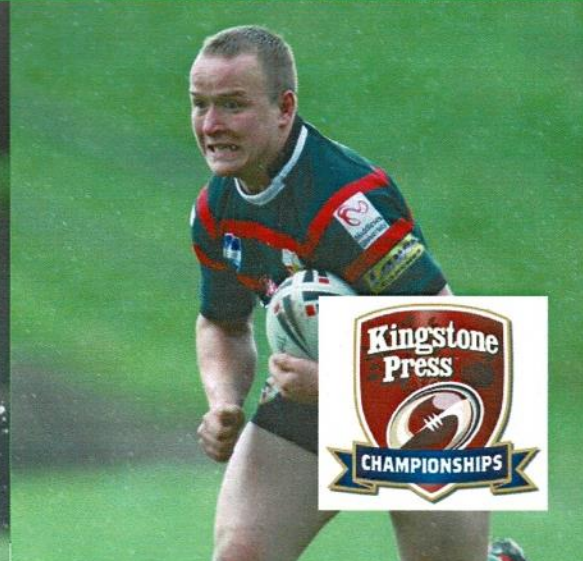

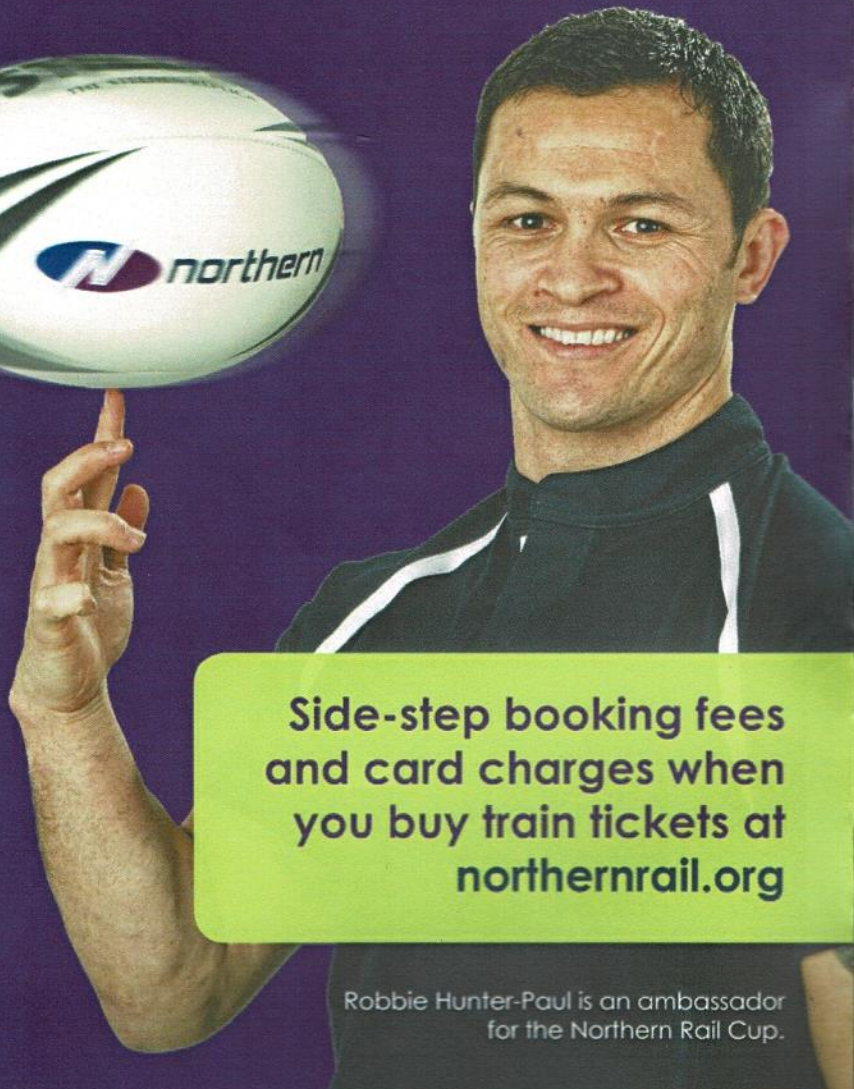

close that league has been this season. There can't be many leagues where next to bottom has a better points difference than the side at the top.

