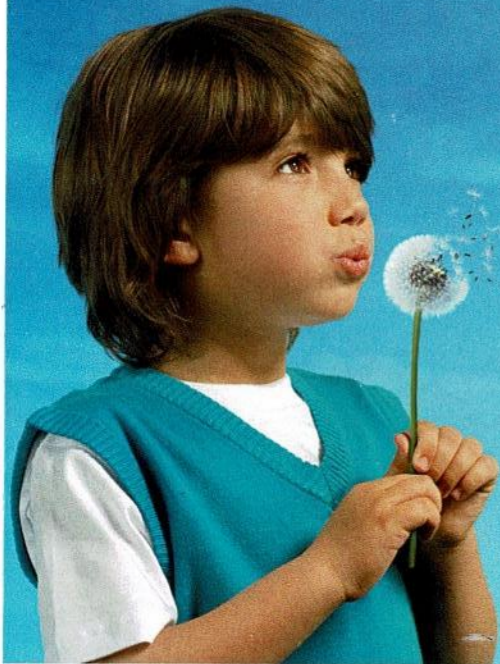

Twists and turns aplenty in store

After an enthralling finish to the Northern Rail Cup final a fortnight ago, you could have been forgiven for thinking last weekend's Co-operative Championships wouldn't be quite so dramatic.

Sometimes it's good to be wrong because we were treated to some enthralling action and yet more twists and turns in the chase for glory and survival.

The clash of the weekend was arguably the Championship game between bottom-of-the-table Keighley Cougars and Toulouse Olympique in which Danny Jones slotted a last-minute drop-goal to secure victory by 27-26 and complete an impressive comeback for the Cougars.

With the Northern Rail Cup secure in their trophy cabinet, Batley struggled to shake off their post Blackpool hangover and were out-smarted by local rivals Dewsbury Rams, losing 36-16 in a hotly contested Heavy Woollen Derby.

After suffering defeat at Mount Pleasant at the start of the season, Dewsbury were happy to regain some local bragging rights although Batley still sit above their neighbours in the league table.

Widnes, Batley's opponents in the final, continued their poor run of form as they suffered defeat at the hands of Leigh Centurions. The Vikings looked to have recovered from their last-gasp defeat to Batley in the Cup as they went into half-time level with Leigh at 18-18. However, Widnes never got into it during the second half and Leigh eased home with a 20-point winning margin.

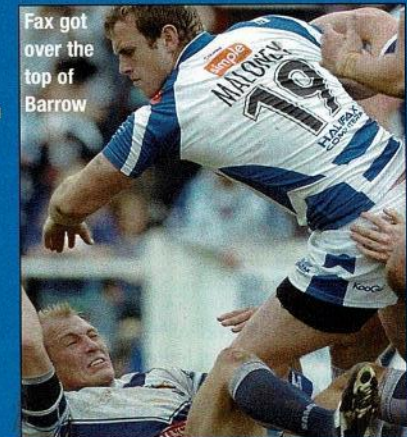
Runaway leaders Featherstone continued to show their class with a comprehensive victory against Whitehaven, a victory which has almost secured the League Leaders Shield for the Rovers.

In Championship One, pacesetters Hunslet outclassed Gateshead by a winning margin of 70 points, with Waine Pryce crossing the whitewash for a try hat-trick.

After a close-fought victory against Blackpool, Oldham will be looking to put the pressure on top-placed Hunslet when they face the South Wales Scorpions. Oldham know victory will take them level on points with the current league leaders and set up a dramatic end to the season.

Elsewhere the mid-table clash between Workington Town and Rochdale Hornets could be one to watch as they both aim to secure a play-off position.

Consistency key for the continually improving Rovers

Featherstone coach Daryl Powell is taking nothing for granted as his team look to lock-up top spot in the Co-operative Championship, as BEN COLLINS learned

W E ENTER the final month of the regular season this weekend yet Featherstone Rovers are showing no sign of letting up in their quest for Championship glory.

Despite the arrival of Iestyn Harris and former Leeds coach Daryl Powell ahead of last season, Rovers had to make do with the final play-off spot.

Even then they were one step from the Grand Final after overcoming Sheffield and Widnes.

This season things have really clicked for Rovers, though. They soon established themselves as the team to beat this year and while their challengers have gradually fallen away, 'Fev' have managed to maintain their momentum so that heading into Sunday's visit of Sheffield they've lost just one of their 17 league games.

"We've done well to be as consistent as we have," said Powell. "We've had a couple of ups and downs along the way in terms of performances.

"We had a real tough game against Keighley the other week and were able to win it while not playing right at the top of our game. But any team that does well throughout a campaign is going to have situations like that and it's a big pat on the back for the players that they've been able to get out of a couple of scrapes along the way.

"When you're on top of the pile, everybody's shooting for you and team's tend to raise their levels against you.

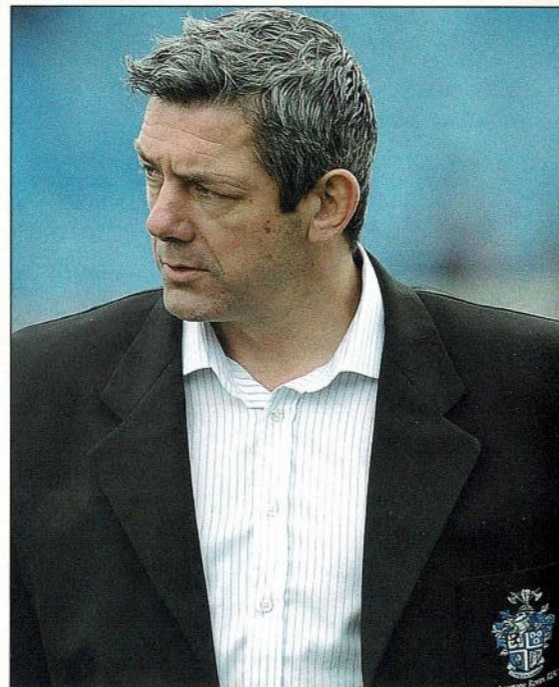
"It's something that we've handled well and we need to continue that, but I'm confident it won't be an issue. Most of the guys have got their feet on ground, they're a pretty solid bunch."

There has been plenty of attention on Featherstone over the last couple of years but now Powell's men have shrugged off the weight of expectation and are living up to the hype.

Rovers are seemingly destined to head into the play-offs as league winners and Powell is eager to ensure they finish the job.

