T'S FULL speed ahead for Featherstone Rovers after their 24-6 win at Keighley last Sunday and with Leigh slipping off the pace, thanks to defeat at Barrow, you'd be hard pressed to see beyond Rovers for the Co-operative Championship leaders' shield.

There's now an eight-point gap at the top but Leigh have the perfect opportunity to reduce that on Thursday night when the Sky Sports cameras will be on hand to capture what should be a cracking contest at Bigfellas Stadium.

Next weekend it's our annual sojourn to Blackpool with the Northern Rail 9s on Saturday at Fylde Rugby Club and the Northern Rail Cup final on Sunday at Bloomfield Road, Blackpool.

Sunday's match will be Batley's first major final in 58 years and has really has captured the imagination of their fans across the globe. Colombia, Abu Dhabi and Australia are just three of the places from where the Bulldogs will be drawing their support at Blackpool.

Where next? Well, whisper it carefully but rumour has it that there may even be a few from as far afield as Dewsbury making their way to the Golden Mile, although no-one is sure which of the two finalists they'll be shouting for...

Widnes seem to be hitting a bit of form after their comprehensive win at Whitehaven and they'll have the chance to head for Blackpool with confidence if they can turn over Dewsbury Rams at the Stobart Stadium whilst Batley face a tough test at home to Barrow after losing to Sheffield last week.

Hunslet Hawks' charge for promotion seems to

be well on track after they destroyed Swinton Lions but watch out for the Roughyeds who are breathing down their necks. # The Bulldog spirit means success breeds success...

It's Batley's biggest day out in over half a century next Sunday in Blackpool. Chairman Kevin Nicholas and the entire club are making the best of their dream run – and casting a cautious eye to the future as he told BEN COLLINS

Chairman Kevin Nicholas has supported Batley as man and boy

ATLEY chairman Kevin Nicholas admits Batley has not been the most attractive proposition for potential signings. Tucked away between Bradford and Leeds, Wakefield and Huddersfield, the Bulldogs have struggled to compete with more illustrious clubs over the years. Their near neighbours Dewsbury Rams play only two miles away across the valley.

That could be very different at the end of this season, though, with Karl Harrison having led the Bulldogs to the Northern Rail Cup final against Widnes next Sunday.

The former England and Salford coach has also done it with a squad consisting almost entirely of young, local players.

And Nicholas, who has been Batley chairman since November 1997, believes the club's bid to build on this year's success will be a great deal easier this time round.

"We want to keep the nucleus of this team together and add a few other players," he said.

"In the past, maybe Batley hasn't been the most fashionable club for players to come to. But we've a coach of the calibre of Karl Harrison and players will see we've got to a cup final.

"That's what players want, they want to be in a successful team, so when people see what we can achieve it might help us attract other players next year.

"I'd be disappointed if the players here went to another Championship club, but if they went to a Super League club then good luck to them."

The Bulldogs also reached the Challenge Cup quarter-finals this year, where they lost to Super League's Catalans Dragons, and they still have their sights set on making the Co-operative Championship play-offs.


"We know it's a competitive league so at the beginning of the season our first priority was to stay in the Championship," he said.

"Once we're mathematically safe the next target is a top-six finish. We know there are other teams in the Championship that are financially stronger than us so we find it difficult to compete with them.

"But we know with the spirit at the club that if we get into the top six we can beat anybody on our day - we're capable of being beaten by anybody too so anything could happen!

"But if we win the Northern Rail Cup it'll give us confidence if we get to the play-offs because we know what we're capable of doing in the right circumstances."

Knock-out rugby has sure brought the best out of Harrison's

men this season

After topping their Northern Rail Cup group they beat Sheffield Eagles 26-16 in the quarter-finals before that memorable 25-4 semi-final win at Leigh.

While few expected Batley to get this far, Nicholas revealed it has come as little surprise to the Bulldogs board.

"To be fair, we did set our stall out and we thought we were capable of getting to the Northern Rail Cup final," he said.

"Realistically, it's difficult for a team from our league to get to the Challenge Cup final and the only other cup competition is the Northern Rail.

"We should have won when we got to the semi-final against Doncaster in 2008, but it was a disappointing performance by us and we wanted to rectify that.

"I think we've put that right because the Leigh performance was spectacular. The defensive effort was outstanding.

"Sheffield was a difficult draw because they're a bogey team for us, and Leigh were the favourites to win the cup and we had to play them away.

"But we were always hopeful of getting there and now we've done it, everyone at Batley is absolutely delighted."

It promises to be a tight contest with Widnes given they drew 30-30 in their Northern Rail opener back in February while just one place separates the two sides in the Championship table.

The Vikings are defending champions and have won the competition in two of the last three years but it will be an historic day for Batley.

