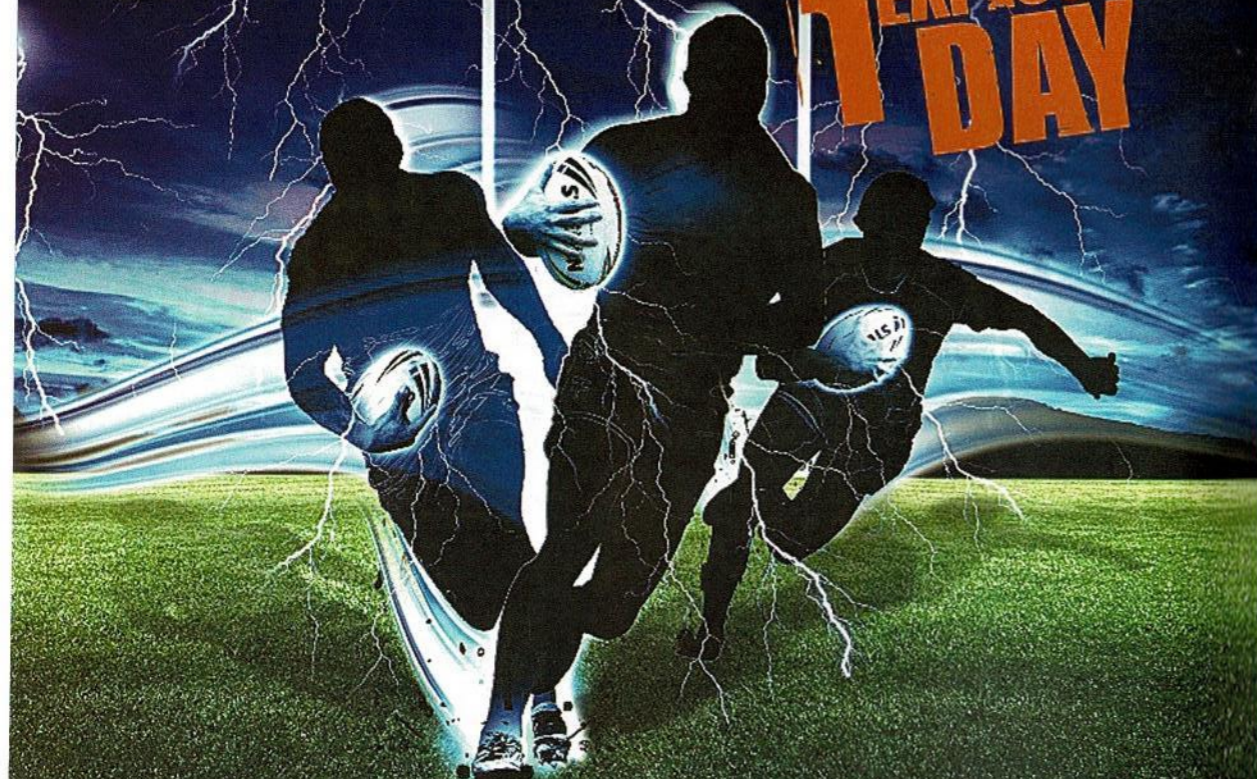

Of those you'd suspect Hunslet Hawks to be the happiest after a 30-24 win at Blackpool guaranteed them the League Leaders Shield. It'll be party time at the South Leeds Stadium on Sunday with the South Wales Scorpions hoping to provide a sting in the tail.

Runners-up Oldham continued to play their part with a decisive derby win over the Hornets in front of a healthy 1,000 plus crowd but they'll now be diverting their attention to the impending play-offs.

Those 12 teams making the play-offs are all but cut and dried. All that remains is the final positioning which will dictate the schedule as the race to reach the Co-operative Finals Day, in Warrington on Sunday September 26, really gets going.

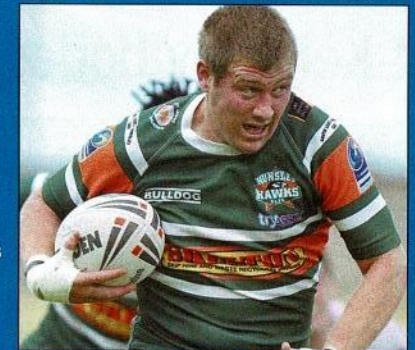
There's a mouth-watering tussle on Wednesday evening in Cumbria with Barrow hosting Widnes, a match-up that could well be repeated in the first round of the play-offs and intriguingly Leigh Centurions travel to Sheffield Eagles on the following night on Sky in another match that could be repeated in two weeks' time.

Barrow then travel to Featherstone on Sunday with Rovers set to receive their League Leaders Shield, capping off what has been a magnificent regular season for all concerned at the Big Fellas Stadium. They'll no doubt enter the play-offs as favourites to book a berth but five other clubs may well have something to say about that.

Last Sunday's round of games provided yet another thriller at Cougar Park with Keighley coming oh so close to moving off the bottom of the table. They fought back from a hefty half-time deficit to just lose out 29-28 to Whitehaven. Good luck to both these clubs in next season's Championship One.

Congratulations to London Skolars. The boys from the capital notched their second win of the campaign by seeing off Gateshead Thunder.

# Hope springs eternal for Eaton

They could not defy massive odds and stay up, but the spirit at Keighley bodes well for future

**K**EIGHLEY Cougars were unable to pull off mission impossible this year and avoid relegation straight back down to Co-operative Championship 1.

But coach Barry Eaton sees plenty of reasons to be cheerful for next season having given a good account of themselves in testing circumstances.

The newly-promoted Cougars claimed four wins and a draw to give themselves a fighting chance of overcoming their nine-point deduction for going into administration at the end of last season.

