



# You are always happy when you nil a side as it shows good attitude throughout the team.

But we also did a lot of good things offensively and I was pleased that Anthony Laffranchi bagged two tries – which is great for a front rower – and we looked powerful on the edges.

The things we have been practising on the training field came through too. It's good to know that the players are taking notice of those little things we are doing in training and bringing them to game day.

The players were disappointed with their performance in the Cup at the Stobart Stadium and wanted to put things right. They did that, and we must now continue to build momentum and continue the good work in the next few weeks.

Tonight we welcome Tony Benson and his Oldham side to Langtree Park. It is the magic of the cup for them and I'm sure they will be giving it everything they have.

Nothing is given in Rugby League and we need to make sure we put pressure on them and turn up in the right frame of mind and be prepared. Without that, like any other game, it could become a real dogfight.

to work and you can't do that by making wholesale changes. We have some big games coming up and need consistency in our performances.

Some players will get a rest in the week of the Exiles game but if you ask them, they want to play most weeks. It seems silly to stand them down when they want to play and we want competition for places in the squad.

The attitude over the last six weeks has been excellent and both myself and Keiron are impressed with how the squad has coped with the adversity. I have said enough times there are good senior players here that lead the group. They have a lot of pride too; they want to aim up every week and want to be in the big games at the end of the year.

It has been a difficult time for the younger players but they have adapted very well. We have thrown Josh Jones and Adam Swift into the mix and they have done brilliantly as did Carl Forster at the weekend.

Having youngsters in the squad that can step up is good for competition and puts pressure on the older players. We had some success in that last season.

Their job now is to keep their feet on the floor and stay grounded.

They need to stay away from big statements and rash comments and work hard.

# A DECADE AT THE TOP

But Ade Gardner has just joined that elite club and this year, as his festivities come to an end, he is focused on adding more years to his service at St Helens.

# LF: You're coming to the end of your Testimonial year, how much have you enjoyed all of the events?

AG: It's been brilliant, so fantastic. When I got injured last year I didn't really have too much to do, I had a big boot on my foot, you can't do too much with that so this has kept me really busy. It's been very overwhelming; I'm a lad from Barrow who has been here for ten years. To have the support I've had from people, a lot who I've never even met before, some have literally come to every single event. There was one lady who travelled up to Barrow after flying in from America that morning. But it's coming to an end now, it has been hard work but looking back now it has been worth it.

LF: Looking back ten years, did


# you ever see yourself being at the club for this long?


AG: I remember making a statement saying I didn't even know what a Testimonial was; I think it was Chris Joynt who explained it all to me. But I said to myself I can safely say I won't be getting a testimonial! Ten years on and I've got another year left on my contract so by that time it will be twelve years in a Saints shirt, a dream come true for a Barrow lad.

# LF: A major part of a Testimonial is having that interaction with your fans, how have you found spending time with them.

AG: Yeah definitely and that's the main thing really. You turn up and everyone is so friendly and all turn up for a good laugh. The lads take to it too, especially the likes of Louie McCarthy-Scarsbrook, his language is colourful to say the least, but you get really good value for money. It's also good for the fans to come and see the players in a nice relaxed atmosphere and you can ask those burning questions.







# ► LF: The support from the club and the players must be humbling as well?

AG: The lads have been fantastic, they try and dodge me when I ask them to sign shirts and balls but they've been more than accommodating. There have been times when some of them haven't been able to do it and at the drop of a hat I've been able to ring somebody else and the answer is yeah no worries I'll be there. Not only them, but the club, the people in the shop and upstairs, they couldn't do enough for you.

# LF: Can you pick out any highlights from your celebratory year?

AG: Highlight, erm there have been so many, the darts night a couple of weeks ago was really good. But I'll never forget Louie's cockney accent, he just swears all the time! Every step of the way has been great; the whole year has been a great laugh and so much fun.

# LF: What about a highlight of 10 years here at Saints?

AG: The first five minutes after winning my first Grand Final in 2006, we were the best team that year. Hull had a good side going into that game but we knew we were a good team. It was the biggest relief after we won that game, we knew we were the best; we just had to prove it and prove that we were the best Super League side that has ever been. I might be biased saying that but I do believe we were the best. It was such a special year; the team was filled with my best mates.

# LF: You've had a great start to the season, but are now injured what's the latest?

AG: It's not as bad as first thought. It was a pretty depressing 24 hours afterwards, but last year with my Achilles it was different because as soon as I did it I knew what I had done. I never had a knee injury in my life so it was a little bit scary and it thought it could be a six month cruciate layoff,

but thankfully it's just the medial. Luckily I'm a good healer so I'm pinpointing four weeks (from last weekend) to being fit. That's my goal so if it's after that so be it.

