



TEENAGE centre Jon Ford who scored FOUR tries for Oldham in South Wales ---- has declared his allegiance to the Roughyeds for the next month at least.

To celebrate he was pronounced the Premier Sports Championship One Player of the Week after an outstanding display in their dramatic win over South Wales Scorpions. Ford records the maximum five points towards his competition's Player of the Year award at the end of the season.





Roughyeds also landed the Premier Sports try of the week thanks to Mark Hobson's last-gasp touchdown in the corner which gave them a dramatic 36-32 win against South Wales Scorpions in Neath, and Jason Boults was included in the Team of the week.

Previously he had scored four in five match-by-match dual-reg. games for Scott Naylor's men, but doubled his tally in his first appearance since signing on loan from Salford City Reds.

"I'm very happy to be at Oldham on a more regular basis now," said 19-year-old Ford. "I enjoyed it here when I was on dual registration. I would have signed loan forms earlier, but I had one or two things to sort out with Salford first."

"It was good to score four tries in one game. I can't recall having done it previously. It's help, of course, to be standing 6ft 5in tall."



Assistant coach Lee Spencer lauded Ford's performance and said it confirmed what many pundits had believed for a long time — that he has what it takes to go far in the game.

He added: "Jon was in the right place at the right time, but that in itself is a skill. He read Anthony Bowman perfectly and as a consequence Bowman put him through some nice holes."

Scott Naylor added, "I've always wanted to get Jon on loan, as opposed to week-to-week dual registration, because he's a very good player and a top lad."

"The partnership with Salford is working well for us and I'm hoping that once the initial onemonth is up we will be allowed to extend the loan and perhaps keep hold of Jon for a while longer."

New-boy Bowman, slotted effortlessly into his new role at stand-off, but things didn't work out so well for the other newcomer, Dan Brotherton, who had to quit with an ankle injury early in the second half.

A winger, Brotherton came on dual registration from Salford to cover for Mo Agoro, who rolled an ankle at North Wales Crusaders and missed the next game against the Scorpions at Neath.

Bowman came on a more permanent arrangement – a month's loan, like Ford — and had a very pleasing debut in Neath.

Bowman, who plays loose-forward or half-back, was born in Halifax, but signed for Wigan Warriors as a boy before returning home and joining Fax in 2010.

He has scored 16 tries in 38 first-team appearances for the Championship club. Last season was his best. He scored 10 tries in 19 games, nine of them in the Championship.

The loan deal was brokered in talks between good friends and former coaching colleagues at Salford – Halifax boss Karl Harrison and his Oldham counterpart Scott Naylor.

Said Naylor: "Bowman can play a number of positions. I liked what Karl had to say about him and I saw it as an opportunity to bring in a player who has had considerable experience in a higher division.

"We've got a run of tough and important games coming up and we need to make sure that the squad is strong enough to take us to where we want to be.

"We've got a few injury niggles, nothing serious, but some of the boys are bruised and sore and I think now is the time to give a couple of them a rest.

"It's all about spreading the workload a bit and managing the squad so that, come the business end of the season, we are at our very best and not feeling the ill effects of a tough campaign. I've got to look ahead.

"I want us to peak when it matters most, but to do that I have to manage things now and keep an eye on the lads who have had it tough over the last few weeks."

Given anything like reasonable luck, both Ford and Bowman will be in the side today for what we consider will be a very tough contest against Hemel Stags, here at Whitebank.


