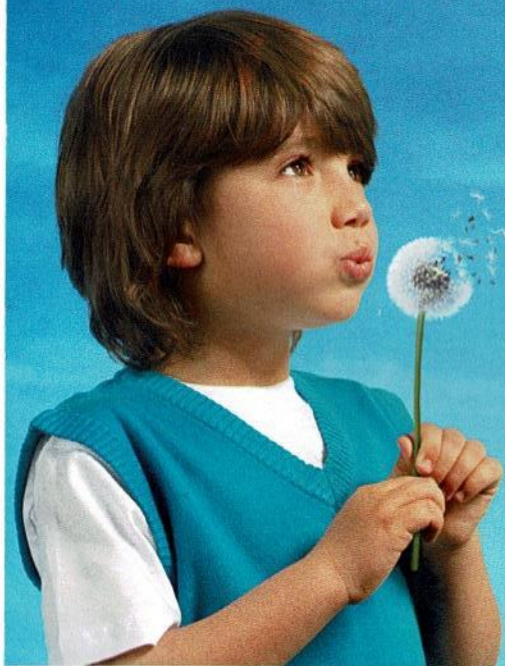

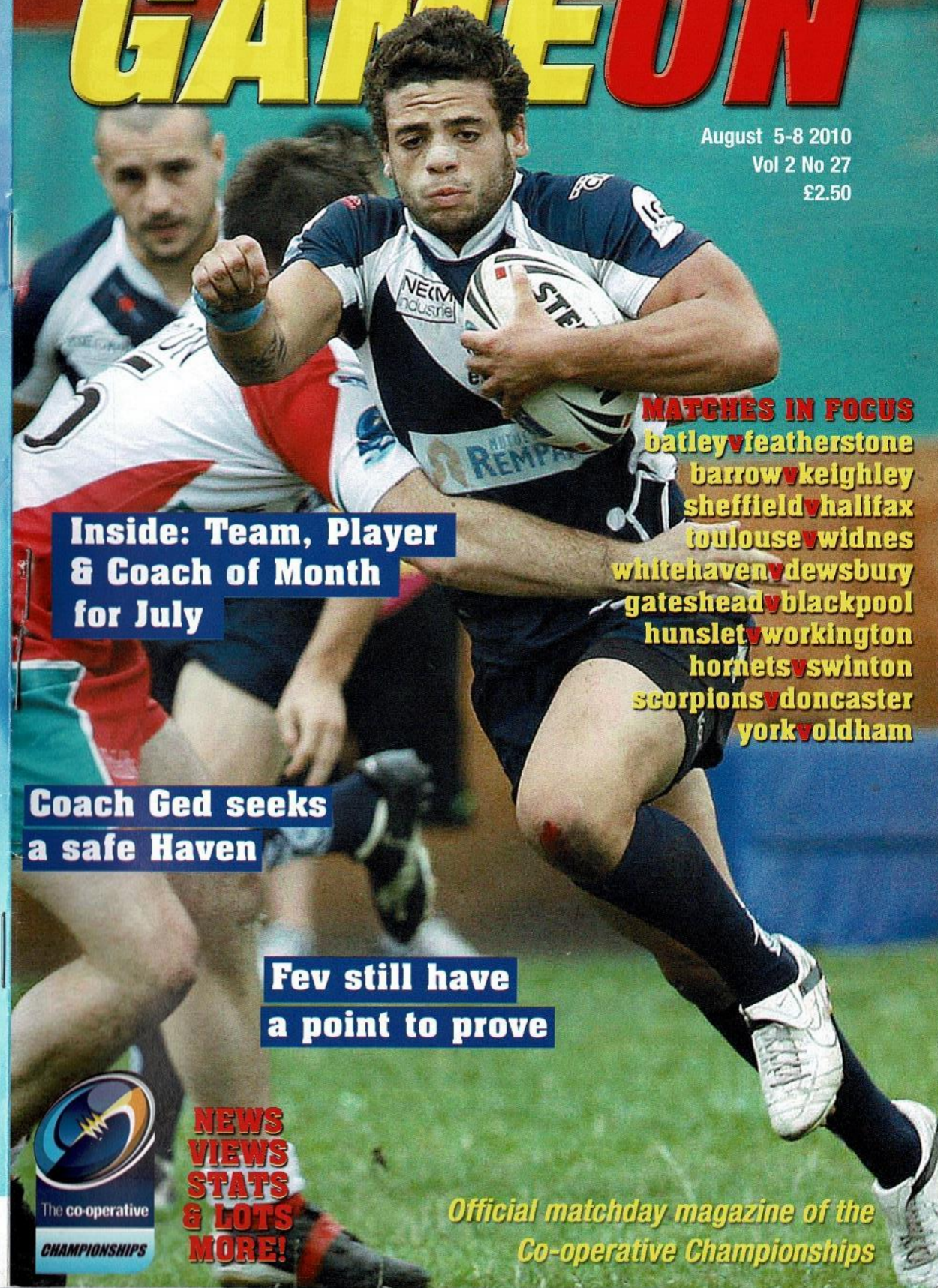

They face another tough task with a trip to Toulouse on Saturday evening and a win is vital if the Vikings are to have any chance of making the play-offs.

Halifax, whose title dream is still alive, just, are at Sheffield. Commiserations to Keighley and Whitehaven after their relegation was confirmed. Now they can begin their preparations for an immediate return.

Keighley travel to Barrow on Saturday evening and Whitehaven play host to Dewsbury at the Rec on Sunday.

BATLEY BULLDOGS loose-forward Tommy Gallagher is the July Player of the Month in the Co-operative Championships – ironically for a five-star performance from the stand-off berth for his club.

In a momentous month for the Bulldogs with their first real silverware in over 85 years, they negotiated the tricky visit of high-flying Barrow the week before the final with coach Karl Harrison mustering his resources and resting star playmakers Paul Handforth and Gareth Moore.

Gallagher, who has been vital to coach Harrison off the bench this term, started in the no.6 berth and scored five tries as Barrow went home empty-handed.

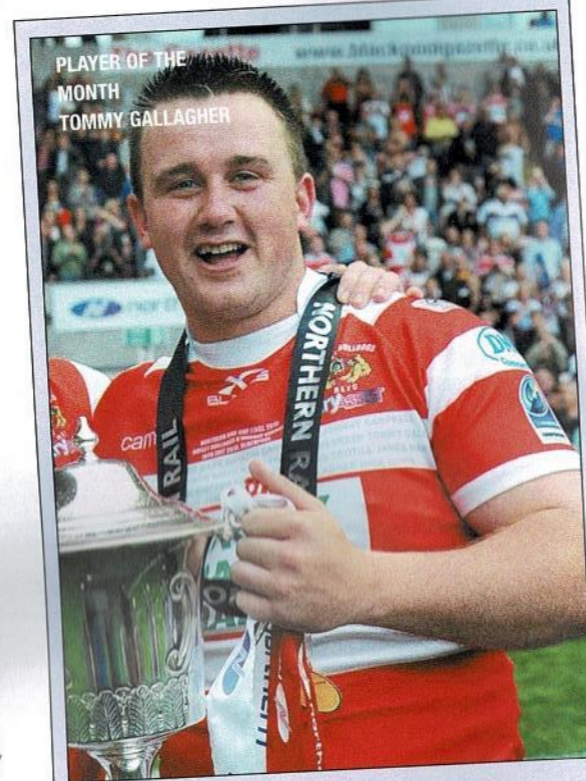
In a month where every team but Featherstone had their ups and downs – and poor Whitehaven again had only downs – it was enough to get Gallagher the nod ahead of young Featherstone trio Zak Hardaker, Sam Smeaton and Kyle Briggs, plus Toulouse inspiration Nathan Wynn.

