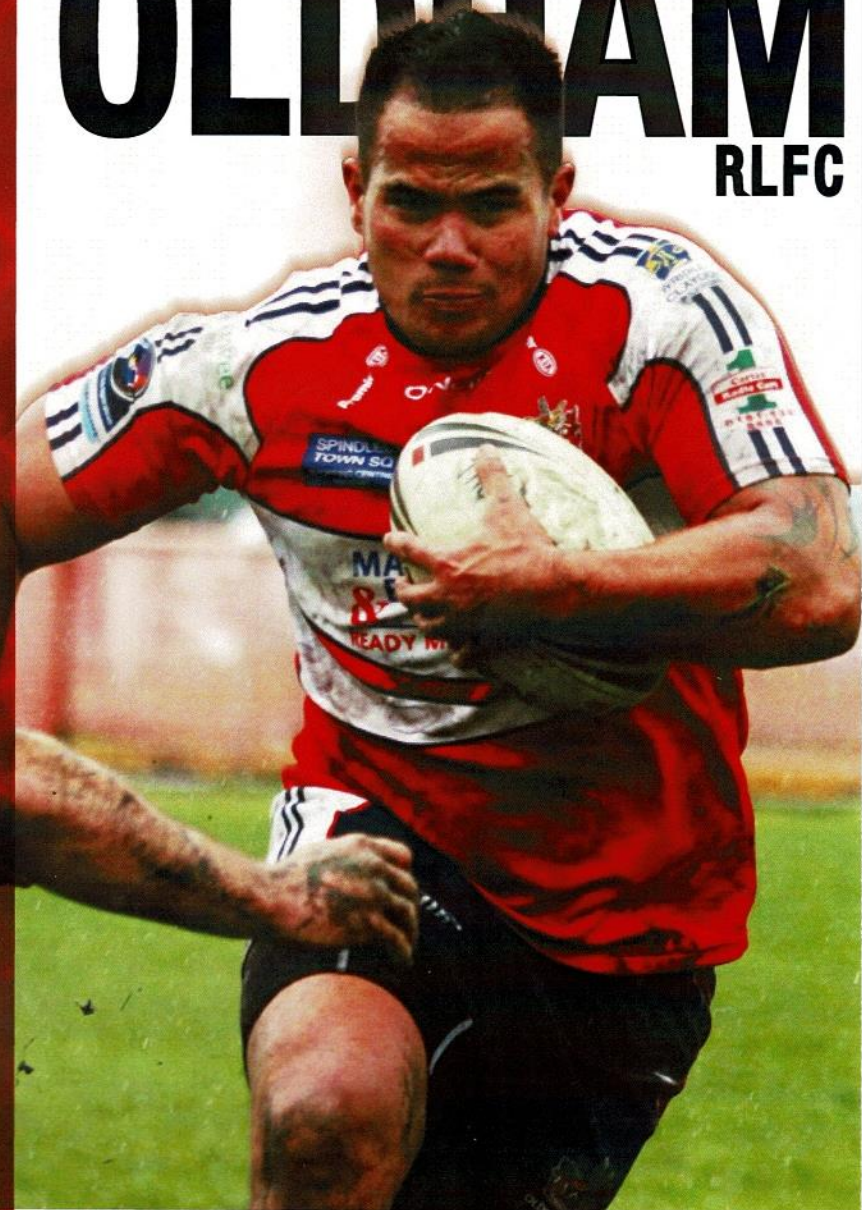

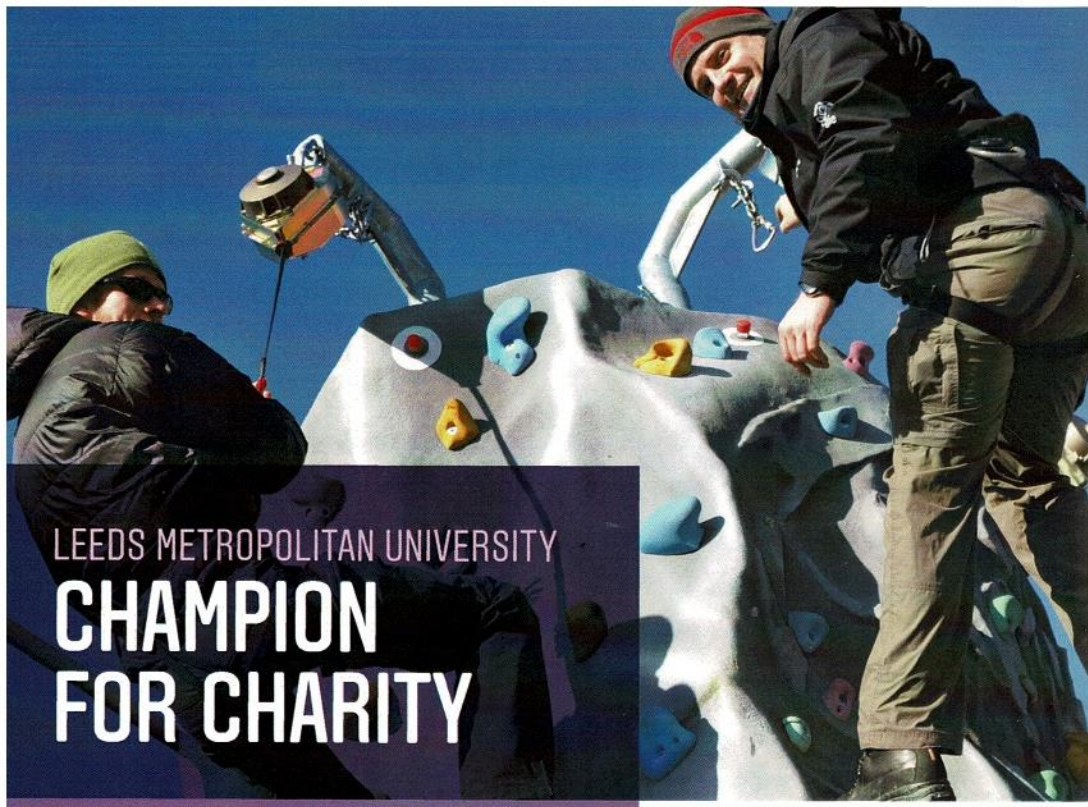

supplier Azzurri and new kit sponsors Elite Print Solutions, County