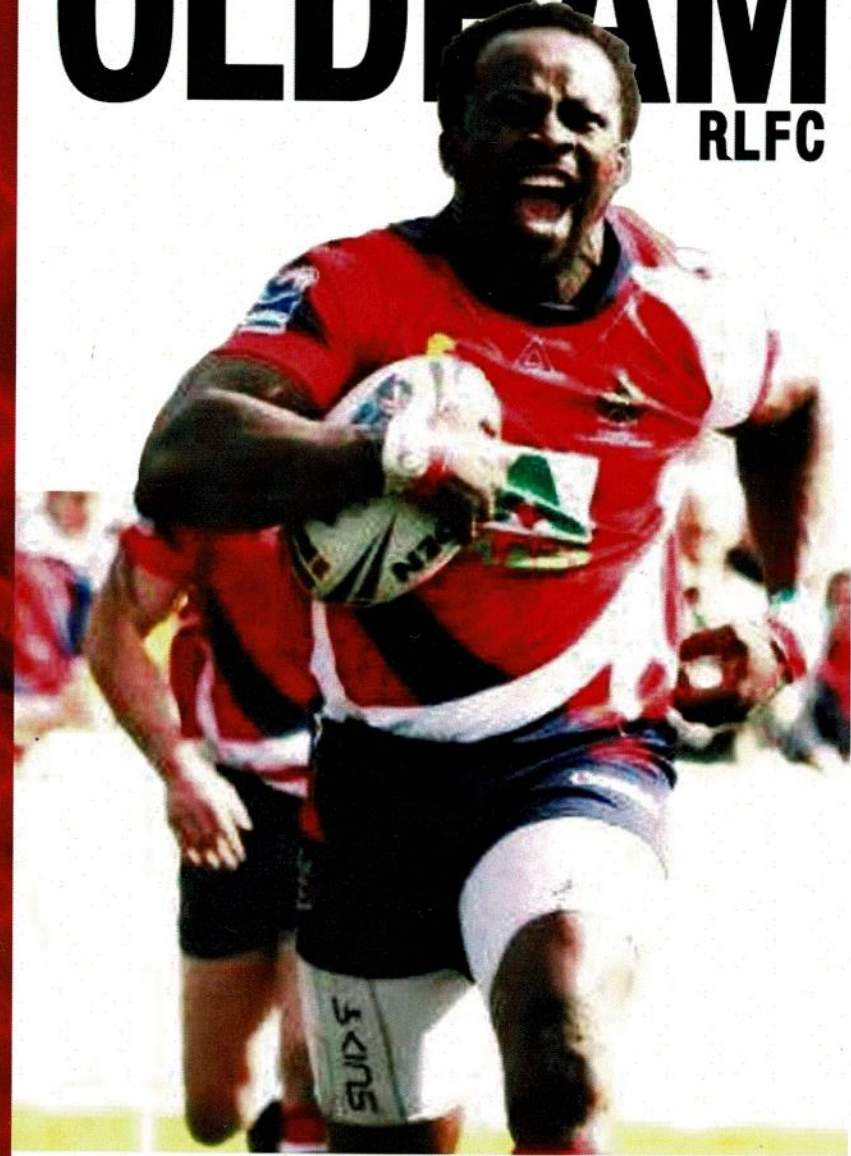

Back to today and the magic of the Carnegie Challenge Cup comes to Whitebank with all to play for.

Please keep up the great support we have had all season to date and make as much noise as you can to encourage the lads as they strive to give us all the win we want.

TON-UP LUCAS CELEBRATES WITH DERBY-DAY TRY



LUCAS Onyango, our popular winger made his 100th senior appearance in the Good Friday derby clash at Rochdale, leading the team out at Spotland and celebrating with a try in the 12th minute.

"Wow, I didn't know I had played so many games," said the Roughyeds' Kenyan winger when told before the game that he was poised to reach the career milestone. Lucas, who made his debut part way into the 2007 season, had another reason to celebrate this week: he was 31 last Thursday.

Of the current squad, only Neil Roden and Jason Boults were at the club when Onyango arrived from Widnes Vikings five years ago to form a new left-wing partnership with Adam Hughes. In the new Oldham club's 15-year history only 12 other players have joined the '100 Club' ---- Roden (279), John Hough (228), Jason Clegg (147), Gareth Barber (138), Boults (138), Gavin Dodd (132), Phil Farrell (124), Lee Doran (112), Jon Goddard (110), Paul O'Connor (108), Danny Guest (104) and Joe McNicholas (102).