Scrum-half Wynn is joined by the dependable Olympique full-back Rory Bromley in the all-star team for July, while another try-scoring sensation, Halifax's Rob Worrincy, zooms in after a four-try haul against Whitehaven.

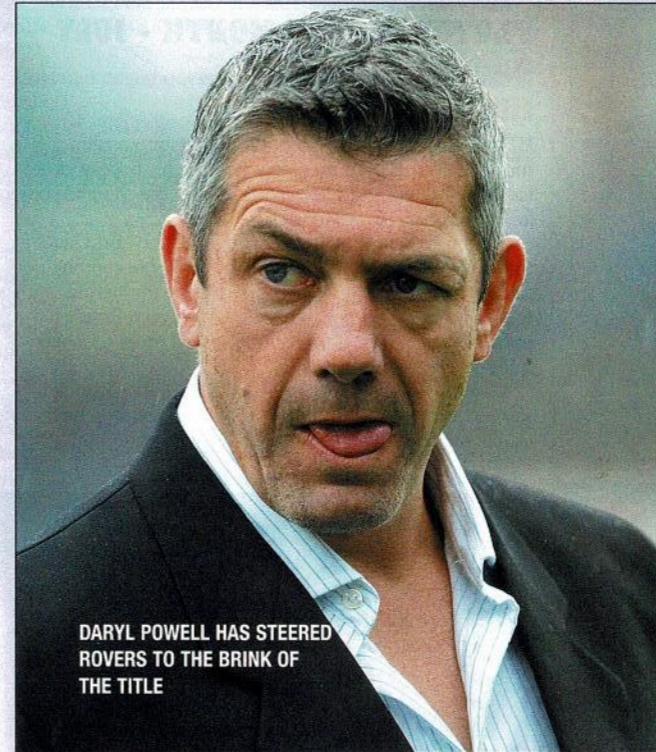

A SLOW start to the season in the icy depths of winter is surely all that has prevented Featherstone Rovers from sweeping the board and Daryl Powell is the deserved Coach of the Month for July.

Mark Aston of Sheffield was a strong contender but the Eagles only had two league games in the judging period, though their wins away at both Batley and Toulouse were noteworthy.

But Rovers put Whitehaven and Keighley to the sword and saw off the challenge of the resurgent Leigh Centurions to put themselves on the brink of the league-leaders' shield before the month of July was out.

Powell, who has been linked with various Super League positions this season, has built an impressively strong and consistent outfit at the Big Fellas Stadium as his team looks odds-on to lift the Grand Final.

came oh-so close to ousting Gallagher for the Player of the Month title as the young Featherstone pivot grows in both stature and maturity seemingly by the game.

A couple of real evergreens prop up the pack, with ex-Dewsbury man Frank Watene's big-busting bench impact being a major plus for Matt Calland and Halifax in this judging period – up to games played over the weekend of July 24/25 – and Ricky Bibey has been back at his best for Ian Millward's Leigh.

Watene's teammate Bob Beswick takes the hooker's role after a series of impressively influential performances.

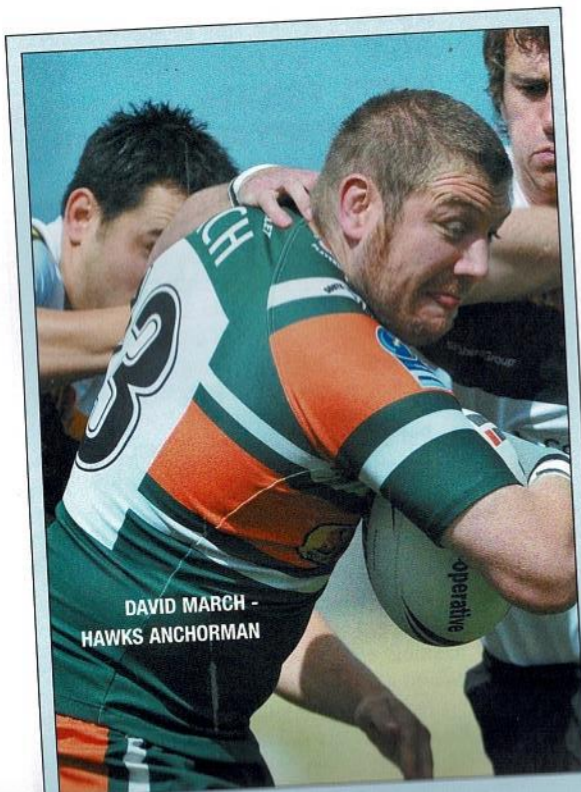

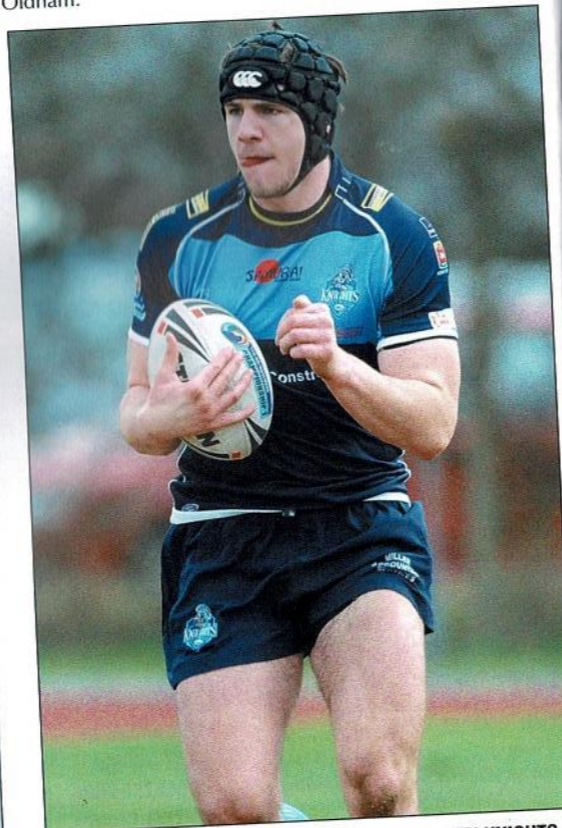

IT'S ALL change in the Co-operative Championship 1 monthly awards with no player holding his position from last month – but there is one constant – the March brothers keep marching on at Hunslet.

For the second time this season loose-forward David is the Player of the Month, anchoring some outstanding performances for the division leaders during the period, with a mix of his aggressive, no-nonsense style, some great ball-play and try-scoring opportunism, and a more than adequate trusty goalkicking boot.

March, who also leads the Championship 1 Ironman standings for the best forward in the division, has been fundamental to keeping the Hawks' noses ahead of charging Oldham.

