

As ever I ask that you get behind the team today and encourage them as much as possible as we try to get our name into the hat for round 4.



I am looking for them to improve individually each


week and give myself and Ashy a real headache when it comes to choosing the team for the York game.



THE Roughyeds' restructuring programme continued with the capture on a one-year contract of former Salford, Leigh & Blackpool hooker John Clough.

John has already f the Whitebank crowd

made himself a favourite of the Whitebank crowd with his performances in our pre-season games and in our Northern Rail Cup matches.

A native of St Helens, 26-year-old John spent the last three seasons with the ill-fated Blackpool club and he is now looking forward to relaunching his career with the Roughyeds and getting involved with the club's battle to get out of Co-operative Championship One, which starts in earnest again here at the Whitebank Stadium next Sunday when Gateshead Thunder come down from the North-East to open up our league campaign.

"John knows pretty well all there is to know about the hooking role," said Roughyeds chairman Chris Hamilton. "We are delighted to sign him. He has already shown that he will be a more-thanuseful addition to the squad."

Clough was a member of the National League under-21s representative side, managed by Chris, which played several games in France in 2002.

He later went up into Super League with Salford, for whom he made 17 appearances in the elite competition between 2004 and 2006. While at The Willows he also had a brief spell on loan to the old London Broncos club.

As understudy to a City Reds legend, Malcolm Alker, he did well to get as many as 17 outings in our sport's upper echelons, making his debut off the bench in Salford's 28-22 defeat at Huddersfield Giants on Sunday, September 19, 2004.

It is interesting to recall the Salford team that day: Beverley; Caine, Littler, McAvoy, Stewart; McGuinness, Kirkpatrick; Coley, Alker, Rutgerson, Shipway, Johnson, Charles. Subs (all used): Baldwin, Haggerty, CLOUGH, Hartley.

It was to be John's only Super League appearance that season - he had celebrated his 20th birthday only a few days earlier - but he got nine games at the top level in 2005 and another seven in 2006, all the time learning his trade and developing as a player.

His first Super League appearance at The Willows, an occasion he marks as one of the highlight of his career, was off the bench versus Leeds Rhinos in March, 2005.

When it was time to move on, he had one season at Leigh under Darren Shaw in 2007 before he became one of Martin Crompton's first signings when the former Oldham Bears captain was given the job of rebuilding the seaside club in 2008.

"Blackpool hadn't won a game for two years when Crommy (Crompton) got the job there, and signed me from Leigh," said John. "We put in a lot of hard work and had some success. It was a shame it had to end in such unsatisfactory circumstances.

"It's tough on players when there are broken promises, uncertainty about the future and nobody knows for sure exactly what's happening. But all that's behind me now.

"Oldham is a good club with a good reputation and I'm looking forward to the new start it will give me. Tony Benson had a chat with me a while ago and it all moved on from there.

"I'm really enjoying my time here at Oldham. Tony's approach is a lot different to Crommy's."

A product of amateur club Blackbrook, John is the elder brother of St Helens forward Paul Clough and a neighbour and lifelong friend of former Roughyeds winger Gareth Langley.

Added John: "When I told Gareth I was thinking of joining Oldham he said he couldn't fault the club. He said it was a good club to play for. When you hear that from a friend it goes down well.

"I just hope we can progress one step further than Oldham managed last year and finally win promotion for the club after so many near misses.

"I know a little bit about what it's like to play in four consecutive Grand Finals and lose them all because the same has happened to my brother Paul at Saints"

John has played nearly all his professional rugby at hooker, although he had a spell at Blackpool last season when he was picked at loose-forward.

"I'll play anywhere," he added, "but my preference is hooker - that's where I feel most at home."

He celebrated his third and final year at Blackpool by winning the supporters' player-of-the-year award - no mean feat when you consider the quality that Blackpool had in their squad in 2010.

Away from rugby, John works in Billinge at a special school for children with challenging behaviour.


Oldham Roughveds' Supporters' Association (ORSA), formed only a few months ago, has already made two significant donations to the parent club.



WARRIORS ON THE WARPATH!



AMATEURS yes, but team-of-themoment Hunslet Warriors won't be in awe at the prospect of coming to Whitebank for a third-round tie in the Carnegie Challenge Cup.

When you've lost only one game in 21 all season, and you've got that winning habit, you're ready to take on the world --- and that's the attitude with which the Warriors from South Leeds will descend on Oldham this afternoon, writes ROGER HALSTEAD.

Their squad is packed full of players who have loads of experience on the professional circuit and one of them, Darren Robinson, is no stranger to the Oldham club and its fans.

Now aged 31, he was only 18 when he signed for the 'new' Roughyeds club as a free agent on December 2, 1997, having previously played for the former Oldham Bears club's alliance side. Only one player put pen to paper before Robinson and that was John Hough, who committed himself to Roughyeds just a few hours earlier.

Robbo was to play in nine of the new club's first 11 fixtures, mainly as a sub, before he moved on to Rochdale Hornets. He was later to return to his home city of Leeds to join Hunslet Hawks before leaving the pro game behind to join the Warriors and put something back into the game at community-club level.

"I'm enjoying it, too," said Darren. "In amateur rugby you've no concerns about things like winning bonus and losing pay, but it isn't any less intense. We've still got that winning mentality; that burning desire to score more points than our opponents.

"We'll be coming to Oldham determined to put on a show ... and I'm sure I'll get a nice, warm reception from the Oldham faithful!"

Warriors, clear leaders of National Conference division 2 and certs for promotion, have been beaten by only one team in all competitions all season.

Their fantastic unbeaten record ended a couple of weeks ago when mighty Leigh East toppled them 18-6 in the third round of the BARLA National Cup.

The only other side this season to come anywhere near pushing them off their pedestal were Eastmoor Dragons, who held them to a draw in a titanic battle at the top of NCL2.


They are coached by 31-year-old Castleford Tigers and former Huddersfield and Wakefield prop Paul Jackson and they claim to be, not without justification, a club that's going places. Players to look out for? For starters there's ex-Hunslet and Batley centre Mark Cunningham, who has a phenomenal scoring record this season ---- 29 tries in 15 games.

Loose-forward and skipper Caldon Bravo leads from the front, while half-back Jim Baker, the side's Mr Reliable, regularly records 30 tackles a game from the scrum-half position.

Goalkicking full-back Gary McClelland is another prolific scorer among the backs, while the hard-working pack includes more former professionals in ex-Huddersfield prop Paul Sebine and former Batley man Mark Holmes, a hard-working second-row man who has represented Great Britain Community Lions.

Oh, and lest I forget, we might see a certain Darren Robinson in the line-up at stand-off ... and he's not a bad 'un, either.
