From The Chair...

Good afternoon everyone and a very warm welcome to all supporters, players and officials from Oldham for today's Challenge Cup 3rd round tie. It's not so long ago that Oldham were our main rivals for promotion from Championship 1 and but for a horrendous

run of luck in Grand Finals would be with us in the Championship today. They are a Club like us with a long and proud history in the game both being forced to reinvent ourselves to remain financially viable and competitive on the field. We certainly wish them every success in their quest for promotion this season.

It was interesting to see that the 3rd round draw was made in Oxford by Kevin Whateley of "Lewis" fame. What made it more understandable was that they needed someone with the intelligence of a Detective Inspector to understand the draw in the first place! Separate draws were made to even the two pools out and then additional draws were made following each tie to decide who was at home. I have to say we don't do ourselves a lot of favours when we are trying to appeal as a new sport to the masses. 



Today sees our first step on the road to Wembley for the 2013 Tetley's Challenge Cup as we welcome our old foes Oldham to the South Leeds Stadium.

Oldham have regrouped over the winter and brought in ex-Super League Centre Scott Naylor as coach on a two-year deal. The Roughyeds have also partnered up with Salford City Reds in a deal that will allow Naylor to call on the services of a select number of players to help the Oldham cause.

Oldham got their league campaign under way on Good Friday against local rivals Rochdale at Whitebank. Despite going 18-0 down inside the first 30 mins, Oldham closed the gap to 10 points at half time thanks to a converted try from Danny Langtree. Oldham hit the lead after the break with further converted tries from Richard Lepori and Adam Files. Rochdale, however hit back to take the lead with 15 mins left and a late score sealed the win for the Hornets 18-28.

Before last weekends League kick off, Oldham have been involved in a re-vamped Northern Rail Cup Competition. All the Championship 1 sides were involved in two leagues of 4. Oldham were in Pool A along with North Wales Crusaders, Rochdale and Gateshead. The Roughyeds finished 2nd behind North Wales with two wins from 3 games, beaten only by the group winners.

Did You Know?...

Did you know that for every person on the planet, there are 200,000,000 insects? If you could collect them all and put them into bags for carrying, each person would have to carry 40 tons of insects! Thank goodness insects have 6 legs of their own to get about on. Some insects are incredibly strong. For example, an ant can lift 50 times its own weight. So if you were as strong as an ant and weighed about 20 kilo, then you would be able to lift 20 x 50 = 1000 kilo, which is about the same as a small car! Some ants live in colonies of about 1.000.000 ants. Don't ever sit on THAT colony. Did you know that a hive of bees will fly 90,000 miles just to make a kilo of honey, which is about the same as flying three times around the earth? Each worker bee makes about a teaspoon of honey before it dies at the end of the year. So think of how many bees it takes to make a jar of honey. In some countries it is quite normal to eat insects, in fact they're a good food source which can feed the world. If you go to China, you can have grilled millipede or scorpions on a spit! And red food colouring is made from the skin of an insect. Grilled locust.

Where Are They Now...

Kenny Eyre...

"I got more money than Jack Charlton." Not many people can boast that, but Ken Eyre can. From signing for Hunslet in 1957, Ken played until the start of the 1966/7 season before transferring to Leeds for a fee of £5,750. He played twice at Wembley, once in 1965 for Hunslet, and once for Leeds. Ken still has his Hunslet blazer, which a player was given once he'd played 15 times for the first team.

Ken made his debut for Hunslet's first team aged 18 in a match against Wakefield on 29th November, 1958, and went on to play 242 times, scoring 18 tries in all. He played at 10 at a time when there were no subs and is one of the few forwards I've met whose knees are still in pretty good working order, although his only serious injury was stretched ligaments and a chip of bone floating around his knee. Ken's coach, Jack Walkington, had planned to give Ken his debut earlier, but Ken had been in town on a Saturday night, got into a fight and, in the waltz with his opponent which followed, had danced into a plate glass window.

Ken had begun playing rugby at School – "Every school in Hunslet played rugby except Cross Flatts and Hunslet Moor, who concentrated on football." Ken captained the Hunslet City Boys at under 13s. He also played in 3 Yorkshire Cup finals, as well as twice for Great Britain.

Ken has lots of anecdotes: – how he was suspended from an important 3rd round match after hitting Peter Fox; how his dad used to meet young Ken and brother, Albert, after work on



Saturday afternoon outside Parkside and say, "If they win at home today, I'll take us to get our haircut." After 2 wins on the trot, the family was in danger of sporting Yul Brynner haircuts! When Hunslet got through to

Wembley in 1965, they took over the London hotel booking which knocked-out Wakefield had made. To relax the team the night before, they were taken to see the Black and White Minstrel Show. Their presence was announced from the stage and they were invited to go backstage. You can imagine the scene of show girl dancers in their flimsy costumes and burly rugby players. No wonder they lost the next day — still thinking about the dancers, no doubt! Turning up for his first match at Leeds, Ken was shocked to see all the pre-match warm-up the players were doing. Ken's warm-up routine was to stand up, bend his knees, and sit down again.

Ken enjoyed his time at Hunslet – "no regrets." He says they were a close-knit group, first and second team training together then going off to The Engine or The Prospect. It's "the best game in the world – a gladiator game. I enjoyed every minute of my time at Hunslet."

If you want to hear more anecdotes from Ken, he can usually be found down at The Prospect in Hunslet on a Sunday afternoon. Be prepared to be entertained!

Fitzsimons was nearly the villain of the piece with

Hunslet 12-6 up as Hartley scored a try for the Rovers and Fairbairn converted looked pure consolation as the electronic scoreboard at Elland Road flashed for full time; however from the restart Fitzsimons put the ball out on the full and gave Fairbairn a chance to win the game for Rovers from the half way line, fortunately the attempt drifted wide, the hooter sounded and Hunslet had sealed a famous victory.

best interests of the club at heart but if anyone could help us in the task of tightening up these areas prior to kick-off please offer your services at the club office.