Tony Benson's men provide three of the July Team of the Month, full-back Paul O'Connor returning to the all-star side, while prop Wayne Kerr earns a spot, as does on-loan scrum-half Gregg McNally.

The Huddersfield Giants dual-registered half-back just pips possibly the most difficult section in the side, with Blackpool's Tom Hemingway and Hunslet player-coach Paul March both having excellent cases for their inclusion, as did Skolars' Paul Thorman.

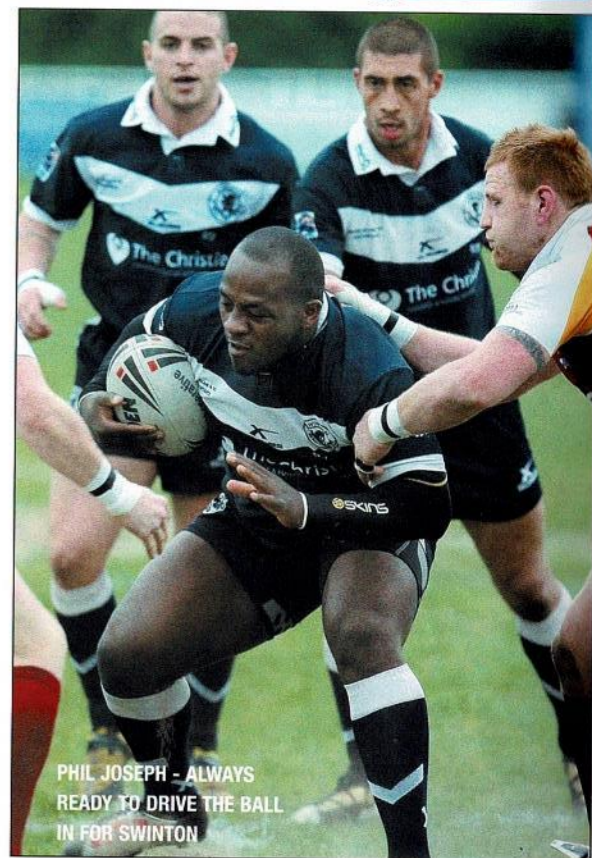
Partnering McNally in the halves is a surprise inclusion Jy-Mel Coleman of the London Skolars, reward for an excellent month where James Massara's men were always competitive and took their first win of the season over Hornets RL.

Coleman edged out evergreen Neil Roden for the no.6 shirt.

Hunslet utility Tommy Haughey gets a place in the centres alongside Blackpool's in-form Casey Mayberry, who has clubmate Tom Woodcock on his wing, while Hunslet flyer Waine Pryce completes the three-quarter line.

Up front York prop Nathan Freer only just missed out, pipped by James Houston and Wayne Kerr from the division's two most dominant teams, although in an always competitive tussle, Hunslet impact man Scott Woodcock, Jason Boult at Oldham and the Knights' Adam Sullivan all turned in notable contributions.

Phil Joseph again bags the hooker's role, beating out Steve Parry of South Wales and Phil Wood at Hornets. Young Sam Gee at Skolars also got a mention. Blackpool Panthers' Danny Halliwell was a contender for the overall prize but has to settle for a back-row berth with David March, the pair being joined by York's Luke Hardbottle, whose performances out of loose-forward get him promoted into the second-row on this occasion.

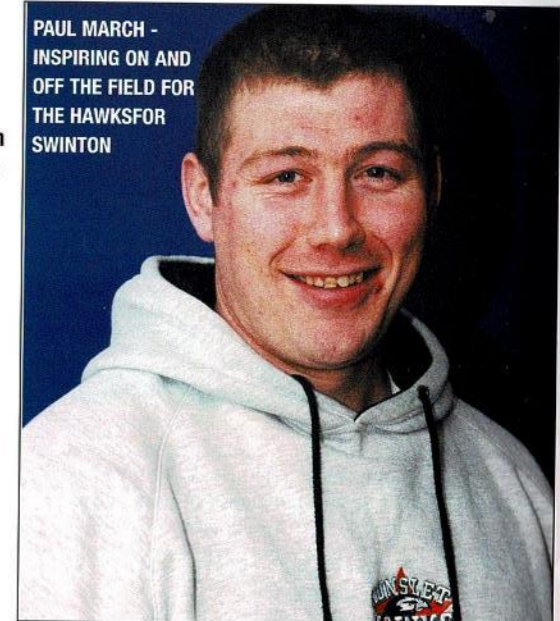
COACH OF THE MONTH - JULY PAUL MARCH HUNSLET HAWKS

THEY say it's the toughest job in rugby – that of player/coach – but Paul March has made it look like a doddle all year with some inspirational halfback play that perfectly complements his brother David's style out of the loose-forward berth.

But March has also managed to juggle his resources and rotate players all campaign long without it affecting the Hawks' ability to produce results, week in, week out.

After an acrimonious departure from York last season, March turned up at the South Leeds Stadium soon to be followed by many of his key men from the Knights and they have blended in seamlessly.

It is no coincidence that the scrum-half tends to be at his best when matches with his former club appear in the calendar as they did during July. 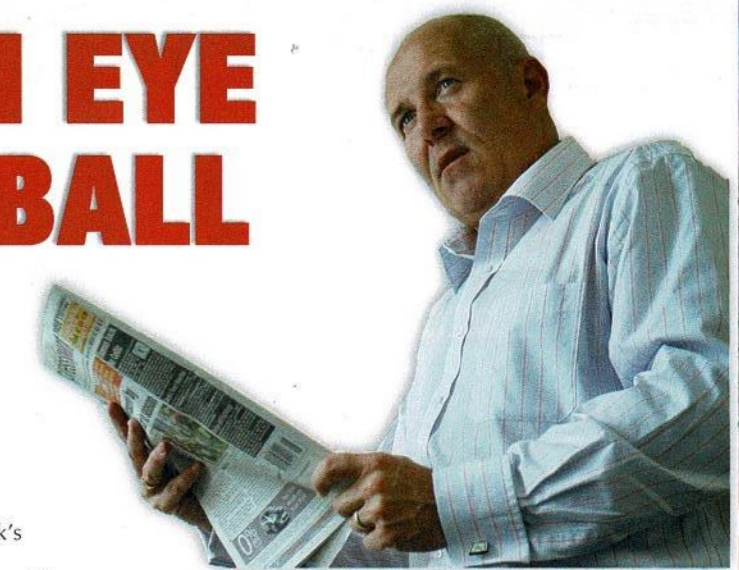

KEEP AN EYE ON THE BALL

IT'S a pity, although admittedly probably not from a Dewsbury point of view, that this weekend's 'big' clash between the Rams and Whitehaven has now been almost rendered meaningless by last week's results.

