What we showed in Yorkshire on Sunday is what we need to show for the rest of the league games this season.

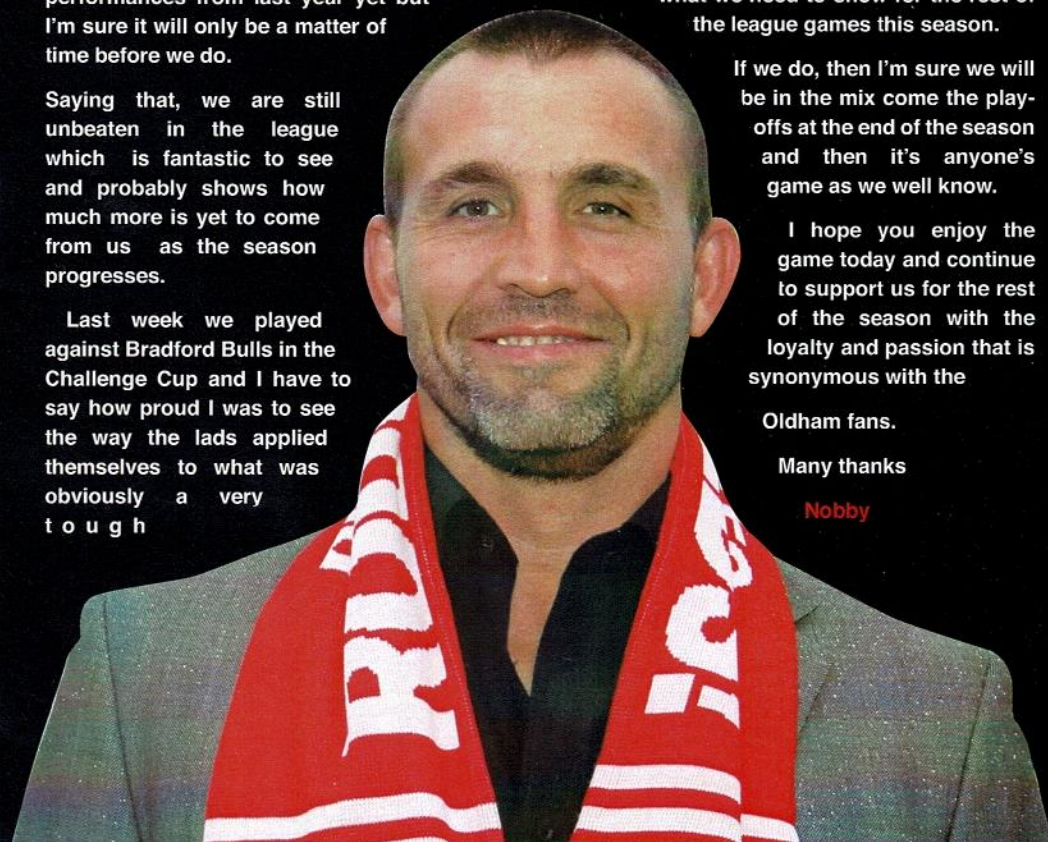
If we do, then I'm sure we will be in the mix come the play-offs at the end of the season and then it's anyone's game as we well know.