### LF: Do you have the ambition to stay and play on past your current contract?

AG: I want to play as long as I can as long as my form is good. You can always say I did twelve years at Saints but I don't want to look at it that way. I thought I was playing my best rugby at the start of last year until I got hurt and again this year. So I just want to continue with that, hopefully get another contract, I love the club, I love being here, why would you want to leave? I couldn't speak more highly of the boys, they've been incredible throughout my ten years here.



# **OLDHAM ROUGHYEDS**



OUR THOUGHTS TODAY RETURN TO THE CHALLENGE CUP COMPETITION AS OLDHAM ROUGHYEDS VISIT THE LANGTREE PARK FOR THIS EVENING'S FIFTH ROUND TIE.

It is incredible to think that it is almost 15 years since Oldham last visited St. Helens. That occasion was a Super League II match played at Knowsley Road on August 10 1997.

They were then known as the Oldham Bears and St. Helens won the match by 36 points to 26. Since then Saints have won two World Club Challenges, four Super League Grand Finals and five Challenge Cups. The contrast with Oldham's fortunes couldn't have been greater. The 'Bears' folded at the end of that 1997 campaign and were replaced a completely new club. The Oldham (Roughyeds) began their life in the third tier (Division 2) of English Rugby League and ended their first season in fifth position in that league. At the end of 1998 the two divisions merged into one league and the Roughyeds played in this competition until they were relegated in 2006. Oldham have remained in this league (now known as Championship One) since.

The Roughyeds have also led a nomadic existence. They have played their home matches at Boundary Park, Oldharm, Sedgley Park Rugby Union Club, Spotland, Rochdale and Hurst Cross, Ashton Under Lyne. They have also played at Staleybridge Celtic, Chorley and Bloomfield Road, Blackpool. They finally moved into their own ground, the Whitebank Stadium in Oldham in May 2010.

Head Coach, Tony Benson is now in this fourth season with the club having originally come to England to coach Leigh in 2006. He has led Oldham to two Grand Final appearances and whilst at Leigh, he ended his first season by leading the Centurions to a National League Cup final triumph against Hull KR. In between his coaching spells with the Centurions and the Roughyeds, Benson was Head Coach at London Skolars in 2008.

Oldham qualified for this evening's match by winning a potentially tricky Third Round Challenge Cup tie at the Recreation Ground in Whitehaven where they defeated Cumbrian Amateurs' Egremont Rangers by 22 points to 14. They then disposed of Barrow Raiders at the Whitebank Stadium 26-14. Oldham are currently lying in fourth position in Championship One having won three and drawn one of their five matches for a total of 12 points.

The Roughyeds more than

anvone will be glad that there a four promotion places available in Championship One this season. They have been banging on the Championship door since they dropped into National League 2 at the end of the 2006 campaign. Last year was a disappointing one for Oldham. They had an injury plagued season that saw them slip to seventh place in the Championship One table and they saw their run of four consecutive Championship One Grand Final appearances end in the play offs at Rochdale. At various times during the campaign Oldham suffered long term injuries to Chris Clarke, Lucas Onyango, Dave Ellison, John Gillam, Bruce Johnson and Mick Fogarty and the disruption these losses led to, decimated their campaign. They won eleven of their twenty Championship One matches for a total of 36 points.

During the off season, they prepared well and enjoyed promising pre season performances against Whitehaven and St. Helens Reserves. They have only made a few of minor changes to their squad as they hope that, should they stay relatively healthy, they have a squad that is good enough earn promotion to the Championship.

Joining the Roughyeds for 2012 are, Miles Greenwood & Paul Smith (both Halifax), Neil Rigby (Swinton Lions), Danny Heaton (unattached), Jamie Acton (Wigan Academy), Matty Syron (Leeds Rhinos – dual registration) and Graham Holroyd (Preston Grasshoppers RU).

Ben Heaton (Halifax), Andrew Isherwood & Marcus St. Hilare (both retired), Tom Wood Hulme (Rochdale Hornets), Ben Wood, Mick Diveney, Tom Woodcock, Jack Bradbury and Neil Rigby (each released) and Carl Forber (Workington Town) have left the club.

