.

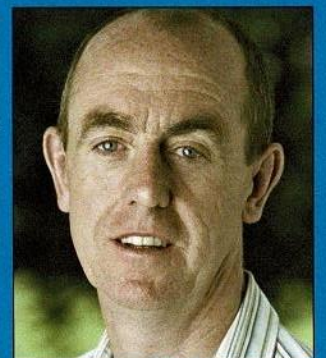
So, too, did the results at Bramall Lane and Halliwell Jones Stadium where Sheffield Eagles and Featherstone Rovers were proud ambassadors for the with their sterling efforts against Wigan and Warrington respectively.

No team has scored more points against the current Engage Super League pacesetters this season than Sheffield, who bowed out of the Cup with their heads held high after 50-34 defeat. A repeat of the 1998 Challenge Cup final may never have been on the cards but the Mark Aston's team once again made their mark on the sport's oldest and most prestigious competition.

Featherstone can also feel proud of their battling performance against the Cup holders, who were given a more searching examination than the 48-24 final score-line suggests, and Daryl Powell and his charges will take a lot from the experience.

Special mention must also go to Leigh Centurions, who defied the travel chaos that has brought Europe to a standstill by travelling to the south of France to complete a hard-fought 32-20 victory over Limoux. It's fair to say that few Leigh players will be taking their families on holiday by coach this summer....

Finally, well done to Blackpool Panthers, who flew the flag for Co-operative Championship One with distinction by beating Whitehaven in their fourth round tie. It's going to be tough for them at Leeds in the fifth round but the seaisiders thoroughly deserve their place in the sun next month.

# WAITING GAME PAYS OFF FOR WOODSY



He's larger than life and he's back on the frontline where he belongs. New Director of Rugby at York Dave Woods spoke to BEN COLLINS

**A**ll good things come to those who wait - and Dave Woods has been doing plenty of that over the last year. The Australian coach has been kicking his heels since leaving Gateshead in January 2009 but earlier this month he returned to professional coaching as director of rugby at York City Knights.

Woods led Castleford to promotion to Super League in 2005 and Gateshead into the Championship in 2008. But his contract was not renewed by Cas and Woods was sacked over disputed financial irregularities shortly after steering Gateshead to promotion.

Wood fought the claims and has had to bide his time before the next opportunity presented itself, as it did with a phone call from Knights general manager Ian Wilson.

**"I've really missed it, it's great to be back"**

"It just came out of the blue," said Woods. "I was in the car and I got a call asking if I'd be interested."

"I spoke to my wife about it, worked out what was best for me and the family, and I rang back the next day and we got things sorted."

"I knew a fair bit about the club, it's a really nice city and the club's got a good set-up. I've really missed it, it's great to be back. I've been doing things and kept my hand in but it's not the same as the weekly grind - training in midweek, the build-up to a game every week and the pressure of trying to get a result."

Woods has certainly kept himself busy during his exile, commentating for BBC radio and writing a

monthly magazine column, along with coaching duties in the St Helens club's junior set-up.

The 45-year-old, who still lives in Gateshead, was also appointed coach of GB's under-18s, a position he will retain alongside his duties at York.

"I'll continue to do that," he said. "They have a few trial games this year but a lot of it's in pre-season as well so it won't interfere with York at all."

"I was also asked to go into a few schools in the North East and help with coaching there, and at St Helens too because Mick Potter's a good mate of mine."

"But I've got a two-year contract here until end of 2011 so I want to make the most of it and hopefully make it longer. I live just off the A1 so I jump on there and it's about an hour-and-a half down so it's not too bad."

"At this stage we're staying but down the track, if I can get a longer contract, we might look at moving."

James Ratcliffe had been top dog at the Huntington Stadium and remains as head coach with the assistance of Mick Ramsden and close-season recruit Chris Thorman.

"I'll be in charge of all the rugby league matters," explained Woods. "James is the coach and will make team selections but I will assist James and the other coaches by giving them my side of things."

"I'll also help them with training and recruiting players, and we'll look at the junior set-up to see how we can improve the scholarships and assist the junior coaches."

"The standard's a bit better and the competition's a lot harder, but I don't think things have changed that much since I've been away," he added. "It's an easy game really, it's just that players and coaches try to complicate it!"

Few have had both the experience and success of Woods in the second and third tier of the English game.

But he insists he was not surprised it took this long for the next opportunity to present itself after his departure from Gateshead.

"It was difficult because it came at a bad time," said Woods. "I'd already prepared for pre-season and we'd started recruiting players, and everyone else already had their coaches for the new season."

"It looked as though I'd have an opportunity to go to Barrow, so I was looking forward to that, but then Gateshead went into administration so they gave Steve McCormack the job."

"It was just one of those things, I just had to bide my time."

York have won three of the six opening Championship One games this year, including a 72-14 defeat of Gateshead in their last home game.

The Knights go into this weekend's home game with Hornets RL level with the Rochdale outfit and Woods believes they can go on to launch a play-off challenge this season.

