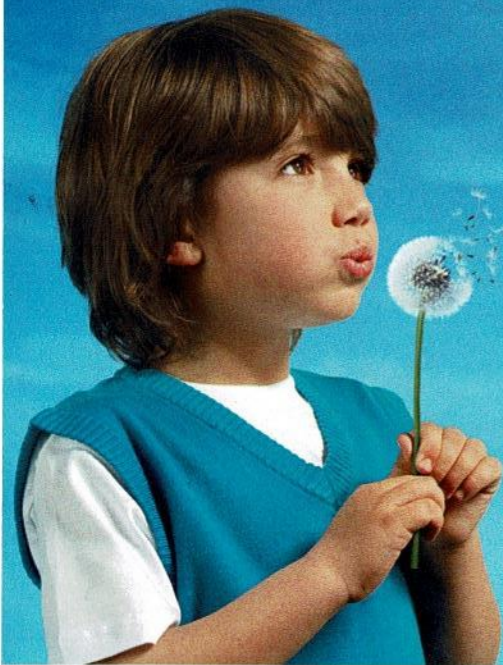

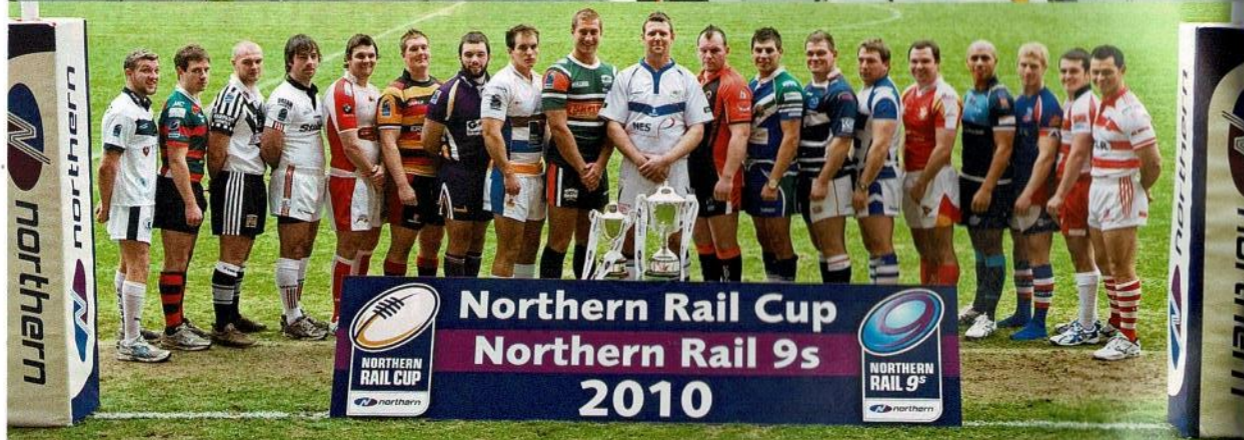

The game of the day however must be the Heavy Woollen derby at the Tetley's Stadium where Dewsbury take on Batley.

I wonder if the Bulldogs will bring their trophy over?

Hunslet Hawks, another side to perform impressively in the Northern Rail 9s, can extend their lead at the top of Championship One with a win at Gateshead and it's second versus third with Oldham travelling to Blackpool Panthers for another mouthwatering clash.

# Just one match at a time...



## Barrow coach Steve McCormack knows all the sporting cliches, but sometimes it's simply the best way to get the job done

**S**TEVE McCormack admits Barrow must lift their game if they are to make it back-to-back titles in the Co-operative Championship.

The Raiders beat Halifax in last year's Grand Final after finishing top in the regular season. And while both remain firmly in contention this year, Featherstone look destined to go into the play-offs as league winners.

Fourth-placed Barrow have two games in hand due to their cup commitments, while Fax are third.

And although the Raiders suffered their third league defeat of the season last time out, losing 34-16 at Batley, they can go within a point of Fax by beating them in Thursday's televised match.

"It's important we're at home, especially against an excellent side like Halifax," said McCormack.

"It's a big game for both teams and we need to bounce back from last week's performance, although Batley were on fire.

"We beat them quite convincingly at home in April (56-10) but last week was totally different. We didn't play well but you can't take anything away from Batley, they're an excellent side.

"That's the kind of division we're in," added the Barrow coach. "If you don't play well you get beat, and that's happened with teams at the top of the division and the bottom.

"We can't rely on two or three individuals. Two or three years ago that might have been enough.

"But the league's that strong now that you have to put performances in as a team, and probably against Batley we tended to do more of the individual stuff."

Barrow lost 46-24 at Fax in the reverse fixture in May before going down to a credible defeat at St Helens in the Challenge Cup quarter-finals.

They were then knocked out of the Northern Rail Cup quarter-finals by Widnes but regrouped to go on a four-match winning streak leading into the Batley defeat.

So while McCormack has been pleased with his side's progress this season, he accepts there is plenty of room for improvement heading into the business end of the campaign.

"If it were a school report it'd say 'done ok, but can do better'," he said.

"We've had a few good wins and put in some top-class performances but there have been a few weeks we've not been at our best and at the back end of this year we've got to make sure we improve on all aspects.

"We've had a good run, especially considering we've had

a few injuries. I know everybody has injuries but we've had a good Challenge Cup run, and although we were disappointed we didn't get to the Northern Rail Cup final, we've had a decent run of form in the league.

"I'd like to think that when we get a few more senior players back we'll be doing well at the back end of the season."

The Raiders' injury list includes the likes of James Nixon, Matt James, Chris Larkin and Richard Fletcher, which had some bearing on McCormack naming a relatively inexperienced squad for last week's Northern Rail 9s in Blackpool.

Barrow drew 14-14 with Oldham in their opener before losing their last two pool games against Featherstone (14-4) and Sheffield Eagles (36-10).

"It was all about blooding a dedicated bunch of young players," he said. "We've highlighted a few of them over the year and they did excellent.

"That wasn't reflected on the scoreboard but it was a big ask for any young player, especially when you look at some of the squads the clubs brought. Sheffield were probably four stone a man heavier than us.