They had hoped to charter a private train service direct from Batley to Blackpool North and although the 'Bulldogs Express' did not get out of the rail yard, plenty will be following them at Bloomfield Road.

"We've got coaches going instead now, with some trips going from local pubs, clubs and schools," said Nicholas, who grew up in the town but now lives in Morley and works as a solicitor in

"People might have thought it'll be a disappointing gate with Batley not being the best supported team in the division but I think a few people will be surprised.

"Widnes will take a few and at the last count the RFL had sold 1,300 tickets from Red Hall so there's been a reasonable

amount of interest from neutrals.

"We got just over 2,000 at the Catalans game, with obviously nobody following Catalans, so we'll be disappointed if we take less than that to Blackpool.

"It'd be great to put a cup in what's not the fullest trophy cabinet in the league," he added.

"We won the Trans-Pennine Cup final in 1998, when we beat Oldham before a

2,500 gate up at the Batley club.

"But the last major final was in 1952/53 against Huddersfield in the Yorkshire Cup.

"I know the RFL have been trying to contact people who were at that final and obviously they're few and far between. "But John Etty, who played for Batley

"But John Etty, who played for Batley and Oldham and played in that final, is in his 80s now and lives in Blackpool so we're expecting him to be there."

There will also be supporters travelling from as far afield as Switzerland and Colombia, where shareholder Bruce Thewlis is based, while former coaches Paul Storey, David Ward and Gary Thornton are also expected.

"There's a few nice things happening at the club to do with this final," said

"None of the previous coaches were sacked so they all left on good terms and are still behind the club.

"We've always had a good relationship with our coaches, including Karl now, and I think it's held us in good stead.

"We don't put coaches under any pressure. They know what we're trying to achieve and we let them get on with it.

"I think now is the time to have a chat with Karl and get everything sorted out for next year. He's an inspirational figure at the club and we're delighted to have him here"

And tempting as a move to Batley now is, they would not carry the same appeal without Harrison's continued presence at Mount Pleasant.

## Tez always looks on the bright side

It's been a topsy-turvy time at the Vikings, but Terry O'Connor is still accentuating the positives, as BEN COLLINS discovered

-ERRY O'CONNOR is a man who will always look for the positives. Widnes Vikings come into the Northern Rail Cup final with a fivematch league losing streak still fresh in the memory.

But their sporting director refuses to offer excuses or dwell on the reasons why Widnes have slipped out of the Cooperative Championship play-off places.

Instead, O'Connor is urging the Vikings to grasp the opportunity of creating history by becoming the first club to retain the Northern Rail Cup having won it in two of the last three years.

"That's a big thing for the players," he said. "You can play till your mid-30s at the latest so when you finish you're a long time retired.

"You want to look back on your career and know you've been successful. You want to remember not just playing in cup finals but winning some silverware and making history.

"And this team has the chance to go down as retaining the Northern Rail Cup.

"Everybody wants to be part of a final, it's an exciting time, and there's some good players in our side.

"They will see before the game there's a trophy there waiting to be picked up but it's up to them if the ribbons will be Widnes colours or Batley."

O'Connor has huge respect for Batley, given that Widnes have already had three close contests this season with the Bulldogs, who few backed to reach the final and are now just one place behind the Vikings in the Championship

The two sides drew 30-30 in their Northern Rail opener back in February before Widnes won 32-24 at Batley in April while Batley won 35-16 at Widnes in May.

"In the first league game we were winning 24-0 at halftime then they came right back into it," said O'Connor.

"They're a very good, well-drilled side. We know they're strong in the forwards and that in the backs they're very cre-





ative, so it should be a good game because Batley have been

"I think Karl Harrison's done a very good job. He's got a great mix of youngsters and experienced players like Paul Handforth and Sean Hesketh.

"Johnny Campbell's an exciting full-back and their centre, Danny Maun, is probably one of the most under-rated players in the competition in my eyes.

"They've got lads who have come through good systems -Danny was coming through when I was at Wigan and

Gareth Moore at Leeds. They just weren't given a chance in Super League but they've still got aspirations to play at the highest level they can."

The same goes for many Widnes players, although O'Connor admits they have been under-performing in

While Widnes will be favourites to retain their title, it's a tag O'Connor feels the Vikings have struggled to cope with

"Some of our players have aspirations to play in Super League and there'll be a lot of Super League clubs watching to see how they'd fit the big stage," said the Wigan legend.

"There will be a lot of pressure and those that can handle it will go on to have a good career.

"The performances haven't been good enough recently

and we'd be daft to think just because we beat Whitehaven we've turned a corner. The league table is there for all to

"No matter if you're in Super League, the Championship or Championship 1, if you're one of the so-called best sides in the competition then every week a team is going to raise their game<sup>o</sup> against you so you've got to be on top form.

