# Jason Boults



**JASON Boults will soon complete five seasons with Roughyeds --- and you don't do that unless (a) you are committed to the cause and earn the respect of the club and its fans and (b) you are happy at the club and**

**pleased to be playing for it.**

'Boultsy', as he is known to all and sundry here at Whitebank, scores full marks on both counts and as a fully paid up member of the '100 club' --- for the uninitiated that's for the exclusive membership of players whose number of senior appearances for Roughyeds have topped the ton --- he is almost part of the furniture.

The 27-year-old Yorkshireman boasts an impressive record of consistency for a prop, having made 25, 33, 20 and 26 appearances respectively in 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2010 to reach 104 overall and he has added significantly to that total since by continuing to be one of our front-line front-rowers during the campaign that is now edging towards the play-offs and another exciting conclusion.

'Boultsy' will be proud to be classed as a 'players' player' because that's exactly what he is. His position, and the type of game he plays, means he rarely hits the headlines. But ask any Oldham forward who they would want to be lining up alongside them when the battles of the packs are at their most ferocious and they will tell you in one: 'Boultsy'.

The work of a prop like Jason often goes unnoticed by fans because it doesn't fall into the 'glamorous' category, but it is an essential part of any rugby league team and all fans will agree that of the many unsung heroes at this club Jason Boults is certainly one of them.

And part of the reason for that is that he loves it here. He likes the club, the people, the place. In other words he is very much at home here and he will be the first person to tell you that.

He said this week: "It's a closely-knit club. The staff and the fans are great. It's a nice play to be and that counts for a lot. It must be awful to be at a club where you don't feel at home.

"From day one I have always been made welcome at Roughyeds. Each year we have had a great set of lads and I like to think I get on well with everyone, including the supporters who have always been great. I think that in any walk of life it's always a help when you get on with people."

Jason, who lives in Halifax and works in Bradford as a fork-lift driver, was the first player to commit himself to the club for 2011.

He didn't play in Oldham's 2007 and 2008 finals, but he was in the starting line-up at the Halliwell Jones in 2009 against Keighley and in 2010 against York City Knights and he would love to get the opportunity to make it three finals in three years in 2011.

"It looks as though we could be challenging from fifth or sixth place, maybe even seventh, so we will have to do it the hard way like we did in 2009 when we lost a few players to Barrow in mid-season but went on to qualify for the final with play-off wins against Swinton and Hunslet at Boundary Park and then against York away.

"Apart from Workington we have beaten every other play-off team at least once this year so nobody should scare us. We just need to work on playing at our highest level more consistently and if we can achieve that I don't think any of our play-off rivals will particularly fancy a game against Oldham." Jason played for Brighouse Rangers as a boy, for Siddal as a youth and then signed for Bradford Bulls when he was 16. He had five years at Odsal before transferring to Halifax where he spent two enjoyable seasons and, in one of them, had the distinction of playing in every match --- a real achievement that for a prop-forward who is always in the thick of the action.

Strong, and with a good engine, as they say in the business, Jason brought with him qualities of honesty, reliability and an indomitable work ethic when he came to Oldham back in 2007. He is still as indefatigable as ever.

# About Oldham

**IT has emerged that our coach Tony Benson, soon to complete his third season with Roughyeds, is the longest-serving coach in Championship One.**



Tony joined us in September, 2008 and of all the coaches in Championship One only Doncaster's Tony Miller, who succeeded Ellery Hanley in December of that year, comes close to matching Benson's length of tenure. The Roughyeds coach has also put in a longer stint than seven of the 11 coaches in the Championship.

In 2009 and 2010 he led Oldham to within one game of promotion, losing each time in the play-off final, while this year we are now mathematically assured of a play-off spot, despite losing several players with long-term injuries, following our exciting 38-16 win at Rochdale last Sunday.

"Each year has thrown up different challenges," said Tony, "but, in varying degrees, we've come up with the goods and we are laying down strong

foundations with Phil Costin's new under-18s squad and John Hough's exciting under-23s. In recruitment and player development Houghie is doing a great job.

"In 2009 we lost a clutch of players mid-season to Barrow and the next year we again reached the final despite starting late in rebuilding the squad on a much-reduced budget.

