

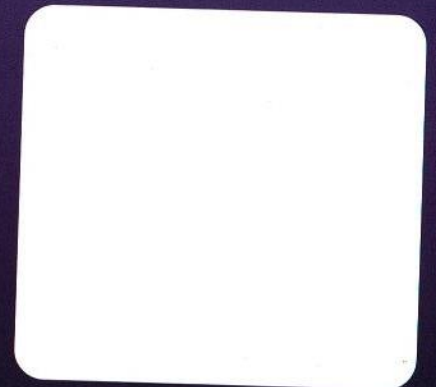

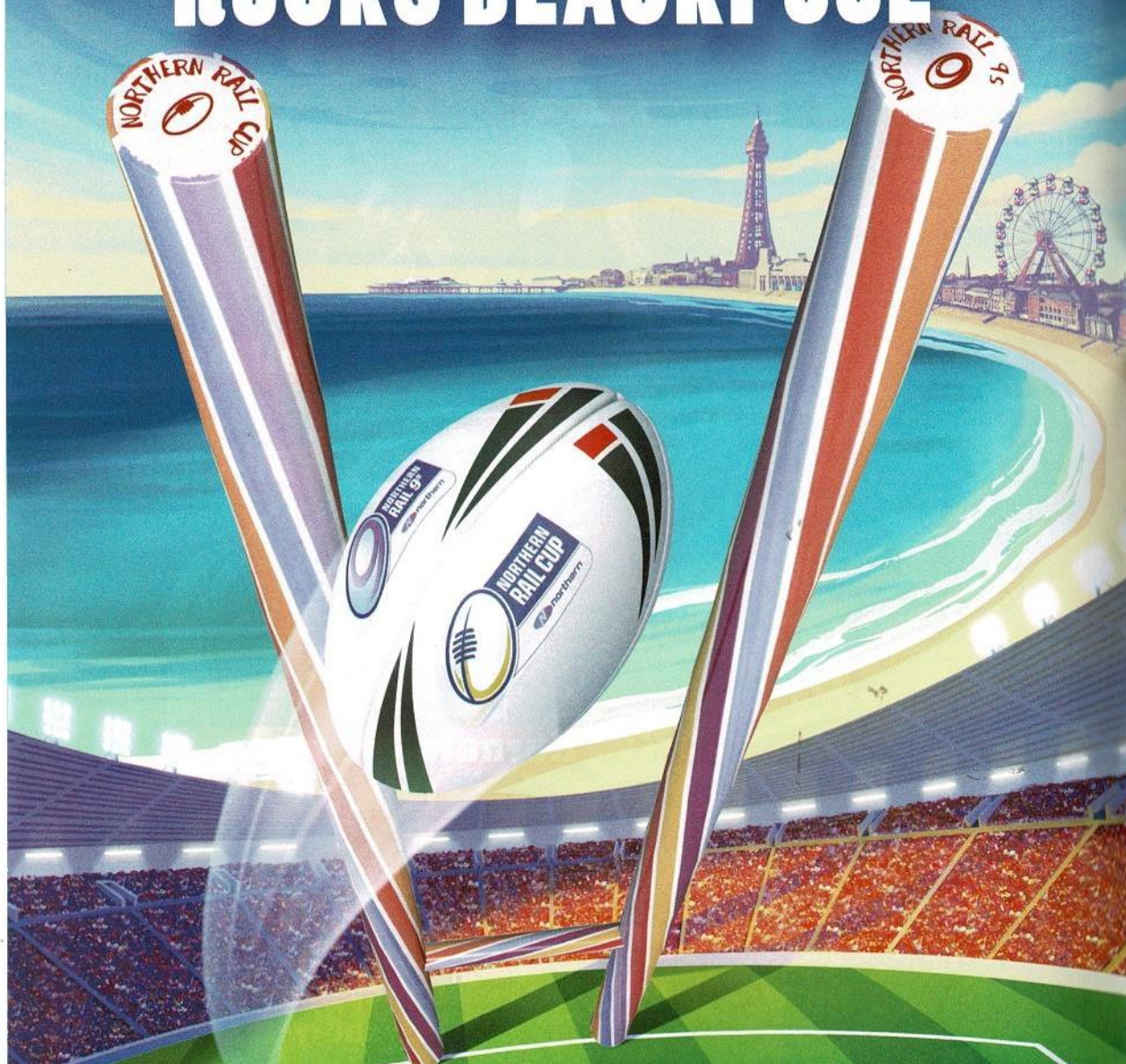

Whilst it may have been missing from Bloemfontein, there was plenty of passion and commitment in evidence at the Tetley's Stadium where Dewsbury Rams pipped Halifax by seven points in a 67-point contest.

Since beating Keighley it seems the Rams are on a roll - or should that be a baguette as they host Toulouse this Saturday?

The Frenchmen certainly made their mark last week by bursting the bubble of Batley Bulldogs at Mount Pleasant in a truly crazy contest and then putting Whitehaven to the sword. They are clearly adapting well to the Championship and bring a real sense of joie de vivre to the competition.

Featherstone Rovers are racing away at the top and maintained their six-point lead with a 30-22 win over Widnes Vikings in another thriller - but how will they fare against a wounded Keighley side at Cougar Park on Sunday?

After a positive run of form the Cougars have hit a bad patch since losing out to Dewsbury and then Widnes in the Northern Rail Cup semi-final before finishing second again at Leigh last Sunday.

Despite a gutsy display you can bet that Barry Eaton's side will not give up the ghost despite this being a top-versus-bottom clash.

With Oldham having a week off, Hunslet Hawks continue to set the pace in Championship One and made easy work of the London Skolars last weekend but the Roughyeds can close the gap if they beat Gateshead this Sunday when Hunslet face a tricky trip to Swinton Lions.