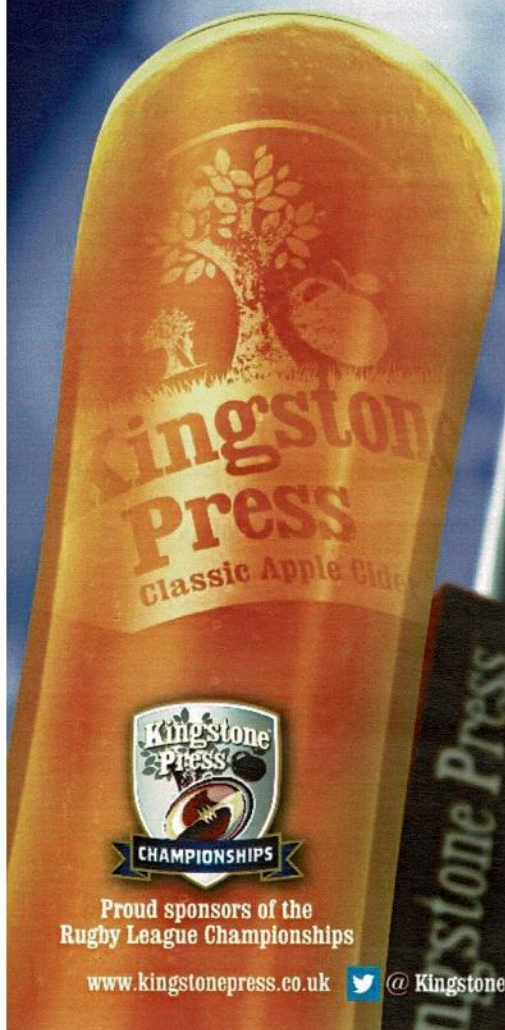

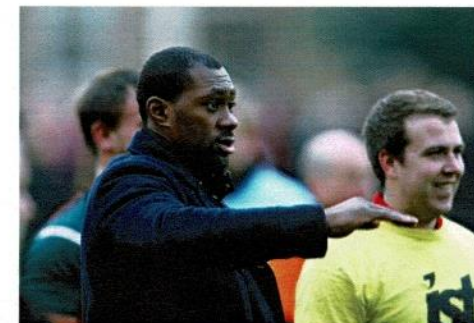
Going back to the importance of experience, Gareth Raynor certainly has that with over 200 Super League

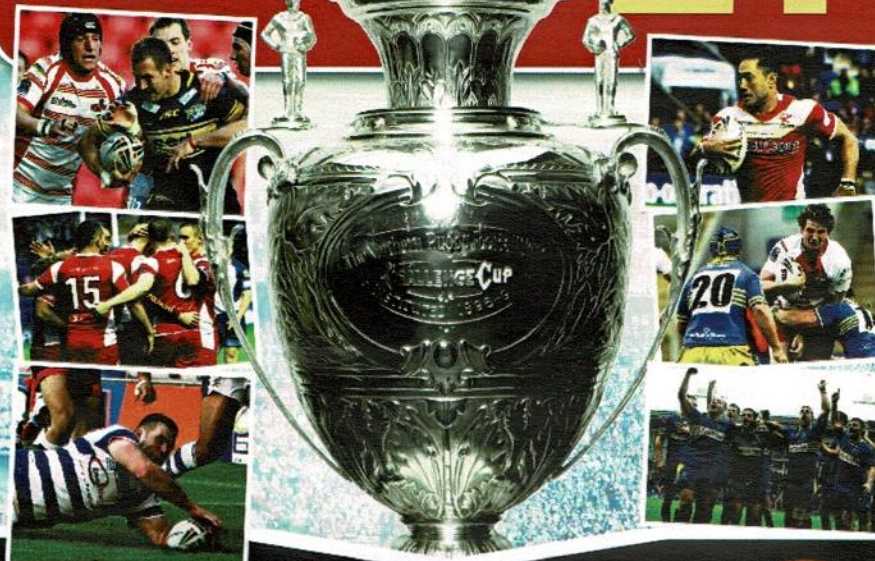
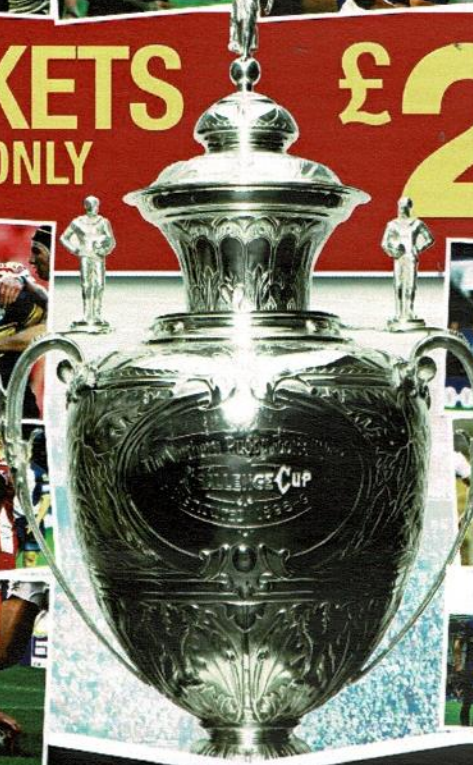

