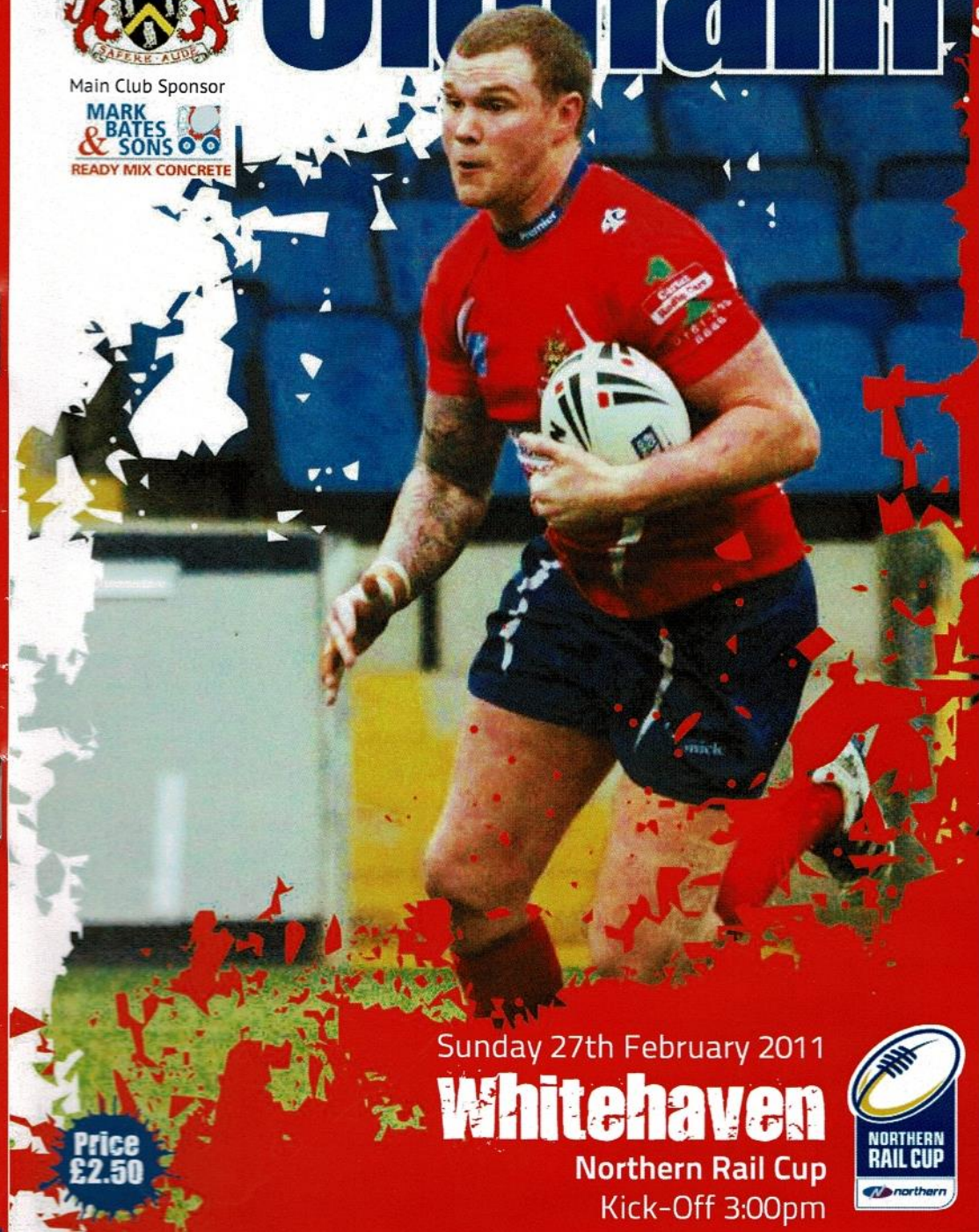

FROM THE
Boardroom
with Chris Hamilton



Today we welcome back Whitehaven in the last of our Northern Rail Cup group matches.

