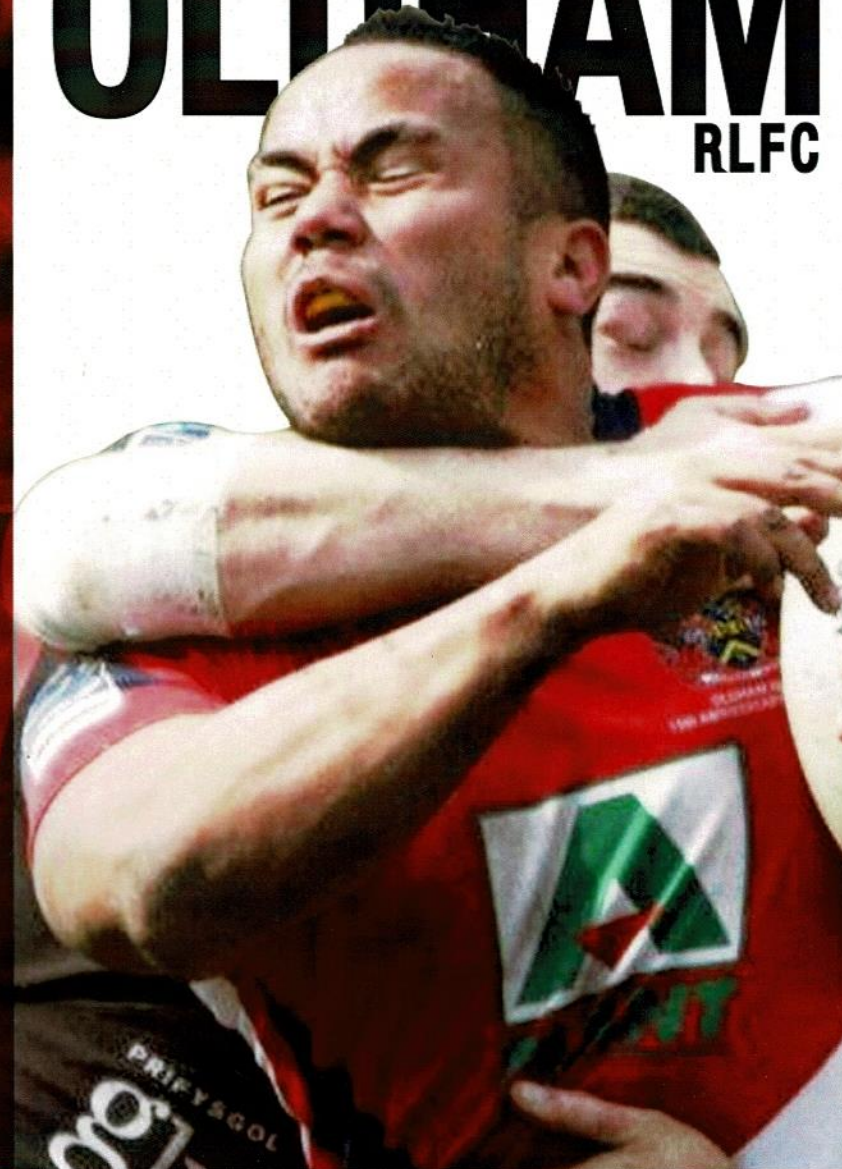

BOULTSY Hits the 200 Milestone!!!

Described by club chairman Chris Hamilton as an "unsung hero", prop Jason Boults reached a huge personal milestone at Doncaster last Sunday when he played the 200th game of his professional career.

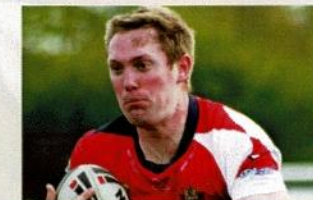
The 28-year-old former Halifax front-rower played in 57 cup and league games for his hometown club and has since added 143 more with an Oldham jersey on his back, having joined Roughyeds in 2007 and having remained loyal and steadfast to the club ever since. His consistency and reliability can be seen clearly from his season-by-season appearance figures ---- 25 in 2007, 33 in 2008, 20 in 2009, 26 in 2010, 25 in 2011 and 14 up to now this season.

