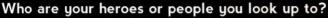

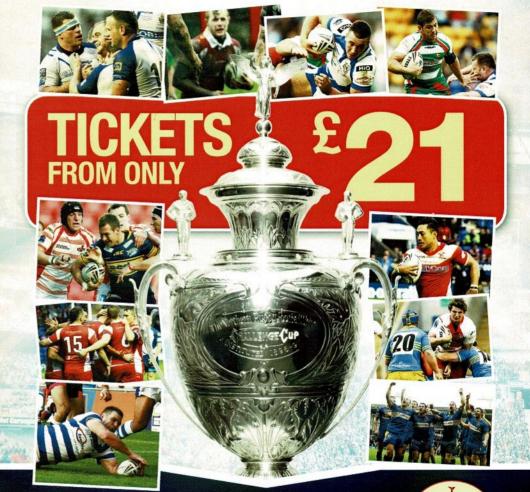

IT'S always a real pleasure to bump into former players from Oldham RLFC of yesteryear, as I did at Hemel with David Parker, Captain Courageous of the 1964 Challenge Cup semi-final side.

A talented loose-forward, David played in nearly 200 games for the Watersheddings side between 1960 and 1967 and he was club captain when I began to cover Oldham RL for the Chronicle in that memorable 'Spring of '64, writes ROGER HALSTEAD.

Aged 78, still playing squash regularly, and often busy on his allotment, David has lived in Hertfordshire for many years, about half an hour's drive from Hemel Hempstead.

He sees little rugby league these days, but he said there was no way he was going to miss the Oldham game when he saw they were scheduled to be playing so close to his home.

He sends his best wishes to everyone at the club and especially to older supporters who may remember him as a player or who even knew him personally.

While acknowledging that modern rugby league is unrecognisable to the one he played all those years ago, he thoroughly enjoyed the game and he and I have already made tentative plans to meet up again next year at Hemel IF the Hertfordshire club is still on the Roughyeds' fixture list.

Perplexed initially when I said I hoped it wouldn't be, he soon cottoned on!

His view on the game? "First and foremost, I just wanted to get out there on the field again! Once Oldham had taken the sting out of Hemel's big forwards, who needed two or three tacklers to put them to ground in the early stages, they threw the ball around and it was good to watch."

David was born in Barrow, but he moved to the Manchester area when winning a place to the University. He signed for Roughyeds in 1960 from Manchester RU club, having captained the Lancashire County XV.

A tremendous tackler and a slick ball handler with an eye for the opening, he gained two full Great Britain caps at rugby league, both in 1964.

That was the year he skippered Oldham to the last four of the Challenge Cup in that astonishing three-match series against Hull KR, in which he suffered a severe facial injury in the first game at Headingley and had to sit out the other two.

FROM a strength and stamina point of view, Oldham RL players will easily cope with the challenges to come, says club fitness guru Mike Hughes.

As part-time professionals, Roughyeds players must juggle private lives with full-time work and rugby commitments, while facing 12 crucial Championship One games between now and the middle of August.

Starting with Sunday's visit of Gateshead Thunder to Whitebank (1pm kick off), they go eight weekends without a break and in that time travel for games to Wrexham, Neath, Gateshead and Oxford.

It's down to Hughes (26), on secondment from link club Salford City Reds, to make sure the players are strong, fit, fast, injury free and well fed.

With a masters degree in sports physiology from Liverpool John Moores University and six years' experience in Salford's backroom team, Widnes-born Hughes splits up his working week between both clubs.



He's with the Roughyeds on match days, home and away, and at one training session per week as well as preparing each player's individual programmes covering weights, supplements, general nutrition and all other aspects of physical conditioning for rugby players.

When he isn't around at Whitebank his assistant Craig Thomas is. They work closely with head coach Scott Naylor and his No 2 Lee Spencer, who believe there are two main reasons why the players head into this make-or-break period relatively free from injury ---- use of the superb training facilities at Oasis Academy Oldham, combined with Hughes's hard work and expertise in conditioning.

Said Naylor: "Liam Gilchrist's calf strain is the only injury we've had all year and that's mainly due to the prehab and rehab systems we have in place.

"It shows that what we are doing off the field in this regard is working well."

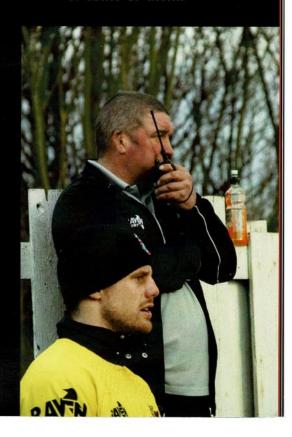
Hughes said: "Everything we do is with a purpose. My role is to prepare the players to be better athletes."

While qualifying, he spent six months in the States, first at IMG Academy in Florida, one of the leading sports performance academies in the world, and then doing mixed martial arts in Granite City, Illinois under the wing of the famous 'Hit Squad' run by former champion Matt Hughes.

With the knowledge he gained there, and with input from Naylor and Spencer, he developed innovative wrestling programmes, specially designed for rugby training, which Roughyeds players have been working on since preseason.

Added Hughes: "We've created team spirit --- and a very fit young squad. If we can keep it all together mentally we'll do well over this extremely demanding two-month period.

"I don't think there's a fitter team in Championship One and I would say we are the equal of most sides in the Championship, and even ahead of some of them."

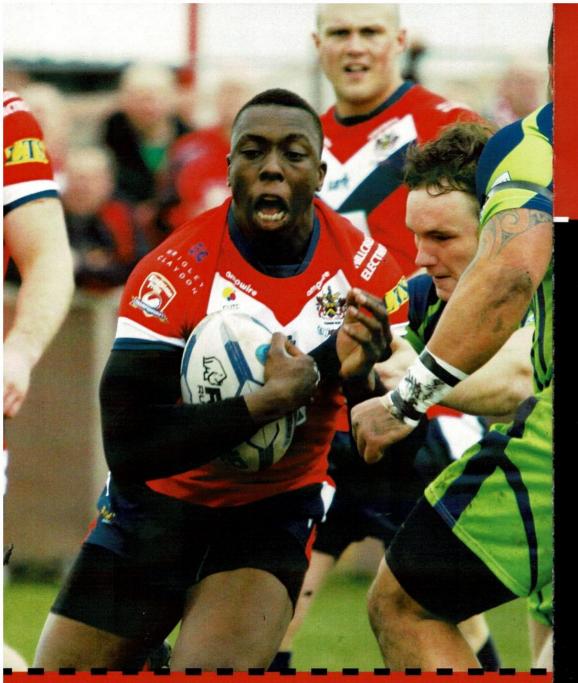

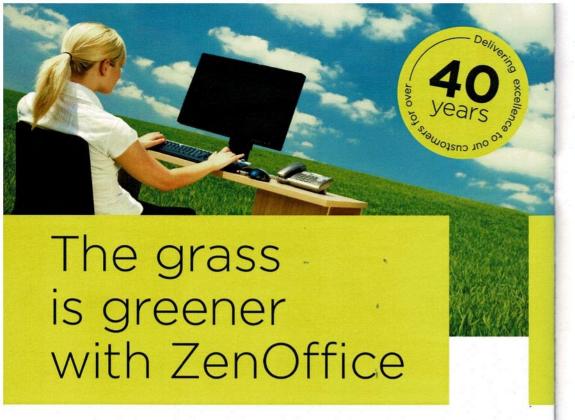