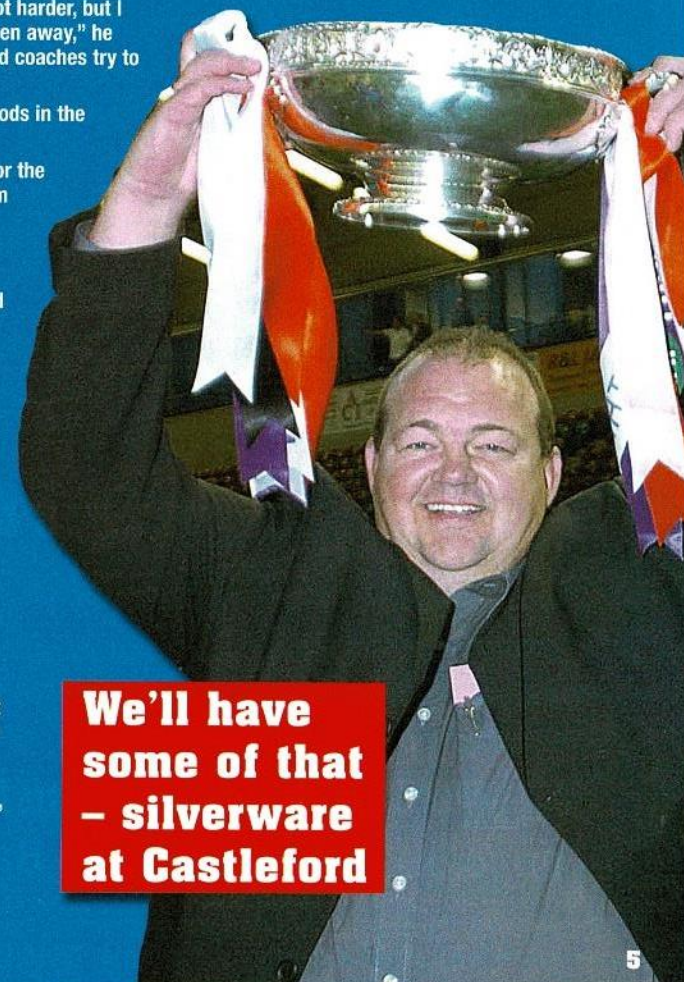
"I think we can get promotion, I really do," he said. "It is a tough competition. Hunslet are the early leaders and Blackpool are also doing well."

"It's going to be tight for places but with the start the team has had, there is something there we can build on."

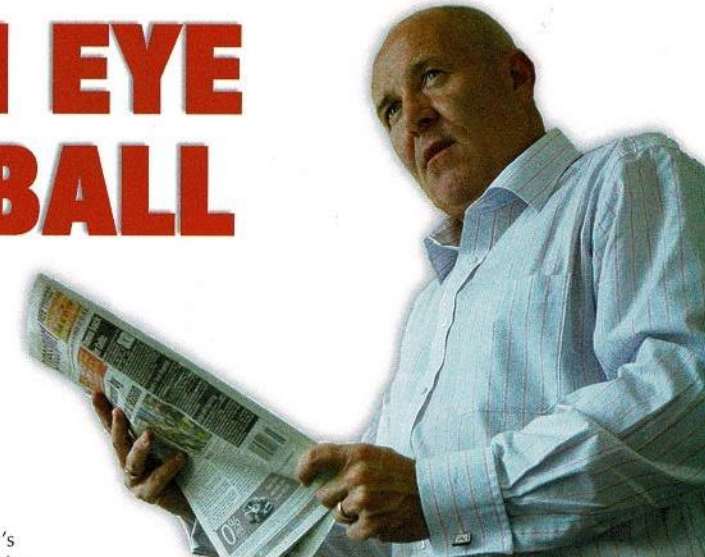

I DID a radio interview on Monday morning – journalists can usually rely on other journalists as rent-a-quote sources which is handy when, like sharks circling a victim leaking blood, they sniff a story coming on.

The subject in a round-about fashion was Barrow's stunning win at Castleford, a fantastic effort considering not only that they were on 'foreign' turf, but also that they had conceded a very healthy, nay you'd almost guarantee a 'winning' position, to their Super League hosts.

We've all seen the underdogs give it their gallant best for 40 minutes, or even an hour, before succumbing like the best built sandcastle on Blackpool beach. That tide's a-coming in and there's nothing you or King Canute can do about it.

Instead they chose to run the ball and nearly paid the price when they coughed up possession and the Tigers came oh-so close to a score that would not only have levelled matters but won the game.

And yet there was still time for Ned Catic to hammer the final nail in Terry Matterson's coffin ... oops, slip of the tongue. I meant the Tigers' coffin, although that was the subject of my radio interview – Terry Matterson's fate, not Steve McCormack and his band of merry Raiders. The Barrow boss is one of the more amiable characters in the coaching business and he's been on the ropery end of lop-sided results enough not to take any great pleasure in the discomfort his team's fabulous performance inflicted on the already besieged Matterson.

"So Danny," asked my excited interviewer, "is Terry Matterson under pressure this morning?" ... Is the Pope a Catholic? I might have replied but didn't ... "Will this result make or break Castleford's season?" ... well it will certainly allow them to make plans for a Wembley weekend in August. But they needn't bother packing their boots and jock straps ... and finally the really tough one: "SHOULD Castleford sack Terry Matterson?"

At least now you know why the radio jock telephoned another journalist and not the Castleford coach himself.

"So Terry, should the board give you the boot?" Would you like to ask that question of a bloke who played State of Origin and barely noticed when he yanked his entire finger off in pre-season?

That couldn't happen in professional sport and especially not in a civilised, family friendly one like Rugby League? Actually no, it probably wouldn't. Probably.

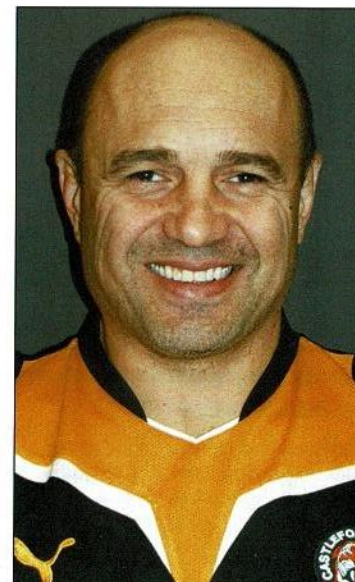

# Mr Smith is learning on the job

The 2010 season has already been a steep learning curve for Swinton's Paul Smith. The second-row forward has made his first foray into coaching this year, combining his playing duties with the role of head coach.

Paul Kidd stepped up to become director of rugby, giving Smith the opportunity to pass on the know-how he has gleaned from a playing career which has included three years in Super League with Huddersfield.

Smith sure has a lot on his hands as he is also a Maths teacher, and the 30-year-old has had a few lessons of his own as he gets accustomed to the demands of his new position.

"It's been difficult but I've enjoyed it," he said. "It's not as easy as just picking your team. People being ill or missing training, it all makes a big difference and you have to sit back and weigh up the options.

