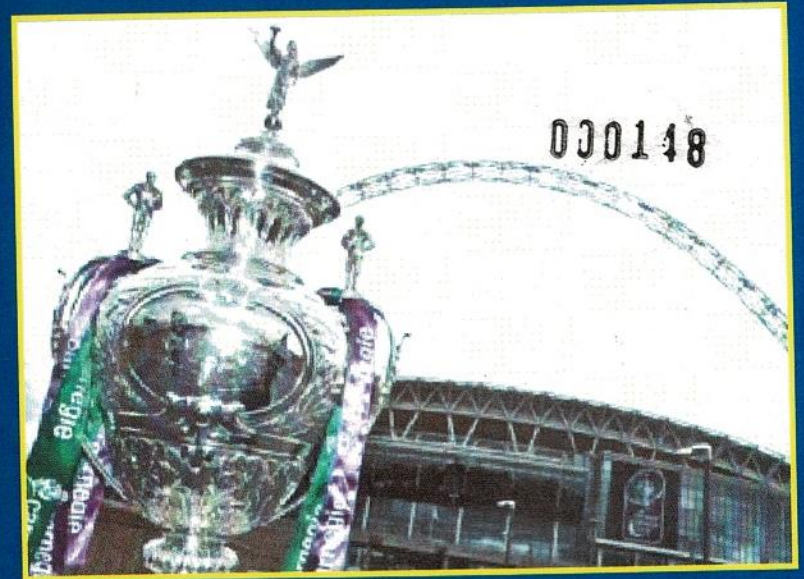

Chairman's Chat

Welcome to the Recreation Ground, Whitehaven for our Carnegie Challenge Cup third round draw against Oldham. A special warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters who have travelled the long journey from Oldham.

I would firstly like to thank Whitehaven RLFC for loaning us their facilities today. Barry Richardson and his team have been very supportive and their help is very much appreciated.

I would also like to say a big thank you to Oldham officials and players for their support in agreeing to come to Whitehaven tonight. Chris Hamilton and his team have been very obliging and I hope we can respond with a good crowd to mark the occasion.

There is always an excitement when amateur plays professionals. The talk is whether the amateurs can cause an upset, what if scenarios surround the stadium. What if Oldham play poorly and drop the ball and Egremont play to their top form. What if the scores are tight with a just few minutes to go? Well who knows but 'keep believing' as you never know.

Today's game against professionals will be a massive challenge for our young guns, but I feel sure the lads will try their best. The last time Oldham were in the county, two weeks ago, they took the spoils from Workington, turning out winners 14-24. That day the two half backs played well for Oldham but Workington gifted the Oldham side the ball on too many occasions. We must learn from this.

Oldham to date have played 2 and won 2 in the league and lie top of the Championship 1.

Our recent form shows we are doing well in the amateur ranks and we remain unbeaten for the season to date, taking on Castleford and Eccles in the League whilst dispatching Bank Quay Bulls, Leeds Met and Ince Rose Bridge in the Carnegie Challenge cup; amassing 134 points along the way.

We have played some classy football and last week with just 3 mins and 40 seconds remaining, we were 8 points behind, yet we won! What a finish and it just shows, as the saying goes, its 'not over until the fat lady sings'.

Egremont Rangers Challenge Cup History

A Friday evening Challenge Cup fixture for Egremont Rangers against professional opposition – and, in Oldham, one of the traditionally great names of the game at that – will bring back memories of one of the clubs finest hours. It was 14 years ago that Rangers faced Workington Town here at the Recreation Ground and achieved their famous 18-0 victory. With over 3,000 spectators roaring them home, Egremont sneaked ahead in the first half when a young Robert Purdham wriggled across to score at a packed Kells end, before Mark Beckwith and Geoff Blacklock added further tries in the second half.

That was Egremont's fourth dalliance with the business end of the Cup, the stage at which the professional teams enter the fray, and they went on to face the side which would ultimately win the trophy that year, Sheffield. The clubs Challenge Cup pedigree, however, dates back to the earliest days of its history, and the very early days of the 20th Century. In 1906, just six years after its formation, Egremont travelled to Lawkholme Lane to face Keighley, and three years later battled their way through the qualifying rounds before travelling to play Runcorn. Not surprisingly, both games ended in defeat, but these were formative experiences for the club and helped establish it as a recognisable name and major player within the amateur sphere the sport.

If you subscribe to the view that we're all products of our life's experiences, then those early Challenge Cup matches were defining moments in the shaping of Egremont as a Rugby League town and of the club as we've come to know it. The efforts of those early pioneers blazed a trail from which it's possible to draw a discernible line to the present day. And as we welcome Oldham to West Cumbria this evening, it may be of interest to the visitors to know that Egremonts captain and star player of the time was their forward Jim Kelly. A regular selection in the Cumberland county sides of the time, he had actually sampled the professional game with the then-Watersheddings club – and had been a Championship winner to boot – before returning home.