Oldham drew at Whitehaven 22 all in their first pre season run out. They then played host to a St. Helens Reserves Team that included, Ade Gardner, Josh Perry, Chris Flannery, Josh Jones, Adam Swift and Carl Forster. The Roughyeds beat Saints 28-18 with St. Helens' lad, John Clough (brother of Paul) scoring the game clinching try. Featherstone Rovers visited the Whitebank Stadium in the first round of Northern Rail Cup fixtures. Featherstone are one of the Championship's strongest teams and the hammered Oldham 68-0. The Roughyeds picked up what was to be their only Northern Rail Cup point the following week in a highly entertaining 36-36 draw at South Wales Scorpions. Oldham lost their final two Northern Rail Cup ties by 28-30, at home to Dewsbury Rams and 12-26 at Keighley Cougars.

The Roughyeds won their first two Championship One fixtures. The visited Workington Town and ran out 24-14 winners. Gateshead Thunder were Oldham' visitors seven days later and their

comprehensive 40 points to 14 triumph saw them sit proudly on top of their league. The Roughyeds then knocked Egremont Rangers out of the Challenge Cup before winning third successive Championship One match when they enjoyed a fine home victory over Barrow Raiders by 32 points to 26.

Oldham's only league defeat this season came at Spotland. Rochdale on Good Friday. Rochdale Hornets took the spoils in a bad tempered match by 18 points to 10. Two Oldham players were suspended by the Rugby League's Disciplinary Committee in the aftermath of this match. Danny Whitmore received a one match suspension whilst John Clough copped a two match ban and thus misses tonight's Cup tie. The Roughveds then knocked Barrow out of the Challenge Cup before drawing 20-20 at London Skolars, last Sunday.

Four of Oldham's squad are former St. Helens' players. Miles Greenwood, Liam Gilchrist, Bruce Johnson and Mark McCully each began their careers in the Saints' Academy and will need little incentive to perform well tonight.

This evening's match will be the 212th meeting between the two sides. Saints have won 108 of these encounters to Oldham's 97, with six matches drawn. At the old Knowsley Road ground, the teams met on 102 occasions with Saints winning 65 matches to Oldham's 37. The clubs last met on February 10 2002, in a Fourth Round Challenge Cup tie played at Staleybridge Celtic, in quite appalling weather conditions. The then Cup holders' St. Helens won the match by 40 points to 6. ln 1953, 1972, 1976, 1978, 1987 and 2002 Saints have defeated Oldham on route to reaching Challenge Cup Finals. As previously stated, Saints' last home victory over Oldham was a 36-26 Super League II, Round 18 success on August 10 2007 whilst Oldham's last win in St. Helens was by 30 points to 26 on April 17 1994. This win occurred over 18 years ago and was the last time Oldham defeated Saints.



**BENTLEY Valu:** (29), backrow forward in his third season at Oldham. Spent much of his career in France where he grew up, although born in New Zealand.



# **QUIRKS**OF THE SAINTS

# THE FLYING CURATE MAKES A 'MULL'

It seems appropriate in this Olympic year, that we remember one Saints' player who took part in the first London Olympics in 1908 at the White City stadium.

Christopher Chavasse attended Trinity College, Oxford and was an accomplished rugby player and athlete. He entered the heats for the 400 metres, with his twin brother Noel. Alas, neither made it to the semi-finals, with Christopher narrowly beaten in his heat by an American athlete called William Prout. Ironically the Saints played their first-ever game of floodlit rugby league at the White City stadium many years later – but that's another story!

As for Christopher, he became the Curate at St. Helens Parish Church and wanted to play rugby league, to empathise with his parishioners. He played six First Team matches, scoring three tries. Yet his biggest moment was to end in total embarrassment! When Saints played Wakefield Trinity, on Saturday 21st January 1911 the fans only counted twelve players on the field. There was no Chavasse! The game kicked off, with Saints putting reserve Sam Daniels onto the field. After half an hour a figure

in a blue and black jersey vaults over the fence and rushed onto the field – it was Chavasse! The referee sent him off and later reported him for ungentlemanly conduct, not having sought the referee's permission to enter the field of play! To make matters worse, Wakefield won 18-8.

Christopher later explained the situation to the local press: "The whole thing was a fearful mull on my part....and I accept full responsibility for it. I had been up the previous night preparing a sermon and after lunch I sat in my chair before the fire running through it....when I dozed off. I rushed to Headquarters to find the dressing room doors locked and everyone gone to the match. I obtained the keys and sent for a cab while I dressed, but they had to harness the horse and when I reached the ground it was only to find I could not play...."

Christopher later became the Bishop of Rochester [1940-1960] and he always kept in touch with the fortunes of his former team, sending them letters of encouragement before major finals until he died in the early 1960s.

# PLAYED FOR BOTH CHRIS JOYNT

In the early 1990s, we used to go to Oldham and admire the progress of a young secondrower, born in Wigan, called Chris Joynt.