I am sure that everybody connected with the Cumbrian club will be doing their utmost to make sure the performance and result are different than when we won the SEAT trophy in January.

For our part we need to make sure that we put right the deficiencies that have come into our game over the last couple of matches as we do not want to get into bad habits.

We still have a chance of qualifying if we win today depending on other results and regardless of that we do not want to get into the habit of losing matches so I am sure you can expect an improved performance this afternoon.

This week will see clubs attend a very important meeting up in the Lake District where some crucial decisions are expected to be made

regarding the future of the game outside Super League. As ever we as a club will be trying to do what is best for the game as a whole and will be striving to make sure the club's point of view is put across before any decisions are made.

I know from speaking to a number of people at other clubs that there are several concerns, not least of which would be the widening of the gap between Championship and Championship One clubs. Whilst that gap already exists a different ratio of central distributions (all clubs currently receive equal monies) to one where Championship One clubs only get 50% of what Championship clubs get, can only make it much harder for clubs to plug that gap.

In addition it will also have a knock on effect to the resources that those clubs can put into all of their on and off field activities.

We are generally supportive of the need/desire to be improving standards etc but there also needs to be some kind of understanding of clubs like ours where people have made significant financial contributions to the club over the years to ensure professional rugby league has been able to continue rather than just dismissing history.

With regards to the ground scenario within the new proposals once again there has been nothing taken into consideration about the assurances we made to the RFL - to satisfy both their and our needs - about improvements to the current facilities at Whitebank Stadium and whilst I have made this point to them we are hopeful that the criteria will not adversely affect our club.

As ever with any changes there will always be opposition but with everybody operating within economic times like we have never faced before it is vital that we make sure that these proposals are the right ones and equally important that they are implemented at the right time.

Enjoy the game and get behind the team today as we seek our second win in the competition.

- All matches are played in accordance with the rules and regulations of the relevant sporting governing body.