Finally, if I was to suggest to you a full day of blistering, quickfire Rugby League action with change from a tenner, I suspect you'd bite my hand off or get me sectioned!

That's what you'll be getting for £9 with 18 clubs competing for the Northern Rail 9s at Fylde on Saturday July 17.

That notwithstanding there were some memorable contributions from both teams and individuals and some significant moves within the division.

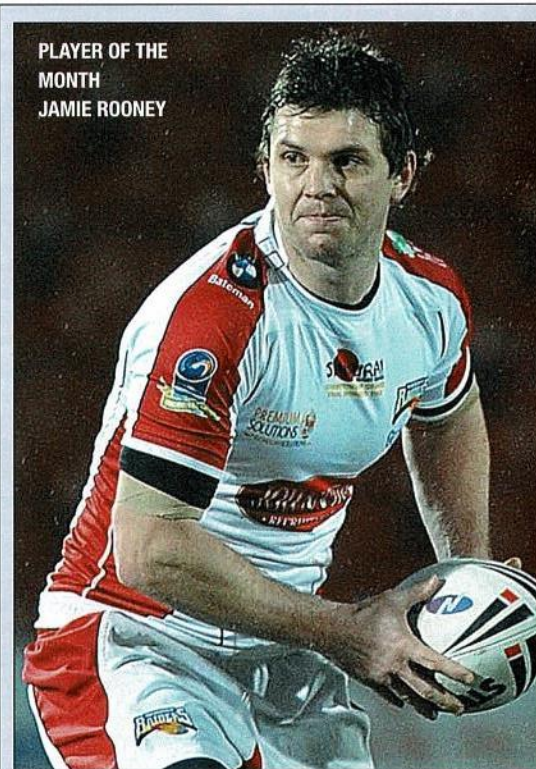

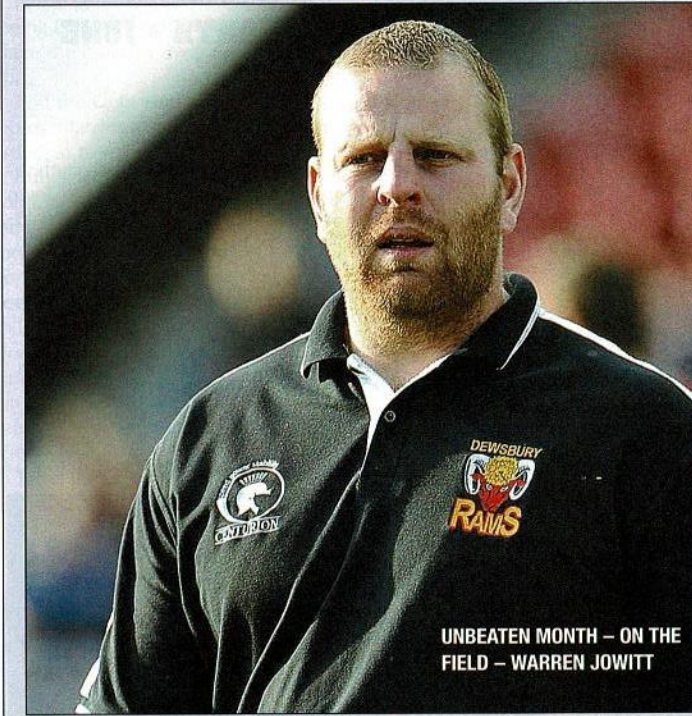
WARREN JOWITT, DEWSBURY RAMS

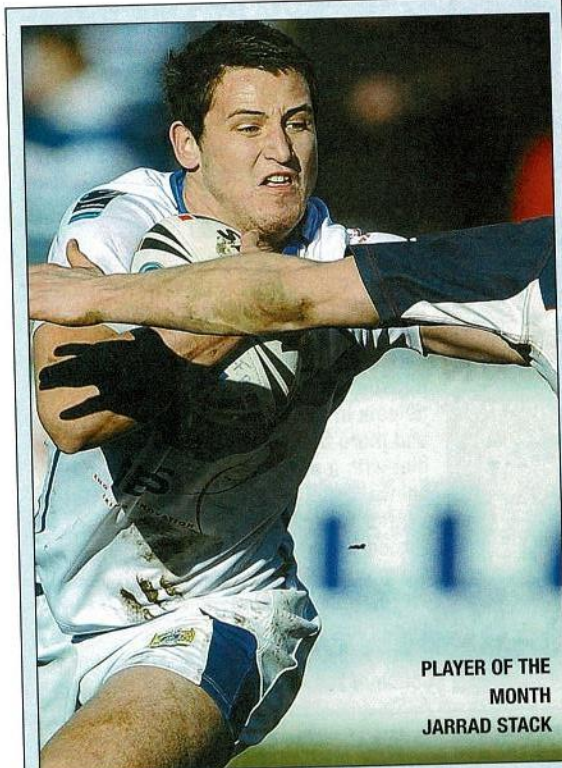

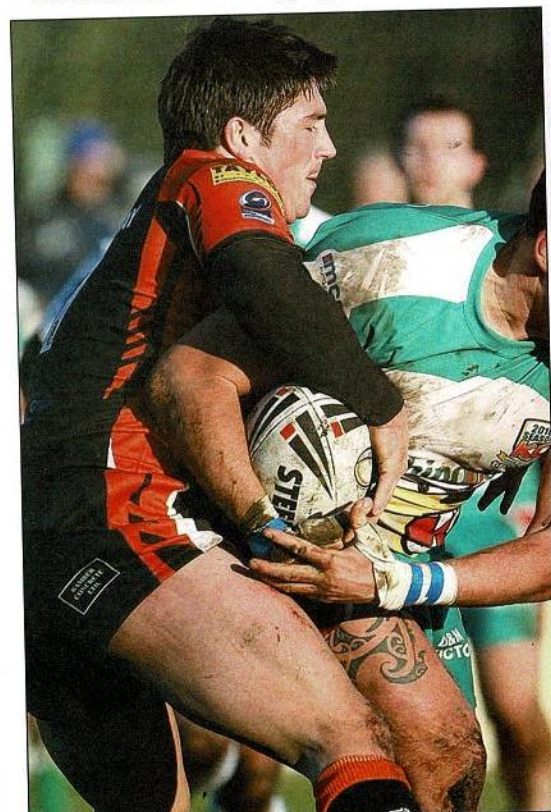

In the end they have to settle for seeing Lunt and centre Shaun Leaf make the monthly award-winning line-up.

