ROB POWELL LOOKS FORWARD TO TODAY'S CLASH WITH WIGAN WARRIORS

I would like to welcome everyone associated with Wigan for our game at The Stoop today. Michael Maguire's team have led the way again in many areas this year especially with their mental resilience in their attitude towards defence and it will be a massive test for us. I would also like to thank Wigan for their support this year over the loans of Karl Pryce and, earlier in the season, Joe Mellor

The last two weeks have been particularly frustrating for us. Although it appeared to be a blow out score against Hull KR, we matched them in most departments. We were better than the 10-0 half time score line suggests and statistically it was a couple of missed tackles at crucial times that were the difference in the end. It shows just how fine the line is at this level and you get punished if you aren't clinical enough when you get opportunities.

back it up, we will become a difficult team to beat

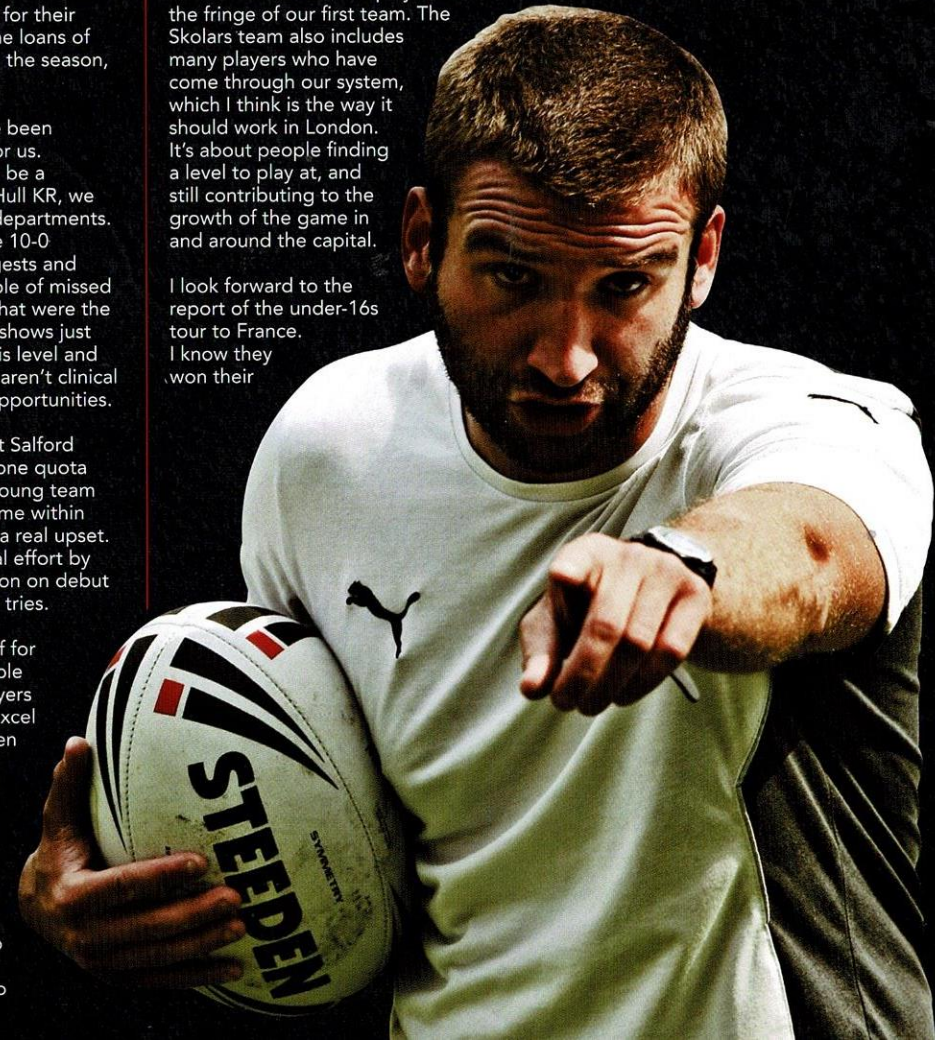

B CLOSE WITH

CHRIS MELLING

THE GAMES AGAINST WIGAN ARE ALWAYS A BIT SPECIAL FOR CHRIS MELLING. THE HARLEQUINS WING WAS BORN IN THE TOWN OF ASHTON-IN-MAKERFIELD IN THE BOROUGH OF WIGAN AND AS A YOUNGSTER HE WAS A BIG WARRIORS FAN.

Fulfilling a boyhood dream, he signed for them as a teenager, came up through the ranks and subsequently made 13 appearances for the first team before moving to London in 2007. Now in his fifth season with Harlequins, he is one of the club's seasoned professionals but whenever he comes up against his former club there's an extra bit of motivation.

"The last couple of games we've played against them haven't been the greatest," admits Chris. "When we played them earlier in the season, we performed in the second half but not in the first.

"Wigan have been on top form and are top of the league so we need to be at our best. But I always want to get one over on them, so there will be a lot on this game and I'll be hoping for a good win."