"You don't realise how much the little things can affect you until you have a coaching job.

"I've been captain before so giving out instructions is not totally new. But there's a lot of extra things to do like looking at videos and statistics."

Injuries have forced Smith to remain very much in the firing line on the field and that has been frustrating for the former Halifax man as he aims to find a solution to the team's inconsistent start.

The Lions have won just two of their opening five games in Championship One, including convincing defeats at Blackpool (54-6) and Hunslet (46-12).

And although Swinton were beaten again in the Challenge Cup fourth round last week by Halifax, Smith saw enough to be convinced they can soon get their league campaign back on track.

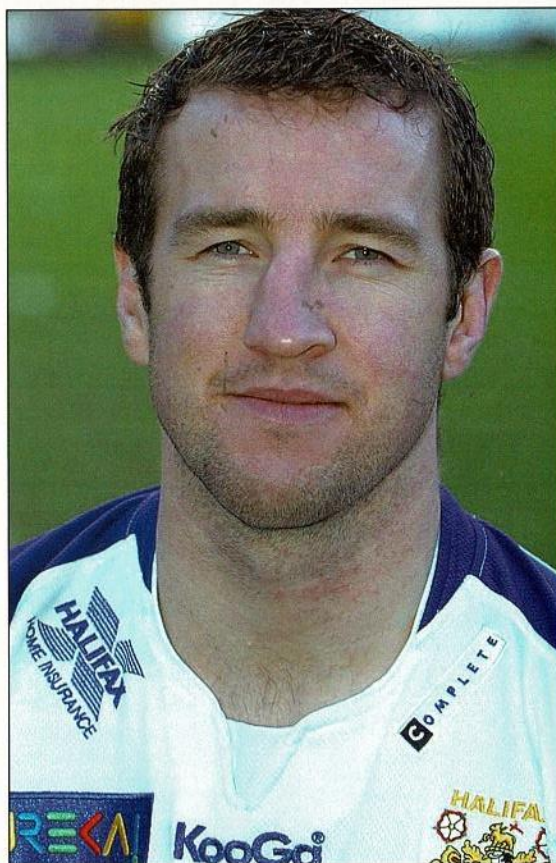
"There's been times where I've wanted to step back to watch the team and see where we need to improve, but it has been difficult with the injuries and people leaving the team," said Smith.

"I've not had that opportunity yet but I've got Paul Kidd alongside me and assistant coach Wes Rogers, so if I'm playing they can help guide the team.

"We'd liked to have had more wins," he added.

"We've not played consistently well for 80 minutes in any

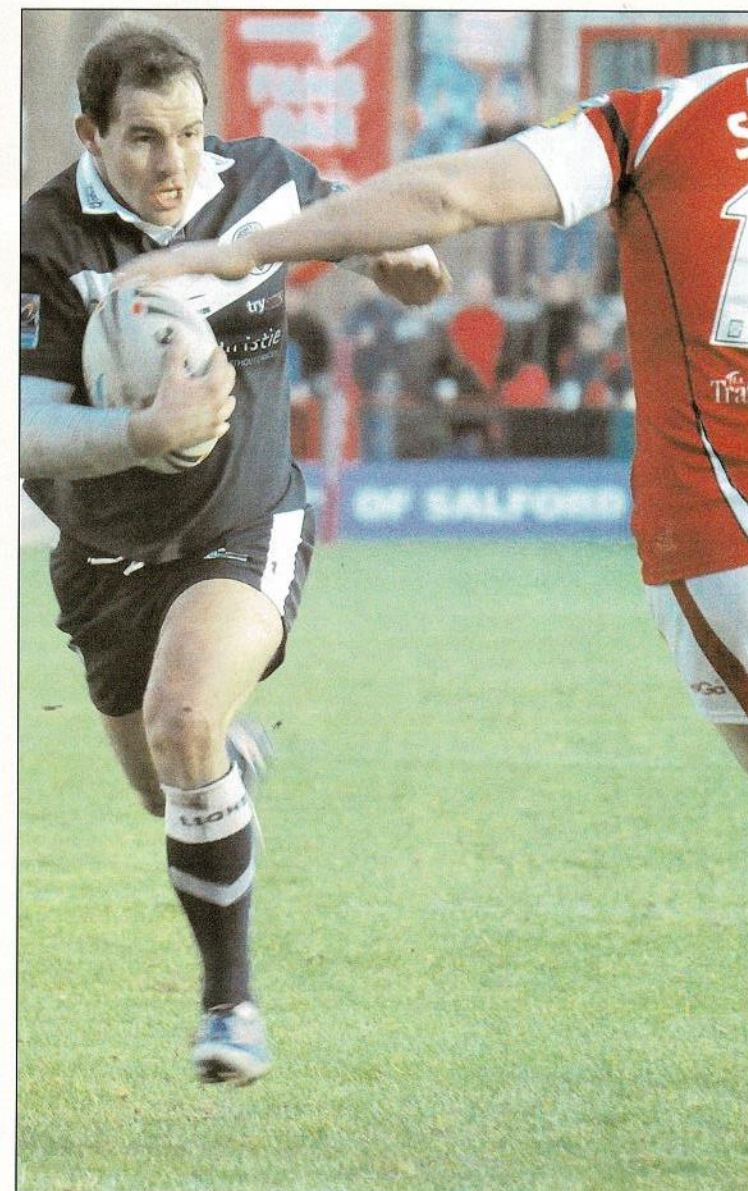
As a Maths teacher, Swinton player-coach Paul Smith is used to conveying his knowledge in a classroom. This term he finds himself in 'work experience' mode

of the games. Against Blackpool and Hunslet - they're our rivals and really we should be pushing them, but we just weren't competitive and we fell short in lots of areas.

"But I think we were very competitive in the first half against Halifax, who are obviously one of the best

Championship teams.

"In the second it got away from us a little bit but I thought as a team we came together.