Lucas reached his ton despite missing most of last season with a ruptured Achilles tendon, which required surgery and kept him out of the game for ten months. He said: "The time has flown by since I first came here. It's crazy. "Lots of players have come and gone in that time,

but I'm happy to soldier on here while the boss still wants me.

"I've always felt at home at Oldham --- and to get that interception try against Barrow two weeks ago (see front cover) after being sidelined for so long was magical.

"It was a shock to the system to look up and see I had half the length of the pitch to run, but neither my legs nor my lungs let me down. I felt great."

It was the Kenyan's 70th Oldham try in 99 appearances, so his overall record now stands at 71 tries in 100 appearances ---- an impressive return by any standards.

His best seasons were 2007 (18 tries in 23 games) and 2010 (19 tries in 28 games).

What he has lost in pace and athleticism over the last five years he has made up for in strength and experience.

"The game has become tighter," he said. "I don't get many opportunities these days to run like the wind, but I'm much stronger now and purpose-built for helping out with the heavy work.

"I mix it in the middle with the props when I'm running the ball out. A year or two back they would flatten me and wipe me out, but not now. I can hold my own.

"The other boys reckon my age is a con; that I'm Oldham's answer to Stanley Gene, and that really I'm 40 something.

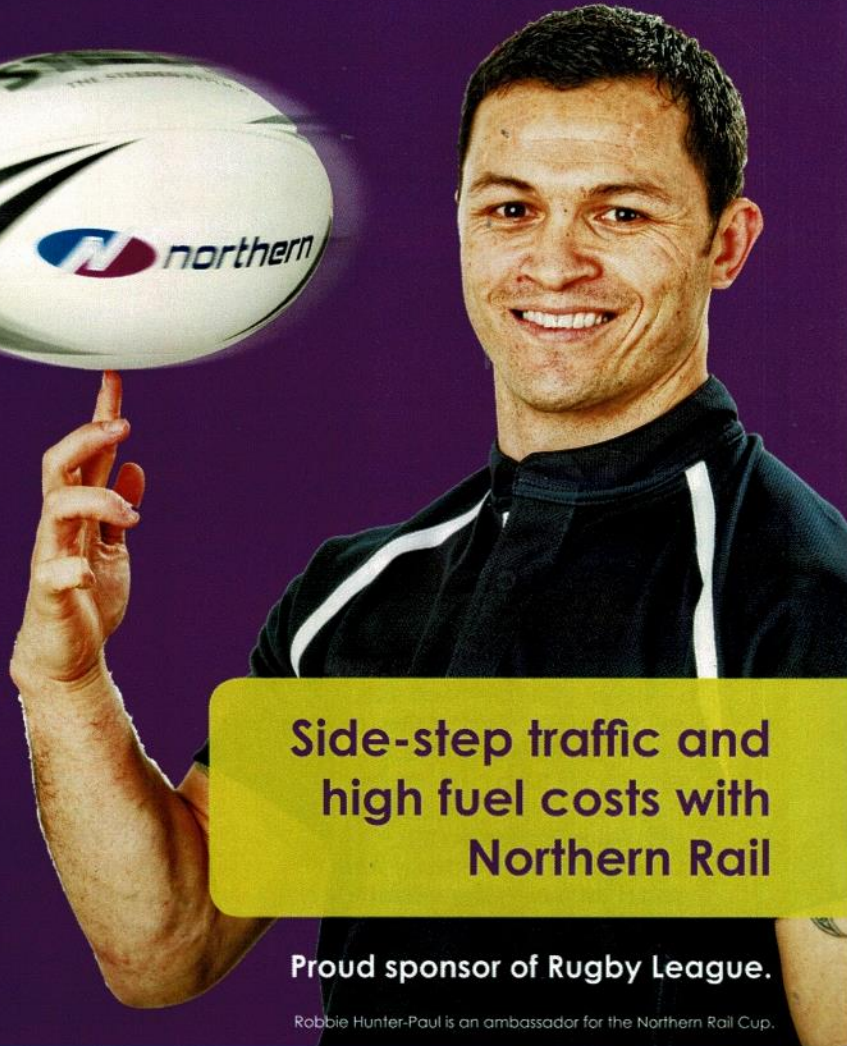
"I tell them: 'Old is gold'.

"As soon as I get the nod from the physio I'll start doing sprint training again.

"I need to, because if I just do weights I'll get so strong that Tony (coach Tony Benson) will want to start me at prop!"

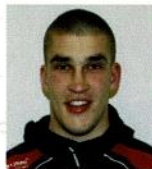

WITH THE RESERVES by Paul Ashton

WINGER Shaun Robinson's impressive hat-trick of tries was the highlight of the Roughyeds' Reserve team's 30-16 win over a spirited York City Knights outfit at Whitebank last Thursday night, April 5.