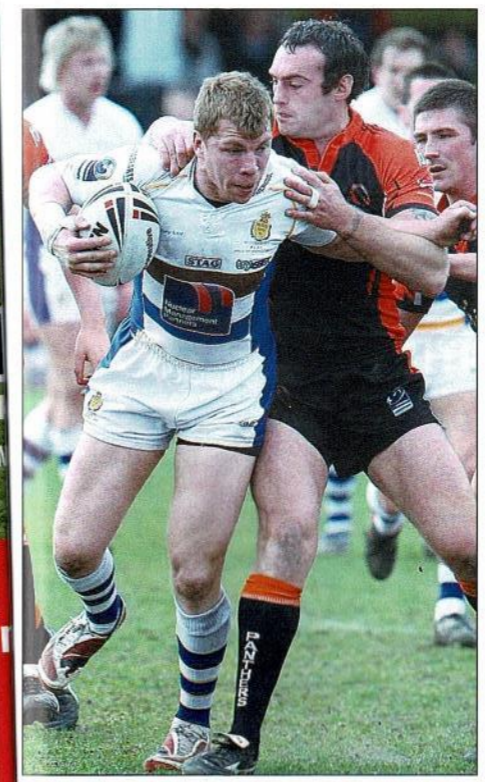
For a club of Haven's history and stature, it would have at least been nice for them to have had the opportunity to go down fighting with one last hurrah at the Recre.

As it was, the Cumbrians' relegation to Co-operative Championship 1 was sealed with Warren Jowitt's side's remarkable 30-6 win at the Leigh Sports Village, leaving Haven to hear news of their relegation from their sofas as they 'enjoyed' a weekend off.

Congratulations must go to Jowitt and to the Dewsbury club as a whole for its remarkable achievement this year. In many pundits' eyes they were nailed on for relegation this term and those opinions seemed to have been backed up by an 11-match losing run at the start of the season.

However, the Co-operative Championship's bonus point system rightfully rewarded them for keeping results close as they battled to come to terms with the division. Once they did, there was no stopping them. They have, arguably, been on play-off form these past couple of months.

But for Whitehaven it's another sad moment in a traumatic year for the town. Whitehaven RLFC means the world to many of its inhabitants in a county where rugby league is ingrained in the culture and lifestyle. Those people have found little to cheer about in 2010 with poor results on the pitch and financial difficulties off it.



Arguably, Haven's fate is also a blow for rugby league as a whole. The club continues to produce talented youngsters; the likes of Kyle Amor - now at Leeds - and Gregg McNally, currently on the books of Huddersfield. But with both Haven and neighbours Workington Town in the lower division, West Cumbria now has no outlet for its best young talents to play Championship-level rugby, save a handful of games in the Northern Rail Cup group stages at the start of the season.

And with many clubs in Championship 1 willing to splash cash on big name signings these days (note Hunslet's charge towards the title this year and Blackpool's ambitions before their implosion) it's not guaranteed that Whitehaven will bounce back at the first attempt either.

Their cause will not be helped by the presence in Championship 1 of a Keighley Cougars side that had eventually come to terms with playing at the higher level.

The Cougars' fight against the drop ended tamely with a heavy defeat at Batley, but they have notched twice as many wins (four) as Haven and would still be right in the fight for survival had they not suffered that nine point penalty.

Difficult times, therefore, lay ahead for Haven; times which demand that the club's supporters pull together in one direction in true Cumbrian spirit in order to drag the proud institution that is Whitehaven RLFC out of the mess they're currently in.

Welsh squad calls up Scorpion Steve Parry

Wales Rugby League have released a 47-man training squad for their European Cup games against Scotland, Ireland and France and their full international friendly and under 23 matches against Italy. All are in October.

Wales will be defending the European Cup that they won last year as they look to qualify for the Four Nations tournament in 2011 to take on England, Australia and New Zealand.

The squad includes 16 potential new caps including former Wales rugby union skipper Gareth Thomas, who switched codes to join Wales' only Super League club, the Crusaders, earlier this year. In addition to Thomas, some of the newcomers also come from the engage Super League. They include Crusaders' Jamie Murphy, who started with South Wales Scorpions this year but has recently signed a

professional contract in Wrexham, Castleford's James Evans, who has been included in Wales squads in the past but injury prevented his selection plus Wigan's Ben Davies and St Helens' Jacob Emmitt who have both performed well with Widnes and Leigh respectively this season under the dual registration rule.

There are six players from Wales under 18 in the squad. Four more up and coming South Wales Scorpions stars could make their first appearance too - Andrew Gay, Joe Burke, Lewis Reece and Steve Parry - while Leigh East's new signing Owain Brown, who was a stand-out performer for Wales Students in their recent home nations campaign, has also been selected. Brown has been studying at Glyndwr University, next door to Crusaders' ground in Wrexham that hosts Wales' first match, a friendly against Italy on Sunday 3rd October.

Fund launched for Afghan victim

Sheffield Eagles are to back the fund-raising appeal launched for their former player Liam Brentley who has been shot and injured in Afghanistan.

Royal Marine Brentley is recovering in the UK after being shot in the head while on patrol with 40 Commando in Helmand Province. He was on his first tour of duty in the country.

Bradford Dudley Hill, who the 25-year-old played before and after a two-season spell at the Eagles, have launched a fund to assist Liam and his young family.

Eagles' coach Mark Aston said the club will have talks with the organisers of the appeal to see how best they can help.

The Eagles plan some kind of fund-raising at their final Championship home game of the season against Leigh Centurions, on Sunday 22 August.

Aston said: "We will do something at

the last home game of the season for Liam who was a great player for Sheffield Eagles and did a sterling job for the club.

"Our thoughts are out there with his young family and his parents. Liam was part of Sheffield Eagles and the rugby family and when something like this happens it shows the strength of rugby league at pulling together."

Liam, a hooker, played 30 games for the Eagles from 2005 to 2006 and was the club's Player of the Year in his first season.

Eagles player Ryan Hepworth, a former Royal Marine, served with 40 Commando in Iraq and Afghanistan before leaving the forces and joining the Eagles in 2006.

He said: "It's a really sad story - sadly we hear it quite often these days but I'm just glad that Liam's pulled through.

"Quite often on the news I see mates from

the Forces who have passed away.

"When I did my stint out there (Afghanistan) it was bad but it's got gradually worse and worse as the campaigns have gone by.

Hepworth added that Brentley, who is being treated at Headley Court, the military's rehabilitation centre near Epsom, will get the best possible care.

*SHEFFIELD Eagles half-back Brendon Lindsay is to return to Australia at the end of the season.

"It's sad but probably this will be my last season at the Eagles," said Lindsay who is in his fifth season at the club. "It's on the cards, I've had a couple of conversations and it's starting to look like it."

A key factor is his wish to play one or more seasons in Australia before he finally hangs up his boots.