There have been some fabulous Egremont Rangers teams down the years yet, perhaps surprisingly, many of the very best missed out on the opportunity to pit their wits against professional opposition in the Challenge Cup. The great teams of the 1950's "Golden Era" got no closer than a final qualifying round defeat at Wakefield Loco' in 1957, and some splendid teams from the early 1970's, say, as well as those from the 1980's, were similarly left wondering what might have been.

Although Egremonts Challenge Cup history is a long one, there have been some major gaps in it! Remarkably, in 1995 Rangers ended a drought of almost 90 years when they qualified to play Leigh at Hilton Park. It was wonderful effort to progress as far as they did in an otherwise nondescript season, and is best remembered for the heroic performance of a seriously weakened team in drawing at Woolston, arguably the top amateur side of the day, before defeating them in a replay at Gillfoot Park to qualify for the trip to Leigh.

Similarly, there was a trip to play a rejuvenated York side in 1999 before, last year, a cruel draw sent them on a long journey south to play the London Skolars. The bright lights and big city was no place for the feint hearted although a new look young team performed admirably and that experience will put them in good stead for today's professional challenge.

And that brings us to tonight and the visit of Oldham. It's been a long time since Jim Kelly and his pals packed their boots and boarded the train to Keighley, and yet their feelings – a little apprehension no doubt, excitement definitely – would have been identical to those of the young Egremont players who trot onto the pitch this evening. It hasn't always been an easy ride in the years since, but the lesson is simple for all clubs...possibly even in all sports – try to smile and maintain your dignity though the hard times, but *always* stay loyal to your core beliefs. The rewards will generally be forthcoming.

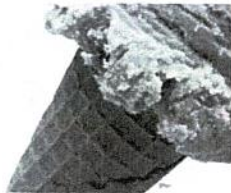

A very warm welcome to the Recreation Ground Whitehaven for our 3rd round Challenge Cup tie against Oldham Roughyeds.

Can I say on behalf of all involved with Egremont 'a big thank you' to our Professional neighbours Whitehaven for the loan of the ground and their excellent facilities. It is greatly appreciated.

I would also like to say a big thank you to tonight's opponents Oldham for agreeing to play this game under lights on a Friday evening. We know this has made it difficult for your fans and your players, having to take time off work and re-arranging their weekend plans. So a big thank you from all at the Mont for your efforts.

Talking of Oldham, we as a county have many connections with the Club. Oldham have broken the World Record transfer fee on two occasions for Cumbrians, Jim Lomas in 1910 for the princely sum of £300 and in 1959 a price of £10.065 for former Haven and Town player and Coach Ike Southward, they also paid £9000, which at the time was a record price, for a forward when they took Geoff Robinson from Whitehaven. Recent Cumbrians to represent Oldham are the likes of Paul Davidson, Chris McKinney and Haven stalwart Howard Hill. Just for note Oldham have won the Challenge Cup on 3 occasions the last being the 1926-27 season.

We also have an Egremont connection as our former coach and player Hugh Waddell represented Oldham 54 times scoring 7 tries, He also gained 5 Great Britain caps as a Roughyed.

Our Players go into tonight's game full of confidence and well prepared for battle, we might be the Amateurs but write us off at your peril. Not that long ago tonight's Mont coaches JMB and Rob Purdham orchestrated Workington Towns downfall at this very ground. What Egremont lack for in size we more than make up in stature as last weeks last minute win showed. Whatever happens this evening I am certain we will all be proud of the lads.

Lets hope for a good fair hard game and a Mont victory.

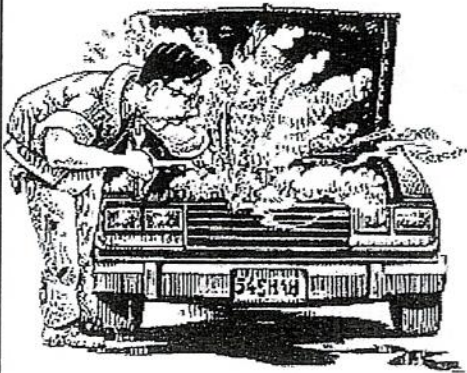

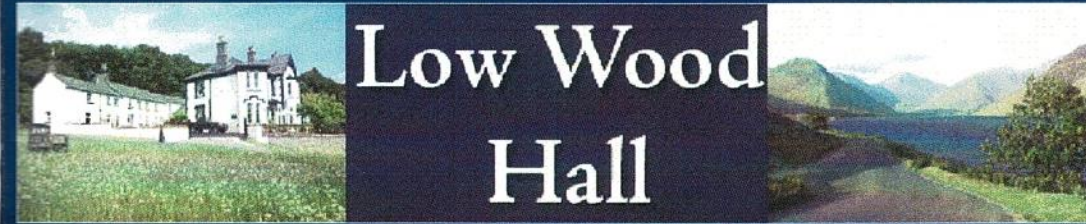