Chris played his junior rugby with local team the Ashton Bears and then moved to Hindley before joining the Wigan Academy. He toured Australia and New Zealand with England Under-16s in 2001 and also played for the England Under-18s Academy.

"I was a massive Wigan fan," says Chris. I started watching them at Central Park and when I started training there I'd be meeting up with legends like Neil Cowie and Gary Connolly. It was a childhood dream to play for them."

Chris made his debut for the Warriors in 2004 at the JJB Stadium, coming off the bench against Salford and slotting in on

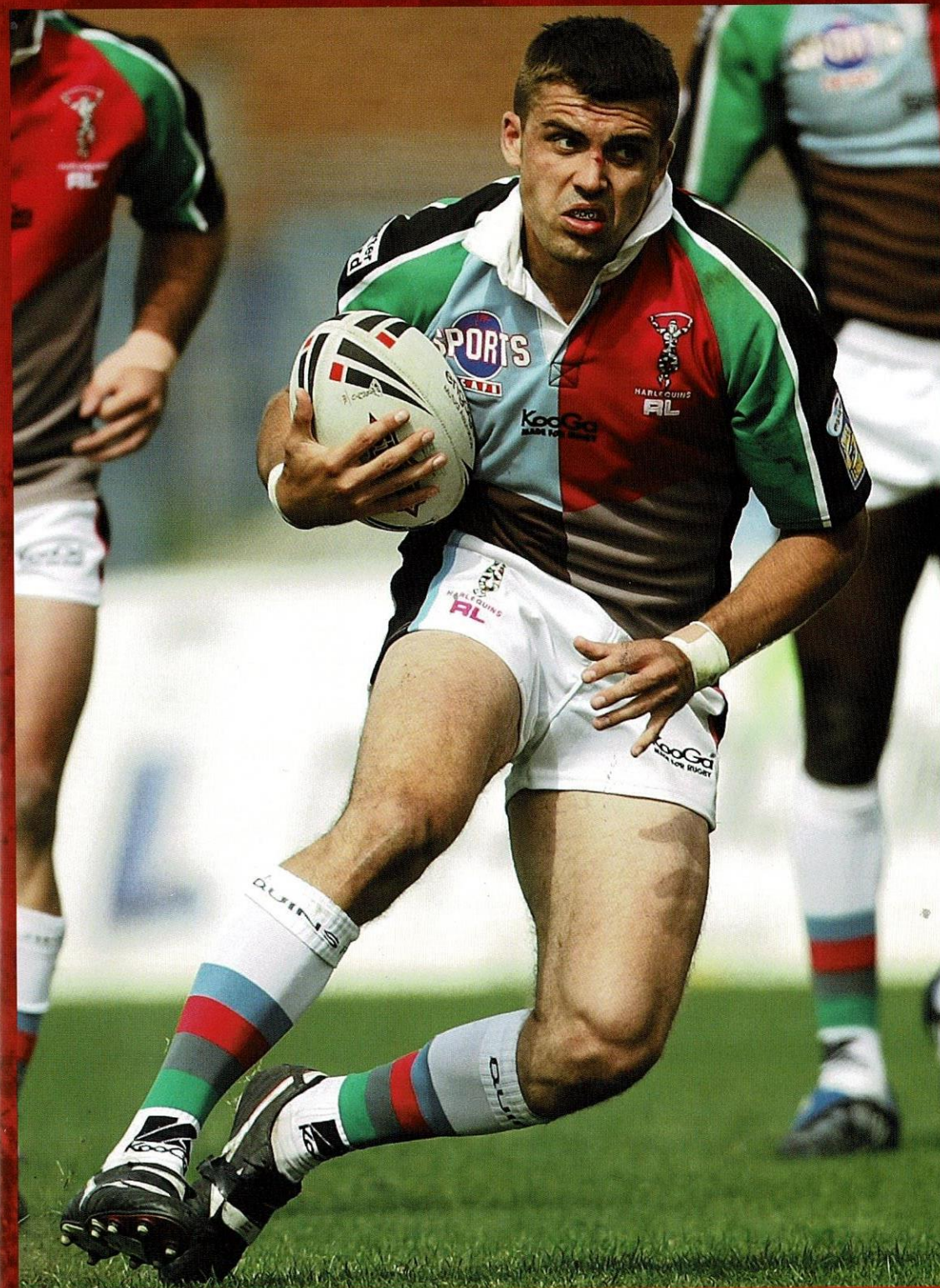
The following week he played against Limoux in the Challenge Cup, scoring a try and kicking 10 goals out of 10 attempts. However, in his third game against Leeds at Headingley, Chris lasted just 30 seconds following a cruciate ligament injury.

He was out for around a year but looking back, Chris reckons it was something of a blessing in disguise. "I think I had just started my second year at university, I was doing a degree in physiotherapy at the University of Central Lancashire in Preston.

"I was able to get on with my studies and didn't have the demands of getting to games. I spent a lot of hours in the library and in the rehab room in

"Doing a university course while I was at Wigan were the craziest three years. I was trying to be part of the first team, train as and when I could I'd be doing a weights session at 6 o'clock in the morning, then travelling up to university, doing a full day there, then coming back to do extras or skills or whatever.

