The season's end is upon us, and we have achieved phase one of this season's aims, which was to finish higher than last season and improve more as a team.

I think it's safe to say we have now surpassed that, and are now looking forward to the play-offs with renewed vigour following some fine displays of late.

The season is 20 games long, and we have proved over the 20 games that we can live with the best in this division. Today's opponents Oldham have been one of our most difficult opponents, and we fully expect them to come out all guns blazing to cement their own play-off hopes.

The Keighley v Whitehaven game also taking place today could have a real bearing on the final league position for both clubs. If Oldham win today and Keighley defeat Whitehaven, then Oldham could finish in sixth place. Likewise, if Whitehaven defeat Keighley and we can somehow overturn a 23 points difference, then we could grab the coveted runners-up spot.

Those games were points lost, which had we won them could have seen us crowned champions instead of Swinton.

Today gives us the chance to finish the season on a high. We have players returning after injury to put pressure on the starting XIII who have performed so admirably in recent weeks. Props Marc Shackley and Ryan McDonald are both back in training so will add much need depth to the squad.

Our support this season has been fantastic, and we sincerely hope we can round off the season with an entertaining game today to maintain our end of season momentum.

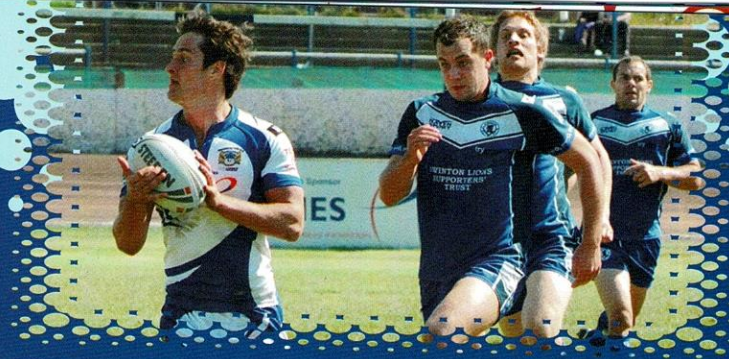

'The Roughyeds'

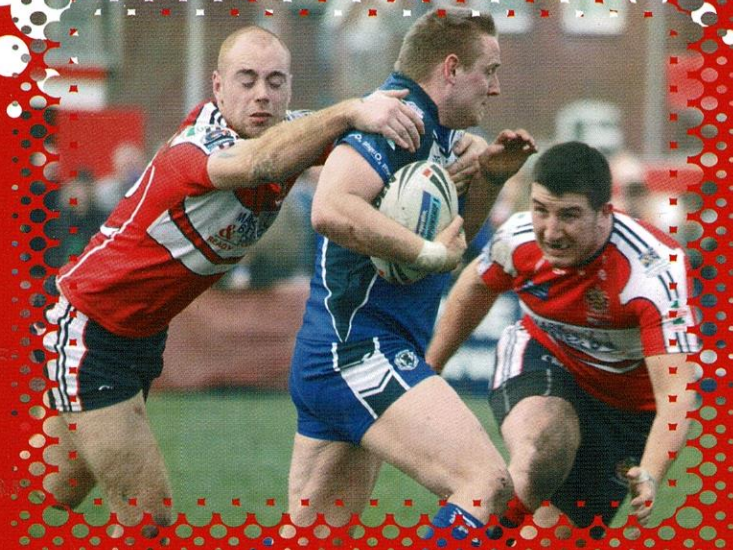
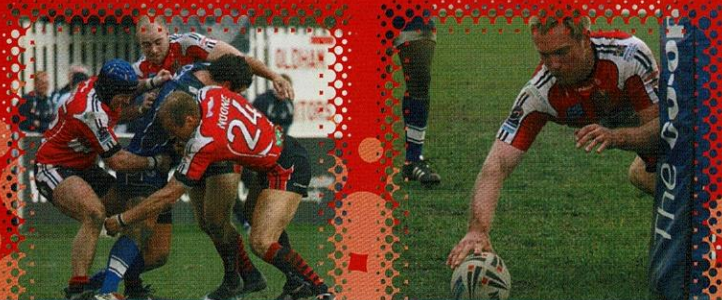
Oldham

A cursory glance at the Championship One table could easily fool the average supporter into thinking that today's game would be a guaranteed win for the home side; after all, Oldham are sitting in seventh place, with Town riding high in third. But, as any chameleon will tell you, 'appearances can be deceptive!'

On closer inspection you would see that although Oldham are indeed in seventh place, Town have only won one more game than the Roughyeds, showing just how important the bonus point has been for Town this season. We are all aware that today is arguably the most important game for Town in recent seasons. If results go our way and we defeat Oldham, we could finish runners-up and claim a home draw in the play-offs, giving us a chance to make the Grand Final at the first attempt.

The club is buzzing at the minute, due to the end of season form which has seen us record six straight victories, defeating our nearest rivals along the way. However, a note of caution, our closet victory was against Oldham, where we eventually won a very tight game by 24-22. Winning breeds confidence, and we should go into today's game in the highest spirits, with several players returning from long term injuries, we appear to be hitting form at the right time.

Oldham new boy David Cookson may make his senior Roughyeds debut at Workington on Sunday. The 22-year-old former Oldham St Anne's and Great Britain under-23s amateur international, who signed pro forms last week after a string of impressive performances in the reserves, trained with the first team last night and was then told to keep Sunday free. A native of Rochdale, Cookson plays equally well at centre or second-row and has built a reputation in John Hough's high-flying reserve.