"But that's what it's all about. We need to get our youth structure in order at Barrow; let some of those players come through and do the club proud.

"We've been decimated by injuries and we're struggling in our Academy this year so the squad we took was a credit to themselves and the club.

"More senior players like Paul Noone, Andy Bracek, James Coyle and Liam Harrison did really well, and it's a good concept. I think it was a good day for everyone involved."

One youngster to prosper this season is Nathan Mossop, who has been the starting hooker following the on-off situation with Andrew Henderson, who was identified as a key signing pre-season.

"Nathan's been excellent this year," said McCormack.

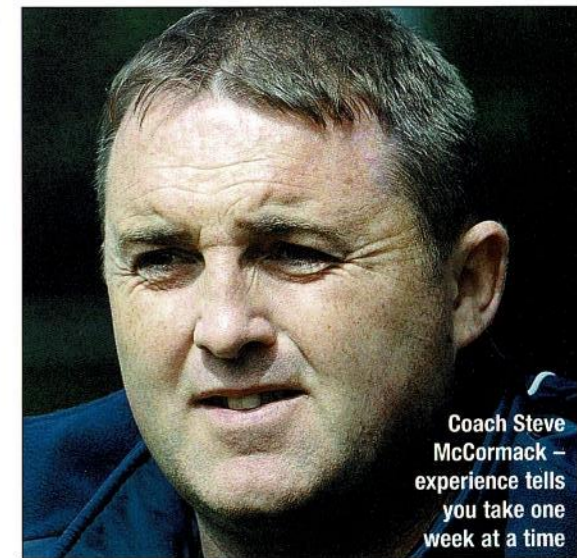
"We've put a lot of pressure on him because of the Andrew Henderson situation and he's really stepped up.

"For a young player who was playing amateur level 18 months ago, his form has been excellent.

"He's got a lot of improving to do but to bring Keal Carlile in as well, that'll hopefully take a bit of pressure off Nathan." Carlile, 20, joined on loan from Huddersfield earlier this

month on loan until the end of the season and will provide Mossop with some respite during their final six games of the regular season.

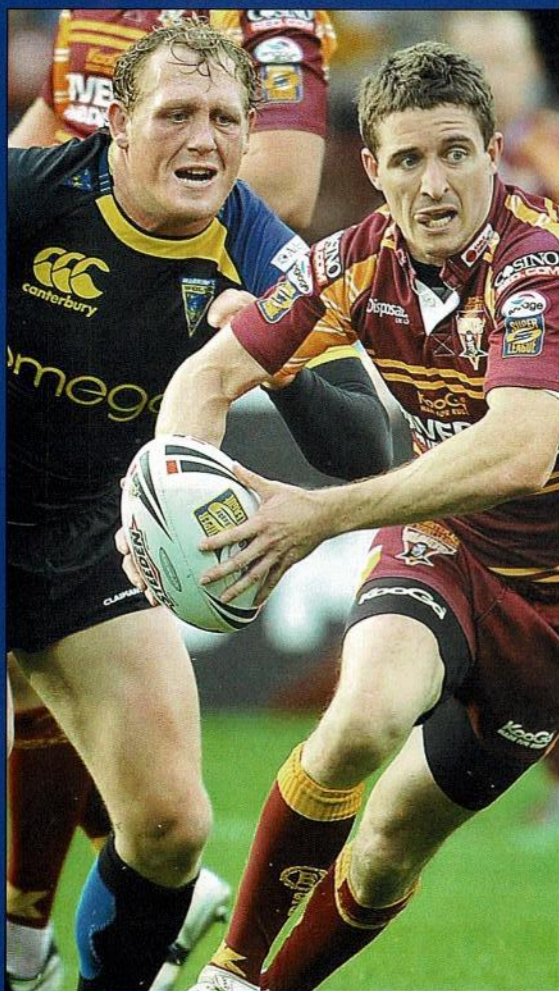
"The target now is just to beat Halifax, that's it," added McCormack. "The league table looks after itself. Featherstone have really improved and are up there this year so we're not looking too far ahead. Experience tells you to take one week at a time."

# All work and no play makes Chris a happy boy...

Deciding to step down from Super League while still in his prime was a tough decision for Chris Thorman to take. But it was about more than self-gratification and an easy life, as he told Game On's BEN COLLINS

**C**HRIS Thorman admits his first year as a player-coach has been something of a culture shock - but he wouldn't have it any other way.

After eight years in Super League, punctured by a year in the NRL with Parramatta, the 29-year-old felt it was time to pursue his coaching ambitions at the end of last season and dropped two divisions to the Co-operative Championship 1.

After playing for Huddersfield and Hull, the Geordie decided to stay in Yorkshire and signed a two-year deal with York City Knights.

The former England half-back is now usually up at 5am to walk the dog then in the gym by 6.30am to train clients for his personal training business.

He is then at the Knights from mid-morning before going back to the gym in the evening or doing first-team training with York.

"I've gone from being a full-time Super League professional finishing by 1pm and then drinking lattes and playing Xbox to doing this," he said.

"There aren't enough hours in the day but, to be honest, that's how I like it. I've had a good life so far and it's probably time to do some hard work rather than just run around and get paid too much money to play a game of rugby!"

Thorman had offers to stay in Super League but was ready for the next progression in his career.

"If it had just been myself, I probably would have stayed in Super League, but it's not just me any more, I had other things to think about," he said.

"It would have meant moving away from my home, which I'd just bought, and we were planning on starting a family, so they have to be part of the decision-making process and York was the best option.

"Rugby league's a short career and to coach is something I'd always wanted to do.

"I've played at some of the best clubs in the world and under some of the best coaches.

"I've played under both Smiths - Tony and Brian - and the likes of Jon Sharp and Brian Noble have had an influence on my career.

"I'll always be grateful to York for being the first club to offer me a coaching role."

Thorman began the year working alongside head coach James Ratcliffe and Mick Ramsden, with Dave Woods appointed

as director of rugby in April.

But Ratcliffe was sacked in June, with Woods taking over as head coach, and the coaching changes have given Thorman a baptism of fire at York.

"I'd been captain at Huddersfield and vice-captain at Hull but coaching-wise, it's very new to me," he said.