"It was a pretty intense course, then every so often we'd have a placement in a hospital or a clinic. If I had a Friday night game I had to ask for the afternoon off – we weren't super stars, so it was a case of asking the educator politely. A couple of them ended up coming along to some games. It was a tough three years but I'm qualified now."

Having got back to full fitness after the injury, Chris found it difficult to get back into first team contention at Wigan and through a spate of injuries, he found himself playing hooker in the under-20s.

"It was probably the best season I'd had and ended up as Player of the Year, but not many clubs were looking for a hooker. I met up with Macca (Brian McDermott) and Tony Rea in a seedy café in Tesco's prior to one of their games up North. They said, 'we'll sign you as a hooker but you've got the opportunity to play in the outside backs if the opportunity arises'.

"So I came down as a hooker, Chad (Randal) had signed 12 months before. Mark McLinden then got injured before the start of the season and Macca wanted me to play full back in the Capital Challenge at the New River Stadium.

"I ended up playing there for the majority of the year. I think I've only played about 60 minutes in total at hooker the whole time I've been down here."

As with all northerners, it's a big step coming to London and Chris had just got engaged to Ruth before he signed a 12-month contract with Quins. "At first, I was going to come down on my own and just see how it goes but we'd both finished university, she didn't have a job she was fully committed to and thought it was as good an opportunity for her as it was for me.

"I thought, 'we've got no ties up north so let's jump in with both feet, eyes closed,' and I've loved every minute. It's had its ups and downs but over the last five years we've started a family down here and fortunately it's worked out, we both enjoy it."

Chris believes that the London club fosters a very special atmosphere among the players and it's something which helped when he first moved to the capital. "I think the fact that regardless of where you come from, down here everyone is in a similar position and you end up having your own community.

"That, for me, was really good and being part of it for the first 12 months made the whole thing a lot more enjoyable."

And for those who think that playing for Harlequins takes a player off the radar as far as international honours are concerned, Chris is proof that this is not the case. One of the highlights of his time with Quins was being selected at full back for Great Britain to face France at Headingley in June, 2007.

"I never expected it, I just put my head down and got on with things. We won 42-14 but the downside was that I picked up an injury and was unable to play for the next eight to nine months."

When asked to name a memorable game in a Quins shirt, it's not surprising that Chris comes up with the 38-26 victory at Wigan last season, one of the biggest upsets in Super League!

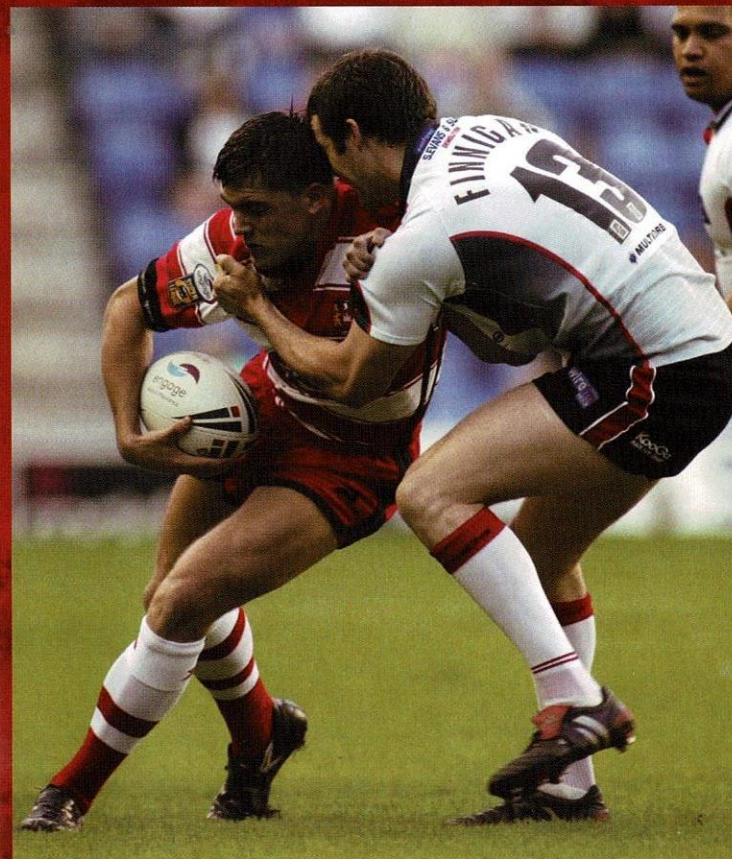
He recalls: "We were getting beat 24-6 at half time and went in with our heads down. But we hadn't made any ridiculous errors, there had been a couple of missed tackles and we conceded a couple of poor tries.

"But we felt if we cut out the errors and controlled the ball a bit better, we'd give ourselves an opportunity to get back into the game. We went out there with no fear in the second half and did a job. It was close but we ended up scoring late on and took the victory."