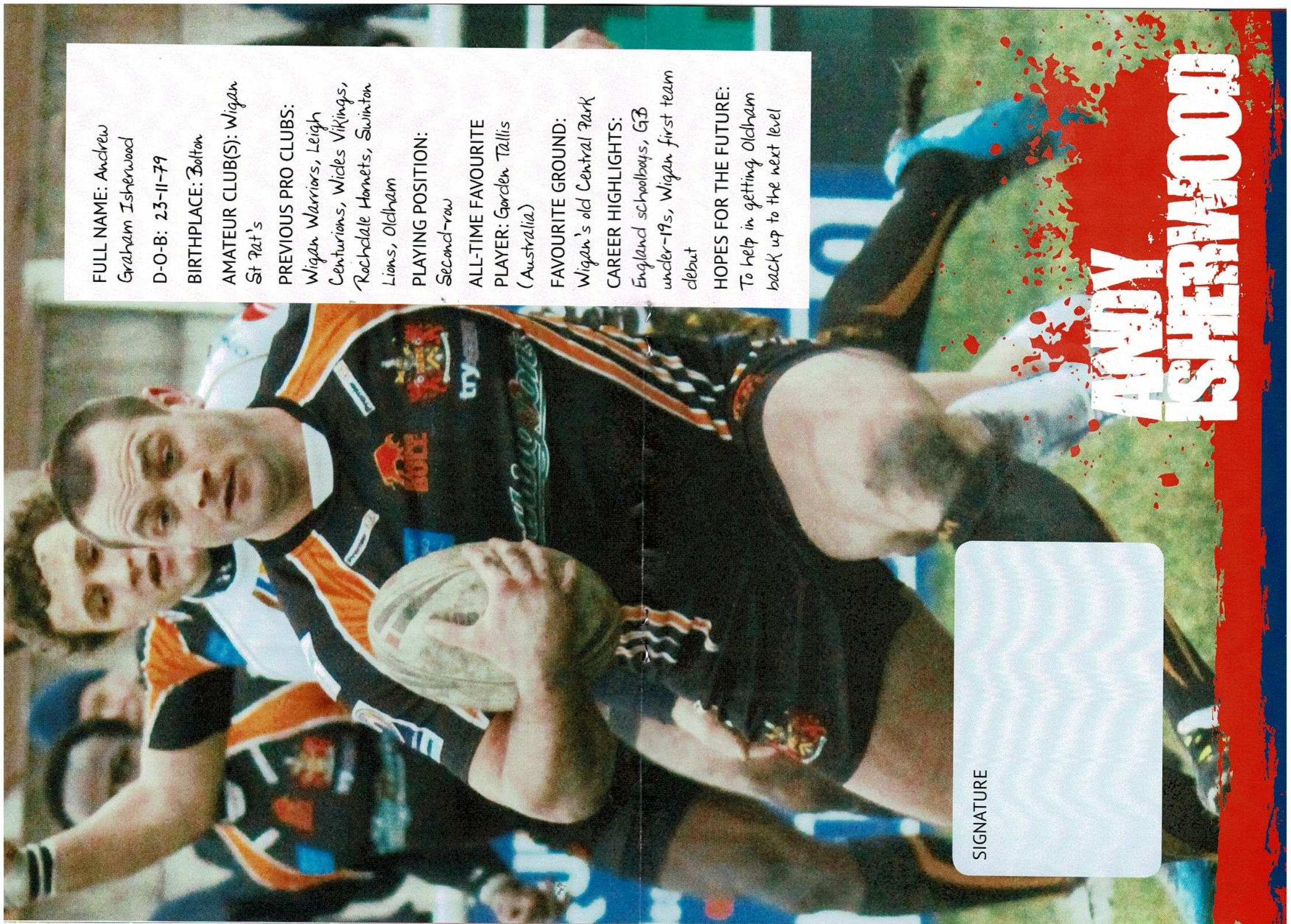
SEASON TICKET HOLDERS

The former Wigan Warriors, Leigh Centurions (twice), Widnes Vikings, Rochdale Hornets and Swinton Lions forward had a brief stay with the Roughyeds at the start of the 2005 season.

Now, a little more than six years since he last put pen to paper on a Roughyeds contract, the 31-year-old second-row forward has returned to the club on a one-year deal.

"He will give us power, strength, experience and mental toughness," said Roughyeds' chairman Chris Hamilton, who clinched the deal at the player's home near Leigh, Andy thus becoming one of the earliest of the club's signings for 2011 and the first of our new boys for the season that is now underway.

Isherwood, who was at Swinton Lions last year, rejected approaches from another of his former clubs, Hornets, in order to turn back the clock at Oldham.

It was on December 7, 2004 that Andy rejected a Super League offer from Leigh in order to stay part-time with the Roughyeds who had just signed Kiwi half-back Marty Turner from New Zealand and were soon to sign a trio of Cook Islanders in Carlos Mataora, Tere Glassie and Dana Wilson.

With Gary Mercer as coach, Andy played only three pre-season games for Roughyeds in 2005 -- against Hornets in the Law Cup and friendlies against Halifax and Leeds --- before leaving the sport for a couple of years

and then surfacing again at Rochdale.

It is interesting to recall that the team that went down 24-8 to the Hornets that day lined up like this: Goddard; Dodd, Munro, Wilkinson, Johnson; Svabic, Barber; Norman, J Hough, Sharples, Haughton, Isherwood, Kilshaw. Subs: Turner, Cowell, Barraclough, D Nany, Kirkland, Farrimond, Roberts.

Andy played at prop in the next match against Leeds with Mark Roberts taking his spot in the second-row and Marty Turner coming in at scrum-half.

Little did we know then that the next match, against Halifax, would be his last in an Oldham jersey for six years. "I didn't do myself justice the last time I was at Oldham," said Isherwood, "and I am keen to make up for it this time. I want to finish what I started.

"I had offers from Rochdale and Oldham, but I chose Roughyeds because I have a few close friends here and I would love to do my bit in steering the club to automatic promotion in 2011.