"It's been enjoyable but also really tough. There's been a fair few hurdles along the way this season with getting a new head coach.

"I took charge of first-team responsibilities for a small period and it hasn't been ideal. But I guess the main thing I've gained from it is how to deal with adversity.

"Some sessions are thrown upon you and you just have to think on your feet and handle them as best you can.

"I'm one that likes to be prepared and know exactly what's going on. Sometimes that hasn't been the case so I've had to learn how to deal with circumstances I wouldn't normally put myself in.

"It's all part of a learning curve and I'll certainly be a better coach for it by the end of this season.

"And what's probably been a blessing is that I've been injured for half the year with a quad injury," Thorman added.

"It's made my life a bit easier because if I'd been head coach and playing at the

same time, with only one other member of staff working with me at that time, it would have been difficult.

"Being a player-coach is about getting the balance right really."

Thorman returned from injury in the 34-18 defeat by league leaders Hunslet two weeks ago before boosting his fitness as York narrowly missed out on the Northern Rail 9s semi-finals last Saturday.

The Knights had won their previous four league games to put them on the

shoulders of the top three and Thorman, who isn't planning on hanging his boots up for a few years yet, hopes to help them back to winning ways against Workington.

"Ultimately the Knights signed me firstly as a player so it's important I got back on the field," he said.

"I've done that now and I'm in the gym every morning so that one particular injury aside, I've never been in better

shape. I was really happy with my performance against Hunslet and to get through it.

"The team performance wasn't as good as it could have been but I don't think this team realises how good they could be.

"Through adversity, through injuries and through people leaving the club, we're still a really good team, and I think we have to start realising that and recognising the potential.

"We've got a good mix of experience and young lads, who have raw potential. We've had some good results but we know we have to finish as high as possible with regard to the play-offs.

"That's the focus for the next few weeks. We're hoping to finish the season on a high."

Thorman was fit to play in the 32-16 win over Doncaster the previous week but his wife gave birth to their first child, a baby girl.

That will put further strain on Thorman's busy schedule but he couldn't be happier.

"I don't need much sleep anyway so I'll try to do my fair share, it's just another responsibility," he said.

"I'm all for hard work now and I'm embracing it!"

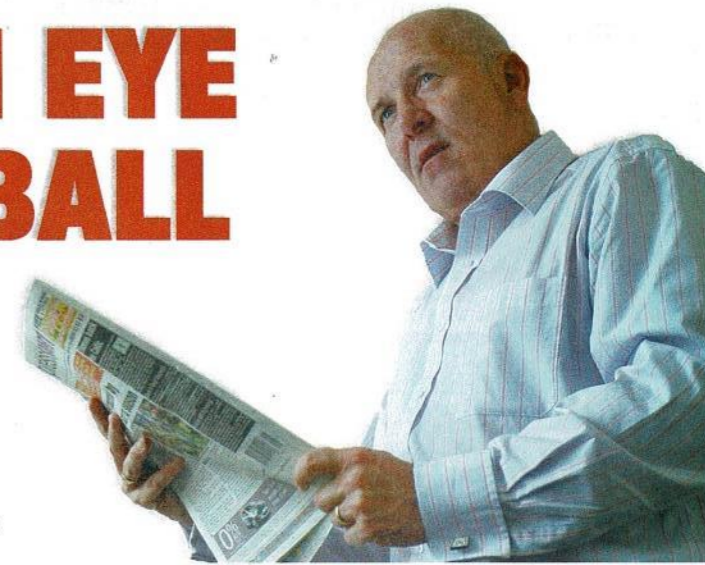

I HAVE to make a confession. It was one of my two favourites clubs' biggest day out on Sunday and I wasn't there. I sincerely hope it won't be another 50-odd years before Batley make it into another final or I might not make that either.

And if I do, then with a telegram from the Queen (or more likely the King) in my pocket, the odds are I won't remember how to get to the ground (any ground) or be able to see what's happening, let alone climb up the stand to my seat. Hey ho, good old Father Time, eh?

It's only 37 years since Dewsbury's last really big day out, the Championship final in 1973 when Stevo led the boys to glory over hot favourites Leeds at Odsal. That's a 'bus' that might not be passing by again any time soon, although both of the grand old Heavy Woollen clubs are a credit to the current Co-operative Championships.

But why did I miss the Bulldogs' big day out?

Well, I have about as good an excuse as could reasonably be contrived. No, it wasn't the annual family holiday, not a family member's wedding or funeral, nor even work commitments in the office – which takes precedence over all of the above in the deadline-constricted world of journalism.

I couldn't be in Blackpool because I was in London's Hyde Park on Sunday afternoon, along with about 15,000 people, mostly women, who were taking part in Cancer Research's annual Race for Life – the women, that is. Mrs L hasn't been up to much in the way of exercise over recent months, due to the extremely gruelling ordeal that all cancer sufferers have to face, but she managed to walk the modest 5 kilometres along with two friends and they raised a pretty magnificent amount of cash in the process – some £3,700 and counting.

There are few, if any, of you reading this who will not have been touched in some way by this disease, via either friend or family, or possibly even personally. When you attend an event like Race for Life and look around the thousands of people rubbing shoulders with you, it is a truly heart-warming and humbling experience.

It's why the work that Steve Prescott and his supporters continue to carry out on behalf of both Christies and the Rugby League Benevolent Fund's Try Assist appeal is tremendously important and inspirational.

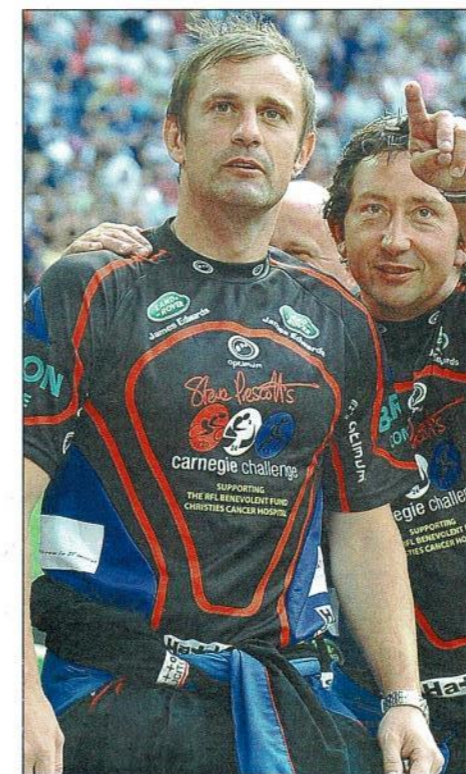
It's why the news we're going to be carrying in coming weeks about the Benevolent Fund's patrons scheme really does deserve your fullest consideration, and why having 'pledged' and forgotten to follow up my good intention last time, I'll be making sure I don't this time. And it's why, on this biggest of big days for the great Batley Bulldogs club, there wasn't a second thought to be had when considering the challenge my good lady was facing.