However, at the final whistle, for a split second he had mixed emotions, particularly as many of his family still support the Warriors. "I'd disappointed a bit of family and knowing what the atmosphere would be like in the home changing room you feel for them a little bit.

"It was my home town club so you always want to get one over on them and to prove a point and I was a Harlequins player and we'd won! We'd been written us off at half time and the excitement and atmosphere in our dressing room afterwards was unreal."

Chris reveals that the underdog mentality is something which runs through the team and gives them extra motivation "No one gives you a chance and that is a big motivation for a lot of people – we haven't got a big fan base and a lot of backing – all those sorts of things. On paper you haven't got a cat in hell's chance but that gives a lot of people inspiration and motivation.

"We're not a team that runs from the front and continues to run, we battle. I do quite like that but sometimes I would prefer us to be a team that takes a little bit of an advantage and is clinical."

The 26-year-old is probably viewed as an out and out winger these days but he still classes himself as a utility player and although it can have its drawbacks, he's happy with the tag.

"I've never pigeonholed myself in a certain position, some will see this as my downfall. It does get frustrating, but on the plus side I'm usually pencilled in somewhere because I offer quite a lot to the team. I'm not the biggest but I'm not the smallest either and I'd like to think I can match it with anyone.

"The way we've played this year, early on we rely on our back three to get in there and do some work. You effectively become one position, which is good. I think the way the game is now, you do need to be able to switch

and change between positions quite often. You get back rows and centres switching, as well as full backs and wingers, hookers and loose forwards. Because of the intensity of the game, quite a lot of players don't end up playing 80 minutes each week.

"That can be a positive for me as I offer different positions. I might start on the wing but if we get an injury or players are struggling I can fill in. That gives the coaches options."

Once upon a time wingers just stayed out by the touchline and rarely ventured inside, but that's all changed. They have to return kicks from deep and try to win as much territory as possible and also give the forwards a breather by taking the ball up early in sets, often near their own line.

"When you're deep in your own half or on your goal line and you look up and it's 100 metres to get to the opposition try line, sometimes they're not the nicest carries. The objective is to get as many yards as you can. It's

a case of getting the ball, tucking it under your arm and setting off like a bullet, finding the floor and getting a good play-the-ball."

There have been a lot of tough carries in a tough season and after that good start, the long run without a win has been frustrating for all concerned. "The lack of consistency is disappointing," he says. "We started well and in our first four or five games, hadn't conceded many points and scored quite a few. Everyone knew what they were doing, then we lost a few players through injury and haven't been able to put those consistent performances together.

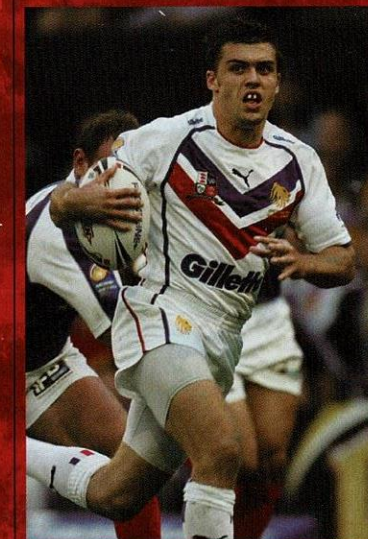
"We're still immature as a club and as a team. We need to be able to develop the skills to switch on and be ruthless.

"We had a good win recently against Wakefield and are hopefully beginning to turn it around. We've done it for five and 10 minute spells in games, we just need to do it for 80 minutes."

A career as a physiotherapist is an option for Chris when he eventually hangs up his boots and keeps his hand in by working with the Quins Under-15s and Under-16s. "I physio with them occasionally and help out a little bit with the coaching. I would like to do a lot more but it's on the back burner at the moment. With two girls and the team, there's not many free hours!"

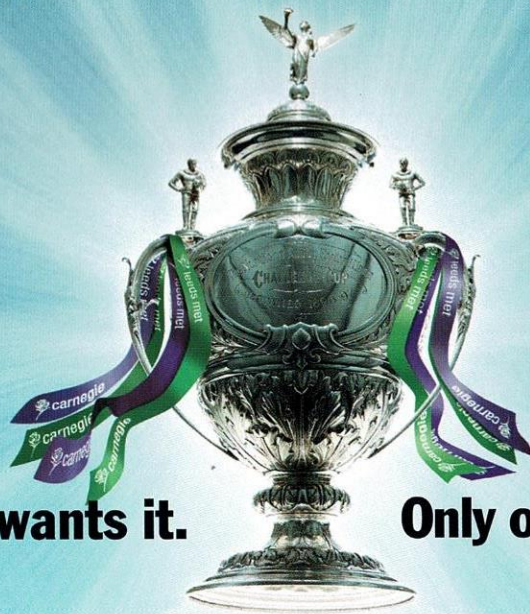


A CLASSIC WINGER'S TRY, CHRIS SQUEEZES OVER BY THE CORNER FLAG

MIGHTY MINIS



ELMBRIDGE EAGLES' VICTORIOUS

Mini Rugby league involves the youngest age groups playing rugby league in structured competition, with teams at under-7s, under-9s and under-11s.