And although Keighley are now condemned to finish bottom heading into their final game of the season, Eaton believes his side will be stronger for the experience.

"We've had to face a lot of adversity," he said.

"With the points deduction, we knew it was always going to be a massive hurdle to overcome.

"For large parts of the season we had some genuine belief that we could maybe overturn the deficit and sneak out of it, though.

"The key game was probably our home game against Dewsbury in June. If we'd have won that, we'd have gone level with them.

"Unfortunately we got beat 20-16 and Dewsbury have gone from strength to strength since then and they've got themselves out of danger.

"But for most of the season we believed, which is admirable considering we would have been favourites for relegation regardless of any points deduction. To believe we could overturn a nine-point deficit is testament to the effort that we've put in."

Eaton was angered by his side's performance when they went down to a 76-12 defeat by Featherstone in April.

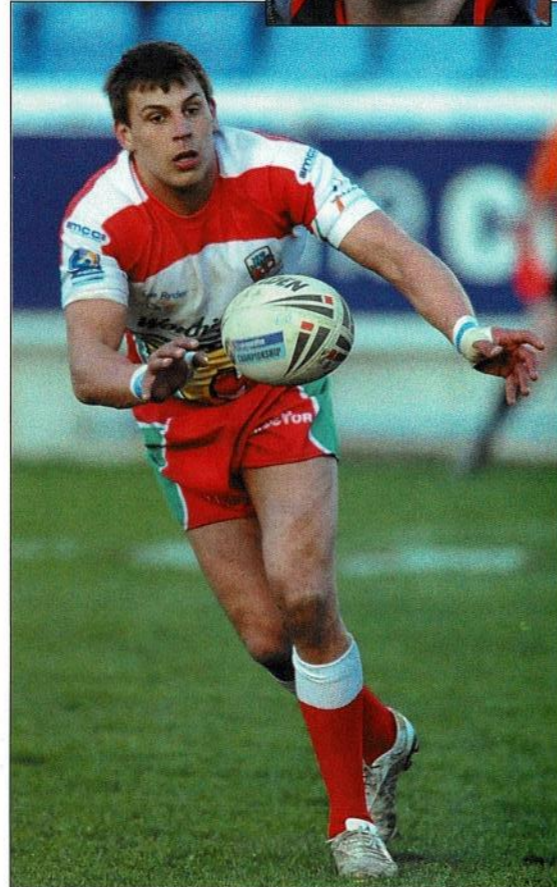
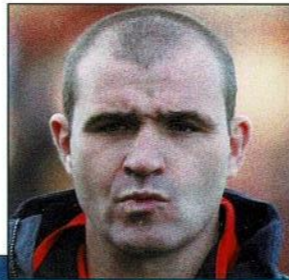
While they seemed doomed for the drop, Eaton demanded they went down fighting, and it turned out that the Fev drubbing was an exception.

For the main part, Keighley have contested against the odds - none more so than last week when they lost 29-28 to Whitehaven having trailed 28-4 at half-time - and Eaton reckons the spirit his side has shown has surprised a few people.

"There's only been three or four games where we've been disappointed with the effort and commitment," he said.

"When you consider the enormity of the task that was facing us, to only have those few games shows what a close-knit bunch we are.

"I'm pretty confident we made one or two people sit up and take notice of Keighley Cougars this year."



James 'Buster' Feather has re-signed for Barry Eaton, top, and the Cougars for 2011

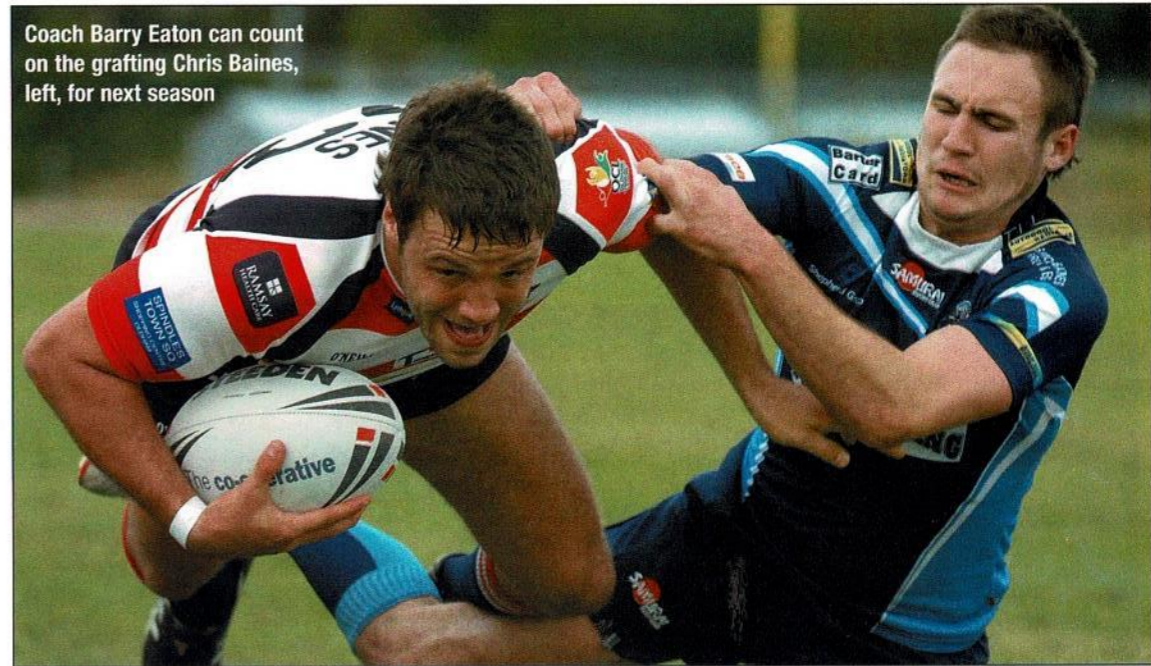
Keighley's season in the Championship has served as a steep learning curve for the club in terms of physical preparation.