"We don't want to leave anything to chance this time. I'm excited by the challenge and by the prospect of playing at Whitebank in front of decent crowds creating a good atmosphere.

"Everything about the club is on the up and I want very much to be part of it."

"Things didn't work out for him the last time he was here," said Chris H, "but that was due to circumstances that were beyond the control of both himself and the club.

"He has a good knowledge of the club and what makes us tick and, most important of all, he was keen to come and we were delighted to get him."

Isherwood has already forged a strong and experienced second-row partnership with Paul Noone -- one that will serve the club well in the long season ahead.

TAXI for Roughyeds!

That's the call from Cartax Radio Cars of Lees, who have become Oldham Rugby League Club shirt sponsors for the first time since Farooq Usaf and Itaf Hussain became directors of the company three years ago.

We won that one too.

"I like my football," he added, "but I thought the sheer effort the rugby players put in, as part-timers, was truly phenomenal. And to see them mingling with the fans in the club after the game provided a great

atmosphere."

Cartax have agreed a one-year shirt sponsorship deal, but they hope it will be merely the start of a long-term partnership with the club.

The Roughyeds players paraded the two trophies they picked up in their pre-season campaign - the Law Cup and the SEAT Trophy - when they did a two-hour meet-the-fans signing session in the Spindles Town Square Shopping Centre on the Saturday before the Hunslet game.

They met shoppers between 10.30am and 12.30pm on the Upper Mall between Peacocks and Next.

The visit was part of a renewed agreement in which Spindles are sponsoring the Roughyeds for the fourth year in a row.

Said Mike Flanagan, the Shopping Centre manager: "At Spindles we are looking forward to another exciting season of Roughyeds rugby. Roughyeds and Spindles Town Square are all about community and it's good that we will enjoy a continuing partnership."



CHALLENGE CUP DRAW MEANS IT'S THREE IN A ROW AT WHITEBANK



ROUGHYEDS go head to head with amateur form team **Hunslet Warriors** at Whitebank in the third round of the Carnegie Challenge Cup next Sunday, March 6 (3pm).

"It's an interesting draw for us inasmuch as we are at home against a team we have never met previously," said Roughyeds chairman Chris Hamilton.

The home draw gives us three games in a row at Whitebank in three separate competitions --- against Whitehaven in the Northern Rail Cup today, followed by Hunslet Warriors in the Challenge Cup on March 6 and Gateshead Thunder in the first Co-operative Championship One game on March 13.

Warriors, whose stand-off is former Oldham, Rochdale and Hunslet Hawks player Darren Robinson, were unbeaten this season in cup and league when the draw was made a couple of weeks ago by top referee Richard Silverwood, who handled last year's final, and the legendary Billy Thompson, who refereed the first of his two Wembley finals 40 years ago.

The Carnegie Challenge Cup did indeed scale new heights that day because the draw took place 900 feet up at the top of the Emley Moor television mast, the tallest free-standing building in Britain.

We were paired with a Hunslet Warriors side that is enjoying a fantastic season of cup and league rugby.

At the time of writing they topped National Conference division two with 12 wins and a draw from 13 outings and they were through to the third round of

both the BARLA National Cup and the Carnegie Challenge Cup.

In the National Cup they beat Kells of Cumbria 34-0 at home and then triumphed 12-4 at Oulton Raiders, who are unbeaten leaders of NCL division one.

To earn their right to test themselves against the Roughyeds, they beat Drighlington away 13-12 after extra time before accounting for NCL premier division side Wigan St Jude's 22-16 at home.

Darren Robinson, a young Roughyeds hooker in the early days of the new club, is still kicking goals and scoring tries at the age of 31, having touched down four times in the last five games.

Added Chris: "It will be a tough test for us, as we know from all the other cup tussles we have had with amateur teams down the years."

Roughyeds have won each of their 14 Challenge Cup ties against amateur opposition since the new club was formed in 1997, beating Charlston Rovers of Featherstone three times (twice at home and once away) and East Hull twice (home and away).