Under-7s rugby league is non-contact Tag and is usually played as a four-a-side game on 10 metre fields, with minimal technical rules and the emphasis on fun, involvement and getting every player running with the ball as much as possible.

At under-9s and under-11s, the competitions are still small-sided to encourage maximum involvement of each player but they play full contact rugby league and learn the essential collision skills of safe tackling, protective falling and running with the ball. The minis ethos is about getting children playing the game and enjoying the sport irrespective of position, gender or athletic ability. Boys and girls play together until under-11s, and most clubs have a mix of both in their teams.

The Harlequins RL's Mighty Quins Minis' festival has been around for five years now and is the biggest event in the mini calendar. Supported for the last two years by Warburtons, its success has led the WCAM London Mini, Junior & Youth League to introduce a new calendar for Mini rugby league in 2011 based around four major competitions including today's Mighty Quins festival. The season runs from

Easter to September and in between the four major festivals, which this year are at Elmbridge, Brentwood, Mighty Quins and Surrey Sports Park, the teams play weekly smaller round-robin competitions and have training weekends.

This year 10 clubs across London and the south have run mini rugby league teams at some or all of the age groups and the competition season is the longest and most popular it's ever been. Most clubs see their minis as the most important people at the club; if a club's under-7s are strong, with lots of players and good coaches, those players will stay with the club through the age groups and become lifetime rugby league players.

I am not really bothered what name it is, I'll play 100 per cent whatever the name, but I do know a lot of people relate to London Broncos as rugby league in London.

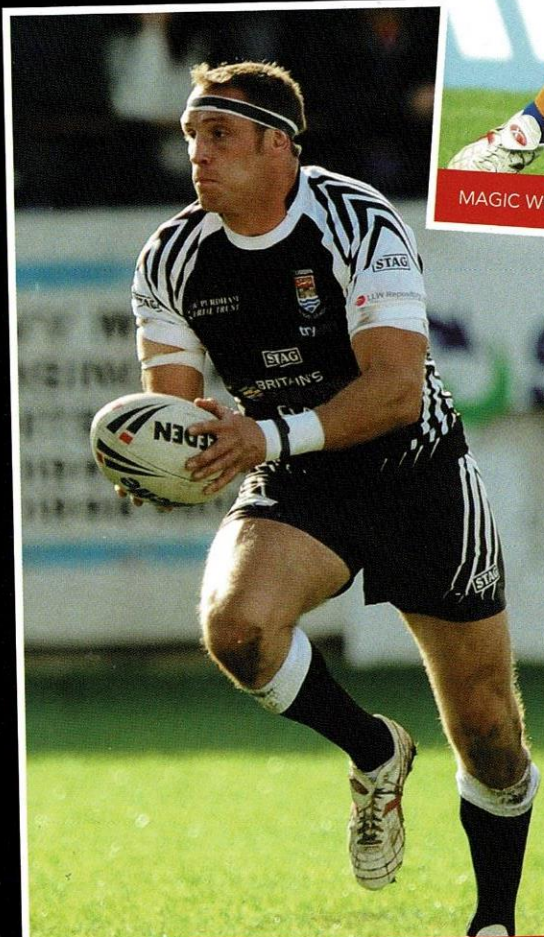

THREE SUPER LEAGUE CLUBS – HARLEQUINS RL, WAKEFIELD, AND THE CRUSADERS RL – ARE OUT OF THE RUNNING FOR THIS SEASON'S PLAY-OFFS. QUINS AND WAKEFIELD COULD MATHEMATICALLY STILL MAKE IT, BUT EVEN THE MATHEMATICAL OPTION IS NOW DENIED TO THE CRUSADERS, WHO HAVE NEVER REALLY RECOVERED FROM THE FOUR-POINT DEDUCTION THEY SUFFERED FOR GOING INTO ADMINISTRATION BEFORE THE START OF THE SEASON.

With seven Super League games remaining, all three clubs are now at the stage where planning for next season becomes even more important than anything else that will happen during this season.

There is, of course, the added complication of the clubs not being sure that they will be in Super League in 2012. Fortunately on 26th July, the RFL is due to announce its decision on which teams will comprise the Super League competition for the next three seasons.

With Widnes Vikings already having been told that they will be in the competition from next season, I sincerely hope that the governing body will announce that Super League will have 15 clubs in it next

season, although I suspect that it will stick with 14.

I can hardly begin to imagine the damage that exclusion from Super League will cause to the club that gets kicked out, but I'm sure I'll be writing about that in a separate article before the end of this month.

Meanwhile, I would like to make a plea to the RFL on another issue, which is a recurring theme. Why must clubs wait until September 1st before officially being allowed to negotiate with players who are coming out of contract at other clubs?

Apart from being totally unrealistic, that deadline is universally ignored by our clubs. So, you might say, 'what's the problem?' given that no one pays any attention to the rule in the first place.