"We haven't been playing well but it was a definite improvement. We're starting to gel as a team and we got several players back who I think will make a big difference.

"I've not been happy and I've tried to change things round to see what works, and even though we've lost a few, there's definitely signs we're heading in the right direction."

This weekend Swinton return to league action with a home game against South Wales Scorpions.

While the new club lack Swinton's pedigree, they have shown they are already a competitive outfit.

Smith believes the Lions cannot afford to become the Scorpions' latest scalp and accepts it is time they started living up to pre-season expectations.

"I still think we can turn it round and I think this weekend's game is vital, not just in terms of getting a result but in how we play," he said.

"I'm confident we've got the players to turn it round and I think we've got our best team available now.

"Hopefully I don't have to make too many changes now and we can just march on from here.

"We'd like to be challenging and our main goal is to improve from last season. We finished seventh, and we're behind that now, so we need to kick on a bit more to achieve our goals and make the play-offs.

"South Wales are a new team so we don't know that much about them. They've had a pretty good start and done better than a lot of people expected.

"But it's up to us really. I think a lot of people have mentioned it that if you look at our squad on paper, we have got some good players and should be doing better than we're doing.

"We've got to play as a team and play to our potential, which we started to do in that first half against Halifax."

And Swinton's pedigree is something Smith is looking to tap into as he aims to lead the Lions forward.

The club still play their home games outside Swinton, at Sedgley Park RU in neighbouring Prestwich, while they train at Eccles rugby league club.

And although there has been little progress with plans to move back to the area, which was home to two championship-winning sides in the 1960's, Smith insists that remains the long-term vision.

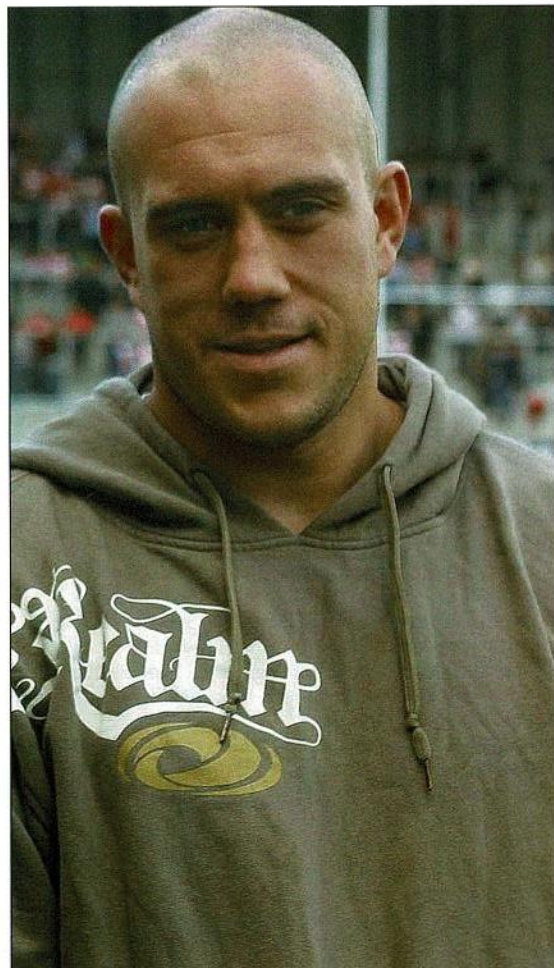
"Sedgley Park doesn't really feel like home and from a club point of view it'd be better to be back in Swinton, although on-field success is important as well," he said.

"I still bump into fans that used to support the club in Swinton, and the only way we're going to get fans like that back is if we're back in the area."

# IRONMAN

THEY'RE the blokes in the boiler-room, the ones who lay the platform for the 'pretty boys' in the backs to run in the points – they are the Ironmen of Rugby League, the forwards. And this season Game On is making a special award at the end of the season to an Ironman from both the Co-operative Championship and Championship 1 competitions. Each week in league competitions only – no Northern Rail or Challenge Cup matches to count – points are awarded by match reporters to the best three operators from the two packs on view. What makes an impression? It can be 80-minute workrate, big hits, or skill and craft in the heart of the battle, hence hookers and loose-forwards picking up a healthy ration of points. So far some 53 forwards from the 11 Championship teams have got in the points and even more – 59 – in Championship 1. It means that with the bulk of the league season to come there is plenty of scope for players to make a name for themselves in the toughest engine room in sport – the Rugby League forward pack

In the Championship, 'surprise' early form horses Leigh have the leader in the Co-operative Championship Ironman running in prop Rickey Bibey. The ex-Super League packman has turned in a series of impressive performances as Leigh joined Featherstone Rovers in setting the pace, getting in the points four times to set an



early leader's mark of 10pts after six games for the Centurions. With Featherstone having a tremendous start to their campaign it's no surprise that two of their most redoubtable performers are on Bibey's tail. Jamie Field was in the points on three occasions and comes in on 8pts, while the ever-reliable 'Mr Featherstone' Stuart Dickens has also been in the reckoning on three occasions and is there on 6pts, where he is joined by another of the Rovers stars of 2010, Jon Grayshon. And it isn't just the star turns that get their efforts noticed. Twice Batley's big man Sean Hesketh has received top marks to join them on 6pts, while in a struggling season so far for his club, Kyle Amor has been Mr Dependable for Whitehaven and come in three times on 2pts to join the group on 6pts, one ahead of his teammate, hooker Graeme Mattinson.