"I think Featherstone, as a club, has a massive history, and we're looking to develop that," he said.

"Expectations are always high at a club like Featherstone

and we're looking to meet them all the time. But we've not won anything yet so it's important we don't get too carried away.

"It's crucial we finish top. You want to be consistent going into the end of the season when a play-off series is looming. We're conscious of that but you can only play one game at a time and that's the way we try to focus.

"If we keep getting our performances right then the results will take care of themselves. We'd like to finish top of the pile but we're not taking anything for granted."

Consistency has been the key and Powell has put that down to both the new arrivals at Post Office Road during the close-season and a much-improved defence.

"The personnel we were able to recruit made a big difference," he said. "We've got a real strong group of people at the club, first and foremost, and they're quality players as well.

"The consistency we've been able to deliver this year

has been a big step up from last year. We just need to hold our nerve and continue to be strong.

"Defensively we've been much better this year. We talk about our defensive standards all the time and that's been a significant improvement. If you get that right then it gives you a good platform to build your attacking game on."

And Powell's half-back pairing have sure done that in recent weeks. Kyle Briggs has picked up the mantle following Iestyn Harris's retirement while Liam Finn has impressed after rejoining Rovers having helped Dewsbury win Championship 1 unbeaten last season.

"They've been outstanding," Powell said. "They've had a real controlling influence on the way we've played the game. Kyle's goal-kicking has been fantastic, he's got a high percentage, and I was confident Liam would come and slot in well.

"He's got great control of the game and he's a real composed individual who doesn't get rattled too much. He's certainly lived up to the expectations we had of him.

"We work pretty hard from a team perspective and everybody's contributed.

Our forward pack has been excellent because we're not the biggest team. We're a fit bunch with a tough mentality, but I'd pick those two out as being significant."

Featherstone's title challenge has also been aided by some relative good fortune in terms of injuries, which has allowed Powell to play a settled team.

"Credit to Dave Downs and Carl Chapman, our physio," he said. "The way they've managed the group from a physical and injury prevention point of view has been exceptional.

"You try to keep as consistent a team on the field as

possible and if we don't have too many injuries, then that helps. We lost Tommy Saxton for a while and Iain Morrison for the season, but touch wood, we've been ok with injuries and we'll keep working hard to keep guys fresh."

But it should be noted that Featherstone are not putting all their efforts into just securing on-field success. There are ambitious stadium plans afoot while the club is also looking to boost its community and youth programmes ahead of a proposed Super League application.

"Everybody at the club's worked really hard to develop the business and what we do in the community," said Powell.

"We've got eight players working in the local community now, delivering all sorts of programmes, and Ryan Sheridan's managed that excellently.

"We're looking to grow as a club in every department, year on year. I have to give everybody credit for the way we've gone about things and we can get even better, there's no question about that, and we're aware of where we need to improve. But we have to focus on getting this year right."

That effort will continue with Sunday's visit of Powell's former club.

"We've had some pretty tough tussles against Sheffield since I've been at Featherstone and I don't expect that to be any different," he said. "They've been improving recently and they've got plenty of quality players so they're a dangerous team.

"They've made a strong push to be in the six at the end of the season so it's really important we focus on ourselves and get our game right. It's certainly going to be a tough challenge for us."

Just like the good old days



Doncaster have come back from the brink and will celebrate in true nostalgic 50s style

THEY'RE about to get all nostalgic over at the Keepmoat Stadium. Doncaster have been working hard to make sure they have stayed in the black this year after last year's financial problems.

And to celebrate, the Dons are going back to the 50's for their final league game of the season against Workington on August 22.

"We got a grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund, which runs till September, so for the last game we've decided to go for a 50's theme," said chief executive Carl Hall.

"We'll play in the 1950's kit, it'll be 50p entry and for one day only season tickets for next year will be just £50.

"Then after the game we'll auction the 17 shirts so it'll be a real exciting project, and the reason we're doing that is a thank you to the fans for sticking with us.

"Last year they paid good money for their season tickets then halfway through they're watching a bunch of amateurs play.

"It's possibly the first time in the club's history we've finished with 'plus' in the bank so we wanted to give something back to the supporters, and hopefully it'll attract some of the older ones to come have a look."

After last year's turmoil, winning back the trust of the fans has been as important as balancing the books to Hall, who has led the effort to get the club back on its feet since he took over last October.

As well as boosting the club's community programmes, Hall was keen to restore a sense of its heritage and invited back Doncaster stalwart Ray Green.

"The Heritage Fund grant was for a 12-month project on the history of Tattersfield and the Dons, which comes to a close in September," said Hall.

"That was one of the reasons we were able to bring Ray back to the club and he's now running the community side as well.

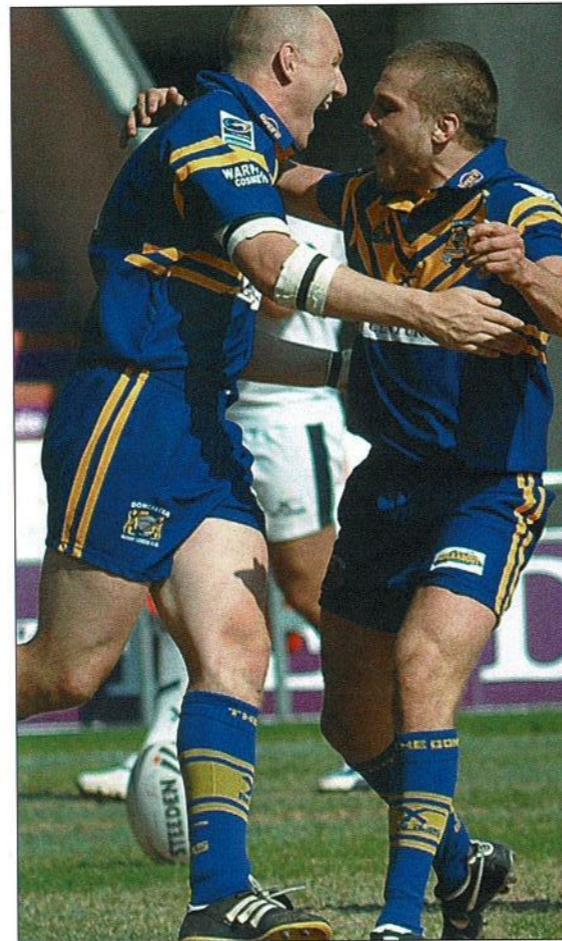
"His wife, Jackie, works full-time at the club in admin, and their son Pete is an ex-captain who now plays for Sheffield so the family's Doncaster rugby league through and through and I needed people like that at the club.