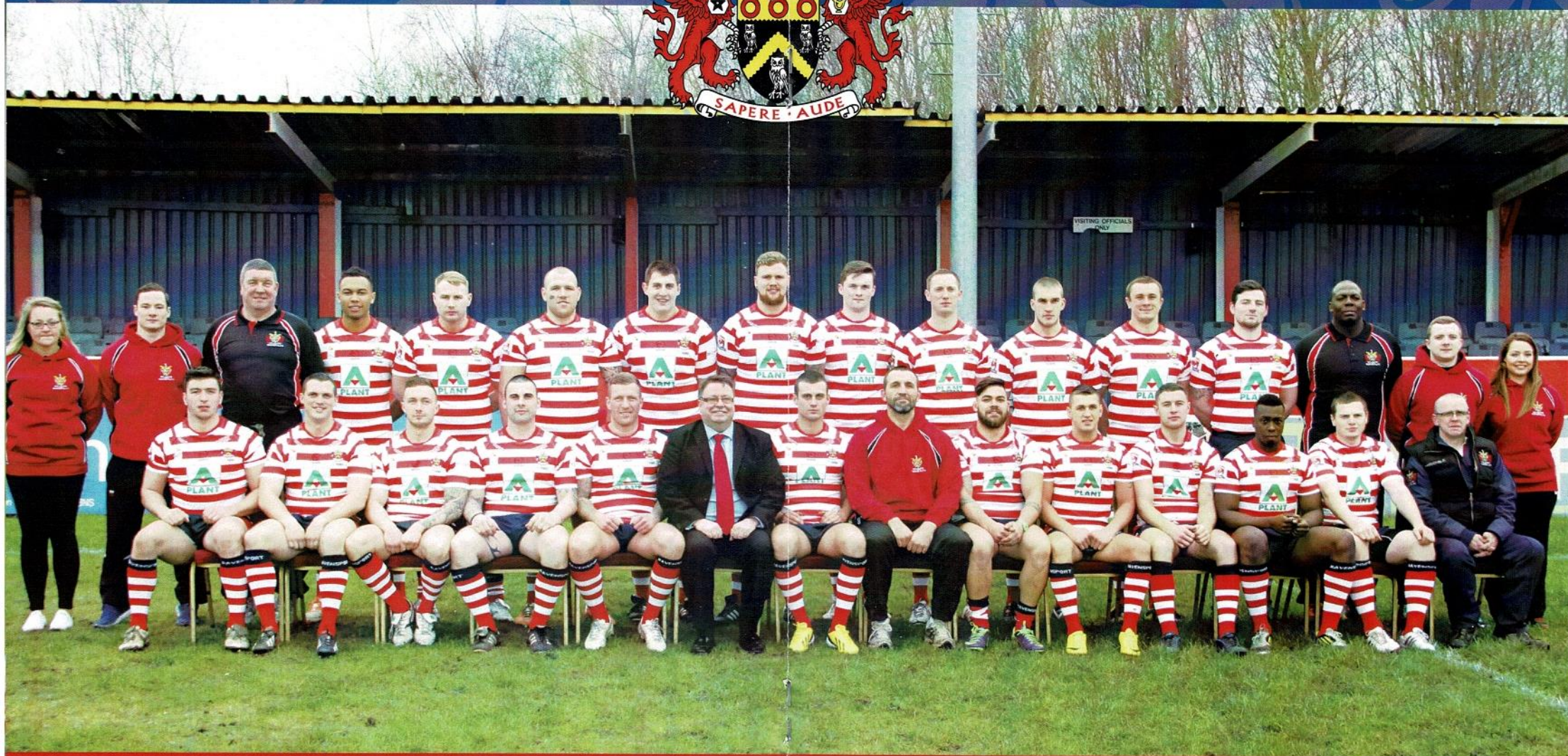

BRIAN HOLLAND R.I.P

It is with deep sadness that we record the passing of Brian Holland, a lifelong Oldham RLFC supporter, who was a seat season-ticket holder with his wife Carol until the end of last season.

Brian, who was 76, died in the Royal Oldham Hospital a few days ago after a long illness and a brave battle against Parkinson's disease.

His funeral was at Oldham Crematorium on Monday, April 7.

Brian was a staunch supporter of Oldham RLFC for nearly 70 years, having been taken to Watersheddings by his dad when he was a small boy.

In turn, he introduced both his wife and daughter Caroline to rugby league and in particular to his beloved Oldham club, which he supported through good times and bad throughout his life.

Said Caroline: "He used to talk all the time about the great Oldham team of the fifties, but he was passionate about the club all his life and through thick and thin."

"I used to go with him all through my teenage years. Mum went with him before they were married and she has been going with him again for the past ten to 15 years, right up to the end of last season when they had seats in the stand."

"Oldham Rugby was a massive part of his life."

His passion for the club was recalled by Mike Turner, a founder member of the Oldham RLFC Heritage Trust and author of that fabulous book 'Oldham RLFC - the complete history'.

Said Mike: "Brian was extremely supportive of the Heritage Trust and of all our publications and helped us in many ways and with the offer of photographs and anecdotes."

"He also helped me with my book about the Beatles. They only did one show in Oldham and that was at the Astoria in February, 1963. Brian dug me out a photograph of the Astoria."

"But Oldham Rugby was his passion. He was a great chap --- always helpful and always ready to have a chat about the team and the club."

The club sends its sincere condolences to Carol, their daughter Caroline, grand-daughter Alexandra and to the rest of the family.

THE late Nigel Marland will be at the heart of everything his beloved Oldham Rugby League Club achieves in the 2014 season.

Roughyeds lost one of the club's stalwarts when the former schoolteacher died in January, aged 65, but his support will live on at Whitebank thanks to a unique memorial.

The team's new home kit carries the inscription: 'Nigel Marland, 1948-2014' --- a tribute which is believed to be the first of its kind in the 130-year history of Oldham Rugby.

Replica home-kit jerseys worn by supporters will be identical.

Said club chairman Chris Hamilton: "Nigel's name is purposely positioned on the left breast, above the club crest, because that's where the heart is and because Nigel's heart was always close to the heart-beat of the club."