**Rickey Bibey - in great form for the Centurions**

In the Co-operative Championship 1 the Game On Player of the Month for March not surprisingly topped the Ironman standings also in what has been a fairytale start to 2010 for Martin Crompton's men Blackpool. Andy Hobson brought his vast experience to bear in leading the Panthers line although teammates Martin Keavney, Paul Anderson, Paul Alcock and Kris Ratcliffe have also caught the eye. Meanwhile Jarrad Stack, Workington Town's resident Aussie has also been in super-consistent form as signified by his Team of the Month for March inclusion. Just to prove that it isn't just the big men taking the glory, Hunslet loose forward David March has twice got a top 3pt score as the Hawks prove themselves the early front-running

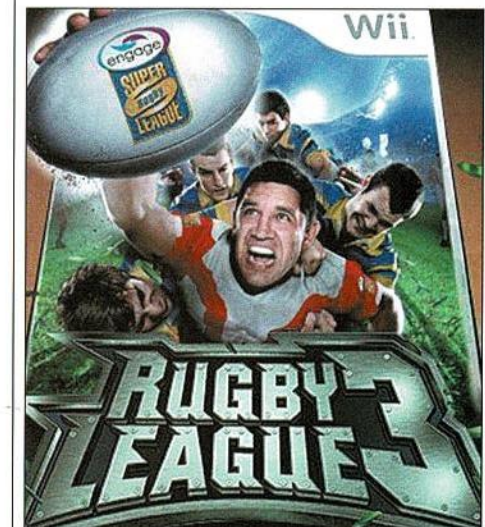

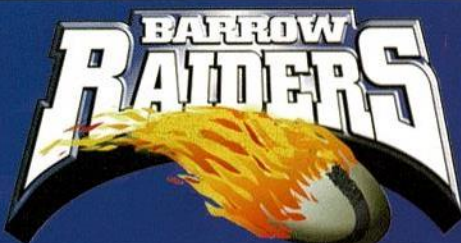

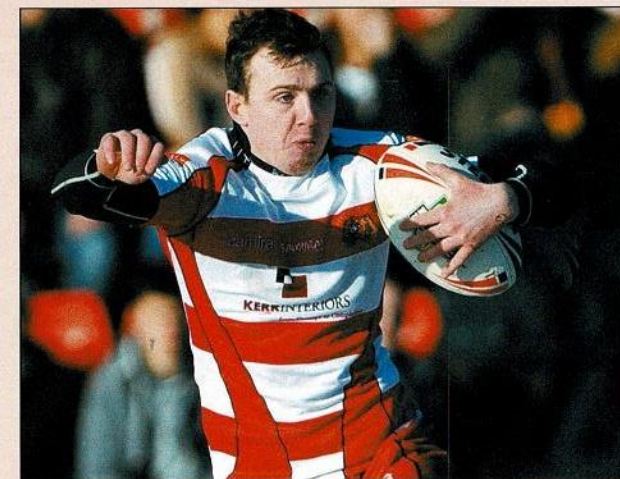

Special congratulations must go to Barrow for their result against Castleford. Theirs was the stand-out result of the round and a big result for Cumbrian rugby league.

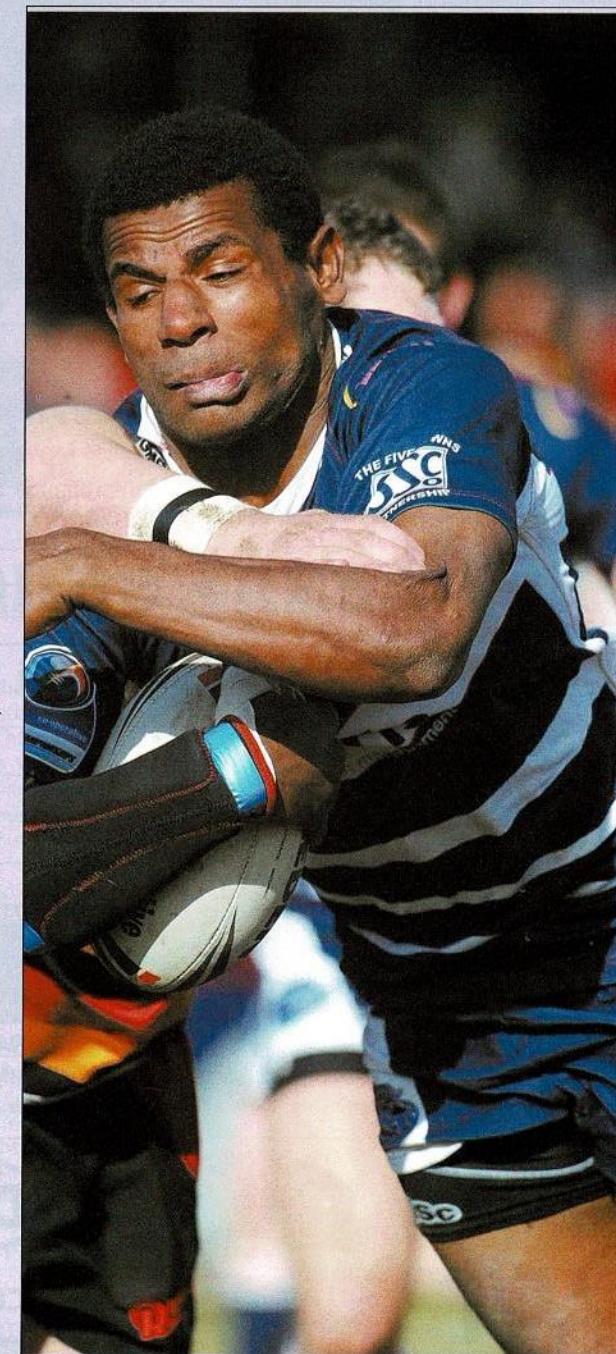
Tonight is our first outing on Sky this season and I think the development of the club as a whole will be there for all to see. We have a quality group of players who the supporters have really got behind so far.