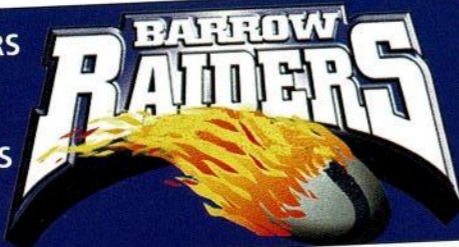

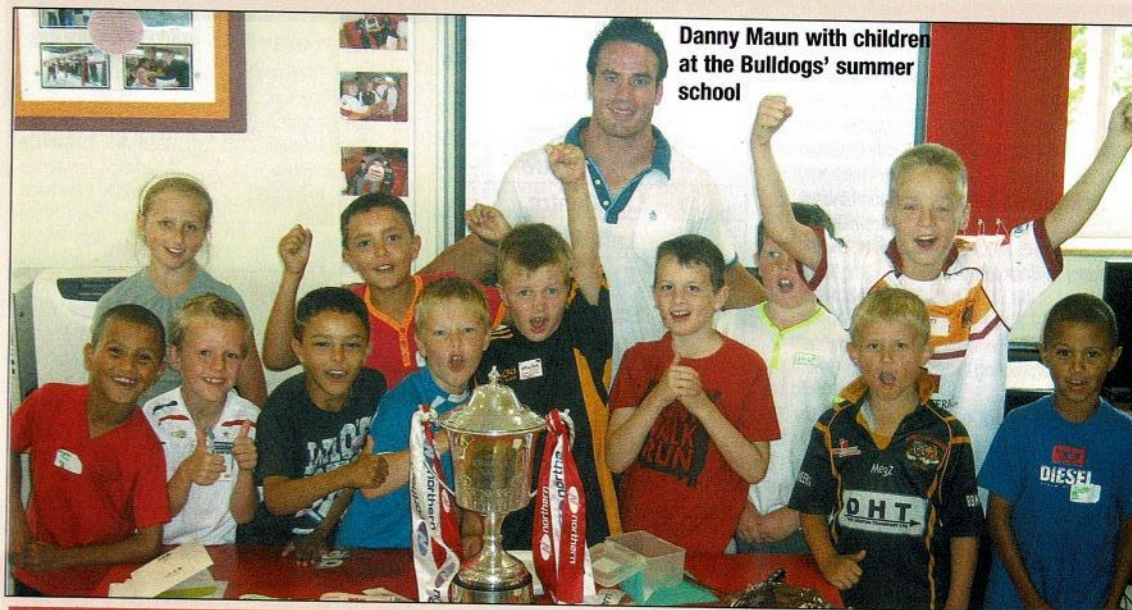

It's the time of the year when some players move on. Jason Mossop has been released from his contract at his request and we wish him well.

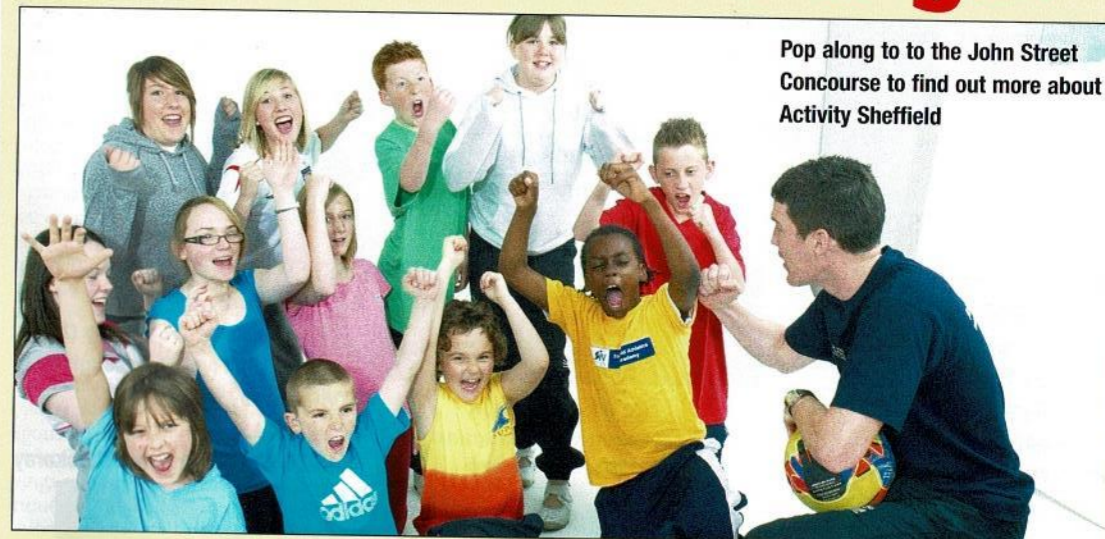

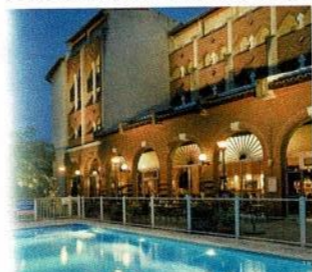

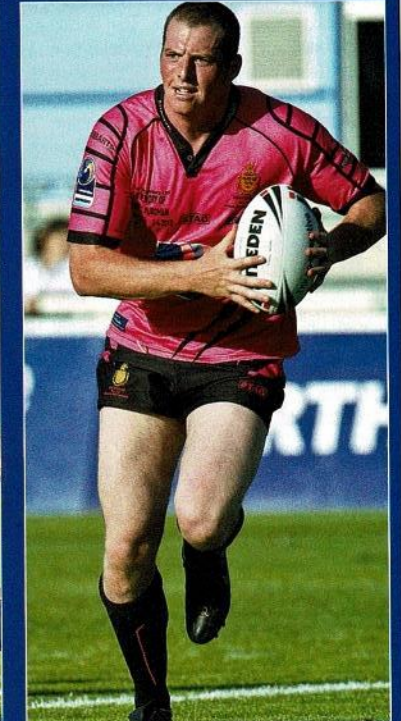
The board is committed to keeping the 60-year heritage of this club alive. We are certainly down, but we are not out. Your help and support are important to us.