Liverpool manager Bill Shankly famously said that "some people think football is a matter of life and death. I assure you it's more important than that."

Good manager Shanks and a great quote. But in the real world, it's about as far out as you can get. I think Rugby League people understand that.

Well done Batley. I'm glad the Sky+ worked!

It's also great to see you get one over Widnes as we were hard done to the week before, so well done to Karl and the boys.

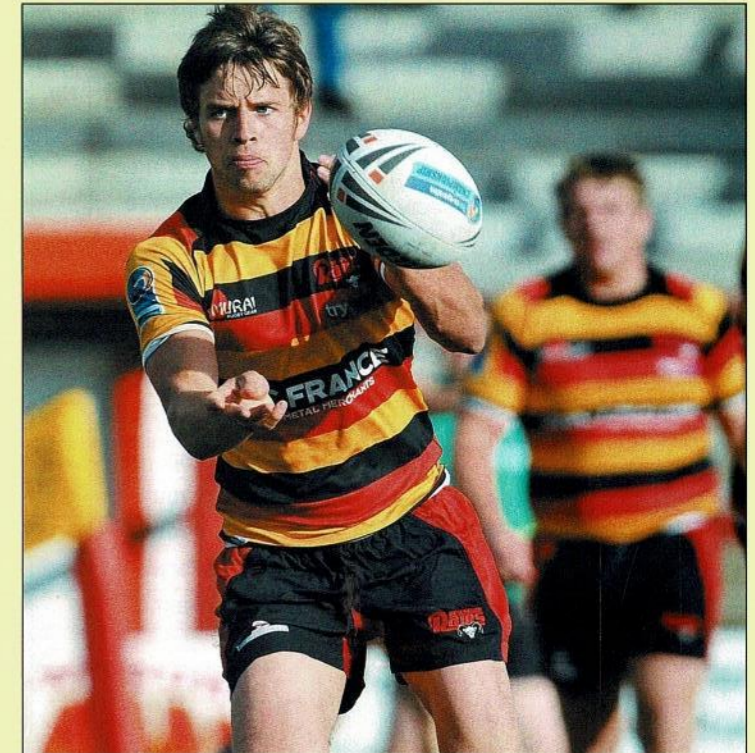
On that subject, I thought our boys played really well against Widnes, as they have been doing for the last month or so.

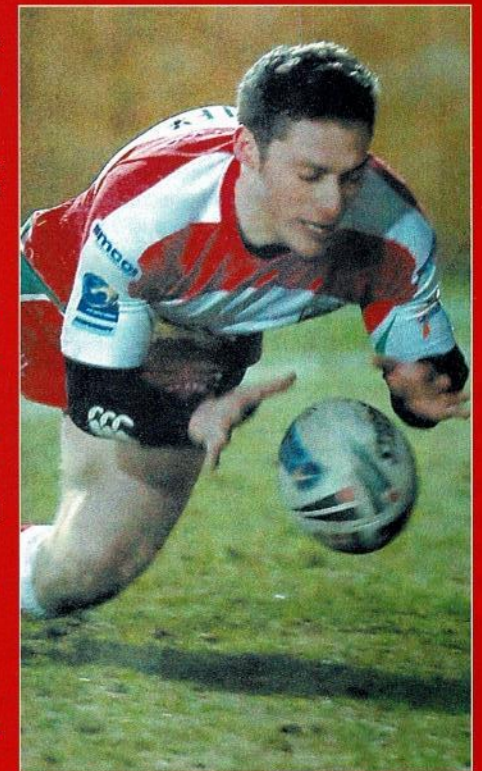
in engaging young people.

It was a massive step up for these lads from reserve-grade but they proved up to the task. The club's future lies with players such as these.

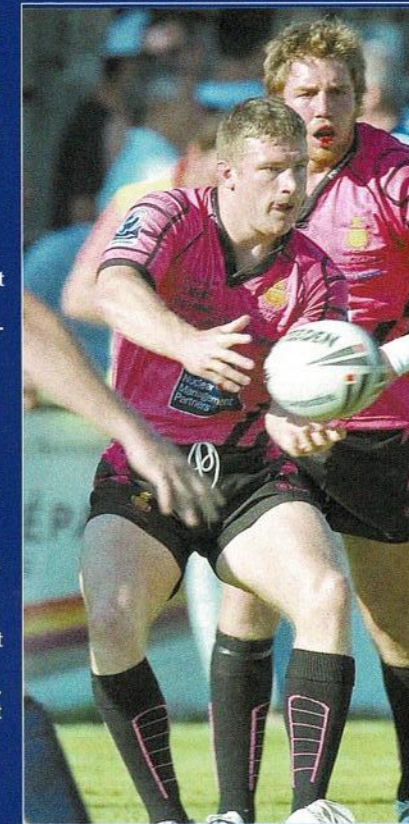
Danny's a kid of 18, coming in at prop, Jay's just turned 17 and Loz is 19 and new to the game this season.