So too did the St. Helens Directors, who signed him up for the start of the 1992-93 campaign. It was money well spent indeed! Chris soon developed into a wide-running second-rower of international pedigree. In his first season at Knowsley Road, he won the \*Harry Sunderland trophy, after Wigan were defeated at Old Trafford and his career took off from there.

In Super League, Chris won the lot, including the World Club Challenge against Brisbane at the Reebok when he scored a crucial try. He captained the team to two back-to-back Grand Final successes and a Challenge Cup victory against Bradford Bulls at Twickenham in 2001. Chris represented Lancashire, England, Great Britain and Ireland with distinction and gained a reputation as a workaholic forward with a penchant for scoring vital tries, none more so that the famous 'Wide-to-West' four-pointer in 2000 at Knowsley Road. It seemed as though the team could crumble if he was taken off for a 'breather' and he was soon back on the paddock inspiring and cajoling his team-mates to victory. Chris played 382 times for Saints all-told from 1992-2004 and was an automatic choice in the Club's Greatest 17 selection in 2010.

Other familiar names who have played for both include John Donovan from the 1960s; Neil Holding and Shaun Allen from the 1980s and Paul Atcheson, Paul Davidson and Tommy Martyn from the Super League era.

We cannot imagine it today - the town of St. Helens divided by cup fever and bragging rights up for grabs. The Recs had joined the league just after the First World War and had actually won the Lancashire Cup in 1923-24, with their much older rivals still waiting for their first trophy success! The county final at Warrington was played in what may best be described as wet and soggy conditions. Saints' Chairman Jim May had a very scientific piece of advice for his team: "Do as the stamp did - stick it to the end!"

They did exactly that, maintaining an intensity that made life difficult for their famous rivals in red, amber and black. George Lewis kicked a first-minute penalty for the Saints and, following a set scrum, standoff wizard Leslie Fairclough ran rings round Recs' second-rower Albert Fildes before touching down under the posts. Lewis converted and the Saints were in the driving seat. Just after the half-hour it was Alf Ellaby's turn to shine, when he got

a pass from Lewis, kicked over his opponent's head and dribbled over the line to score. Jim Pyke reduced the deficit just before half-time with


a welcome penalty for the Recs.


No further scoring took place in the second half and the Saints were victorious by 10-2. There was untold joy at Wilderspool on the final whistle. as thousands iumped over the terrace wall to congratulate their heroes and wait for the presentation of the cup in front of the grandstand. Second-rower Fred Roffey thus became the first captain to lift a major trophy for the Saints in their rugby league existence. Ironically, the club had to wait almost 30 years before their next success in the competition, against Wigan in 1953. Some might say it was definitely worth the wait!



Trivia footnote: The Recs later got their revenge at the end of the season with a sensational 33-0 victory in the Championship semifinal at City Road. Two Saints players - Groves and Houghton - were sent off, together with Bill Mulvanney of the Recs in what was a feisty encounter to say the least!

# SUPERSTITIOUS TIMES

I was really pleased when Saints' name came out of the hat with that of Oldham.

It is not that I expect the Roughyeds to be a soft touch and therefore provide a safe passage through to the quarter-finals – although everyone but the most hyper-optimistic of Oldhamers will expect the latter.

Nor is it simply the fact that I have a soft spot for Oldham as a proper rugby league town, especially given the number of top players that this XIIIman code hotbed has produced and continues to do so despite not having a team in the top flight.

Warrington would give their eye-tooth to have a record of producing a list of internationals to match that of Oldham – Barrie McDermott, lestyn Harris, Paul Sculthorpe, Kevin Sinfield and Kyle Eastmond. Give it a while and we may well be throwing our own Mark Flanagan on there too.

And it is not even that I am glad we could give the Roughyeds a decent pay day – as Saints probably still owe them big time for helping nurture two of the finest players to ever grace a Saints shirt in the modern era – Tommy Martyn and Chris Joynt.

No, it is more one of superstition. Invariably when we play Oldham in the Challenge Cup we usually go all the way to the final – that was certainly the case in 1976, 1978, 1987 and 2002. The only game spoiling the stat is 1981 where Kel Coslett's team fell at the semi-final hurdle after winning at the Watersheddings in the last eight.

Two of those games were absolute blinders – demonstrating the compelling nature of the Challenge Cup.

In March 1981 the quarter final tie between the sides was as close as it gets – and what an atmosphere.

The Watersheddings was absolutely jam-packed to the rafters with a crowd



of around 9,000 on and you could barely move around the ground made up of old wooden stands.

The game was close with only a Peter Glynn drop goal separating the two sides at half time and again at the final hooter.