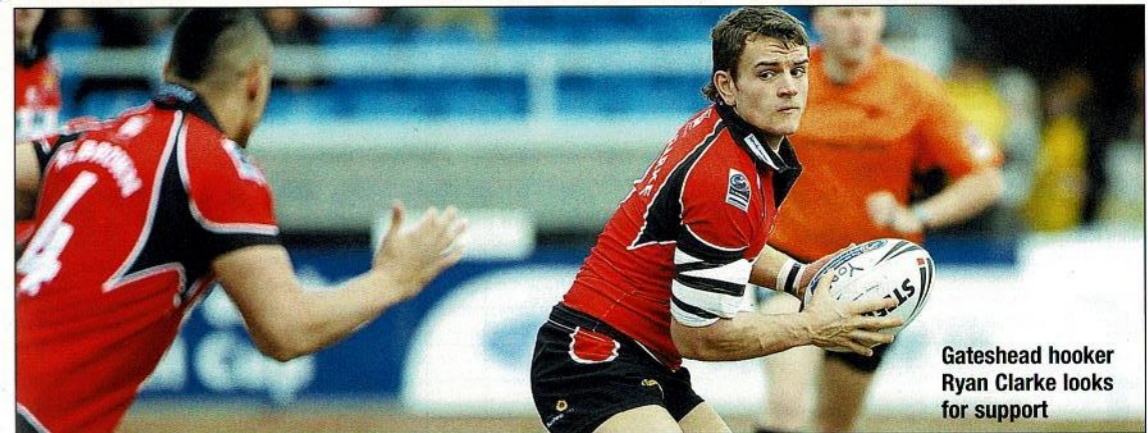

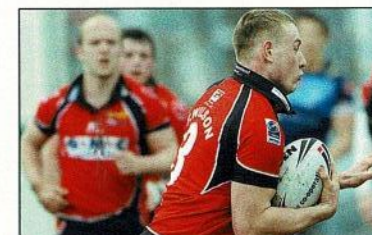

Despite the council not fulfilling its promise of a

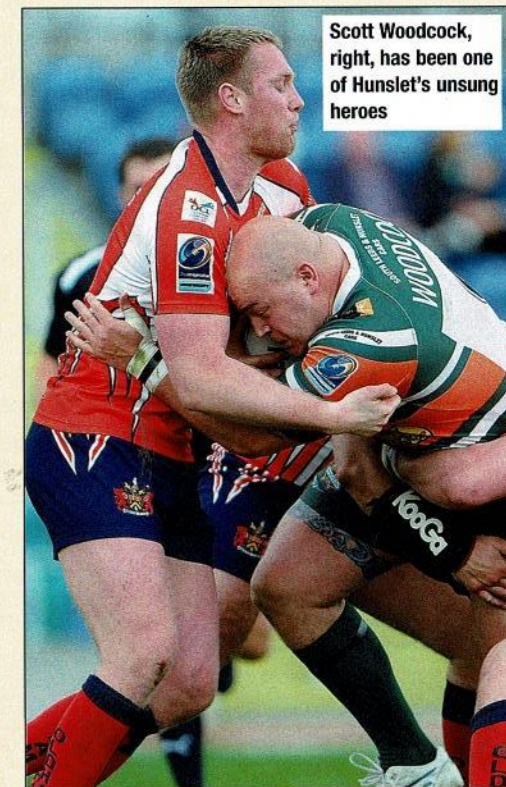
completed stadium we still need to attract more people if we are to survive. These occasions will be seen as a guide to the possible future of the club.

However, the club is far more financially stable now than this time last year and we can push on with developing the club in the next year or so.

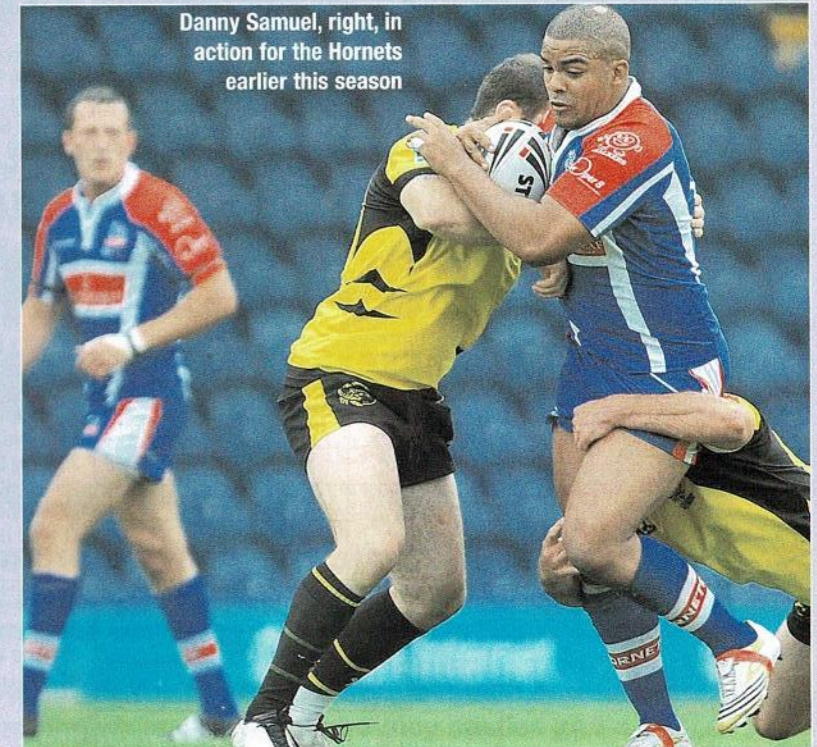
I have had very positive feedback from all the sponsors and I have already had talks with most of them about supporting us next season. I also have had discussions with several new potential corporate sponsors for next season.

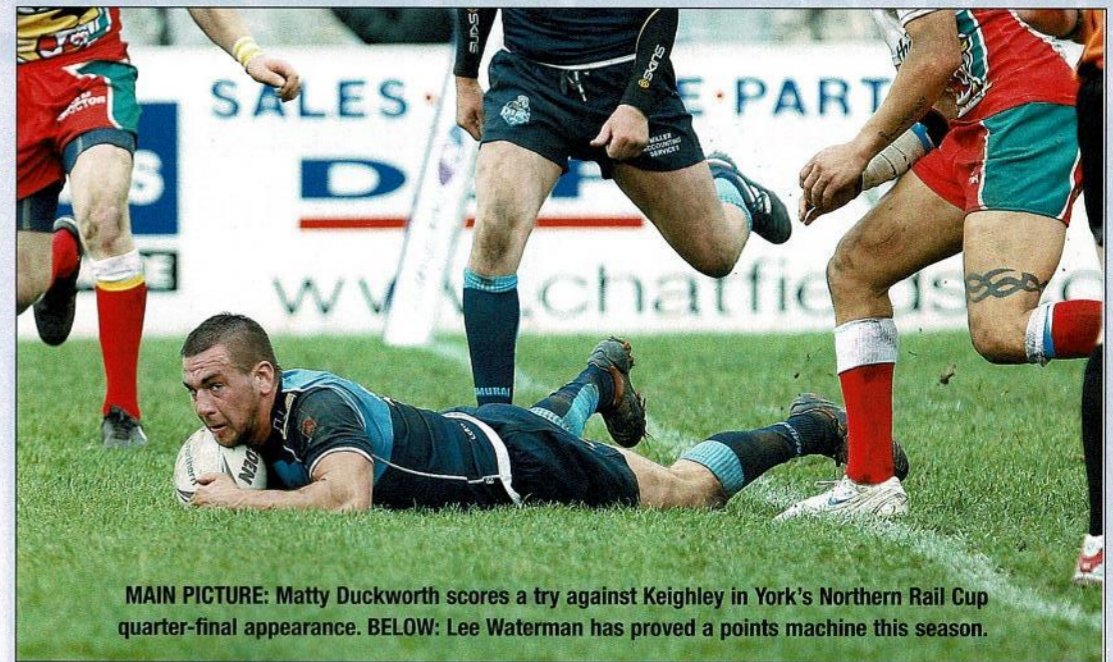

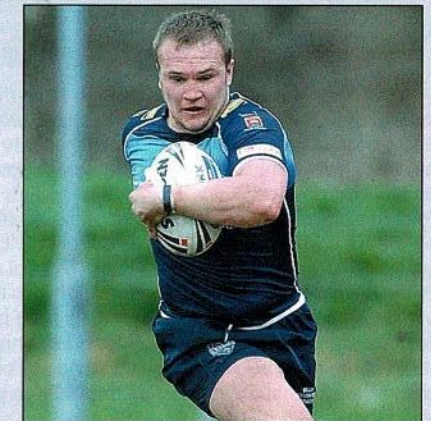

We need a safe Haven now



Coach Ged Stokes claims that relegation will give the club the chance to rebuild the team at the right level.

Report by BEN COLLINS

WHITEHAVEN'S clash with Dewsbury this Sunday was set up to be a relegation six-pointer. Haven are on a 12-match losing streak which has seen them slip to second bottom in the Co-operative Championship, with Dewsbury hovering just above the drop zone.

But Dewsbury's 30-6 win at Leigh last Sunday sealed Haven's fate and means they go into Sunday's game knowing they have already been relegated to Championship 1.