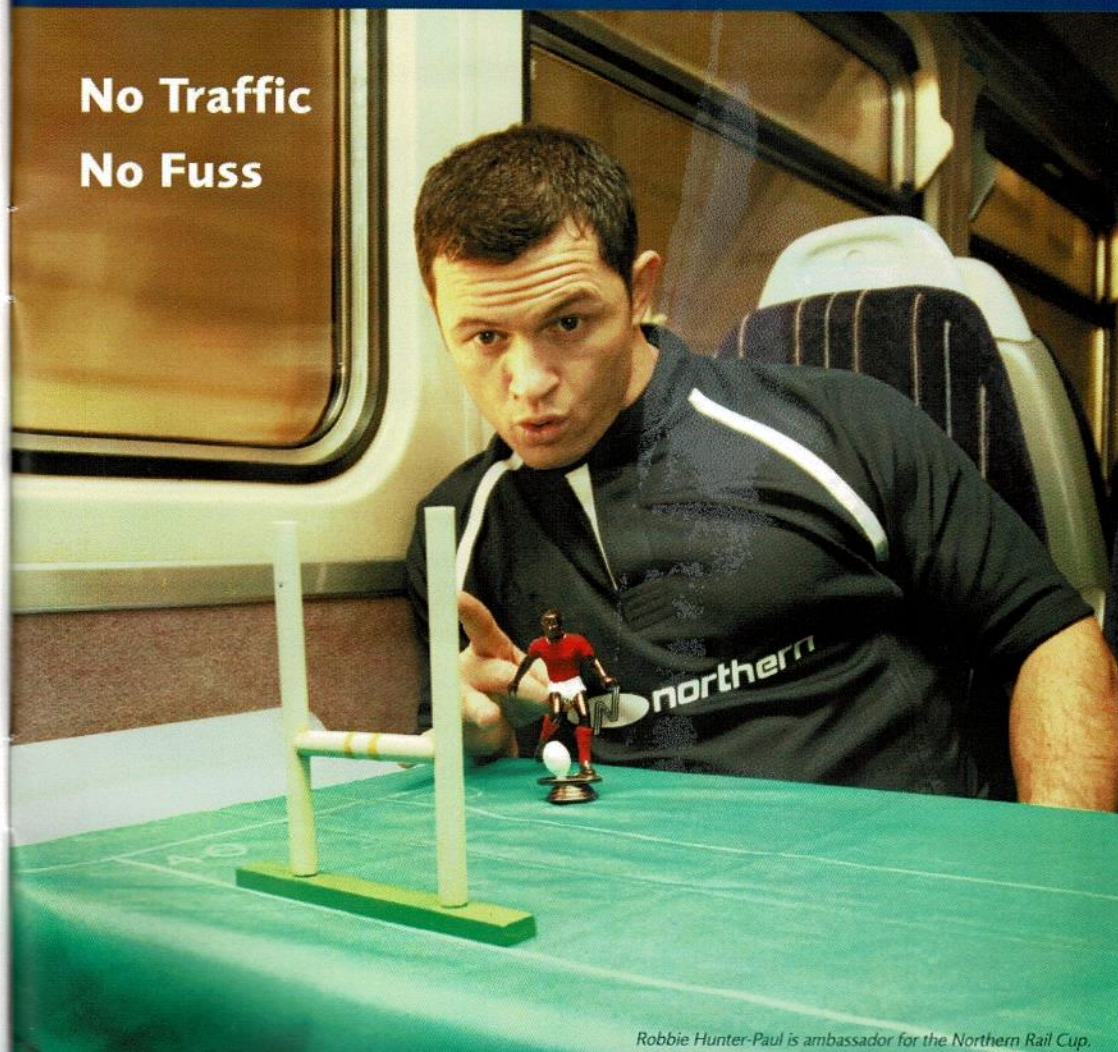
They have also knocked out Heworth, Eccles, Wigan St Jude's, Queensbury, West Hull, Castleford Panthers, Saddleworth Rangers and Blackwood Bulldogs (home) and the Army at Aldershot.