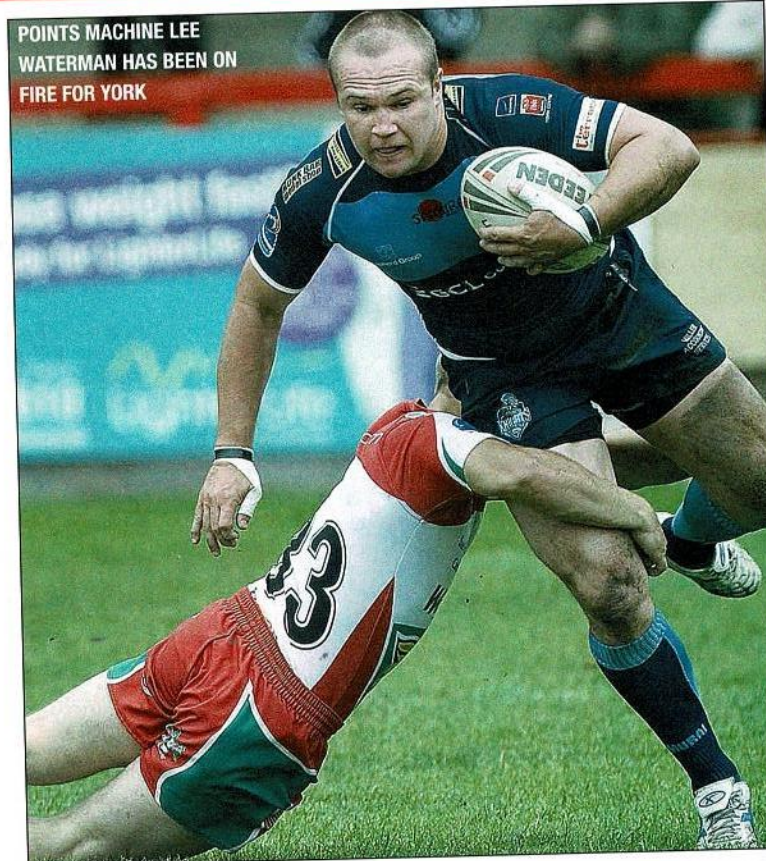
And the Dons duo aren't the only representatives from 'down the batting order' so to speak.

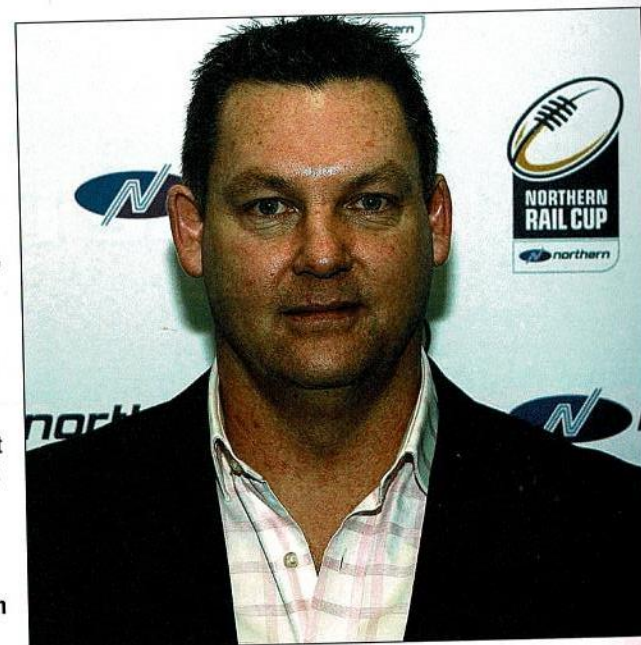
COACH OF THE MONTH - JUNE TONY BENSON - OLDHAM RLFC

BATLEY'S busiest boozier will most likely be quiet on the lunchtime of Sunday July 18th, though I suspect the Irish National Club – 'the Nash' – might be heaving by 10pm once the hordes have returned from Blackpool.

As I write the Bulldogs are looking at trying to put a special train on from the town's own station for their big day out in the Northern Rail Cup final. What an occasion that would be, though excuse me if I don't volunteer to be a conductor on that particular service. In fact I'll go further – the club simply has to make it happen, because it would be a massive PR victory not only for the town, the club and the competition, but for the sponsors also.

A party atmosphere may well prevail and given that train companies positively encourage the imbibing of alcoholic refreshments on board, the decibel level inside that train may well exceed anything to follow inside Bloomfield Road later that afternoon.

I was going to say it isn't so long ago that chartered trains used to be a permanent feature of the mill and mining towns of the industrial north, when Working Men's Clubs took their annual children's treat to the seaside, but I might be showing my age there. I can certainly remember visits to Blackpool and Southport, Scarborough, Bridlington and Cleethorpes, though most were by bus.

It was in a mini-bus however that I accompanied a bunch of Batley RLFC diehards to Blackpool in 1978, to witness the first match of the Kangaroos' tour – and actually saw one of the most stunning, sidestepping runs up the old home of Blackpool Borough that I've ever witnessed.