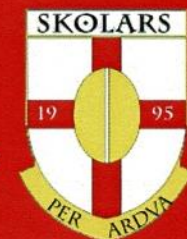

On The Road To Halifax

Saturday morning, 7.30am, and the first of the Skolars supporters travelling to Halifax have arrived an hour early at New River. It's seems like an age since Skolars qualified for the Final and now the day has come. The coaching and medical staff are assembling for the team bus departure at 8.00am and I have clipboard in hand, ready to "take the register" and ensure that everyone travelling on the supporter's coach is present and ready to depart for Halifax at 8.30am.

The supporter's coach arrives and, one by one, I tick off the names on my list until there are just three people missing. Two of Skolars juniors casually amble along the road, blissfully unaware they are causing me to have kittens! I now have one name missing and it's the young man who will be donning the Super Skolar outfit at the game. Like all good mascots he needs his beauty sleep and a call from one of his mates reveals he is still in bed and will miss the coach! We set off without him but soon get the news that he's on his way to Kings Cross station to catch a train up to Halifax. This draws a rousing cheer from the supporters on the coach, elevating Super Skolar to true Super hero status.

After distributing Skolars away shirts to those on the coach not wearing club colours I settle down to endure what seems like a week on the M1! A brief motorway service station stop and we're back on the road again, making reasonably good time to Yorkshire. As we wind our way up one of Halifax's finest hills the entire coach party are amused by the sight of a Crusaders supporter's coach struggling to make the incline and almost going backwards.

The coach is parked and I remind everyone of our proposed departure time and assembly point after the finals. It dawns on me that I might have made a good school teacher. 20 minutes after we arrive a rather apologetic and sheepish looking mascot arrives at the ground but his efforts to make the match are rewarded with my gratitude - he's suffered enough.

After months of waiting and anticipation the game goes by in what seems like minutes. We're hanging in there and at half-time, with the score at 16-16, dare we start to dream of big Dave Williams lifting the trophy? Alas, the second half gets away from Skolars and despite the team's best efforts Crusaders forge ahead and maintain a healthy lead to take

the spoils. Our supporters were in fantastic voice all afternoon, even though they were outnumbered by the hoards of Crusaders fans. Defeat is taken in true sporting fashion and we applaud our team off and the Crusaders lads. A cracking Northern Rail Bowl Final between Leigh and Sheffield follows our game and then it's back to the coach. Clipboard in hand I am pleasantly shocked that everyone makes it back on time, including three extra members of Skolars staff travelling back with us. Skolars assistant coach, Marcus Tobin, makes the journey back with the supporters and has time to talk to everyone on the coach and share his thoughts on the match and the day.

It's almost midnight when we make it back to New River and despite the obvious signs of fatigue shown by many on board it was unanimously agreed that it had been a great day for the club and its supporters and we definitely want more!

My clipboard is temporarily retired but, who knows, it could make a return at the end of the season - we will see.