"The biggest thing we had to do was to earn the trust and respect back off the fans and the town," added Hall.

"When I took over, we sat down with the advisory group and said we wanted to go through the whole year without any financial murmurs. I've had to be very tight with the money but we've done that.

"People might have been saying, 'in 12 months' time they'll be back in the same position'. But we've managed to batten down the hatches and have a good go, and we'll finish the season with a significant amount of money in the bank.

"We've had a year to really look at the business and see how the finances go, and I can assure everyone we can only

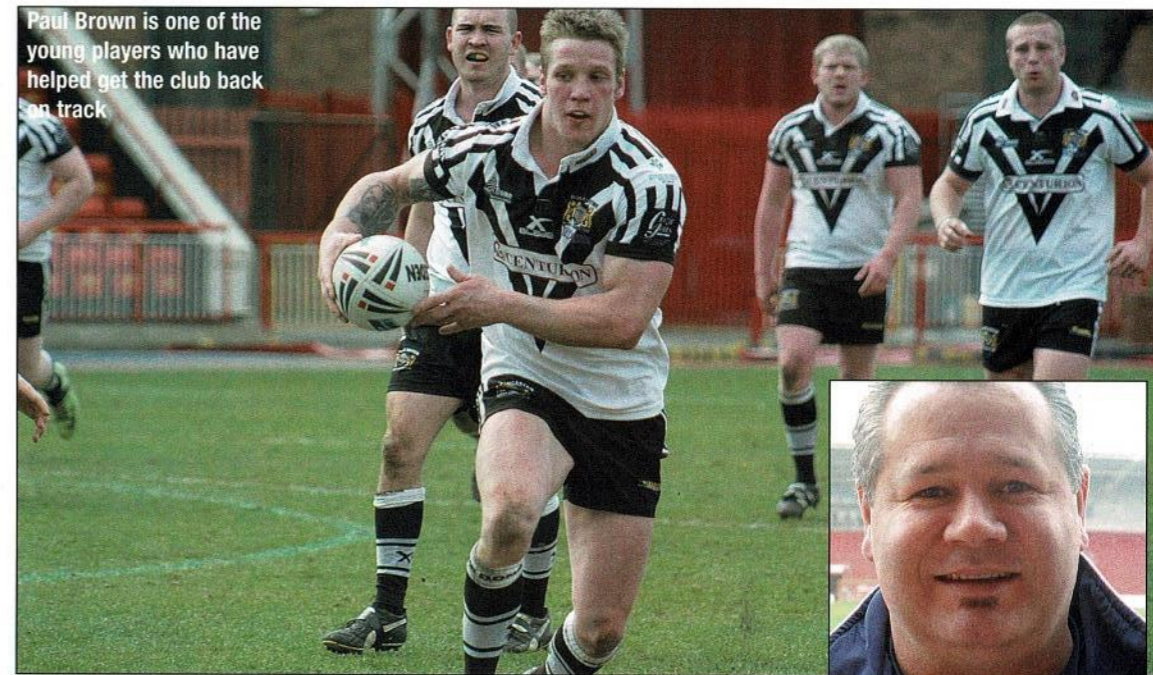
progress on an off the field. Everything at Doncaster rugby league is onwards and upwards."

Hall has gone back to basics in a bid to get the club running on an even keel, which has meant not being able to sign players on contracts this season.

"We only pay win and lose money and we'll continue to do that for the next year or so," he said. "I have to tip my hat to the players because they came for two or three months pre-season, three nights a week, and didn't earn a penny. We're getting people at the club who want to play for the club, and everyone's buying into the idea we can only pay what we've got.

"We're also strengthening our links with all the local amateur clubs Rossington, Moorends, Doncaster Toll Bar,

Bentley. Everything we do has got to include the community. Our development officers now go out twice a week with Active Doncaster and Positive Futures, so we're really grasping that side of things.

"I may own the club in principle but as far as I'm concerned, the whole of Donny owns this club. Our focus is having a club here for the next 10 or 20 years."

Given he's an ex-player himself, Hall appreciates more than most what Tony Miller's squad are doing for the club.

He came over from New Zealand to play for Doncaster in 1988 and later played for Bradford and Leeds before finishing his career back with the Dons.

"I then worked a proper job in immigration for a while then (former owners) Shane Miller and Craig Harrison brought me back and now I've ended up holding the baby, haven't I?" Hall joked.

"This club contributed a helluva lot to my life and I'm not one to forget things like that.

"I feel I owe the club a lot and I'm proud of what we've managed to achieve this year."

Playing matters have taken a back seat this year but even so, Hall has been pleased with the team's progress under Tony Miller.

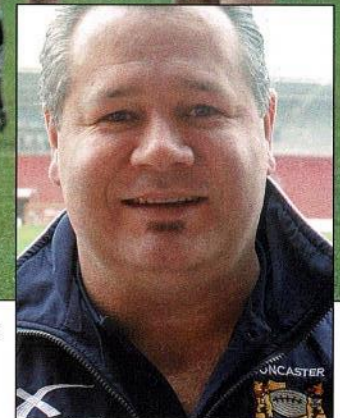
Having won at London Skolars last week, the Dons are aiming for back-to-back wins against Gateshead, before which there'll be a Masters game dedicated to Kevin Parkhouse, the former Doncaster player who passed away in a road accident in 2006.

"The playing side has not been the priority this year but we've done what we wanted to do on the field," said Hall.

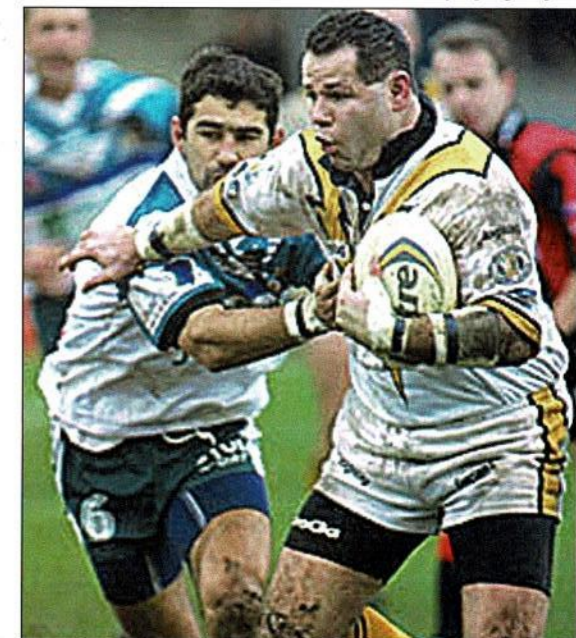
"There's a great team spirit, we've got better as the season's gone on and we can still make the play-offs.