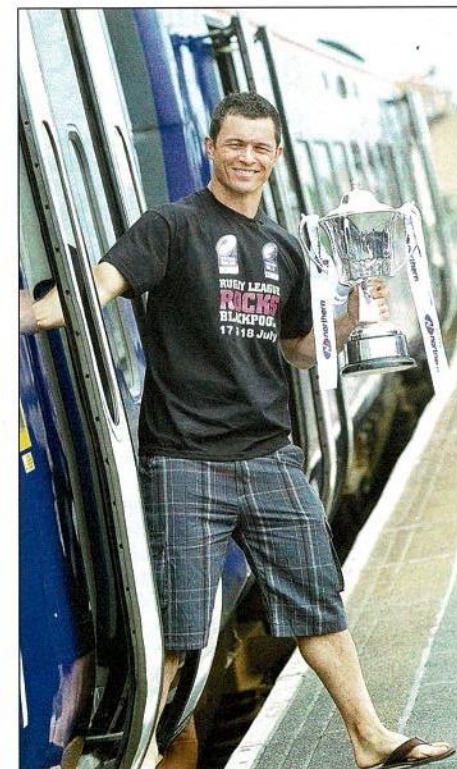
That fact that the Blackpool team of the time qualified to take on the might of the 1978 Australians should give heart to Martin Crompton and his 2010 troops. The top eight clubs got to play the tourists and Bak Diabira and his men, under coach Albert Fearnley, had earned that honour. I don't recall the exact score but think it was something like 37-1 – Blackpool's talismanic scrum half Diabira landed the home team's solitary drop goal.

And I should mention that that was an Aussie tour party featuring the likes of Bobby Fulton, Rod Reddy, Ray Price, Mick Cronin, Geoff Gerrard, Graham Eadie, Les Boyd etc...

There we were, a party of Batley lads (though I'm actually Dewsbury born and bred the Lockwoods hail from 'Barfield') on the terrace in the sunshine as the half time whistle blew. Suddenly, up from the dugout where he'd gone to sit alongside his old pal Albert Fearnley, jumped a bare-chested figure. Grabbing the ball (from the ref I think, or it might have been a spare) this chap sprinted onto the field and went on a weaving, mazy run, followed within seconds by a hundred screaming kids.

The packed-out crowd howled laughing. I hung my head in my hands in shame. There was no way the sidestepping, dummifying figure could hear my plaintiff wails of "oh no, Dad!" above the din.

I just hope the Batley fans flocking to Blackpool in a couple of weeks are rather better behaved...



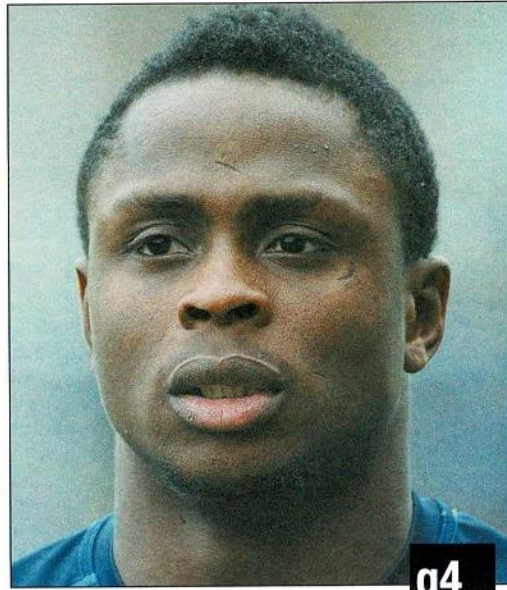

Also there are opportunities to develop within the organisation and people are encouraged to learn new skills and change and extend their roles if appropriate.

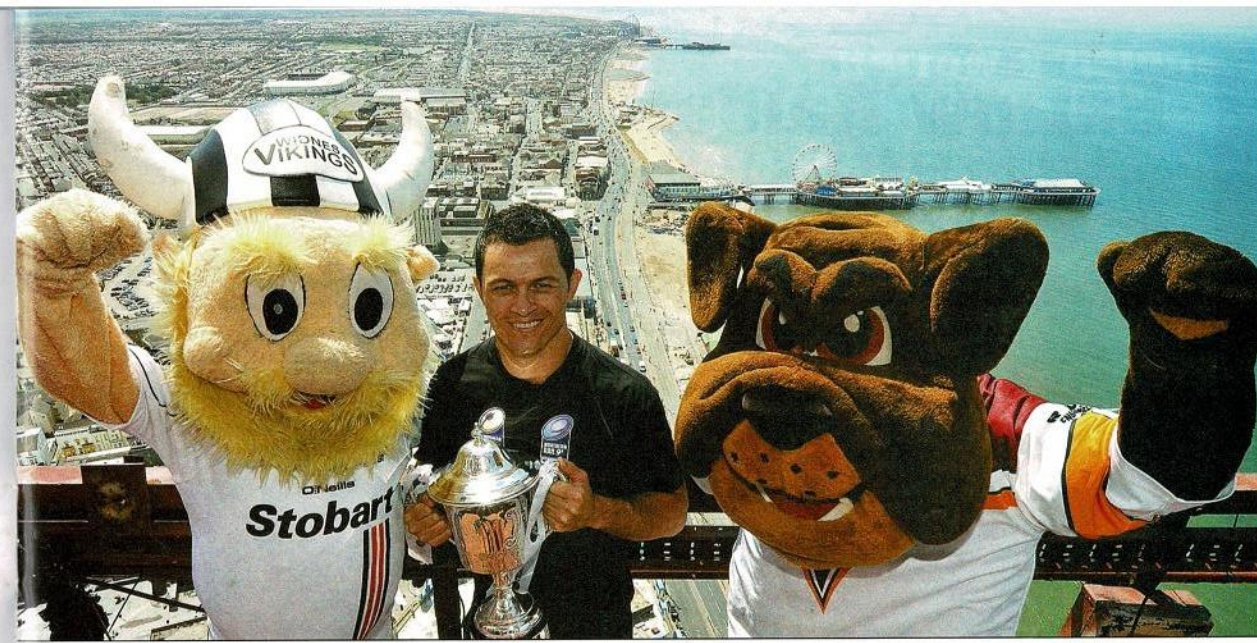
The drinks are on Oldham!