Well, there are a couple of problems. First of all, clubs may agree new contracts with players who are currently on other clubs' books. But those contracts are not valid until they are registered with a club on or after September 1st.

Therefore there is always the hidden danger for a player that he may sign a contract in July, but then suffer an injury in August and his 'new' club can renege on the contract he has

signed by refusing to lodge it with the RFL, leaving the player in no man's land.

Secondly, when clubs like the Crusaders, Harlequins and Wakefield are planning for next season, they need to be able to make announcements about their recruits in order to fire up their supporters for next season. The blow of not making the play-offs for these three clubs would be softened if they were able to tell their supporters about some of the players they have lined up for next season.

Unfortunately, they are only able to do that with news of signings they have made from the NRL, where the September 1st deadline doesn't apply. I don't know why we have this rule, and it is surely about time to get rid of it.

Apart from anything else, I think it is unethical to try to stop players planning for their future by testing themselves in the market. I am sure that the Rugby League Players Association would like to take action on this issue, and I hope they do.

In the meantime, I hope the fans of all three clubs continue to give their support for the remainder of what has been a difficult season for all of them.

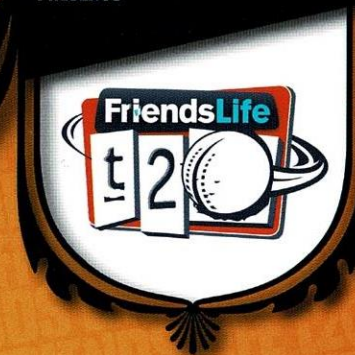



RUGBY LEAGUE RULES

A BEGINNERS GUIDE

THE IDEA

To score more points than your opponent.

THE MATCH

A game lasts 80 minutes, comprising of two halves of 40 minutes each. Professional games are controlled by time-keepers who sound a siren to tell the referee when the correct amount of time has expired.

THE SCORE

By touching the ball over your opponent's line you score a try, which is worth four points. You can then add another two points if your kicker kicks the ball between the posts for what is known as a

conversion. There are two other ways to score. Firstly, you can kick a penalty that is awarded after a player has been penalised for breaking rules such as being offside, or misbehaving – this is worth two points. And secondly, if you can kick the ball between the posts after bouncing it onto the ground during play, you collect one point. This is known as a field goal or a drop goal.

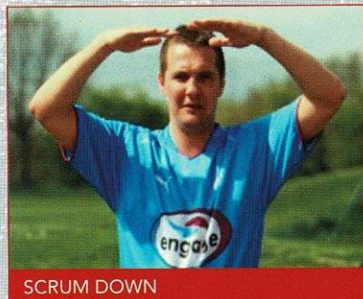
THE TEAMS

There are two teams both made up of 13 players, comprising of: a fullback; two wings (one on either side of the field); two centres; two half-backs – one called a stand-off and the other a scrum half; and then six forwards: two props and a hooker in the front row, two in the

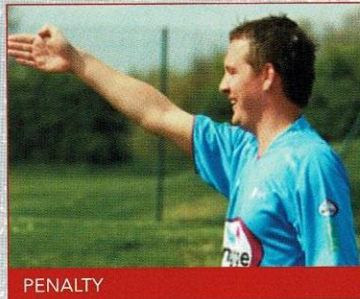
second row and a loose forward at the back of the pack. Each team can have four subs who can be interchanged with any member of the team up to 12 times.

THE PRESSURE

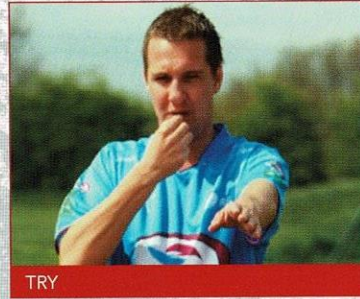
Each team in possession is allowed to keep the ball for six tackles. When a tackle is completed the ball carrier stands up and propels the ball back along the ground to a supporting player – this is called a 'play-the-ball'. If the team in possession is still carrying the ball after six tackles are completed, they have to hand the ball over to their opponents. Many teams elect to kick the ball after the fifth tackle in an attempt to gain as much ground as possible.



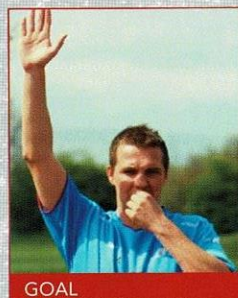

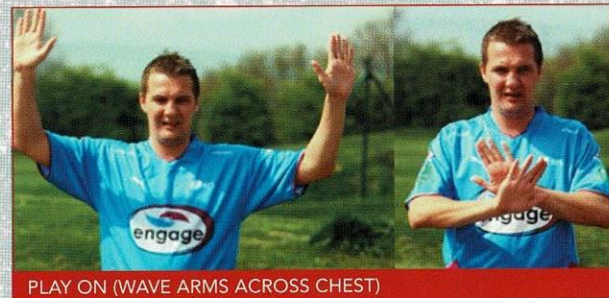

PASSING

The ball is passed between players in a backwards or level direction. You can pass the ball until a player is tackled in possession.