Consider that he is playing every week in the rough and tumble of the front-row, usually in the starting line-up to soak up the forward battles when they are at their hardest, and that he often puts in a solid 30 minutes or more before he is 'spelled' for the first time, and it says a great deal about him as a player and as a person.. Any tries scored by a prop are a bonus, but in 2010 he amassed half a dozen, including a hat-trick in a 44-14 win against derby rivals Rochdale Hornets at Whitebank on August 15. He has had lots of big games in his five and a bit seasons here. Fans will recall that it was his first-rate performance against Celtic Crusaders in South Wales in May,

2007 that helped Roughyeds to kick-start their season with a 34-26 triumph, to project themselves with style and panache nationwide via Sky Sports TV and to pull off a surprise win that confirmed their credentials as NL2 promotion challengers. It was a game in which, totally out of character, he was sin-binned for fighting.

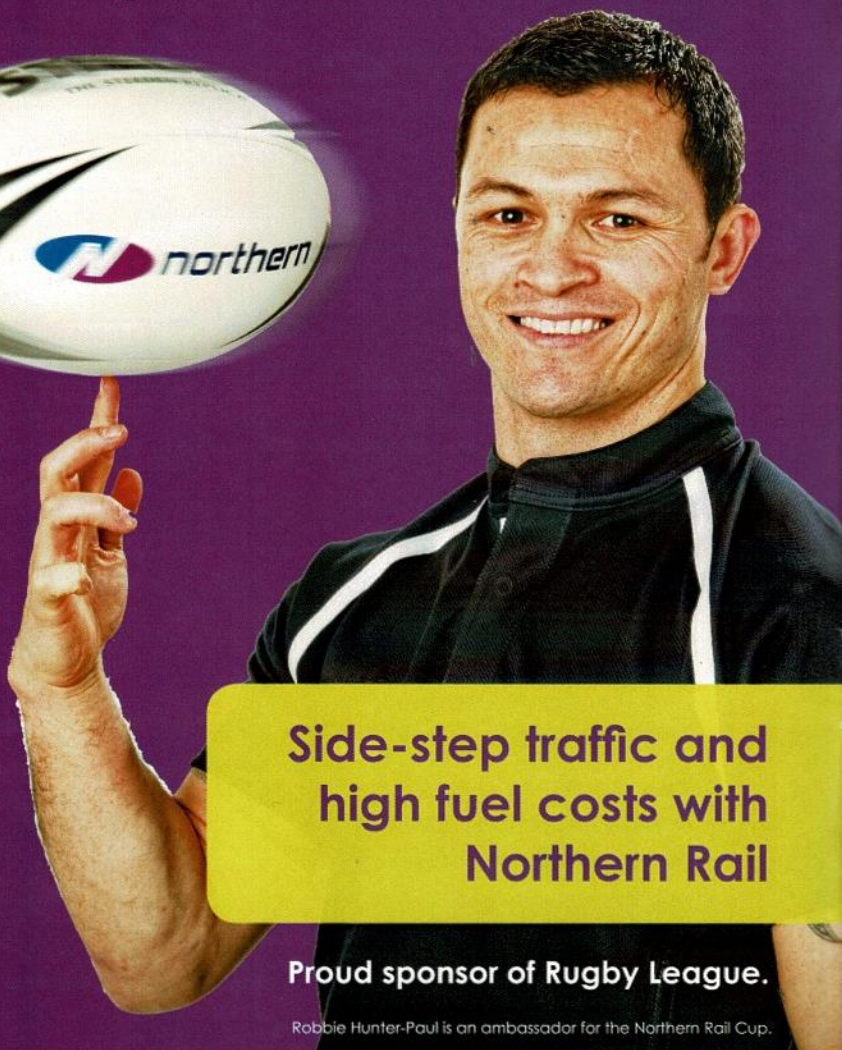
A firm favourite of the Whitebank crowd, who fully appreciate his loyal service to the club, Jason has often said publicly that he loves to play for Oldham because the club and its supporters are friendly people who have always regarded him as one of their own. Added Chris: "In my view, Jason has been an unsung hero throughout his time here. He always does a lot of work that goes unrewarded and unnoticed. He is a coach's player and a players' player. Some props can make an impact over 15 or 20 minutes, but Jason has a big engine and he often goes much longer than that. "He's someone you can always rely on for 100 per cent honesty in his performance and that's what any side needs most of all in the pack's engine room."