And having competed against second-tier opposition for most of this year, Eaton has sent a warning to their promotion rivals for next term.

"A big factor for this season was the physicality and the conditioning of the players," he said.

"It is a big step up from Championship 1 to the Championship, playing against semi-full-time teams week in, week out. That means the players have had to put a lot

more emphasis on their own training regimes, conditioning programmes and their diets.

"Paul Royston's been fantastic in that respect. We brought Paul in as conditioner at the end of last season and he oversaw our pre-season for this year. And I can't remember any games where I thought our fitness or physical condition wasn't where it needed to be.

"We've improved that area and that's something we need to sustain and maintain as we go back to Championship 1. That'll certainly stand us in good stead and hopefully we'll be physically able to dominate more.

"We're a progressive club," Eaton added. "We went into administration last year, which was a financial matter. But on the field, the way we've developed as a team shows we're progressing.

"I'm pretty certain we're a better side now than at this stage last season. We're well on the way to retaining the squad for next year as well, so considering we're a better side now than last year then it all bodes well for potentially bouncing straight back next year."

The Cougars announced at the start of the week that Scott Law, Olly Pursglove, Greg Nicholson and Chris Baines had joined Andy Shickell, Ryan Benjafield, Jamaine Wray and James 'Buster' Feather in agreeing new deals for 2011.

And Eaton expects more to follow shortly after Sunday's final game of the season at home to Widnes.

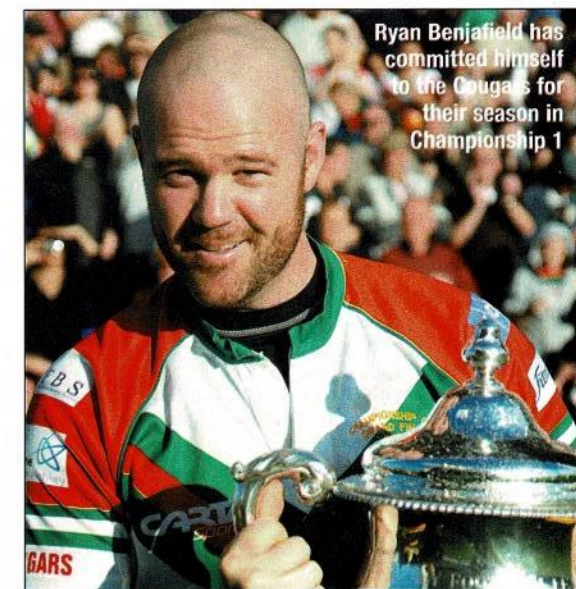
"We're working with a small squad of about 21 at this moment in time and we've now got a lot of them retained - there's just a few more to sort out," he said.

"That shows we're doing everything in our power as a club to make sure we retain everybody we want to retain and that once the season's over, we can start looking at the recruitment of players that are available from elsewhere."

Keighley just missed out on snatching victory against already-relegated Whitehaven but they are eager to upset Widnes and finish with a flourish.

"We want to set some standards to take into the off-season and into next season as well," Eaton added.

"We've talked about making sure our performance levels are where we would expect them to be and then we can take that forward and have some positives to work with, rather than having regrets that we finished the season flat."

# Just champion as Hawks get job done in good time

**It's onwards and upwards for Hunslet coach Paul March with promotion to the Championship achieved, as he told Game On's BEN COLLINS**

**I**T WILL be party time down at the South Leeds Stadium after Hunslet sealed the Co-operative Championship 1 title last week.

Victory away to Blackpool Panthers would ensure the Hawks had the title in the bag with a game to spare.

And they kept the Panthers at arm's length throughout to claim a 30-24 win and clinch top spot ahead of Oldham.

That also secured Hunslet's return to the second tier and the club's first championship since 1999.

The Hawks will be presented with the trophy as they host South Wales and player-coach Paul March was relieved to get the job done before the final day.

"We're glad to get it over and done with," he said.

"We didn't want to go into the final game and have a bit of nerves.

"All we needed to do was play 80 minutes like we've done all year and we certainly did that.

"Before the game everybody was relaxed. We were a bit twitchy late in the game but we got through it.

Everybody stood up and now we've done it, we're going up!"

Hunslet haven't had much to shout about in recent years, stemming from that title success in 1999.

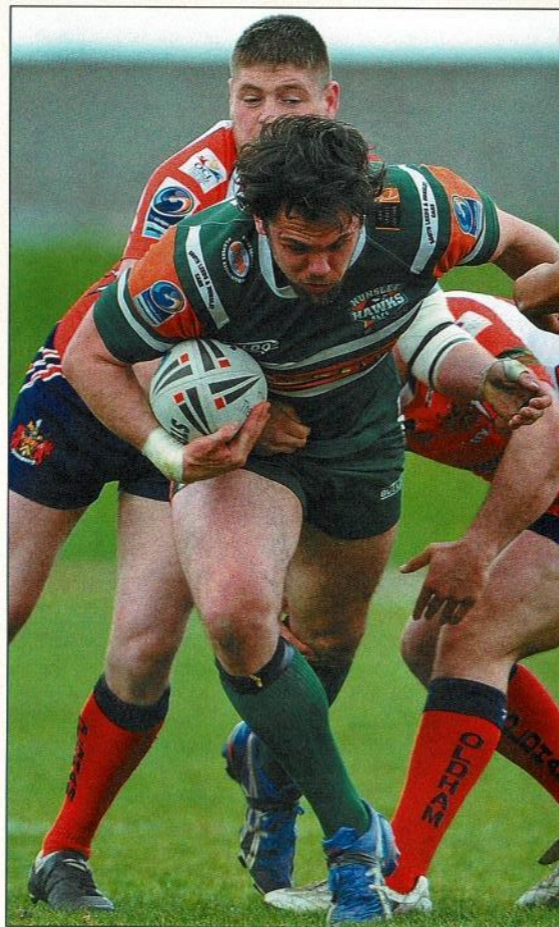
The Hawks beat Dewsbury in the Northern Ford Premiership Grand Final at Headingley only to be denied a place in Super League, and their crowds then fell from the 2,000 mark to around 800.