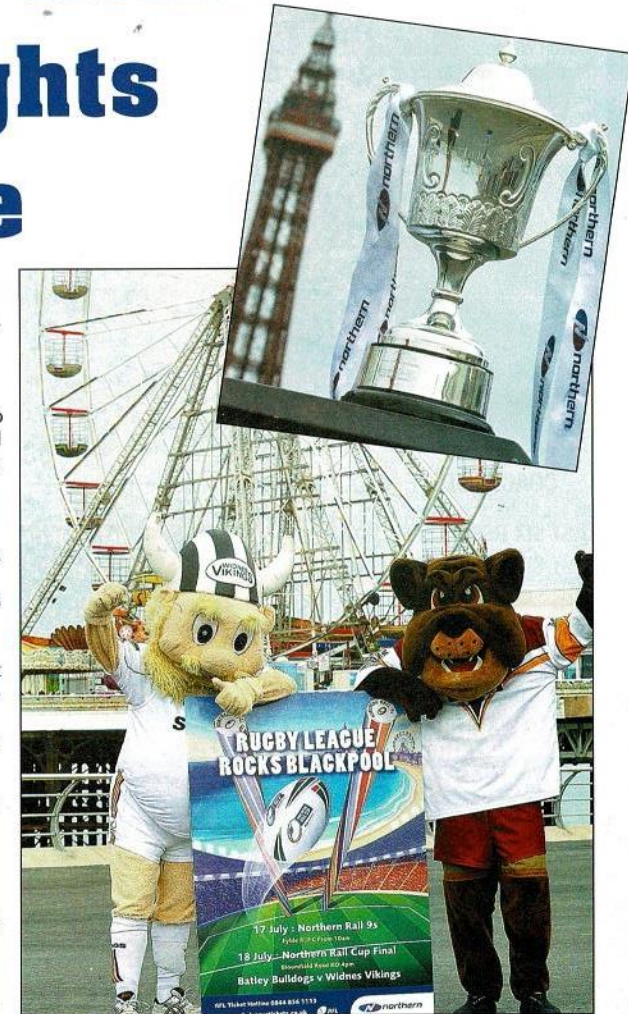

Then we have had five tries in a match by Ben Feehan and Jermaine McGillvary.

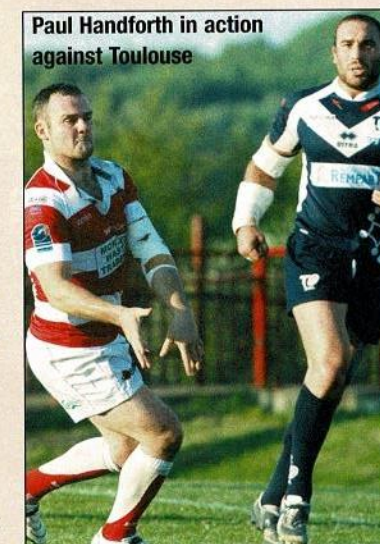
Also the Gateshead game this year gave us two records to Gareth Moore in most points in a game (40) and most goals (16) and a club record score 100-4.

best marketing tool so we all need to promote the game and encourage and badger everybody in Batley who is breathing to turn out at Blackpool as it will be a great day for the town.

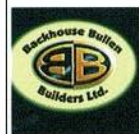
However, today can be a step towards another great day at the Grand Final as I dream again.

I'd just like to thank you all for your continued support throughout the season. It's been a big help to me and the players through some tough times.

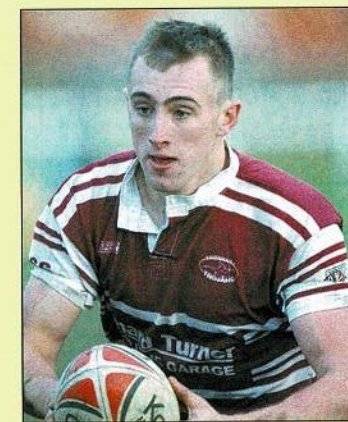
The win against Halifax showed we are a capable side and we've got to kick on from this. As you'll agree, all the season we have competed with all the top teams.

We have been having a tough time of late on the field but we are still making big strides off it.

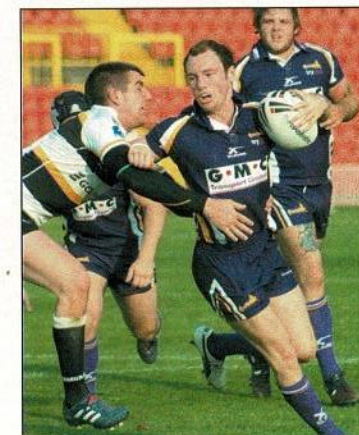
Unfortunately, it is not a chicken and egg situation at this point in time. We need to make the chicken first before we start to lay the golden eggs!

Whilst a lot of things went well, the double header with Quins showed the level of competition there is for people's attention in the sum-

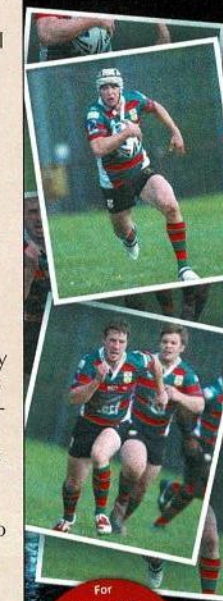
mer, especially when there is a major football tournament taking place. That is an issue that we are always going to face, but particularly hard when neither London club is having a successful playing season.

