# Dave Ellison



AN indication of Dave Ellison's feelings towards the Roughyeds is provided by the fact that he signed a

new one-year deal for 2011 before last year's Grand Final, thus proving that he was keen to extend his tenure regardless of which division we would be in.

He said at the time: "My first season here has exceeded expectations. I've loved every minute. I'm dreading it ending. We've got a fabulous team spirit and a good coaching team.

"I'm expecting us to win promotion, but if we lose I still want to be part of the same group of players next year, playing in front of the same superb supporters."

So that's what Elly thinks of the club and the fans and it is fair to say that the admiration is mutual.

Leigh-born, Ellison arrived at Oldham last autumn via spells with Wigan Warriors academy, Swinton Lions and London Skolars, whom he joined when his full-time managerial employment in leisure and catering took him to London.

He quickly became a fans' favourite by offloading cleverly, sidestepping like a centre or carrying Oldham over the gain line with bursts of genuine speed. Remarkably for a prop, he played in each of the club's 28 games last year, most of them coming off the bench as an impact forward. His fellow props Jason Boults and Wayne Kerr were also exceedingly consistent, Boults missing only two games and Kerr one.

This trusty trio between them scored 19 tries and clocked up 81 appearances out of a possible 84 -- a massive contribution in the side's engine room to everything Roughyeds achieved last year.

It's a similar story so far this year with props like Ellison, Boults, Luke Sutton and Luke Stenchion among the first players to go down on the team sheet each week --- further proof that it was a red-letter day for Roughyeds when the firm for whom Elly works full-time in a managerial capacity decided to send him back up north after his spell working in fashionable Guildford and playing for the Skolars.

Their loss was Oldham's gain. "Once back in the north I was contacted by Oldham," recalled Elly, "and the rest, as they say, is history. It's brilliant at Oldham. It's been a shame this year about some of the results, but we have been badly hit by injuries this year and another factor, I think, is that we had a very tough start this year in the way the fixtures worked out.

"Last year we had relatively few injuries and, apart from that, we had an easier start which enabled us to build up a lot of self confidence and self belief. Our confidence has suffered a bit this year, but it's starting to come back now and hopefully we will be set fair for a great run-in to the end of the season.



# Scholarship



OLDHAM unearthed some likelylooking lads in their inaugural Extended Scholarship game for under-18s against Workington Town at Whitebank on Saturday.

The Roughyeds teenagers, backed by the club's official Scholarship sponsors Tensile-Superlamp of Swinton, lit up a grey day with a 40-0 win in which standoff Tom Shaw scored two tries and landed six goals from seven shots for a personal points haul of 20.

Depleted by youth representative calls, the Cumbrians lost hooker Nathan Kirkbride and second-rower Jordan Tinkler with first-half injuries, but that should not devalue Oldham's seven-try performance as Roughyeds reached another milestone in the club's long-term development.

Centre Tom Breheny had the distinction of scoring the new side's first-ever try in the 18th minute before Shaw went in for the first of his brace of touchdowns just before half-time, giving the home side a 10-0 interval lead.

As Workington tired in the second half, coach Phil Costin's cubs added five more tries by Shaw, Jack Breheny, Craig Lawton and two by winger Curtis Strong, including a superb length-of-the-field effort in the last minute.

The 17-year-old from Ashton-under-Lyne, who has been training regularly with the

reserves, collected a restart kick near the Oldham line, blitzed a weary defence up the middle and then raced away stylishly from just inside Oldham's half to put the finishing touches to a job well done.

"Expectation was high and we had a lot of first-day nerves," said Costin, "but we were delighted to hit the ground running. There's room for improvement, but this was the first time these lads have played together and to score 40 points in those circumstances was pretty good. They were just glad to get the first game out of the way."

Although they scored only two tries while attacking up the hill in the first half, Roughyeds had several good chances.

Strong-running second-rower Jack Breheny twice went close; left-wing Chris Jarvis put a foot in touch as he crossed in the corner; and on the other wing Nathan Bevan sent in his brother Conal Bevan only for the final pass to be judged forward.

Nathan Bevan, the scrum-half, then had another good opportunity to score when he charged down a clearing kick, but in his haste to pick up the loose ball at speed he momentarily lost his composure and knocked-on.

ROUGHYEDS have strengthened their squad with the capture on loan of two up-and-coming youngsters from Leeds Rhinos, both of whom made very impressive senior debuts last Sunday in the side that won 52-16 at Gateshead.

Casey, who was 21 last week, plays stand-off or loose-forward and is the eldest of the three Casey brothers from Oldham St Anne's who are on the Rhinos books.

Bravo (20), who operates at prop or second-row, joined Rhinos from St Joseph's, a Huddersfield amateur club.

"Leeds want them to get some first-team experience," said Roughyeds chairman Chris Hamilton, "and, although they can't be guaranteed that, it is up to them to push their way into the side.

"Moves like this have, in the recent past, proved beneficial all round and we hope

they will do so again.


"Their stay with us will be part of their development. We have a good track record in this sort of thing so the rest is up to them."

Casey first donned his Roughyeds jersey when scoring a brace of tries in the reserve team's big win against Sheffield Eagles and he was unlucky not to score in the senior side up on Tyneside when he crossed the line only to have it rubbed out for a forward pass.

They are among five members of the Rhinos under-20s squad who have been allowed out on loan -- two have gone to Keighley and one to Doncaster -- in order to gain experience of Championship One rugby.

The under-20s Valvoline Cup has been put on hold while the Rugby League Nines series is taking place and this has prompted Leeds to provide opportunities for their youngsters to spread their wings.