Car and Van Hire and long time sponsors H. Mullaney and Sons Ltd.

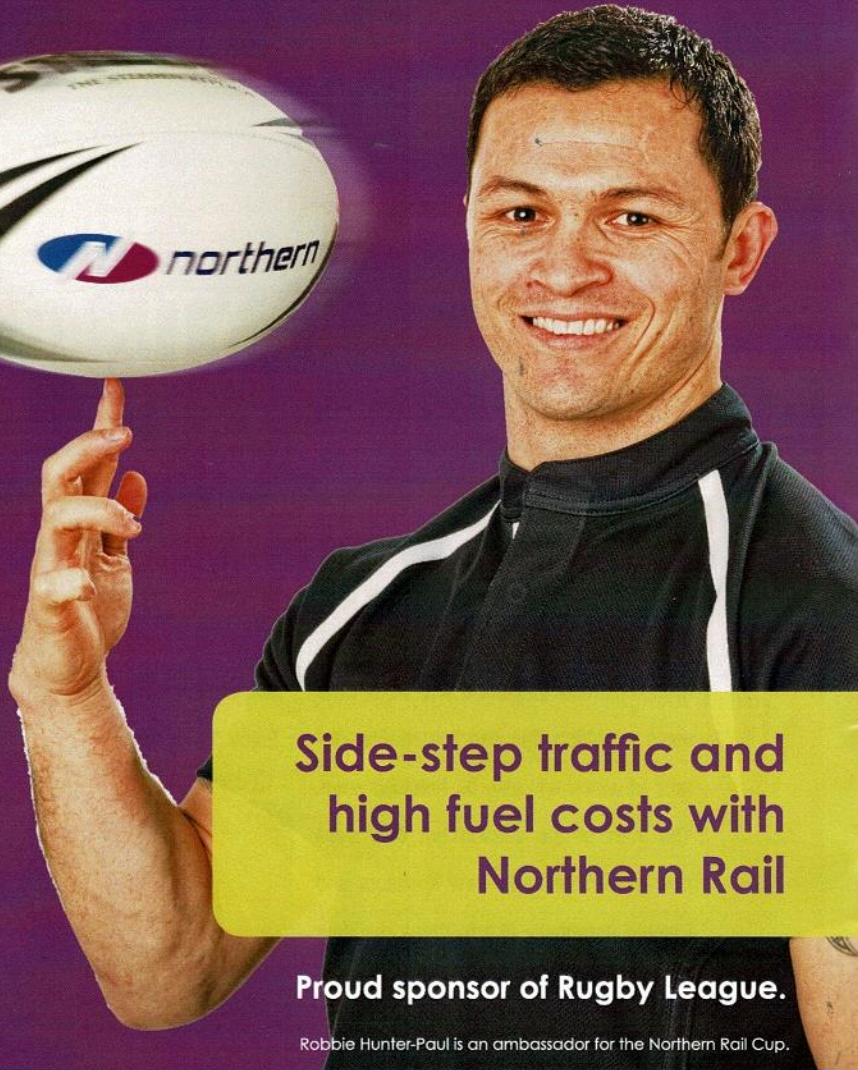
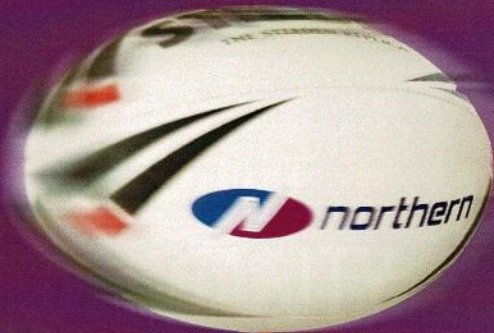