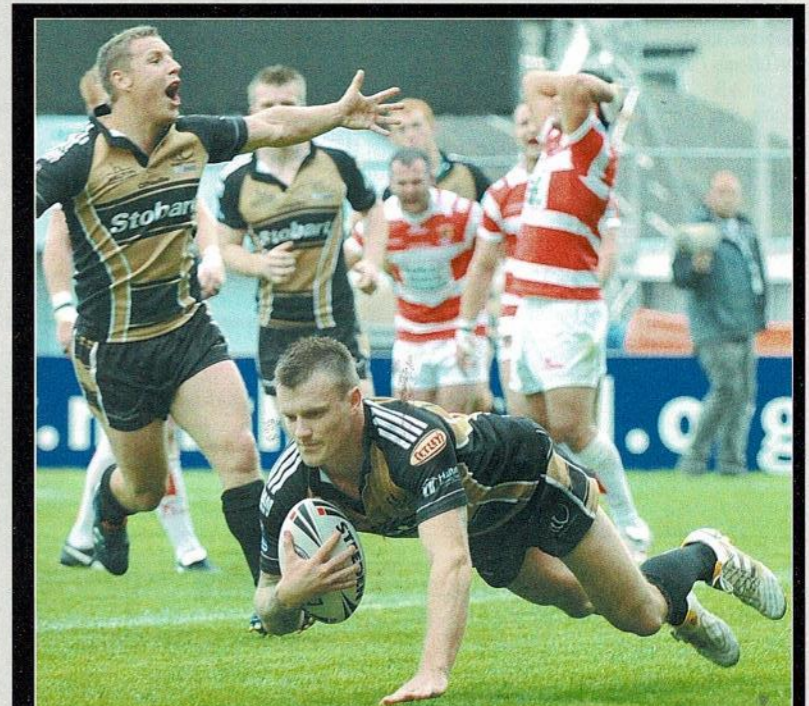

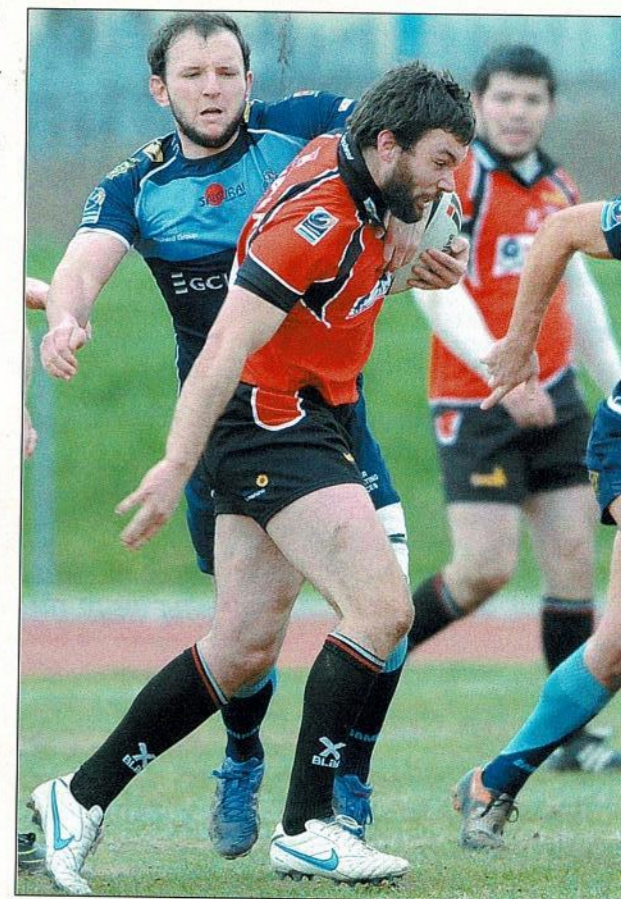
We as directors said at the very start that we were not going to be here to make up the numbers. Our simply plan was to take a step forward every day and we have more than done that.

Today's game against South Wales sees us return to Spotland after a five-week absence, and it is very exciting to get back 'home' seeing as our home form has been so good.

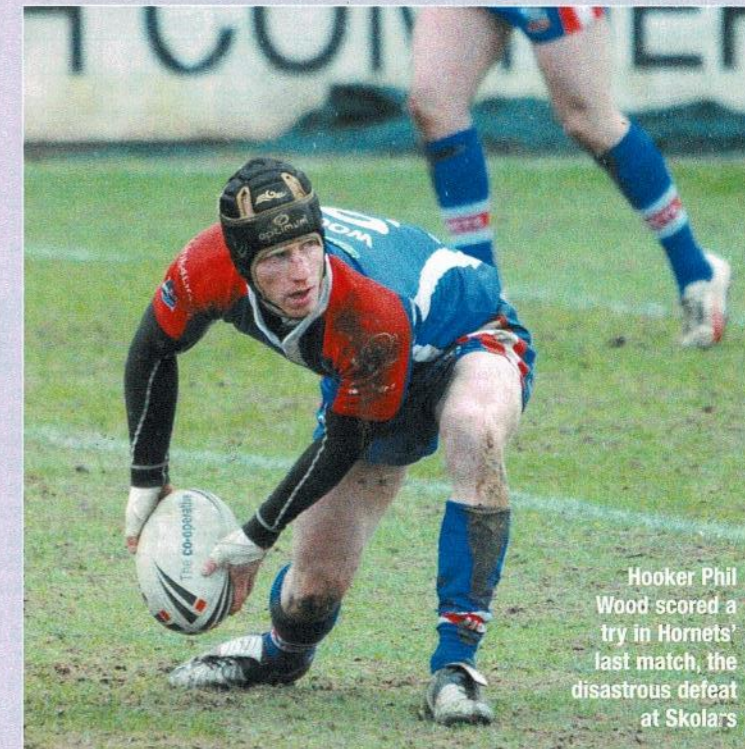
We have won all but one of our Spotland fixtures this term and we have played some fantastic rugby at times.

We hope for more of the same today.

