

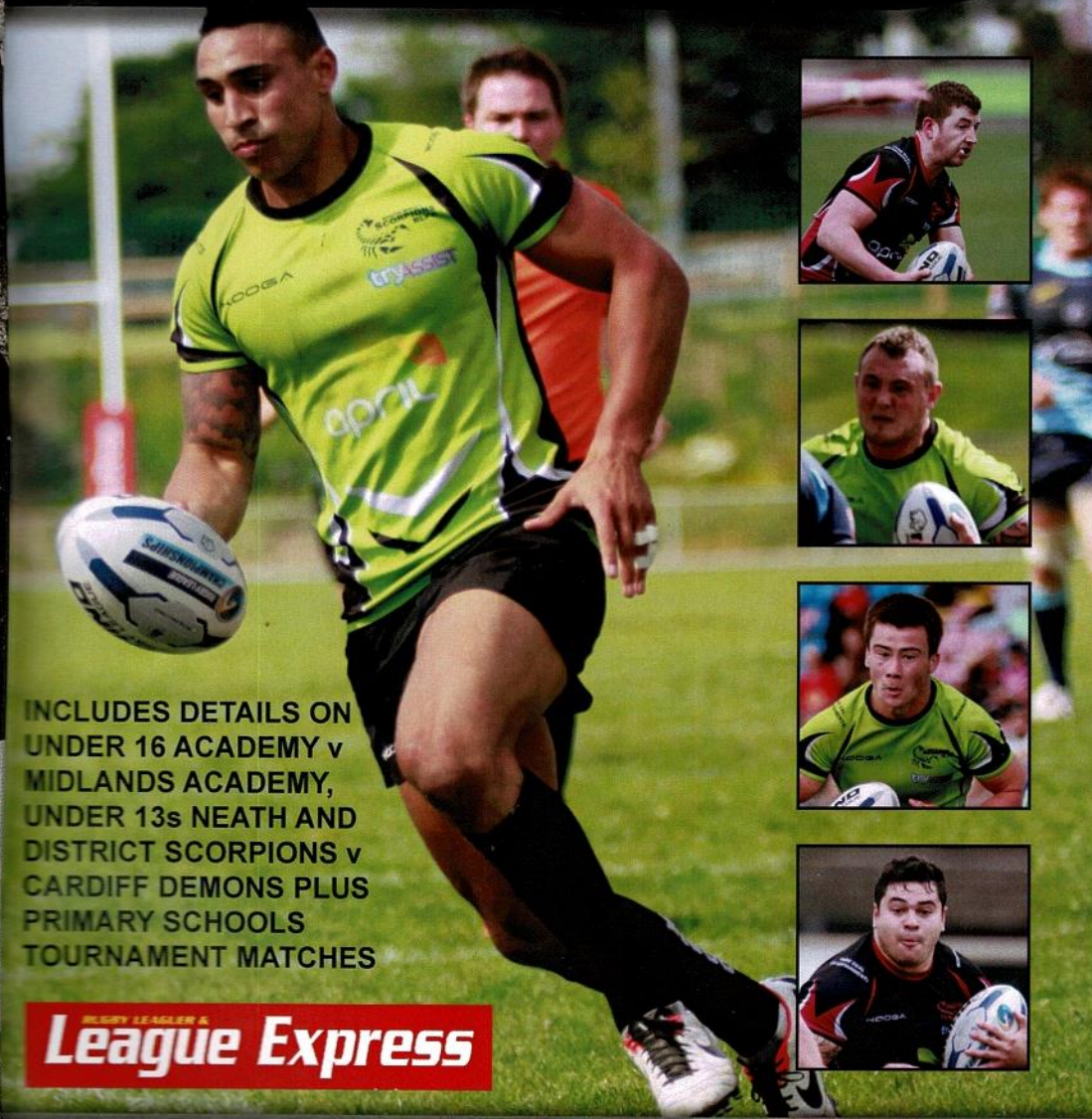

World Cup Update...

