

CAPTAIN'S COLUMN - ALED JAMES

t was good to have a week off from match action last weekend but we kept ourselves busy on Saturday morning with a longer more intense training session than normal.

It was a long old day. We started with video at 9am before doing a defence session that lasted an hour and a half. We then had a break for 20 minutes and we were then back on the field for another hour and a half focusing on attack.

It was good to get the entire squad together and have a hit out. There were a lot of exhausted bodies at the end.

It's the little things that we need to get right as a team as it's the same crucial errors that are killing us at the moment. Errors by key players are restricting us from competing. We play really good rugby in segments then we throw up an error and we suffer the consequences.

Our key players are not stepping up to the plate. It's our more experienced players who are dropping balls on exit and giving soft penalties away. We need to eradicate these issue and then maybe we will be in a position to compete.

We come into this game on the back of defeats at Rochdale and Keighley and there were stages of each game were we showed glimpses of real quality and we threatened the defence and scored good tries. But there were also stages were we very poor. There is a lack in consistency in our play this year.

Oldham come into this game on the back of a heavy defeat to Hull in the Challenge Cup but we know that we cannot take this into consideration. They played Super league opposition and something similar would have happened if we had played Hull. The result will have no bearing on our game on the weekend and I expect them to bounce back.



Oldham are a tough experienced team. Their forwards run hard and will be a constant threat around the ruck. They have experience in their half back positions and at hooker. It will be a good challenge for us today.

Rugby League is being played here all summer long by both Crusaders junior sides and Conference National team the Valley Cougars. The Cougars are using Scorpions fringe players as well as their own club developed stars and they've had a great start to their campaign winning two games in a row. WHO ARE OLDHAM ROUGHYEDS?

With three League Championships, one First Division title, three Challenge Cup wins, seven Lancashire League triumphs and nine Lancashire Cups to their name, Oldham are one of rugby league's most famous names.

As one of the original 22 clubs to start the Northern Rugby Union in 1895, success arrived quickly for the Lancashire outfit.

They won their first League title by heading the First Division in 1905 and further League success followed in 1910 and 1911, when they twice beat Wigan in the Championship final. Indeed, in 1910 they won three trophies, adding the Lancashire League and Lancashire Cup to their sideboard.

As for the Challenge Cup, though, it was not until 1925 that they followed their 1899 success, finishing runners up three times (in 1907, 1912 and 1924) before laying the ghost to rest when they beat Hull KR 16-3 in the final at Headingley.

They lost in the Challenge Cup final again the following year to Swinton but gained revenge in 1927 when their fourth final appearance in a row ended in a 26-7 romp at Wigan.

It was another 30 years before they enjoyed more glory, the signing of players like Alan Davies, John Etty Sid Little and Derek 'Rocky' Turner leading to their last Championship title in

1957, along with numerous county honours. However, that was their last major success, although they have won the Second Division three times in 1964, 1982 and 1988 and the Divisional Premiership twice, in 1988 and 1990.

They added Bears to their name as one of the founding members of the Super League in 1996. but they were relegated in 1997 and, to add insult to injury, they went bankrupt as well.

However, they re-formed as Oldham Roughveds in 1997 and reached the Northern Ford Premiership Grand Final in 2001, only to lose to Widnes. They were relegated in 2006, though, after only one win and have been there since, despite reaching the Grand Final three times.

In 2009, Roughyeds were told they would no longer be able to use Oldham Athletic's Boundary Park. The club went to Oldham Council for help. Oldham Council bought Whitebank Stadium from Oldham Town and sold it to Roughyeds.

The 2010 season saw a transition with the five home games were played out of town at Sedgley Park, Whitefield, Roughveds' first game at Whitebank took place on 9 May 2010 with the opposition being York City Knights. The first time Oldham had played on their own ground in Oldham borough since 1997.

AHEAD OF THE GAME

WITH REBEEGA SMITH OF LEAGUE WEEKLY

OACHES' criticisms of referees have been all over the news of late.