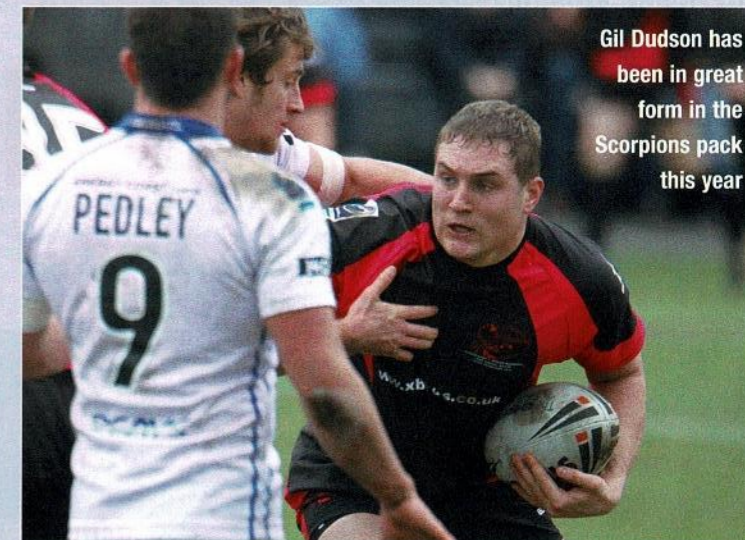



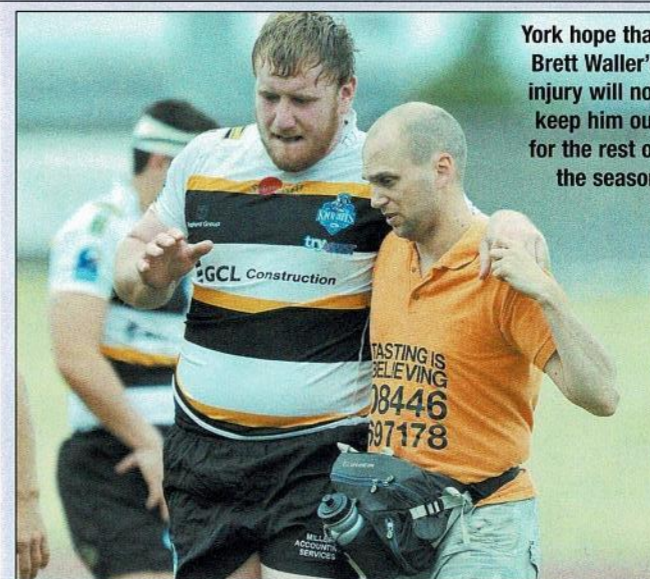

# For Danny Boy, the Mount Pleasant pipes are calling

**Batley centre Danny Maun was tutored in the Wigan academy, but the pull of 'home' in Batley and Dewsbury has kept him close to his roots. And as he told BEN COLLINS, that's where he wants to stay**

**D**ANNY MAUN is not talking in clichés when he says helping Batley win the Northern Rail Cup last week was a dream come true.

Before winning the 1998 Trans-Pennine Cup, the last time the Bulldogs appeared in a cup final was the 1952 Yorkshire Cup and their last major trophy was the 1924 Championship.

And being a Batley lad, last week's thrilling 25-24 victory over defending champions Widnes at Bloomfield Road meant just as much to Maun as it did to the Bulldogs' long-suffering fans.

Over 2,000 of them made the trip to Blackpool and a similar number attended the team's homecoming party on Sunday night at the town's Frontier club.

The players were still celebrating around Batley on Monday, when Maun told Game On: "I still can't believe it. I keep waving my medal around; I think I'll be wearing it all week at work.

"We came back from Blackpool and they had a stage up at the Frontier. We had a few speeches and it stayed open all night for us.

"It was an amazing experience just to see all the Batley shirts and I'll never forget that as long as I live. Everything I'd dreamed of came true.

"I watched us win the Trans-Pennine Cup when I was younger and that was a great day, but Sunday was something else."

Maun works as a binman for Kirklees Council and did a feature for Look North in the build-up before being interviewed by Radio Leeds on Monday morning.

"It's nice to get some exposure for Batley," he said. "People look down at the club because we're not a big name but now everyone will take notice.

"I'm glad for the chairman, the board and the coach Karl Harrison, and it's amazing for the fans because they haven't had much to shout about for a long time."

The Bulldogs put in a resilient defensive performance to shock Leigh in the semi-finals and again they upset the odds in the final, mounting a late fightback to snatch victory with two Alex Brown tries in the last 12 minutes.



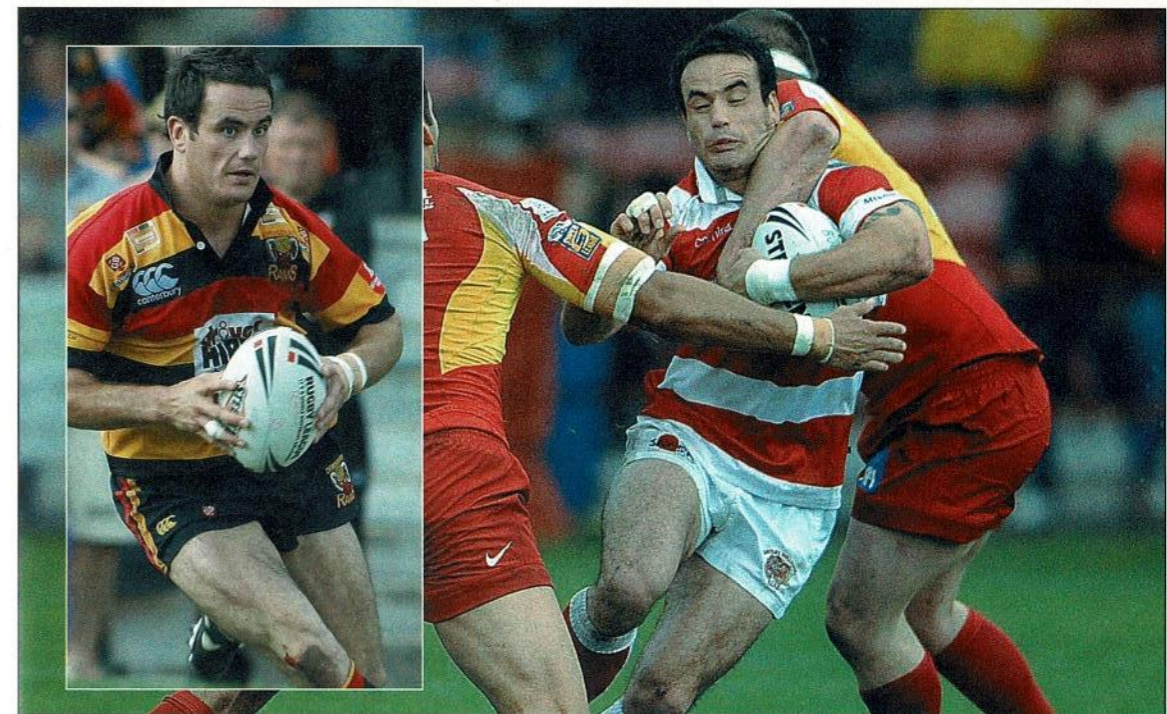

"It was massive just reaching the final but going into it I was thinking 'how good would it be to win today?'" said Maun.