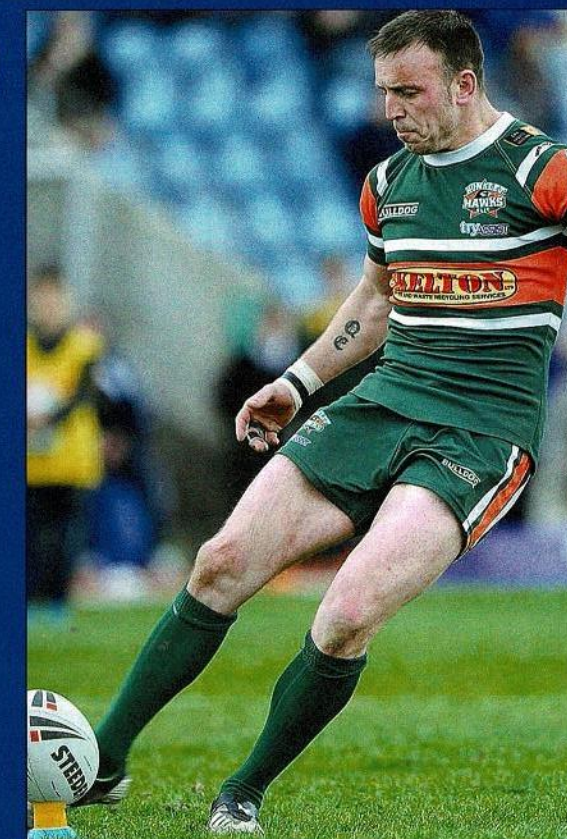

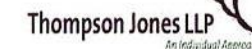

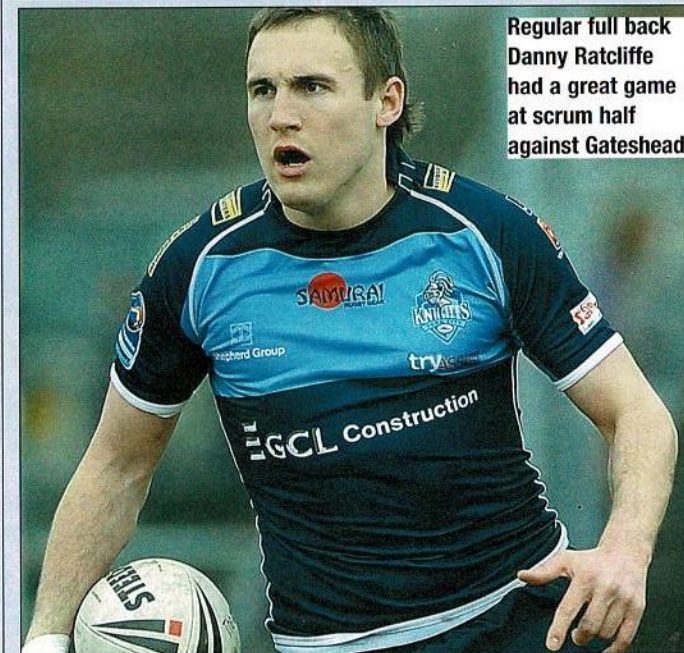

How the co-operative way has transformed two great clubs

Focus on SUPPORTERS DIRECT, the organisation bringing a new perspective to running Rugby League clubs

With an increasing number of clubs hitting financial difficulties in recent years, two clubs have, with the help of Supporters Direct, taken a new approach to club ownership and reformed as co-operatives. Both Rochdale Hornets and Bramley Buffaloes have long histories in rugby league but can this model of ownership see them thrive in their respective leagues, and could supporter ownership of clubs be the answer for other clubs?

I spoke to Mark Wynn (MW), Chairman at Rochdale and Martyn Cheney (MC), Chairman at Bramley to find out their experiences.

What made you decide on the cooperative model of ownership?

Mark Wynn (MW): Hornets as a co-op came about through an initiative from the RFL after the old Rochdale Hornets club had gone into administration. Through a series of phone calls and meetings, the idea of Hornets as a supporter-owned and run club came about.

Martyn Cheney (MC): After the original club was closed down, we wanted to make sure it couldn't happen again. The premise of a co-op owned club means no one person has ownership of the club and no one person has the power to shut it down.

How has the co-op model changed the way the club is run?

MW: Hornets are now much more accountable to their shareholders, i.e. the supporters. We have regular elections, a massive increase in communication and are a lot more open than the previous regime.

In practical terms we've removed the "sugar daddy syndrome" from the club. Although we couldn't have launched without the backing of Paul Ormerod, it's now up to us to make the business work. As has been seen at so many clubs, when the financial backer gets bored, runs out of money or has just had enough, the club collapses. The major defining difference for us however, is a desire to re-engage with the community we represent.

MC: We're now run democratically – everyone has the opportunity to stand for the board and everyone has a say in how the club is run. We have to run the business within our means so can't spend any more than we bring into the club in the first place. The club is also a lot more transparent so everyone can see exactly what's going on.

How has it been for you in terms of the experience?

MW: Enlightening, uplifting, depressing and frustrating, all in equal measures! Supporting the club and running it blend into the same experience.

The elation of winning a game or doing a great community project are pretty much the same, as are things when they don't go your way. But you take each experience, learn from it and always attempt to go forward.

MC: It's been an eye-opening experience for sure, but we've all learned a lot along the way and we try to use past experience when planning for the future.

What support have you had from outside organisations?

MW: The RFL have been very supportive, especially people like Alf Davies who helped us revitalise our lottery. Supporters Direct have been a real friend to Hornets, giving help, guidance and support.

It is no exaggeration that without Supporters Direct,

Hornets Rugby League would not exist.

Another organisation that has been a massive help is Link4Life, employing Rob Bradley as an RL Development Officer which has enabled us to be even more active in the local community.