Many see the signing of vastly experienced back row forward Paul Smith as pivotal for this very important season for the Roughyeds. At 34 he has a wealth of experience and knowledge which could be vital to bring on the very talented young players in the squad this season.

Roughyed's chairman, Chris Hamilton said on signing him, "At 34 he is still very fit with great enthusiasm for the game. He's got a football brain and good ball skills, but in addition to his own skills he will be a mentor for some of the less experienced players."

Paul started his rugby league career as an exciting young forward at Swinton, and then moved to Rochdale Hornets. It was there that his great potential was recognised by Huddersfield Giants who took him into Super League in 2004.

He made 69 Super league appearances for the Giants between 2004 and 2006, the highlight being the 2006 Challenge Cup Final at Twickenham against St Helens which Huddersfield lost 42-12.

He then spent four years at Halifax before returning to his first club, Swinton as Player Coach in 2010. "That didn't work out for me," said Paul. "It was difficult to combine playing and coaching and it made me realise I wanted to continue in a playing role for as long as possible and then take up coaching when my body finally tells me it's time to stop."

He left Swinton before the end of the season and had a brief spell at Leigh before rejoining Halifax where he thoroughly enjoyed his rugby last season.

Paul seems to have settled in nicely at Oldham where he has captained the side in the two friendlies against Whitehaven and St Helens. "It's a very friendly almost family like run club," said Smith, "And I've been very impressed with the performances and commitment of the young players. Their performances in the two friendlies have belied their tender years and lack of experience, especially in the hard conditions both these games were played in. With the right guidance these lads have a great future in the game. I will do everything I can to help them develop further, but my priority at the moment has to be to get my own level of performance right before I think of anything else." "We haven't set ourselves any goals yet, but it's pretty obvious that promotion to the Championship will be number one on the list and with the fine blend of youth and experience we have in the squad this is a very achievable goal. Let's hope we're not hit with the high number of injuries the club had last year and we can fulfil the real potential that this squad of players has," he added.

Born in Hull, Smith studied for a maths degree at Salford University and has lived in this area ever since. He now lives in Bolton and teaches maths and PE at a Salford school.

BRUCE JOHNSON

Bruce has still to make his senior Oldham debut after coming to the club last June with great expectations only to severely damage a finger while playing for the trophy-winning under-23s.

So in that respect, he is another new addition to coach Tony Benson's first-team squad.