The Cumbrians now have little more than pride to play for but the message from coach Ged Stokes is clear.

"As far as I'm concerned it's business as usual," he said.

"We'll still do the same preparation. It's a matter of keeping a professional attitude.

"Once everybody gets their head around going down a division I think it gives the club a chance to rebuild in all areas, performance and business - then be able to develop a team that's sustainable so that, if we do go up again, we can maintain that position."

Although Haven won the 2005 title and have reached the play-offs for each of the last four years, Stokes felt he was rowing against the tide.

The club has been operating on one of the smallest budgets in the Championship and this year they have been forced into cost-cutting measures to allay fears of administration.

Haven's financial constraints meant some key players had to leave the club but Stokes is eager to put those problems behind them.

"I think looking at what we have to achieve over the next couple of years is more important now," he said.

"We'll be trying to get a team together that can be competitive in Championship 1. We'll have a number of players leaving the club so it's a matter of starting with a clean sheet of paper and away we go again.

"In some respects it's maybe the best thing that could have happened for us because if we had managed to stay up then we would have struck the same problems again - trying to bring players in on a small budget and trying to remain in the Championship, which has been very difficult over the last few years.

"I took over when the club was facing relegation in 2008 and realistically that's been the motivation - to stay up - and for me that's a negative motivation for any team. You should always be looking to win something.

"With the limited amount of resources at the club, it was very hard," Stokes added.

"The Championship's a tough competition to be in and you have to have players with the quality and the ambition

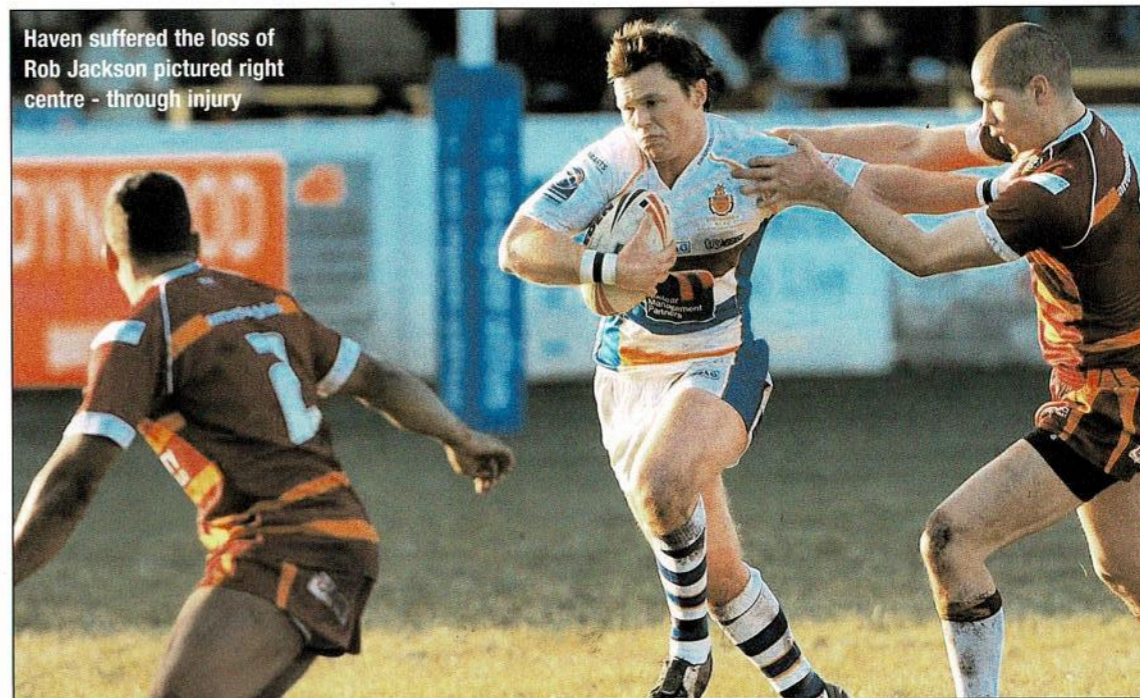
to do well, rather than just trying to avoid relegation.

"I don't think that works. It puts a lot of pressure on you. It accumulates, and not being able to get the players in that we needed in certain positions was a major factor.

"Every year that went past, our stocks of players diminished and we didn't have the quality to be able to make a charge for the play-offs, which the last couple of years we were able to do.

"This year we lost another group of talented players and we weren't able to replace like with like, so the writing was on the wall really."

Haven's last win was a 20-12 triumph at Dewsbury on April 11.

Injuries and players' unavailability have since forced Stokes to bring inexperienced youngsters into the team.

But as well as looking to the future, the Kiwi coach is also focusing on the positives from this year's campaign.

"The group of players we had really tried hard, our team spirit's always been good and they've fought hard for each other and the club," he said.

"We went close to beating some very good sides but we just didn't have that X factor we needed and that cost us.

"We've had a hard year in terms of injuries to key players at key points of the year and it has been a real struggle to get a team on the field at times.

"But if you look at the positive things at the club this year, the results our reserve-grade team have achieved have been right on our succession plan. They need just one more win to clinch the Reserves Championship and it's been very pleasing to put that in place."

Among those to progress from the reserve ranks are hooker Chris Smith and 18-year-old prop Danny Bower, while three-quarters Jay Rossi and Loz Hamzat were handed their debuts against Halifax last month.

So with two years still to run on his contract and a host of exciting prospects waiting in the wings, Stokes has no intention of stepping down.

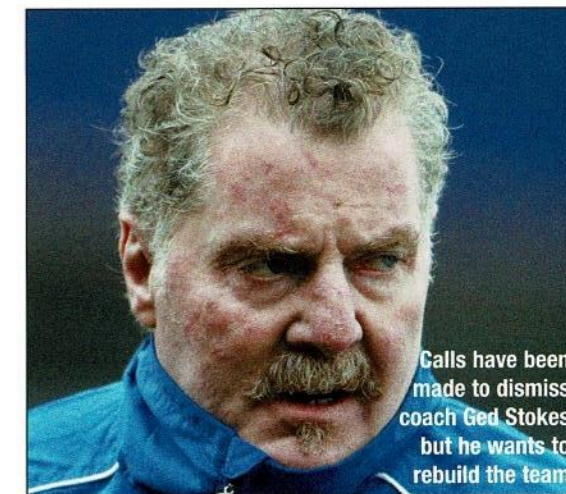
"They're very talented players, there's no doubt about that," he said.

"They'll need time to adapt, coming from a boys' competition into a men's competition, but having been forced to put them in this year, it does give them that good base of

experience for next year.

"Over the last few weeks we've introduced some young players and it's something that, as a coaching team, we had looked at.

"We have a succession plan in place and we've brought players in over the last couple of years that we feel will be long-term players for the club. They're all aged between 16 and 18 so it's a bit too early for them to come into the team this year. Although that wasn't the plan, at least now we know where we stand for next year and our preparations start now."