MC: Supporters Direct have been a fantastic help to us in the last year and we also received a lot of assistance from Leeds Co-operative Society. We're also now beginning to develop good relationships with the local council which we hope will begin to bear fruit in the near future.

What would you say are the advantages of the co-operative model of ownership? Are there any drawbacks?

MW: The distinct advantage is that we have taken away the 'sugar daddy' element of the club. We now have to work as a business as there simply is no other way to continue, let alone prosper.

The advantages are also the disadvantages – there are no short cuts and the only way to go forward is through sheer hard work but on balance, the highs far outweigh the lows and in reality, at the level Hornets play at, other clubs must be looking to follow suit.

MC: The one member, one vote principle is a key advantage for us, along with knowing nobody can buy or sell our club for private gain. The drawbacks are temporary. It's hard work running a club at whatever level you play, but the rewards of seeing

your team play outweigh the hard work a thousand times over.

Finally, what are your plans for the future?

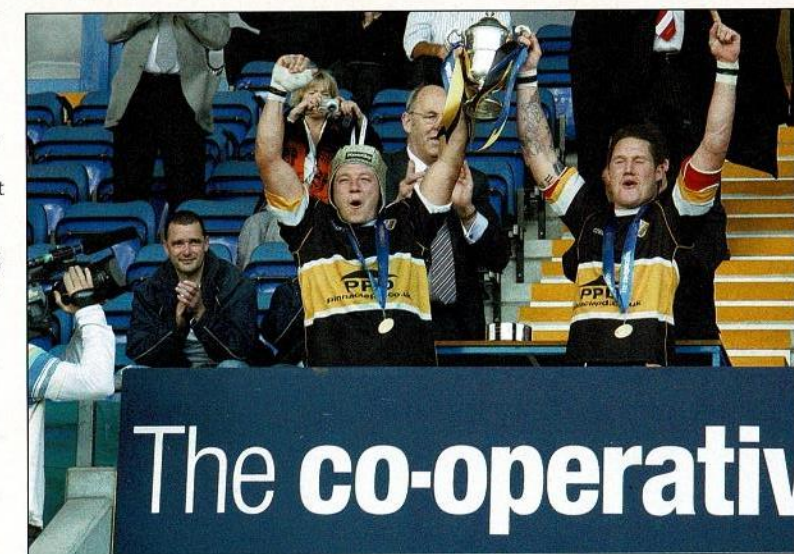
MW: In the short-term, we're looking to develop our lottery and the other commercial aspects of the club. We're also looking to expand our junior development in the not too distant future with an under 18s side and possibly a Hornets Reserve team too.

We're looking to increase and diversify our community work, not just in terms of our coaching programmes but by being more involved in community projects that make Rochdale a better place to be. Our philosophy always has been

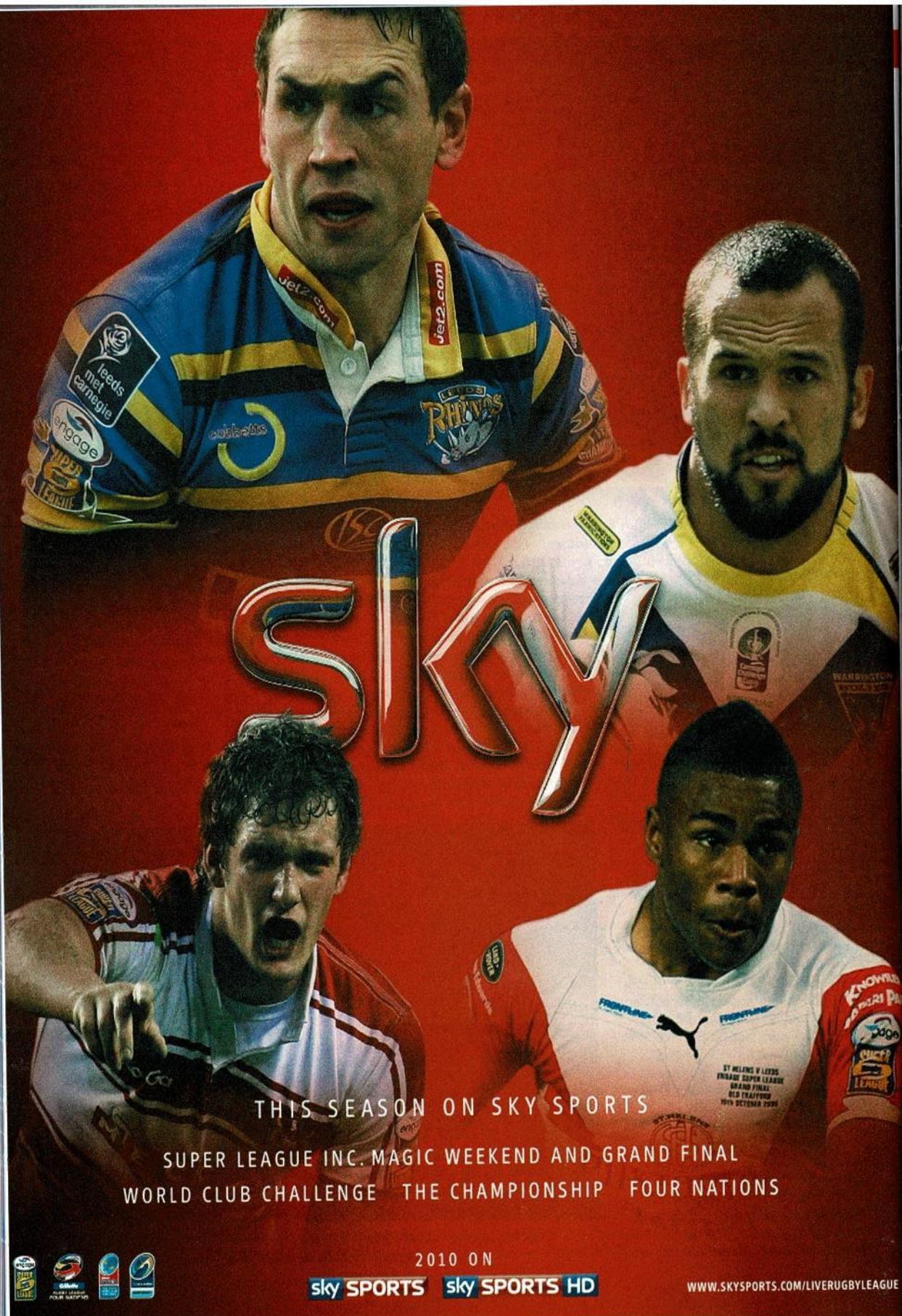
and shall remain – to be the best we can be!