"I was plagued with injury last year, but with more luck this time around I want to impress Roughyeds supporters and show them what I can do at first-team level." Big, strong and aggressive, Johnson knows his way around Championship One rugby, having been a front-line prop at Swinton for five seasons before coming to Oldham.

He signed for St Helens as a boy, spent four years at Knowsley Road, and then had a season at Widnes before signing for the Lions, for whom he played more than 100 senior games.

Coach, Benson said "He was desperately unlucky to be injured just before he was due to step up to the first team at Gateshead at the end of June. I'm very pleased to have him on board again. Hopefully, he will have better luck in 2012 than he had in 2011. He has a big-volume game in which he gets through loads of tackling. On attack, he'll take the ball up all day and get in a good, quick play-the-ball.

NEIL RIGBY

Neil has signed for Roughyeds in order to challenge himself in new surroundings. After five years at St Helens and four at Swinton Lions, the 25-year-old second-row forward turned down an opportunity to go up with Swinton next year and play in the Co-operative Championship.

"I was in their plans," he said, "but I was desperate for a change of scenery. I was in a comfortable zone --- comfortable in my surroundings and



breezing along. Moving to Oldham, new club, new coach, new team mates, will give me the kick up the backside I need." Rigby, reared on rugby in his home town of St Helens, signed for Saints from amateurs Blackbrook when he was 16 and in the next few years passed through the Knowsley Road academy system alongside Gareth Langley and Craig Littler, who were later to join the Roughyeds.

He was named Lions' man-of-steel in his first year at Swinton and in the following season both supporters and fellow players voted him their player of the year.

A family man with two small children, Rigby works full time in St Helens with young people who have been excluded from school -- a similar job to that done by his new Roughyeds team mate, John Clough. Oldham team boss Benson said, "He's tailor-made for the way we play, he's strong, pacy, good in defence, has a good pass and runs good lines. He will be a big addition to the squad."

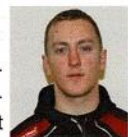
CHRIS MURPHY

Chris is a 22 year old full back.

North Wales, Rochdale Hornets and newly-promoted Swinton Lions were also interested at looking at the former Warrington Wolves youngster, who spent five years with the Super League club after signing scholarship forms when he was 16. On leaving the Wolves, he opted to sign a full-time contract with French club Carcassonne, but things didn't work out for him as expected. He was back in England within three months, signing for Leigh

Centurions but breaking an ankle in his first game. Murphy worked his way up through the academy and reserve teams at Warrington and also played in a couple of first-team friendlies.

He added: "I loved it there. I owe a lot to the Wolves coaches for the work they did with me during my five years at the club. I didn't want to leave, but I had to move on in order to advance my career." France was okay, but it was very different

to what I had expected. I knew there would be differences in language and culture, and things like that, but the style of rugby was also different to anything I had been used to previously. I'm looking forward to playing again after being out for such a long time and hopefully doing enough to stake a claim for the full-back's job. I've played a bit on the wing, but full-back is my real position and the one I most enjoy playing."

MILES GREENWOOD

THREE weeks after the launch of a fans' fund to buy new players, Oldham RL Club used it to pull off a coup and bring Oldham-born Miles Greenwood, one of the best and most experienced full-backs outside Super League to the Roughyeds on a season-long contract after spending the last four years with Championship side Halifax.

A cousin of former St Helens and England star Kyle Eastmond, he played for St Anne's as a boy and, like his cousin, signed for Saints when he was 15. During his time at Knowsley Road, he had a spell on loan at Widnes, followed by a year at Leigh and then four seasons at Halifax. Despite missing most of 2010 with a knee injury, 24-year-old Greenwood scored 38 tries in 79 games for Halifax, for whom he was voted players' player of the year in 2011.

"I regard the opportunity to play for my home town as a major honour, said Miles. It's a first for me, but I've got a buzz about it already. I want to do my town proud and help my town team to progress."

Coach Benson lauded Greenwood a "class act". "He's unpredictable, he'll pop up anywhere and he has loads of skill. Furthermore, he's passionate about playing for his home town team and he has settled so well into the group that he appears to have been here for a long time. That's always a good sign."