"He was a massive part of our club and this is an appropriate way to remember him."

"He will be with the players every time they put on the home kit and take to the field, and that would have suited him just fine."

"It's a measure of the respect and esteem in which he was held by me personally and by lots of other people at the club, including coaching staff and players."

Said Nigel's brother John: "We're absolutely

flabbergasted. Nigel would have been so proud. It's just fantastic."

And sister-in-law Gail added: "He'll be looking down at us from heaven with his wry smile. He'll be absolutely made up by this because Oldham RLFC meant so much to him and had done all his life."

At the time he was taken ill with heart trouble last November, he was chairman of ORSA (the club's supporters' association), editor of the match-day programme, match-day PA announcer and the man who had instigated and organised our Squad Strengtheners Fund to assist in the signing of new players.

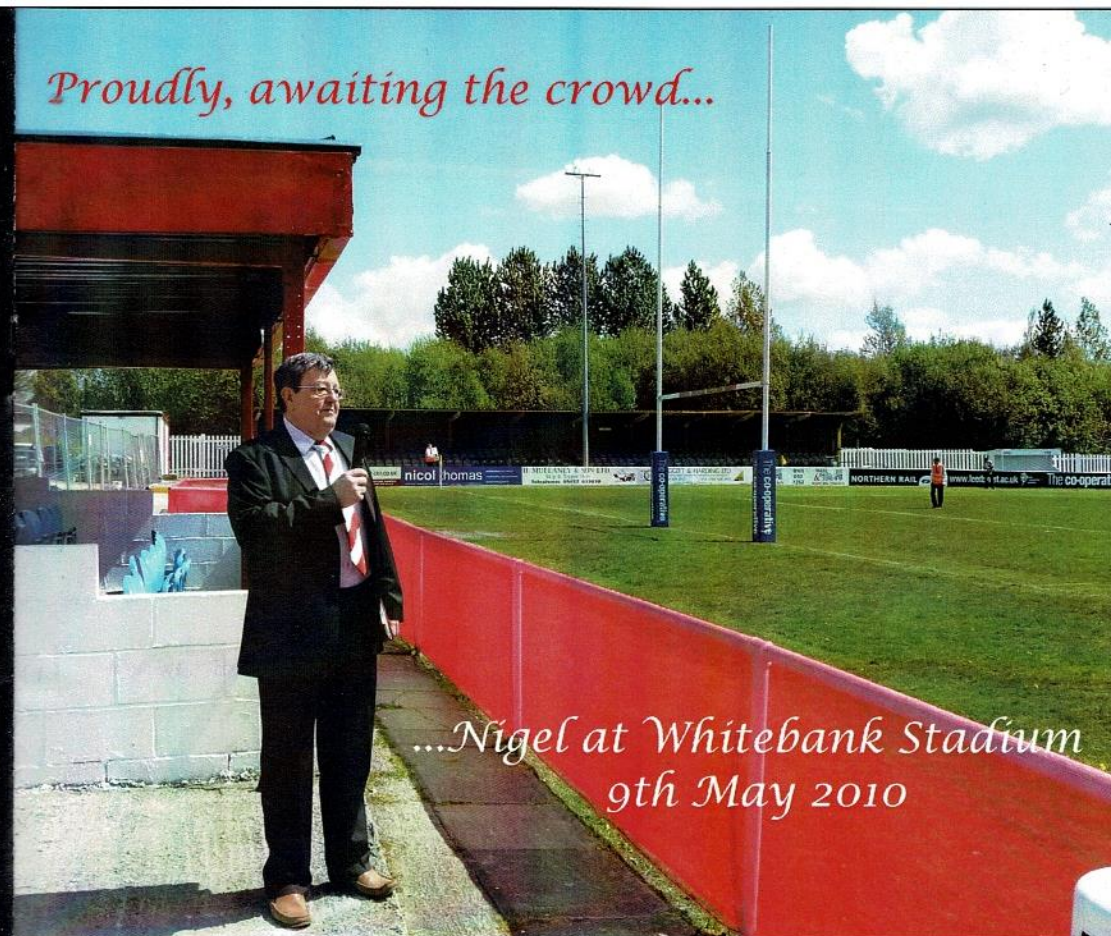
He was a teacher in Oldham for more than 30 years, most of that time spent at Hathershaw School where he was a head of year and later deputy head.

He also had a lifelong connection with The Lyceum Theatre, Union Street where he was artistic director for many years.

Following his death, donations in his memory totalled £1,030 which has gone to the Acute Coronary Care Unit at Wythenshawe Hospital to be used specifically for the needs of patients.

Explained John: "It was Nigel's expressed wish that the money should go to the unit, but only to be used directly for the benefit of the patients in there."