"Everyone said we'd be lucky to win two or three games

but we could finish the season winning eight or nine, which I don't think is a bad return for a club paying just win and lose money."

KEEP AN EYE ON THE BALL

I WAS checking out eBay at the weekend under the section for 'sporting goods'. Try as I might I could not find a section that might cover "Super League licence qualification for sale".

Tut, tut, imagine Batley Bulldogs chairman Kevin Nicholas missing a trick like that! If a place at the top table is beyond the Gallant Youths, I'd have expected their astute chairman (which is a very polite way of saying 'money conscious', which is in itself another way of saying 'tight-fisted') to find a way to cash in on the Rugby League equivalent of one of Willie Wonka's Golden Tickets.

For clubs like Leigh and Featherstone – as yet at least – all of the good work in the community, with development structures, and with their stadia, is pie in the sky without the all-important on-field qualification. Of course the worth of a trophy win like Batley's in the Northern Rail Cup is about so much more than that. There was a definite swagger in the step of local folk over the past week or two that hadn't been seen in quite some time, and even if the old enemy won the last set of bragging rights until Boxing Day, the Bulldogs faithful could with good reason put a big asterisk against the result – as in "we don't care because the lads had only slept about eight hours in the past week."

What was tremendously encouraging was the crowd of almost 2,000 at the Tetley's Stadium last Sunday, which just goes to show what some of our more modest Co-operative Championship clubs can achieve with a fair wind at their backs.

Within many parts of the game there is still a feeling that Widnes are front and centre of the queue for Super League, and the fact that the RFL said at least one club would go up is now sharply in focus, especially as the decision-making process has been brought forward a few months to next spring.

I made just that point last week in the company of former Featherstone Rovers chairman Richard Evans who – as you would expect – took mild umbrage at the mere notion that anyone could take anything so important for granted.

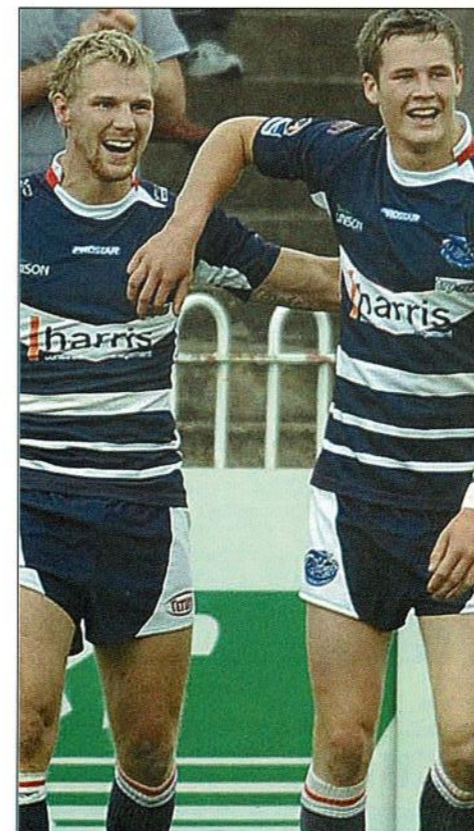
The idea, for instance, that neighbours Wakefield and Castleford automatically have better cases for a licence (in the event that Featherstone qualify through the Championship Grand Final) was pure anathema.

That is entirely understandable. The pride that beats in every heart, under every shirt, at clubs like Leigh, Barrow, Halifax, Featherstone (and elsewhere!) is what makes our game so very special.

Looking further ahead, it means that come next spring when the big decisions are made, there is going to be joy in one particular camp, relief in several more (most probably) and wails of anguish from at least one current Super League club and, I suspect, from more than one current Championship club who will feel terribly hard done by.

That's the nature of sport, as simple as. But it does mean we are in for some fireworks on the field between now and September!

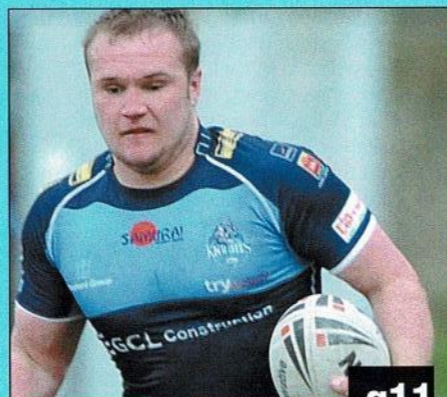

HALIFAX coach Matt Calland is relishing the chance to fly the flag for the Co-operative Championships when his side compete in the Carnegie Floodlit 9s on Wednesday August 25.

Victory in the Northern Rail 9s at Fylde 10 days ago secured Halifax entry into the Carnegie Floodlit 9s, where they will go up against Super League opposition at Headingley Carnegie Stadium.

"Everybody at the club is really looking forward to it, we had a great day out in Blackpool and we thoroughly enjoyed the day and the atmosphere," said Calland.

"Now we're all looking forward to testing ourselves at a higher level against other clubs and the players can't wait.

"It will be a big challenge as it comes on the back of a trip to France for us; we play Toulouse in the last game of the season on the Saturday. It will be a quick turnaround but we will be taking a full strength squad, so we are really going for it."

Halifax have put in a few extra hours of 9s training in preparation for their experience at Headingley.

"We had a nine against nine training session before the Northern Rail 9s, so we will probably do the same again before the Floodlit tournament," explained Calland.

"We are playing on the Saturday so we will just have a look at the rules and have a run through, playing with fewer men."

Calland is also looking forward to travelling to Headingley to play at one of Rugby League's top grounds.