MC: Our key plan at the moment is to find the club a permanent home, and strengthen the club in terms of income and also our outreach work. There are a lot of things we'd like to do as a club and we see having a permanent, stable home as a key factor in achieving this. Ultimately, we'd like to secure a return to the professional ranks of the sport and return the club to what we feel is its rightful place.

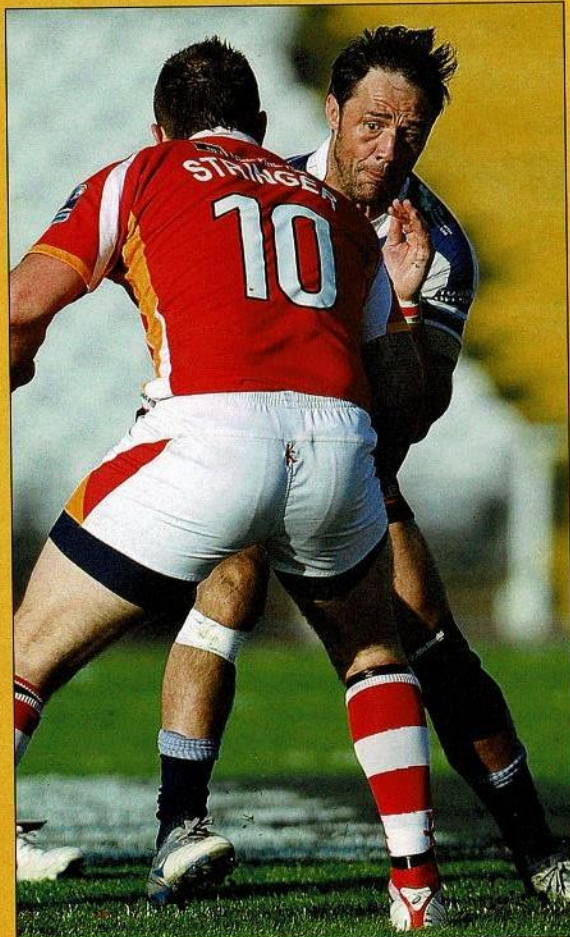
Leigh Centurions fans can also breathe a sigh of relief after Ian Millward's men ended a run of two defeats with a 36-18 win over Keighley Cougars.

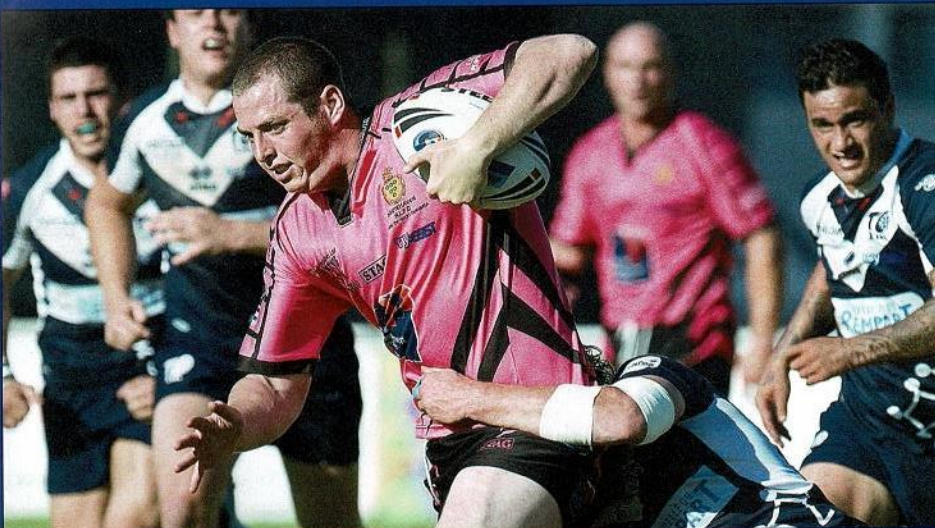

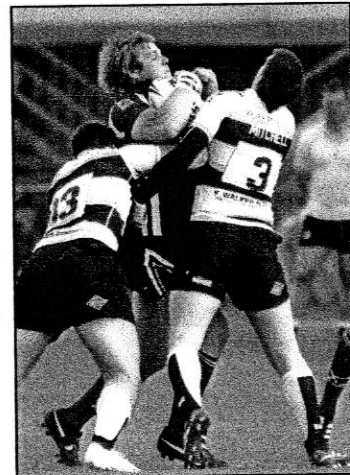

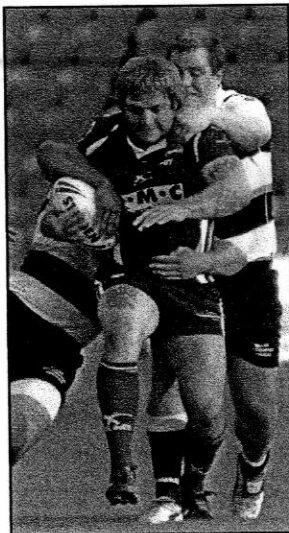
Hello again!