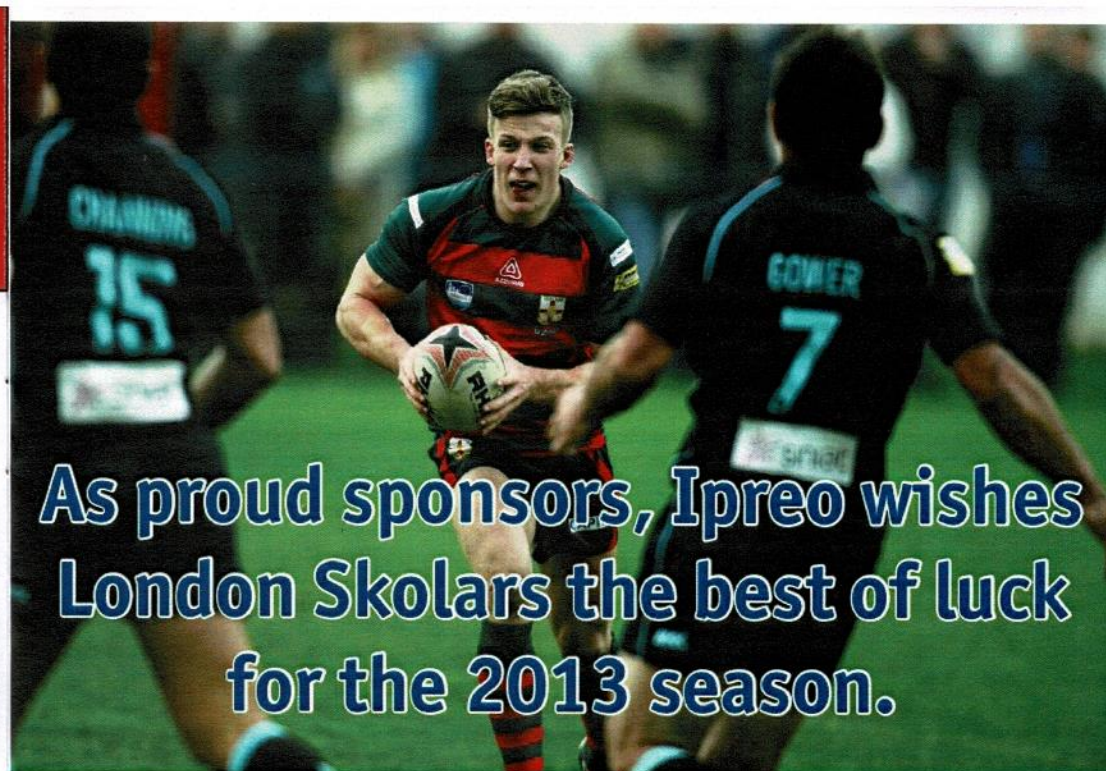
Dylan Skee broke the club's all-time points scoring record in the win against University of Gloucestershire All-Golds. The record was previously held by Paul Thorman with 488.

As not all the records are available for scorers and appearances in the amateur days, our records tend to caveat with "in the professional era" or "since 2003". However, given the number of goalkickers the club had in those early days, this is definitely one record that does cover the full 18 history of the club.

Dylan's fifth conversion on Sunday saw him go past the 500 points. His next two milestones are most goals in the season (he set that record last season with 89) and top goalscorer (currently held by Paul Thorman with 223).

James Anthony moved into fifth place in the Skolars top try scoring list (in the professional era) closing in on third place held by Matt Thomas and Gareth Honor with 33. He also has a chance of beating Mark Cantoni's record of 20 tries in the 2004 season.

The Northern Rail Bowl final was David William's fiftieth appearance for the club.

Under 19s Triumph

A Grand Final win at Hemel

London Skolars U19s age group finished off an outstanding season as they emerged victorious from the London Youth League Grand Final last Saturday. On a hot day at Pennine Way, the home of Skolars Championship One rivals Hemel Stags. The Skolars again made a dominant start to the game, with their impressive forward pack finding huge holes in the Eastern Rhinos defence, as was the game plan – the powerful bursts by props Franklin Bruno and David Ogufere were ably followed up with good support by lighting quick wingers Sayed Kapaka and Donovan Noble, enabling Skolars to cross for 4 quick fire opening tries, all converted by scrum half Jack Avery.

With the way the Skolars were defending both in the middle and out wide, and the assurance with which fullback Aston Stephenson was returning Eastern Rhinos kicks, there was a danger that the final was going to be all one way traffic. However credit to the Rhinos and their coach Pete Le Marquand, they rallied and dragged themselves back into contention. With the momentum now with the boys from Colchester the Skolars felt themselves under pressure for the first time in the match, facing two repeat sets on their own goal-line, it took a huge defensive effort to keep the Rhinos out, the Skolars finally got the break they needed when the left side of Seb Kolasa, Micheal Greenhalgh and Donovan Noble managed to make a great hit and force the Eastern Rhinos winger into touch.