MATCH OFFICIALS

There is one referee in charge of the game, who can send players off for foul play and counts the tackles in each six-tackle spell. He is assisted by two touch judges, and, if the game is not televised, an in-goal judge is situated at each end of the ground. Televised games also have a video referee.

SCRUMMAGES

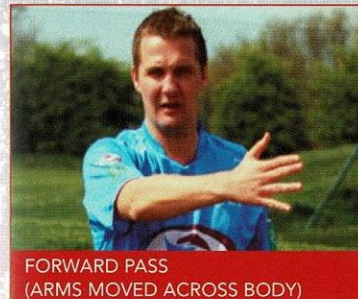
Six-man scrums in Rugby League are a way of restarting the game and making 12 men out of the way of the back division players.

OFFSIDE

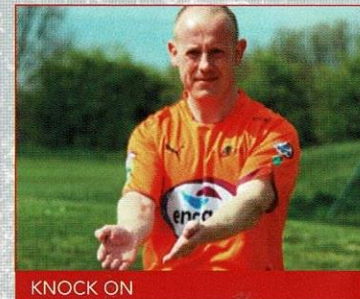
In Rugby League, you are offside if you interfere with the game after being in front of one of your own team when he kicks the ball in open play, or if you stray too quickly between the ten-metre-gap maintained between the two teams at a play-the-ball.

OTHER THINGS

You will sometimes hear fans talk about a '40-20'. That is when a player kicks the ball out of play in his opponent's 20-metre area from within his own 40-metre zone. This gives his team the advantage of putting the ball into the scrum where the ball bounced over the touchline. A 'goal line drop out' is a drop kick taken from under your own posts if you've been forced to touch the ball down in your own in-goal area, or put the ball out of play from behind the posts.



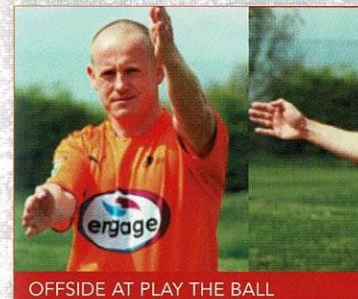

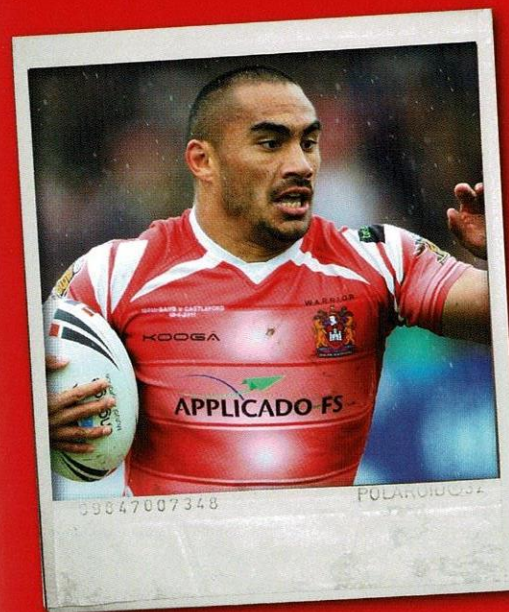
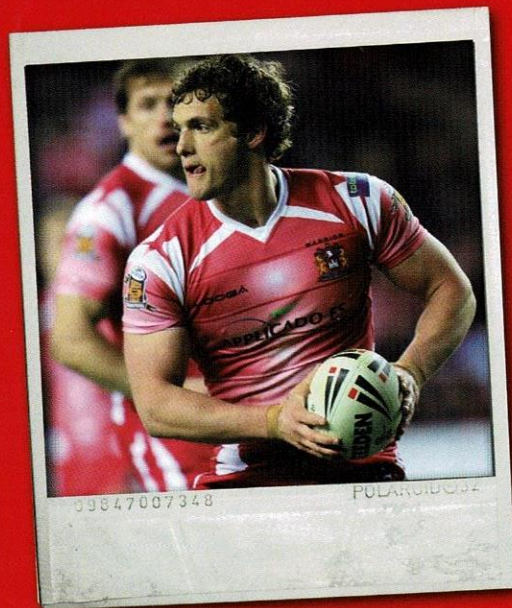
He has committed himself to the club for another two seasons and was selected for the Exiles in their recent game against England along with teammates George Carmont and Thomas Leuluai.