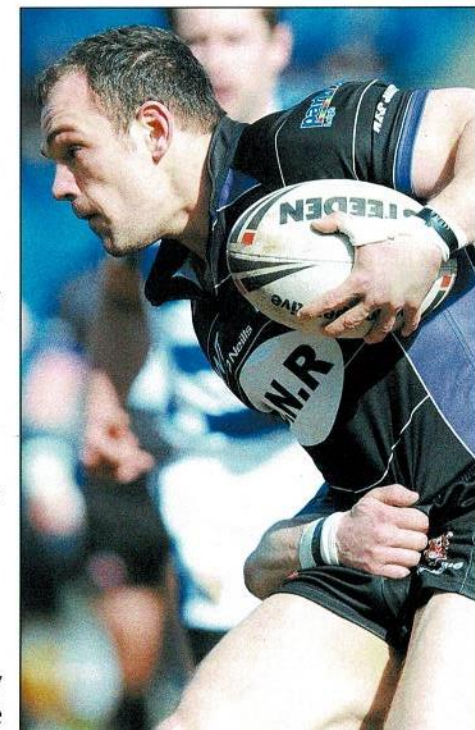
We have been to Toulouse twice now in the Championship and I have nothing but praise for the way that they go about their business.

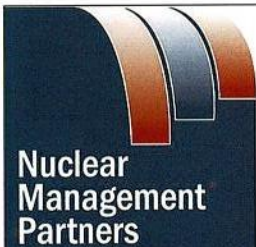

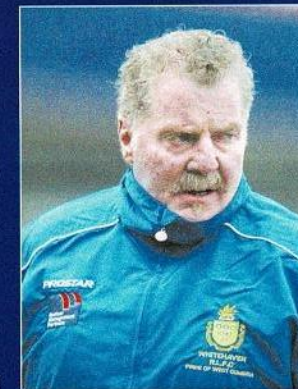
We have obviously had some great moments and winning efforts, but far more incidents of mistakes, injuries and less-than-professional efforts.

Our aim is to win all our home games and a few on the road, and if we can achieve that, we'll finish the season in a reasonable position.

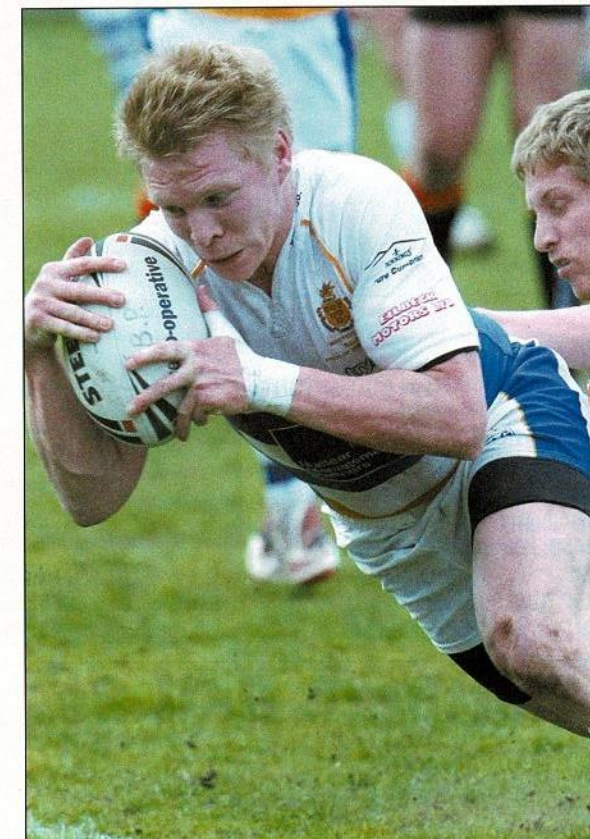
We've had some very entertaining games with Halifax over recent years and enjoyed some success.

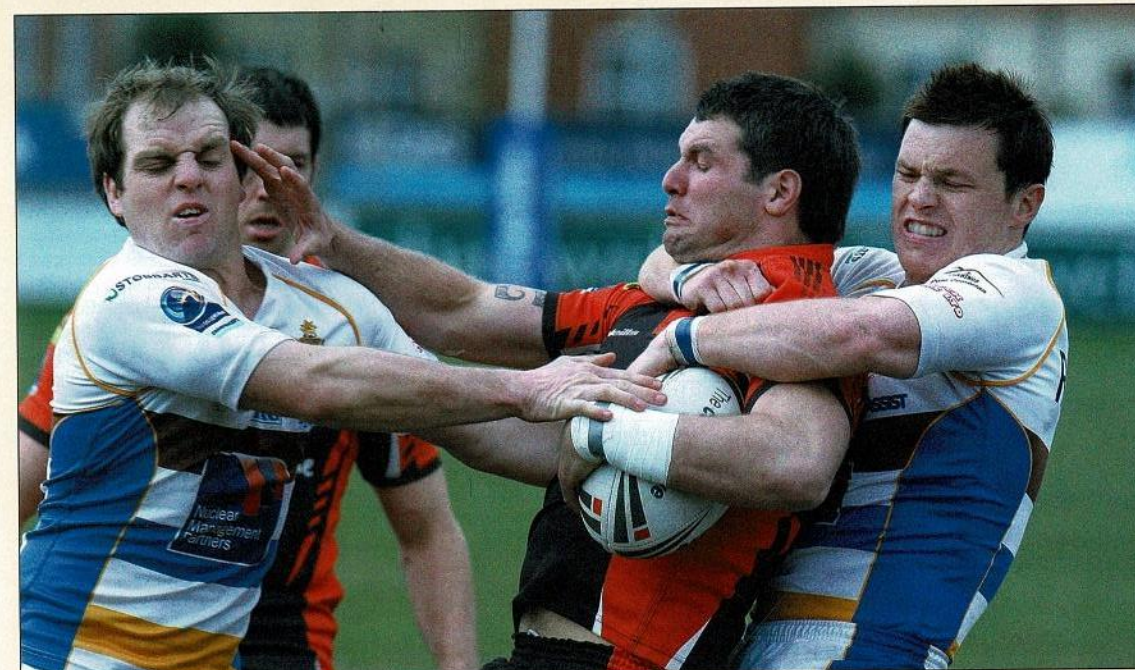

Whilst we had a week off from competitive games last weekend, there certainly hasn't been any let off in the intensity of the training, although it did allow some of our players to recover from injuries.