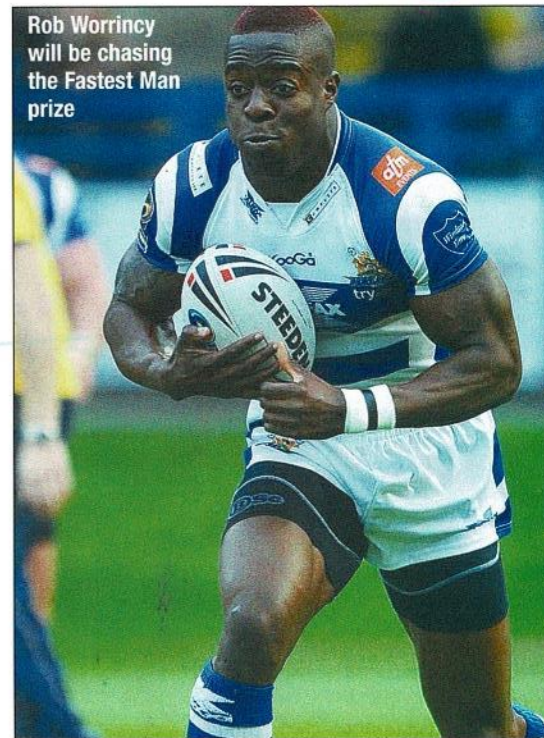
"It's a great place to go, I hadn't been there for a long time but I watched the Huddersfield game against Leeds and I couldn't believe how much the stadium had developed," he said.

"The atmosphere was fantastic so it will be a great occasion for the players, the club and the fans."

Not only will Calland's squad be able to test themselves against some of the best players in Rugby League, but with £10,000 in prize money available to the winning side, they may also be able to strengthen the club's financial position.

"Obviously all the clubs are struggling at the moment and it would be a great boost for the club if we were to get the £10,000, but I'm sure the other clubs will have a lot to say about that too."

"Rob is a really good athlete, he's quick and he's strong and he'll definitely be going all out to win it," said Calland. "With the prize money being £1,000 he'll definitely be up for that."

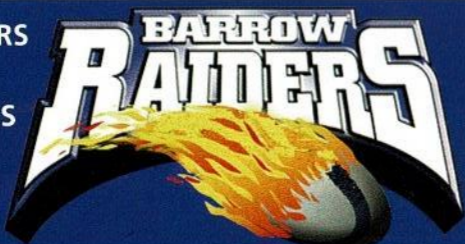

I have been supporting Batley Bulldogs for 70 years, but the weekend of the 17th/18th July will stay in my memories for the rest of my days.

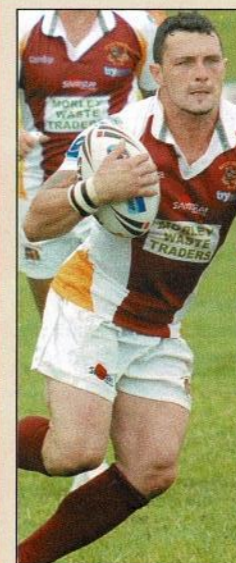
The weekend started with a nice meal at the White Tower Pleasure Beach hosted by the Northern Rail on Saturday, then back to Batley.

Light up the Sky!

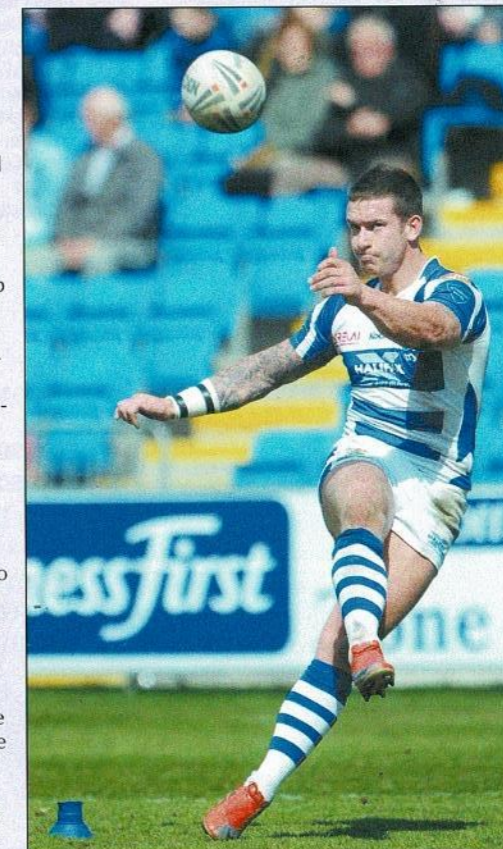
ANOTHER week, another Thursday in front of the Sky cameras.