"It was an amazing feeling to go out there for the warm-up and to go and win it was magic.

"We may have left it late but we did it, and it's a massive achievement for us."

What has made Batley's surprise success all the more remarkable is that they have done it on possibly the tight-

est budget in the Co-operative Championship.

However, Maun feels that has played a major factor in forging the side's team spirit, which has been there for all to see in recent weeks – not just in the Northern Rail Cup but in the Championship, where the Bulldogs have won four of the last six.

"I'm glad for the chairman, Kevin Nicholas," said the centre. "He's tight with the purse strings but that helps bring us all together.

"We have to earn our money and the win bonus we got is a lot of money to us lads. Some players elsewhere get paid a lot more money and it's pinching it really, in my opinion.

"If you get paid a lot of contract money in this division I think you're more likely to lose because you've got that money to fall back on.

"We don't get paid a lot of money at Batley. The win bonuses pay our bills. Ash Lindsay even says it pays for his kid's nappies!

"But that's why there's no egos at Batley. We play for the love of the game more than anything."

Maun, 29, is in his second spell at the club having returned to Mount Pleasant from Dewsbury in 2008.

A highly-rated youngster, Maun came through the Wigan academy before first joining Batley in 2000 and he is now one of the senior players in Harrison's youthful squad.

"Being released by Wigan was hard to take," he said. "But Paul Storey was the coach then and he developed me as a person and gave me a lot of confidence to play at that level.

"There were players like Glenn Tomlinson and Richard Price in that team, and the whole experience made me

the player I am today.

"I was having a bad time of things in 2004 and sometimes I felt I was getting picked because of my name so I needed a fresh challenge at Featherstone," Maun added.

"I then joined Dewsbury and although we won National League 2 in 2006, I always wanted to play for Batley again. Batley's a big part of my life and I'm proud to play for them."

So much so that Maun can see himself spending the rest of his career at Mount Pleasant. He admits Batley's success this year may result in their star players being snapped up by more illustrious clubs for next season but he is determined to stay put.

"You get coaches from other clubs asking if you want to leave but I'm happy here," he said.

"There's a great team spirit here and I've got an outstanding coach who will develop me as a player so there's no reason for me to leave.

"I'm not a greedy player, people who know me know I won't go somewhere for financial gains.

"I want to keep winning things with Batley and I want to see out my career here. Some players might be poached, like Jason Walton, Gareth Moore, and

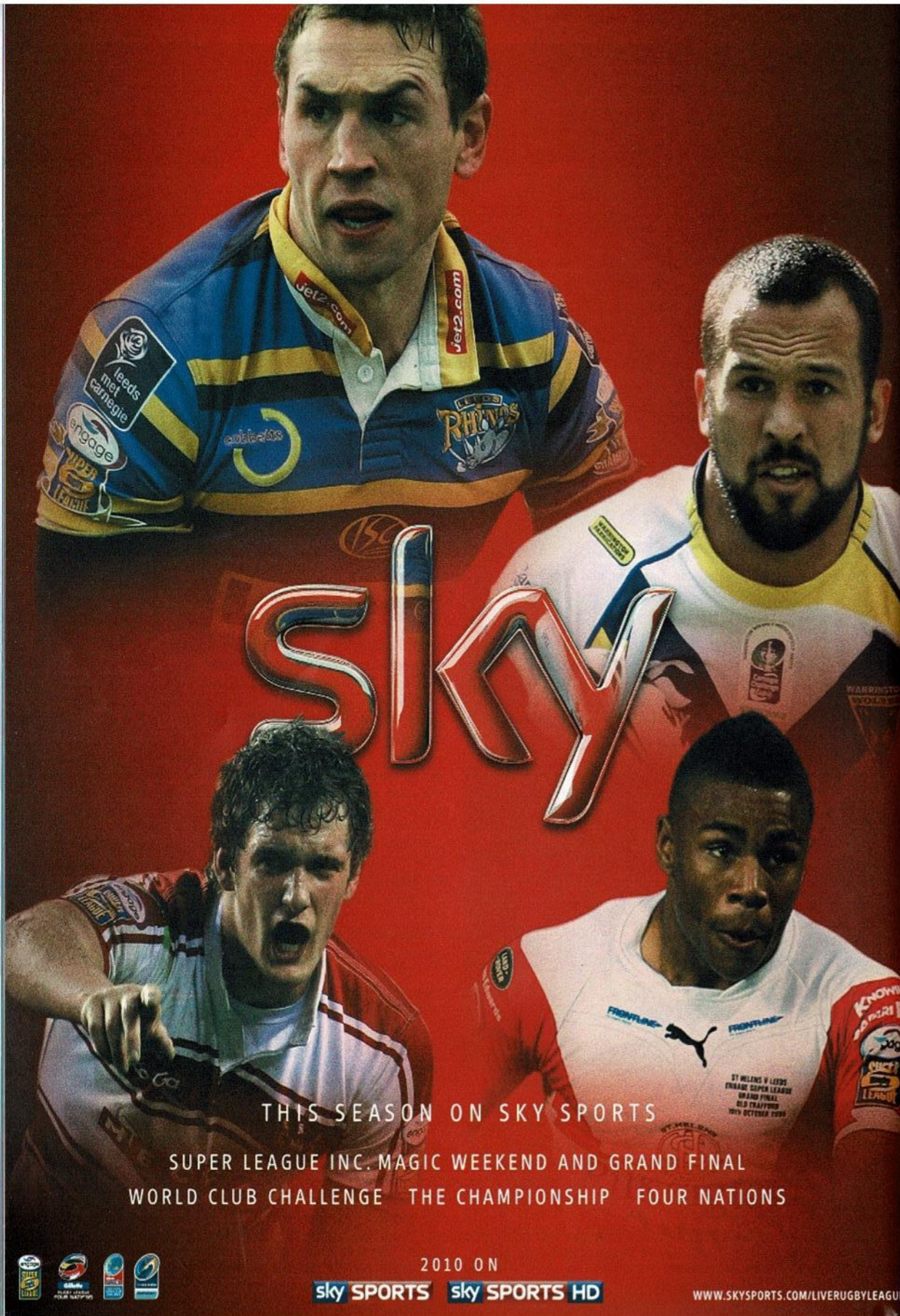
maybe Karl as well.