This allowed the Skolars to regroup and they began to force themselves back upfield. With Eastern now chasing the game their plays became riskier and their error count increased. The Skolars, with first team coach Joe Mbu watching on from the sideline, were clinical in capitalizing on these errors and ran in 20 unanswered points to put the game beyond the Eastern Rhinos. The final whistle sparked jubilant scenes from the Skolars bench as they celebrated Grand Final success for the second year in a row.

This result meant the U19s secured a London RL 'treble' with the 9s, Junior Challenge Cup and now

Grand Final trophy all now in the Skolars cabinet. Commenting on the victory, coach Matt Cuss and assistant coach Dion Chapman praised the way the boys had applied themselves throughout the season "given that the U19s were coming into the season as Champions, there was pressure on us from the start, but every time we have been tested the lads have stuck their hands up and come away with the right result.

"It's been a whole squad effort throughout the year with every one of the lads playing their part in some way, and a huge thank you must go to everyone who has enabled this season to be such a successful one, all the supporters who have turned out, everyone at the club for making everything so accessible, and Bobby Brown for driving us all over London. It's been an absolute privilege to work with such a talented bunch of players in my first season with Skolars and I'm sure that we will see a number of this squad make the step up to first team level in the near future."

The race for promotion

The play-offs explained

This season see a change in the play-of format for promotion from Kingstone Press Championship 1.

The side that finishes first at the end of the league campaign of 16 games earns automatic promotion. The sides finishing second to sixth enter the play-offs. The format then follows the method used for the top 5 play-offs for many years in Australia and the format used in the early seasons of Super League.

Week 1 - weekend of 7/8 September

The 2nd placed team in the league gets a bye.

3rd play 4th (match A),

The winner progresses to match C. The loser has a second chance to progress and plays the winner of Match B in week 2

5th play 6th (Match B).

The loser is eliminated. The winner progresses to Match D

Week 2 - weekend of 14/15 September

2nd-placed team v Winner Match A. (Match C) The winner progresses to the Play-off final. The loser has a second chance to progress and plays the winner of Match E in week 3.

Losing team Match A v Winning team match B (Match D)

The loser is eliminated. The winner progresses to Match E

Week 3 - weekend of 21/22 September

Losing team Match C v Winner Match D (Match E)

The winner progresses to the Play-off final, The loser is eliminated.

Week 4 - 29 September

Kingstone Press Championship One play-off final:

Winner Match C v Winner Match E

The final takes place at Leigh Sporting Village and the day will also feature the Championship Grand Final.

With 14 teams in that division, the top 8 take part in the play-offs with a simlat format to the top 8 play-offs in Super League

Whilst we report on Skolars' success in the Under19s on Liontrust Youth and Junior Grand Finals Day in detail on page 12, there were four other finals played at Pennine Way.

Brixton Bulls reached the first final in their history and took the under-14s title with a 28-26 victory over Elmbridge Eagles with Kelland Thomas-Smith scoring two tries.

It was a good day for south London sides, who won three out of the five finals. At Under 13 level the Croydon Hurricanes Under-13s had a narrow 28-20 victory over Elmbridge Eagles, both sides scored five tries but the Eagles were unable to convert any of theirs while Dan Johnson's four conversions for the Hurricanes was to prove the difference. Croydon's Samuel Ajayi scored a hat-trick.

In the under-12s final Elmbridge Eagles proved too strong for Medway Dragons winning 28-5. In the final game of the day the Croydon Hurricanes Under-16s wrapped things up with a 34-12 win over Medway Dragons.