"We're playing in a final now so there's no point leaving your best game at home.

"We've got to play for the full 80 because all it takes is one missed tackle and then you can collapse."

Injuries and disruption caused by dual-registration players haven't helped but O'Connor is having none of it.

"If you look for excuses you'll always find them," he said. "Have injuries played their part? There's probably been some major disruption. But I prefer to look at the positives. Look at some of the youngsters that have come into the first team - the future's very bright.

"I've always said there's got to be faith in the youngsters and Steve O'Connor has put his hand in his pocket and put people in place in the youth section, and other Championship clubs don't have that."

And given what those youngsters gain from the presence of dual-registered players, O'Connor cares little that Widnes must wait and see who they have available for the final.

"Michael Maguire and Shaun Wane at Wigan aren't daft," he said. "They know that having their dual-reg players play in big games like that will benefit them and we've helped Ben Davies and Liam Farrell progress into Wigan's first team.

"If you lose them would it disrupt your team? It probably would - for a week or so.

"But would you have him in your side if available? I per-

sonally would and I know Paul Cullen would too.

"To me it's a no-brainer and anyone who says 'no' is

"We're getting youngsters coming in who play and train with some of the best in the game and are showing our youngsters what it takes to be a full-time professional and sharing the experience of being at Wigan, or wherever it may be.


"They're in five hours a day, whether it be watching videos, doing weights or conditioning, and what our youngsters get from that is knowledge about the whole package needed to be a top player.

"I know coaches have been moaning about players being pulled back but if you know that when you go into it I don't see what the problem is.

"We've got a thing in this country about always looking at the negatives and taking the glass half-empty view."

O'Connor will mantain the glass half-full approach, though. "We've lost seven league games but five of which we've lost by eight points or less, and now there's silverware on offer - not just two points," he said.

"It'll be two boxes out of three ticked for a Super League licence and will give us a push towards the play-offs, when we'll have some key personnel back."





FEW months ago I was present at the Stobart Stadium, Widnes, when the Vikings' go-getting chairman Steve O'Connor and his management team launched the club's Super League bid.

In essence, what O'Connor and coach Paul Cullen outlined was the fact that the Vikings had been running a 'shadow' Super League operation this season, specifically but not exclusively since they had ticked the box of qualifying for a licence by virtue of winning last year's Northern Rail Cup final.

Whichever way you look at that plan it smacks of resounding common sense. The Vikings haven't had the easiest of times with injuries this year – rumour has it that they put in a transfer bid for Florence Nightingale – so their league position looks rather more disappointing than it otherwise might.

However in plumping to blood their own talented youngsters, to put pride back into the local community game and get Widnes folk cheering on Widnes blokes, there is surely a lesson to be learned for clubs currently enjoying the luxury of life amongst the elite.

Halifax were the Thursday night visitors that early spring evening and I recall standing alongside their then-Chief Executive Graham Clay as he enviously cast an eye over the stadium and the impressive Widnes facilities. Clay has departed since then but at least Halifax now have – finally – the benefit of their new east stand open for business.

I suspect Clay knew that in terms of chasing that elusive Super League licence, Fax were a step or two behind the Vikings in terms of preparations, and of course they hadn't achieved the on-field qualification.

That will all come down to the league competition and a certain few sides by the names of Featherstone, Barrow and Leigh will have something to say about that over the next couple of months.

But what also impressed me that night at Widnes was the range of activities and levels of input that spoke very healthily of the wider base of Widnes as a club.

The Widnes Rugby League Museum has been created in the cavernous hall beneath the stadium's east stand and if you have an hour to spare, it will delight any Rugby League follower.

You can't imagine a Leeds Utd fan wanting to visit the Man Utd hall of fame, can you? But we're creatures cut from a different cloth in our sport and to witness the heritage of a club so artfully and proudly displayed as Widnes's is, is to while away an enjoyable hour regardless of partisan attachments.

It doesn't cost a fortune to pull together such a display, and it doesn't have to be on a 'Tate Modern' scale either. What's more our clubs have nothing if not the heartfelt support of many volunteers and people with a passion for the sport's heritage.

Many of them already do this to a greater or lesser extent.



BLACKPOOL'S reputation as one of Rugby League's favourite venues has long been established and the statistics surrounding the sport's seaside special speak for themselves.

Did vou know...

...Bloomfield Road has hosted the last five finals and since 2005 a total of 236 points have been scored with an average of 47.2 points per game.

...The average winning margin has been 26 points with Doncaster faring worst in the 2008 final when they lost 60-0 to Salford City Reds. The closest result was the thrilling Hull KR 18-16 win over Castleford in 2005.