Experienced administrator Steve Ball became Hunslet chairman at the end of the 2007 season when they got into financial difficulty and he soon set about restructuring the club.

They finished bottom of the third tier in 2008 but improved to sixth last year, beating Blackpool to reach the second round of the play-offs.

Ball told Game On in May how he cut back on the player budget and the club's community strategy has attracted around £400,000 in extra revenue.

He also admitted that the Myrtle and Flame club, for the hardcore supporters, is basically the lifeline of the

club, so was delighted the fans could start celebrating in Blackpool last week.

"Hunslet have struggled over the past three years but we've straightened ourselves out financially, and this is a great achievement for everybody involved," he said.

"The club was denied Super League 11 years ago and lost a lot of supporters because of that. We've seen some hard times since then but this is a great day for those

supporters that have stuck with us.

"We regard ourselves as the best team in the division so we're absolutely delighted to be champions."

March reiterated those sentiments, saying: "We've had the bad times but the supporters have stuck by the club so this is as much for them as it is for the players.

"I'm sure they're going to enjoy the game this weekend. Hopefully we can get a big crowd down there to celebrate us lifting the trophy."

With the club's finances back on an even keel, March revamped his squad ahead of this season and they have fulfilled their potential.

Not only have the Hawks won the league but they also upset Halifax to reach the Northern Rail Cup quarter-finals.

"I thought the squad we put together at the beginning of the year was quality and could have played in the Championship," said the player-coach.

"In big games, big-time players stand up. David March, Tommy Haughey, and both front-rowers, Adam Sullivan and James Houston, have all put massive efforts in and led us forward all year.

"I can't speak highly enough of Waine Pryce. He's come to the club at the start of the season and scored something like 23 tries in 18 games, which is an unbelievable record. He's like an extra forward when he's carrying the ball.

"I've got to mention John Oakes as well. He and the

others playing in the back three - Stuart Kain, Michael Mark and Waine Pryce have all been outstanding this year.

"We've all come to Hunslet and done the job - now we're playing in the next tier and we're going to challenge ourselves and everybody's up for this challenge."

March took charge midway through the 2009 season following the resignation of Graeme Hallas and can now focus on keeping his squad together for a tilt at the Championship next season.

"The majority of the squad are happy where they are but we need to talk contracts with them," he said.

"At least we've had an extra week now instead of waiting till after the last game of the season, so we can hopefully get some signings on the board.

"I had a personal goal of getting the club promoted within three years and I've done that so now I'm going to reassess my goals and see where we can go from here."

Ball, though, will be sticking to his vow of stepping down at the end of the season after steering Hunslet back in the right direction.

"I'm going to take a step back," he confirmed. "I enjoy rugby league, it's part of my life - it's a way of life for me.

"But this week I'll just enjoy being Hunslet chairman and take whatever comes my way."

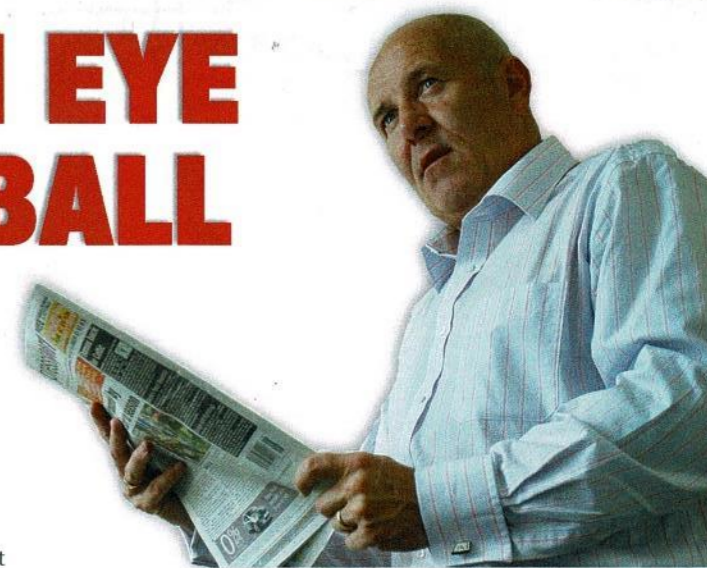

# KEEP AN EYE ON THE BALL

**F**AR be it from me to insult the good men of Oldham (let alone the equally noble burghers of north London) by suggesting that beating the Skolars by 300 points might be beyond Tony Benson's team, when they meet in the annual Friday Night Lights fixture on the eve of the Carnegie Challenge Cup Final.

I've just done a bit of fag packet-mathematics and if Hunslet lose to the Scorpions and fail to get a bonus point this weekend, then Oldham would need to run in 49 tries and convert them all to nick the champions' mantle.

Given that the average goal attempt takes about one minute, then the Roughyeds would have to score a try every 30 seconds or so – and that's if the Skolars players sprinted up to the halfway line to restart. Now I accept that they would have plenty of energy left to spare if they were just standing and applauding the opposition downfield as they ran in the points, but I can't fathom where their motivation would come from.