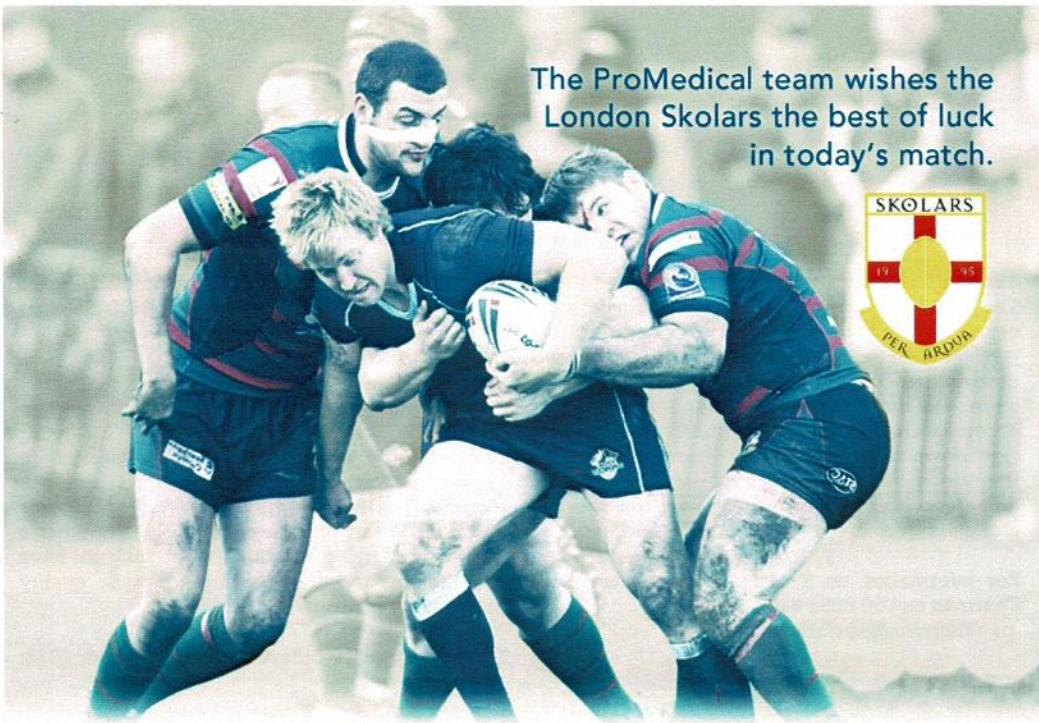

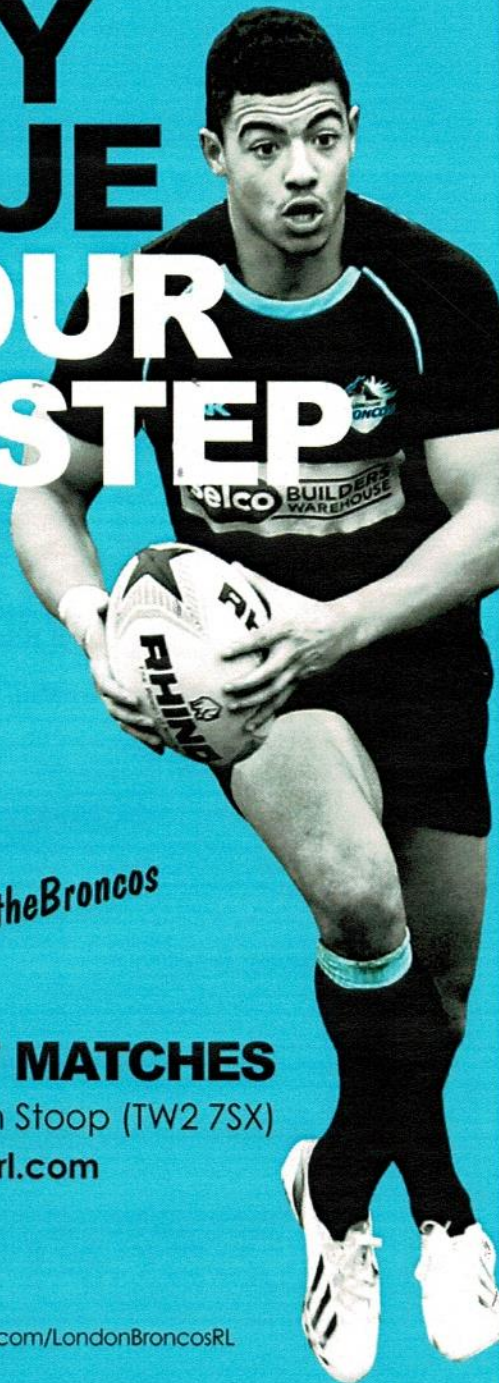

Relegation Dogfight

WITH five full rounds to play and two teams set to be relegated from the Kingstone Press Championship, it could hardly be closer at the bottom at present.

Heading into this weekend's fixtures, just two points separate the bottom four teams – York City Knights, Barrow Raiders, Swinton Lions and Hunslet Hawks. The situation seems to change on a weekly basis, with shock results such as Swinton's home win over Featherstone on Sunday regularly shaking things up further.

The Lions had been struggling of late, but buoyed by that win, coach Gary Chambers is now looking for further improvements in the crucial coming weeks.

