

who will start to stake a claim for a spot in the side for the first league game of the season exactly one month later on March 10.





Co-operative Championship One to sign Paul on a one-year contract in mid-January.

One of the most experienced forwards in Championship rugby, 29-year-old Noone's CV includes 119 Super League outings with Warrington, 47 appearances with Widnes and 59 games with Barrow where he played in 2009 and 2010.

He also had seven Super League games for Harlequins while on short-term loan to the London club from Warrington in 2006.

In 2007 he played in two finals for Widnes-a 54-6 win against White-haven in the National League Cup final in July and a 42-10 defeat by Castleford Tigers in the National League One Grand Final in the October. Two years later he lined up alongside Andy Ballard, James Coyle, Rob Roberts, Dave Allen and Danny Halliwell in the Barrow side that beat Halifax 26-18 in the Championship Grand Final at the Halliwell Jones Stadium, Warrington.

Commenting on Paul's capture by Roughyeds, coach Tony Benson said: "It was one of the last pieces of the jigsaw in our team building for 2011, but it was certainly well worth the wait.

"We wanted somebody to add more experience into our young squad and Paul was the ideal fit. He's seen it all

at the top level of club rugby. He is aggressive in defence and he runs good lines in attack.

"He's also a good bloke to have around and that is always an important factor to us as a club when we are doing our recruiting.

"He will add a lot to our squad and give us a strong back-row with a lot of competition for places."

Paul played in 28 of Barrow's 31 games last year and thought at one stage that he would be staying at Craven Park for a third season.

"I had two good years there," he added, "but that's in the past and I'm looking forward to a new start at Oldham. I'm still only 29 with plenty left in the tank and my aim is to help Oldham to go one better this year and finally get promotion.

"After that there is no telling how far the club can go. I just want to do the best I can to help Roughyeds to go as far as they can. The club has a great tradition and the town is steeped in rugby league. As a lad growing up I used to support Widnes regularly and some of the games they had with Oldham were crackers. Oldham were always there or thereabouts.

"I spoke to a few clubs but Chris Hamilton (club chairman) and Tony Benson convinced me that Oldham was the right club for me. To get to four Grand Finals in a row is no mean feat.

"By signing for Oldham I've joined a good squad and a good club. There is a lot of potential on and off the field and I like the idea of striving with all the other lads to put the club back where it belongs in the Championship."





Our pre-season's silver lining

OLDHAM Roughyeds will set out on their 2011 Northern Rail Cup campaign with confidence high after winning two preseason trophies -- the Law Cup and the SEAT Trophy.

The serious stuff kicks off today with the visit of newlypromoted Hunslet Hawks to Whitebank Stadium (3pm kick off) in the round-robin section of the NRC.

We then play Halifax away next Sunday (Feb 13, 3pm), Swinton Lions away on Sunday, Feb 20 (3pm) and Whitehaven here at the Whitebank Stadium on Sunday. Feb 27. So make a note in your diary of that next home game--Whitehaven here on February 27.

Coach Tony Benson was delighted with what was achieved in the three pre-season warm-up games -- a 34-28 win against Rochdale to win the Law Cup, a 36-10 defeat at Featherstone Rovers and a 50-0 hammering of Whitehaven at Whitebank to win the SEAT Trophy.

In this game Roughyeds rattled up nine tries, and eight of them were scored by the backs after hooker Martin Roden had set the ball rolling by squeezing in from dummy half to score the first try in the seventh minute.

Tony'big problem was to pick a squad of 17 to face Hunslet today from the 24 or 25 who have been training hard for the past two and a half months and who have all staked a claim in the warm-up games.

Twenty players were used against Whitehaven but Jason Boults, Scott Mansfield, Ben Wood (hat-trick hero in the Law Cup win), Marcus St Hilaire, John Clough and Mark Brocklehurst were left kicking their heels.

The rampant Roughyeds got their hands on their second piece of pre-season silverware by winning the SEAT Trophy for the first time at the third time of asking.

The Cumbrians had won it twice previously, both times at the Recreation Ground (in 2003 and 2010), but in this instance Oldham turned on the style to run in nine tries without reply.

Mr David Cook of David Cook Motors, sponsors of the SEAT Trophy, said later at the post-match presentations in the hospitality suite: "It's good from a personal point of view that the Trophy is 'coming home'.

"For a whole variety of reasons the trophy has only been contested twice previously over a number of years, but on each of those occasions we travelled back from Whitehaven, leaving the trophy in Cumbria.

"It's good to see the trophy back on Oldham soil."

Skipper Neil Roden won the club's official man-of-thematch award, but he promptly handed his prize to his half-back partner Mick Diveney. "Mick was the best player on the field, particularly in the first half," said Neil.

"In fact, there were one or two more deserving winners than me in a good team performance. The object of

these games is to improve match on match and we certainly improved on our performance in defeat at Feath-

Teenager Matthew Fogarty won the champagne- moment award for his first try in Oldham colours, but he wasn't present in the clubhouse later so fellow centre Jack Bradbury, who also scored his first try for the Roughveds, went on stage to collect it on his behalf.

Said a beaming Benson: "To be honest I expected a good performance. We have a good squad and we have worked well. These games are all about working on areas of your game that need to be improved.

"Particularly pleasing was the fact that we put into practice what we have been doing in training. It is one thing to do it on the training paddock; it is different altogether to do it when opposed in a match.

"The score didn't matter too much. The important thing was the performance. It was good. The biggest problem I have now is picking a squad of 17 or 18 from all the good players at my disposal. I left six out today, yet we still played 20 and everybody did well.

"The young players have forced the issue over the last couple of months of pre-season training and have forced themselves into contention."

It was the first time for several years that Roughyeds "nilled" a side --- and one of the most pleasing aspects of the performance was the enthusiasm in defence even when the side was 30 or 40 points in front.