... A total of 40,321 fans have attended the five games making an average of 8,064 per final. A record crowd of 9,400 was in attendance last year as Widnes defeated Barrow 34-18. The low crowd of 6,328 was 2006 when Leigh pipped Hull KR 22-18.

...So far in this year's competition both finalists have been unbeaten although they shared the spoils in the pool stages with a 30-30 draw at Mount Pleasant.

...Batley, the competition's top scorers, have notched 261 points and conceded 90 in six matches with an average of 43-15 whilst Widnes have scored 212 and conceded 98 giving an average 35-16 scoreline.

...Widnes have shaded the last 10 games between the sides in all competitions 1 Brett Carter (Workington) going back to April 2007 with six wins to Batley's three and one draw. An average scoreline of 37-25 in Widnes' favour over that period suggests we could be in for a try

...Widnes winger Dean Gaskell is looking to maintain his 100 per cent winning record in Northern Rail Cup finals as he prepares for his fourth final in five years.

Gaskell appeared for Leigh in their victory over Hull KR in 2006 and then followed that up with 2007 and 2009 triumphs for the Vikings against Whitehaven and Barrow, respectively!

## **Hood to step down as** Thunder ring the changes

ATESHEAD Thunder Director of Rugby Chris Hood is to step down as Head Coach at the end of the 2010 Co-operative Championship season, but will remain at the club as Director of Rugby.

Hood, who alongside fellow directors Rod Findlay and Keith Christie set up the new company that saved Thunder's existence in professional rugby league, says that it is something that has always been part of the new company's plans and now is the right time to make it happen.

Alongside Hood's change of role, Community Development Manager Sam Shaw-Kew is leaving his post at the club.

Shaw-Kew and current Community Development Officer Claire White worked for free alongside the club's directors throughout the off-season period to ensure the new company was set up after the previous company went into administration.

Hood commented: "At the start of the season, I said to both Rod and Keith that I wanted to concentrate on the essential long-term plans that are paramount to our future success, such as our youth performance systems and charitable foundation."

"At that time it was more important that we set up a team as soon as possible and it was essential that we had a team on the park for both the players, sponsors and fans to focus on."

"I am remaining as Director of Rugby and my new remit will encompass both the club's community development programmes and youth performance systems, as well as working alongside the new head coach to continue the progress that we are making on-field.

"This has been something that I wanted, and the board knew about this and agreed a long time ago. With Sam's departure from the club, the opportunity has arisen to do that and I am now able to concentrate on what I feel is very important."

"I have always received nothing but support and good wishes from those who attend the games and those are the people that have always counted the most, not an anonymous forum."

Even with the club entering the final phase of the season, the recruitment of a new head coach has already begun, and Hood is excited with some of the people they have been speaking to

with a view to joining the club for the 2011 season.

Hood continued: "I have already been looking for suitable candidates and preliminary discussions have already taken place with a few, and they all have a fantastic pedigree and a wealth of experience in the game."

"I will ultimately be responsible for the new head coach and I, alongside the other directors, are keen to make sure we have the right person to work alongside the players and personnel at the club. I will make sure that the new Head Coach has everything that he needs to continue to progress the on-field side of the club and give him all the support I can."

"It is also important to recognise that we would not be in this position without the hard work and dedication of Sam Shaw-Kew and the fantastic work that he has done."

"We have a vibrant community programme and a wealth of contacts throughout the local community that have given real strength and credence to our community arm, and that is largely

Half-back Carl Dooler won the Lance Todd Trophy in the 1967 Challenge Cup

Carl joined Rovers in 1960 and was the epitome of the proud heritage of **Sharlston-born Featherstone Rovers half** backs, until joining Hull Kingston Rovers

David Hobbs was another Lance Todd Trophy winner, for his performance in Rovers' amazing win over Hull FC in

Hobbs made his international debut in 1984, staying at Rovers until the following year. David was a quality all round forward and excellent goal kicker.

He later returned to Rovers as head

coach and gained promotion and grand final honours with the club.

Another half back, Deryck Fox came to Rovers in the wake of their 1983 cup final victory. Deryck was a classic half back cast in the 'little general' mould, and he had two spells at Rovers, commencing a distinguished international career whilst at the club.



Also there are meant to be plenty of other trips going so it promises to be a great day for as many as possible.


A train would have been great but again it was not to be.





There's been many occasions this season when, through injury, Widnes have had as many 'crocked' players sitting in the stands as they've had on the pitch.



Our next home match, on August against Gateshead, we are dedicating to Kevin Parkhouse.







coach with experience of playing nine-a-side'.


"But I have to hold my hands up and say it was all down to the lads! We used it more as a team-bonding exercise, to be honest," he added.