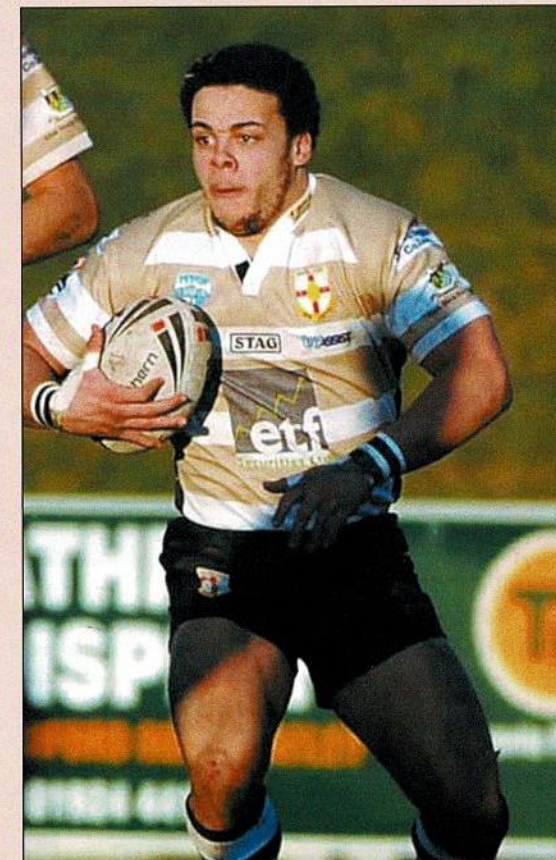

It's important that the premier side provide a strong playing side both for players dropping out of the first team and as a springboard for up-and-coming players to make their mark and force their way up to Championship 1 level.

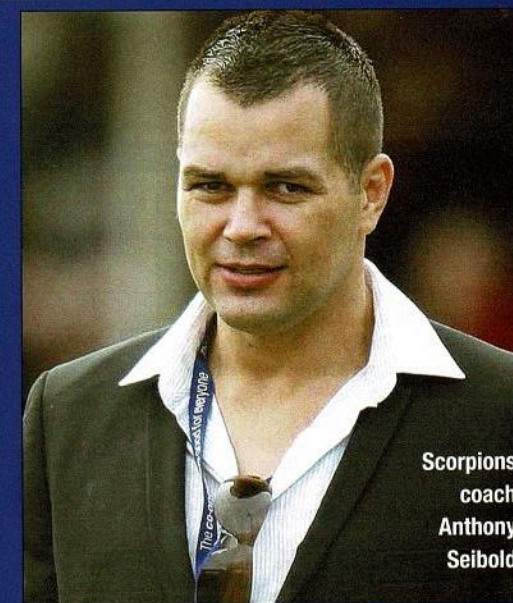

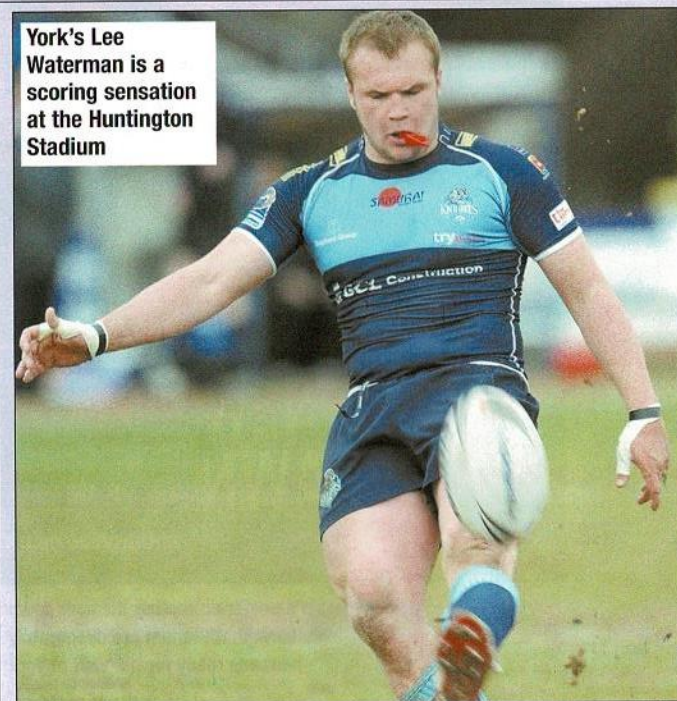

# Oldham appeal for help making 'a new dawn'

OLDHAM are battling against the clock in order to get Whitebank Stadium ready for when York City Knights come to town on Sunday, May 9.

Anxious club officials have again appealed to fans for help and coach Tony Benson has warned that if essential work is not completed in time it will be a "devastating" financial blow.

Four out-of-town home games this season, all at Sedgley Park, Whitefield, have produced fewer than 2,000 fans in total. Three of them were on Mondays and the one Sunday game was against Welsh amateurs Blackwood Bulldogs in the Carnegie Challenge Cup.

The club made nothing out of the Challenge Cup – beaten at Hunslet last Sunday and watched by only 509 – and it is banking on much bigger crowds when it can stage home games at its new ground in Limehurst Village.

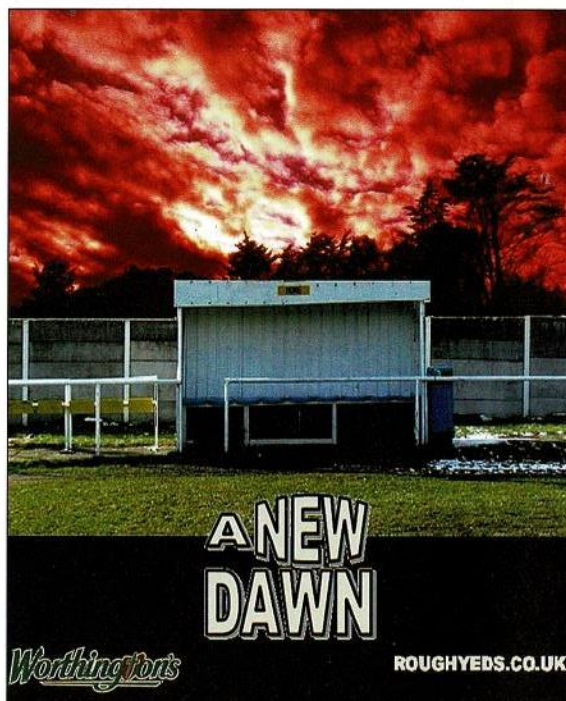
Said Benson: "It is essential we are in our new home for that match but unless we get more helpers quickly there is a danger it won't happen and that would be a serious blow to the club. We are relying on fans but so far it has been the same few every time and we need more help.