The race for Co-operative Championship 1 glory appears then to have been well and truly run, and congratulations are due to Paul March and all at the South Leeds Stadium.

The play-offs now loom while the Hawks put their feet up and plan for 2011, but a dozen clubs still have eyes to a greater or lesser extent on a place in the Co-operative Championships Finals day. Drama aplenty awaits, but after a season that hasn't lacked in action (on and off the field) I would like to take this opportunity to pay tribute to two clubs who have, to use a coaching expression, "done it tough" in 2010.

Gateshead's various travails have been well documented as they have fought to keep their heads above water. That they have survived the campaign bears testimony to the resilience of Chris Hood and his stalwarts up in the

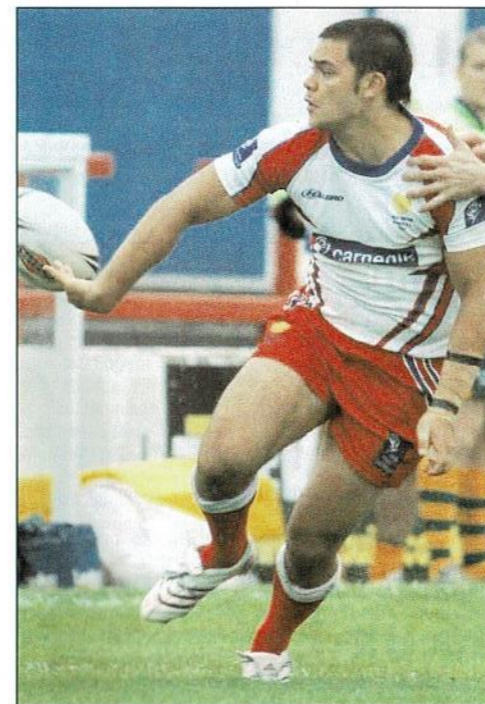
north-east. One place above them in the league table sit the London Skolars, who have made measurable progress this season, not just in the 'w' column, but in the manner of their contributions to good, competitive matches and the improved performances which culminated in a high-scoring win over the Thunder in the penultimate regular season round of matches.

But here's the main point for my money: all 34 players involved in that game were British. Ironically Thunder fielded a couple of Londoners, and the Skolars two from the north-east, with the rest mostly locally born and bred.

The Manchester Citys and Chelseas of the football world, the Warringtons and Wigans of ours, might be able to indulge in chequebook management, and their rewards (and failures!) have to be seen in the context of those resources.

But achievement in sport should to my mind be measured and valued in different ways. That's why most of the country cheered when Blackpool FC got their Premiership footy season off to such a good start. And that's why the efforts of Skolars and Gateshead in spreading the grassroots gospel is every bit as important to the long-term good of Rugby League and should be celebrated as much as any of the silverware won by our clubs. Well done to them, and here's to better times (on the field) for 2011.

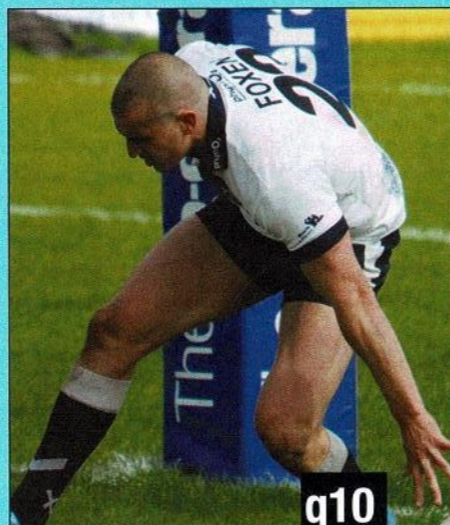

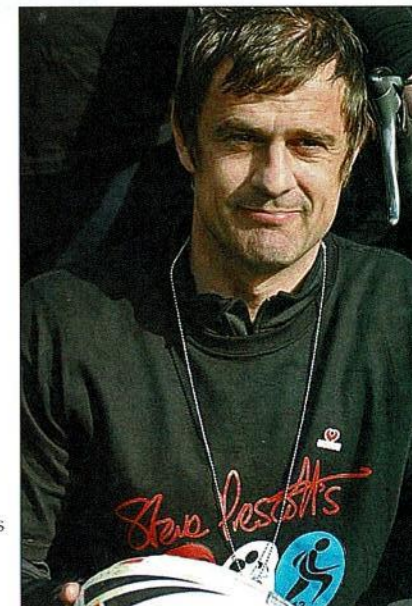

## Cup honour for League legend Steve



THE RFL is delighted to announce that Rugby League legend Steve Prescott will be Guest of Honour at the 2010 Carnegie Challenge Cup Final at Wembley.

The former England full-back will greet the players and officials from Leeds Rhinos and Warrington Wolves before the game and present the Carnegie Challenge Cup to the winning captain.

Prescott, a Challenge Cup winner with St Helens in 1996 and 1997, was diagnosed with Pseudomyxoma Peritonei, a rare form of terminal cancer in 2006, and has become an admired figure within Rugby League for the great work he has done for charity in recent years.

"I can't think of anyone more deserving to be Guest of Honour than Steve Prescott," said RFL Chairman Richard Lewis.

"Few people could have coped with an illness as serious as Steve's with the dignity, fortitude and stoicism he has. Steve has set an example to us all, not just for his unselfish and amazing charitable work but for the courage he continues to show in the face of considerable adversity.

"Steve commands the respect of everyone in the game and we are delighted that he has agreed to be Guest of Honour."

Prescott feels that walking out on to the pitch at Wembley and lifting the Carnegie Challenge Cup at Wembley on Saturday August 28 will be one of the proudest days of his life.