Hull FC's Richard Agar is raiding his piggy bank after being slapped with a record £6,000 fine for bagging James Child and Huddersfield Giants boss Nathan Brown looks likely to get similarly, if belatedly, hit in the pocket for his comments about Ben Thaler

Both coaches were indeed scathing in their assessment of the officials' performances and that may be in breach of the RFL's rules, but maybe those rules are need changing.

Super League referees are full time. Surely with a full time salary and full time hours should come full accountability.

Isn't it about time coaches were allowed to have their say on a referee and more importantly that referees were allowed a right of reply?

We hear from our referees during a game now they are wired for sound, and that is great. But maybe it is time we heard from them after a game too.

Coaches are obliged to front up to the press right after a game so why not the man who was in charge.

I am not advocating a public flogging or explanation for every decision they take, but there are plenty of controversial incidents in matches where it would be good for fans to get an official response.

If a refereeing decision is the talking point of a match then it makes sense to quiz a ref after a game?

If the referee is such a delicate flower he couldn't handle a post match interrogation then perhaps they shouldn't be in the job. But if the RFL won't put them in the front line then maybe it is time for their boss Stuart Cummings to take a higher profile and speak for them more loudly and more often, admitting when they have made mistakes as much as defending them from unfair criticism.

Gagging coaches is no way to ensure respect for the officials.

All reasonable supporters know that onfield referees have a terribly difficult job and that it is carried out generally with accuracy and integrity.

The on-field officials are making decisions in the moment, at full speed while on the move and without the vantage point enjoyed by the rest of us.

No one expects them to be perfect, just accountable when they are not.



NATIONAL LEAGUE VIEW

WITH GARETH WALKER OF LEAGUE EXPRESS

F there's one Rugby League topic that gets my blood boiling, it's the suggestion from some that the Challenge Cup should be restructured for the benefit of Super League clubs.

Every now and then some pundit – invariably from a Super League background – pipes up with the idea that top flight clubs should avoid each other until the later stages, or bemoans the fact that upsets aren't possible any more.

But although there were no outright shocks in Round Four this year – Swinton's win at Dewsbury was the biggest surprise – there could have been as many as three but for the odd contentious refereeing decision or bounce of the ball.

That showed that the magic of the Challenge
Cup does still exist. Leigh were leading Catalan
for long periods on Friday night, Halifax
competed fully with neighbours Bradford live
on terrestrial television, and Batley came closer
than anyone against Huddersfield before
having Dane Manning sent off in the second
half

Ask the coaches of the Dragons, Bulls and Giants whether Championship clubs have nothing to offer the competition.

"But there are too many one-sided scorelines," the advocates of change will say.

To which I respond - so what? Warrington beat Harlequins 82-6 in March, should we overhaul Super League as well?

Championship clubs can get so much out of these matches even if they end up on the wrong end of a big scoreline – which is always possible when full and part-time teams collide.

I was at Rochdale versus Castleford on the Sunday, and the home side competed fully for the vast majority of the first half, before being brushed aside after the break.

But Hornets coach John Stankevitch said after the game that he and his players will take as

much out of that game as any so far this season. Ask the Rochdale players who received a standing ovation from the terrific traveling Castleford support whether they would want to

Castleford support whether they would want to miss out on the opportunity to test themselves against some of the best players in the country. Tigers coach Terry Matterson hailed the

approach of Rochdale, and said "it was great to be a part of this today". There were similar sentiments from Tony Smith after his side's 80-0 win over Keighley, and other Super League coaches elsewhere.

Yes, shocks might be rarer than in years gone by, but that is inevitable when Super League sides are full-time and Championship teams aren't. When Wigan were the only full-time team in the sport they won eight Challenge Cups in a row.

But Championship clubs can still cause upsets if everything comes together for them on the day, and restructuring the Challenge Cup would only further alienate fans at this level who already think they get a rough deal from the sport as a whole.

There is more to Rugby League in this country than the top flight, and we should never forget that.