Playing his second game in the second team after a three-week lay-off with a hip injury, Robbo blitzed the Knights' defence regularly by touchline-hugging runs over distance, setting up the opening try for full-back Mark Brocklehurst and then scoring himself in the 23rd, 55th and 70th minutes.

With a performance like that he must have caught the eye of head coach Tony Benson, who had dashed to Whitebank to run the rule over the reserves after supervising first-team training at an out-of-town venue.

Other tries were scored by Danny Langtree and Matthew Fogarty, Robinson's centre on the left flank, while Jack Reid landed two conversions and Mark Smith one. Smith, playing at stand-off, took over goalkicking duties when hooker Reid was sin-binned early in the second half together with York's big prop Adam Howard. Howard was shown the yellow card for a grapple tackle and Reid for what the referee later described as a man-to-man confrontation. Not long afterwards York were further punished when half-back Tyler Craig

was also given ten minutes for dissent. Roughyeds again conceded ten penalties --- six of them in the first-half ---- but coach Paul Ashton was nevertheless a much happier man than he had been at Featherstone the week before when his reserves suffered a heavy defeat.

" We were down to just two subs after injuries to Valu and Foggy", Paul added. "This meant a lot of people had to dig in hard until the end with the forwards having to give massive efforts. Phil Joy, Danny Langtree and Mark Smith were exceptional but penalties and ball security played a big part in the loss.

The York game was a huge improvement, and it shows what can be achieved when we respect possession, complete sets and build pressure. If our execution had been better and we had taken all our chances we would have scored a few more tries."

TALK WITH TONY FORD Sports Chaplain

In the light of Fabrice Muamba's collapse during an FA cup semi-final and the fervent prayers for his recovery, Tony Ford talks to us about his role as sports chaplain for Oldham Rugby League Club.

Best of both worlds – that's how I describe my role as vicar of St Mary, Balderstone and chaplain of Oldham Rugby League Club.

It doesn't get better than being paid to tell people about Jesus and to extend that pastoral love and support of the church to the rugby team I've supported since a lad.

But is there a place for the church of Christ in modern sport? Well the world of sport certainly thinks so. Just within the Manchester area we have chaplains from across the denominations in football clubs at Bolton, Bury, Manchester United & City, Oldham and Stockport County. There are also chaplains in the rough and tough sports of rugby league and union at Oldham Roughyeds, Salford City Reds and Sale Sharks, as well as at Lancashire County Cricket Club. And I am sure there are others not known to me.

On 17 March the whole nation held its breath as Fabrice Muamba collapsed and medics rushed to his aid, working on his heart for over an hour before it began to beat for itself. Even the Sun newspaper had the headline 'God is in control'.

Phil Mason is a fellow sports chaplain at Bolton Wanderers who was right there in the middle of the Fabrice Muamba news story. I asked him about his work at Bolton.

Within Bolton Wanderers there are three words written in the wall just outside the home changing area as the players leave for going out onto the pitch. These are Faith, Family and Football. Three key words that have always been important in the life of our club but never more so that in the last 10 days. As club chaplain I recognise that for many the football stadium is like a cathedral, and so at times

of concern and crisis becomes a focus for prayer and support. This focus has been at its height since the collapse of Fabrice and we have seen prayer at the top of the agenda.

It has been important to give people opportunities for prayer in formal and informal ways including, players, staff, fans and even our Junior Whites members.

The offer of pastoral support is always a major part of the role, but at times of real concern this is heightened. People reflect on what has happened and issues about life and death surface within them. I believe that chaplaincy has a vital part to play within the life of the club, as it does in so many areas of life where people can explore the big questions.

Many clubs like ours grew out of a church and in many ways spirituality now plays a significant part in the life of the club. Each day I offer a Thought for the Day online, as well as an opportunity for people to submit their concerns or prayer requests. Pre-match prayers are offered with good attendance from the players.

So what does rugby league chaplaincy look like for me? On a weekly basis I attend training sessions and chat with the players, coaches and physios.

It is so easy for us to put these folks on a pedestal and forget they suffer all the life issues that we all do. We have had bereavements, broken marriages, drink and recreational drug misuse and serious health problems. Big hard rugby players grieve the loss of a loved one just like you and me.

Listening to players week by week gives me the opportunity to share with them what a difference having Jesus in my life has made for me as a geriatric ex footballer and rugby player.

Please continue to pray for Fabrice, his family and colleagues at Bolton Wanderers FC.