"It's an incredible honour for me to be given this amazing opportunity and I still can't believe I've been asked to do it,"

said the former full-back who enjoyed spells at Hull, Wakefield and St Helens during his career.

"I was lucky enough to win two Challenge Cup winners medals while I was at St Helens and Wembley Stadium holds many fond memories for me, especially from 1996 when I managed to score two tries.

"I can't wait to go back and get my hands on one of the most famous trophies in world sport once again, even if it is just for a few seconds before I present it to the winning captain."

Prescott became a firm fan favourite during his playing days at both St Helens and Hull as he gained recognition on the terraces as a player who gave his all during matches, tackling and running above his weight and scoring many memorable length-of-the-field tries, including a double in the 1996 Challenge Cup final.

"The Challenge Cup is one of the most prestigious rugby tournaments in the world," he said. "The final is always one of the biggest events of the season and the games are always very memorable and some of the greatest rugby I have ever seen has been during the Challenge Cup final."

## Jamaica get into World Cup mode

JAMAICA'S national side are continuing their preparations for World Cup qualification with a game against the Great Britain Community Lions as a curtain-raiser to Hunslet's final match against South Wales Scorpions.

The game is part of a two week tour which will also see Jamaica take part in the Carnegie Floodlit 9s where the side will compete against fellow international sides Wales and Scotland, plus ten Engage Super League clubs and Northern Rail 9s winners Halifax.

The Jamaican squad will comprise ten domestic based players and seven from the UK and JRLA Development Officer Romeo Monteith believes the experience will have a positive impact on his country's domestic game.

"Our domestic players can only improve when they come up against some of the best players in the world."

"This tour is intended to improve the experience of local players and open their eyes to how the world's toughest team sport is played in a fully professionalised setting. In addition, it will help the domestic based players bond with the UK teammates, a process which is vital as we build towards our game against the USA in November."

For the Community Lions it gives the side another chance to

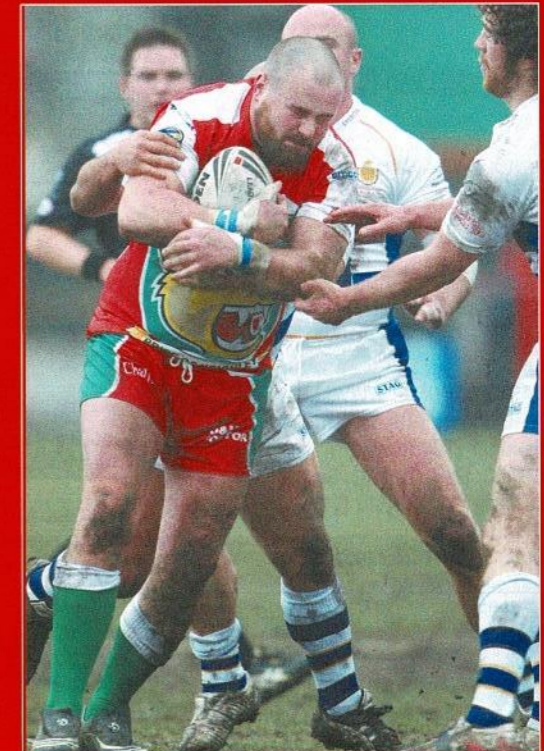

We will not survive if we do not all pull together.

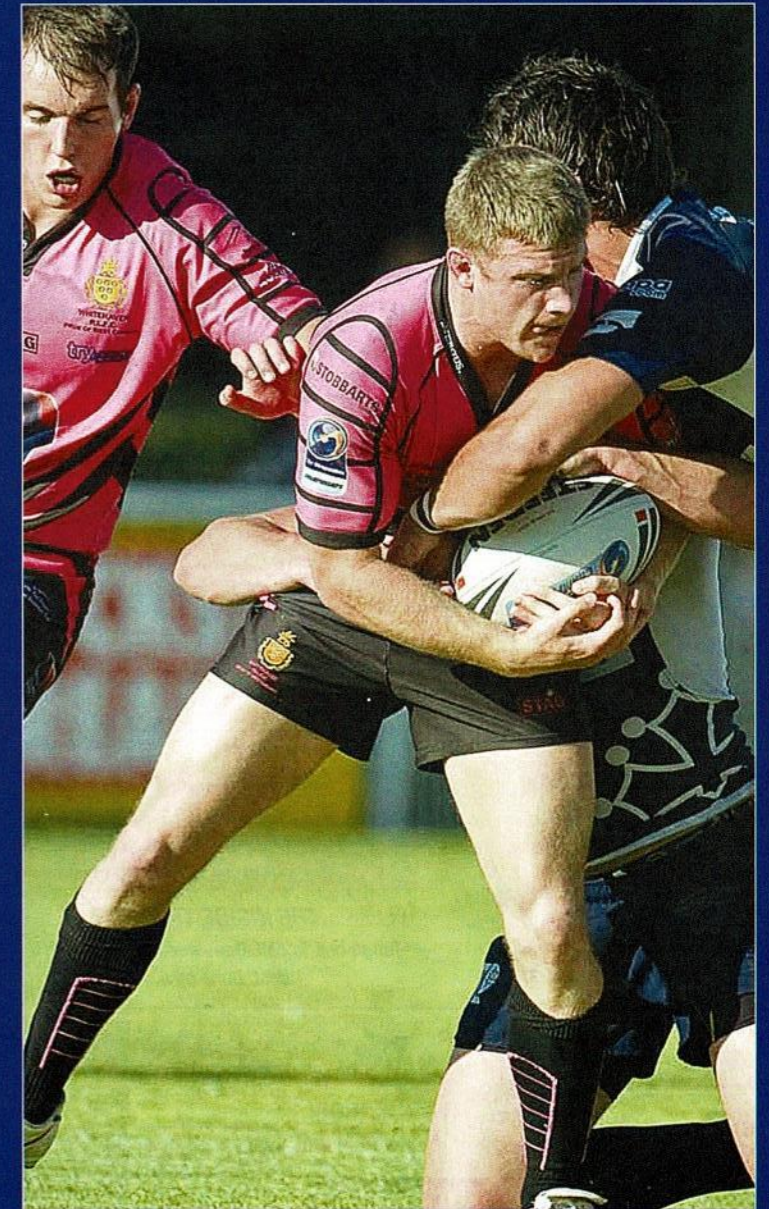
I cannot end this season without expressing my sincere gratitude to all those fans who have supported the club, both home and away, and to our sponsors – we hope you will keep faith and return next season.