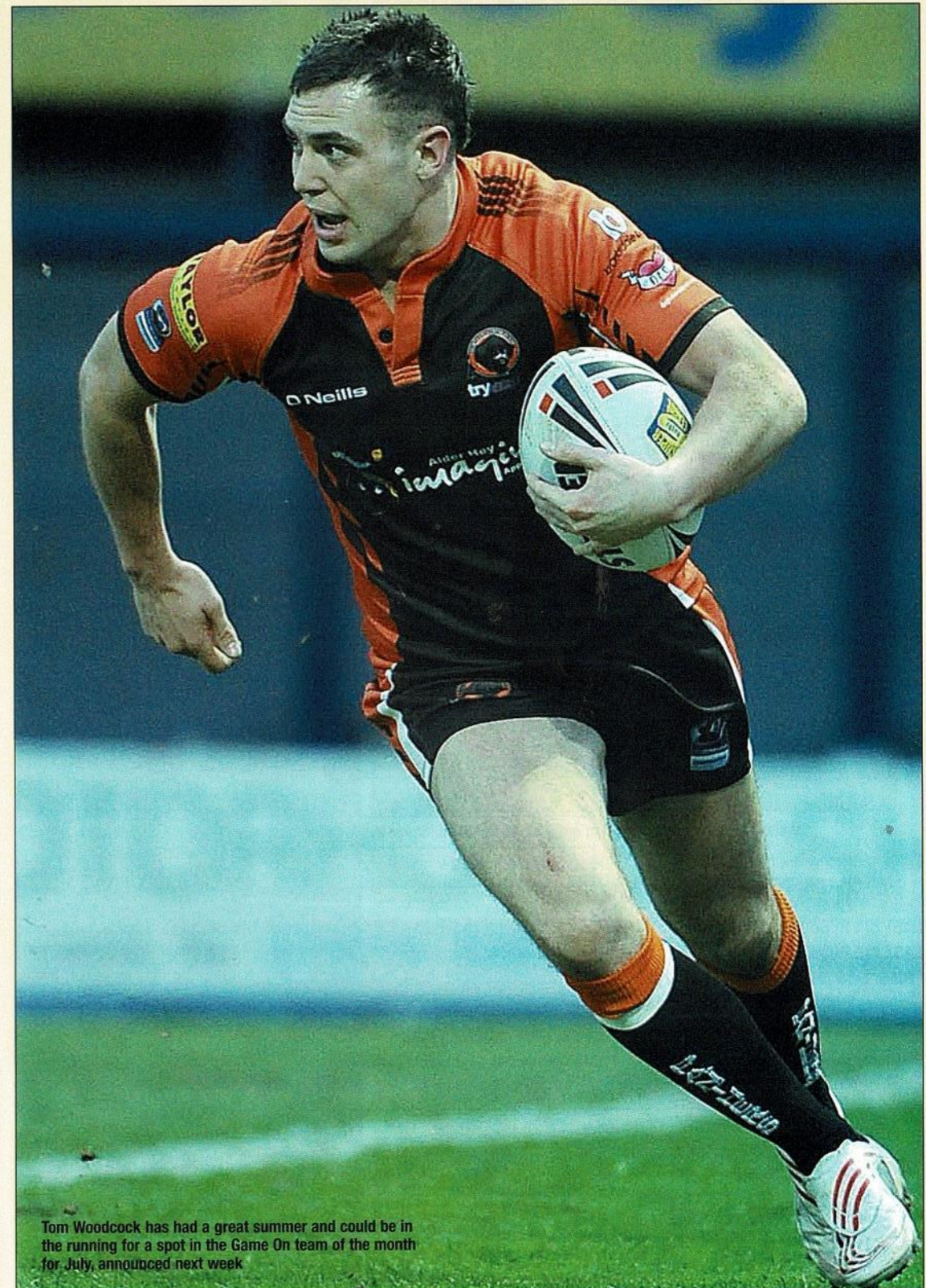

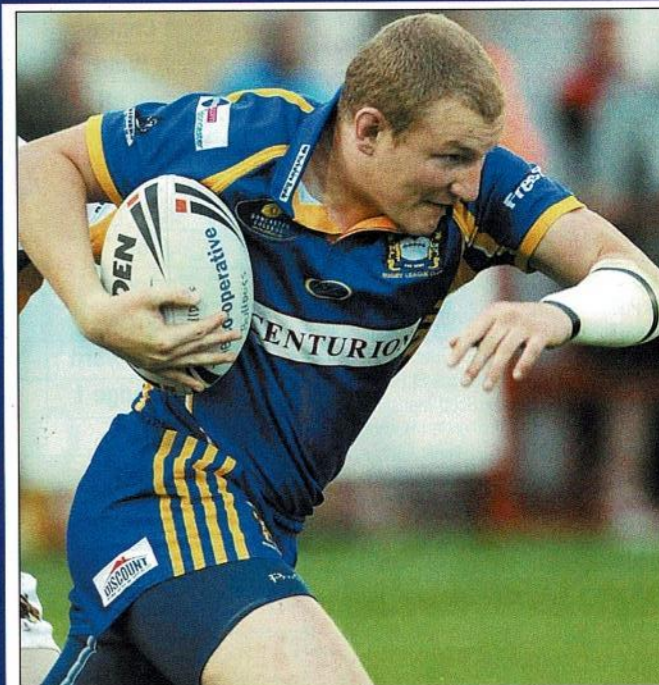

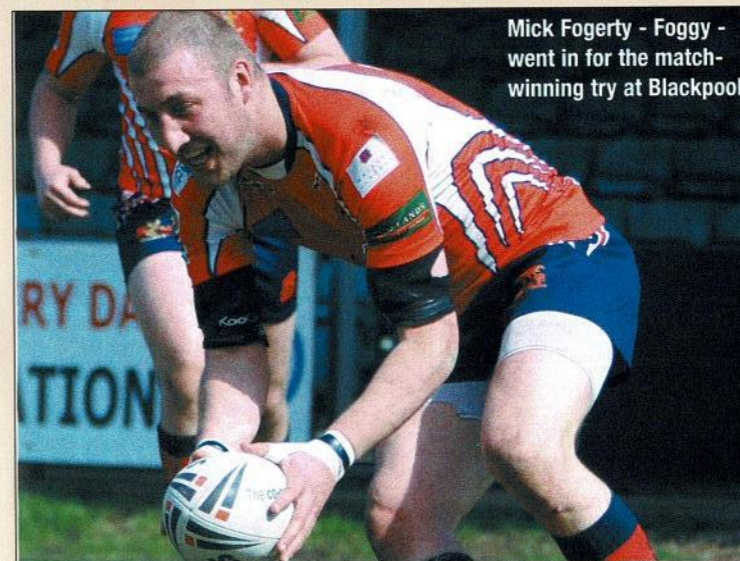

For players who have never played in a final that game was about as close as it gets with high intensity rugby in front of a large and vocal Oldham support.

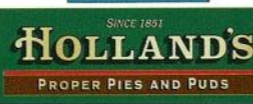
To everybody who took the trouble to get up there and get behind us with so much enthusiasm, thanks so much for making Sunday July 25 a very special day.