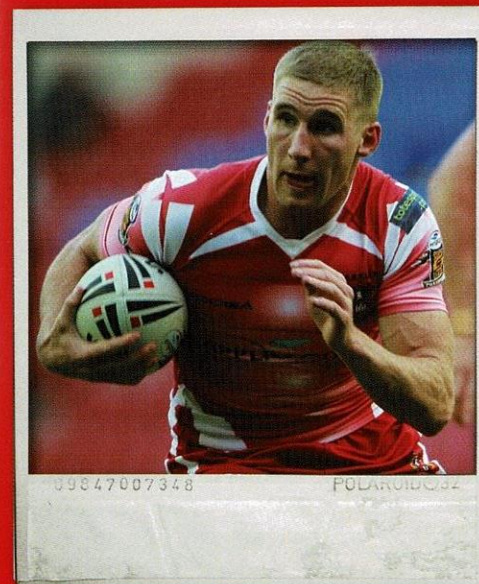
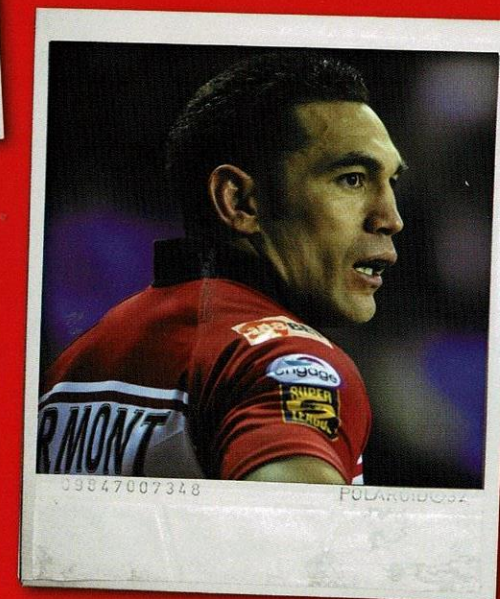


THOMAS LEULUAI

Whilst former Skolars' coach Tony Benson will be making a return to the capital, former player Dave Ellison won't be, except as a spectator. The prop forward severely dislocated an elbow in the Oldham's 40-20 win against Whitehaven and now has an arm in a plaster cast, he is likely to be out until at least the end of the league season.

The 2010 season saw three players share the top try scorer honour - Mick Fogerty, Paul O'Connor and Lucas Onyango all with 29 tries. Kenyan born Onyango is another

player on the injury list, which given his ability to score against Skolars will be something of a relief. However, Oldham won't be short of try scoring opportunities with a strong hooker and half back combination.

Martin Roden, their 31-year-old hooker, adds a wealth of experience to the side and is also the club conditioner, assistant coach and joint vice-captain. Cousin Neil (stand-off) is three months younger and also hails from Wigan, joining Oldham from the Warriors in 2000. He's spent

almost 10 seasons with Oldham (with two years away at Batley and Leigh in 2005 and 2006).

At scrum half is Carl Forber, who impressed at Blackpool Panthers in 2009 and 2010, scoring 14 tries last season. Following that club's demise he joined Swinton and is currently on loan to Oldham.

Sharing the hooking duties with Martin Roden is John Clough. Like Forber, he hails from St Helens. He made 17 appearances for Salford City Reds in Super League and also had a brief spell on loan with the (then) London Broncos.

The head-to-head analysis shows that Skolars have never beaten Oldham in nine outings. The closest games have occurred when Skolars have been away from New River.

A late penalty denied Skolars a draw at Boundary Park in 2007 when Oldham won 28-26. The Sky cameras covered the game in 2009 when Oldham staged a comeback in the final quarter to run out 28-22 winners. The closest result at home was a 6-34 defeat back in 2007, the largest margin being 10-78 in 2009 in a game in which Paul Ballard kicked 13 goals.

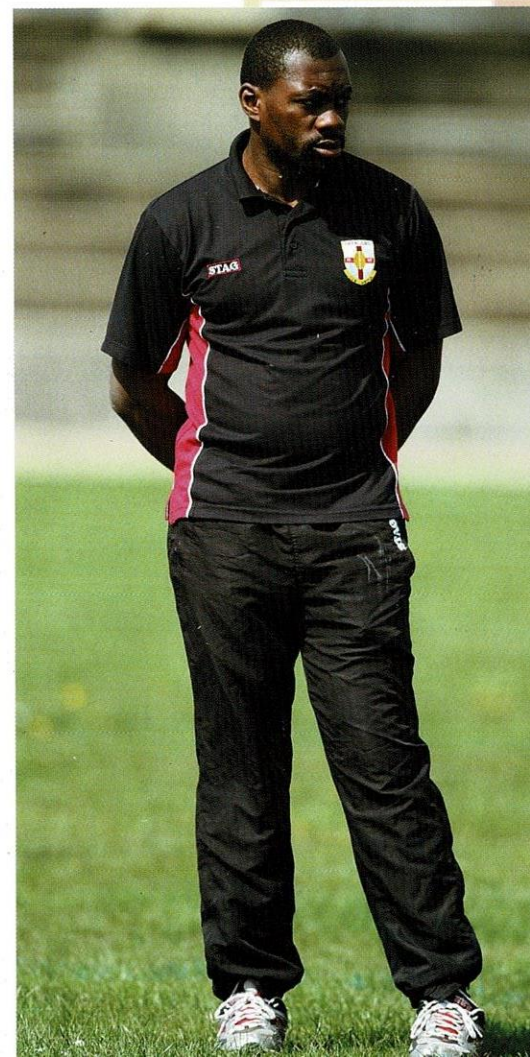