"But I hope as many of us stay as possible and we can kick on next year.

"This year I really think we can reach the Grand Final," Maun added.

"That may seem a bold prediction but we've got some big games coming up and we'll be looking to win them. We don't fear anybody in this division and why should we?"

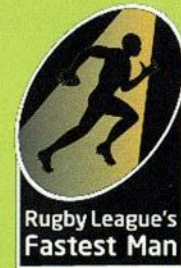

# All hail the Bulldogs' Northern Rail heroes

**A** FULL eighty-six years since they last lifted a piece of major Rugby League silverware, the roller-coaster Batley Bulldogs rocked Blackpool – and the favourites Widnes Vikings – with a thrilling 25-24 win in the Northern Rail Cup final.

After racing out to a 12-0 lead the Bulldogs twice fought back, first to lead 15-12 at the break, and then from 24-15 down. In the end a cheeky first-half Gareth Moore drop goal – straight after Thomas Coyle had missed one at the other end – proved the difference.

"It's an outstanding achievement for me personally and for this group of local players, which we've recruited in a short space of time," said delighted coach Karl Harrison.

"I'm so pleased for everybody at the Batley club. After being 12-0 up, we made too many mistakes to let Widnes back in the game, but we showed great character to come back and win it. There were some real big individual efforts to force errors from the Widnes ball carrier. We weren't at our greatest today but neither were Widnes. In cup finals, the team that executes their plays at the right time generally gets their rewards and we probably had one more play than them." Harrison paid tribute to dual-reg Huddersfield winger Alex Brown who grabbed two late tries to drag Batley back in front for the final time.

Widnes coach Paul Cullen said: "We had some good patches and were one mistake away from winning the final but I don't think we deserved it. You have to congratulate Batley for the way they stuck at it and finished the game but when you're winning a final, to concede field position so cheaply is very difficult to take. The Widnes players have lost that final, they've thrown it away, and Batley used the field position very well.

"Some decisions went either way but the officials didn't drop the ball on play one and they certainly didn't chip kick to Batley. We lost the ball four or five times on the first or second tackle with a one-hand carry from our tryline.

"Then when we've won the game, we conspire to come up with a very weak kicking game, chip kicking straight to Batley which was outrageous and it's cost us the game."

## COMING UP...

... the prospect of anyone catching the runaway Featherstone Rovers atop the Co-operative Championship appear less and less likely by the week, but one team looks certain to drop out of the running on Thursday night when Barrow desperately need to make their games-in-hand count against Halifax, while hoping their county neighbours Whitehaven can pull off the surprise of the season at home to Daryl Powell's men.

Widnes and Leigh provide another classic clash, while the battling Rams will be hoping neighbours Batley are still hungover from their NRC celebrations when the two meet at the Tetley Stadium. They may well be!

Toulouse will hope to continue their play-off charge at Keighley on Saturday evening.

The two teams hoping to peg back Hunslet in the Co-op Championship 1 meet as the action returns to the Fylde coast on Sunday with Oldham the visitors.

The Hawks meanwhile have a less daunting visit to Gateshead on the cards, while the clubs chasing play-off positions have intriguing fixtures with Hornets entertaining a rested South Wales who were not in the Northern Rail 9s, and York hosting Workington. Finally Skolars will harbour hopes of increasing their points tally when Doncaster come to the New River.

## Halifax go one better in 2010

HALIFAX showed how seriously they take this competition by winning the Northern Rail 9s at Blackpool Panthers' Woodlands Memorial Ground last Saturday, leaving Sheffield as bridesmaids for the second year running. It gives Fax a place with the 'big boys' at the Carnegie 9s at Headingley next month.

Halifax won the second-tier Plate competition last time out but the change to a one-day format meant there was no 'second chance' for clubs. It also meant there was heartbreak for Leigh and Hunslet, two clubs who emerged from the group stages with three wins from three, but under the points-ranking system, missed out on a semi-final place on their scoring aggregates.

Joining Sheffield and Fax in the top four were Keighley and an impressive Swinton side that managed a win over Championship opposition in Dewsbury, besides cruising past Gateshead and notching a win over derby rivals Hornets. For last year's winners Blackpool, a relatively inexperienced squad meant Martin Crompton's men were never in contention to repeat.

Sheffield's place in the final was earned by emerging from a World Cup-like 'Group of Death' which included both Barrow and Featherstone Rovers, plus plucky Oldham. A total of 104 points in their three games spelled out the danger the Eagles posed.

The Cougars led twice in their semi with Sheffield before Menzie Yere and Tim Bergin sealed a 20-14 victory, while in the other semi Halifax were pushed all the way by a Swinton side that almost took a drop goal decider, before Fax progressed with a 'sudden death' try.

In the final Eagles went ahead through one of their three powerhouse Pacific Islanders, Misi Taulapapa, but for the high scoring Yorkshiremen, that was to be that.

Both sides had taken very strong squads, but Dylan Nash was a massive influence on a particularly strong Halifax side as they eventually took control to run out 16-4 winners.

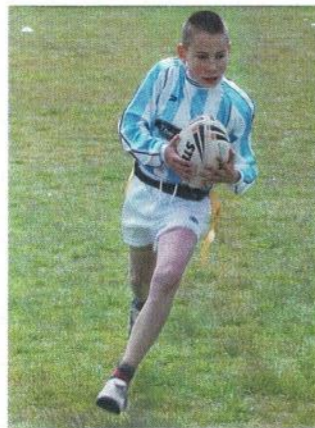