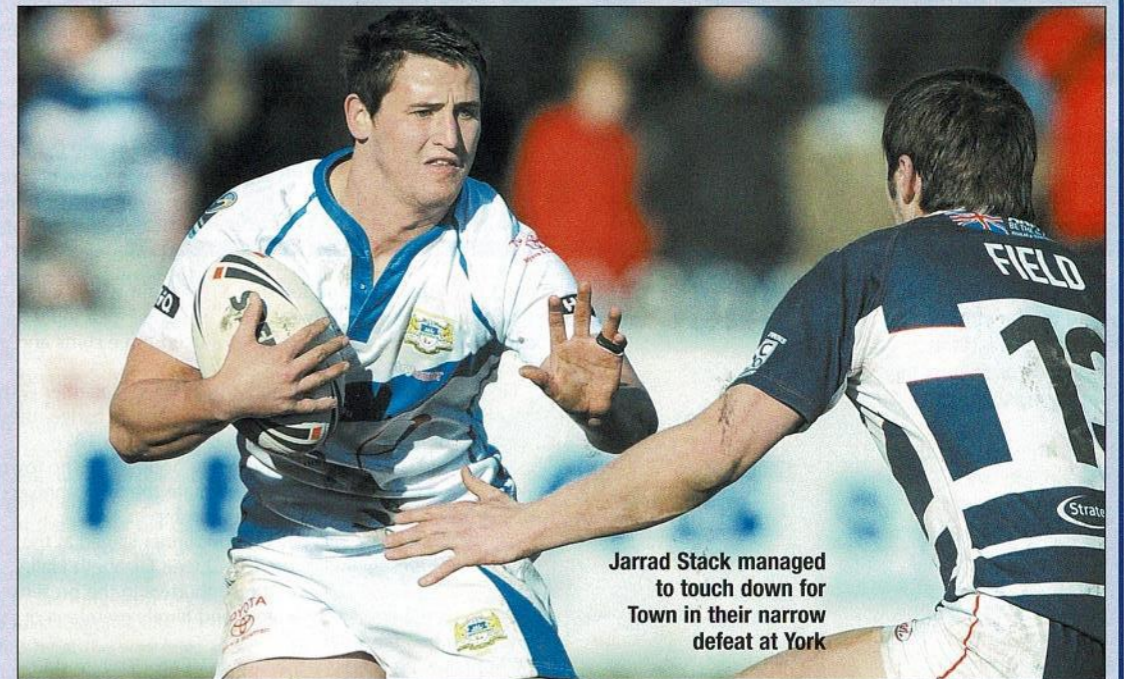

THE RISE AND RISE OF RUGBY LEAGUE RETRO SHIRTS

Focus on SUPPORTERS DIRECT,
the organisation bringing a new
perspective to running clubs

One question I'm often asked by the supporters trusts I work with in rugby league, is how best to raise money for the trust.

It's a difficult question, especially in the economic climate the country has recently faced so being able to come up with innovative ideas is key to ensuring the trust has the resources available to fulfil its aims.

In recent years, Rugby Oldham has come up with a fantastic idea that both raises funds and celebrates their club's great history. I chatted to Geoff Cooke and Ian Wilson, both board members at the trust, to find out more.

How long have you been a supporters trust for? What are your aims?

Rugby Oldham formed in May 2005, in response to the demise of the old Watersheddings ground. The club had to play matches outside of Oldham due to difficulties with Oldham Athletic and we wanted to secure a new dedicated RL ground within Oldham that could also be used by the entire community.

More recently, following advancements in the club's circumstances, we've altered our focus and dedicated much of our resource to supporting all rugby league within our area from the junior and amateur game right up to the professional level.

What made you decide to produce a retro shirt?

In conjunction with Oldham Rugby League Heritage Trust, we identified a gap in the market for RL memorabilia in the

lead up to Christmas and felt that a retro shirt which celebrated the club's fine history could be a great idea to fill the gap. In the last four years we've produced three shirts and a polo shirt.

First came a shirt in black and amber hoops together with the original Oldham Football Club 19th century badge, these being the original colours of the club founded in 1876.

Next came the classic red and white hoops with the town coat of arms and embroidery to celebrate the 50th anniversary of Oldham winning the Championship in 1957.

This tied in with a gala celebration dinner staged at the town's most prestigious venue, the Queen Elizabeth Hall, which was attended by over 400 supporters in the presence of surviving members of the team and family members of those who had passed away.

The following year saw the launch of an all white shirt with the town coat of arms and the dedication "Lancashire Cup Winners 1957-1958-1959", recognising the club's triple feat in each of these games.

Finally, last Christmas saw the release of a polo shirt in the club's traditional red, white or blue. The polo shirt carried a new badge which was a copy of the programme cover badge from the 50s and 60s with the legend "Oldham Football Club".

How successful has it been? Is it something you would recommend to other trusts?

All of the items we've produced have been very well received and popular amongst our members and the wider rugby league public of Oldham.

They've helped to raise the profile of the supporters trust and earned valuable publicity for us as well as raising much needed funds.

There's definitely a big market out there for nostalgia and retro goods and it's certainly something we'd recommend to others.

Going back to being a supporters' trust, how do you feel it makes you stronger than if you were a supporters club?

The main benefit is the strength in numbers we gain from being part of the membership of the much larger Supporters

Direct organisation.

We're also aided by the fact that we're a properly constituted legal trust so we can't just disappear and there are a clear set of rules we have to follow.

What support have you received from outside organisations like Supporters Direct?

Supporters Direct is a terrific resource as it is a national organisation to fall back on for ideas, advice and support.

It is also a campaigning group with the ability to create pressure at the top level of football and rugby administration and also at government level.

Would you recommend this route to other supporters who might be worried about the future of their own club?

There's no doubt that the current business model of Directors who fund the running of clubs cannot be sustained.

Too much instability is created when anyone pulls the plug on their contributions and this has been demonstrated on several occasions already in rugby league.

At the end of the day there is only one constant in the game and that is the fans.