TALK from the dug out

Last week was the most disruptive and difficult week I've ever experienced since I started coaching over 16 years ago. It wasn't just the fact that we had 11 of our regular 1st team players out with injury or sickness; that we lost all but 1 of the players in the leadership group but that we lost them regularly as the week progressed. When you have injury numbers that high it's not just a simple case of replacing them as we had already pretty much cleaned the Reserve side out, so we had to resort to moving people about, changing game plans instilled and practicing them in the first two sessions as the week went on. Our problems were then amplified on Friday night when two more players pulled out with bad cases of flu, and one with the same virus was also doubtful to play. It was a mad Friday night pulling in three more players who had played in the Reserve grade game on Thursday night. We put a side together and had a pretty useful extended training session on Saturday morning which I think paid dividends. We knew we were in for a difficult encounter on Sunday and personally I felt we played pretty strongly

in the 1st half, and had a few decisions gone our way could have gone in at the half way mark ahead. The disastrous start in the second half killed us with John Clough in the bin and Shaun Robinson breaking his hand and having to leave the field. This was too much for us and although I think we battled on we were beaten because we weren't good enough to keep enough of the ball or territory. I was encouraged by large parts of our game, and the progress of some of our younger less experienced players, who were forced to step up. I look forward to getting stuck in to this week's challenge and turning our fortunes around.

University of Gloucestershire All Golds to join Championship One

The RFL has confirmed that University of Gloucestershire All Golds is the third of four new teams that will join the semi-professional Championship 1 Rugby League competition in 2013.

In a unique set-up, the All Golds will be based at and run by the University of Gloucestershire and will also benefit from close links with Super League and World Club champions Leeds Rhinos, who have been active in developing the sport in the South West in recent years.

RFL Chief Operating Officer Ralph Rimmer said: "We are delighted to announce that University of Gloucestershire All Golds will join Northampton and Hemel Stags in taking their place in Championship 1 in 2013.

"The All Golds are another exciting addition who will enhance the competition and the sport in many ways.

"Once again we are breaking new territory for Rugby League in terms of geographical expansion which will ultimately grow the player pool by giving increasing numbers of players from across the country the opportunity to play the sport at semi-professional level.

"They have a remarkable combination of history combined with some exciting plans for the future and with their set-up at the University they will be unique amongst their peers."

The University All Golds are currently rated as one of the top eight student sides in the British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS) Super 8 League and finished third last season. In April, this year, they launched their junior academy, attracting over 100 players to their first

trials and now run U14, U16 and U18 squads.

Since January 2011 they have implemented a number of community strategies and are currently delivering Rugby League in eight primary schools, 14 secondary schools and have seen an increase in Rugby League participation numbers by 550 new players since the beginning of the year.

Director of Sport at the University of Gloucestershire, Andy Pitchford, said: "The announcement builds on many years of hard work, led by both enterprising students and supportive members of the local community.

"The team now play at the very highest level of student sport, with 12 student internationals, two full internationals and three students who have made their professional debuts this season. The professional club is the natural next step for those both on and off the pitch.

"We are particularly grateful to Lionel Hurst, the Chairman of our Student/BUCS club, for his leadership and for his encouragement to push for this ambitious project. We are grateful to all of the partners who have helped us to bring this to reality, including the RFL and the Leeds Rhinos."

Leeds Rhinos Chief Executive Gary Hetherington said: "It's an exciting opportunity for the game's development at this level and we at Leeds Rhinos are keen to lend our support as part of our continued assistance to the growth of Rugby League in the South West region."

"I can't get to ORSA (Oldham Rugby Supporters' Association) events due to work commitments so this is an alternative way of expressing my support for the club.

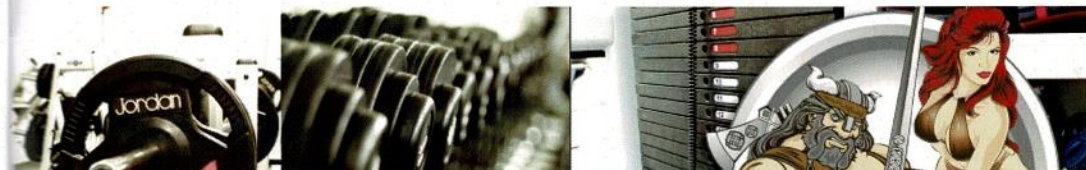
"We've already been hit by injury this season and I see this as a way of helping the club to further strengthen the squad when they feel the time is right."