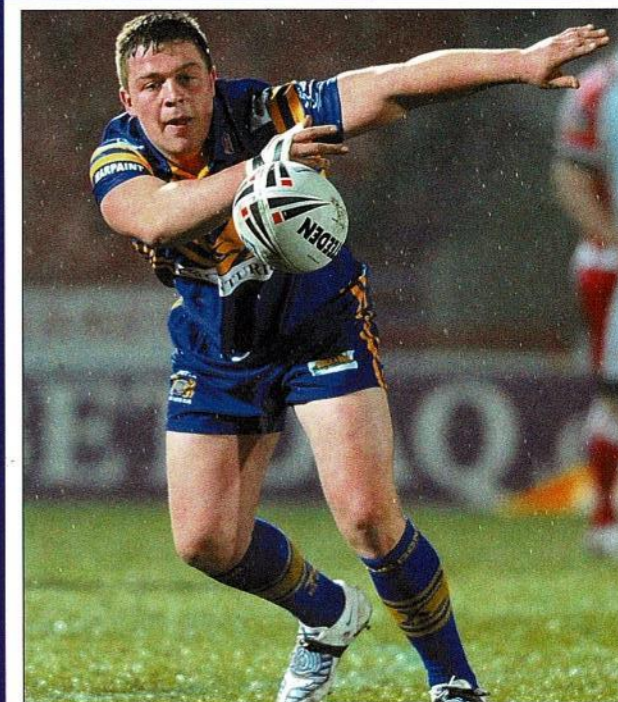
Off the field we have done really well.

The club's improvement on the field is down to the hard work and dedication of the playing, coaching and support staff, led of course by Head Coach John Stankevitch.

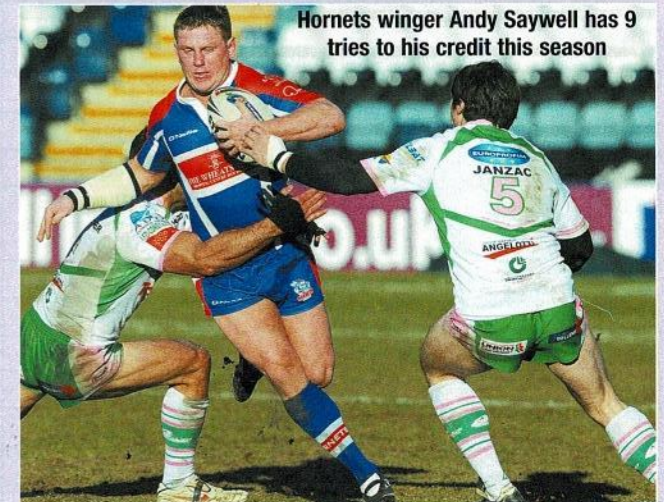

**A** WARM welcome to Phil Davies and his fellow directors, officials and players, and to all South Wales fans who have made the long trip.