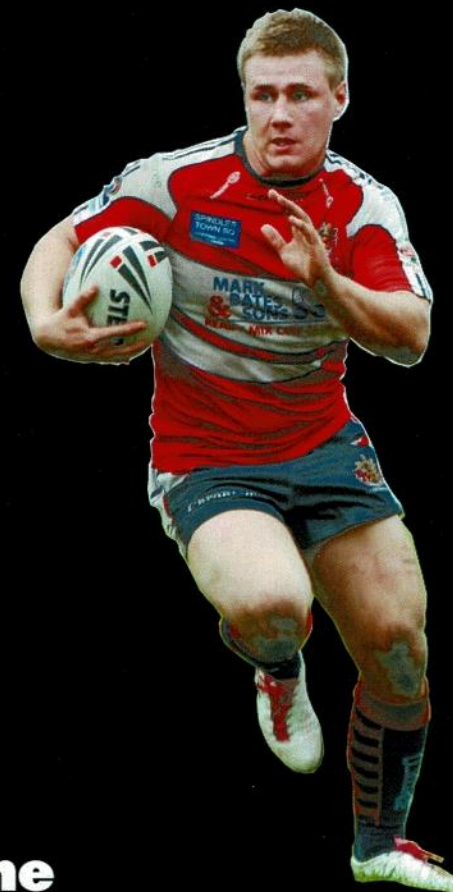

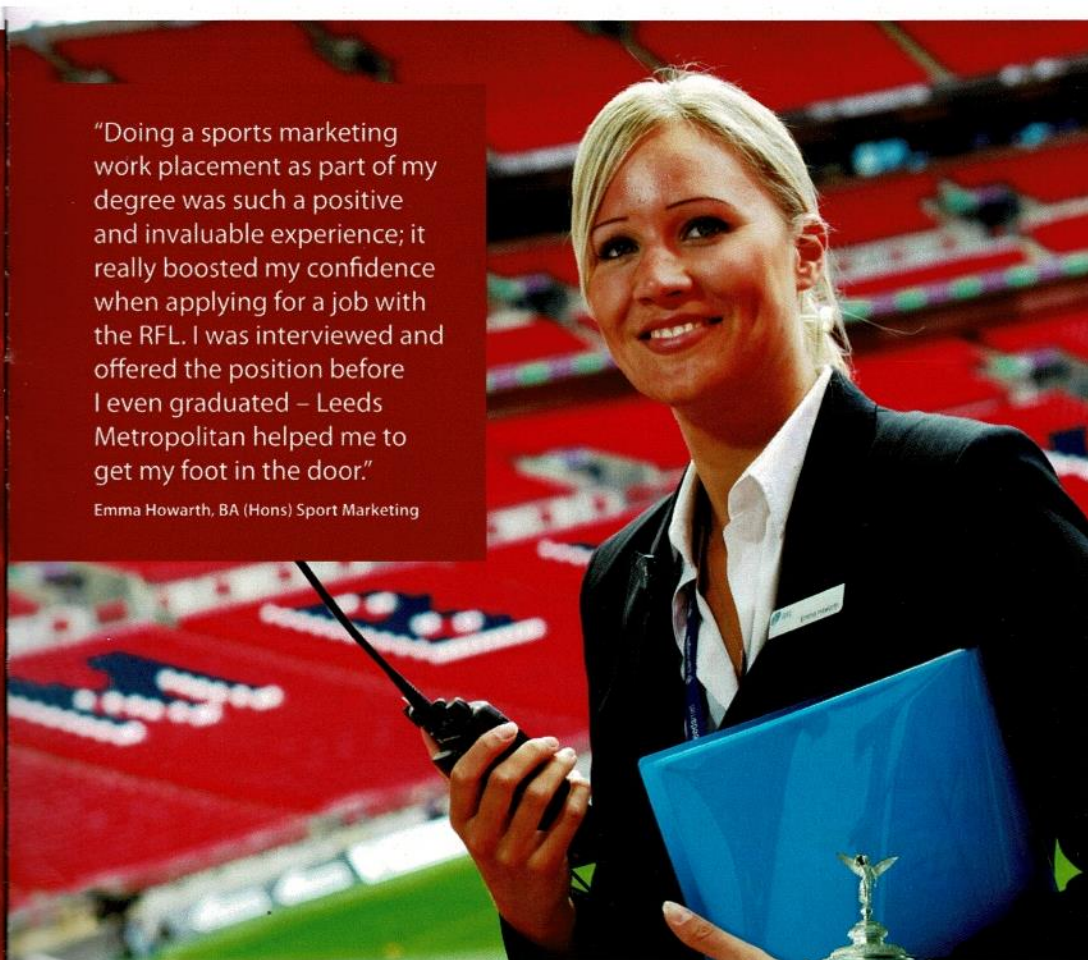
