We performed better in the second half and played some nice rugby which resulted in the team scoring some quality tries to which Jamie Dallimore added all the goals in his best day with the boot.

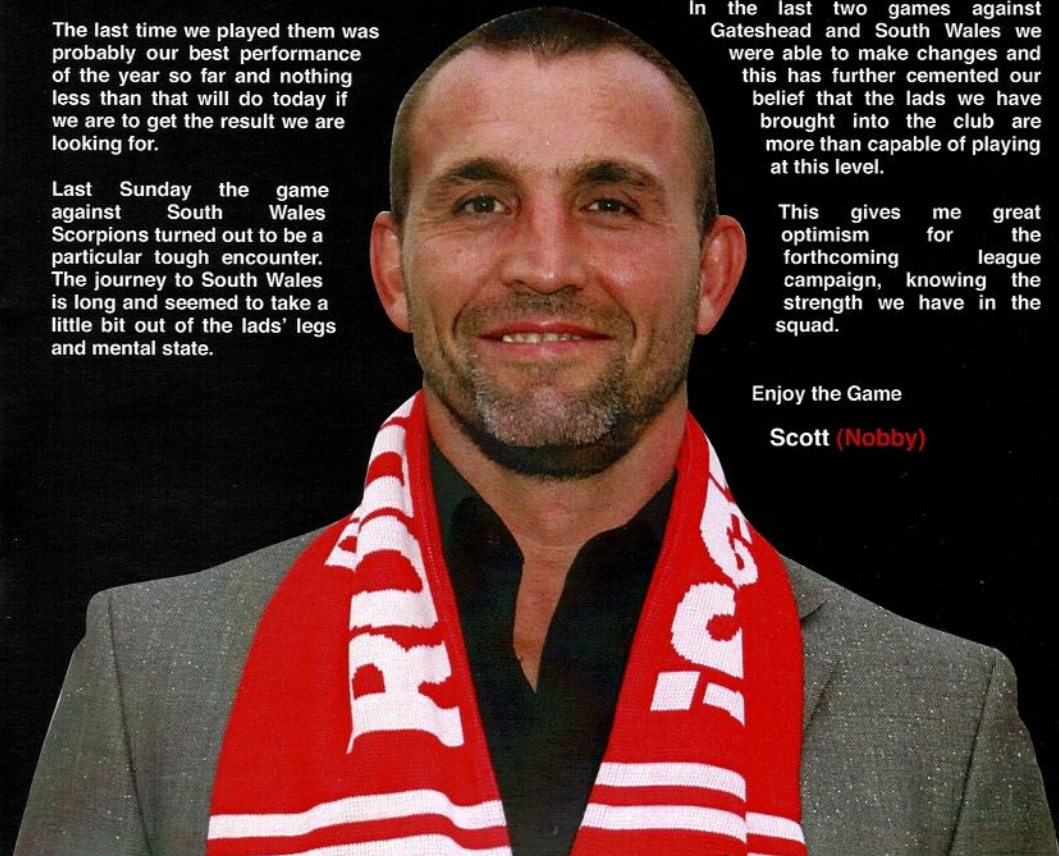
South Wales played well. They seemed to be a much improved side on last season's team and it will be tough for any team to go to Neath this year and come away with a victory.

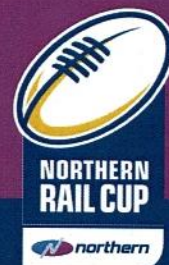

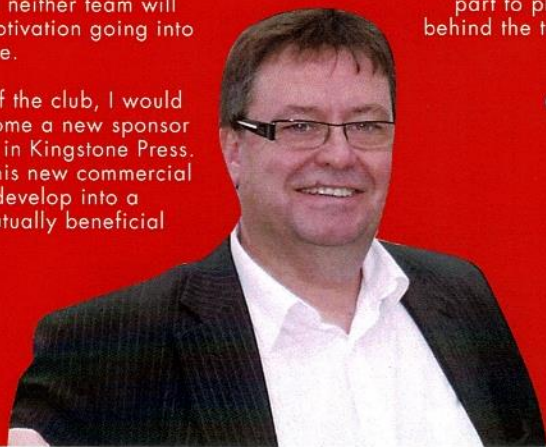
Having lost the first game, and having been very disappointed about the manner of the defeat, the lads responded well and won each of the next three matches.

Today is the start of a journey which will hopefully see us achieve our - and your - goals this year and as always you have a part to play in that regard. Please get behind the team and be loud and proud!

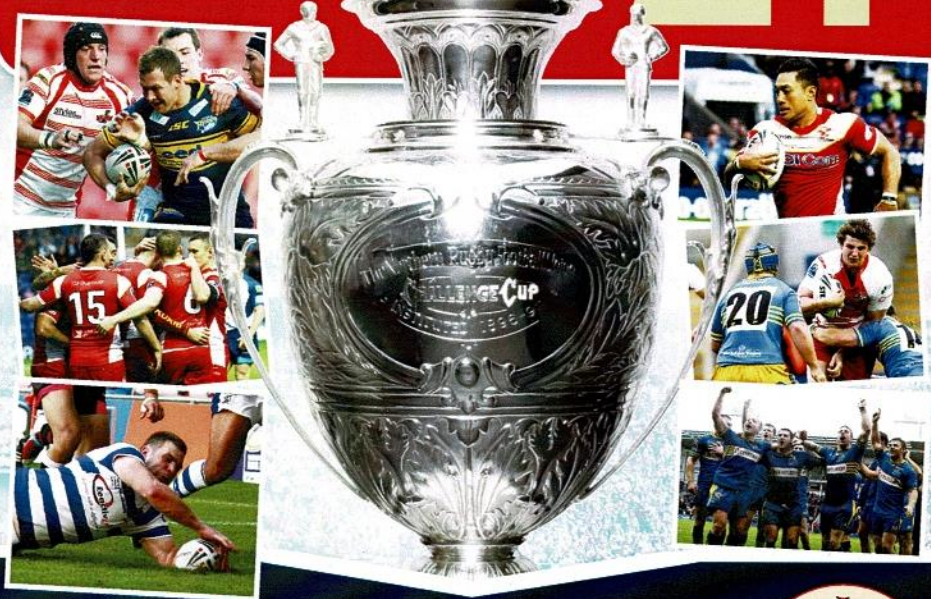

Roughyeds players **David Cookson** and **Jamie Dallimore**, who didn't play against Gateshead, also helped to get the message across.

**Bill Lovat**, **Regenda's** Regional Director (East), was also at the game to support the initiative and to talk to club sponsors and hospitality suite guests about **Regenda's** links with the club. He said:

*"We are aware of the importance of being involved with projects like this, which is sending out a strong message at a time when many people are facing financial difficulty.*

*"We are pleased to assist and, in conjunction with Regenda, we are also helping to promote an alternative form of finance with Oldham Credit Union.*

*"This is a key message not only to our supporters, but also to the larger public in this very difficult economic climate.*

*"Regenda have demonstrated their commitment to the local community via their Limehurst Village 10-year plan and have also supported us fully as we strive to establish the club in the same community."*

Describing loan sharks as