Rugby club chiefs have been in talks with council leader Jim McMahon in a bid to seal their future at Whitebank Stadium. Now a deal has been struck with Oldham Council after a series of complex negotiations with landowners. The news comes after Roughyeds chairman Chris Hamilton revealed in the Chronicle this week how rumours of another potential groundshare with Oldham Athletic were way off the mark. It follows years of uncertainty for the Co-operative Championship One play-off chasers, who moved to Limeside in May, last year.

Rumours have been rife in the town, that the Roughyeds could be moving back to Boundary Park, but these rumours are way off the mark. Oldham Council have now acquired the Freehold interest in 4.85 acres of land owned by Molson Coors Brewery Company (UK) Limited and sealed an agreement to lease the adjacent 2.28 acres of land owned by Enville Estate. Council leader Jim McMahon

said: "This deal not only gives the Roughyeds security of tenure — and ensures they stay within the borough — but also enables them to look ahead with renewed optimism. "It was vital for us to be able to find a solution to what has been a long-running problem that has held back this club's development for around 14 years."

Fans will breathe a sigh of relief that the club has a permanent home, something it has not lay claim to since the demise of Watersheddings in the 1990s. A long-term lease agreement will now be signed by the council and club in the coming days. This will mean the club can now seek out grants to enable the development of the stadium in the future. Roughyeds chairman Chris Hamilton said: "The problems the club has endured have been documented on many occasions, so to have secured the long-term future of the club in the town is an achievement of which I am personally very proud.

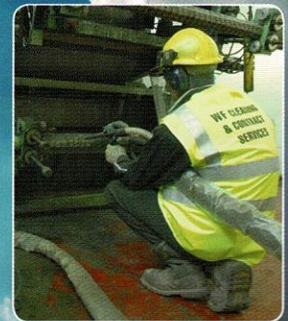

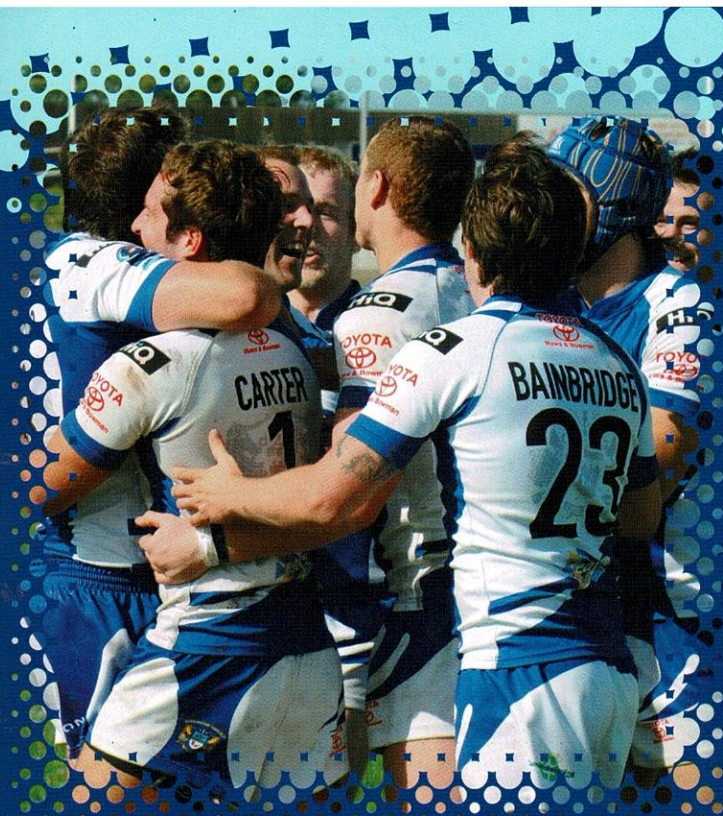

Rugby News

The RFL can confirm that Toulouse Olympique will not play in the Co-operative Championship and are to return to the French domestic competition in 2012.

The decision was reached following full consultation between the RFL, the French Federation and Toulouse, who will continue to face regular competition against British opposition in both the Carnegie Challenge Cup and Northern Rail Cup.

Toulouse have been guaranteed a place in the Northern Rail Cup for 2012 and automatic entry into the Challenge Cup for the next three seasons.

The absence of Toulouse, allied to Widnes Vikings' success in securing a three-year Super League licence from the 2012 season, means that the Co-operative Championships are expected to comprise two 10-team competitions next year.

The RFL is currently in the process of finalising the structure of the Championships for 2012 and is awaiting an application to participate in the Championship from Crusaders.

Should Crusaders be accepted into the Championship as the displaced Super League club, two clubs will be relegated from the Championship – the clubs which finish ninth and tenth – and two clubs, Championship One champions Swinton Lions and the Play-off Final winners, will be promoted.

Should Crusaders not be accepted into the Championship, one club – the club which finishes 10th in the 2011 Championship – will be relegated and two clubs, Swinton Lions and the Championship One Play-off Final winners, will be promoted.

In the absence of a second Welsh club, Championship One will run as a nine-team competition in 2012.

Promotion into the Co-operative Championship will be dependent on clubs meeting minimum standards for that competition.

Crusaders have been given until 5.00pm on Friday September 2 to submit their application to join the Co-operative Championship in 2012 to enable the RFL Board of Directors to finalise the competition structure prior to the commencement of the play-offs next week.