We are in a World Cup year and we as a sport have already started the blame game over England's chances and I'm afraid I am involved in that as well.

I'm not one to just throw blame at a person just for the sake of it but there are lot of people disinterested in the England team this year and the blame has to be pointed at coach Steve McNamara.

It would be easy just to cover how he has treated Danny Brough over the last 12 month or so, but it goes even further than that. Brough, in my opinion, has been one of the standout performers in Super League for a couple of seasons. He has thoroughly matured as a player and his kicking game is second to none as are his organisational skills.

Everyone can see his talent – except McNamara.

Yes I know Brough opted to play for Scotland in 2004 and has played a handful of internationals for them, but he was called upon by McNamara last year to feature in one of the Origin games against the Exiles.

But since then he has been overlooked by McNamara for a number of training camps and the autumn internationals last year, but even to the untrained eye you can see how well he has played this year and many thought McNamara would swallow his pride and include for the upcoming Origin series and for the World Cup at the end of the season.

I am putting the blame on McNamara because, although Brough could have helped his own cause by saying he wanted to play for England this year rather than keeping quiet, the coach should be approaching every top class player who is eligible to play for the country. Brough

would work wonders in the national set-up and in my opinion he is a much better fit than New Zealand born Rangī Chase.

I know some fans will say he has played for Scotland and therefore shouldn't be playing for England, but hooker Michael Mellorum has played for Ireland and I don't see many people saying he shouldn't be playing for England in the World Cup.

Warrington coach Tony Smith has come out this week and laid the blame at Brough's door saying he should have waited a bit longer, now I might not be qualified to question Mr Smith but how long does he have to wait, this kid has been playing out of his skin and McNamara has always said he would pick his squads on form well that hasn't been the case.

That is another problem I have with McNamara. He states he picks his squads on form and then ignores the likes of Brough and Darrell Goulding but resorts back to his old favourites.

James Roby and Adrian Morley have been both selected when they haven't played much this season through injury while the likes of Rob Burrow and Jamie-Jones Buchanan have not been setting the world on fire.

Players are not going to put their hand up for England if they are not getting a fair crack of the whip. Now the injury to Kallum Watkins was a major blow for McNamara but how can he ignore the form of Wigan centre Goulding – his wing partner Josh Charnley is in the squad after scoring 21 tries this season but who do you think has set him up for most of them? By Road:

Leave the M62 at junction 18, then at roundabout take the first exit, then join the M60 motorway signposted Ring Road East and South. Leave the M60 at junction 20, then turn right onto the A664 signposted Blackley.

Turn right, then join the M60 motorway signposted Ring Road North and West. Leave the M60 at junction 19, then at roundabout take the 4th exit, then join the M60 motorway signposted Ring Road East and South. Leave the M60 at junction 22, then turn right onto the A62 signposted Oldham South, Manchester City Centre. At traffic signals turn left onto the A6104 signposted Oldham South. At roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A6104 signposted Oldham South. Turn right onto Trough Gate. Continue forward onto Elm Road. Turn left onto White Bank Road.

By Train:

Oldham Roughyeds

With three League Championships, one First Division title, three Challenge Cup wins, seven Lancashire League triumphs and nine Lancashire Cups to their name, Oldham are one of rugby league's most famous names.

As one of the original 22 clubs to start the Northern Rugby Union in 1895, success arrived quickly for the Lancashire outfit.

They won their first League title by heading the First Division in 1905 and further League success followed in 1910 and 1911, when they twice beat Wigan in the Championship final. Indeed, in 1910 they won three trophies, adding the Lancashire League and Lancashire Cup to their sideboard.

As for the Challenge Cup, though, it was not until 1925 that they followed their 1899 success, finishing runners up three times (in 1907, 1912 and 1924) before laying the ghost to rest when they beat Hull KR 16-3 in the final at Headingley.