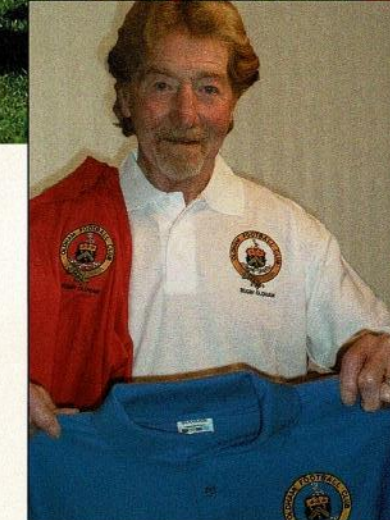
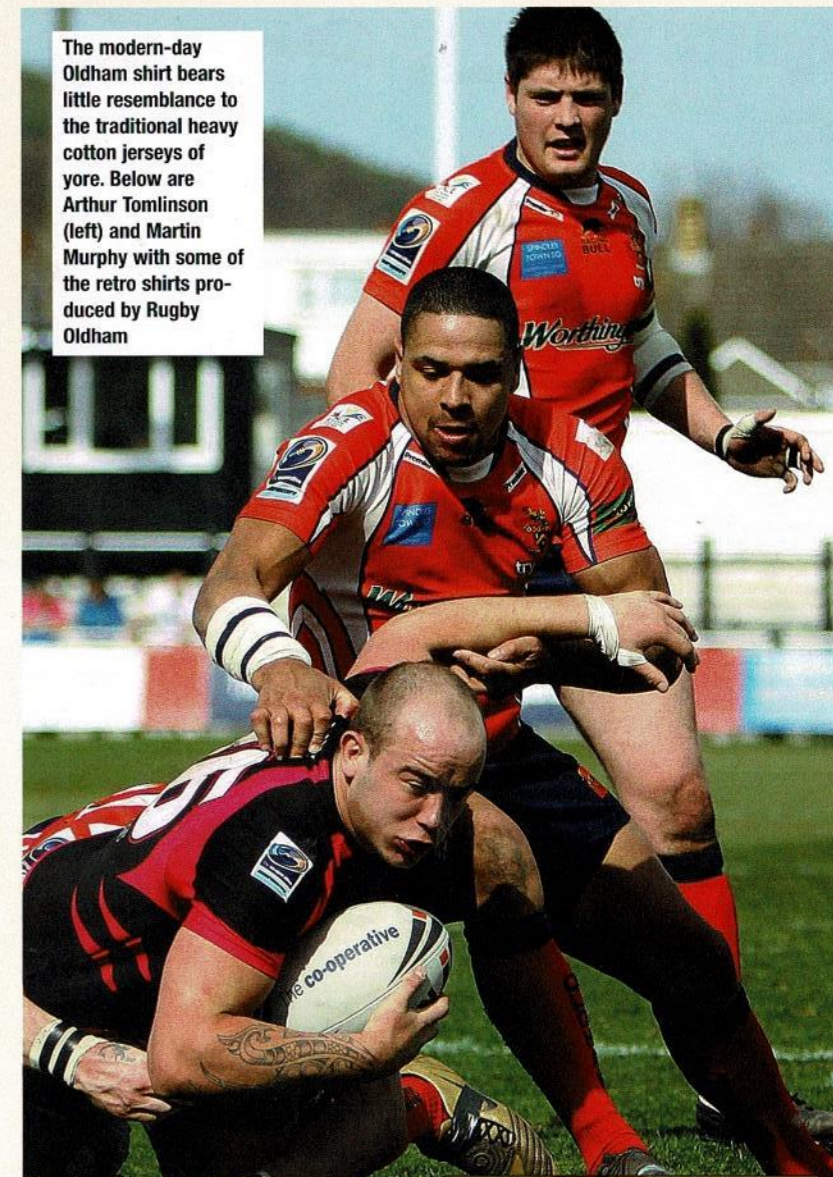
In the long-term fans have to take responsibility for their club by at the very least gaining a stake and influencing the running of the club through a transparent and democratic organisation like a supporters trust.

The German Football League has rules that all clubs must be at least 51% owned by fans and they have one of the strongest leagues in the world so if it can work there, it surely must be worth looking at in rugby league.

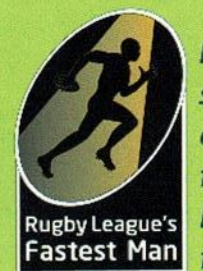

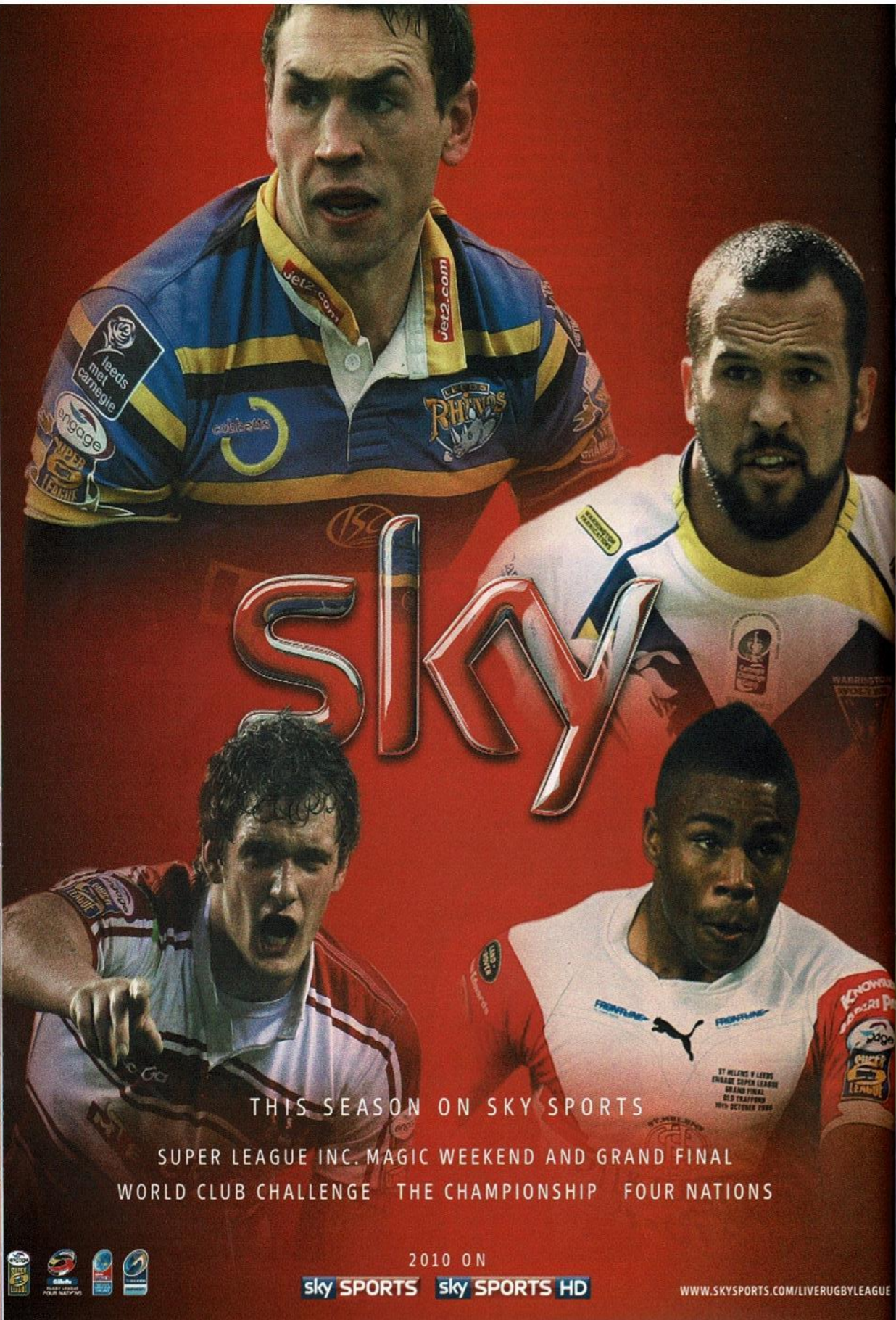