"I've said all along since I've been at the club that we're turning too much ball over, and tackling twice as much as everyone else," Chambers said. "If we can hold the ball a little bit better and stick to the plan then we can trouble teams." "Sunday was probably the best team we've had out all year, and it showed. We stuck to the gameplan and hopefully the players can now see the value in doing that. It also gives us a bit of belief that we can play against the bigger teams and get something out of it."

Hunslet Hawks' ability to pick up frequent bonus points means they have not been cast adrift at the bottom – they have won just four matches all season but picked up ten extra points in defeat.

York have been slipping in recent weeks and have been dragged right back into the struggle to survive, while Barrow Raiders had been noticeably improving, until Sunday's disappointing 32-4 loss at Doncaster.

Keighley may have thought they were out of the battle too, and had they beaten Dewsbury at home a couple of weeks ago instead of falling to a four-point loss they might have been. Consecutive defeats mean they are just four points above the drop zone now – and have arguably the toughest run-in on anyone, including all three trips to Cumbria still to come.

The remaining fixtures for the bottom five teams are set out below. There promises to be plenty more twists and turns yet.

This Month in Time

A good start to the National Conference League campaign, but 2003 continues to be tough for Skolars

1998

Skolars made the best possible start to the 1998/99 National Conference League division 2 campaign with a victory at Dodworth. They led 6-10 at half-time but fell behind until Charlie Oyebade scored the decisive try with seven minutes remaining for a 12-18 victory.

They made it two from two with a 28-20 against Hull Dockers the following week. Alfie Petelo scored twice and Anthony Scully scored for the second consecutive game. Hull Dockers made a second half comeback after trailing 22-10 at the break but a Marc Simon try and conversion sealed the win.

Skolars announced a new coach with Australian Nathan Turner taking over the reins. Turner played for Queensland Crushers in the NRL and in 1997 signed for Oldham, though a foot injury prevented him from playing a single game for the Bears as they were then known.

2003

After some heavy defeat in July, Skolars pushed top of the table Keighley Cougars close before going down 14-22 despite missing Jake Johnstone and Alann Tito. Glenn Osborn (now at Oxford) returned from a successful tour of Australia with the Great Britain Academic Lions Under 19s side, kicking a penalty on ten minutes. When Alex Smits was sin-binned for backchat halfway through the opening period the Skolars showed far greater resolve than they had in previous week and were still in touch (2-10) at the break.

An early break from Rubert Jonker and Cory Bennett saw Kahu Henare force his way over, but an error at the restart saw Keighley score. A second try from Henare was concerted by Osborn narrowing the gap to two points. The last twenty minutes saw some breathless action as both sides looked for the decisive score. But the pressure finally told with a minute to go as Ricky Helliwell scored out wide to keep the Cougars top of the table. If Skolars could play that against a weaker team than Keighley their first win had to be around the corner.

So there was much hope as the team travelled to Sheffield the following week, even with hookers Kahu Henare and Gareth Honor out through injury. Mario DuToit scored Skolars only try as they trailed 44-4 at half-time. Worse followed as Andy Pointer scored four tries and Greg

Hurst scored a hat-trick for the Eagles, with Gavin Brown adding 14 conversions in a 98-4 record defeat for Skolars. Even with a number of reserves stepping up to play in that game, the reserve team were strong in their play-off game scoring 17 tries on a 86-10 against St Ives Roosters.

It was a much improved performance at Salford FC when Skolars played Swinton. Gareth Janes crashed over for an early try, and they were in contention at 16-6 down at half-time, but with only a try by Huy Le, converted by Glenn Osborn they fell away to lose 34-12. It was another away trip the following week and Skolars lost 64-14 at Hunslet, whilst the reserves were knocked out of the play-offs by Greenwich Admirals.

2008

Skolars chances of a making the play-offs were dented with a 33-16 defeat at Workington, who regularly put London on the backfoot, including two 40-20 kicks in the first half. Corey Simms scored for Skolars in the first half, but Town were comfortably in the lead before tries for Alan Barker and Gareth Honor narrowed the gap.

Doncaster were to go on to win the promotion play-offs but had to work for their 16-23 win at New River, Skolars' tries coming from Wayne Kerr, Dave Ellison and Joe Brown with Paul Thorman kicking two conversions as Luke Gale starred for the Dons.

Skolars fell to defeat again against Rochdale, falling 20 nil behind before Simms and Austen Aggrey launched a mini-comeback, Stevie Gibbons' late try saw him show the form that would get him into the Ireland World Cup squad in the autumn, along with Wayne Kerr.