They lost in the Challenge Cup final again the following year to Swinton but gained revenge in 1927 when their fourth final appearance in a row ended in a 26-7 romp at Wigan.

It was another 30 years before they enjoyed more glory, the signing of players like Alan Davies, John Ety Sid Little and Derek 'Rocky' Turner leading to their last Championship title in 1957, along with numerous county

honours.

However, that was their last major success, although they have won the Second Division three times in 1964, 1982 and 1988 and the Divisional Premiership twice, in 1988 and 1990.

They added Bears to their name as one of the founding members of the Super League in 1996, but they were relegated in 1997 and, to add insult to injury, they went bankrupt as well.

However, they re-formed as Oldham Roughyeds in 1997 and reached the Northern Ford Premiership Grand Final in 2001, only to lose to Widnes.

They were relegated in 2006, though, after only one win and have been there since, despite reaching the Grand Final three times.

In 2009, Roughyeds were told they would no longer be able to use Oldham Athletic's Boundary Park. The club went to Oldham Council for help. Oldham Council bought Whitebank Stadium from Oldham Town and sold it to Roughyeds.

The 2010 season saw a transition with the five home games were played out of town at Sedgley Park, Whitefield. Roughyeds' first game at Whitebank took place on 9 May 2010 with the opposition being York City Knights. The first time Oldham had played on their own ground in Oldham borough since 1997.

CHAMPIONSHIP TALK

EIGHT clubs are just two steps away from the Northern Rail Cup final ahead of this weekend's quarter-finals stage.

With the competition being played under a new format this year and the final being staged at Halifax's The Shay, there is plenty at stake for the remaining sides.

The action starts on Thursday night with the televised clash between Swinton and Doncaster.

The Dons have been here before - making the 2009 final under Ellery Hanley - but the prospect of a Northern Rail final is a new one for the Lions.

Swinton have been inconsistent for much of the year, perhaps a legacy of their controversial use of the dual registration system, which has seen no less than seven different halfbacks play for the club this season.

The Dons produced the performance of last weekend by winning at Featherstone, and with Paul Cooke in fine form will fancy their chances.

Sheffield and Dewsbury meet for a third time in Sheffield this year, with Mark Aston's Eagles already having won in the league and Challenge Cup.

But they will still be wary of a Dewsbury side that dumped out the much fancied Halifax in the last 16.

Glenn Morrison's side has been showing signs of genuine recovery recently after a disappointing run of form.

But Sheffield are deserved favourites, and ominously for the Rams, star fullback Quentin Lulu-Togagae appears to be hitting his best form at the moment.

Batley, the 2010 NRC winners, host a Workington side that has impressed for much

of the year so far on Sunday.

There is no escaping the fact that the Bulldogs will start as favourites, but their coach John Kear - the old master of knock-out competitions - has already been keen to stress that they won't be underestimating the Cumbrians.

Both teams have a host of high work-rate, honest players, and among several fascinating battles will be that of the loose forwards - Ash Lindsay and Karl Olstrum have both had fine seasons to date and are key men for their respective sides.

Town's ability to handle the Bulldogs' back three - whoever Kear chooses out of Miles Greenwood, Gareth Potts, Johnny Campbell and Greg Johnson - will also be important.

But Town will be buoyed by their excellent defeat of Leigh on Sunday, and the form of rookie halfback Callum Phillips.

The Centurions, three times winners of the NRC, will be looking to secure another big day out when they entertain a Whitehaven side that has been climbing the Kingstone Press Championship table of late.

Haven have been steadily improving under coach Dave Woods, who also has experience of a NRC final with Castleford in 2005, though the Tigers lost to Hull KR.

The Cumbrians' main objective this year was Championship survival, which has now probably turned into making the play-offs and even the top six given their recent form.

But they would still welcome a final appearance, and in prop Paul Jackson they have one of the form players of the competition at present.

Still, most will favour Paul Rowley's Centurions, especially with home advantage. Follow Gareth on Twitter at www.twitter.com/garethwalker13