"There is a lot of enthusiasm among supporters. Hundreds of them can't wait to see the team run out at Whitebank, but it needs to be reflected in the numbers who are prepared to roll up their sleeves."

Benson coached the team on Saturday and then dashed straight to Warrington's old ground at Wilderspool where he and scrum-half Matty Ashe helped to load 350 seats on to a lorry for delivery to Whitebank.

Six Oldham fans had dismantled them the day before from high up in the main stand – an operation that lasted five hours.

Back at Whitebank, new main gates are being fitted; large areas are being cleared of rubble and undergrowth to create car park space; a fence down the top side of the pitch,

but inside the complex, is being moved back three metres; and the whole ground is being painted.

One volunteer said: "The impossible we do at once, miracles take a little longer. But I appeal to fellow fans to join us – the camaraderie is second to none."

Another, Sam Kershaw of Daisy Nook, has taken a week off work to do his labour of love and has designed two promotional posters called, 'New Dawn' which have been adopted by the club and posted on the Roughyeds' website.

Said 22-year-old Sam, the team's mascot in the 1994-95 season: "If Whitebank can be anything like as atmospheric as Watersheddings – and I'm sure it will be – fans will be in for a treat after 13 years travelling all over the place."

Work at the ground is done seven days a week and most evenings, but fans wanting to help are advised to ring the club first on 0161 628 3677.

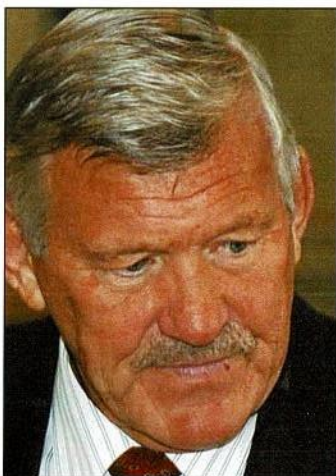

Blackpool Panthers had their share of giant killing with a battling 24-18 win over Championship team Whitehaven.

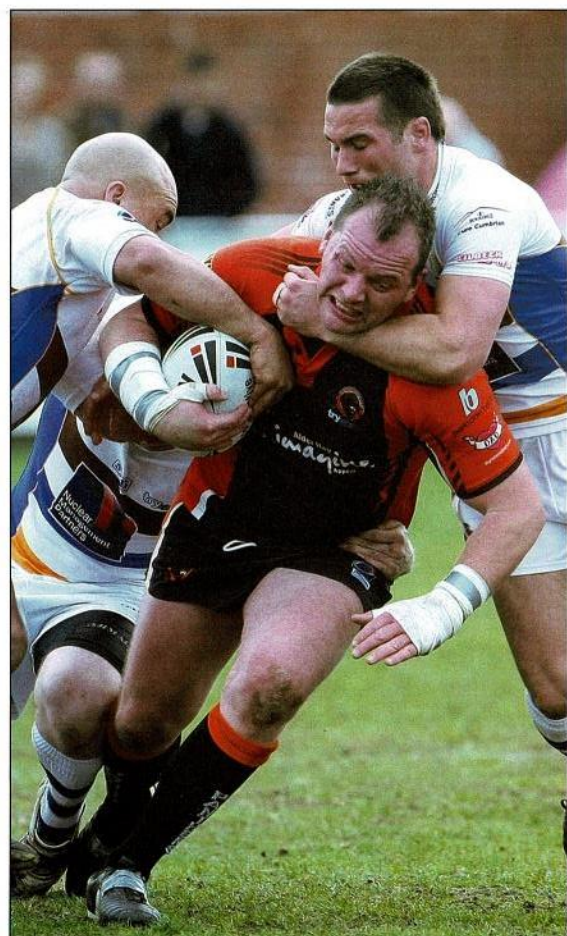

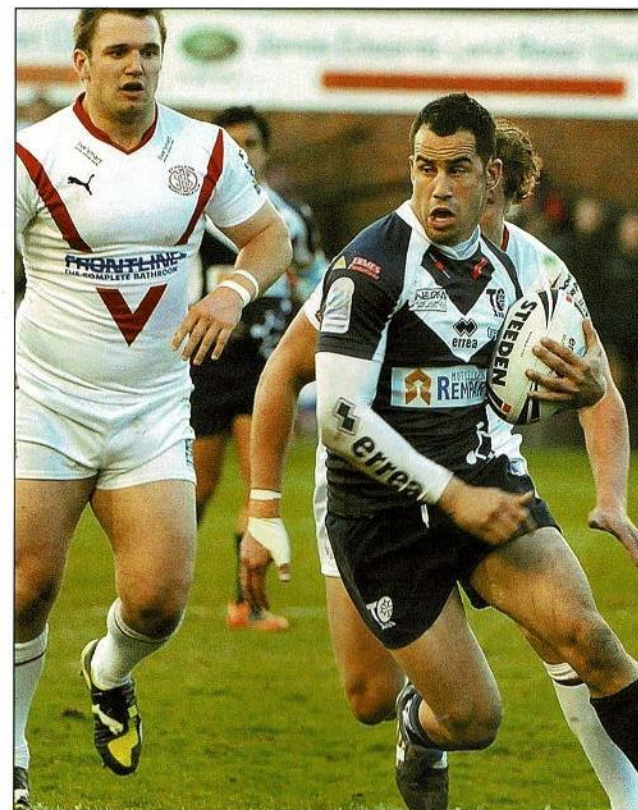