"This year, our first full season at Whitebank, we again brought in a significant number of new players, but we have also seen the successful promotion of several younger players from the reserves.

"I'm lucky because I have both a supportive chairman and a backroom staff who are second to none.

"Chris (Hamilton) has never refused a request. His attention to detail is spot-on, which clears me of administrative worries, and he has structures in place so that everyone knows what the club is about. Players like that environment.

"Paul Hulbert takes a lot of strain off me on the football management side; Rachel Johnson, the physio, has been with us for several years and so have Ian and Dave, my statisticians, Stability counts for a lot.

"I'm also fortunate to have the support of loyal fans who have stuck with us through thick and thin."

Chris said: "Tony isn't the division's longest-serving coach by accident. He's a good coach and he works hard. He's also a good club man, who has bought into what we are trying to build."

## BEN HEATON - IT'S ALL TO PLAY FOR

**BEN Heaton, our exciting young full-back, scored two tries in last Sunday's 38-16 derby win at Rochdale as newly-named 'Rugby League World' magazine's Championship One player of the month for July.**

Eye-catching performances against Whitehaven, London Skolars, Keighley Cougars and Workington Town earned 21-year-old Ben this prestigious accolade, which will further enhance his growing reputation.

Last Sunday's game was his sixth derby against his home-town club in two seasons - he has been a winner each time - but his first at Spotland in the position he has now made his own.

Ben celebrated his RLW accolade with two cracking tries - both off astute Neil Roden passes - to add to others by Neil himself, Danny Whitmore, Callum Casey, Shaun Robinson and Marcus St Hilaire.

"It looks as though I'm type-cast as a full-back now and that's where I'll probably be playing for the foreseeable future, but it didn't look as though that would be the case last season when I played in 27 of the 28 games and mainly in the forwards."

Paul O'Connor's departure at the end of last season changed all that. Heaton, who had started off at Roughyeds as a 17-year-old rookie full-back in the newly-formed Reserve team squad of 2008, stepped into the breach and was an instant hit.

"I hadn't played full-back for a long time," he added, "and it took me a while to get my head round it. But I'm loving it now and it feels good to get some 'outside' recognition and to get something back for all the hard work I've put into making the transition from forwards to full-back.

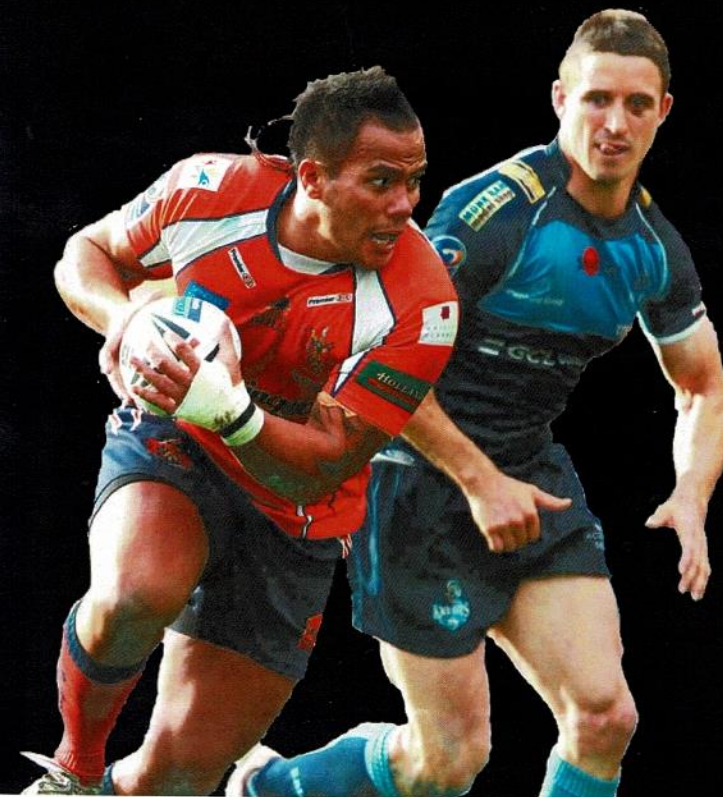
