

Danny Ansell

Danny Ansell is the player in focus this week. This season he is brimming with confidence and has made himself no stranger to getting involved in the big games. He has impressed with his accurate goal kicking since taking over from an injured Andy Ballard and has also seen himself cross the white wash. The championship in Danny's eyes acts as a great stepping stone and is a league full of exceptional young players. 

Match Report...

Hunslet Hawks 44 Gloucester 4

A convincing victory in sunny Cheltenham for the Hawks this weekend. It was no easy challenge as Barry's side faced a physically strong All Gold's side but the Hawks productive start to the season continued with a 44-4 win, to maintain their position at the top of the table.

After an exciting cup game last week in the Challenge Cup minds were back and focussed on the league. The Hawks were quick off the mark when Brooke Broughton got his arm free in the tackle and managed to get the offload away to James Coyle on his first appearance of the season who then put Houston through under the posts. The Hawks defence has been consistently good across the opening games and today was no different Watson, Stenchion and March muscling up and creating the solid line that left the home side pointless for so long. Jamaine Akaidere continued to prove himself worthy of the spot in the team when he latched on to Danny Maun's pass and dived over in the corner. Despite Barry's side looking reasonably in control they suffered from ill-discipline and some dubious decisions. Akaidere was accused of stripping the ball and the All Golds were granted possession but the Hawks scrambling defence relieved them of conceding one in the corner. Hunslet went on to score their

third try courtesy of Lee Mapals as the winger added the finishing touches to Danny Ansell's cross field kick 5 minutes later the Hawks were at it again this time James Houston barged his way over for his second. Gloucester looked to narrow the gap slightly and got themselves a try. Fullback Marcus Elliot sent Phil Cowburn half the field to reward his side with a fine try as the visitors headed to the break with the upper hand at 24-4 they still had 40 minutes left to maintain stranglehold.

It took either side time to get back into it but when Gloucester pounced on an uncharacteristic Kain error it was left to Lyons to make the try saving tackle on the line. The second rower got his side out of danger, the Hawks made sure they stamped their authority back on the game. Enjoying plenty of possession the Hawks grabbed the first try of the second half Ansell made no mistakes weaving his way in and out of defenders he scored and converted his own. The boys were just doing what they had to do; Grimshaw drew defenders in before a change in direction saw him fly over the line. Casey Canterbury had some game time in pre-season but making his league debut he was able to show the potential he has, quick from half back he was catching the All Golds off guard. The visitors thought they had put the game to bed but tempers flared as both sides were still wrestling for the victory. Gloucester would fight until the end and were

attacking the line with intent and had another try disallowed for a knock on. The threat of any kind of comeback fuelled the Hawks momentum and prop forward Houston charged through and put it down to seal his hat-trick this afternoon. Maun touched down in the corner and rounded things off at 44-4

A good steady game for the Hawks this afternoon another win under the belt will continue to add to the confidence the Hunslet outfit are gaining. A quicker turn around than usual for Barry's side as we face Oldham at The South Leeds Stadium on Good Friday.



A fine individual try by recently rugby union convert Nigel Heslop gave Oldham a 18-8 lead.

Hunslet rocked the visitors with 2 spectacular tries in 5 minutes with Paul Beath going over after



bewildering from Boothroyd, Brook and Burros, and then again Paul Burrows after a fine break from former Oldham Australian favourite Brett Carter put Hunslet 20-18 ahead. Unfortunately, 2 tries in the last 12 minutes from Jones and Heslop gave the visitors a passage into the 5th round.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know that the nickname of Roughyed given to Oldham supporters comes from about 1756? Back then the town used to be a centre for making hats from rough felt from the local sheep, thus Rough Head. The club started off as a football team founded back in 1876, and has won the Challenge Cup 3 times in its history. Oldham was most famous for spinning cotton and in the 1850s there were 360 mills

spinning day and night. In fact in 1909 Oldham factories spun more cotton than France and Germany put together. It's reckoned that Oldham had more than 16million spindles winding cotton! All that came to an end in 1998 when the last mill closed down. Famous people from Oldham include the first woman to go to jail for protesting about getting the vote, Annie Kenney.

Also Philip Schofield from 'Dancing on Ice,' and Cannon and Ball, comedians, are from there. Best thing started in Oldham, though, has to be the first chip shop in 1858. By 1900, Oldham had the highest concentration of chip shops in the UK – 1 for every 400 people! Now, I wonder what happened to all those 16,400,000 spindles?



Where are they now?...



There are not too many players who played for all 3 professional clubs in Leeds - Leeds, Hunslet and Bramley - but Neil Lean is one who did. He was persuaded by Paul Daley to come to Hunslet in the 1980-1 season, playing his first game on 1st August 1980 as a sub v Hull in a benefit match. He'd been transfer listed from Leeds, where he'd admired the greats such as John Holmes, Dave Heron, David Ward and Kevin Dick. "John Holmes is the one in my memory who stands out above them all." He came in to a team with equally-admired players - Graham King, Mark Burgess, Johnny Wolford, Phil Gibson, Bryan Murrell and a couple of Kiwis, Akland and Brown. Paul Daley was the Hunslet coach, "He was a great motivator and he knew how to get the best from all the players. At the time two other clubs were interested. I am pleased that I made the right choice by coming to Hunslet."

Playing mainly at no 8, Neil stayed till the mid-80s. appearing 78 times and scoring 8 tries, before moving on to Bramley, where he played alongside Karl Harrison and Paul Fletcher, both well known rugby coaches. Neil only packed in rugby when his job as an overhead linesman in the power industry began to take him all over the country and abroad. It's a job he has still. He's kept up with rugby though, as his son played, and now 2 grandsons play, and his daughter is an avid supporter 'and has a very good knowledge of the game.' Typically as a forward, he plays down the extent of injuries -"None of my injuries stand out in my memory, however I did have quite a few: several sets of stitches, a broken nose, a broken jaw, dislocated shoulder. hamstring injuries, twisted knees etc." I'm sure all were painful at the time.

Hunslet in the 1980s began playing at Elland Road, "The facilities were very good. We had a good cup run, beating Hull KR. who were the Challenge Cup holders. I have many happy memories from my days at Hunslet (on & off the field) and Paul Briars was one of the funniest guys in & out of the dressing room. He's a great character. My other memories are of Bryan Murrell, who found it difficult to keep his clothes on outside the dressing room (No changes there: he's still the same now)."

As a lad who started playing at age 10 with his primary school. Bramley St Peter's, Neil maintains his love of rugby in Leeds and is hoping to come to more matches at Hunslet this season. Looking forward he says, "Realistically, I believe Hunslet have a very good chance of promotion. I look back on my time at Hunslet with pride and fond memories, for all the great times that we had, both on & off the field. I am very grateful that I had the opportunity to play there."