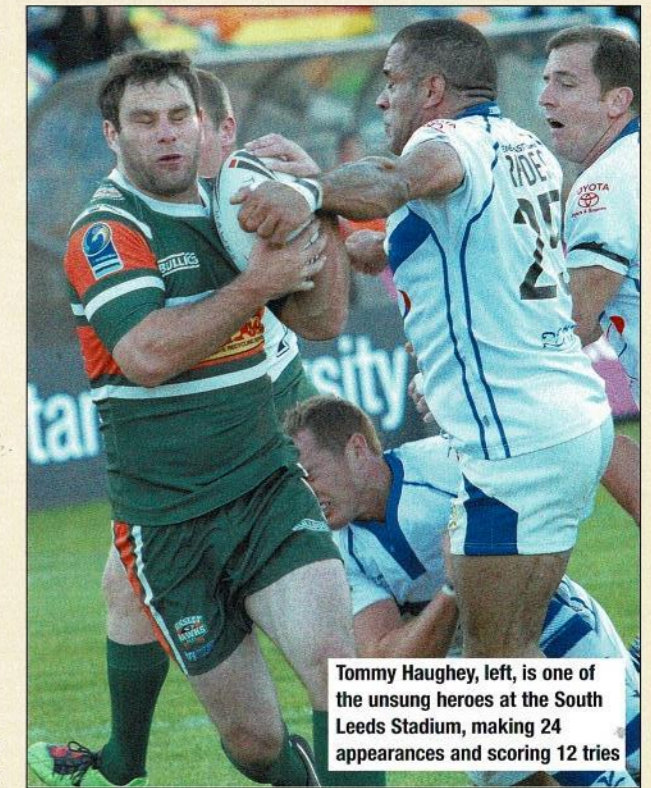

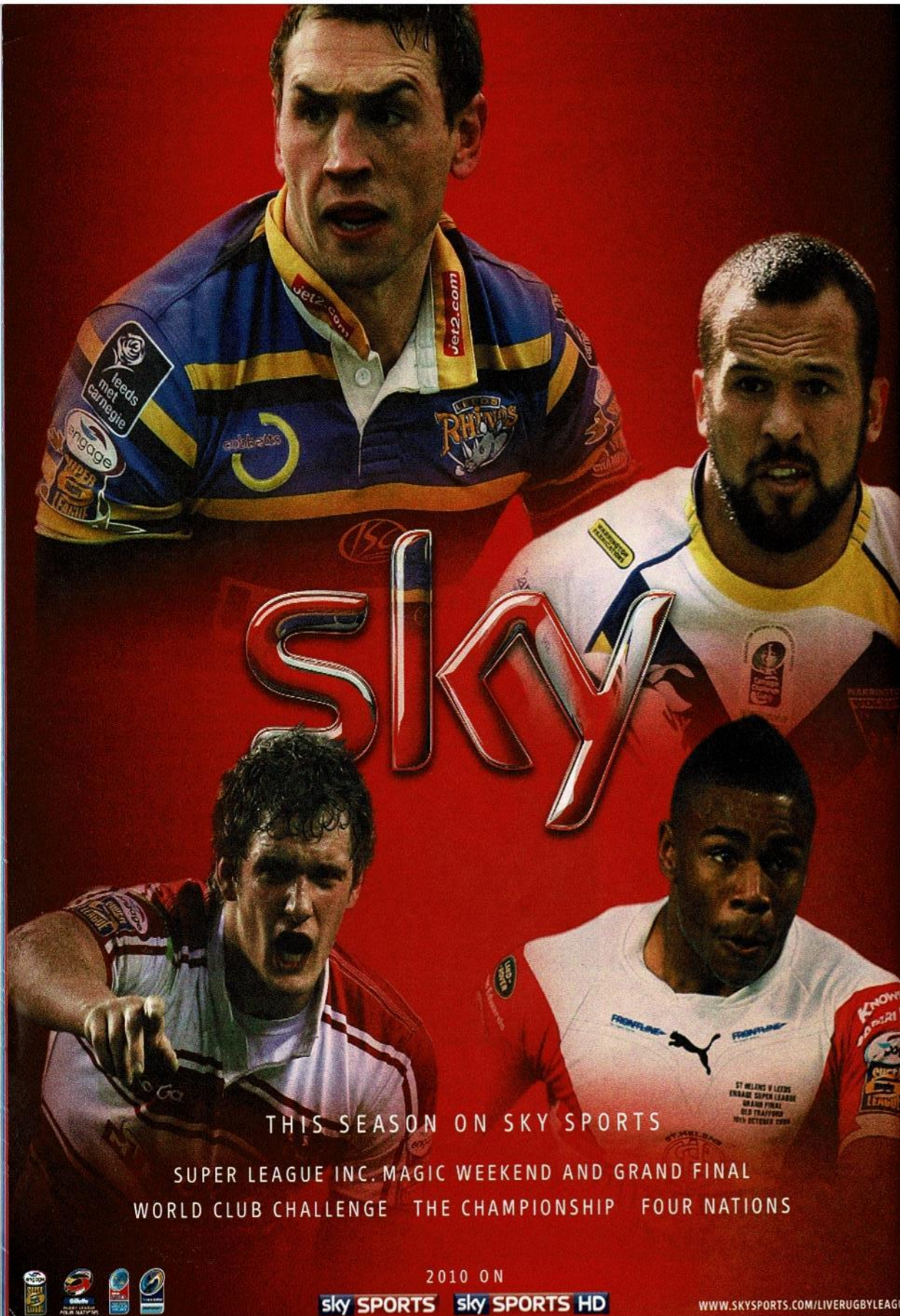
Today is my last day with the Skolars.

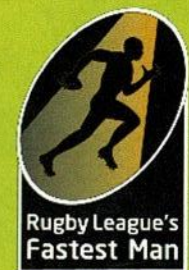

THE key issues of the season have been decided for some clubs but for others 'there is all to play for' as the Co-operative Championship heads into its final round.

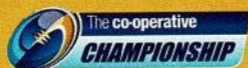
Halifax made certain of taking second place for the second season running.

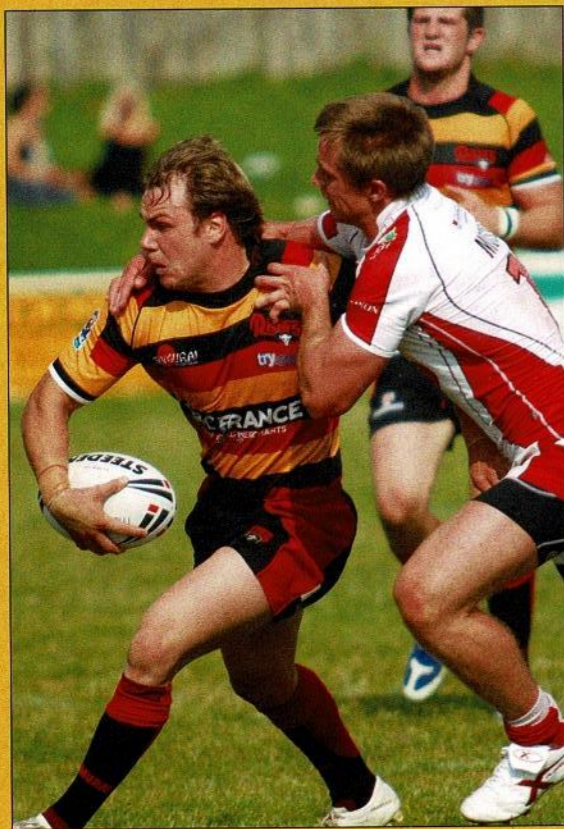
Widnes have the best points difference of the mid-table teams and have two games to play – a trip to Barrow on Wednesday and at Keighley on Sunday.