Oldham made a real game of it, taking the lead with a 14th minute try from big Welsh prop Gareth Owen. A try from hooker Graham Liptrot try cancelled that out, then Glynn nudged Saints in front. The second half remained nailbitingly scoreless, but the crowd was so packed that you swayed with every tackle and every ball carry.

Saints held on – but there was no place to hide in the semis where they lost to Hull KR.

Another classic at the most picturesque ground in rugby league came on Valentine's Day, 1987.

Oldham, who were bossed by former Saints skipper Frank Myler, came into the game cock-a-hoop after a late Paddy Kirwin try had knocked Wigan out in the previous round.

It was another bitterly cold day at Watersheddings and straw had been scattered across the pitch to keep out the frost.

The Roughyeds led 8-6 at half time leaving the Saints fans, packed up behind the back of the posts, shuffling

nervously in anticipation of suffering the same fate as Wigan.

However, Oldham had hooker lan Sanderson sent off for a high tackle on Neil Holding. (Blimey, remember when players actually got dismissed for high shots!) Saints moved the ball about a lot more in the second half, and used the one-man advantage to send Kevin McCormack and Paul Forber over for good tries. Holding then scored a peach of a try - after taking the ball from the scrum, he dummied to the invisible man on the wing, beating the former Great Britain full back Mick Burke for pace to score.

The intensity of the first half and prospect of losing had made the victory even more pleasing. Raucous cries of 'We're on the march with Murphy's Army!' repeatedly rang around the ground, each time rising in volume.

That year Saints did go all the way to Wembley, where they suffered a heartbreaking one-point defeat by Halifax.

# IN THE SYSTEM

Ben Parry, 17, is a winger who lives in Chorley with his parents, stepfather and mum Michael and Barbara Owen. He attended St Laurence Primary School, Parklands High School and Runshaw College.

He is currently a first year student Cowley International College and has begun an AASE (Advanced Apprenticeship in Sports Excellence).

# Q: How did you first get involved playing in rugby league?

A: When I was four or five years old I used to play football for Charnock Richard and one of my friends asked If we should go and try out playing rugby league at Chorley Panthers as one of our older friends played there. I took to the sport and we mixed and trained with the year above us. I began playing at six and seven and I stayed at Chorley until the end of the Under 16s season. In the Under 13s we won the North West Counties Division 1 title but were relegated the following season and we then won the Division 1 title again in the Under 15s. I won the club's Players' Player of the Year at Under 11, 13, 15 and 16s. From the age of six to 13 I played at full back, then centre and on the wing.

### Q: Who were your coaches?

A: When I was younger Bernard Flannagan and Ian Carr and up to the under fourteen side and for the final two seasons I was coached by Peter Bridge.

# Q: Did you play for your Service Area?

A: I played for Lancashire Service Area at Under 14s, was injured the following season, and then played for them at Under 16s and was coached by Frank McMullen. I was selected for the under 16s regional camp but missed out on the national camp.

# Q: How did you get picked up by Saints?

A: I was playing for the u15s at Chorley Panthers and Mick Oxley came to see me and asked if I would like to come to Saints. ### Q: Were you also part of the St Helens Academy Squad which went to Australia at the end of last season?



THE OFFICIAL BALL SUPPLIER TO SUPER LEAGUE

GROUND REGULATIONS Unnecessary noise such as that from the use of radio sets, and air horns and behaviour likely to cause confusion, annoyance or nuisance of any kind, including obscene, racist, homophobic or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground. The consumption of intoxicating liquors is permitted only in authorised places and in accordance with the Sporting Events (Control of Alcohol etc). Act 1985. It is an offence, punishable by Law, for any person to enter or attempt to enter the ground: (a) Whilst in possession of a controlled container which is or was capable of holding liquid and which if thrown will be capable of causing injury to another person. (b) Whilst in possession of alcohol. (c) Whilst Drunk. All persons entering the ground are admitted subject to the condition that they may be required to submit to search to prevent dangerous articles being brought into the ground which might be used to cause injury or damage to other persons or property. The Club reserves the right to refuse admission or to eject any person who refuses to be searched by a Steward or Police Officer. The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits, and entrances, stairways and like places and standing in the seating areas whilst play is in progress, is prohibited. Any person persistently contravening this requiation may be ejected from the ground. Any person who fails to comply with instruction from a steward or Police Officer may be ejected from the ground. No Smoking is permitted within any areas of the ground within the perimeter walls of the Stadium. No Drums or other musical instruments which could be construed as dangerous or as a nuisance to other spectators are allowed within the ground.