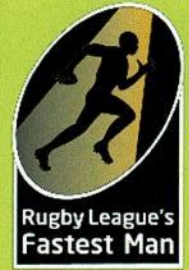

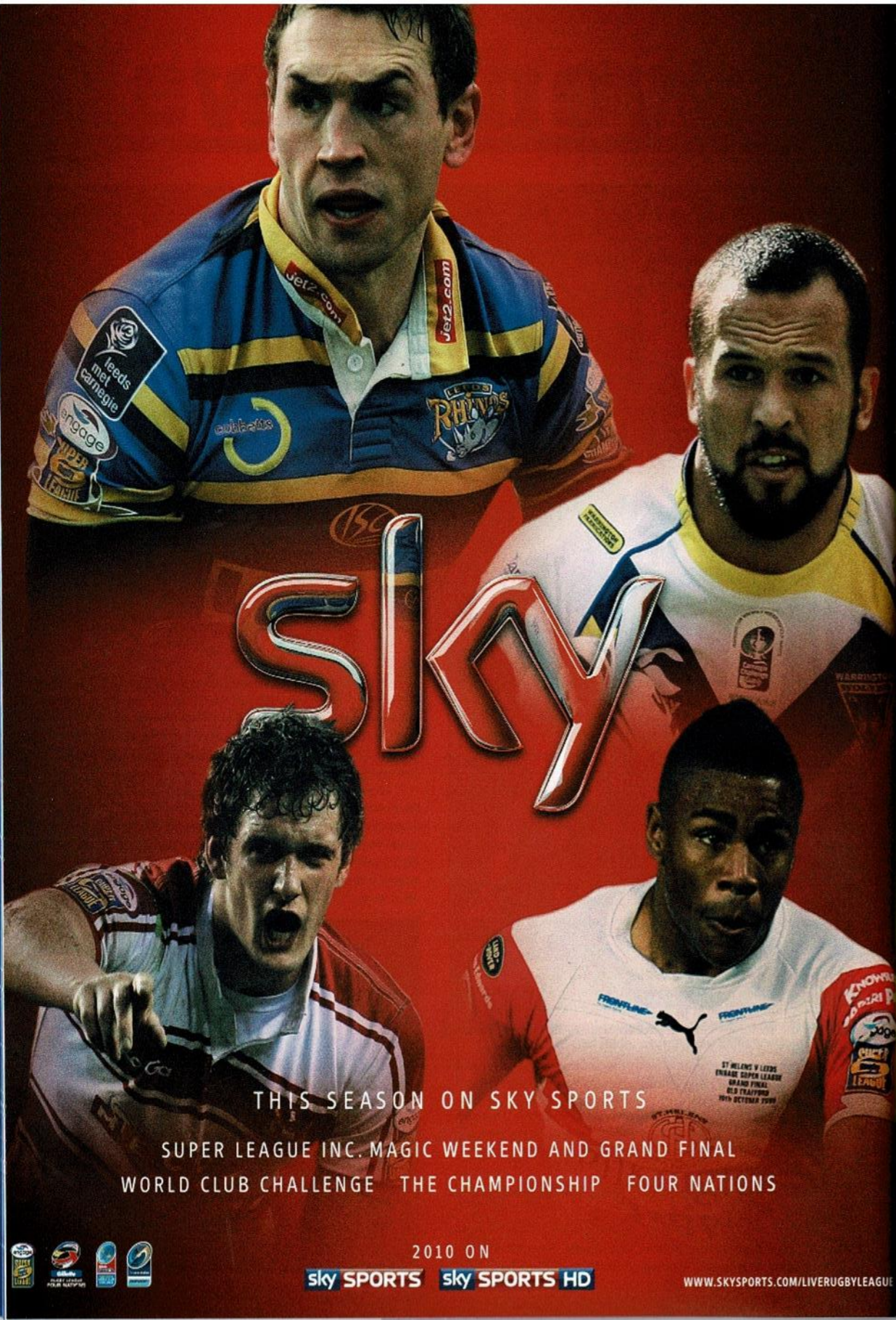

win with Penkywicz completing a hat-trick of tries.

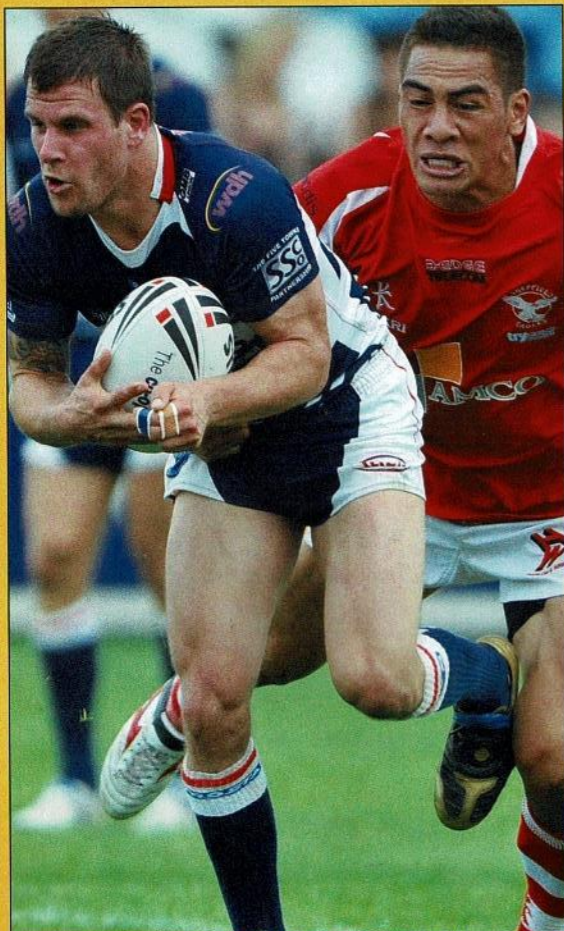
The result was another setback for the Vikings in their chase for a play-off place as they failed to gain the consolation of a bonus point.

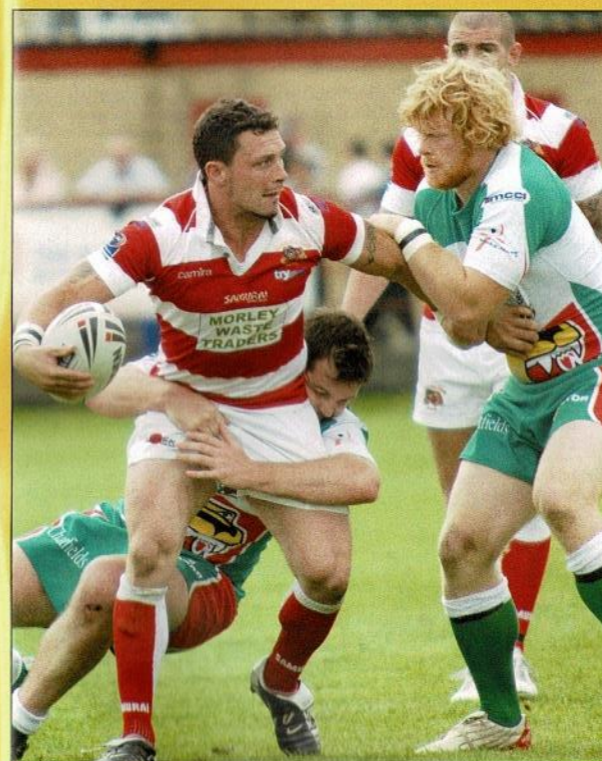