TOM RIGBY and JACK REID

Both Tom and Jack joined the Roughyeds from Widnes Vikings, initially with the intention of

playing in Paul Ashton's Reserves. But utility back, Rigby and stand off/hooker Reid impressed coach Paul Ashton so much that he recommended that they both train with the first team squad and they immediately caught the eye of head coach Tony Benson

They were both regular members of the Viking's under-23s side which finished top of the Reserves Championship last season and lost to Oldham 29 - 24 in the play off final. Rigby, a close friend of Oldham's young forward Alex Thompson, played on the left wing for Widnes in that final, while Reid turned out at loose-forward.

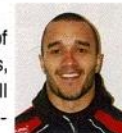
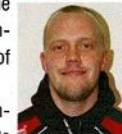
"They are both good players," said Ashton. "We learned a lot about the Widnes lads while playing them four times last season and these two were always going to be on our 'wanted' list if they ever became available, which they did when Widnes got into Super League."

PAUL BALLARD

The club completed the signing of 27 year old Paul Ballard at the end of January. The flyer, who played under coach Tony Benson at Leigh, arrived on a deal to the 30th of November, after fully recovering from a knee operation following an injury at his last club, Blackpool. He can play on the wing, at full back and at centre and is a player Benson has targeted because of his extensive experience both in the Championship and Super League.

Ballard moved to Widnes following his spell at Leigh and then onto the now defunct Celtic Crusaders playing in all three professional divisions with that club following their rise through the professional ranks.

After a successful spell playing Super League with the South Wales club and their subsequent demise he played for Blackpool in the 2010 season where he suffered the injury which saw

him make the decision to not play at all in 2011 in order to get himself back to full fitness ready for this year.

Ballard is known for his pace and try scoring ability and is sure to be a strike player for the club who are delighted to confirm his capture despite competition from other clubs including Barrow where his brother, and former Oldham player Andy, is still playing.

DANNY HEATON

FORMER Widnes, Halifax and Swinton prop Danny Heaton decided to kick start his career with Oldham, in September of last year.

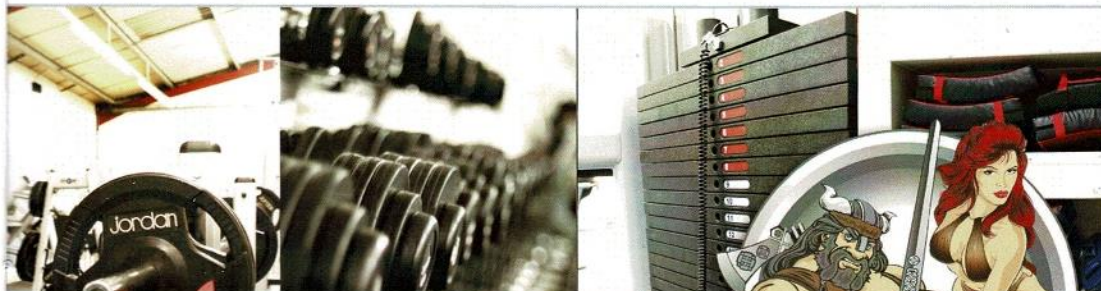


"I'm 30", said Danny. "And as props peak somewhere between the ages of 27 to 33, I should now be at my strongest and most knowledgeable."

Heaton, an electrician by trade, who has signed a one-year contract, was the first of Tony Benson's 2012 newcomers — an experienced heavyweight

who will be expected to provide the pack with an old head and to beef-up the front-row. Warrington-born, he began his rugby career with the Wolves where he spent two years in the reserves. He then had two seasons at Swinton, one at Widnes and two at Halifax before he went back to Swinton for the 2009 and 2010 campaigns.

At the end of the 2010 season he decided to have a break. "I wasn't enjoying my rugby any more. I had lost the appetite for it. Tony (Benson) rang me about joining Oldham back then, but I wasn't ready to sign for another pro club. I enjoyed the break, but then I had a game for Warrington amateurs Woolston, my old club, and got the itch back again. Now, I can't wait to get cracking. Knocks and nig-gling injuries are long gone."
